Moffat's Mitchell and CRTC's Hylton to speak at Communication Thirteen

J.R. (John) Mitchell, president of Moffat Broadcasting and CRTC Commissioner John Hylton have been firm-ed as feature speakers for this year's C13 Seminar to be held at Toronto's Inn on the Park, March 13.

The industry meet will stretch over three days and will end with the Juno Awards and the Meet The Stars Party, Monday, March 15.

For the seminar portion of the weekend, RPM will introduce a new procedure this year with the setting up of interesting panels comprising knowledgeable personalities within both the broadcast (television and radio) and record industries, government spokesmen and observers.

DISTINGUISHED PANELISTS

Panelists firmed for the four separate discussions include: Chris Beard, producer of the new Wolfman Jack CBC TV series; Chuck Camroux, Station Manager at CFTR Toronto; Margaret Daly, entertainment writer for the Toronto Star; Arnold Gosewich, President Capitol Records/EMI of Canada; Alan Guettel, national news with RPM; Keith James, head of Moffat's contemporary music activities; Blaik Kirby, music and media critic for the *Globe & Mail*; Terry Lynd, President Columbia Records of

Canada; Jack McAndrew, head of CBC TV Variety; John Mackey, General Manager CFCF Montreal; Jack Miller, media critic for the *Toronto Star*; Jerry Rochan, head of CTV TV



Registration and coffee will take place at the Inn on the Park's Park Ballroom at 9AM Saturday March 13. The speakers' session will begin at 10AM.

Saturday night at 8:30PM, RPM will host a party for the registrants, and Sunday will be open house to the industry at the Inn, with many companies opening hospitality suites and showcasing rooms.

JUNO AWARD SPECIAL

Monday (15) at 8:30PM, the activities will switch to the Ryerson Theatre where the Juno Awards, in co-operation with the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences will present this year's Awards presentation - the annual industry show which will, again, be televised nationally by the CBC, in a 90-minute "live" special.

The presentations will be followed by the Meet The Stars Party at the Inn on the Park.

The three days of events have been tagged as Three Days In March. Registration for all events or individual events is available. A registration form appears elsewhere in RPM. Registration for all events commencing March 13 will be \$120 per couple or \$65 per person, although reduced rates are available for pre-registrants.

It is expected that by the next issue of RPM, the Juno Awards will be sold out and tickets will be available for only the other events.

If you wish to attend, we suggest that you register early.

Stratford sets summer dates for jazz & pop acts

The Stratford Festival announced a line-up of 8 Monday night concerts for this summer and an Oct 10 Sunday afternoon Anne Murray stage show. The series will open with jazz pianist Oscar Peterson's (July 5) followed by Cleo Laine and John Dankworth (12). It's Peterson's first appearance there since 1956 and Laine and Dankworth are following their 1975 Stratford debut which brought rave reviews last sum-

The panelists will cover topics ranging from Canadian artists and music on television, to changes in radio format and the print media and government involvement - and their effects on the music industry in Canada.

Berandol release for McKenzie King's Margaret

Ralph Cruickshank of Berandol Productions, reports to RPM that the McKenzie King Band, featuring guitarist Ron Leonard Jr., keyboarder Glen Johnansen and percussionist Mansbridge, have readied a single, *Song For Margaret* (BER 1005).

The single is accompanied by a glossy photo of Pierre's first lady, Margaret Trudeau.

Cruickshank reportedly sent off a telegram to Ottawa, requesting the recording rights to Margaret's Venezuelan song, but hasn't yet received a reply.

More jazz is featured (July 19-26) with jazz master Chuck Mangione followed by The Preservation Hall Jazz Band. Juno winning Murray McLauchlan will be on stage (Aug 2) and Odetta performs (Aug 9).

In addition, the Festival will stage 6 Sunday afternoon chamber concerts between July 18 and August 29.

Ken McFarland appointed to Columbia promotion

In a new wave of appointments, Columbia has upped Eddie Colero to the national post of marketing manager where he will be coordinating merchandising, from a street level, with Scott McNeill, who is involved in merchandising at the display level and with the print and broadcast media.

Joe Fox moves up to Ontario Sales Manager and Ken McFarland, long-time promotion man with London and just recently with Motown, moves into Ontario promotion where he will work with Terry McGee. He will report directly to Fox for day to day activities. Promotion policy however, is set by head office.

There has been a change in promotion procedures for the Manitoba market which was previously handled by the Ontario branch. Corrine Burke takes over Manitoba sales and promotion with her base in Winnipeg. This operation is similar to Columbia's Maritime operation where duties are handled by Jim Bradley. Appointments in the Quebec branch will be announced shortly.

Attic's Fludd washing over U.S. & Europe

Attic Records' Fludd band opened at Toronto's Gasworks Tavern, Monday February 23rd.

The troupe is still headed by brothers Brian and Ed Pilling, featuring new-comers Peter Rochon on keyboards, Ian McCorkle drums, and Jim Chrichton bass.

The Fludd story pulls back to 1967, when Brian 16 and Edmund 18 formed the Toronto band Pretty Ones. Originally from Birmingham, England, the boys went back "over 'ome" to try and make their rock and roll score.

