Publishing breaking out in Canada

Canadian publishing, particularly the Chappell/Canada variety, is "experiencing a record burst of activity" according to Jerry Renewych, professional manager for Chappell's Toronto-based office.

Renewych went on to claim that "Publishing has been overlooked in Canada up until now. But, within the next two years, I see an explosion in this area with the ensuing competition greatly improving the quality of the material to be recorded by Canadian artists". Renewych is also of the opinion that this activity will supply the Canadian writers with the aid they need in "gaining international acceptance".

Two Chappell copyrights that have become accepted by the radio programmer and record buyer are "Where Is The Answer" by Copper Penny and Shawne Jackson's "Just As Bad As You". The latter, released on the Playboy label (a U.S. firm) made excellent gains up the RPM 100 chart but failed to get a foothold in the U.S. market.

Chappell have also signed co-publishing deals — one such deal with Harry Hinde, an American now living and producing in Canada. His acts include Copper Penny, Ruckus, Ken Hollis, Tony Kingston and Phyllis Brown. They have also been active in the development of writer/performer Harry Marks, who they just placed with Polydor Canada. The Toronto office is now negotiating a record deal for the Detroit-based Brussel Sprout.

Renewych has been busy picking up material from other international offices of Chappell.

ARCHER RELEASES ON CONDOR LABEL

Condor, a recent label entry into the country field and already experiencing success with the Newman Sisters, are continuing this pattern with a single release from Con Archer. Entitled "Happy Anniversary", the RPM sampling for the past couple of weeks indicates that Archer has a strong initial single and enters the RPM Country Playlist this week at No. 38.

Born at Bourlamaque, P.Q. and raised in Orillia, Ontario, Archer began his singing career in church choirs and performing at weddings and local dances. He went on to star at country jamborees, and became popular on the club circuit as well as with television audiences. No stranger to the recording scene, Archer has released several albums over the years.

POLYDOR/PABLO PACT DISTRIBUTION DEAL

Pablo, the Norman Granz jazz label will be distributed in Canada by Polydor Records. Initial release for the month of July will be six albums including a three record set featuring various jazz greats including Oscar Peterson, Count Basie, Ella Fitzgerald and others. The release will also include albums by the Oscar Peterson Trio, Duke Ellington Quartet, Count Basie with Joe Turner doing the vocals, Joe Pass and Ella Fitzgerald. The latter will be rather unique in that Fitzgerald is accompanied only by Joe Pass on the guitar.

Granz is well-known in jazz circles and was the founder of the Verve label back in the 40s. He also organized the highly successful Jazz of the Philharmonics concerts which toured through the 50s. Pablo is New York based.

ECM PRODUCT STRENGTHENS POLYDOR'S JAZZ CATALOGUE

Polydor continues to strengthen their jazz catalogue particularly with new releases from ECM. Ready for release is a three record set by Keith Jarrett, a very popular item in Europe. Jarrett, an American jazz pianist has, over the years, been associated with several of the big names in jazz including Miles Davis. His new package comprises two recent concerts in Europe.

Also on tap is an album release by Dave Liebman, "Lookout Farm" and "The Colours of Chloe" by Eberhard Weber.

Polydor has experienced good response for the ECM label from those dealers specializing in jazz.

BITS AND PIECES FROM THE WEST

Polydor's national promotion manager, Allen Katz, is now back in Montreal following a whirlwind tour of the west with stops in Calgary and Vancouver. Columbia's Frank Gigliotti just completed the rounds of Alberta while RCA's John Ford is right in the middle of it all. Paul Sanders is now responsible for Polydor sales in the interior of B.C. as well as Vancouver department stores. Promoter of Blues Jam, Patty Fiedler, is said to be working on a folk festival for this fall. CKLG FM's Simon Ginsberg has heard no more of possible court action over incidents arising from union hassles. Gary Switlo of Concerts Box Office in Vancouver is putting together a mammoth promo campaign to tout the upcoming Chicago appearance.

LONDON DISTRIBUTES NEW ATTIC PRODUCT

The newly formed Attic label will be distributed by London Records. The deal was finalized by Al Mair and Tom Williams of Attic and Alice Koury, product co-ordinator for London.

Initial single release, "Brother And Me" and "Piece Of Alright" by Fludd, has already been shipped and London's network of promotion people are beginning a series of promotion campaigns to get the single off the ground.

