Polydor's Sedaka awarded Canadian Gold

Polydor recording artist Neil Sedaka concluded a two-date tour of Alberta (May 31) by performing two shows at Calgary's Jubilee Auditorium for 5,400 appreciative patrons.

Sedaka had appeared before 6,000 fans in Lethbridge Sunday May 30 with RCA's Aztec Two Step as his warm-up act on both occasions.

Sedaka's visit to Calgary was capped by the presentation of three gold records, one for his single Bad Blood and the remaining two for his albums, Sedaka's Back and The Hungry Years. All three have been certified gold in Canada.

Sedaka's 90 minute set contained a selection of his old standards such as Calendar Girl, Oh Carol and Happy Birthday Sweet Sixteen as well as selections from his past.

"It's great to see people appreciating my newer material," said Sedaka at a press reception staged at the refinery. "At one time all people wanted to hear was the old hits."

Between 1959 and 1963, Sedaka sold

25 million records, but the Beatles invasion sent the New York native into a self-imposed retirement. He still composed for a number of artists including Tom Jones, The Fifth Dimension and Peggy Lee but didn't record again until 1971 when he travelled to England to produce the first of three albums.

"It was Elton John who gave me the confidence to return to America," said Sedaka. "He convinced me the material was good enough to re-establish myself."

Sedaka collected the best cuts of his three English albums into Sedaka's Back, the record which launched his American comeback.

A single from Sedaka's Back, Laughter In The Rain, turned gold in a matter of weeks and another track from the same album, Love Will Keep Us Together, was recorded by Captain and Tennille, selling more than three million copies. His two follow-up albums, The Hungry Years and Steppin' Out have done almost as well, spawning a number of hit singles.

Radio Shack searches for best CB songster

Radio Shack, one of the largest North American retail radio, phonograph and related equipment, chain stores, is sponsoring a U.S.-Canadian CB radio song contest.

The company is offering 63 cash prizes for the best songs (music and lyrics), in any style about citizens band radio. Participants may enter as many songs as they can write. The ten finalists will all be recorded by Radio Shack.

Cancon singles top

U.K. charts

RCA's Ed Preston reports J.J. Barrie's No Charge has topped the charts in England, selling more than one-half million copies. Released early this spring, the song was making headway on Canadian charts until CHUM talk-show host John Gilbert covered it on Capitol and proceeded to outsell Barrie's version, helped along by a very respectable berth on CHUM's chart. Gilbert's No Charge is currently number 55 on the RPM singles chart.

Barrie's version is two parts Cancon. He was born in Oshawa, the single was recorded at the RCA studios in Toronto. Bill Amesbury produced, John Copek played piano and Milan Kymlicka arranged the strings that form the basis of the musical background to the spoken-word sentimental disc. It was written by American Harlin Howard.

Barrie's album, released in the U.K., sold 11,000 copies in two weeks. Recorded in London and Toronto, the album will be released in Canada shortly.

Barrie may have a special attachment to the U.K., the birthplace of his wife, Kristine. Her new single, Devil Woman, is reported moving into the top 20 in England. It's also Cancon, with hubby's touch on the music and lyrics.

Radio Shack will, by the contest rules, become the sole owner of all copyright, world rights, sound recording rights etc., in the name of Radio Shack, "together with extensions and renewals, the right to use new lyrics with the melody . . . (or) . . . new melody with the lyrics, the right to publish, reproduce and disseminate the entry by any means, the right to alter, expand, adopt and translate either the lyrics or music of a submitted entry, the right to change the title . . . and the right to license or assign any of the foregoing . . .

"In consideration of the prize money to be awarded," contestants must agree that their names, biographical sketches and pictures can be used. In exchange, Radio Shack is granting \$1,000 to each of the 50 finalists, \$2,000 to each of the 10 semi-finalists, \$5,000 more to the third, \$10,000 to the second and \$15,000 more to the first prize winner. Cumulative top prize is thus \$18,000; each of the ten finalists will receive at least \$3,000.

All of the top 10 songs entered will be recorded. All entries must be recorded on cassette tape (they recommend Radio Shack Supertape, Realistic, or Concertape).

Entries must be received by Radio Shack by August 31. Forms are available at Radio Shack outlets or from Radio Shack, CB Song Search, Dept. 0062, 2617W. 7th St., Fort Worth, Texas.

CPI, DKD tour Cooper

The 11-date Alice Cooper Canadian tour (June 30-July 15) is promoted by Donald K. Donald and Concert Productions International, per the agreement of the two firms to cooperate on tours of major acts which include more than four Canadian dates. Taurus' Max Webster, booked by Music Shoppe, opens each Cooper date.

