

Canada outshines Hollywood stars

The National Ballet of Canada held its Second Annual Celebrity Tennis Tournament April 5, 6 and 7th and in one sense it was a success but financially, a bust.


The event was kicked off with a benefit rock concert at Maple Leaf Gardens, Toronto, by two of Canada's top recording groups, Guess Who and the Stampeders. The concert drew close to 13,000 fans and grossed almost \$63,000.00.

The ballet reportedly paid \$5000.00 for tennis headliner Bobby Riggs and in an effort to assure themselves of a successful event paid another \$1,200.00 for tennis pro Pancho Segura. Peter Sever, ballet assistant manager, claims the tournament grossed approximately \$10,000.00.

Pepsi-Cola, which sponsored the three day event, donated \$15,000.00 and the Tennis Club another \$3,500.00 and besides this the Women's Committee of the Ballet brought in \$15,000.00 from the patrons package ticket sales. The advertising in the souvenir booklet grossed another \$3,000.00.

Even though such stars, as Abbey Dalton, Mickey Dolenz, Sandra Giles, Cathy Lee Crosby and other celebrities attended the tournament at Windfield Indoor Racquets Club, only half of the 6,000 expected showed for the two day event. The services



SINGLE ACTION LOOKS HEALTHY FOR POLYDOR

The up and down importance of the single would appear to be up for Polydor this month. Mark Hodes, national singles promotion, reports a wide open programmer door for the recently released "People & Spring & Love" by Sunshine featuring Claude Philippe. Canadian "pop" giants have been so taken with the Canadian production they took the time to pen their comments to Hodes. Barbara Pocock of CJAD Montreal found "Immediate phone response" with CFRN's (Edmonton) Mike Cranston reporting "This is great. We'll use this right away." Harry Boon of CJCA Edmonton asks "How come there aren't more good Canadian singles like this, instead of all those gloomy ballads; this is what we are always looking for". Also out of Edmonton, Don Andrews of CHQT found the single as "It's a nice light tune". Other stations adding the single to their playlists are CFCF/Montreal, CFRB/Toronto and CKFM/Toronto.

Hodes is re-servicing the Sami Jo single, "Tell Me A Lie" together with a copy of the lyrics. He is convinced the single failed to reach its full potential and is hopeful of breaking the MGM single across the country.

Don Goodwin, who qualifies for two part Cancon (ML) on his Silver Blue single, "Time To Cry" (the words and lyrics were written by Paul Anka), looks like he's off to a good start with an almost immediate charting at CKOC/Hamilton and playlisting at CKLW/Windsor, CHEX and CKPT in Peterborough and CHUM/Toronto.

Back into the single fray once again comes the Five Man Electrical Band with one of their strongest entries for some time. "Werewolf" has picked up several major markets in the U.S. and would appear to be breaking nationally in Canada.

The big news from Polydor is the chart success of Bachman-Turner Overdrive's "Let It Ride". Polydor's national team of promotion people put a great deal of effort behind this single and the album from which it was culled. The big payoff for Polydor and BTO was this year's Juno Awards. Bachman-Turner Overdrive were honoured as Most Promising Group of the Year and the "Bachman-Turner Overdrive" album picked up a Juno as Contemporary album of the Year.

RUTLEDGE TOUR COINCIDES WITH VAN-LOS RELEASE

Singer-songwriter Doug Rutledge has embarked on a three month tour of major and secondary centres in British Columbia and Alberta to coincide with the release of his Van-Los single, "Necessary Man" f/s "It's About Time". The tour consists of a series of dates varying in length from three days to a week from north to south and east to west in the two provinces.

Upon Rutledge's return to the Vancouver area he will immediately enter the studio for an album session before again hitting the road for a nation-wide tour. Van-Los is independently distributed.

QUALITY & MUSIC SHOPPE SHOWCASE CANADIAN ACTS

The first of what is a hoped-for series of showcasing Canadian artists, took place at Wexford Collegiate Institute in Scarborough (Toronto) Friday, March 29. Billed as Quality Records Artist Showcase Concert, the two hour show was put together by Quality and Music Shoppe Booking Agency.

