"Edmonton Contest" Presents Five Top Talented Canadians

Edmonton: Five young Canadians who are prize winners in the 1968 National Performing Artists Competition (organized by the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra) will be introduced to a nation wide television audience in a 90 minute CBC-TV colour special, "Edmonton Contest". Telecast date for this special has been set as Wednesday, Dec 4 at 9:30 PM EST/AST.

Filmed in Toronto studios and produced by Franz Kraemer, the prize winners are featured with the Toronto Symphony, conducted by Brian Priestman, who also acts as host.

Toronto pianist Arthur Ozolins, 22, winner of the top award of \$3000 and a

contract with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, is joined in the CBC special by four other finalists and prize winners: Otto Armin, 24, violinist from Montreal (formerly from Winnipeg); Gloria Richard, soprano from Buctouche, New Brunswick; Samuel Morrison, 17, pianist from Vancouver; and Avril Colleen Letourneau, 19, soprano from Edmonton.

There will also be a filmed excerpt of the award presentation ceremonies at Edmonton's Jubilee Auditorium.

Hambleton's Tuesday Music Expands

Toronto: Greg Hambleton, singer, composer, engineer, publisher and producer has relocated his Tuesday Music complex to 9 Sultan St. Toronto and can boast 15 releases in 1968 on various labels. These are his own productions. As well, many of Hambleton's compositions have been recorded by various artists.

Hambleton is a very capable and accepted studio engineer having engineered such sessions as "Biplane Evermore" and "Whiskey On A Sunday" for the Irish Rovers, and produced and engineered various sides by the Passing Fancy.

The recent release by Gloria Kaye

on RCA was written and produced by Hambleton at Sound Canada in Toronto. The compositions are published by Tuesday Music (a CAPAC affiliate firm). The A side "Weather" and the flip side "Child" both show signs of the Hambleton ability through and through.

The Sir John A label has released two further sides produced by Hambleton. The artist is Jay Telfer who wrote the two sides "Life, Love and the Pursuit of Happiness" and "Watch The Birdie" (The title song from the Toronto review). Both compositions

CBC TRIBUTE TO SIR ERNEST

Toronto: Nov 26 at 8:10 PM CBC radio's "Tuesday Night" will present a 90 minute concert performed by the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir and the Toronto Symphony in "A Tribute To Sir Ernest MacMillan".

Both these groups (conducted for many years by Sir Ernest), with the Festival Singers of Toronto and baritone Bernard Turgeon, are conducted by Elmer Iseler.

The broadcast includes three MacMillan works: "The Queen", "Blanche Comme Le Neige", and "Te Deum", as well as "Sanctus from Mass in B Minor" by Bach; "Dirge For Two Veterans" by Vaughan Williams; and "The Oratorio Belshazzar's Feast" by William Walton.

It was just recently that Deutsche Grammophon paid tribute to this great Canadian composer with the release of his "String Quartet in C minor" - 2 Sketches on French Canadian Airs" by the Amadeus Quartet.

This CBC "Tribute" was produced in Massey Hall, Toronto by James Kent.

Many of the above services have already proven effective on the market. The most successful being the release of Rhinoceros, an album package that has obviously been designed to bring attention to the excellent material contained within.

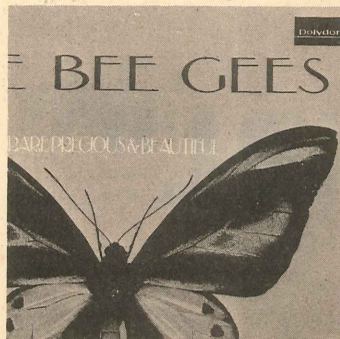

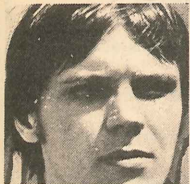

New York....(PWS)....The Rolling Stones have a strange habit of appearing to imitate the Beatles -- especially to Beatle fans. Their "Satanic Majesties Request" album followed "Sgt. Pepper's"; their "We Love You" followed "All You Need Is Love"; and their "The Rolling Stones' Rock And Roll Circus" TV special is following "Magical Mystery Tour" by a year exactly.

The special, which has not yet been set for American television showing and if the no show of "Mystery Tour" is any indication may never be shown here, will be shown in England before Christmas. The Stones will perform as well as Traffic and two American groups; Taj Mahal and Doctor John.