POLYDOR REORGANIZES PROMOTION STAFF

Polydor Records' Vancouver office has reorganized its promotion staff, effective immediately. Peter Behnke is now responsible for contemporary pop product on Polydor and distributed labels, while Ted Hopkins, who formerly handled all product, will be responsible for Middle of the Road and classical material.

Behnke and Hopkins are now operating from Polydor's recently completed offices at 805 West Broadway in Vancouver.

U.S. INTEREST IN TENNISON PACKAGE

The Tentam album release, "Two Words, Three Words" by The Robert Tennison Troupe, mailed extensively to pop programmers throughout the U.S., has been given the nod by several major market stations resulting in enquiries as to when there will be a U.S. release.

Produced by Robert Tennison, who created an image for his group with the initial single release, "I Can See", the album has received heavy play by Canadian pop programmers as well, particularly on the "Just Like A Fool" cut.

The session was produced at RCA's Toronto studios and features vocal background by several name artists.

Negotiations are currently underway for national distribution of Tentam product.

THE REAL SOUNDS OF THE 40s — HARRY JAMES

The sound and atmosphere of the 40's Big Band Era were revived for four brief hours Monday night, June 24th, when Harry James and his band played to a capacity crowd in the Centennial Ballroom of The Inn On The Park, Toronto. This was Harry James' first visit to Toronto in over twenty years. The audience spanned at least three generations, and all were most receptive to the music, applauding after each number. The dance floor was crowded continually, although not all were dancing.

Some were standing in front of the stage, just listening or singing the old remembered tunes.

The girl singer with the band, Sundi Martino, had once been a resident of Northern Ontario, and, in the early days of her career, had played several Toronto nite spots, including The Seaway Hotel and the Colonial Tavern. She has been with the band for nearly three years, and now makes her home in Las Vegas. After leaving Toronto, the band will be doing a series of one-niters before returning to their home base, Las Vegas. —J.V.

EMERSON SALES PROMOS MUDDY WATERS APPEARANCE

Emerson Sales, GRT distributor for British Columbia, tied in with Vancouver stations CKLG FM and CHQM last week to promote the appearance of legendary blues great, Muddy Waters at the Vancouver Blues Jam, held June 23rd at the Pacific Coliseum. Emerson provided Waters' latest Chess album, "Unk In Funk", to the stations for give aways. Emerson's Monica Netupsky arranged the tie-in. Following his Blues Jam appearance, Waters settled into the city's Egress Club for a week long engagement.

EGRESS ANNOUNCES UPCOMING ATTRACTIONS

John Bottomley, of Vancouver's mid-town showplace, the Egress, has announced the club's list of attractions for the early summer months. Columbia artist, Taj Mahal, appears for three days June 24th to 26th, followed by country artist, Earl Scruggs, June 27th-29th. Steve Goodman is the first confirmed artist for July, playing from the 10th to the 13th, followed by Dan Hicks, 17th-20th, and Lightning Hopkins, 23rd-27th. Willy Dixon appears August 13th-17th, preceded by Ry Cooder, August 6th-8th.

REID'S "VALLEY'S" BIG IN IRELAND

Canadian writer Glen Reid wrote "My Green Valley" three years ago and it was used as a "B" side for the Brannigan's Boys' single, "Independent Means" — neither side doing too much. A recent recording of the Reid song by Olive Bayle and the Irish Tradition brought only moderate success to the Boot single but in Ireland it has become a Top Ten hit.

The Bayle single has also been covered by several popular Irish folk groups including the Wolfe Tones and the Barley Corn.

CLIMAX BLUES BAND WOWS 'PEG AUDIENCE

The Climax Blues Band brought the thousand-plus audience in Winnipeg's Playhouse Theatre to its feet during the British group's June 10th appearance. Climax had the traditionally reserved Winnipeggers singing along and clapping throughout the performance and during four curtain calls.


Group leader, Peter Hancock, was particularly well-received, by the crowd, whipping them up into an enthusiastic back-up chorus. Climax Blues Band's latest album, "Sense of Direction", on the Sire label, is distributed in Canada by GRT.

BROWN'S "WOOD" CUT BY CAPITOL'S BRUSH ARBOR

The Canadian country/pop hit for Cliff Edwards, "Carpenter Of Wood" has been released in the U.S. by Brush Arbor on the Capitol label. The song was written by Barry Brown of the Family Brown, popular RCA country recording group. Published in Canada through Broadland Music, the U.S. release is published through Grand River Music-ASCAP.