The latter is one of the most aggressive of booking agencies on the scene today.

Featured at the show were Kanata recording artist, Peter Foldy and, from Celebration, Karen & David, Sugar Cane and Chester.

Those in attendance included high school and college entertainment buyers as well as press representatives. The show resulted in a number of engagements for the acts being firmed.

Emcee of the show was Quality's Joe Owens. Co-ordinating the show with Owens was Quality's national merchandising manager, Peter Graham and representatives from Music Shoppe.

Special "goodie" bags containing Quality promotion material and single and album product was handed out to the audience.

ADAM TIMOON TO MARATHON

Adam Timoon, well-known on the club circuit in Canada and the U.S., has been signed to a recording contract with Marathon. Timoon is currently working the Seaway Hotel chain as well as industrial shows for General Motors. He was held over for so long at the Seaway in Toronto they named a room after him — Adam's Room.

Marathon's A&R chief, Doug Taylor, has scheduled an album release for Timoon entitled "The Incredible Adam Timoon" which gives the singer a live concert atmosphere and gets him into pop, rock and Broadway show tunes.

PIERRE & FORESTIER GET IT ON AT TEMPO

Studio activity at Montreal's Tempo studios has been centred around two well-known Quebec female artists — Isabelle Pierre and Louise Forestier.

Ms. Pierre will shortly complete her set which is being engineered by Ian Terry and features Mario Bruneau on guitar; Leon Aronson, piano; Richard Pelletier, drums; and Gene Kurtz and Jean-Guy Chapados, bass. Lyrics for the Pierre session were put together by Roch Poisson with guitarist Bruneau in charge of the arranging. The album is to be released on the Barclay label, distributed by Polydor.

The Forestier album will not be released until September, allowing the artist to honour a European tour. The album is being produced by Editions OK-Solset Inc. with engineering duties taken on by Michel Lachance of Studio Tempo. The album release will be on Gamma, distributed by London.

EDMONTON SYMPHONY SET FOR ITV TAPING

Edmonton's ITV, or CITV as it is licensed by the CRTC, will go on the air shortly with a diet of movies, public affairs programming, variety offerings and significantly, a series of six concerts featuring the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra. ITV is breaking new ground in several areas. Firstly, it is the first independent UHF channel to be licensed in western Canada. Further it will be one of the few commercial television outlets in North America to give support and exposure to a symphony orchestra on a regular basis.

Additionally, the channel will provide a good avenue of exposure for contemporary talent via the "Tommy Banks Show" scheduled to premiere this fall. The daily hour long program is expected to feature artists of international stature set against a backdrop of local western musicians.

VANCOUVER'S CHRIST CHURCH FEATURES NORMAN'S ROCK MASS

Vancouver's threatened Christ Church Cathedral played home this week to a multi-media "rock mass" composed and co-ordinated by the city's Marek Norman. For six nights the beautiful old church rocked to the sounds of a forty piece band and a one hundred and fifty voice choir, operating under the collective name of the Vancouver Youth Orchestra and Choir.

The fourteen-part mass was recorded live by Stoney Sound of North Vancouver for future release in album form.

The mammoth production, including a bevy of dancers, was also taped by the CBC in anticipation of an hour-long broadcast over the entire network sometime around Easter. Proceeds from the six-day long engagement go to the United Appeal.

CANADIAN & U.S. ACTS SIGNED TO MARATHON

Marathon, known basically as a Canadian content country label, has stretched south to Nashville to pick up three top performers from that Music Capitol of the U.S. Signed to a recording contract are Donna Darlene, the Calhoun Twins and Shot Jackson. The trio of acts will fly into Toronto on the Calhoun's Lear jet for an April recording session.

Jackson, known for his talents on the dobro, can be heard on the Roy Clark "Family" album and has chalked up many U.S. national television appearances including "Flip Wilson" and "Hee-Haw".

Canadian country group, The Eastwinds, with Johnny Burke as leader, have also been signed to Marathon. They appear regularly on the popular "Harry Hibbs Show".




claims she has never been happier in her life and she plans to do her concerts and to work with the religious group when time permits. She will also continue to live in and work out of Nashville.

