CJCA GOES ALL REQUEST

Edmonton: Monday May 2, CJCA became the first Canadian radio station to go all request, 24 hours each day 7 days a week. Certain telephone funlines (request lines) will be open at all times for the listeners to call. These calls will be tabulated by CJCA's specially hired request staff every hour and given to the radio personality on the air. He will air the tunes most requested by Northern Alberta listeners. It will all basically follow the top forty format now in use and they will air the new up-and-coming records as they are received and after a few airings will leave it to the listeners to request the numbers to build them into hits. CJCA will also air "Special Flashbacks" that are requested which will enhance the top forty and also encourage listener participation with CJCA. Much success has been experienced with the airing of the best in Canadian productions and CJCA is slowly but surely creating an interest by their listeners in the Canadian sound. CJCA also has an untapped wealth of talent within its studios. Their Program Director, Dalt Elton and a popular group known as The Nomads, who are closely associated with CJCA through commercials and station promotions, have been heard by a few Eastern-ites who were amazed that this talent wasn't on wax.

Up and coming from-CJCA is the unveiling of their specially made Batmobile. The Bat craze is still "in" with the hippys of Edmonton which should make for some pretty exciting promotions for the CJ-DJs. Bob Stagg recently conducted a pre-marital Osculation Survey to find out how many Edmonton women kissed how many Edmonton men before they were married (something like that). Anyway, the Edmonton average is 52. That's how many men were kissed by each married Edmonton woman prior to marriage. The CJ-DJs gave a hand to the proceedings of the Firemens Ball Day at the Northgate Shopping Centre. Pro Canada Dave Charles

Belleville: Radio station CJBQ won the John J. Gillin Jr. Memorial Award for 1964-65, an award presented annually by the Canadian Association of Broadcasters and based on any single or continuing contribution by a member radio station to any form of community service. CJBQ's award was for "having a genuine public interest in local education problems." What the CAB and perhaps many others have overlooked is the contribution CJBQ has made to the advancement of the Canadian music industry through the efforts of Dave Charles, popularly dubbed "The Voice

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of the Quinte Teens". Charles has consistently fed the Canadian line to his listeners and they have clearly and enthusiastically shown an appreciation for this struggling industry which is only asking for a chance to compete with the product of other lands. The Dave Charles influence is felt through the successful bookings of many of the best recording groups available in Canada. At one time it was considered fatal to book a Canadian group into the area. Now it's a weekend habit. Charles himself hosts many of shows playing to capacity audiences throughout the Quinte area. To add strength to his radio voice Charles now writes a teen oriented column for the Belleville Intelligencer. CJBQ gives their teen listeners what they want, the music they want to hear. Many radio stations could very easily take a lesson from the successful operation of CJBQ and should also remember that in many cases their very existence depends on the teen market, who spend over 42 million dollars annually on fashions, fads, records, cosmetics and the wide range of products and services of potential advertisers.

If any radio personality deserves an award for contributing more to the Canadian image, then it must surely go to Dave Charles of CJBQ in Belleville, Ontario.

To boost local talent, CKWS presents a live variety show each Wednesday at 8:30 PM featuring the best in local artists. The show is called "The Music Goes Round" and has been grabbing a lot of the adult listeners as well as the bubble-gummers.

Burton Cummins of The Deverons has joined Chad Allen's group (Guess Who) as singer and organist, replacing Bob Ashely. Wayne Arnold replaces Burton in The Deverons.

Bobby Griffith, a niteclub entertainer has been getting much mileage with his release of "Cheater Cheater" on Am-Can, a sub of Canadian American Records.

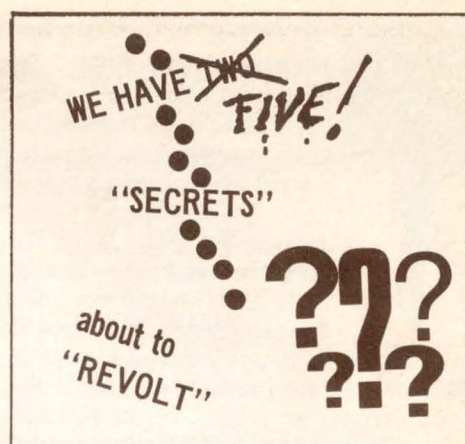
CKNL ACTION FOR VERNON'S "DOWN IN THE BOONDOCKS"

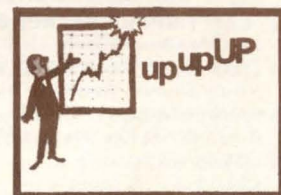
