Chalmers/Lefort/Miller figure in London hubub


London's head office has been humming with activity over the past few weeks with appointments, signings and the winning of awards. Kicking it all off was the announcement by the label's Product Exploitation Manager, Ken Verdoni, of the appointment of Gary Chalmers to the post of National Promotion Manager. Chalmers will be responsible for the coordination of all phases

of promotion as well as handling the label's existing Canadian distribution labels.

Chalmers joined London six years ago as Winnipeg sales and promotion rep and last year moved into head office as Canadian Label Manager.





Dick Riendeau, London's National Sales Manager has good news - for his sales staff. Pierre Lefort of Deram, made such an out-

standing sales effort that he was presented with the London Salesman of The Year Award for 1974/75. The award is given to the salesman who achieves the highest percentage over quota during the year.

Deram is the division handling the majority of London's French product.

On the artist front, London copped the exclusive signing of Joey Miller to a worldwide recording contract. A Montrealer, now living in Toronto, the multi-talented singer, composer and arranger is currently completing tracks at RCA's Toronto studios for his first release.

To cap off the London excitement comes news of the Canadian tour of 10 CC. Kick-off date is at Toronto's Massey Hall (October 23) followed by University of Montreal Sports Centre (26), the Convention Centre in Quebec City (27) and in Vancouver Nov. 13. The tour is the icing on the cake for the label that did so much in making the group's single "I'm Not In Love" Canada's No. 1 single for two weeks running (August 23 and 30) on the RPM 100 Singles Chart. The popular British group have three albums available in Canada - "10 CC", "Sheet Music" and "The Original Soundtrack" and London is now preparing a new album, "100 CC", a compilation of their first two albums which contain their major British singles and several of the items they had success with in North America. An entirely new album is expected for release to coincide with their North American tour.

Way first on board Mitre Prod's roster

A new production company called "Mitre Productions" has been formed by Will Webster and Ed Cowan of Thunder Sound.

The first artist signed to a contract under the new team is singer/songwriter Bryan Way, originally from Stephenville, Newfoundland. The deal with Quality Records calls for an album in addition to the single product. One of Way's songs "Say My Goodbyes To The Rain" has been picked up by RCA's Roger Whittaker.

Way's music is co-published by Chappell Music (CAPAC) and Thunder Sound's new publishing wing, Davenport Music (CAPAC).

"... Bryan has signed a long-term situation with our new production company, and we, in turn, have signed him to Quality", said Cowan.

"We are looking forward to our association with Quality, and in particular with their A&R director, Bob Morten."

A&M's top management into regional meetings

Rather than bring national personnel into head office for one general meeting, A&M's Gerry Lacoursiere took top management into the field. Regional meetings involving the Calgary, Montreal and Toronto branches of A&M Records of Canada have now been concluded.

From September 7th to the 17th, A&M national, promotion and sales personnel covered a wide range of subjects including the discussion of new product by artists Lelly Boone, Gerry Niewood, Firefly, Shawn Phillips, Billy Preston, Bazuka, Gap Mangione, Esther Satterfield, Dan McGafferty, Bim, Susan Jacks, Chilliwack, Andy Fairweather Lowe and flautist Tim Weisberg.

Meetings were centered around the discussion of advertising and promo campaigns, disco and radio outlets, internal executive communication, artist appearances and distribution agreements.


Highlight of the meetings was the bannered rally-call of A&M's "We Give A Damn."

All A&M accounts will be offered special benefits and bonuses including display suggestions, promo radio tags and other unspecified discounts. The "A&M National Lottery" will culminate at the end of the co-op fall program and will provide winning accounts with the services of a member of the A&M national and local sales or promo staff for work in a record or retail outlet. Date for this service has been set for December 20th. Details should be worked out with the assigned A&M representative.

Incentive programs, utilizing a "point system" will result in monthly "branch awards" geared towards a "Branch of the Year" award. January 1976, is the date for selective three branch meetings.