CANADIAN SCENE BECKONS RAPSON

Canadian Bob Rapson, enjoying a successful career in modelling and television work in the U.S., may return to Canada to become involved in the recording scene. He is currently working through Midland International a label on which he will release his single, "Someday", a recent Eurovision winner.

A&M'S ALPERT & ALBUM READY FOR MARKET

Herb Alpert and the Tijuana Brass have set their sights on the disc and personal appearance market after an absence of almost five years. The Alpert album has already been released in the U.S. and should be ready for Canada by the time Alpert and his crew open at Harrah's in Lake Tahoe April 19.

Alpert the trumpeter teamed up with Jerry Moss back in the late sixties and their first production, "The Lonely Bull" started the Alpert ball rolling. It was in 1969 when Alpert was at his peak and had sold more than forty-five million albums when he decided to go behind the scenes at A&M.

His new album, "You Smile - The Song Begins" is what Alpert refers to as "a fresh inspiration".

URIAH HEEP & SLADE OFF WITH POLYDOR

Canada has one up on the U.S. with the Mercury release of "The Best of Uriah Heep" (SRM 1-695). The album, not yet available in the U.S., was developed in Canada and comprises the best of the group during the period they were with Mercury (middle of last year).

The new Slade album, "Old, New, Borrowed and Blue" (Polydor 2383 261) has created some confusion with the U.S. release on Warner Bros, entitled "Stomp Your Hands, Clap Your Feet". The cover design is the same which also confuses the issue.

Slade have experienced some difficulty in North America with single releases that have proven giant sellers in other countries. The Canadian operation of Polydor established the group with their last single which had some spillover effect in the U.S. The Canadian single success has led to a healthy album situation.

BITTER BLUE, which is booked to September and engagements are now being negotiated to December. Castle Management has been obtained as Entertainment Consultants by MacKenzie's Corner House, 620 Church Street, Toronto, to bring in such top acts as ROY BUCHANNAN, EDWIN HAWKINS SINGERS, JERRY JEFF WALKER and even top Canadian acts as DAVID CLAYTON THOMAS and JESSE WINCHESTER. Artists managed by Castle are: BERTH, BITTER BLUE, COTTONWOOD, GREGORY LEE FITZPATRICK, ANN LOUGH, PURE COUNTRY PLEASURE, STRAW BOAT and FRED WERTHMAN Good Luck Jim & Bill.

JULES RABKIN, has been obtained as Entertainment Director for the Savarin Restaurant & Tavern, Toronto. Jules as most of us know is the Personal Manager for BOBBY G. GRIFFITH and has done a most successful job in this field.

CONCERT PRODUCTIONS INTERNATIONAL, will be presenting HAWKINS with MAN, FAIRPORT CONVENTION with TIM BUCKLEY, GENESIS, and GEORGE CARLIN during April and May, all at Massey Hall, Toronto.

SCRUBBALOE CAINE will be appearing at Massey Hall April 14th, Toronto with STEELY DAN, presented by ENCORE PRODUCTIONS.

GREASEBALL BOOGIE BAND, will be doing their special at the Colonial Tavern, Yonge Street, Toronto, from June 24th to the 29th. At this time, they will be present-

ing their new show and performing with the band will be the CATHY, MOREEN and ELAINE MURPHY, formerly from SUGAR & SPICE, Winnipeg.

YORKE'S ENTERTAINMENT CONTACTS, with offices in Newfoundland and Nova Scotia, have arranged a three week tour for A FOOT IN COLDWATER, beginning May 3rd. The suite contains four movements and is one of the composer's most brilliant orchestral scores. Alexander Borodin's opera "Prince Igor" is represented by the Overture which was written down from the recollection of a single performance on the piano by Glazunov, and scored by Rimsky-Korsakov, and the popular Polovetsian Dances which are presented here in their original version for chorus and orchestra. Beautiful playing enhanced by superb sound.

