# Ampex Of Canada Bows Tape Activity

Toronto: As reported in RPM (Aug 26), Ampex of Canada Ltd., unveiled, to the press, their newly formed Ampex Stereo Tapes Service. At a well attended reception in Toronto (20) and in Montreal (21), AST execs gave reviewers the opportunity of trying on for size the best of Ampex units (home, portable, auto).

These units were offered to the reviewers for a 120 free trial, but Mr. Joseph Pariselli, manager of sales planning and promotion, advises that many of the reviewers waved the free offer and instead placed orders for several of the units. Particularly popular was the Ampex Micro 85 Cassette portable recorder.

Ampex Open Reel, cassette and 8 track, now contains product from AST, Astex, Audio Fidelity, B.T. Puppy, Buena Vista, Contemporary, Elektra, Fantasy, Good Time Jazz, Hi I.L.S. (language), London, Monitor, Nonesuch, Parrot, Phillips, Project 3, Recorded Treasures, Scepter, Skye, Vanguard, and Wand.

## Canadians Well Represented At Eastman School Of Music

Rochester, N.Y.: Eastman's School of Music has become of increasing importance to Canadians involved in the music industry. This year's 2nd annual one week workshop on recording, producing and engineering, held in conjunction with the School of Music, had several Canadian notables in attendance. These included Montrealers Andre Perry of Perry Productions and Jean Billard of Mc Cann Erickson; Doug Elphick, of Hallmark Studios, George Semkiw, of RCA Victor Studios, Pete Nichol, Jack Richardson; and representing Film House Ltd., Paul Coombe, all of Toronto; and Brian Blaine of Russell T. Kelley Co. Ltd., Hamilton, Ontario.

Taking charge of the workshop series was Manny Album, noted record producer and now Music Director of Solid State Productions, and Ray Wright, of Radio City Music Hall. The series, which had 22 in attendance from all parts of the U.S. as well as Canada, costs \$125.00 per member for the week long affair. It's expected that next year's series will

be of two week duration.

Aim of the series, new for some, and a refresher for others, is to lay down the basics for getting the best sound possible on tape preparatory to its transfer to disc. Equipment used during the workshop series included a Scully 4 track with 16 inputs. It's hoped that next year, an eight track will be operational. A new console has already been installed.

Those attending the series were given the opportunity of recording a well known New York jazz trio. The Billy Taylor Trio and a full orchestra made up of 60 top studio musicians. The trio and orchestra performed arrangements as laid down by those attending the Arrangers Workshop, which was being directed by Phil Ramone and Dave Green of A&R Recording, New York City. The Close-out concert of the series was also recorded.

Through an arrangement with the American Federation of Musicians Union, musicians are paid scale and the tapes remain the property of the school.

### BERMUDA'S GENE & PINKY APPEARING AT OSHAWA

Toronto: Bermuda Records announces that their top Mr. and Mrs. recording act Gene and Pinky Steele are skedded to appear at Oshawa's Home Show, to be held September 13 through the 15th. The show is to be held at Oshawa's Civic Auditorium.



Gene and Pinky, besides being a top attraction on the Island, have become well known in the U.S. where they have made appearances at several hotels. Much of their U.S. acceptance was due the exposure they received on the Hugh Down's TV show "Today Show", out of New York.

The duo have had much success with their Bermuda album release of "You're Gonna Hear From Us" (BDA 6710). Just prior to their Canadian appearance two singles have been released from this album. These are "Oh What A Feeling" (6712) and the title song from the album (6711).

# RECORDS

Don Norman and Ron Greene, independent producers and owners of Norman Greene Productions, have just completed a series of tapings of Ottawa's Purple Haze at Toronto's Sound Canada studios. Finished product is expected to be released on the Sir John "A" label.