A&M national, sales and promo staff, along with their guests, will fly to Acapulco Mexico for seven days of meetings.

tion of country music. There is an illusion of promotion, but if you really analyse it, it turns out to be each act promoting itself and it turns out to be a loud rumble and grumble that leads country music nowhere. United we stand. Divided we fail.

A long time ago I found that most country people were "countryfied." We may have adapted some of the Nashvilleisms, but that one was short lived. We have tried so hard to be Nashville artists, that we forgot that Hank Snow and Wilf Carter didn't know about the Nashville sound when they made their move into prominence.

Throughout the organization of the Awards weekend and the Awards we constantly heard about how other Awards are run and how other associations conduct themselves in the United States.

Well, this isn't the United States and the population of Canada proves that. This is Canada and this is the Canadian country music scene and any resemblance to Nashville or the United States is only in the minds of (I'm afraid) too many of the Canadian country artists.

You want to do it? Do it here and do it now! Find that attitude that will lead to something distinctively here (right here in Canada) and something that the rest of the world will imitate.

If the sound of Canadian country is an imitation of the Nashville sound, then that isn't the Canadian country sound and so be it . . . it should be done in Nashville. If the idea is to come up with something new and different, that's different.

Whatever we are trying to do, we must do it together. United.

So we gathered you all here in this beautiful place and set up a chance for a dialogue and some entertainment on the side and opened

the door for a helluva lot of promotion and business to be done. At the end of it we arranged for some Awards to be given out to some deserving artists, but that's not what it's all about.

We have presented to you the unique opportunity to talk, discuss, further and promote the Canadian country music industry. How you do it is up to you. You will see throughout this weekend that we have formulated this Big Country Awards Weekend to stimulate your thinking and get you all together.

We have formed an Academy of over 300 country people. We have gathered the funds to launch something that is uniquely Canadian and we are anxious that those in attendance realize that what we are trying to do is get a Canadian outlook on Canadian country.

In the past two meetings we haven't got very far. I hope this time, the time is right and the place is right for Canadian country artists to look at Canadian country music and say that we ALL want to work together to make it BIG!!!

If you are looking for something foreign, you can take this from the Nashville people. They did work together to create the mystic



Flight 226 to Winnipeg turned back 20 minutes after leaving Regina airport and was thoroughly searched by RCMP officers.


When nothing was found, the flight was allowed to continue. No comment from Alpert.





Always remember the 49th parallel and remember if we hadn't needed it . . . it wouldn't be there. It is what divides Canada from the United States and it should divide our thinking from theirs.


I'm sure that no one in Nashville would admire Canadians who imitate Nashville. They are people who believe in creative innovation and would admire something uniquely apart from what they are doing.

Gregorash & Ben Kaye pact long term deal

Publisher/producer Ben Kaye, has announced the signing of Joey Gregorash, Jay Nine and Dollar Bill Music, to a long-term agreement. Kaye's vinyl-output includes Trini Lopez, the Bells, Tinker's Moon, Marty Butler, and Patsy Gallant as well as an extended host of other music-talents.

The acquisition of Gregorash and his catalogue "is a giant step in the development of Joey's career as a writer and an all-round entertainer." Kaye has been working on two French-translated recordings by Gregorash, and has secured two U.S. recordings, T.B.A.

Mills-Cockell performs for World Music Week

September 28th, is the date slated for the John Mills-Cockell Band to stage a concert commemorating the Pop portion of World Music Week.

The show will be performed in the Harbourfront Bohemian Embassy and recorded on location by Heartbeat Studios (Toronto) for the CBC. Delegates of the International Music Council will be hosted by the Music Council, for the weeks events.

Charles-Dunne and Owens promo'ing Jethro Tull

Joe Owens of PR Firm Charles-Dunne and Owens, reports that Jethro Tull's Ian Anderson, coining himself "The Minstrel" is back once again on the music-scene.

The title of the new Tull release is "Minstrel In The Gallery", distributed by WEA Canada on Ian Anderson's Chrysalis label. At last notification, the Jethro Tull concert scheduled by Concert Productions International for Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens, October 7th should be completely sold out by curtain time.