This Fontana disc which is pressed in Canada and distributed in Canada by London Records of Canada (1967) Ltd. is directed exclusively to Quebec listeners. The titles, and liner notes are printed in the French language only. Perhaps a separate release is planned for English speaking Canada. The album appears to contain a group for works written for the King's supper by Baroque composer de Francois de Boisvallee. Selections include a suite titled "Musique pour les fetes d'eau", a three movement work titled Premier Concert, followed by Deuxieme Concert for 2 Mandolines, string orchestra and harpsichord, and Troisieme Concert for piccolo, bassoon, strings and harpsichord, and concluding with a Tambourin Champetre. The performances under the direction of Paul Bonneau are authoritative and the recorded sound is fine.

HANDEL OverturesThe London Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Karl Richter
DGG 2530 342

The London Philharmonic Orchestra reinforce their reputation as one of the world's greatest Symphony Orchestras in this latest Deutsche Grammophon release containing nine overtures from operas by Georg Friedrich Handel. The orchestra is here under the direction of Karl Richter and the harpsichord continue is played by Hedwig Bilgram. The contents include Overtures to Alcina, Deidamia, Agrippina, Radamisto, Rinaldo, Jephtha, Rodelinda, Belshazzar and Susanna. The orchestra plays with breathtaking dash and virtuosity and DGG engineers have captured their characteristic sound with the utmost fidelity. The music has tremendous virility and nobility and should be a part of every collection.


KING OF THE HIGH C'sLuciano Pavarotti - Tenor





Alicia de Larrocha - pianist

Spanish pianist Alicia de Larrocha has over the past twenty years gained a reputation as the greatest interpreter of the vast repertoire of keyboard music by the greatest composers of Spain. Isaac Albeniz composed the suite of twelve compositions entitled Iberia in the early years of this century. They are considered among the most difficult works in all keyboard litera-

ture and they have always held a special place in the repertoire of Alicia de Larrocha who recorded them for Epic label and Erator label on previous occasions. Her latest London recording benefits from superlative recorded sound. Side two contains a brilliant virtuoso work called Navarra which was intended as an added number to the Iberia suite but was left incomplete when Albeniz died. It was completed by French composer Deodat de Severac and dedicated to French pianist Marguerite Long. The set concludes with a first rate performance of the suite "Cantos de Espana" which contains a Prelude, Orientale, Sous le Palmier, Cordoba and Seguidillas. Better performances throughout could hardly be imagined.


GREAT PIANISTS OF THE WORLD
HMV HLM 7008

This EMI import is available in Canada through Capitol Records. It is a must for all lovers of great piano artistry. The programme begins with a performance by Dame Myra Hess of the Scarlatti Sonata in G, L. 387, full of sparkle and laughter. Edwin Fischer plays the "Turkish Rondo" by Mozart, and Artur Schnabel is superb in Schubert's Gb major Impromptu and the Moment Musical Op. 94 No. 3. The piano music of Brahms was always a specialty of Wilhelm Backhaus as the 1936 performances of the Intermezzo Op. 117 No. 1 and Capriccio in B minor Op. 76 No. 2 indicate. The side ends with the Gounod/Liszt Waltz from Faust played with steely-fingered dexterity by Egon Petri. Alred Cortot begins side two with the Chopin Nocturne in Eb and Impromptu in Gb Op. 51, followed by Dinu Lipatti's superb performance of Ravel's Alborada del Gracioso. Walter Gieseking plays Debussy's La fille aux cheveux de lin and La plus que lente with memorable sensitivity, and the disc concludes with three Rachmaninoff Preludes played by the greatest of Rachmaninoff interpreters, Benno Moiseiwitsch. A wonderful souvenir of the golden age of keyboard pianism.

WINCHESTER AT TORONTO'S MacKENZIE CORNER HOUSE

Jesse Winchester is one of those rare artists who enjoy an almost fanatically loyal following. What he does, he does extremely well. His music is a subtle mix of folk and blues, most of the time, with a sensitivity capable of personally captivating an audience — providing the audience is willing to make a reciprocating effort. Sometimes they aren't.


