YA GOTTA HAVE A GIMMICK

It was only four years ago that all you required to make a go of it in the music business was talent. Stars like Pat Boone and Connie Francis were top record sellers, and they looked like.....people.

Since the success of The Beatles, a vaudevillian approach seems to be what you have to create about yourself before you can have a top seller. Hysteria breeds hysteria, and today fans expect to see the wildly attired, long haired, strangely named groups and artists before they will buy a record. The weirdo, freak distinction isn't solely the property of the British groups. It has spread to the United States and throughout the world.

French Canadian groups must lead the way. The gimmick is a big thing in the very healthy, very competitive Quebec market. Everything from the pastel coloured hair, the high styled outfits and the over-theatrical approach to performing have become more important than the sound.

The French artist pictured on this page has to be the ultimate in this new approach. If this is the ultimate, than it may also be a turning point.

Many of Canada's groups have tried to make it with the "clean cut" look and have had to resort to the gimmick to succeed or give it up. The visual appearance of the group and the followers they have are important to their record release and if they haven't thought of the ultimate gimmick yet...give them time.

Talent has taken a backseat in all this and there is some question as to whether a polished talent can make it today because the sound has become very natural and seems to happen. The polished US production session sound isn't doing as well as the hit that happens somewhere in a studio because the people involved were sincere.

It may be a long time before we get rid of the gimmicks, but the magic ingredient will always be a thing called "HIT" and if it has it in the grooves, someday it won't have to lean on the "Barnum and Bailey syndrome".

HARRY "FINGERS" FARMER RELEASES CFRN SINGLE

Edmonton's Klondike Days produced many lasting and imaginative mementoes. One that is becoming very popular is a 45 disc, produced by CFRN Radio of Edmonton. "Klondike Days" and "Those Were The Days" by Harry "Fingers" Farmer and His Freeloaders is on the Sunwapta label, available through CFRN. Harry Farmer, who is music director of CFRN narrates, briefly, the history of Klondike Days on side one and gives with a melody of tunes, popular during the gold rush, on side two. Another popular souvenir of the big celebration, is the "Klondike Days Special", a twelve page newspaper with authentic reproductions from 1898 editions of Edmonton's first newspaper, the **Edmonton Bulletin**, published by **Frank Oliver** at Edmonton. Those interested in copies of this interesting tabloid can obtain same through **Smith and Smith Associates**, 10435 - 124th St. Edmonton.

R. Paul Godfrey leaves CKWS Kingston to return to his home in Peterboro and to take over the "Music After Midnite" show on CHEX. Paul advises that CHEX has been very successful with their GMP type music policy. The CHEX TUNEDEX includes the "Best Sounds In Town" and the top country hits. GMP for CHEX doesn't mean straight down the middle. **Peter & Gordon**, **Nancy Sinatra**, **Trini Lopez**, **Catherine McKinnon** and **Gordon Lightfoot** can be heard almost any time of the day. **RPG's** Weekly Winner is "A Million To One" by **Dean Martin**. Coming soon for CHEX is 10,000 Watts and the appearance of **The CHEX MATES** at **The Peterboro Exhibition** where they will be broadcasting live from the CHEX Big Top.

CFQC's **Jim McCrory** covered **The Rosetown Fair** by way of a remote set-up for the August 3rd. event. CFQC's "Fence Art Contest" is drawing to a close and is regarded as one of the best promotions ever run at CFQC.

Marion Lawrence, of CFAC, sends news that Calgary is girding itself for the August 16 appearance of **The Beach Boys**, who will be making the scene at **The Stampede Corral**. Also on the bill are **Chad and Jeremy** and **The Sunrays**.

DJs from the Maritimes would seem to agree on one beef, and that is that many of the record companies fail dismally in supplying promotion copies of what they consider hits. CKCK's **Graham Wyllie** has just returned from a trip around the Maritimes where he met many Canadian talent conscious DJs who were buffaloed when it came to promoting Canadian talent because of the absence of their discs. **Bob Bacon**, of CFCB Corner Brook complains that although he has a captive audience of approximately 50,000 listeners, he has only received one Canadian disc in four weeks.

There would seem to be a growing tendency on the part of some Maritime distribs to wait for five or six weeks to see if a record will make it in the larger centres before supplying DJs.

Fred Trainor notes that Canadian Teen Music is all the rage on the South Shore, that's Bridgewater, Nova Scotia, and that CKBW is charting the best which averages out to 1/4 of the Top 50. **Roger Lewis** and **The Moondawgs** make the Bridgewater scene, soon.