Troiano preps for label deal

Domenic Troiano is probably the only Canadian guitar star. He established an American following for himself as a member of the Guess Who until its breakup early this year, and a few years back he recorded two albums with the James Gang. He's also released two solo albums and led the Canadian bands Mandala and Bush, as well as producing RCA's Shawne Jackson.

Now he's back in Toronto with his own band, playing clubs for the first time in years and shopping around for a label.

"No, I'm not signed to a label," Troiano told RPM. "But with the last couple of bands I wasn't signed to a label either. I was with the Guess Who without being signed to RCA, and I was in the James Gang without being signed to ABC. I want to record of course, but I'm in no rush. I really want to get the band together."

The band consists of music acquaintances and friends. Fred Mandella is the synthesizer specialist, Dave Tyson is the second keyboardist, Keith Jones is bassist, Jim Norman, formerly of Rough Trade, is drummer, and Wayne St. John, ex of Ocean, is vocalist. The band was formed in March; they started playing clubs in April.

In November, after five years of living in Los Angeles, Troiano says, he came back to Toronto to live and to form his dream band:

"I knew this would be the best place to put the band together, because a lot of the players I had in mind were based up here. And this is a great place to work and to get things going; there's a lot happening locally."

Since April, the Domenic Troiano band has played the major rock clubs of Toronto, including the Gasworks, the Colonial, and the El Macombo. A performance at the latter was broadcast by CHUM-FM.

Negotiations for use of these tapes by U.S. radio stations are underway. Indicating interest are: WIOQ-FM Philadelphia, WABX-FM Detroit, KWST-FM Los Angeles, and a possible special show to be featured on CKOC, over the next few weeks.

Troiano obviously isn't in a hurry, and he seems to be in a secure position; and

plans to take a few weeks off this month. At the end of June, he will be going into the studio, probably by himself, to get a few things on tape. He wants to be able to give the record people an idea of the band's sound, which he feels is very versatile, "because the guys are all so good themselves; we can do anything we want to do."


With major label interest already expressed, and with a past full of superstar associations, many wonder why Troiano is playing clubs.

"Clubs are great!" he explained. "It's the best place in the world to get a band together, and I haven't done it in so long I'd forgotten how much fun it is. You get that immediate feeling from the audience. Concerts are so isolated, they wheel ya in and they wheel ya out. There could be 20,000 people out there and all you can see is the first row."

Capek creates Toronto niche

Three and a half years ago, John Capek came from his native Australia, where he was working as a composer and musician. He intended to stay a few weeks to help a friend who'd come here to record an album. Several months ago, Capek finally returned to Australia, but only to visit.

When his friend's album was delayed for



weeks in production, Capek settled down, writing lead sheets for publishers and working around Toronto. He played keyboards on an Ian Thomas session, which produced Painted Ladies, an international hit. It launched the careers of both Thomas and Capek.

Since then, he's composed, arranged, played and produced dozens of sessions for artists like Fludd, Suzanne Stevens, Dan Hill, and Ken Tobias. He's done work, he

figures, for just about every major record company, and has been in every Toronto studio.

Capek has also worked in the U.S. For example, his production of Gene MacLellan's new LP (scheduled for early July release on Capitol) involved mixing in Los Angeles with Keith Olsen, Fleetwood Mac's producer, engineering the session.

Having worked with people on both sides of the border, Capek is in a good position to discuss the advantages of working in the States.

"American session musicians are more professional; there's more work for them to do" Capek told RPM. "A Toronto musician just doesn't play as much, and, so, isn't as experienced."

Capek doesn't plan to move south, though, because he's sure things are brewing in Toronto:

"There must be something happening here. Why else would names like the Bay City Rollers and Elton John come here to record?"

Capek suggests that Toronto is relatively fresh with lots of room to develop, and, perhaps, New York and Los Angeles have no where left to grow.

In the meantime, Capek has more than enough to keep him busy. Besides the Gene MacLellan LP, for which he used Alice Cooper's band and Anne Murray on backup vocals, he recently completed co-production of Ken Tobias' album Every Bit Of Love, from which Give A Little Love is enjoying a good run on the RPM chart. Also just completed are an album for Bryan Way, and a single, just released Stateside, by Heaven's Radio, called Good Time Station on U.A.

Work is underway on projects with the Good Brothers for RCA, Bruce Miller for A&M, and local bands Rough Trade, Cayote and Jack Tobi for labels not yet named.