Jethro Tull is still incredible for concert-viewing, even if one has to sit behind a wall of speakers . . . better than the Rolling Stones at any rate.

"Come Back Mick Jagger" - British Tory spokesman

A top British politician sprang off his soapbox to scream out the plea, "Come back, Mick Jagger."

The outburst was triggered by what opposition Conservative spokesman Sir Geoffrey Howe has termed as the "fame drain." The plea was delivered at Nottingham University, in which Sir Geoffrey urged a drastic cut in the British income tax structure. He lamented that rock-stars and other British celebrities are being driven out of Britain because of "punitive" tax laws that can take up to 98% of a star's earnings.

"There is little doubt that most of the stars concerned . . . the Rolling Stones, Slade, Ringo Starr and Rod Stewart for example, would prefer to make the United Kingdom their financial base", Sir Geoffrey told the students.

"If we had a top rate of, say 50%, they would almost certainly do so." The former Tory cabinet minister said that it is self-defeating for the tax-man to demand 83% of earned income and 98% of investment income from top earners, since Britain loses greater amounts of tax when the famous decide to live abroad.

England seems like the worst place to live these days, what with pub-hurled bombings and the high rate of unemployment.

The people and the government it seems, are tired of seeing megastars reap millions for single albums, when their mothers are busy char-womaning the floors of their studios.

Music World's Hughes sets Canadian dates

Houghton Hughes, Managing Director of New Zealand's Music World Ltd. will be visiting the U.S. and Canada this month in order to: "renew acquaintances with existing licensors and to negotiate New Zealand licensing rights to selected labels", and to "obtain overseas release of Music World's New Zealand product."

Hagood Hardy's "Homecoming" "The biggest instrumental hit ever"

Hagood Hardy, former Doug Riley jingle-man cohort and now a cross-over monster maker, has had his Canadian Talent Library LP and single "The Homecoming" as "shaping up to be the biggest instrumental hit ever to come out of Canada", - and it's not a fluke.

Featuring the Canadian jazz-scene's who's-who, including Eugene Amaro and Ed Bickert, domestic sales on both the single and LP indicate probable gold records.

Originally recorded on Hardy's Isis Records, Attic Records Limited released the single and LP, simultaneously in July. Capitol's Al Coury and Bob Young negotiated the U.S. release with Attic's Al Mair.

RPM as well as dozens of Canadian programmers knew of the instrumental impact that a heavy-weight string-layered Canadian jazz line-up could produce . . .

From RPM's August 2nd album review, Michael Dolgy had written that, "Hagood Hardy has written, produced and arranged over one-half of this release's layer-lush instrumentals, with his 'Homecoming' (at 2:29) furrowing itself towards a comfortable niche in the Canadian MOR-programming. Many progressive FM-outlets would be well advised to listen to the soothing benefits this production affords . . . the collection of the 12 instrumentals recall the supremacy of relaxation that

some sounds are able to induce . . . the 'Homecoming' succeeds to score with an imagery, coupled to a measure of collective talent."

Programmers across the board have usually regulated instrumentals to an MOR-programming . . . Vibraphonist Hardy has broken the top-40 Seventies rock-sound with an easy-going effort, proving that good music can communicate his jazz-bent "raw-emotion. MD

Tom Gallant shapes up as CBC-TV's new country star

"You don't know what you think about a thing until you write a song about it", says Boot's Tom Gallant in his simple soul-search fashion. The Gallant single "Cathy's Wedding Song" enters the RPM Country playlist at No. 47 this week.

Earlier on the CBC this summer July 11th, Tom Gallant played host on Tommy Hunter's summer replacement with a series entitled "Down Home Country."

"It's the first time I've ever been interpreted by somebody else", said Gallant of starring in a CBC-Stan Jacobson produced series.

The 29 year old Maritimer felt confident of the series, as he was backed by the talents of the trio, Blue Jane-Stephanie Taylor, Dianne Miller and Judy Richards. Comic interludes were provided by yet another trio, comprised of volatile Peter Cullen, Harvey Atkin, and straight-lady Nancy White.