The August singles release from London leads them into September with strong chart product. Strongest of these is Monuments Ray Stevens with "Mr. Business Man" (1038). Deram's Moody Blues have also been good to London with their "Tuesday Afternoon" (85028). Dave Dee, Dozy, Beaky, Mich & Tich are now up into the important end of the charts with their Fontana release of "Break Out" (15001) with the Troggs on the newly acquired Page One label right behind with "You Can Cry If You Want To" (1001). Bobby Vee is shaping up with what looks like a winner with his Liberty release of "Do What You Gotta Do" (56057). Jackie Shannon, who has been off the chart scene too long is back with "The Weight" (Imperial 6491). Tom Jones could finally break back into the top of the charts with his Parrot single of "Help Yourself" (40029). Album product has also been strong for London. Liberty's successful new group, Canned Heat, have made strong moves up the chart with their "On The Road Again" (56038) and have also made the album charts with their release of "Boogie With Canned Heat" (LDT 7541). Fontana's Dave Dee, Dozy, Beaky, Mich and Tich have a strong album outing in "If No One Sang" (STL 5471) which contains their past hits of "Zabadak" and "The Legend Of Xanadu". Fans of Jackie De Shannon will be happy

to know that she has a very strong album release in "Lonely Girl" (SUS 5225) which contains the hit most remember her by, "Needles And Pins", "The Cowsills Plus The Lincoln Park Zoo" (Mercury SRW 16354) have an interesting album release for the London people.

Caravan's Frank Swain has a unique situation on his hands with Friends & Lovers. This Verve/Forecast group have just entered the charts with "If Love Is In Your Heart" (5091) and back orders are encouraging. What's unique is the fact that their first single "Reach Out Of The Darkness" (5069) which reached the top ten of the RPM 100, but was only on the Toronto charts for two weeks, is still chalking up impressive sales. Another Swain happening is Mainstream's Amboy Dukes, who are moving into the top end of many of the charts with "Journey To The Centre Of My Mind" (694).

Arthur Brown's "Fire" (541012) is starting to catch, particularly in the Toronto area where Polydor's Lori Bruner has put on a major push to get England's No. 1 hit off the ground. The Sceptres have left Toronto for a week at Oshawa's Carousel. While appearing at Toronto's Coq D'or, the group came in for encouraging press coverage. Their single release of "Juicy Morning" (54004) which was produced by the Montreal production house of Summerlea, headed up by Bob Hahn and Brian Chater, is now getting extensive play in Montreal and Ottawa and could happen in Toronto as well.

Compo's Al Mair notes that Bobbi Martin's United Artists single of

"Harper Valley PTA" (50443) has become one of the most exciting in their roster. Initial orders for the single in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario are reported to be staggering. Their western distribs have also ordered heavily on the single which was rush released. UNI product, both album and singles are coming in for good sales because of the extensive play received on underground and those stations programming close to the progressive new sound. Fever Tree is perhaps the most powerful. Their album "San Francisco Girls", became a top item in Vancouver and is now being featured on CHUM-FM as well as CKFH. Rabbit MacKay made a good impression with his album "Bug Cloth". A single release from the album "Candy" looks like one of those out of left field hits. Mars Bonfire, another UNI happening with his recently release album will also have a single off the LP, "Ride With Me Baby". In view of the popularity of "Spin Spin" by Gordon Lightfoot, Compo has reissued the single on their Golden Gems series. The Northwest Company, who seem to be gaining strength with their Apex release of "Time For Everyone" (77085), are now moving eastward from their hometown of Vancouver on a tour that will take them into the Toronto area. Looking after bookings east of the Lakehead is the Alvin Munch Agency of Toronto. The Cat, another Apex success story, are showing strong chart action in the Maritimes with their release of "Doing The Best We Can" (77080). Their recent Maritime tour saw them returned to Newfoundland twice through popular demand.

## MERCEY BROTHERS TO PLAY SAVARIN

Kingston: After a successful tour of Ontario's top country clubs. The Mercey Brothers, Columbia recording artists will move into Toronto's Savarin for a one week engagement commencing Sept. 2. They are currently appearing at the Seaway Inn in Kingston.

