

RPM Introduces National R&B Listings

As the record buyers have started leaning toward R&B records, RPM has experienced an increasing demand for an R&B listing. This week will introduce this NEW feature. It is hoped that as R&B becomes even more popular, this listing will induce the sales that will make many more singles available which are now only imported at a premium price. In many cases the Canadian record numbers are not readily available. In the weeks to come (and with the cooperation of record companies) this problem will solve itself.

CASINO ROYALISTS FUN MOVEMENT

With the winning combination of publicist Helen Conway, Columbia Pictures (Canada) and RCA Victor promotion dynamo, Ed Preston, plus the supporting talents of Odeon Carlton manager, Victor Nowe and CHUM radio personalities, the Columbia flick "Casino Royale" just had to be the best promoted film to hit Toronto in some time. Two days of wild and effective, on the street, in the stores and on the air promoting, kicked off what could be one of the top box office draws of the year.



Ed Preston, newly appointed RCA Victor promotion man, took on the giant task of promoting a movie with the hopes that he could also stimulate interest in the soundtrack. The movie, "Casino Royale" is a well put together spoof on the very popular James Bond character and stars Peter Sellers, Ursula Andress, David Niven, Joanna Pettet, Orson Welles, Daliah Lavi and Woody Allen, as well as many well known guest stars.

The determining factor in the popularity of the soundtrack is the fact that the theme "Casino Royale", which was written by Burt Bacharach, is performed by Herb Alpert, who has made the theme a chart topping single. What might be a hit out of left field is "The Look Of Love", written by Hal David and performed by Dusty Springfield, no stranger to the hit scene.

Preston got together with Columbia Pictures publicist, Helen Conway, and came up with a novel idea for promoting the movie, and the soundtrack in record bars. They used the giant theatre posters, not only in record bars but furniture store and photographic store windows as well. A small jitney and trailer was used to haul several beautiful models, and Preston, around the city. They were fortunate in having a ready made audience of over 18,000 being as one of the promotion nights happened to be a Stanley Cup playoff night and the theatre is right next door to the Gardens. Preston made sure he had his well decorated jitney and trailer parked in full view of the hockey fans.

One of the big attractions was a "paint-in". CHUM personalities journeyed from the station to the theatre on the trailer with the Casino Royales (beautiful models) who had successfully invaded CHUM and on arriving at the theatre the lucky deejays gave the gals a paint job, ala "Goldfinger".


Bumper stickers and 5 types of buttons were given away to many thousands of Torontonians who grabbed onto the opportunity to join "The Casino Royalists Fun Movement".

Vic Tanny even got into the act, giving away envelopes containing "007 orders" which entitled the recipient to a free workout at one of his gyms.

Album sales, and queuing "Casino Royale" movie-goers was proof positive that the Conway-Preston team had succeeded in their individual projects.

Bathurst, N.B.: Radio station CKBC has been awarded the ACRTF Trophy, "FOR THE BEST CONTRIBUTION BY A CANADIAN ASSOCIATION OF BROADCASTER (C.A.B.) ENGLISH LANGUAGE RADIO STATION, TOWARDS A BETTER EXPOSURE OF FRENCH CULTURE AS A UNITY FACTOR IN CANADA". The award was presented by the Quebec Region of Broadcasters (A.C.R.T.F.) L'Association Canadienne Des Radiodifuseurs at the annual meeting of the C.A.B. which was held recently in Toronto. There are only two such awards presented annually, one for radio and one for television.

This is the second award CKBC has received this year. Twenty-two year old Denis Menard was, earlier this year, picked "Canada's Top Radio Personality" by the trade magazine RPM.



There was a big sound show at the Welland Arena last week and I was there. This was the first sound show I'd been to and it won't be the last. There were Graeme and The Wafers, The Magic Circus, Ragged Edges, The Misfits and other great groups from the Niagara Peninsula. One group that really caused a small riot was The British Modbeats. These guys are a fantastic act to watch, with their weird mod clothes and stage movements. There was a New York booker at the show and he was so excited over the Modbeats that I thought he was gonna take off for New York without his plane. You know the Modbeats have their first album out and inside of nine days they are reported to have sold over 2000 copies. Their single "Somebody Help Me" is also doing real well. CKFH in Toronto is giving the Modbeats a boost but the other station won't touch it because it's a Red Leaf production, or so they say.

Now how about those Preachers. No sooner do they hit Upper Canada and experience success with their Barry single "Hey Girl" then they move into the Ottawa area for appearances and then open at the Ontario Pavilion at Expo May 19 through the 27th. How's that for eastern hospitality? Wouldn't it be nice to see a few CHED and CJCA chart listings for eastern Canadian records? They might give a listen to "Half Past Midnight" by The Staccatos, "Looking At A Baby" by Vancouver's Collectors, Ian and Sylvia's "Lovin' Sound", The Modbeats' "Somebody Help Me" and.....well there are so many great Canadian sounds that I just can't understand what the problem is.