The Stones' album is ready for release this week but without the graffiti bathroom wall cover. Instead the LP jacket will have a plain cover with "The Rolling Stones R.S.V.P. Beggars Banquet" or a similar line written on it. It is possible that Stones' fans will be able to order the original album cover by mail- for free - from the Stones' New York fan club.

Speaking of album covers, John Lennon and Yoko Ono's 'state of nature' album cover for their duo debut album "Two Virgins" has aroused a good deal of comment in the music industry. The album will probably not be sold over the counter although it will be available. It is not

going to be released until late December or early January, however. The new Beatles album, "Beatles", also features some nudity on the cover. At least on the British album. The cover may be changed for U.S./Canadian release.

Jimmy Page, who, after Eric Clapton and Jeff Beck, became the lead guitarist of the Yardbirds was in New York last week for discussions with Atlantic Records, the group's new label. They won't be known as the Yardbirds however. The new name of the group is Led Zeppelin. An album is due to be released within the next couple of months.

Carla Thomas was in Paris this week after singing at the Berlin Jazz Festival. Carla did TV spots and a big reception was held for her while she was in the French Capitol. When she returns to the U.S. she'll be heading up to Montreal with the new Bar Kays for a week's engagement. Judy Clay, who is presently on the Jackie Wilson tour, will also be appearing in Montreal soon.

The new Madison Square Garden is getting to be very much aware of pop music these days. The Garden has been sold out three times since it opened and each sell out has been a pop music concert. The most recent was the Cream concert which grossed an estimated \$104,000.

Soul sounds are on the way for Christmas. Atlantic Records has put together a rather fantastic album called "Soul Christmas" which includes two cuts by Otis Redding. Otis sings "White Christmas" and "Merry Christmas Baby". Other artists doing holiday material on the album include Joe Tex, King Curtis, Clarence Carter, Booker T and The MGs, Carla Thomas, Solomon Burke and William Bell.

Mamas and Papas producer Lou Adler is producing an album called "Music From Little Brown". Any resemblance between the title and any other is purely intentional. The cover will feature a picture of a brown garage and the music will be heavy soul.....Bob Dylan's brother is also getting into the album race. David Zimmerman is producing an album by a professor of psychology at Columbia University in New York called "Sleep Faster We Need The Pillow"..... British blues group Fleetwood Mac busy finishing up an album in London to be released here when they tour the U.S. in December.....Buddy Miles big brass group The Buddy Miles Express isn't sounding so big and brassy these days. The horn section quit. Buddy will carry on as a quartet until he can find a new group of horn players. His album "Expressway To Your Skull" features liner notes by Jimi Hendrix.....Jefferson Airplane starring in a film to be made by French director Jean-Luc Godard. The film, which starts shooting in New York this week, will probably be similar to the film that Godard made with The Rolling Stones recently, "One Plus One". 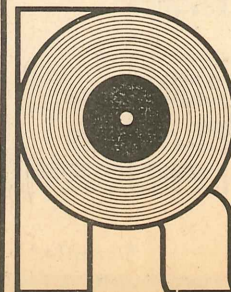

MUSIC BIZ

Very recently, I was criticized for being a "dreamer". I understand that this column is too concerned with how things should be and that they could never possibly be the way I "want them to be." I also understand I have been accused of being bitter!

gossip and names. In this column we are talking about a business. It is a very exciting business that few people understand. I am among those who don't understand it, but each week as I talk to you, I am put in the same position as my readers. I have to think about the many situations I am writing about. Often they make more sense after I have finished my column. Many times I finish my column and have a new opportunity to look at the subject and I scrap the first attempt to do a much better job. As important as the communication of news is, I feel that this column is also very important and very unique. No other trade paper attempts to reach the industry with a personal feeling toward the tempo of the business.

This type of column is also important in a weekly, because as quickly as any book on the business is written and put into print, it becomes outdated.

My conversations with various company execs in many countries regarding recording, merchandising, promotion and publishing as well as the lawyers, programming consultants, disc jockeys, writers and artists, give me a unique opportunity to pass on

ideas and thoughts to you each week. Often a particular column will be reprinted and circulated throughout the trade. Repeatedly I have been asked why I don't write a book to cover the entire spectrum of the business which might be a primary guide to those entering the business.

Bitter? Yes, at the inadequacy of the people this business attracts, the dreamers who "hit and run", the politics that destroy work in the name of promoting it, the lack of confidence of Canadians.

If I am bitter, then I have a head start on many in the business when it comes to experience. Every minute of every day adds to my experience, and every victory and every defeat teaches me more about the business.