The "Carpenter" single was the last release for Edwards for Polydor. He moved over to Columbia and is currently receiving strong pop radio play with his initial single for his new label, "Love May Be The Answer".

through a trying period, but there was confidence that time would resolve many of the problems — and they were in control, at all times.

Somehow, I feel many of the problems of the Canadian industry are inherited from those conditions existing in the U.S.

So closely tied are these two nations, in many businesses and particularly the record business, that we feel the pain of the international industry whether the malady is ours or not.

ALL PRICES ON INCREASE

The consumer is aware of the overall price increases of many commodities and, in particular those materials derived from oil products.

Truly the record industry held the line for too long. Labour had already made the price of manufacturing records very high and finally when the increase came, it was a hefty one. Some dealers may have rebelled at the idea of charging more, but, as mentioned, they must have been aware of price increases of everyday commodities.

As you walk through a department store or sit in a restaurant, you get the feeling that inflation or not, these are good times for Canadians and money must be readily available. No longer do we hear about unemployment, in fact we hear more about a lack of good employees being available.

In the wings waits a new sound that I feel is slowly evolving in the international industry. What we may be waiting for could be

Appearing with his back-up band and preceded by the Northern Flyer, a Texas bluegrass group, Kershaw was particularly well received by the crowd, which included young and old, straight and hip. Tickets for the show were set at \$6.00.

CKWX, in co-operation with Cajun Productions, promoted the appearance and participated in a give-away of tickets and copies of Kershaw's "Mama Kershaw's Boy" LP. WX personalities, Tom Peacock, Jim Morrison and John Michaels emceed the show.

CONCERTS BOX OFFICE DATES ANNOUNCED

Gary Switlo of Vancouver's Concerts Box Office has announced a number of shows to be staged in the west coast city this summer. July 17th, Columbia Records' Chicago plays Vancouver's Coliseum on the Pacific National Exhibition grounds. July 27th, Rory Gallagher and A&M's Status Quo appear in Vancouver. Venue is now being arranged.

Country artist, Ferlin Husky, is scheduled to entertain at New Westminster's Queen's Park Arena, July 28th.

Jose Feliciano is signed for an August 10th appearance at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre, preceded on July 27th by a special program featuring CTI Records artists, including George Benson, Ron Carter, Ben Davis, Hubert Laws, Johnny Hammond and Grover Washington Jr.

one of the most prosperous periods in the history of the music industry.

INDUSTRY READY FOR NEW IDEAS

The industry appears ready for new ideas in merchandising, promotion and recordings. Everything would seem to indicate a countdown to a very big fall season.

Someone said recently there were always big sellers in the business. The question was — which company had them.

This is very true, and the idea that the business was big enough that you could sit back and rake in your share is becoming a thing of the past.

It's become a very big business, and it's growing — more than eighty years of growing pains, but it is coming of age.

The company that has the product and the sales, is the company that can get all the elements together to take advantage of every regional breakout and spread it across the nation. Breakouts are god sent, but to sit back and enjoy just the regional sales can be disastrous.

INFORMATION IS THE KEY

Quite often a new record on a new label begins to break and the phones at RPM light up with dealers asking who distributes this record. Many times we don't know, and have to make exhaustive efforts to find out. If RPM doesn't know, the industry is in trouble.

The industry is learning slowly, the worth and value of a trade magazine on the music industry in Canada. Each week we flash music industry news across Canada to record stores and radio stations about Canadian happenings in the trade, whether they be domestic or international.

The processing of news is a very impersonal thing. As observers, it is impossible for us to hold a grudge or show any favouritism. We treat news and information as just that. It's our job and duty to make any and all relevant trade news available to the trade. There is no company too small that it doesn't deserve a mention in RPM if, something they are doing or have done is going to assist the trade.

SUBSCRIBER IS "KING"

Our subscribers are "king". For their money, they deserve every scrap of information that will further their endeavour and their position.

It seems that the more important you become, the more enemies you gather along the way. We acknowledge no enemies and no critics. We treat everyone as fairly as humanly possible.

Some of you have known us for ten years. That lengthy relationship has endured. Some of you may be newcomers who haven't known us long enough to realize that over those ten years, this magazine has strived to consistently work for the industry.

CIRCULATION MEANS POWER


As we have grown in circulation and power, we have acquired a new group of critics who might find fault with the position of a record on our charts that should have been two points higher.

Those were "the good old days"

Since I began this series, I have had many good comments and some . . . not so complimentary. A number of people have asked, "What does Klees know about promotion . . . ?"