"In Birmingham we became part of a band called Wages Of Sin," Brian said, "which was a typical British rock and roll band, strongly influenced by the Byrds and the Hollies. It wasn't the top group in Birmingham but it was well-known at the time."

While gigging at the Cedar Club, the band jammed with the likes of Led Zeppelins' Robert Plant and John Bonham, pianist Nick Hopkins, and Jimi Hendrix. Cat Steven's brother scouted out the Wages Of Sin, arranging for an audition in London. The Cat was suitably impressed with the group and signed them as his backup, also desiring to produce/mould them as a separate band.

"It was a really fine experience," Brian recalls, "except that the material Cat was writing for us, that he wanted us to record, was perfect for him . . . but not for us."

By year '69, the band came back to Toronto, looking forward to the throngs of enthused undergrounders that pushed along Yorkville Village's coffeehouse Music scene, but the strip had musically eroded with age, which led to Brian booking it back to school and Edmund becoming happily married . . . but they kept on grinding out songs.

Subsequently, Brian hitched up as part of Medusa and soon after, Edmund joined. Eventually the band split as 1970 approached and they then formed the Cancon progressive rock group now known as Fludd.

In '71, their first record Turned 21 was released to the sounds of a national hit, followed by a string of successes including Get Up, Get Out And Move On, Cousin Mary, I Held Out, Brother And Me, and last year's What An Animal.

Their "banned" LP titled Great Expectations (causing a great retailer's fury due to its thanx for the mammarys cover-art), scored as an impressive LP debut. The band recently spent the last few months writing new material for their upcoming album slated for a March recording session. Fludd's cross-Canada tour and U.S./European release of their music, will undoubtedly ensure them a much larger piece of the fan-following rock and roll pie.

Ambrose's Celebration seeking U.S. TV buyers

Tommy Ambrose's CBC Network gospel television series, Celebration, has its season's 26-show tapes "In the hands of professional distributors", who offered its sale at San Francisco's National Association of TV Producers and Directors (Feb 21-22).

Partners for the series, alongside singer Ambrose, are Toronto director Bill Davis and Hee Haw producer Sam Lovullo.

Ambrose was just recently signed to a reportedly "heavy" contract with Warner Bros, who has a "stack of tapes all ready to roll". His first single should be on release in the U.S. by late February or early March.

Schafer's Spoken Word takes poke at Trudeau

Reuben Schafer noted humour author, has entered the recording arena with The Trudeau Sting on the Berandol label. The disc has been described as a "poetic outburst on Trudeau's price and wage controls." Schafer sponsored a nation-wide poetry contest on the subject with a first prize of \$1,000. Radio stations were requested to invite their audiences "to express their personal feelings in poetry, pro or con concerning wage and price controls."

RCA to tape Amram at Seneca's Minkler

RCA will tape a live performance by David Amram (Mar 12) at Seneca College's Minkler Auditorium. An album will be skedded for an early spring release.

Amram made his first Toronto appearance almost 4 years ago and has since entertained the Toronto audiences on an annual basis. He has been known to perform within many international regions, bringing all types of people together with the beauty of his music language.

Although the Minkler appearance is anticipated to showcase Amram's pop/folk feel, the artist will also demonstrate his craft in jazz and the classics.

Amram is currently at work on a symphonic piece for the Philadelphia Symphony and has just completed work on a Steve Goodman LP.

CHUM & GRT set "live" Koffman showcasing date

Toronto's CHUM FM is featuring another GRT artist in their second live concert series. This time, jazz master, Moe Koffman, appearing live at George's (Mar 7). Koffman's current album release, *Live At Georges*, was a first live recording for both the artist and the famous Toronto jazz establishment.

CHUM FM earlier aired an hour long Dan Hill performance, live, from Toronto's Riverboat and GRT's Jeff Burns reports the concert itself generated 3-4,000 sales in the Toronto area for Hill's LP, *Growing Up*. GRT later presented CHUM with a gold Dan Hill T-shirt.

Burns points out that the new demands for foreground and creative music programming placed on FM broadcasters by the CRTC have opened up many ways to expose new, local and progressive acts. "We have groups on our label or distributed by us that have no single, no tours and no airplay. How do you promote an LP without a single?"

Burns and his staff at GRT have been working on that problem. Recently they made a special effort to promo the label's progressive product to the major FM stations "mostly for familiarity" says Burns. It was so successful that GRT is going to build on using more specialized promo and attention grabbers for groups which get little or no AM airplay.

Burns, who has worked in record retail, points out that the kind of people who buy FM-fare records have to know more about a group than 1 single cut, "and the new FM programming will get more of that across".

Conservatives lash out at CRTC impositions

Conservative MP Allan McKinnon, recently accused the government and the CRTC of trying to tell Canadians what television programs they should watch.

McKinnon told the House of Commons that the commission and government are trying to "impose" their preferences on an unwilling public through its cable television policy and "controversial" tax legislation now before the Commons. Legislation would stop 100 percent tax deductions for Canadian advertisers on United States border TV outlets and in the Canadian editions of foreign publications.

Recently, a group of British Columbian Conservative MPs have been arguing for an amendment to the bill which would allow KVOS-TV-Bellingham, Washington (beaming into the Vancouver area) to continue soliciting tax-deductible Canadian advertising.