Ultimately what are we all after? Success in the business, and what does that really mean to the rest of us? It means there is a business that someone has succeeded in. Others can then follow. It is something like the four minute mile. Once someone did it, it became easy for others to do the same. Come to think of it, we didn't do too well with the Olympics except for the extensive TV coverage of all our defeats.

To answer some of these claims, I would like to explain that this column is meant as a music business philosophy. While I talk about how things should be, I also talk about they way they are. Understanding both situations, I hope the readers are attempting to figure out a fair compromise.

The whole idea of exchanging ideas is basically what I attempt to do in this column. The limitations I have set for myself make it unnecessary for me to have to worry about news,

There's some top talent moving back into the booking business, and, unfortunately, the evil lurkers are also eyeing the industry as it gets into the groove again. Let's hope the musicians have grown up and that there's enough of them around who can remember the old days (65,66,67) and not get shafted once again.

Ed Jeffers, the motivating force who got Ryerson's Phornographic Onion on the move, is now a part of the very "movin'" Elcoda Productions. A top rated folk duo known as Sonny and Peter are part of the Elcoda roster and after a five week engagement at Niagara Fall's Yard In The Park, have opened at the Italian Villa, out in Toronto's Queensway area.

Sault Ste Marie at last has a resident booker. The Drayer Booking Agency appears to have a lot on the ball with Roy Drayer up front.

Toronto promoters, who intend to remain promoters, might be well advised to make attempts to increase their image with the radio and press. That columnist from the small town newspaper or the radio station within bussing of the Metropolitan area could do much to promote, not only the act, but the promoter.

Bobby Curtola did such a crowd drawing job during his recent engagement at Toronto's Town and Country, he's been invited back "by popular demand" for another two weeks commencing February 17. Never underestimate the strength of Canada's top teen idol of the mid-sixties. Although Bobby has mellowed into an exceedingly talented professional club act, he has brought his thousands with him. His fan club must still be the most successful in North America. Each time RPM does a

story on Bobby Curtola, it's necessary for us to increase our run. When Marie Martel says there are over 75,000 active souls in the club, you can believe it. Marie is the driving force behind Bobby and his fan club success.

The Spencer Davis Group are back in Canada once again. Compo's Al Mair sends the following dates. Winnipeg (26); Lethbridge (28); Calgary (29); Edmonton (30) and Regina (Dec 1).

B.B. King makes his first Canadian appearance at Toronto's Massey Hall Feb 14. King is an ABC Bluesway artist. This line is now handled in Canada by Polydor Records. David Rea, a Canadian guitarist, who was once the accompanist for Ian & Sylvia will be on the same bill. This is one concert you shouldn't miss. Rea is something else. This powerful package is being presented by Richard Flohil.

Happy tidings from Calgary's Happy Feeling who are currently happening with "Happy Feeling". Happy Don Lloyd of CKXL Calgary, telephones the news that this talented Barry group have been signed to tour the west with Roy Orbison. The 10 day tour will take them to Lethbridge, Calgary, Edmonton, Vancouver, Victoria, Saskatoon, Regina and Winnipeg. Their single is now breaking out in Vancouver. "Happy Feeling" is a top request on CKXL's "Housewives Survey" and takes over the No. 1 spot on the CKXL chart. The group have just been informed that Norman Petty, their producer has successfully negotiated with Bell Records for a U.S. release.

Waterloo, Ontario's Copper Penny have just released their new single "Beezel Bug" on Columbia. Their manager Richard F. Wendling has

taken the time to send us a copy of their release along with news of the group. Besides making quite a name for themselves throughout Ontario and Quebec, the Copperpenny have now become an important addition to the college circuit of the U.S. Some of the dates where you can catch them are: Kirkland Lake High School (29); Forest Heights, Kitchener (30); and in December Terry Powers Secondary School, Toronto (13); Oshawa (14); Kon-Tiki, Durham (31); and in January Port Huron, Michigan (13); Alfred State Collegiate, Rochester, N.Y. (31) and one date already confirmed for February, Kissing Bridge Ski Lodge, New York (1).

Mel McCormack just couldn't stay away from the business. This "gentleman" among managers is now back looking after a Montreal group. His new charges are Lyndon Gallagher, Keir MacMillan, Randy Peterson (younger brother of Gary of the Guess Who), and Russell Blackney. They've been working local high schools and expect to record in early '69.

LPRT BRINGS CBC TO ISOLATED AREAS

Toronto: A string of Low Power Relay Transmitter (LPRT) boxes spread out across Canada numbering 187 are bringing CBC radio programs into areas that could not otherwise pick up a clear signal.