Industry "gets together" at Annual Awards Banquet

Three hundred and fifty people got together in the Centennial Ballroom of Toronto's Inn on the Park (June 7) to attend the first annual Canadian Music Industry Awards Banquet. The awards were based on the voting in the first RPM Readers' Poll.

During the early evening cocktail reception, guests from as far away as London, England and from across Canada met their

counterparts, representing, record companies, artists, personal managers, record producers, publishers, recording studios staff, record librarians, music directors, booking agents and record retailers.

It all began in April of this year, when RPM mailed nomination ballots to Canadian subscribers. The ballots were returned to an accountancy firm and tabulated. The five highest scorers in each category were tabulated and a voting ballot was mailed to the same subscribers early in May. Again, these ballots were returned to the accountancy firm.

The results were known only to the accountancy firm and the night of the banquet, a representative of the firm was on

hand with the results for each category sealed in envelopes.

After a scrumptious banquet, served elegantly in the usual Inn on the Park efficiency, RPM publisher Walt Grealis opened the proceedings. The text of his speech follows.

" . . . I think you'll agree with me that it's good for us to be able to get together like this from time to time. The occasion seldom presents itself, of late, but tonight, we are here to find out the results of the RPM Readers' Poll and to find out who we will hate for the next little while. All kidding aside, of course, it's really an occasion to renew old friendships and discuss the business and get to know one another better which, I suppose is the real reason for our communication-type of get-togethers.

"It's our hope that we can make this evening's affair a yearly event and, although the industry needs another awards presentation like it needs another return privilege for dealers. . . . it is a good reason to get together.

"The most important point I would like to make before we begin is that all the nomination ballots and voting ballots were returned to the accountancy firm of Donald Hill & Partners - and a representative of that firm is here tonight with the tabulation of the ballots.

"I would like to make it quite clear at this time, that at no time did anyone at RPM or anyone associated with RPM, see any of the returned ballots - either voting or nomination - nor has there been any conversation by myself or my staff about the results. Those results are completely

based on the ballots returned by our readers. The results are known only to the chartered accountancy firm.

"As you know, among the readers of RPM are people in every area of the industry. They all deal with one another toward a common cause - RECORD SALES. What better group is there to judge these categories?

"tonight, we will feel the pulse of the industry from coast to coast, as fragmented as it is. In this contest, which goes on day in and day out. We already know the five nominees in each category - and being nominated is already enough praise - but now we find out who the winners are.

"This kind of competition can only further the industry as each segment becomes aware of their standing and works to improve. We have been told that this kind of award presentation is dangerous because it will leave some people out. It might be better to say that it's a good idea because it will indicate WHO IS being left out. The rules are the same for everyone and, in the year of the Olympics in Canada. . . . we should be sportsmen in our businesses as well as our sport."

The presenters for the evening were distinguished music industry figures and, between each award, Grealis emceed with glib off-the-cuff remarks that brought ease to what began as a very serious and stiff affair.

As the evening wore on, the speakers and audience were caught up in the light-hearted mood of the event and it became a roast of the industry as well as an award presentation and proved that many of the

record and music VIPs had a great sense of humour and timing.

Midway in the presentations, John Mills, Q.C. was presented with the RPM Canadian Music Industry Hall of Fame Award which turned out to be a high point of the evening and Mr. Mills was honoured by a standing ovation.

In making the presentation, RPM's Stan Klees said of Mills: ". . . As head of this giant performing rights organization, he has been active in improving the status of Canadian songwriters and publishers. His was one of the first, if not lone, voices raised in support of 'legislated radio'. He carries on an active communication with Ottawa sources that have been of benefit to the Canadian music industry. This is an important year for him, as he brings his performing rights society into its 51st year of operation. . . . and it's an important night for the industry because tonight,












Ron Ketchman of Donald Hill & Partners, Chartered Accountancy firm in control of the ballots, explains how the nomination and voting results were processed.





High-brow, jazz, blues highlight Olympic fests

Among the many cultural events to be staged during the Montreal Olympics this season are two music series run under the auspices of COJO's (the Olympic organizing committee's) Arts And Culture Programme: COJAZZ, a jazz blues festival; and a 322 performance high-brow series.

The COJAZZ series will be staged in four different locations (Montreal, the Olympic Village, Sherbrooke and Kingston) with each of five headline acts playing each spot once during the two-week Olympic activities.

Paul Horn and Sonny Greenwich play July 9-11, Moe Koffman and Phil Nimmons

(15-19), Maynard Ferguson (26-30), Gino Vanelli (26-30), and David Clayton Thomas and Blood Sweat and Tears (20-24). July 4, in Montreal, there will be a showcase of Quebec groups: Taoubabou, Zak, Octobre, and Nebu.