Polydor distrib deal with Toronto's U.P.

Tim Harrold, president of Polydor Ltd., has announced the signing of a distribution agreement with U.P. Productions of Toronto. U.P. executive directors are John Usry, Dale Payment and Lamont Howze. All 3 have extensive experience in the industry, with Usry as producer/composer, and Payment and Howze on the club-circuit.

Polydor is in the midst of planning a national disco-promotion for the initial single release from U.P., *I Got Your Love*, by Stratavarius featuring vocals by Lady. A special 12-inch disco pressing has been produced for handservicing to all major discos.

Worldwide distribution for Boot classical discs

Boot Records has announced a deal with London Records for worldwide release of Liona Boyd's classical guitar LP, *The Guitar*, plus her new release, *Liona*, timed for the airing of her U.S. ETV Network concert program in April. Boyd's album product was produced by Eleanor Sniderman.

Boyd recently played a private hour concert for Prime Minister Trudeau in his hotel suite in Kamloops, and the recital made front page news in the Vancouver Province for the pretty young talent.

In addition to Boot's current classical series, *The Boot Concert Master Series*, the label is forming a *Boot International Series* which will concentrate on foreign classical product for which Boot has picked up Canadian rights. The *Concert Master Series* will be reserved for Canadian productions. The initial release in Boot's international line will be a 4-LP set licensed from Supraphon of Czechoslovakia.

Liona Boyd has been active since the release of her debut LP, having played close to 70 Canadian centres with a new U.S. tour set to coincide with her forthcoming releases there. Her new LP will be released in Canada in April.

Island's Chieftains guest on Hamilton's Ryan Fancy

CHCH-Hamilton's Tommy Makem and Ryan's Fancy series, guested Irish traditional musicians the Chieftains, Monday Feb 23. The Chieftains' current LP is titled *Chieftains 5*, released on the Island label.

The band has been exposed to North American ears via selections on the soundtrack of the Stanley Kubrick film, *Barry Lyndon*, distributed by WEA with the featured cuts, *Sea Maiden* and *Sean O'Riada-Women of Ireland*.

The Chieftains will be appearing at Toronto's Massey Hall April 29, promoted by Dick Flohil.

Major Hoople's Boarding House opening new doors

"Since its formation in November of 1967, the group has managed to move with the dominant styles and sounds of rock without becoming stuck - the group has made it over the long haul, because its concept is loose".

Loose, horn-backup, goodtime rock 'n' roll - Major Hoople's Boarding House owes its decade-old success and survival to the fact that ". . . we've learned to evolve", said band manager Dan Mombourquette of Dram Agency.

The group originally sprang from a Galt High School trio, named the Shan-de-leers. By mid-1967, lead guitarist Rock Howell, rhythm guitarist Peter Padalino, drummer Rick Riddell and bassist Dave Lodge, turned pro touring Ontario campuses and taverns.

The present line-up of the Boarding

House comprises Rocky Howell, Owen Sound drummer Edward Miller (formerly with Jack London's Sparrow, the Fat Chance Band, Bobby Curtola touring gigs, and LP-work on the Celebration and Periwinkle labels), keyboarder Peter Brent Beacock, Kitchener-born hornman David Gooding, band lyricist/bassist Keith Stahlbaum and former Berklee College trombonist David Gregg.

Major Hoople's Boarding House are currently on release with their Axe single, You Girl, given an RPM Personal Pick (Mar 21).

The idea development has been through the introduction and mating of talented filmmakers with talented singer/songwriters.

Valdy Sings About Newfoundland, premiered Feb 7, directed by David Acombe.

Life Machine, aired Feb 21, coupling Hoyt Axton with directors Jim Hanley and Henry Fiks, in a "film-song" concerning the American cultural breed of the Grand Ole Opry rhinestoned cowboy.

A feature on Dory Previn, titled Mindscape couples the piano musings of Moe Koffman regular Don Thompson with the lyrics of Previn.

Murray McLauchlan, Ann Mortifee and Tom Paxton have already been filmed by the BBC, which also produced Transatlantic's Harvey Andrews/Graham Cooper, the Grimms band, Victoria Wood and the Fivepenny piece, Scotland's Ian Campbell and Sonny Condell and Leo O'Kelly from Dublin, Ireland.

The Camera and The Song series marks the first television feature co-produced by both English and Canadian networks, having been heralded as an innovative attempt at producing "radio with pictures".

OAC & Stratford Fest bow theatre admin award

The Ontario Arts Council and the Stratford Shakespearean Festival have set up a Theatre Administration Award "to help a talented young person who is seriously interested in theatre administration." It is the first award from the William T. Wylie Theatre Administration Fund named for the late general manager of the Stratford Festival. The award is a \$1500 cash prize and 6 months employment in the Stratford Festival's publicity department. Forms are available from the OAC at 151 Bloor W. Toronto. Closing date is March 15.