These repeater transmitters are small booster stations capable of a broadcast range of up to 25 miles on a strength of 40 watts. The LPRTS are fully automatic and broadcast 24 hours a day with little maintenance.

This is not a new CBC service. The first LPRT went into operation in British Columbia in 1940 and met with such great success that the service was increased until now CBC programs like "Matinee", "CBC Tuesday Night", "School Broadcasts" and "National News" are a daily habit of thousands of Canadians across the top of Canada, and in southern interiors where nature has supplied natural barriers for a strong signal from the network source.

In charge of this fast-growing service is R.S. (Jimmy) James, radio network program officer for the CBC.

James believes there's a bright future for the LPRTs in broadcasting and points to northern Ontario as an example.

Through the LPRT set-up northern Ontario has a special radio network of its own. Residents have come to rely on the daily broadcasts for weather reports, local news commentary, road conditions and forest fire indications. In an effort to create more of a personalized service by way of the LPRTs, James and announcer Leon Mangoff travel through the north in a mobile truck recording items by local residents for broadcasts later.

According to James, the CBC plans eventually to install a tape cartridge into each individual LPRT which will give out call letters and, in effect, provide people in the area with their own radio station.

The CBC intends to carry on with their "magic box" system and extend it even further, so that Canadians in small communities from Newfoundland to British Columbia will be provided with a radio service they might not otherwise have had.

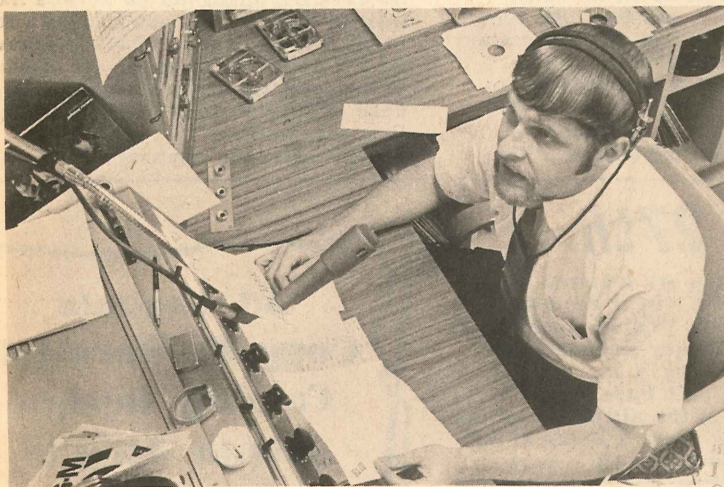
David E. Lyman, operations manager for CKXL Calgary, and spokesman for the Moffat Broadcasting Ltd., Canadian Talent Awards, has announced, in a well circulated letter to the music industry, that Moffat has found it necessary to cancel the reception for the Awards. The presentation was to have taken place at the Skyline Hotel, in Ottawa, Nov. 20. Lyman pointed out in his letter "In our opinion, the position taken by the recording industry of Canada with regard to its future relationship with all Canadian broadcasters may be detrimental to the future development of Canadian talent." It is generally assumed throughout the industry that the "position" referred



to in Lyman's letter has to do with the much publicized efforts by the

Canadian Record Manufacturers Association to acquire a performance royalty from radio stations in Canada for the play of records.

The Canadian Radio Television Commission (CRTC) is currently setting up a monitoring system through which they can have first hand evidence of bias and other abuse allegedly being practised by some broadcasters. The announcement of the intended monitoring of radio stations from coast to coast came from State Secretary Gerard Pelletier. Some observers read a little more into the announcement of this monitoring set-up in which Mr. Pelletier was quoted as stating "A lot of changes" could be expected in the whole broadcasting area.

OPEN LINE

Many letters of praise and criticism are received at RPM's "Open Line", and for obvious reasons some of these do not appear in print. It is flattering to receive letters of support and praise but if the letter doesn't offer constructive thoughts which would be of interest to other readers, we prefer to acknowledge same by a return note of thanks. Some letters are not so flattering and in some cases attack the authors of a particular "Special Report", or "Series" from a personal angle. These are also weeded out. The following letter from Claire-Louise LaLonde offers a guide line for future critics and/or reviewers.

