Throughout our society age 65 is the traditional age of retirement and turning off, but for Maurice Solway, star of the acclaimed motion picture short "The Violin", age 65 is a turning on, a new beginning. It might be better to say that his interesting life is continuing at a higher and faster pace and one that doesn't seem to phase the dauntless musician one bit.

Mr. Solway's career dates back some 50 years when at the early age of 15 he became a member of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. His mastery of the violin is much sought after on recording sessions and he is a familiar face around the Toronto area Studios showing up on discs by such artists as Moe Koffman and Anne Murray. But to the general public these days he's best known as the kindly old man who tries to show two small boys about love, through music, in "The Violin".

Millions of people across the country have viewed this short film, first as it has appeared along with a number of feature films and secondly when it was screened on national television across the CTV-network.

Mr. Solway himself is responsible for numerous screenings of the film throughout the schools of Ontario as a teaching tool.

His method has been to offer a one-hour presentation, the first ten minutes of which are devoted to a demonstration of the

NEW MONEY PUMPED INTO DAVIES' LOVE PRODUCTIONS

Love Productions, a small but aggressive record production company, has a new lease on life. It's called MONEY. Frank Davies, President of Love, and his lawyer, Peter Steinmetz, firmed a deal that should see Love Productions move into the area of importance over the next few months.

The new directors of Love were introduced to the press, radio and industry figures at a Hot Stove Lounge (Toronto Maple Leaf Gardens) reception (11). They are William Ballard, Vice-President Maple Leaf Gardens Ltd., who will act as Chairman of the Board; Myron Wolfe, of the Oshawa Group (IGA Supermarkets and Towers chain), who has been appointed Executive Vice-President and Treasurer; and Donald Crump, Secretary Maple Leaf Gardens, who will act as the new Board's Secretary. Davies remains as President with Steinmetz carrying the title of Vice-President and Counsel.

Davies immigrated to Canada from England in 1970, promptly forming his new company, releasing product under the Daffodil label. He has released thirty-nine albums, eleven of which were Canadian produced. Fifty-five singles were released, thirty-nine of these being Canadian content. A recent audit of the books revealed that the Daffodil label has spent \$181,063.00 on their artists, with Love Management spending \$40,000.00 on its artists. It has been estimated that more than \$50,000.00 has been invested in Canadian talent alone.

It was Frank Davies who first introduced Crowbar (now with Columbia Records) to the recording industry, followed by Fludd, Joe Probst, Foot In Coldwater, Cochrane, Christmas and Waldo De Los Rios. The

THREE PENNY OPERA PACT WITH MUSIC MANAGEMENT

Sammy Jo, well known booking agent for the past eleven years, has entered into the field of personal management, heading his new company, Music Management.

Initial signing to the new company is Three Penny Opera, a Manitoba group now working the Ontario circuit and booked by the Bud Matton Agency. The group is comprised of Doug Haynes, piano and organ; Lary Haynes, lead singer and bass; Charles "Carol" Nabess, lead guitar and backup vocals; and Sherman Murphy, drums.

Having built up a strong image in the prairies, Three Penny Opera moved into Ontario the latter part of last year and, through the services of the Bud Matton Agency, worked a circuit that took them into Northern Ontario and finally into Upper Canada.

A recording session is expected to be scheduled within the next few weeks.

No strangers to the wax business, Three Penny Opera were formerly known as Midnight Angels and in 1967 released a Lary Haynes' penning, "I'm Suffering", on the Apex label. The session was produced by Greg Hambleton at Toronto's Sound Canada studios.

latter is an Argentinian arranger and conductor. His album releases, "Mozartmania" and "Sinfonias" certified for RPM Gold Leaf Awards soon after release and are still considered top sales items. Most recent success for Rios is his "Operas" set, expected to certify for Canadian Gold shortly.