Canadian audiences "loose" claim by A&M's Supertramp

John Anthony Helliwell, hornman/vocalist for A&M's Supertramp band, spoke to RPM before the band's London Arena concert (Feb 24). He claimed the attitudes of Canadian concert-

goers are "a bit loose as opposed to the crowds in England and the States," continuing with, "Canadian audiences just sit back and relax, able to pick up on our music's subtleties, which we find very rewarding because we spend so much time and energy on every second of every tune that we work on".

The Supertramp band will be preparing for their next LP in Los Angeles "... with no particular concept or goal as of yet, but we do intend to make more music that gives out a great deal of enjoyment".

The band have been on tour since November of last year and their Canadian capper has been set for March 28 in Vancouver.

As for the staff of A&M Records of Canada, Helliwell boasts, "... they have to be one of the finest families we've ever worked with".

Supertramp's entourage comprises 35 people, soundmen, roadies, lighting people etc., plus \$200,000 worth

of sound and lighting equipment.

Late press news from A&M's Jim Monaco indicates several "sold out" houses for the group which includes Hamilton, London and Montreal with

a couple of western dates ready to post "sold out" notices.

Set for their Montreal date is a presentation by A&M of a gold and platinum record for their *Crime Of The Century* LP. Monaco predicts that by the time the band gets to Toronto, A&M will present them with a platinum for *Crisis? What Crisis?*

International success has been shown for the group with their *Crime* LP being double gold in Australia and gold in England. Both LPs are gold in Holland and are about to go gold in Germany.

Tee Vee, ITV launch multi-\$million TV music series

Tee Vee Records and Edmonton's ITV Productions are syndicating at least 25 Canadian produced television concerts to feature as many international record stars. With an ITV taping of Charley Pride's February 21st Edmonton concert, Tee Vee is merchandising music as it has never been sold in Canada - with a just released LP package of Pride's best, a Tee Vee produced Pride radio special and Pride's upcoming national concert tour to go along with the more than \$200,000 television production of the largest indoor country concert ever staged in Canada. It's the biggest Canadian record campaign ever launched for an artist.

Booming newcomers in Canada's entertainment world are teaming to present the most ambitious show package ever seen or heard from Canada. Record mass-merchandiser Tee Vee Records, which started as Cachet Records less than 3 years ago, and Edmonton independent TV station CITV, which signed on the air less than 18 months ago, are meshing respective marketing and production skills to combine television concert specials, mass-sales records, radio programs and millions of dollars worth of television commercials featuring more than 2 dozen world-famous recording stars.

The 1-hour TV concerts, taped by ITV, the production wing of CITV, are staged live at Edmonton's Jubilee Auditorium or Coliseum, most with the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra and distributed by Tee Vee to stations across Canada and, with other distributors, around the world.

Fourteen are already taped at an average cost of more than \$150,000 each: Engelbert Humperdinck, Jack Jones, Leslie Uggams, Vikki Carr, Paul Williams, Johnny Mathis, Roberta Flack, Sergio Mendes, Diahann Carroll, Henry Mancini, Charley Pride, and

Anne Murray. Another 11 are in the works including Neil Sedaka, Sarah Vaughan, Jose Feliciano, and the Fifth Dimension.

Tee Vee president Ed LaBuick and ITV producer Doug Hutton stress that these are not just headline concerts, they're top-dollar productions - screening a full hour of star-power, greatest hits performances supported by a full professional orchestra without slow-paced interviews, stand-up comics or sleepy, local-host intros.

Tee Vee owns the Canadian rights for each special taped to date with options on the rest. They're dealing the shows to local stations (mostly independents) in exchange for commercial broadcast time rather than cash.

"Tee Vee's major expenditure is television time," says LaBuick and he points out that any Canadian station pays dear cash for any other headline variety specials. With this series they get needed Cancon programming as well - all with no cash on the table. "Even if we don't have

a record package by the featured artist," says LaBuick, "any big-name music special is an excellent chance to promo any Tee Vee product."

ITV is financed by millionaire Surgeon Dr. Charles Allard's Allarco investments, a healthy Alberta corporation with holdings including real estate, oil and gas exploration, chemical processing, hotels, restaurants, and life insurance firms among others. Allarco built ITV's \$7,000,000 studio for a station that would do more than compete with Edmonton's established CTV and CBC affiliates. Last year he hired Hutton, a long-time Canadian record and TV producer, who was on his way to L.A. to produce a U.S. Bicentennial multimedia presentation.

Hutton, with Tommy Banks, assembled a top production and music variety staff from across Canada. "It's not just a western millionaire throwing away money," says Hutton, "we're a serious production company and we're part of the community."


As part of the community ITV has brought a wave of live entertainment to the city; Henry Mancini conducting the Edmonton Symphony sold out so fast they scheduled a second night and the 14,000 people who paid \$6-8 to see Charley Pride (Feb 21) accounted for the largest indoor country concert ever staged in Canada.

In addition to Pride, backed by his own band, Tommy Banks' band with the strings of the Calgary Symphony and U.S. hit country group Dave and Sugar, Edmontonians were treated to an Anne Murray concert backed by the Edmonton Symphony and TV premieres of Edmonton concerts by Roberta Flack, Sergio Mendes and Johnny Mathis - all in the space of 2 weeks - presented by ITV.