Phil Reed sends news that **Paul Haines** has returned to CKLN Nelson after a leave of about four years and will take over the morning show. **Bill James** moves up to CKPG but before leaving for this Prince Rupert station he gave Nelson audiences a blow by blow description of Nelson's **International Water Pageant**. The roof of the radio station was a ready made gondola for spotting the action.

CJOC's station project **Teentown 66** was one of the most popular attractions at the **Lethbridge Exhibition**. **Buddy Knox**, **The Guess Who** and **The Marketts** provided the entertainment. The Guess Who put on six shows and packed each performance which resulted in a return

engagement for this popular Winnipeg group. Up in **Henderson Lake**, **Bobby Curtola** and his **Martells** also packed them in as did **The King Beezz**, **The Big Town Boys** and **The Guess Who** are expected to draw well at Henderson Lake.

CFJR's **Brian Barker** is knocked out over the promotion job that **RCA Victor** is affording **Marti Shannon** and her new single and album release. Brian interviewed Marti on his "Up Tempo" show and also had the privilege of seeing the "Six Foot Blond Sound" in action, and labels her "dynamite".

Terry David Mulligan did his bit for French-English Canadian relations by doing a bi-lingual record hop at St. Victor, Sask. The French DJ, **Jean Marc Rancourt** from CFRG,

The latter group apparently stole the show. Terry would like us to ask all stations to give a second close listen to two Regina groups, **The Check-er-lads** and **White Knights**. Their **Gaiety** releases are being distributed by **Rca Victor**.

SLAIGHT QUILTS CHUM FOR ENGLAND

Toronto! Allan Slaight, who was recently appointed General Manager of radio station CHUM, has resigned this post to form a communications consultant firm with Terry Bate. The team of Bate and Slaight will be headquartered in England at a time when the North American way of advertising and merchandising is most desirous.

Slaight joined CHUM in 1958 and as program director, was mostly responsible for bringing the station from the bottom of the heap to a point where its ratings were nudging the giant CFRB.

Slaight, at 37, will move his wife and three children to England within two weeks.

RED LEAF - DASANDA TIE IN FOR CANADIAN CONTENT

Toronto: Sandy Gardiner of Dasanda Productions was in Toronto recently to meet with Stan Klees of Red Leaf records and to negotiate a product release agreement. Dasanda have very successfully produced and promoted the Staccatos for Capitol Records of Canada. The pact with Red Leaf will deal with new product and will give further strength to Red Leaf who are already a giant in the indie label field.

First release on Red Leaf from Dasanda is expected to be early in September and will feature the Ottawa group The Characters.

Klees denied the rumour that Red Leaf had been sold to a major, but confirmed the fact that a bid had been made for Red Leaf.

NEW STEREO SERIES FOR CAPITOL

Toronto: A new stereo series was introduced to Canada when Capitol Records (Canada) Ltd. premiered their "Studio 2 Stereo" line during the company's fifth Annual Convention which was held in Toronto, the last week of July.

"Studio 2 Stereo" material originated from EMI in England and has also been successfully introduced by EMI affiliates in Germany and Australia.


Paul White, Director of A & R for Canadian Capitol, has been working on the series for some time and is confident that the

repertoire is extremely commercial and that the "Studio 2 Stereo" series will become an important sales item in the Capitol roster.

For Canada, Capitol has designed a special inner sleeve carrying the "Studio 2" story, in English and French, plus a special label colour, each jacket also features an individual design.

The company released the first ten albums this week, which included releases by **The Mike Sammes Singers**, **Manuel**, **Pepe Jaramillo**, and seven other comparatively new names.

The picture in a promo used in last weeks RPM to promote this column was NOT a picture of me. (Ed: Not recent, that is) I repeat, this was not a picture of me. It was in fact a picture of west coast popular disc jockey in "drag". That's the inside news....on that picture. I'm just asking but.....is a certain Manitoba radio station thinking of bringing back their chart????? Spray my finger Old Ed: I just got burned on that HOT item.

Is there a HATE CAMPAIGN on against a certain Canadian artist? Is the campaign "sour grapes" because the artist has started to make it, and the people who mishandled this artist in the first place FEEL BAD!!! (I know, I had the same thing happen to me when I was with the follies). Let's put a stop to the poison pen epistles and get down to serious business.

There is a small intrigue going on behind everybody's back that involves a radio station and a record company-promotion man and a "sweet" young lady that would make interesting reading. Although publishers often refuse lead sheets when they arrive in the mail without opening them, this is not a common practise. They will seldom refuse a tape demo, BUT....many publishers are fair and try their best to handle the lead sheets and demos that are sent in. There are thousands of songwriters, but only a handful of successful publishers in Canada, and they just can't handle the number of songs that come their way each day. I was told that this is an eternal problem throughout the world.