# Andre Gagnon Breaks Into English Canada

Montreal: With the single release of Andre Gagnon's "Don't Ask Why" (Columbia C4-2831), a major breakthrough for the French/Canadian recording industry, could be in the making. Columbia's Charlie Camilleri, of the Ontario branch found exceptional interest by both middle of the road and top forty stations in the Toronto area. CHUM's John Spragge, gave the disc one of those rare on-air boosts, usually reserved for predestined hits.

Information on Gagnon is sparse. Obviously it was not expected that the English/Canadian market would make the necessary moves to make this disc a "very hot" item. It was through the efforts of Camilleri that Toronto, one of the most important hit making areas of Canada, and other important Ontario centres have now given this instrumental outing hit status. The "Gagnon fever" could spread across the nation.

The plug side was written by Claude Leveillée, well known French/Canadian artist/composer. The flip "My Dream" was written by Gagnon.

Gagnon's recently released album "Andre Gagnon Piano Et Orchestre" (Columbia FS 625), has become one of the top selling albums in Columbia's catalogue. Liner notes on the back of this album release include kudos from the late Edith Piaf; Canada's top French/Canadian female vocalist, Monique Leyrac; and Claude Leveillée.

St-Pacome de Kamouraska is reported as the birthplace of Gagnon. His musical studies apparently started at the age of five, and this, mixed with his regular schooling netted him a Bachelor of Arts degree.

Gagnon first showed up in Montreal in 1957 where he enrolled at the Quebec Conservatory of Music. He studied piano, composition and orchestration, for which he received a provincial scholarship in 1961, and left to study in Paris for one year.

On his return to Canada in 1962 Gagnon became a moving force within the French/Canadian pop scene and became one of the most sought after accompanists in the business. Much of his claim to fame, with regards to the public, came from the many recitals and tours he made with Monique Leyrac and Leveillée.

In 1967 he reached the extreme heights of French/Canadian acceptance with his debut concert at Montreal's Place des Arts. His concert, with the Montreal Symphony interpreting the works of Mozart, was a smashing success for which he received rave reviews from press, television and radio critics and established himself as an "exacting and highly professional concert pianist", with his enthusiastic audience of over 3000.

The second Gagnon album was cut in London in 1968 and was produced by Ettore Stratta. Backing was supplied by a 30 piece string orchestra under the direction of Johnny Spence. The album contains ten compositions of French/Canadian composers.

With the release of "Don't Ask Why" coming at a time when instrumental middle of the road type releases are taking a firm hold on the pop charts, Andre Gagnon could conceivably crash two markets, the very difficult International market and the almost impossible domestic market.

## Polydor Off And Running With Canadian Releases


TORONTO—Newly formed, pop-minded Polydor Records Canada is off and running with both single and album product. Heading the singles list is "Sunshine Of Your Love," the Cream deck on its second go-round; "Hush" by Deep Purple, the initial release from the recent Polydor-Tetragrammaton pact; and "The Theme From Elvira Madigan." Lori Bruner, Ontario Promo chief for Polydor, notes that

the label has just released Arthur Brown's English chart hit, "Fire." On the album front, the firm is also doing strong business with Cream's "Wheels On Fire."

On the domestic scene, Polydor has a debut deck by Montreal's Sceptres, currently scoring on the live scene throughout Eastern Canada; and an album from the Billy Van Singers, "A Canadian Achievement," a collaboration of the Canadian Association of Broadcasters and Polydor.

# THE NEED FOR BROADCASTING SCHOOLS IN CANADA

Broadcasting in Canada is now a multi-million dollar industry, and, at the tender young age of forty nine years it is fast becoming the nation's most important industry. It's importance of course can only be attributed to

it's prime function, communication. Air communication which unites our twenty million people from every walk of life each day, informing Canadians about developments at home and abroad. Every Canadian is now able to say he has one thing in common with every other person who inhabits this great nation; a radio, TV set or both. Through commentary, a variety of documentary presentations and of course good ole entertainment as we know it today is responsible for an above average, informed populace. How lucky we are!

Let's step behind those TV cameras and microphones for a moment. There you cannot help but see a tremendous variety of people, individuals who in bulk and as singular people are solely responsible for everything that you and I see and hear each day on our receivers. These people who for the most part take a tremendous pride in what they do, are calling themselves broadcasters. What is a broadcaster? He is a professional and a professional is, according to my dictionary one who is employed in a profession: Better yet the good book goes on to say that a professional is one who is actively engaged in a game or sport for money.