Hutton singles out the enthusiasm of the local audience as a plus for ITV productions: "We often stage \$60,000 worth of talent and gross \$20,000. The crowd acts just like they're getting 3 times the dollar value of the entertainment they're paying for."

Tee Vee got involved with ITV last Fall as the record company prepared to merchandise, their Tom Jones Special, then the most publicised record package ever in Canada, using

footage from ITV's Jones' concert for 60 second spots.

With the Charley Pride special, Tee Vee, which has sold as many records as anybody in Canada recently, is getting into mass merchandising in a new way. They own all rights to the television concert and have just released a Pride record package to be heavily promoted during his upcoming Canadian tour, which takes him through the west in March and the east in April, with a summer return for Vancouver's PNE.

Pride and RCA picked Tee Vee over Canadian competitors to handle the television sales package here and if successful they'll get the nod for U.S. and probably world rights. Tee Vee has never marketed records outside Canada before.

"We couldn't just put Charley on television slam bam," says LaBuick, "we needed a whole media package." Outside of the \$200,000 put up by ITV and Tee Vee for "the best country television production ever," Tee Vee itself has produced a Cancon Charley Pride radio special. Toronto's CHUM did a Tom Jones radio special

last year, available now to other stations.

Sales on Tee Vee's Jones package are already pushing 150,000 with the 6-month promo campaign running until June. Operations manager Dan Laroche reports that sales of the new Pride package are off to a better start than the Jones set.

RCA chief Ed Preston, who was in Edmonton for the Pride concert, says that the company will work with Tee Vee, ITV and concert promoters on the whole Pride package: "When something like this happens the artists' whole catalogue comes alive." RCA

Arista mainstream rocker Eric Carmen (former leader of Raspberries) opened the Massey Hall North American debut of Capitol's Sweet; Capitol's country-folk duo Brewer and Shipley

thers, known for their extensive studio work, provided their brand of electric funk alongside Steve Khan former guitarist with Blood, Sweat and Tears, keyboarder Don Grolnick, conga player Sammy Figura, bassist Will Lee and drummer Chris Parker. Sweet hit town on the heels of 2 recent gold records in Canada and their LP, Desolation Boulevard, has been nationally charted since last fall (No. 14 on this week's RPM 100).

Capitol released a new Sweet single titled Action (No. 81 RPM 100) alongside their new LP, Give Us A Wink. With over a dozen hit singles in the past 5 years and with a chart prominence in over a dozen countries, Capitol is looking to break the group in North America, which should be easy following their recent hit, Ballroom Blitz.

Arista recording artists, the Brecker Bros, featuring Michael on sax and Randy on trumpet, played their only Canadian date Feb 9-12. The Bro-


on the Brecker's first Arista LP) and former Guess Who guitarist Dom Troiano, gathered for a midnight set.

The Breckers are up for 3 Grammy Award nominations for Best New Artists; Best Instrumental arrangement (Cut Some Skunk Funk); and for best R&B instrumental (Sneakin' Up Behind You) released in Canada as a disco-single in May of 1975. Their new LP, Back To Back, is skedded for an early March release.





RCA's Vangelis debuts with Heaven & Hell LP

Greek-born composer Vangelis makes his RCA recording debut with the LP Heaven And Hell (LPL1-5110).

Vangelis has been described as a "virtuoso" of the keyboard, playing grand piano, hammond organ, synthesizers and all percussive instruments on the disc. The English Chamber choir led by Yes band vocalist Jon Anderson is also featured.

Born in southern Greece, Vangelis was working in France when first hearing of the Greek military upheaval of his country in 1968. Unable to return to his home, Vangelis formed the band Aphrodites Child, scoring an

immediate worldwide hit with the single release Rain And Tears. The band subsequently charted several Number 1 hits during the next 3 years, before splitting up after their "controversial" double-LP 666.

Vangelis remained in Paris, recording many cinema-soundtracks and an "amazing" concert performance, before moving to London, amid the rumours that he would be replacing Rick Wakeman as keyboarder for the Yes. He missed out on the gig, but was immediately signed up to RCA, assembling his own 24-track studio near London's Marble Arch, cutting the Heaven and Hell debut.

CBC FM's Jones skeds Moses Quintet for Mar

Hedley Jones, producer of the CBC-FM Network's Eclectic Circus and Recycling Blues features, reports to RPM that he will be recording Toronto's Ted Moses Quintet in March, utilizing the new Kunskopf microphone recording principle.

The Kunskopf is a mike moulded of heavy rubber in the shape of a head, originally used to assist impaired hearing.

Jones is also anticipating that Recycling the Blues (now a one-hour feature broadcast Saturday nights) will expand to 4 hours by October. Currently the producer is working on a Billy Preston special to be aired May 16th over CBC's Entertainers series, employing the same formula of interview/music format, as was heard on his Gino Vannelli special of late last year.

Champlain's Rising label creating national niche

Rising Records, a division of Champlain Productions Ltd., reports a steady increase of acceptance of their product on a national basis.

Marty Simon's productions include the new KidStuff single, which is based on the CTV Network Saturday morning series. He has also produced a Rockabye Hamlet LP featuring 3 compositions by Cal Dodd, 3 by the Lisa Harrt Band and others. On tap as well are 2 singles from the Rockgarden band, a cover of Steely Dan's, Everyone's Gone To The Movies, and Would You Like To La La La.