While concentrating primarily on Canadian artists, Davies has dabbled in foreign product, other than that from Rios. He took on the Immediate (U.K.) series which has proven to be successful. Releases scheduled for the first part of the year include "The Art Of Chris Farlowe"/Chris Farlowe (SBA 16036), "Small Faces"/The Small Faces (SBA 16038), and "Anthology of British Blues Vol III"/Various Artists (SBA 16039). The Immediate series is being exported into the U.S. by Peters International of NYC while Davies is currently negotiating with EMI Scandinavia for Immediate to be exported into Europe from Canada.

Daffodil product is distributed in Canada by Capitol Records.

BOB DYLAN—THE LEGEND ON TOUR AFTER EIGHT YEARS

Advance hype for this tour reached an all-time high, but after all, this was the legendary Bob Dylan, and it was the first touring he had done in over 8 years.

Dylan, former skinny, protest singer from the sixties, now a millionaire singer-actor-record company exec (he has his own label now — Ashes and Sand Records), was guaranteed one million dollars by tour promoter Bill Graham. Not a bad chunk of coin, but the entire tour was sold out in a matter of days grossing somewhere in the neighborhood of five million. A nice neighborhood that I'm sure many of us would like to live in.

Enough of financial background. What about the music? Well, the music was very good by me, and judging by the pandemonium I saw erupting around me, it was judged stupendous by others. The 18,000 odd Dylan freaks who packed Maple Leaf Gardens in Toronto January 2nd and paid up to nine bucks apiece for a trip down memory-lane heard Mr. Zimmerman pick and sing his way through his career; at all times professional, but sometimes he surpassed the mere concert performance and lived up to the legendary tag. A personal favorite of the evening was "Ballad Of A Thin Man".

Another personal favorite was "Rag Mama Rag" by the Band, who backed up Dylan. It seems ludicrous to reduce the Band to back-up status, since they are major headliners and recording stars in their own right. Their back-up work was great and their solo set even better.

All in all, the evening was a total success from every possible angle, and because of the historical nature of the event, it was fantastic just being a part of the whole thing. — P.T.

JACKS/PETTINGER FORM GOLDFISH

This week Terry Jacks' Goldfish single, "Seasons In The Sun" tops the RPM 100 Chart and this week the official announcement of the forming of Goldfish Records has been issued.

Jacks, who first hit the wax scene with his London hit "Which Way You Goin' Billy?", has teamed with well-known independent promotion hustler, Ray Pettinger, in forming Goldfish Records. The label is distributed by London Records of Canada. Signed to the label is Susan Jacks, currently showing strong chart action with "I Thought Of You Again". The "Seasons" deck has already surpassed 125,000 units sold and is expected to certify for a Platinum Award within the next few weeks. Both Goldfish artists are also on release with album product.

Rumours about the forming of Goldfish label had tied-in Ken McFarland, former Ontario branch manager for London Records but these are unfounded. McFarland is currently in talks with industry VIPs and will make an announcement of his future plans at a later date.

various string instruments and the second ten to the playing of a bit of Bach or Tchaikovsky.

After this comes a screening of the film (many local school boards have bought or rented prints) and Solway's subsequent re-appearance dressed in character, to answer questions.

The question-and-answer period is always fresh and energetic and has prompted some 300 - 400 letters from children as well as parents. A young girl by the name of Sangjin Lee wrote: "Mr. Solway said he only made the movie to destroy the chaos and bring peace to the world. I felt just the same. I only wish that every person in this world that watched the movie could feel the same as I did. I also wish that someday in my generation that peace would occur in this world".

And that about sums up Maurice Solway's personal philosophy that he stresses through the film and his personal appearances — love and tolerance and the peace that can be attained with music.

Mr. Solway continues his promotional activities surrounding the film as well as the soundtrack album, recorded in August of last year and released on RCA Records a few weeks ago. His rounds take him on television, numerous press interviews and on January 26th he's off to Australia where "The Violin" is due to be shown on television.

Aside from his very apparent musical talents, the thing that strikes one most about Maurice Solway is his energy level. His days are completely filled, and if he isn't promoting the film and the album, then he's in transit between visits. But he wouldn't have it any other way.