It may come as somewhat of a surprise to find out that broadcasting is not a game or a sport although many would-be broadcasters treat it as such. You have only to tune in the radio or TV once outside the Metro-Markets to discover the

No, broadcasting is a very exacting and serious business and those individuals who are engaged there-in should be there with a deep, sense of sincerity, dedication and devotion and above all a genuine feeling of pride. Pride in one's work is the prime requisite for success both for the individual and for the business for which he has decided to devote his life's efforts. Why then, do we have clowns on the air? Why are some announcers managing to make utter fools of themselves without a true knowledge of their folly? Should we, the public and irritated listeners blame those that speak, blame those people who know no better or focus our attention upon the real source of the problem, ignorant or ineffective management? The name of the game is money, yes but must some individuals make absolute fools of themselves in the process? I hardly think so. But the inevitable conclusion one comes to is that those persons, in some instances who occupy important, responsible positions of management are the only ones to blame for some of the disgusting performances of broadcasting and showmanship in stations from one coast to the other. In my opinion had these people of whom we speak (both on air and off) been taught the ideals of the profession before entrance to the business was granted, today the large percentage of the problem we now are confronted with would be



just happen, contrary to common belief, they are made through a long and difficult process of self improvement after the basics are known. Tomorrows' management is trained and educated today.



"Villa" is a Ted Richmond production under the direction of Buzz Kulik. Music was composed and conducted by Maurice Jarre.






CFOM, Quebec City's 19 year old radio station, and the only English/Canadian station in the area, is reportedly now off the air. It has been reported that the official reason given for the close-down was the property, on which the station is located, had been put up for sale at a price too high for the station to meet. Rumours persist however, that a very strong French/Canadian element with obvious separatist leanings have pressured local advertisers to boycott the station. Quebec City, with a population of 350,000, has approximately 20,000 English/Canadians. This is somewhat higher than the French/Canadian representation in Toronto, (per capita), where French only is programmed on one of the most powerful radio stations on the continent - CJBC. The English/Canadian population of Quebec City is also higher than their English counterparts in Vancouver, where it has been proposed that a French/Canadian language radio station be licensed to serve those whose native tongue is French and for those English Canadians who are interested in receiving an assist in their attempts to be bi-lingual. It would seem that if it's tough to be French/Canadian in English Canada, it's tougher to be English/Canadian in French/Canada.

Twiggy was there and took the opportunity to announce her engagement to Justin de Villeneuve, her 26 year old manager. The Grapefruit, who have been making a large sized noise in the British recording



industry, arrived in grapefruit-yellow suits and many patterned kippered ties. George Harrison showed up in hat and suit to match, in orange.

Also in attendance were actors resembling many of the characters in the film. These included Blue Meanies, ten foot Apple Bonkers

and a host of others.

"Yellow Submarine" is an Apple Film produced by King Features and stars Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band. The film is released by United Artists, an entertainment subsidiary of Transamerica Corp.

## MUSIC BIZ

Often I wonder if the average record man in Canada has really thought about having a million-selling master on his hands. What would it mean to possess a #1 record throughout the world? The aspect is very interesting and if I may indulge in some fiction, let us look ahead to a day in January 1969.

The talk of the trade on both sides of the border is a new single by a Canadian group recorded in Canada. Nationalistic Records of Canada has a hit on their hands. The trade papers show it in #1 spot and the record is approaching the one million mark in sales.

STAN KLEES, noted Canadian record producer and music industry consultant writes this column each week exclusively for RPM Weekly. Any questions or comments regarding this column should be directed to Mr. Kees c/o RPM.