The Rising camp has another producer of note, pumping out product. Ralph Murphy has produced a single by the Lisa Harrt Band, Old Time Movie.

Rising is distributed by Quality Records.

Green to Atlanta leaving WEA crew at grindstone

Wea Canada's Linda Nash, reports that the company is currently running with 10 items on CHUM-Toronto (7 charted and 3 playlisted) and 9 items on CKOC-Hamilton (8 charted and 1 playlisted).

The singles, Feelin' Kinda Lucky Tonight by Ray Materick, and Lost In A Love Song by Christopher Ward are experiencing a crossover to MOR, country and pop station charts. Both singles qualify as 4 parts Cancon.

Larry Green national promo, flew to Atlanta, Georgia (Feb 19) for the Radio and Records Conference and will also be attending Warner Bros' R&B bash in New York City.

According to WEA's second Ontario promo, Jim "Soupy" Campbell, new releases for WEA during the early part of February were Bette Midler's Songs For The New Depression, Tom Waits' Nighthawks At The Diner, Chris Squire (bassist for Yes) off with his

first solo titled Fish Out Of Water, Major Harris, former lead singer for the Delphonics with Jealousy and Barry White's producer Gene Page with the instrumental arrangements of Lovelock. Other releases include product from Black Sabbath, Bad Company and the Eagles.

Montreal's Le Temps, distributed by WEA on the Parapluie label, have been set for a Mar 5 date at York University's Glendon College.

Playboy jazz poll winner, guitarist George Benson will be appearing at Toronto's El Mocambo (Mar 18-20) and Gordon Lightfoot moves into Massey Hall for his yearly date (Mar 22-28). Another Canadian Ray Materick is set for the Riverboat Mar 23 through the 28th and again March 30 through April 4th.

Both Nash and Campbell spiked the above concert dates with a "heavy" promo push on releases at both the retail and radio level.

Being readied for release is a new single by Herman's Hermits, I'm In A Lonely Situation. The group was recently signed to Buddah.



Earl Heywood celebrates 25 years in record business

Canadian country music veteran Earl Heywood is celebrating 25 years in the record business. His music career spans more than 40 years and includes live radio shows (like CKNX's Barn Dance where he appeared with



Canada's No. 1 Cowboy, Earl Heywood.

then unknowns Tommy Hunter and Al Cherney) and almost 300,000 Canadian sales on a string of singles in the 50's on RCA's Bluebird label.

In 1969 Heywood wrote and cut a Dominion-label LP *Tales of The Donnelly Feud*, an opus major of Canadian country music. It's the story in original songs, each a sequential chapter, of the legendary feud which boiled in Lucan, Ontario near where Heywood grew up and never drifted very far from. The LP has sold over 35,000 copies in Canada and abroad.

Heywood grew up a close friend of distant cousin Gordie Tapp and bought Tapp's Martin guitar when the now well-known TV star finished broadcasting school - broke. With experience from his church choir, playing the tenor euphonium in the Exeter

Brass Band and guitar lessons paid for with money made selling dressed chickens door to door, Heywood hit the Wingham, Ontario-area circuit and appeared regularly on Fred Funk's Sunday Night Variety Show in Grand Bend.

Heywood actually cut his first 78 in 1941, paying \$2.00 for 1 copy. The song was *Living In The Army* which he wrote during his army days for a base-camp amateur show and it won him a spot on Chatham's CFCO's army camp broadcast. The man who took his \$2. liked his sound and got him an appearance at London's Grand Theatre where he stuck with the show, chorus girls and all, entertaining troops based at home. By the end of the war he was hosting and guesting shows on Wingham's CKNX, becoming a regular in 1946.

Dubbed "Canada's No. 1 cowboy", Heywood became known as a solid performer and songwriter penning a few songs for Canadian Music Sales who published an Earl Heywood songbook in 1948.

In 1949 he joined Wilf Carter, Hank

Snow and Stu Davis with RCA, who had the only recording studio in Canada, and cut a string of 78s on their Bluebird label. His only RCA LP (including *Moonlight on the Manatoulin, Algonquin Waltz, Let's Dilly Dally Down In Lily Valley* etc.) was released on their Camden label which is now distributed by Pickwick - but the LP is no longer available there.

Two of his 3 Dominion-label LPs are no longer available from distributor London Records but can be picked up through Canadian Music Sales in Toronto (58 Advance Rd.). Unavailable is *Good Old Country Singing* by the Earl Heywood Family, which Earl says is the first Canadian country recording by a family unit. In addition to the Donnelly LP, CMS still has stock of his *Original Golden Hits* LP including *Living In The Army, Counterfeit Kisses, There's An Angel Waiting For Mother* and others. They also carry a songbook of Heywood's Donnelly songs. CMS' Ken Stuart tells RPM that the 2 LPs and the songbook are steady sellers there.

Last year's Juno Award winners and nominated for a Juno this year, the Carlton Showband are living up to their reputation of being one of the heaviest booked groups in Canada. They have just swung through Toronto, allowing themselves time to tape a few Pig and Whistle shows plus a special for CTV to be aired Mar 1 and 22. During the month of January they taped 13 segments of a religious show, *The Church Today*, which was aired on both Global TV and Hamilton's CHCH-TV.