Winchester played last week at Toronto's MacKenzie Corner House. Despite a cover

The campaign to save Vancouver's Orpheum Theatre moved into high gear this week with a major benefit performance by Jack Benny and one hundred and ten members of the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra. Proceeds from the concert go to the drive to save the turn of the century showplace from the wreckers' balls and to restore and renovate it into a condition where it can continue to serve as a major venue in this city.

The Orpheum, seating close to three thousand, is an elaborate monument to show-business architecture of the early nineteen hundreds. Its gilt ceilings, beautiful foyer, immense chandelier, and other touches set it a world apart from contemporary theatres. In recent years the word has been out that the Orpheum would be reduced to rubble in order to accommodate a concrete and steel shoebox, prompting a cry of outrage from far and wide. Commitments are now being sought from the various levels of government that funds will be made available to safeguard and restore this monumental work of art from destruction.

JOSE FELICIANO — For My Love . . . Mother Music —
RCA APL1-0266-N

This album was put together to follow up "Compartments" and it has done that, plus in my opinion it is a far superior disc. His Spanish style shows through in both his vocals and his guitar work. The use of both Moog and Arp synthesizers on both his strings and his horns give it a moody quality. For easy listening or for entertainment this is definitely a favorite. Side one has one cut by Harry Chapin, "I Want to Learn a Love Song" backed up by "Blame it on the Sun". Side two has "Shoo-fly" and one of the title songs "Mother Music". I found this album so enjoyable that I would buy it.

BO DIDDLEY — Big Bad Bo — Chess 9033-50047-T

In keeping with his past record of hits Bo Diddley has once again come up with another good product. His sound is unmistakable but it varies from rock to soul to blues. The extensive use of the horn section really gives you a "big sound" to please any stereo buff. His voice coupled with a slight amount of background vocals gives the album the sound he is famous for. From the sound of this disc you can tell why Bo Diddley is where he is today, and why his concerts and personal appearances are so widely acclaimed. Side one leads off with "Bite You" and "Hit or Miss" both of which really showcase his talent. On the flip side, we find a touch of a message in "Stop the Pusher". The album comes to a close with a song by Van Morrison known as "I've Been Workin'".






More than sixty minutes of comfortable country listening with some of the big names in the business including: Donna Moon, Mercey Brothers, Gary Buck, Harry Hibbs, Lynn Jones, George Hamilton IV, Dick Nolan, Marg Osburne, Family Brown, Carlton Showband, Diane Leigh and more. The package is certainly a collector's item and a must for country programmers. This is the first album of its kind and a great tribute to Canadian country music.

WILF CARTER — My Old Canadian Home — RCA KCL1-7007-N

With more than forty years of plugging his brand of Canadian country, this album is in keeping with Carter's image as Canada's first internationally-known country folk singer. The title song was co-written by Carter, John Klenner and Bob Miller. The Carter voice hasn't suffered any for the years of wear as evidenced by his yodelling on several cuts and in particular on "When It's Springtime In The Rockies" a Mary Hale Woolsey and Robert Sauer composition.

THE BRAZDA BROTHERS — Dominion LPS-93077

The Brothers Brazda have brought a little European folk to these shores and have attempted to mold a bit of North American everything into their first effort. As pure folksters Gin and Andy Brazda would probably fare much better than experimenting with sounds they are obviously not in tune with. A bit more knowledge of the English language would also help. Clean, simple lyrics would probably take the strain off what could ordinarily be strong communicative voices.



THE MOM AND DADS — Love Is A Beautiful Song —
MCA 17025-J

They're back, Doris, Les, Quentin and Harold, flashing a Burt Kaempfert type album and already chalking up good sales with their unusual brand of old tyme music. This group has to be one of the most unique in the business. Seasoned programmers and record people wince when they first hear the Mom and Dads but marvel at the listener and buyer response when word gets around that a new album is in. You might laugh but so are the Mom and Dads . . . all the way to the bank. If you have any doubts, and guts, try a cut or two on your listeners.

The tennis tournament has been reportedly dismissed as a financial failure and a disappointment to the Ballet. The rock concert which drew 13,000 grossed \$63,000 and was considered by the Ballet as a "huge success". Both the Guess Who and the Stampeders are Canadian acts residing in Canada.