If today, Gallant can't fully recover over the fortune of having his own show, it's because he broke into television in a one-camera station where he had to learn to handle all the knobs himself.

"I was the fastest camera in the east", he once told reporters.

While at college in Charlottetown, P.E.I., Gallant became involved in little theatre both as actor and playwrite and not applying to his studies. He spent a year in Portugal writing plays, and played guitar on weekends. "The Closet" was made back in Canada and he began to get guest shots on various television specials.

Last April, Stompin' Tom's Boot label released his first album "Down Home." "Cathy's Wedding Song" is a sure pick-up with all the country programmers.

Foldy's Bondi Music into Beechwood fold

Beechwood Music's Joey Frechette, following a recent "get-together", of composers, producers, artists and co-publishers at the Beechwood 42 Scollard Street offices announced that Peter Foldy, Australia to York University good-guy and recently signed on with Capitol Records, has finalized a co-publishing agreement between his Bondi Music and the Beechwood group.

Cliff Edwards, recently completing four Beechwood copyrights, dropped by to discuss his single "Singer Of Songs" distributed by A&M. Gene MacLellan and Joey Frechette rounded the social-sphere by discussing future plans for MacLellan's forthcoming Capitol release, on which production has begun.

Other Beechwood copyrights include Susan Jacks, Bruce Miller, Lynn Jones, Catharine McKinnon, Dick Damron, and Suzanne Stevens . . . all are in current-release or will be in the near-future.





A CIT spectacular showcase

Ross White, president of Canadian International Talent (CIT), presented a showcase-spectacular, Sept 14, at Toronto's Ramada Inn. The showcasing began in the Zodiac Room at 12 noon with a healthy booze opener. The stage show began at 2:15 with an array of ten lounge acts presenting their talent to an estimated 225 music buyers and nightclub operators from across North America.

White's purpose for the presentation was that "...there are literally thousands of groups playing across the country who are

not recording stars, but are working and making a name for themselves. This show gives the buyer a chance to see what they are going to get".

Conditions were suitable for a pleasurable viewing/sound experience . . . tight-bottomed Zodiac waitresses hopped-about each table filling out all liquor-orders and escorting all attended to a buffet dinner of cold cut delicacies piled sky-high.

Estimated by Ross in the vicinity of \$7500, the Showcase burst-energy as the band Accompaniment, managed by Wayne Baguley, blasted alto sax on Average White Band and Downchild disco-melodies. According to sources, the band consists of "seven fine young gentlemen, ready to get down and get it out".

The other acts, singing and pounding out their music included Goody Two Shoes, a "white funk and rock 'n roll" band, comprised of four instrumental back-up and the dynamic vocal-chords of Lydia Taylor; Copperfield, featuring "two high steppin" front men whose energetic choreographics and fine vocals make a power-packed evening's entertainment; Nicholas Sloan, featuring songs from the rock-opera "Tommy"; Northern Dancer, comprising five pieces of

Bitter Blue, probably the fastest rising lounge act to arrive on the Canadian music scene, thrilled the audience with their brand of easy-listenin'; and Canada, "five vigorous Canadians from Sudbury, Ontario, whose roots and inclinations show a remarkable propensity to good ol' fashioned fun-music" got the crowd whooping and calling back for more.

Neannette Brantley and the Arrangement came up-front with the lady's flute and added dimension to her rhythm section of guitar, bass, drums and organ.


Crackers, from Burlington, Ontario, are a band comprised of three dancing guys and a cute young blonde. As the people say: "...Crackers is a state of mind".

Ross then door-prized an AM/FM radio, colour portable television and a grand prize of a trip for two to Las Vegas.


All in attendance then left the club in order to be wine 'n cheezed at a hospitality suite set aside by CIT.

The Starship and other Labour Day "miracles"


Sound . . . the final frontier.

Fearing that a rain would dampen the electric-action, concert-goers were advanced by notices of re-direction on the walls of the Arena . . . sorry kid, but ya' gotta go down to Maple Leaf Gardens.

Time for some greaser-rock action, playing double-encore to second-case of brew. The crowd was still munching on their popcorn though, determined to see their ticket-price through.