WOLFMAN JACK MAKES HIS FIRST CANADIAN SHOWING

One of the world's most famous radio personalities, super-star jock Wolfman Jack, is scheduled to be one of the headliners at the annual Speed Sport '74 custom car show at the Toronto Fair Automotive Building January 25-27.

This will constitute the Wolfman's first Canadian personal appearance. The omnipresent announcer of NBC's "Midnight Special" is syndicated on 1453 American stations and in 43 countries. Wolfman Jack can also be seen in one of the top motion picture hits of the season, "American Graffiti".

York University radio students Bob Predovich and Peter Desrochers will co-ordinate a simulated radio setting for Wolfman to perform on while he takes requests from the audience and signs autographs for his many fans.

As an aside, over one million dollars worth of custom hot-rods, drag machines, sports cars and motorcycles will be on display at the 15th annual show that is expected to draw over 50,000 spectators during the three days it is in Toronto.

MC LAUCHLAN INTO FIRST HEADLINER

There are a few rare moments still left in the music business when one can sense an electricity surrounding an artist when his time has come. Murray McLauchlan's time has definitely come, and for those people who have grown fond of McLauchlan and his music, the time is way overdue.

Murray is currently riding high on critical acclaim for his latest True North album, "Day To Day Dust", but a man can starve



to death on critical acclaim, and he's done his share of the hungry poet singing his songs of life trip.

It seems that the fans and consumers out there are also starting to discover Murray, as they have helped him to attain an RPM Gold Leaf Award for his "Farmer's Song". "Farmer's Song" is what you call a hit, but lest you start throwing out the names of numerous "one hit wonders" now selling typewriters, Murray has followed up his hit with another one. "Hurricane of Change" has been creating quite a stir and when it's time is up his next will probably be even bigger.

His next single, "Linda Won't You Take Me In" on the True North label, is scheduled to be released when he makes his first major headline concert appearance on the Massey Hall stage January 26th. Murray returns to home turf Toronto following a very successful stateside tour opening for Neil Young. Audience reaction was highly favourable, with Murray garnering his share of standing ovations. No mean feat for a performer burdened with the task of warming up for a superstar.

Murray McLauchlan has been a highly respected songwriter since the early days when Tom Rush first recorded "Child's Song" and "Old Man's Song". Recently, McLauchlan compositions show up on David Wiffen's "Coast to Coast Fever" LP for United Artists ("You Need A New Lover Now"); on The New Gary Buck album for RCA and :Bobby Neuwirth, Bob Dylan's Road Manager, has recorded "Honky Red" on his upcoming debut album.

But McLauchlan is now being recognized for the great performer that he is. It is this performer who has graduated from his days of street singing and passing the hat in

IRVING/ALMO BOLSTERS A&M NATIONAL PICTURE

A&M Canada have laid plans to make 1974 their "thrust year" into the fields of songwriting/publishing and A&R. Gerry Lacourtiere, Vice-President of the Canadian operation for A&M, has given his top publishing and A&R management people the go ahead to bring A&M into more prominence in these fields.

Initial move was the formation of Irving/Almo -- the label's publishing arm headed up by General Manager Graham Powers. Working out of A&M's Toronto headquarters, the publishing companies chalked up a fair amount of success for their first year of operation.

Being out of the main stream of the big metropolis was somewhat of a drawback so plans were made to purchase a location near the downtown core. An eighty year old home that had been used recently as a frat house was found near the University of Toronto and handy to subway and surface transportation, appeared to be ideal for the operation. The house was purchased and, after a couple of months of renovating, Irving/Almo had a new home along with the company's A&R and talent direction division headed up by Pete Beauchamp.