THE EXCITING CASE OF (CBC vs. CRTC) vs. PARLIAMENT

The last few days have seen the CRTC winning over more print space and broadcast time than streakers, and probably causing more of a sensation. The Commission made some very strong demands on the CBC in an attempt to rid the network of "the North American merchandising system" and to combat the influence of the mushrooming growth of American television via cable. How the reduction of Canadian mass-appeal programming is to increase the influence of the CBC on Canadian viewers should be interesting to see.

At any rate, the most controversial demand is the phase-out of advertising on the network. The CBC's annual budget is \$210 million, augmented by a sizeable \$53 million in advertising revenue. The loss of this sum, in addition to the increased cost of programming the CRTC is calling for (estimated at double the present budget) poses a helpless situation for the CBC. Pierre Juneau has openly admitted that these demands cannot be met without further funding from Parliament. And so the power play is on, revolving around the CBC.

In addition to the critical situation the CBC is in, fear has been expressed that some of the thirty privately owned CBC affiliates will also be in financial difficulty since they receive a share of the CBC advertising

revenue. The Canadian Advertisers Association has also expressed fear that a monopoly in television advertising will result in escalating rate cards.

The image of the CRTC certainly seems to be that of a power hungry bully. But to quote the Broadcast Act of 1968, "the national broadcasting service should be a . . . service of information, enlightenment and entertainment for people of different ages, interests and tastes covering the whole range of programming in fair proportion . . . serving the special needs of geographic regions . . . and contributing to the development of national unity . . . predominantly Canadian in content and character." That is the law which the CRTC is required to interpret and enforce. The Commission is taking this responsibility seriously and certainly cannot be criticized for that.

But the result is a political face-off precipitated by the CRTC. Parliament passed the Act and is now faced with the realities of it. The CBC and the CRTC will get together to iron out a practical compromise in the near future to present to Parliament. If a compromise is not found, Gerard Pelletier, Communications Minister, will arbitrate and the power of the CRTC will be at stake. Even if a compromise is found, the CRTC's power will still be in the hands of Parliament. Certainly these are critical days for the Commission.





**McGOWAN AWARD WINNER
— ALEXANDER ZELKINE —**

Alexander Zelkine was born in 1938 in Lyon (France) and at an early age, accompanying himself on the guitar, he began to sing the folk songs of his two motherlands (his father was Russian and his mother is French). By the time he was twenty his adventurous life was leading him through Europe, the Middle-east,



Israel and Africa, where during the Algerian War, he was drafted by the army and spent two years in the conflict (two years he regards as torn out of his life).

In 1966, after almost two years in the United States, where he recorded his first album, appeared on T.V. (The Pete Seeger Show), was presented by Theodore Bikel at the 1965 Newport Folk Festival and worked as a free-lance press and fashion photographer, he decided to settle down in Montreal and is now a Canadian Citizen.

Since his arrival in French Canada, his reputation as a folk singer, musician and storyteller has never stopped growing. Zelkine has been most successful in universities, colleges, cultural centres and "Boites a Chansons"; has appeared on many television shows like "Jeunesse Oblige", "Fine & Dandy", "Les Cailloux", "Cent Mille Chansons", "Zoom" and "Sous Mon Toit" in Montreal, and "World of Music" and "Islands & Princesses" in Toronto.

In November of 1968, Zelkine gave his first recital for American students at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York and later he appeared at Harvard receiving a wonderful, enthusiastic response from the students at both schools.

In concert, Zelkine sings songs from France, Russia, Israel, Spain, Romania, Argentina, Bolivia, Peru, Mexico, England, Ireland, U.S.A., Canada and from his Yiddish and Gypsy repertoires. His act is also punctuated by story-telling, poem recitals and throughout, he accompanies himself on guitar and balalaika.

Alexander Zelkine has experienced much success since joining United Artists, unfortunately all of it in Quebec. His album, "Pessimiste" containing the popular single, "Come Away Melinda" chalked up heavy sales. At the recent Juno Awards' presentations he was honoured as the first recipient of CHIN Radio's Douglas McGowan Award (a painting by Manitoba artist Joseph Sanchez) to be awarded annually.