On their recent tour through the east the Showband played to crowds of 1100 people (capacity) for 11 nights at Holy Heart of Mary Auditorium in St. John's.

During the month of March the Showband will be touring the west, including Winnipeg (14) for 2 shows, Regina (16-17), Saskatoon (18), Meadowlake, Sask (19) and the Crystal Ballroom in Edmonton (20). They will then swing back to Ottawa for a date at the Civic Centre (27) and then prepare for a full booking of dates in April.

Bob Murphy & Big Buffalo score with CBC radio net

Country Juno nominee Bob Murphy was recently featured on 2 radio shows for the CBC radio network. He taped a segment for morning show host Judy LaMarsh who aired tapes of Murphy with his Big Buffalo performing in Truro. Murphy also performed a few numbers on the Wednesday-evening, *Country Road* show.

Murphy and Big Buffalo, Broadland recording artists and nominees in last year's Big Country Awards are currently playing their homeground area of the Maritimes and are also working on a new LP release.

George Hamilton IV TVer being aired in S. Africa

The George Hamilton IV Show is now aired regularly on the new South African Broadcasting Corporation network. The shows, produced by Manny Pittson's - Victoria Roads Productions at Hamilton's CHCH telecentre, began their SABC run Jan 31. Many Canadian country acts appear on the show, including regulars Mercey Brothers and Lynn Jones.



Condor's Emmons flashing into Can recording scene

How ya gonna keep Emmons down on the Funny Farm now that he's cut an LP?

Blake Emmons, Condor recording artist and star of the CTV weekly comedy show, Funny Farm, was in Toronto taping 4 future Farm shows and promoting his just-pressed 45, Man On The Inside/Let Me Do Something Lord - and just happened to drop by the RPM offices.


This is the first single culled from his upcoming Condor label debut LP. "Funny, but in all my years in TV I stayed away from records, except for a few singles".

Emmons says Funny Farm taping sessions produced about 4 shows in as many days. "We first do 2 solid days of jokes, about 500 for each show, and we used about 40 of the best in each show". Producer Cliff Tomlinson and director Ed Richardson are preparing for a May taping for the first shows of the program's 3rd season next fall.

A native of Toronto, Emmons hit Nashville in 1968, "because it was the place to go" in a Pontiac which clocked 212,000 miles. He landed a job co-hosting the nationally syndicated Jim Ed Brown Country Place TV - for \$69. a week. "You don't go to Nashville to make money - it's just a town full of people from everywhere else".

Emmons made it first as a performer and writer, penning a few hit songs for other artists. He found his real love is for benefit telethons and he and his band, Prairie Fire, are still going strong

with this type of telethon. He worked a Toronto telethon recently and with the band has done Winnipeg, Edmon-



ton and, just last week, Vancouver's TV fundraisers. Calgary is slated for April. As well, they're playing club

dates in places like Sarnia's Huey's Junk Yard and Kamloops, and a concert in Regina's Arts Centre. He's working on a set of concerts with symphony orchestras next fall and all the band's material is being scored on 55-piece charts for concert productions. Everything is already scored on 24-piece charts. Emmons says his biggest thrill is to convert people to country music - "I have a classy feeling about country".

Prairie Fire, which takes the stage in leather tuxedos, backs Emmons on TV and the LP. Fiddler Brian Sklar has a Condor LP on release and bassman Ron Jeffery has an LP in the can. The rest of Prairie Fire are pianist Keith Day, steelman Don Marshall and drummer Lorne Pavelick. Emmons says, "I'd put my arm in a meatgrinder for them".



Having just completed a hectic 7 week tour of major centres in western Canada, it was almost a relaxed attitude from Tyson and his band with much energy flowing from the stage and the audience. Tyson told RPM- "This is one of the best bands I've ever put together" - and one observer bore out this Tyson confidence when he was overheard to say: "That's the tightest-assed band I've ever seen at the Shoe". The group comprises Ricky Patterson (got the name right this time) on drums; an incredible fiddle player name of John P. Allen; Ronnie Dann, steel- Kimm Branit, bass; and George Hebert on lead guitar.

Opening the Tyson set was Dallas Harms, who travelled the east and west legs of the Tyson tour. Harms does it "originally". His repertoire is 100% his own including his Big Country winner, Paper Rosie and good crowd pleasers, Ruby's Lips, Little Annie Brown and many many more. The big, soft-talkin', laid back Harms is an asset to the show.

Ole 'Eon hunched stage centre and proceeded to deliver an exhausting 45 minute set of old, new and borrowed. His truck driving song, Some Kind of Fool, is the only Canadian truck driving song ever written in a bathtub in Osaka, Japan led him into his single, She's My Greatest Blessing, which was No. 1 in Calgary and "absolutely no other place", Tyson told his audience. His Summer Wages, "a song about B.C. before the NDP", explained how he went "to work on the tow boats with my old city slippery shoes".

If Dick Nolan could sell more than 150,000 copies of his album on the strength of Aunt Martha's Sheep, Tyson is missing a bet in not releasing Tim Finnigan or Little Beggerman as singles. Lots of Newfie-grass and soul.