Powers has been busy on the domestic and international scene, hocking his writers' wares. He has found interest from Rita Coolidge, Kenny Rogers, Three Dog Night, Cliff Edwards, Mickey Posner, and Roger Whittaker. His writers, Lorence Hud, Valdy and Greg Adams, have also been picking up recordings in the Quebec market as well as major recordings by artists in the U.S. and Europe. Powers noted: "It's amazing the amount of respect American and International producers have for Canadian singers and songwriters, due to the fact that many have gone to the U.S. or England and received the recognition they couldn't receive in Canada," adding "We are now trying to give them the chance and we can do this because we are completely independent of the U.S. Irving/Almo company and the Canadian company does not in any way depend on the American catalogue, therefore we can give Canadians what they need."

Powers expects to expand his roster of writers to six by the end of the year and to concentrate on the development of these writers much in the same way artists are developed.

Irving/Almo has also made moves into film scores. Writer Greg Adams has scored the soundtrack for the Canadian film production of "A Quiet Day In Belfast". The film is scheduled for release within the next few weeks.

SHIRLEY AND LEE - United Artists UALA069-U




This double record set is on United Artists' legendary Masters Series, including all monaural selections from way back: hits that made Shirley Goodman and Leonard Lee famous through their innumerable releases for Aladdin Records. Everything is written by Lee, with both of them sharing and exchanging vocal parts. Lots of the stuff is along the lines of "Saxophone Rock" with "Let The Good Times Roll" starting things off. Side two's "Feel So Good", a biggie which got action from various artists including the latest rendition by Slade, takes us back to days of the development of rock 'n roll and rhythm and blues. These pieces are ideal for nostalgia and rock 'n roll freaks and if you're planning a Saturday afternoon sock hop, it's perfect.

SUSAN JACKS - I Thought Of You Again Goldfish GLFP1002-K

With Susan's current single picking up action across the country, comes the album of the same title. Kicking off the set is a very commercial sounding "I Want You To Love Me" geared specially for contemporary rock listeners and tasting very much from Terry Jacks' application. Craig Wood's "No Siree" has by far the best commercial properties of anything on the album, with synthesizer backup and production, as well as Susan's voice, making up for a very well rounded presentation. A rendition of Randy Bachman's "We Passed Each Other By" is good love ballad material. Side two offers a lengthy version of "Build A Tower" where the combination of vocals and musical makeup give the album added strength.

GORDON LIGHTFOOT - Sundown Reprise MS2177-P

This is the latest release in a series of many greats. Avid fans will flip out and naturally will not be let down with this collection. They will wait impatiently for the March performance date when they can get an authentic dose of this master. There isn't one bad selection, only most favourites to choose from. Lightfoot is at his best with the six minute "Seven Island Suite" and here, as well as throughout most of the album, the synthesized background music of Gene Martynec enhances what the songman from Orillia is doing. Immediate action on this album in various markets of programming indicates its general acceptance all over. The "Sundown" rendition joins the rest of the selections in the "fine" category.



DONNA MOON - Bittersweet Marathon MMS 76022-C

Very new country artist just starting out on disc, Donna Moon debuts her talent with a little help from Eastern Sound's Ken Friesen. "Bittersweet", her current single is doing very well in country circles and gaining popularity (RPM No. 15). Nothing original here from Donna, yet her voice and quality of style make the delivery appealing from a country music standpoint. "Disturbed" is a recent hit "Satin Sheets" gets the application with good results. Background vocals are supplied by Maple Street.

An account of rock's comings and goings

LONDON

Let's play a game called "Did you know?"

Did you know that in 1964 the Rolling Stones were the first group to wear what they liked on stage?

Did you know that Fats Domino scored his 22nd million-seller in 1960 with "Walking To New Orleans"?

Did you know Bill Haley was born in Detroit and Del Shannon comes from Grand Rapids?

Did you know that the first records by Traffic ("Paper Sun"), the Move ("Night of Fear") and Pink Floyd ("Arnold Layne") were all released in 1967?

Did you know that the first Beatles record "My Bonnie" b/w "When The Saints Go Marching In" by Tony Sheridan and the Beatles, recorded in Hamburg, was released in 1961?