Lights-on again to reveal a not quite sold-out full-house, but what's to be expected for a last-minute theatre-switch? There seemed enough people to make it enjoyable.

Living the past again "just about anything and everything the music scene's now into is dated."

About once a month I get this strange urge to become a rock and roll star. It's not the artistic freedom I crave; it's the money, the chicks, the fame, I want. Seeing the futility in all this, I take, first, a long Manhattan (with bitters), then a trip to the nearest rock club.

This always does it. Ten minutes watching your typical we're going-to-make-it-as-soon-as-our-album-comes-out kind of band is an instant cure.

It's like stepping into a time warp and finding yourself in 1967 all over again. Now, 1967 wasn't a bad year as years go. But again? No thanks. Too much of a good thing is still too much.

The problem is rock is frozen in 1967, or thereabouts. Sure, some bands are into tone-rows and duodecaphony and stuff, and it sounds pretty far out. But it isn't. It's 1967 only with a new pair of fins and some chrome.

I'm not talking about the music, primarily. Good rock is good rock, and if some band now wants to sound like some band back then, that's fine. I mean, Bachman-Turner Overdrive (taken in moderation) sounds almost as good as did Creedence Clearwater. But the scene itself is locked into the '67 groove and refuses to get out. And things are starting to atrophy.

Consider: Long hair is dated; short-haired reaction to long hair is even more dated. Four-minute-long drum and/or guitar solos

are/is dated. Four (five, six) guys standing on stage is dated. A stage filled with amplifiers is dated. Lyrics about teleporting to Mars and/or getting laid are dated. Groupies are dated. Analysing Bob Dylan is a dated activity. Tight crotches are dated. Having famous session men on your album is dated. Waiting for the next Beatles is dated. Waiting for the old Beatles is dated. Waiting for anybody is dated. Platform shoes are dated. Dark sunglasses at night are dated. Worrying about the state of the recording industry is dated. Going to rock festivals is dated. Being laid back is dated. Going bananas at a rock concert (fist waving; standing up when lead singer says so) is dated. Hip is dated. Hiring a limo is dated. Superstar --- both the word and the idea --- is dated. Rock movies are dated

In short, just about anything and everything the music scene's now into is dated. Finished.

Now, this wouldn't be so serious if everyone knew it. After all, we live in a re-cycled culture and another bit of re-cycling from the music biz wouldn't hurt much. But the music biz has always seen itself to be in the vanguard of things cultural. And because it once was the growth industry, the newest kid on the block, it's still locked into the idea that it's still coming up with novelty.

Well, in a way, novelty is the only thing rock has to offer now. Novelty, not something new. David Bowie is novel: he's not anything new. Synthesizers are novel, not

new (at least the way rock uses them). So rock has created a fake sense of progress, of re-newing itself, with novel little tricks.

Unfortunately, rock needs to be new, not novel. It's the only street art we have. It's the only thing we have to really tell us what's happening to us when we're not thinking Great Thoughts. It should be day-to-day disposable, radical.

But it isn't. And, I suggest, a lot of people are going to be hurt, financially or otherwise when the people out there --- the ones who suddenly realize that rock has become old hat --- look for something new. Because they'll find it. It may be in politics, or poetry, or surfing. And then they'll turn around and see this long-haired industry and all these long hair musicians and wonder what the hell it's all about.

You'll know it's officially all over when some stockbroker and his wife throw a party, hoping for the same success their Gatsby party had last year, and all their guests rush out to get long wigs and their Elton John sunglasses. That will be it.

Jeez, I just remembered. Such a party was given in Toronto less than two weeks ago.

Wall and friends set to coordinate Mosport '76

Due to the financial success of this summer's Mosport music event, billed as "Beyond The City", Jack J. Wall has been given exclusive rights to produce and co-ordinate a Mosport '76.

The promo team of Lip Service David Marsden and Ian Ross will once again supervise all administrative and promotional functions, as well as retaining the services of Jack Morrow.