If you picked up that Rca Victor album "Casino Royale" (RPM Album Pick May 13) give another listen to "Look Of Love" by Dusty Springfield. It could be a big one.

The British group, The Move, has apparently been pulled out of their Expo date



In the May 6 issue of RPM it was mentioned that the single "Been Burnt" by Luke and the Apostles was doing exceptionally well at the Crossroads Record Bar, in Willowdale but there was no info available on the label or distrib. Gail Hemingway, manager of the bar advises that the label is Elektra and the distrib, Allied. You might also be interested in knowing that Luke and The Apostles are currently playing the Cafe Au Go Go in NYC. The Young Rascals and Eric Burdon are top single sellers at Crossroads but the Happenings, Byrds and Collectors are right behind them. "Creeque Alley", "Him Or Me", "Six O'Clock", "Little James" and "If You're Thinkin'" are newcomers that are moving well. The British Modbeats album is a top seller along with "Gimme Some Lovin'" by The Spencer Davis Group and "Happy Jack" by The Who. No word yet on the next single by The Stitch In Tyme.

Mabel Fleming, manager of Fleming's Music House, in Medicine Hat, Alberta, reports good action on the DC5's "Got What It Takes" and Roger Miller's "Sunshine". The Yellow Balloon, Electric Prunes and Byrds are also up with the winners. Herb Alpert is making a strong bid for the top with his "Casino Royale" as are The Tremeloes with their "Here Comes My Baby". "Release Me" by Britisher Humperdinck and his countryman Whistling Jack Smith and his "Kaiser Bill's Batman" are pacing one another. Top Album items at Flemings are all the Herb Alpert releases, "Dr. Zhivago", "Sound Of Music" and Monkees albums.

From Columbia's Bob Martin comes news that The Buckingham's "Don't You Care" is topping the list of best sellers. The Byrds and their "My Back Pages" are running a close second. Simon and Garfunkel, Peaches

Riva Karajaoja, manager of the record Dept. for the Prince George Electric, has Roger Miller's "Sunshine" as top seller. Ian and Sylvia follow with "Lovin' Sound" and the DC5's "Got What It Takes" is moving up fast. Buck Owens is getting good sales with his "Buckaroo". Other singles showing well!





If you happen to catch the world's fair at Montreal, some people call it Expo, be sure to keep an eye peeled for The Scotians (Tom, Jim and Garth). This famous Melbourne recording trio will be appearing at the big show from May 14 through June 3rd.

Here's some news that should frost your saddle sores, particularly if you're an aspiring young Canadian songwriter. Ed Lennard, from Nestleton, Ont., sent a folio of his original compositions to the Tommy Hunter Show, expecting the usual friendly response he had received when he submitted material to other CBC shows. Don Messer had accepted and used Lennard material and took the time to write a thank you note to Ed. But not The Tommy Hunter Show. They returned the tapes and the accompanying letter noted that it was not the program policy to use original songs composed by members of their audience. Isn't that a great boost for our Canadian songwriters? Especially just after the CBC made a great hullabaloo about their Canadian songwriters contest. Doesn't anyone at the CBC come out of their directors or producers chairs to see what this country is really like? The CTV can't take many bows for their efforts either. You would almost think that someone, somewhere wrote a book, rather poorly, on how to produce a television show for the Canadian country bumpkins and that all CBC and CTV producers have a copy. Anyway, like the tired old cliche says, "It's Canada's Centennial year".

Now if any of you American country artists or television producers would like to upstage your Canadian counterparts, you al-

ways do, you might be interested in a Centennial project that's just been launched by Clarence Campbell. Clarence would like to interest as many country artists as possible to use Canadian written and Canadian published material, and he'll supply demo tapes, free, to those who are interested. His address is 466 Kingswood Road, Toronto 13, Ontario, and while you're at it, add Ed Lennard's name to your list as well. His address is Nestleton, Ontario.

Well, now that we've disturbed the old pile of manure let's look in on the record scene. Have you ever heard a better Canadian performer than that Johnny Clark, from Montreal. His single "It's Just About Over" is just great enough to be a smash right across the country.

Columbia's Bob Martin is excited over their new country releases. Tommy Hunter has a strong item with "Cup Of Disgrace" and Johnny Burke is capturing sales with his "I Can't Even Do Wrong Right". "Uncle Tom" by The Mercey Bros is one of the strongest country singles in their catalogue. Doug Lycett, who hails from a little town called Orono, in eastern Ontario has just had his single released on Columbia. It's titled "Build A Scaffold Way Up High" and "Old Zero". Doug wrote both songs and you know, even the pop stations are giving it a spin.

There's a new label among us. It's called Canuk. The owner and first performer are Dave Todd and Alf Fromager, in that order. Dave is also host of the CKVR Barrie country show.

Tom Connors, who comes from the north country is putting finishing touches to his new album for Rebel. It'll be all Canadian in content. Don Reno, formerly of Reno & Smiley has teamed up with Bill Harrell to do a great new Bluegrass set for Rebel.