Did you know this month is the fifteenth anniversary of the terrible plane crash which took the lives of Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens and the Big Bopper?

Did you know the first version of the so-called "torch" song, "Fever", by Little Willie John sold a million copies in 1956, fully two years before the much better known but artistically-inferior Peggy Lee rendition?

Did you know that the youngest-ever artist to top the British charts is nine-year-old Jimmy Osmond who performed the feat in 1973 with a disc titled "Long Haired Lover From Liverpool"?

Did you know that RCA Records purchased Elvis Presley's recording contract and several masters from Sam Phillips of Sun Records for a mere \$35,000 in 1956?


Did you know that Bobby Lewis, the R&B star who shouted up a storm in 1961 with a chart topper entitled "Tossin' and Turnin'", actually came from an Indianapolis orphanage?

Did you know that 1968 was the year in which some top British groups stopped making singles, claiming they couldn't get their message across in less than three minutes?

And did you know that 1963, the so-called "vacuum year" prior to the invasion of the United States by the Beatles (assorted pop "experts" claim a lull in U.S. pop creativity at this time made it possible for the Beatles to happen) actually produced several of rock's greatest masterpieces, among them the Chiffons' "He's So Fine", "Heat Wave" by Martha and the Vandellas, the Drifters' "Up On The Roof", "Be My Baby" by the Ronettes, the Crystals' "Da Doo Ron Ron", "Louie Louie" by the Kingsmen, Little Stevie Wonder's "Fingertips Part 2", "Cry Baby" by Garnett Mimms and the Enchanters, Dionne Warwick's "Anyone Who Had A Heart" and "Mockingbird" by Inez Foxx.

A barren period indeed: so much for sop sociology.

All this information and much, much more is contained in a newly-published book by Andy Gray entitled Great Pop Stars (Hamlyn) which you should not miss. Great Pop Stars is a splendid combination of picture and pen, producing portraits of the people and the records which have



brought rock music from 1955 until now. There are more than 250 pictures, 16 full-page color shots included. They are pictures of the stars as they were then, and you can readily imagine how amusing many of them now appear.

Andy Gray, of course, is uniquely qualified to produce a book such as this: more than any one person I can recall, his journalistic career stretches right through the era of rock. Andy was the editor of the world's largest-selling pop weekly, the New Musical Express, from 1957-71 — he watched the early struggles of the British pop scene as it tried in vain to react to the overwhelming inflow of American pop music, he was there to document the blast of the Beatles, and he interviewed all of the most prominent rock stars from both the U.S. and Britain at the height of their careers.

Yet (and I suspect, wisely) Andy has not attempted to explain the how and why of it all — he restricts himself to dealing with the success stories of each year. This I believe is how most rock enthusiasts would want it. And as one of the most widely-read writers of his genre, Andy Gray offers an account of rock's comings and goings in both America and England that you won't find anywhere else.

Great Pop Stars is full of delightful trivia, the sort of stuff which the nostalgia-breathing mob is devouring these days. As they say on Carnaby Street, this book is gonna go down a bomb!

STRONG INITIAL REACTION TO JOEY GREGORASH DECK

The initial reaction to Joey Gregorash's new single is very promising to say the least. The song, "You've Been Wrong" was co-written by Gregorash and Risko and recorded in Nashville under the production auspices of Ron Capone.

One of the first believers in the strength of the single was Roy Hennesey, Music Director of CKLG Vancouver, who said: "Strongest release he (Gregorash) has had in his last three releases . . . has definite potential".

"You've Been Wrong" was an immediate addition to the playlist of CHAM, Hamilton, where M.D. Greg Stewart referred to it as "the strongest material he has ever had".

The people at Polydor are equally as enthusiastic and "will be driving hard to convert a fine record into a big hit", according to Richard Glanville-Brown.