In 1948, I began a daily "teen" record show on radio station CHUM in Toronto. At that time the record industry was very insignificant to what it is today. Many of the records that were featured on my one hour show, were imported from the United States. I would have to make daily visits to Sniderman's Music Hall on College Street to pick up the latest records which Sam was bringing in from the U.S. They would be returned the following day. That was 26 years ago. The average age of the promotion man today would be (probably) less than 26. Many of them weren't born yet.

A year later, I joined CKLB in Oshawa where I was an announcer-operator. A great deal of the programming of those days depended on transcriptions.

I left the radio business for a stint with Trans Canada Airlines (now Air Canada). Throughout my stay with the airline, some of my best friends were in radio. In 1956 I resumed my career in the music business when I joined MacKay Record Distributors in Toronto, at that time the London Record distributor for Ontario. My position was promotion and sales. Few companies had full-time promotion men in those days. In fact it has only been the last six years that promo men haven't had sales tasks to look after as well as promotion.

At that time the Stortz system of programming (a forerunner of today's format radio) had just been introduced in Canada.

One of the first records I was sent out to promo was "Blueberry Hill" by Fats Domino.

That was 18 years ago. Today's promo man of 26 would have been 8 years old.

In 1956 I joined Astral Records to do sales and promotion. Six weeks later I was made National Sales Manager. Astral was a very small record company that catered to audiophiles. We started to grow when we acquired the Pye Record line from England. It was Astral's biggest label. Astral became Allied Records after I left in 1963.

On May 1st, 1963, I started Tamarac Record Productions and my own label Tamarac (which eventually became Red Leaf Records). At that time there were few (if any) independent record producers in Canada. Facilities were limited. Most productions were done on three tracks. That may be hard to believe for record producers who can today record on 24 and 32 tracks.

Regardless, we were able to produce many Canadian hits and promote them on to the charts. At the same time, and much more important, the success of Canadian productions caused more and more people to become involved and groups, producers and songwriters began to believe that records could be produced in Canada.

Until that time, most Canadian artists would go to Nashville where in three hours they would hand you four sides. Usually the songs were written by Nashville writers. The groups and artists came back to Canada

and would make the rounds of the record companies — and if they were lucky, a record company would put out the record for them. They might even get 6% of 90% of the suggested retail price. Hardly a good royalty, and advances of any kind were practically unknown. I hope some of today's successful artists read this.

In 1964, the United States record companies became interested in records produced in Canada and for the first time a trickle of Canadian recordings were being released in the U.S.

In 1967, Red Leaf and Tamarac started to wind down, for reasons I don't wish to go into here.

Since 1967, I have worked part-time as an advisor to RPM and also as a consultant to the industry, freelance writer, ghost writer and hopefully a patron of the music industry in Canada. I also own MusicAd&Art which is an advertising agency and art firm to the Canadian music industry.

I am constantly in touch with record men and promotion men and devote all of my time to the music industry.

My agreement with RPM limits me to write only institutional articles for RPM, look

MUCH EMPHASIS ON CANCON AT OECA

The Ontario Educational Communications Authority (Channel 19) has advanced to the stage where they are now being referred to as "television for the people". They are supplying exceptionally tight productions of entertainment packages, passed over by the better equipped networks who are looking for the more commercial approach.

The OECA have also become interested in and involved with the Canadian performing artist. They recently aired two new pilot programs — "The Singer", which starred country folk singer Roy Payne; and "Avec Angele", showcasing the talents of Acadian folksinger Angele Arsenault.

Both productions were a mixture of music and documentation. The Arsenault filming allowed the young singer to display her songwriting talents with "Bois Ton Cafe", "I Know I Hurt You Badly" and "The Gospel of Man and Woman".

Payne's "Singer" was recently awarded the "Prize of the Festival" at the 1974 Oberhausen Film Festival in West Germany, and was filmed at the Horseshoe Tavern in Toronto. Payne performed his own compositions in the film including: "Born To Be A Gypsy", "Country Roads and City Streets", "Nothing On My Mind", and "Equal In Our Graves".

Dates for televising of these series, if approved, will be announced shortly.

Channel 19's Mike McManus, a sometimes talk show host, touched on the Canadian recording industry (June 21) when, in a quiet setting, with a pianist playing foreign copyrights, he discussed the industry with Dave Charles, program co-ordinator of CHUM/Toronto, Ian Thomas, GRT recording artist who broke into the hit arena with "Painted Ladies", and Ross Reynolds, president of GRT of Canada and president of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA).