Five more projects have been tentatively scheduled, and according to that usually reliable source, "there will be a considerable financial backing" to insure "even greater" music events.

Pagliaro breaks "easy" from coast to coast

Moving in quickly with a high-powered promotion campaign on the initial Pagliaro single release, Columbia has succeeded in breaking the single in many of the major and breakout markets across Canada. The single, "What The Hell I Got", is now enjoying numbers at CKLW, CFUN, CJMS, CKGM, CFGO, CHUM and CFRW.

Pagliaro is now working on a new album in French expected for release sometime in October.

Hank Smith, holder of a new Quality single release, "If You Don't Laugh, I Promise I Won't Cry" flew into Toronto for the Big Country Weekend and managed to score a three niter at the Concord, Toronto's newest fast-becoming-popular country showplace. Remember, it was Hank Smith who organized the Country Music Association of Canada in Edmonton a few months ago, and chances are, this group could form a powerful chapter for CACMA.

Tom Gallant, host of his own CBC TV country show (which was nominated for a Big Country Award) has shown early indications of catching the national ear of Canadian programmers. His Boot single, "Cathy's Wedding Song", which he wrote and published through Critique Music (CAPAC) enters the RPM Country Playlist this week.

Ronnie Burla, Royalty recording artist, has broken through with his single, "Rainin' In My Heart". Initial reaction came from the Edmonton area.

Bill Hersche, who recently released "Rainin' In My Mind" on the Train label, has been getting some interesting comments from programmers on the single with several playlisting the single.

Michael T. Wall, well-known Singing Newfoundlander, is off with his new Rodeo

single "Ode To The Newbie Bullett" which was culled from his album, under the same title.

Reg Watkins, another self promotin' Newfoundlander, wasn't happy with what was going down with his "Badger Moose" single so he took stock and after making a tally of what was happening with the single in Newfoundland, was confident he has the makings of a hit. Seems like a lot of mainland programmers agreed and Reg is now looking good.

Ronnie Prophet is receiving his dues from south of the border and maybe we can lay a little credit for his recognition on the exposure he received on his CBC-TV series. Anyhoo, his single, "Sanctuary" has the RCA Canada people ooing and ahhing. It's a Canadian production you know, which just might turn off some of the Nashville purists (shades of Olivia Newton-John).

What's the state of the country music business in Canada? Well, judging by this week's Big Country issue of RPM "pretty damn good." But, here's some food for thought. An American giant in country music recently had a No. 1 hit across Canada. She was lucky to have her sales top the 5000 mark. We got trouble with a capitol "T" right here in Toronto where there are three high-powered country radio stations pumping the best in Canadian and foreign country into a population that exceeds three million and represents almost 55% of the entire Canadian market. You know how effective that is on the retail level? Don't ask, on the

other hand, ask - and Big Country is the place to start the asking.

The Royalty gang will be at Big Country - well Chris Nielsen and R. Harlan Smith, and Cheryl Kryla anyway and they've got good news from their label. Cheryl, Chris and Harlan have singles sizzling - "Too Much Love", "Lady From Virginia" and "Momma's Voice", respectively and Jimmy Arthur Orde is doing it with "Storytime and Prayers." If labels like Royalty, Condor, Broadland, Train, DMG, Quality, Gaiety, PLP, Cloud Burst, Gincin, Westmount, Little Guy, Casino and . . . MY GAWD . . . that's a helluva large and impressive list and you know, we just might have a country music industry sizzling. I'll bet I left out a few labels too (and we'll hear about it). Anyway, if they keep it up, we'll have to come up with an RPM Country Playlist with a hundred numbers.

VOCM's Johnny Murphy and Ron McNeill, owner of a couple of St. John's record stores called Records Unlimited, will be sitting on the Big Country panel Saturday the 27th and you might like to ask them about a recent promotion that proved the consumer who listens to country radio - would like to buy the product, if it was available. Ron bought a spot campaign on Murph's Saturday morning country show.

Murph played the records, talked about them and advised his listeners they were available at Records Unlimited. Ron was ready for the crush and, he was right.