Reading through the book you cannot help but gain some perspective on the rock music phenomenon. This counter-culture's mortality rate, for example, is one of the evidences of moral degeneration that the Establishment is always throwing up at us. But when you really get down to it, not that many rock talents have suffered an early demise. Certainly the loss of superb talents of the ilk of Duane Allman, Jimi Hendrix, Sam Cooke, Buddy Holly, and Otis Redding remain tragedies of the highest order; but considering the occupational hazards of this tottering age, things might easily have been a lot worse.

Look, for example, how many motion picture celebrities and jazz musicians have met with an unnatural end during the same period.

Not to leave you on a morbid note, let me hasten to add that another reason why I am so impressed by Andy Gray's new book is that it has Marc Bolan on the jacket, wearing a pair of my trousers. The 'ide of 'im!

Funny line of the week: Ringo Starr, in an interview with David Wigg of the Daily Express: "I think it's the finest business in the world -- the music business."

ACADEMY AWARD NOMINATION FOR ANNE MURRAY SINGLE

Last week Anne Murray received a telephone call from Hollywood informing her that "Send A Little Love My Way" has been nominated as one of the ten finalists for the 1973 Academy Awards in the Best Motion Picture Theme category.

Her recording, from the movie "Oklahoma Crude", was written by Henry Mancini and Hal David with production by Brian Ahern of Toronto. The film itself was produced by Stanley Kramer and starred Faye Dunaway and George C. Scott.

SWEETWATER RECORDS RELEASES DEBUT DECKS

West Coast based Sweetwater Records, a division of Studio 3 Productions, has just shipped three brand new singles.

The first deck off, "So In Love With You Baby" is by Sugarbabe and the Stu Kuby penned/produced tune should fit well into either a pop or contemporary format.

"The One You Got" comes from new artist Michael Palmer and again this single spans both contemporary and pop stylings. "The One You Got" was produced and arranged in the Studio 3 facilities by Stu Kuby.

Wrapping up this initial Sweetwater release is Alan Moberg's self-penned country deck "The Long Left Hand Of Life", which was produced by Jake Doell.

For the present Sweetwater Records will be handling their own distribution, but the label president Ralph Harding, has been negotiating with a number of companies for national distribution.



WORLD OF MUSIC RETURNS TO CBC-TV FOR NINE WEEKS

CBC-TV's internationally-produced classical music series, "World Of Music", returns to the network on Sunday afternoons, 3-4PM, commencing January 20th.

This season, the series comprises nine hour-long colour specials with the first program, A Soldier's Tale by Stravinsky coming from England. The chamber opera stars Svetlana Beriosova and Robert Helpmann and is directed by Michael Birkett.

Other programs in the series include two specials from the CBC French network: a Beethoven concert by the Montreal Symphony Orchestra and a folk ballet by dancers from Bali.

Programs in the "World Of Music" series will also originate from Spain, France, Germany, Italy and India.

VANCOUVER COMPANY TO SYNDICATE RADIO SHOWS

Currently being circulated is the demo version of a new, syndicated radio program that is to be submitted to Canadian stations shortly by Kaleido-Sound Productions of Vancouver.

The program is called Canadian Top 40 and is comprised of a weekly countdown of the best selling records in Canada (it should be emphasized that it is not made up exclusively of Canadian records).

The two principals of Kaleido-Sound are Clive M. Corcoran, President and Michael Morgan, Vice-president, and the expressed intention of the company is to offer a wide variety of pre-produced programming to Canadian radio stations, both AM and FM, and in general to promote domestic musical talent.

Both Corcoran and Morgan hope to have the production of the weekly programs in full swing by March of this year. Canadian Top 40 will be packaged on a 12 inch LP to be pressed at the Imperial Record Corporation of Vancouver. If vinyl allotments become scarce, arrangements have been made to transfer the shows to tape.

Taking effect Jan 7th, CKPC Prince George, B.C. effected the first major format change in over two years. The basis of their new music policy will be uptown country similar to what is working so successfully in Calgary, Victoria and Red Deer - with modifications to suit local conditions.