In an exclusive interview with RPM, the President of Nationalistic had the following to say:

"Early in November, these young fellows came into our offices to play a demo for Tremendous Talent our A&R man. Tremendous saw the potential of the act. The tunes and the group was signed to an exclusive recording contract, and all four tunes that were to be recorded were put with our publishing company. Nationalistic has its own facilities to publish, you know. We took the boys into the studio and laid down their sound. We knew we had a hit on our hands and with an assist from our own management company, we started that big promotion program to make the nation aware of our new act. The boys were sent across Canada to meet and greet the various disc jockeys and by the time they got back to Toronto, the darn record was on nearly all the charts in Canada. The stations said 'yes' to 'This Could Never Happen'. Before we knew it we were climbing the trade charts in Canada.

"Just on you RPM chart, we jumped in at #11 the first week and #4 the second week. As you know the record has been #1 on your chart now for 9 weeks and the record sales in Canada alone are topping the 75,000 mark. We expect it to go to 100,000.

Maybe even 150,000.

"As soon as we hit that magic 25,000 mark, Nationalistic in the states asked us to rush the master down and they went all out to promote and gather the airplay stateside. The group went out on their U.S. promo tour. You can see the progress of the disc on this chart I brought along. On both the U.S. major trades, it came on the chart as #66 with a bullet and in four weeks, it became #1. The U.S. sales are about 800,000 as of last Monday and we are about ready to ask for that much coveted award. Do you know this is the first such award to be presented for a Canadian disc?

"We at Nationalistic are proud that our first #1 record is 100% Canadian content.

"What do we think we will make on this record? It's really hard to tell. I know that in Canada alone we can expect to see a profit of about \$20,000. clear. That's just on the record. Maybe we can say that from the disc, publishing, performance rights and management we really have a three-quarter of a million dollar entity with the Typewriter Keys. They are one of the biggest groups to come along for a long time. As you know, they already have an LP on the market in Canada and about to be released in the U.S.

"I'm glad you asked me about the international action. Other than the states, the disc is on charts in Spain, France, Japan, Germany. It's #2 in England this week and about to be released in 22 other countries. This record has put Canada on the map. We've already been able to release masters by six other groups we've recorded in the U.S. and the potential of Nationalistic's productions in Canada is multi-million dollar. Yes, I said multi-million dollar.

"Yes other companies are getting into the race. Our competitors are rushing to make Canadian releases available to their foreign affiliates. I think the Canadian Sound is on its way.

"Future plans? We've already set up sessions for eight other groups that Tremendous has discovered, and there is no stopping us now. Canada is the music capitol of the world.

"Can I say that it is amazing that one record has caused all this action? Would you believe me if I told you that I got a call from one of

the top acts in the business wanting to come here to Toronto to cut their next single and LP.

"Yes, that's one of the problems. Studio time is at a premium and Nationalistic is right now approving the plans for a large studio of our own. We are gearing up to go all the way with Canadian talent.

"Of course the local radio stations want exclusives, but we at Nationalistic feel that a simultaneous release is the best thing.

"Why I can remember when Hyper Harrington used to go in to see those radio people with our own Canadian productions and they told us to get lost. Funny how the world revolves. Do you know that we've just hired away from the station that wouldn't play our records, the guy who caused us the trouble. He'll be working with us as a producer. He'll be leaving the station. Real talent at producing that guy. I don't want to quote the figure we're paying him, but I can say it's a great deal more than he'd make at that station in 3 years.

"Final remarks? Certainly. We at Nationalistic had faith in Canada and in the talent that was here. We took a gamble and today we can say the gamble paid off. It was a long haul and we put out a lotta money, but we've recouped in the first three weeks with the Typewriter Keys. We've put Canada on the map as a music country. We're now in the Canadian production business completely and you'll see jazz, classical, folk and big band LPs coming out of Nationalistic. We want a good all-round catalogue of everything. Those evergreen workhorses carry you through the slow season. Rock and hit parade is one thing, but first and foremost we're a record company in every meaning of the word".

Those are the words of Nat Ionalistic, President of Nationalistic Records of Canada. A very proud man who has created a first for Canada on the music scene. A modest man who believed in the talent around him and went out and showed the world that Canada has a sound.

Possibly in January 1969, the names might change, but the events might be real. If not in January, than some other month. It might become a true story. I hope so.