A pilot for a new series on the folk and contemporary rock scene in Canada is now being undertaken by the OECA with a hoped for airing date by early fall.

after institutional projects for RPM (The Communications meets across Canada and the Juno Awards etc.). I also look after all RPM's special projects. My firm, Stan Klees Ltd., is paid a retainer by RPM, therefore, I am not on the staff of RPM.

Whether all this qualifies me to write a series on record promotion, advertising and record company procedures . . . I don't know, but as I write, I feel that some of my criticisms of the system could stimulate thought and in some cases cause changes that might benefit the promotion people and the record companies.

A great deal of what I have already written for this series has been revamped just because the industry is changing and many of my columns will be based on the helpful comments of record and promotion people.

I would like to thank the promotion men I have consulted, the promo men that have phoned to make comments and the record heads that have already indicated they are making changes because of my early comments.

RCA COUNTRY PRODUCT STRONG IN VANCOUVER

According to the recently debuted CKWX Country Countdown chart, RCA Records is the dominant factor in the west coast country scene. The company holds down five of the top ten positions on the 'WX chart with such product as "This Time" by Waylon Jennings, Charlie Pride's "We Could" and "I Will Always Love You" by Dolly Parton.

The label is also strongly represented on CKWX's album listing. Among the RCA artists showing strongly here are Pride, Jennings, Hank Snow, Danny Davis, Ronnie Milsap and Dolly Parton.

DYECAST RELEASES A POP PACKAGE

The recently formed Dyecast Record label has released their initial album, "Potpourri of the Ernie Castle Four". The album features Elaine Terzi on lead vocals.

Ernie Castle and his group Patty Shortreed, piano, Reg Garneau, bass; with Castle on drums, have been building a sizeable following throughout western Canada. They are currently playing the Glencoe Club in Calgary and have bookings through to September when they play the Banff Springs Hotel.

Castle's first album effort was produced by himself at Joe Kozak's Project 70 Studios in Edmonton with Kozak handling board chores. With the exception of three out of the twelve cuts, all are 100% Canadian content. They include compositions by Wally Grieve/"Mr. Weatherman", and "Long Walk In The Summer", Kenny Jefferson/"Spell Of The Arctic" and several by Hugh Parsons of Regina including an instrumental "Dirty John", "Sunday Summer", "A Year I've Spent With Time". Also of interest is former EC4 member Brian Wakley's "Bunkhouse Boogie". Castle has put together some of the selections that have become favourites over the many years of his touring.

This world is a tragedy for those who feel . . .

WENGEN, Switzerland

"Aha, my good man" said the chap with the crooked walking stick propped up against the posterised wall of the Wengen railway station, "what I'd like to know is why a rock author and commentator would come here to write a book?"

"Why, that's very simple," said I at a measured space, in this peculiar halting brand of English which one acquires when living in a foreign country. Turning in the direction of the 13,000 foot Jungfrau and other mighty sister peaks, I replied: "Just look around you."

"Ah yes, I know that Wengen is beautiful but tell me: does not a writer draw his inspiration from the environment about which he writes? I would have thought that books about rock music would be conceived in the front row seat of a concert hall."

"Perhaps some people must write in that manner but not I. I have usually found that rock's finest moments are discovered listening to a record or tape player and you can do that anywhere there's electricity or batteries. I can listen to just as much rock music up at the chalet as I could in London or Los Angeles. Shove in the tape and there it is."

"I'll grant you that the music is amazingly portable but I still don't understand what specifically brought you to Wengen. Why not St. Moritz or Gstaad or somewhere where the night life is sufficiently active to stimulate one such as yourself?"

"It's quite simply really. Seven or eight years ago, my lady and I spent 45 minutes in Wengen on our way up the Jungfrau. We went for a quick walk, took a few slides and the memory has burnt strongly ever since. In almost a decade of wandering around the world, we have never seen a more beautiful place, nor indeed a more serene atmosphere."

"You wouldn't be saying that if this were the ski-ing season."

"Perhaps not, but the fact remains that at the present time, you or your children can wander peacefully around here without fear of being run down by some drunken fool directing a motorized vehicle and poisoning you with its fumes. To each his own I suppose. Some people get off tearing around in autos — others prefer to stroll amidst the plentiful pleasures of Nature. It's all a matter of where you're at. Some dudes like to hustle chicks in discotheques, some would rather sit back with their old lady and a good smoke and plug in Astral Weeks or Moondance at home."