Are we ever going to get it over to the trade that this is not a consumer paper. For ten years now we have been publishing trade news, trade charts and trade information, and for some reason the trade insists on either sending us "fan-type" press releases, and consumer oriented ads.

Of course, we have consumer subscribers, but the bulk of our subscribers are in the music business. Very few radio stations don't subscribe to RPM. Some have more than one subscription. Record companies, producers, songwriters, record stores, studios, equipment manufacturers, booking agents, personal managers, one-stops, record distributors, artists, allied fields to the record industry and government agencies. They are all paying subscribers. You can count on one hand how many gratis copies we sent out each week to Canadians.

We do send a large number of free copies to hitmaking radio stations in the United States, but our free list in Canada is very small.

Recently someone claimed that RPM is of the opinion that all Canadian records are good. On the contrary, RPM has no feeling as to whether records are good or bad (within our pages) but if you really want an answer, off the record, I would say that

per capita, there are more bad records released in the United States than in Canada. Few of the really bad U.S. releases ever get into the hands of Canadians. Records are screened carefully before they are released in Canada.

Canada does produce its share of bad records, but there is really nothing that can be done about one man's food being another man's poison. To the young and inexperienced in the business, their own personal tastes are often inflicted on others. The industry really operates to make available to the public records that might capture their imagination. What you might consider a bad record (for whatever reason at all) could turn out to be a number one (million seller) a few weeks later.

We can go back to that old favorite the Beatles who in 1963 bowed their first records and they were not released by Capitol. Capitol chose not to go with them and they were released on other smaller labels in the U.S. On station after station, they either weren't aired or lost the battle on the radio shows that asked the public to pick hits. The Beatles died. In early 1964 the same records became monster sellers and the rest of the story is now history.

We don't think everything Canadian is good, but who cares what we think. When the records get exposure and sales they are indifferently listed on our charts because they have achieved that recognition.

Newspaper reviewers do not review all records, therefore, they protect the public only from records that have achieved some importance and will be bought by fans because of a fad and a certain form of

exploitation, and not because of the reviewer's personal likes or dislikes.

Were I a record company, I would not supply records to newspaper reviewers for review purposes, and were I a reviewer, I would not accept records from record companies for reviews. I would buy them myself and not be influenced by the records sent to me or by the number of records sent to me or by passes given to me for concerts. RPM doesn't review records, so we don't have that problem. We do feature new releases with a few words about what kind of music is contained and we name a few cuts.

We've all heard the great cry that country records do not sell. It has been my opinion, for some time, that they would sell a heck of a lot better if they were put in the stores. The distribution really is bad because, for years now, the CBC-TV network has had to come to us to get the records they want their country stars to do on their shows. The same thing applies to the CTV network. They can't buy them in the stores in Toronto and they can't waste the time being serviced by the individual record companies.

This past week the ultimate happened. We have charted no less than eight records from one company and I received a note saying that seven of the eight will not be released in Canada. You have no idea how much trouble this situation incurs for the retail outlets and for us. The phone calls drive us nuts from people who say they can't find the record in the stores and want to know why. We must continue to play them though because they are giant hits.

None of us, including the record companies, in question, have any idea how much money could be made with the proper sales attitudes.

HANDICAPPED GROUP HAS AMBITION AND A SET GOAL

C-JAZ Radio is the name being adopted by a small, but growing group of handicapped people all interested in the field of broadcasting and working towards starting a commercial AM radio station in North Vancouver.

The group was formed in the spring of 1968 because of the difficulty encountered in finding radio employment by various members of the organization. Another important reason for the founding of C-JAZ was to prove to people that the handicapped are capable of performing in a situation like this just as well as the next guy. They also want to help other handicapped people to stride towards self-identity.

Among the steps taken helping them towards their goals, was the setting up of closed-circuit broadcasting in various shopping centres and fairs in the greater Vancouver area. The first appearance took place at the P.N.E. in 1969, with the reasons behind the broadcasts being to promote the group and gain public support and recognition.