A little nostalgia was also part of the evening with a tribute to the late Bob Wills with the Tyson Swing Band

The Programmers

OECA's Magee & Company digging news deeper than at face value

"News is managed all the time and the people who could break up the management of it, break the game up or be much better bellwethers of things. . . . just don't do it."


"What we're doing is a fantasy in some ways, but it's based on reality. . . . and we think our version of it is in some ways truer than the official news media".

On New Year's Eve 1974, the Ontario Educational Communications Authority (OECA) through its Channel 19 Toronto outlet, televised the Joe Mendelson/Michael McKenna Mainline Bump 'n Grind Review under title of Mean Business (reviewed in RPM as ". . . playing the Victory Theatre to an Aqua-Velva high-balled crowd of music/women oglers.")

Veteran Canadian radio/television satirist Michael Magee (as of Mar '73, CKEY-Toronto's resident 7:45 AM commentator, broadcasting in the "living caricature" guise of J. Carter Hughes "invisible-rich establishment Rosedale type" and Fred Dobbs "down-to-earth farmer from Beansville") hosted the frontal nudity rock and roll event for OECA, successfully backgrounding via his repertoire of characters "the state of entertainment in Canada". The show stirred up a hot-collared stew of controversy, helped along by Magee's talents for expressing telling comments through the attitudes of his living cartoon characters.

Jim Hanley, Director of Programming for OECA was deluged by more

him to do a pilot embodying his closet-cast of characters - hence the series, Magee and Company, co-written by

producer Jack Hutchinson.

"We realized then, as we see now, that the characters can be used to do, almost anything," Magee told RPM.


Michael Magee, through his amaz-

" . . . although there are individuals and groups of people within the community broadcast system who feel that some of OECA's programming, Magee and Company being one of them, are not educational in the true sense of the word," PD Hanley told RPM.

"My feeling is that our programming is educational in the sense of providing learning opportunities. Magee and Company is somewhat of a bizarre program, but does offer to those who choose to get onto its wavelength, a very penetrating insight into the world of Canadian current affairs. . . . Magee's is opinion coming from various quarters, the way-out and the hard-nose reality".

In effect, Michael Magee assumes the role of a character for the purpose of expressing factions of our society. . . . the silent types who razz big noises behind closed doors. When assuming WASPY J. 



er opt out for the status quo, fraughted with all of its plastered on respectability than for a disturbance of the status quo, for the purpose of setting a lot of things right - and that's very serious when you get to that position. In effect, we are probably more governed than any other country in the western world. 



has more than 20 Pride LPs, almost half of them gold in Canada.

Tee Vee and ITV are looking for ways to involve Canadian acts in the concert series. Anne Murray is the only Canadian headliner taped so far. They're planning to stage some Canadian openers for the headline acts - the crowd and production setting already there - and use the footage for Canadian mini-specials. LaBuick would like to use country vets Al Cherney and Maurice Bolyer, each of whom have had successful Tee Vee LPs, as separate openers then combining the performances for a regionally marketed special. Susan Jacks opened for Anne Murray.

Hutton explains that ITV anticipated a lack of confidence here in any Canadian productions and with the added coolness to western productions, they figured they had to use international stars to break the ice. Through L.A.-based Rhodes Productions, some shows are already being picked up in most major U.S. markets and internationally in France, Brazil, Hong Kong, Japan and elsewhere.

ITV has turned Edmonton into a variety television centre of Canada, producing nearly 150 hours of variety programming since January 1975, mostly the syndicated Tommy Banks show. Banks says, "There's this big wall on the Manitoba border where the airing of western production usually stops." Banks, a big booster of Edmonton entertainment, points out that the city is perfect for musical productions: acoustically fine Jubilee Auditorium, new Coliseum, a Symphony Orchestra with a gold record (with Procol Harum) and now ITV's studios. Most Edmonton music people put Banks and his band high on the list of Edmonton's assets.

With more than \$2,500,000 already invested by Tee Vee and ITV in television productions, record rights and promotion (with much more to come) the success of this concert-record presentation will require millions of people, sitting in their living rooms tapping their toes to star-studded television performances.

izing and at worst, hostile towards their own critics, then I think the thing is really very sick.

"You won't have a chance in pro-

gramming unless someone designs a way to market a show where the broadcaster can make some money out of it. And I really believe that if you can show them that there's a profit in it for them to put the thing on - then they'll do it. Much of it, is monkey see, monkey do. It's very hard for them to break out of the formula - because it works".

"One of our great unexamined cliches of broadcasting," Hutchinson said, "is that it's a fun business. If it really is a 'fun' business, then why do so many people in it have heart attacks, bad nerves, ulcers? We just hope that there's enough people around who have some sense and who aren't just completely bloody sellouts".

Magee and Company characters say what they feel, and hang the consequence. OECA will probably receive a budget within last year's \$16 million range. Hopefully their programming

will galvanize creative sectors of the industry finally dropping the anvil on the highways to stop "the drain of talent, brains and guts out of this country".

Magee and Company is communication . . . the pleasure derived from its series' intention is that it creates opportunities to laugh.