"Yes I must agree that it would be a dull world if all dogs barked the same. But I still wonder what you do with yourself here, that is when you're not writing."

"God, there's so much to do that it's a matter of setting up priorities. There must be at least a hundred different well-marked walks around here. You can climb up to the top of the Mainlichen range at the back of the village, or you can go by cable car. The views from the top are magnificent. You can walk across the fields and pick wildflowers: we've isolated at least two dozen varieties so far. I've been taking slides and movies and taping waterfalls, cow bells and Alpine

bird calls. There's just so many things to do. I've even got a nice crop of Sweet Peas coming on in the back garden. This plateau is a gardener's Paradise. Have you seen the rhubarb they grow here?"

"Indeed, I had two bowls for lunch before my blackberry yoghurt. You'll pardon me if I seem too inquisitive and ask how you keep in touch? Do you have any newspapers or magazines sent to you or do you listen to the BBC Overseas Service?"

"Neither. In fact I just learnt about Willy Brandt's resignation in the German column of Record World. I do not get the news and I'm grateful to be without it."

"But surely a writer's inspiration must come from the daily events which engulf us all?"

"For some of us perhaps, yet in the words of Sir Robert Walpole, the 1st Earl of Orford: 'The world is a comedy to those who think, a tragedy to those who feel.' (1769). I suspect that I've personally been plugged in to it for too damn long. The world outside of Wengen (and perhaps a few score acres down under) has little to offer me."

"Do I derive from your words some small indication of those terrible cinders of cynicism? Could it be that you have seen too much and all of a sudden, you have realized the horror of it all?"

"You could well be right. But I find no such oppressive maladies in these glorious Alps. Rather I discover some peace of mind by fully appreciating the insignificance of man next to the mountains."

"Yes, this region tends to draw out one's philosophical yearnings. Goethe, the great German writer, once compared the waterfalls in the Lauterbrunnen Valley below us with the fleeting human soul."

"I had heard that and I was thinking about the other afternoon when we sat at the foot of the Falls in the beautiful little cemetery with the flowers growing on each of the graves. The waterfall will continue flowing as long as man does not interfere with its natural course."

"Indeed it shall and let us hope that there shall be no such interference. Knowing the Swiss as I do, I believe we can be optimistic about that. But pardon me for changing the subject and again focusing on a personal matter. It appears to me that you have come to Wengen not so much to secure an escape from that which depresses you as much as to discover something new within yourself."

"You might well say that, I'll certainly admit that I have been listening to the lion on occasion. I have found the elevation above sea level to be remarkably conducive to new and better spaces. I believe I am now able to see many things which were beyond my vision before. I fear that far too many of us cannot see the wood for the trees. We fail to use our ears and our eyes and our reasoning."

"No doubt, but that has been the eternal folly of all mankind. You must not be too harsh. We here in Wengen have our faults too. The council in Lauterbrunnen keeps telling us that we should build a road up here and thus bring in more tourists. We answer that we prefer it the way it is, but they reply that we cannot hold out progress forever. We Swiss are a strange race. The French think us dull, the Germans think us boring, the British think us amiable. We do not enjoy an enviable reputation in sophisticated circles."


"But what nonsense that is! The Whole of Europe is jealous of your neutrality, your stable economy and your Natural assets. The irony of it overwhelms me. I can just imagine some 18th Century warlords deciding to let the poor mountain folk have their mountains because it is difficult to forge fortunes and progress upon these monuments of Nature. And thus Switzerland was born: a country of mountains that nobody wanted because they couldn't figure out how to amass fortunes from them. And now in the 20th Century, when this country refuses to involve itself in the intrigues and invasions of Europe, it turns out that the Alps are the ultimate tourist asset. And not only that, the Swiss people turn out to be the most compassionate guardians of these treasures, and they have learned to combine them with the few real fruits of progress. Such as this railway station in which we are standing. A cog railway to the top of Jungfrau, a sacred outlook where men and women can face their gods, whatever they may be. That is progress, in my book."

The old man tapped his stick on the iron rails. "You may well be right," he said, pulling an old briar pipe from his pocket. "I think I hear the train coming. Are you travelling today, young man?"

"No, I just like to stop by now and then to see what's happening down here. The scene reminds me of a brilliant movie I once saw — Closely Watched Trains. Do you understand?"






Members of Little Mountain Sound and Strongheart after taping "Candy Baby".