"Editor: Thank you for the set of articles on 'Legislated Radio'. I just wish Mr. Klees' columns were available in the same form. I see I'm not the only one bearing Dave Mickie's remarks or rather, opinion regarding Mr. Richard F. Adams. I'd like to know what Adams thinks of the Radio and Television Arts Course offered at Ryerson. Enclosed is a piece on the 'Principles of Criticism'. If you think it is worth printing, I'd appreciate it very much. I would like the critics and reviewers to read and digest it.

It was given to me by Mr. Paton (one of the producers of 'Assignment', (who also did walk-on parts in 'Wojeck'), and who taught last year's first year Radio and Television Arts students at Ryerson.

'Principles of Criticism'

There are three important questions to consider:

1. What is the artist trying to do? (Too many criticize for wrong attempts by the artist).
2. How well does he do it? (Includes: technique, artist's skill, and effective communication).
3. Is it worth it? (Audience reaction).

'Art may be defined or life refined by or integrated through a personality. Art consists of three specific elements: substance, form, and technique. An understanding of each element is necessary for honest criticism.

'The purpose of art is to give aesthetic pleasure and to clarify life through the communication of the artist's thoughts, ideas or emotions to his audience.

'The theatre is a meeting ground or synthesis of all the arts and as such consists of five areas: plays,

acting, techniques, and audience.

'The theatre, as an art, has specific obligation to its public and the audience as part of the total, to make production.

'Give the artist and/or audience the right of interpretation.

'Technique....blending form with personal interpretation projection of self.

'Quality....technique and audience interpretation'."

BEATLE LP SKEDDED NOV 27th

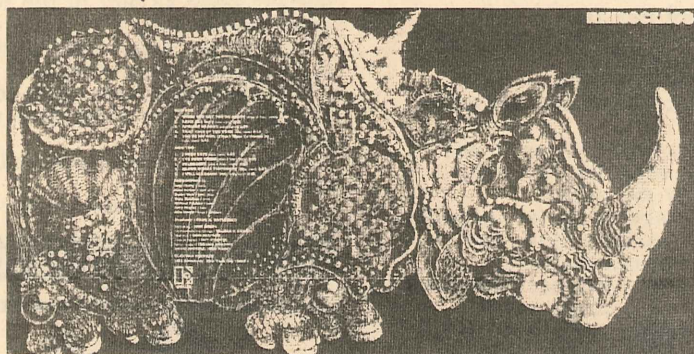
Toronto: Capitol Records (Canada) Ltd. have announced that the new two record Beatle LP, "The Beatles" will be available November 27th. The package will be released just in time for Christmas sales.

Of the 30 cuts on the four sides, "Helter Skelter" was chosen by RPM's Beatle authority Stan Klees as the plug cut. "The overall effect of the album", says Klees is "rock". "Make no mistake", says Klees, "The Beatles have done it again. They have pushed rock music one more step up the ladder that leads to the music of the 60s".

All the Beatles are featured on the LP from Lennon's "Dear Prudence" and the group with "I'm so Tired" and McCartney's "Rocky Raccoon" and Harrison with "Long, Long, Long". Ringo offers "Don't Pass Me By".

The beauty of the simplicity of the cover could only adorn a Beatles' LP. "The LP has much to sell", says Klees "the Beatles, the compositions, the packaging and the return of a better rock sound endorsed by the MastersThe Beatles".

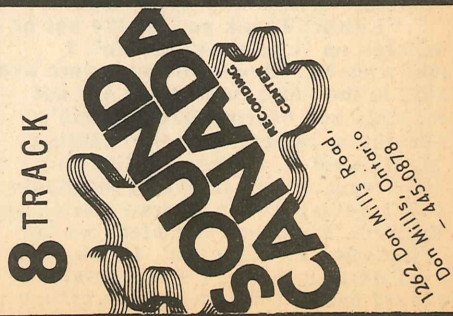

The release also contains a Phase 4 deluxe production of "Israel 20", narrated by actress Molly Picon with musical background by the Stanley Black Orchestra to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the establishment of the state of Israel.

Initial album product from the Sire label, operated by Seymour Stein and Richie Gottcher, are the album singing debut of actress and television personality Phylliss Newman, "Those Were The Days", an assortment of current hits and original material; and "Proof" by a new British group known as The Deviants.

Apparently the police didn't expect a rush of fans at the rear of the building and when Stevens drove out onto the street he was met by a flying wedge of Brown followers. They finally managed to break through then headed for the airport where Brown invited Stevens aboard his jet for a smash of champagne. Travelling with Brown was Hank "Finger Poppin' Time" Ballard. Brown didn't pull a full Gardens but the 5000 that were there made up for it in enthusiasm. The sound system was at its worse..... even in the greens.