VOCM listeners contributed significantly to the sales picture of both stores. Remem-

Abner out - Gordy returns to active helm of Motown

With the resignation of Ewart Abner, stepping down as president of Motown Records to become consultant to the organization, Berry Gordy, chairman of Motown Industries, has retained the additional appointment of the Motown Records presidency.

Barney Ales, has been chosen by Gordy to act as the firm's executive vice president as well as vice president of the parent company.

Ales had formerly been a Motown executive, until 3 years ago when he left to oversee his personal investments.

Gordy said of Ewart Abner, "Abner has made invaluable contributions to Motown's growth and we are happy to take advantage of his services as consultant . . ." Gordy was also overjoyed that friend Barney Ales had come out of his semi-retirement.

Ales duties will include the supervision of all marketing activities including sales, distribution/promotion as well as looking after Motown's publishing and international operations.

Crosby & Nash without Stills pact record deal with ABC

According to Jerold H. Rubinstein, chairman of ABC Records, David Crosby and Graham Nash have signed a long-term recording contract with his label.

First release by the duo will be an album entitled "Wind On The Water." Crosby, formerly of the Byrds and Nash, late of the Hollies, have been thunderously received in the past as part of the Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young team.

An acoustic tour has just been completed and an electric road tour has been scheduled for October.

Jerry Greenberg, president of Atlantic Records stated that his company was "looking forward to" the completion of Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young releases in the near future.

Andy DeJarlis Foremost Canadian Fiddler




Five Gold records to Condor's Bates



Phinney just recently completed a promotion tour with his record and called in at many country outlets where he received indications of good support.





Charley Pride one of the biggest sellers in the country fold, has just signed a new long-term contract to record exclusively for RCA. Mel Iberman Division Vice President, Nashville Operations for RCA Records, made the announcement at a New York reception in Pride's honour.

The contract continues an association which bloomed in 1965 with Chet Atkins, Division Vice President, Country Music.

Pride possesses at least eleven gold albums and one gold for a single. Currently Pride has an album released entitled "Charley" and a new single "Hope You're Feelin' Me."

Anne Murray and friends named in U.S. action

Canadian heavy-weight Anne Murray is being sued to the tune of \$2.5 million. According to Wichita Kansas promoter Harry Peebles, Anne Murray and her co-defendants, Allan Strahl of Beverly Hills, Marvin Josephson Associates Inc. of Los Angeles and the New York-based Alive Enterprises Inc., engaged in "an illegal and unlawful conspiracy" to break a contract they entered into last January, so that the singer "could appear elsewhere under more advantageous terms."

Peebles, who maintains booking agencies in Wichita and Kansas City, insists that Murray broke her contract to appear Aug. 21st at the Missouri State Fair.

Hefty Columbia promo on Springsteen release

A nation-wide promo campaign for Columbia's Bruce Springsteen is coinciding with his new LP-release "Born To Run."

Scott McNeill, National Merchandising Manager for the Columbia group, said that "This promotional campaign is designed to stimulate interest at both retail and radio levels . . . Springsteen has been receiving outstanding critical acclaim . . . 1975 will undoubtedly be the year of Bruce Springsteen."

"Greetings From Asbury Park, N.J." and "The Wild, The Innocent and the E Street Shuffle" are Springsteen's other Columbia releases.

Elements of the campaign will stress radio-time, print-ads, a poster highlighting the three albums and in-store displays.

Steinberg to temporary head of giant Polydor Inc.

Wornall (Bill) Farr resigned as president of Polydor Inc., which became effective Sept. 9. Farr had also served as president of Phonodisc, a U.S. company, not connected in any way with the Canadian firm of the same name.

Irwin Steinberg has reported that on an "interim basis", he (Steinberg), will serve as president of Polydor Inc., as well as serving in that position at Phonogram, Polydor and Polygram.

In a statement, Steinberg expressed "regret" over Farr's resignation. At present, discussions are taking place among Polydor International, Polygram Corporation and the Polydor Record Group concerning expansion-plans for Polydor Inc.

"94Q" will also feature afternoon interviews