Elvis Presley is set for a very expensive TV special Dec 3rd. RCA Victor are preparing a Header Card for his EP's as well as special order forms and streamers. Jose Feliciano's recent smash appearances in London, Ont and other Canadian centres has sparked demand for his new RCA album "Souled" (LSP 4045). Dunhill, distributed in Canada by RCA Victor, have a full house of chart action. Grassroots are moving into the top end of the charts, with Steppenwolf's "Magic Carpet Ride" closing fast. Richard Harris has what looks like a lengthy chart trip with his lid of "The Yard Went On Forever" and Mama Cass is gathering strength with "California Earthquake". John Hartford fans will be happy with his single release of "Mouth To Mouth Resuscitation" and "California Earthquake" from his new album "Gentle On My Mind". Canadian Jay Telfer could see action with his deck of "Life, Love, And The Pursuit Of Happiness". The flip is "Watch The Birdie".

Jacques Druelle, manager classical division for London Records of Canada is off on a trip through the Western Provinces. First stop was in Winnipeg (18) where he visited key dealers and radio stations. After a whirlwind trip, arranged by the local branch office Druelle flew into Calgary (19), Edmonton (20) and finished up in Vancouver (21-24). Druelle found exceptional interest in London's 3 LP set "The Royal Family Of Opera". Interest is also running high for the release of Britten's "Billy Budd Opera" (OSA 1390). This Opera was subject of CBC-TV's "Festival" for Nov 20. With lots of movie talk for

"Chitty Chitty Bang Bang", London are benefitting with their Chipmunk single of the same title on Sunset. Many of the MOR stations across Canada are creating a market for this outing which could become the big one for Christmas. Ken McFarland led the happy band of chipmunks, all dressed up in costumes valued at more than \$1000, down Yonge St., and through the major record outlets, which should garner sales among downtown shoppers. They also dropped into the RPM offices, which surprised the other tenants in the building who have just gotten used to seeing some of the way out conveyors of music news.

Musimart's promotion manager Pete Beachamp had a hot one dropped in his lap with the single release of "I Put A Spell On You" by Creedence Clearwater Revival which is showing strong indications towards chart action. Their album "Creedence Clearwater Revival" also looks like a strong sales item. Beachamp notes that Fantasy has a new Christmas album by Paul Mauriat (PS 8389). Mauriat has created much interest over the past year and with a well put together Christmas offering, should do well. Musimart is also having success with their budget classical line Turnabout and Prestige Jazz line.

The big news at Warner Bros-Seven Arts this week is Allan Bruce. Clyde McGregor, national sales manager for the firm advises that the album was released November 11th., and initial reaction from several centres has been exceptional. A gathering of Montreal's press and radio VIPs as well as key dealers was held Nov 19, and a similar get together is to be held in Toronto Nov 26. Mothers Of Invention have signed a recording contract with Reprise and will be appearing at Toronto's Massey Hall in February. New Branch Manager

for Warners in Montreal is Claude Ranallo and Gord Edwards takes over similar duties for Ontario.

Compo's field promotion manager Al Mair has what looks like a winner with "Soulful Strut" by Young-Holt Unlimited on Brunswick. These two big talents were once sidemen for Ramsey Lewis. Double Shot, who have a great deal of strength on the U.S. West Coast have an outing by Valorie Keys entitled "One Of Them". Roger Williams will catch a lot of action with his lid of "Only For Lovers" (Pour Les Amants), which was written by Montreal's Claude Leveillee.

Quality's "Man On The Job" in Calgary, John Watson, was responsible for one of the most thorough and successful provincial promotions ever witnessed on the prairies. It all had to do with Canada's Pied Piper, Bobby Gimby and his Quality album "Let's Get Together". The Calgary Herald, Calgary Albertan and Edmonton Journal all joined in on the Pied Piper and The Kids kick and proved what Quality execs have been saying all along. "Gimby has another hit. All he needs is the exposure". Radio stations throughout the province also gave top priority to Gimby during his recent visit to Alberta which led to excellent pre-conditioning of the listening audience and resulted in Gimby retaining the star status he enjoyed during his hit single of "Canada".

Being a top promoter and a Company man (in this case, woman) has taken Polydor's Lori Bruner off to Hamburg Germany and London England. Just for a two week "get acquainted with the company" trip, however, Lori will tour the giant Polydor empire, and no doubt pass on a few tips on PUBLIC RELATIONS, so lacking in some of the industry's head offices.