The 322 performance, high-brow series will stage more than two dozen theatre, opera, choral, symphony, and dance groups in 19 theatres in Sherbrooke, Kingston, Montreal and Ottawa.

There are 300,000 tickets available for the series; 270,000 of them have already been distributed through Ticket Reservation Systems outlets.

THE GOOD BROTHERS

The Good Brothers
RCA KPL1-0168-N

With their first album for RCA, the Goods offer an original bluegrass sound that should appeal to every kind of programmer and record buyer. Brother Brian plays electrified acoustic guitar, Larry shines on banjo and Bruce smooths the sound with his autoharp. Adding to the overall instrumental packaging of the group are Michael Love on bass and John Allen, fiddle and mandolin. Also lending a hand, with the recording session, are Danny McBride, guitar, Adam Mitchell, John Capek and Pee Wee Charles. The latter adds that country flavour on steel.

Adam Mitchell produced most of the session at Thunder Sound with Phil Sheridan and Allen Thorne. He also composed the thoughtful cut that closes the album, All Get Lost (MAPL at 4:37). His production of Fox On The Run (AP at 2:15) with its vocal harmonies and banjo, make it one of the standout cuts (and it doesn't even vaguely sound like the one by Sweet). Another Mitchell touch can be heard on That's The Kind Of Man I Am, the current single release. Also, if there are any programmers who haven't listened to Brian's Missing You (MAPL 3:49) on the flip of their single, they should do so immediately. The string arrangement is by Milan Kymlicka.

John Capek also produced some of the cuts, at RCA's Toronto studios. His production of Mike McClellan's Midnight Flight (AP 3:06) might be the followup single. Capek's talents grace Homemaded Wine (MAPL 2:58), slightly surprising in style but still fine. Richard Savoie's Good Boogie also gets a beautiful treatment, and might make good headway as a single on country and certainly the pop charts.



Soft jazz sounds featuring Smith's band, the Cosmic Echoes, with David Hubbard on reeds and Leopoldo Fleming on percussion. Best cuts are Sunbeams and Goddess Of Love, and funkier Get Down Everybody and Beautiful Woman. Check out the percussion experiment of Journey Into Space.

Rough-cut, fast-paced and heavy rock identify this British band. Phil Mogg's vocals and Michael Schenker's guitar are featured in cuts like Natural Thing and I'm A Loser and Highway Lady the best cuts. Progressive programmers and fans of loud rock will be interested in this set.

A fine collection of classic blues and boogie tunes, treated as good as any blues band you'd care to name. You've heard the songs before, but there's something unique about this band, especially since they're Japanese. With proper exposure, they could be very big over here. North American release pending, watch for it.

Sweeney Todd alive and touring Canada

A sheet of paper exhibited by Sweeney Todd bassist Bud Marr effectively erased rumours of the Vancouver band's impending break-up.

The paper contained an itinerary for a 39-date tour of western Canada which the London recording artists have embarked upon to promote their debut album, Sweeney Todd, and their hit single, Roxy Roller.

Break-up rumours began to fly when lead vocalist, Nick Gilder and lead guitarist James McCulloch left Sweeney Todd almost as soon as their album entered the charts.

Gilder, who with McCulloch had penned most of the band's material, jumped to the Chrysalis label to pursue a solo career and McCulloch went along with him.

"Nobody knows that much about the situation," said Marr when RPM interviewed the band in a Calgary hotel prior to the opening of their first tour.

"Everyone seems to be asking, 'What's happening to Sweeney Todd?' There's all sorts of rumours going around about us breaking up. But as you can see, the band is in pretty good shape."

To compensate for the loss of Gilder and McCulloch, the band has acquired the services of vocalist Clark Perry 25, who performed with a Vancouver Island band called Freisha, and lead Guitarist Skip Prest 25, a former member of Jet, a Vancouver-based band.

Both will share song-writing duties with the group's other three members - Marr, Drummer John Booth and keyboardist Dan

Gaudin.

"The loss of Nick (Gilder) didn't really come as a shock," said Marr. "We knew he was leaving all along. But we had intended on going with Jim as lead guitarist.

"But Jim didn't know what he wanted to do. He couldn't make his mind up whether he wanted to write songs with Nick or to stay with us. He wanted to do both.

"So we just said, 'Forget it, we'll go out and get a new guitarist.' We sorta made up his mind for him."

Although the new-look Sweeney Todd has only been together for two weeks, Marr is confident the present lineup is better than ever.

Sweeney Todd's initial tour, which takes them through June and July is one which Marr says, "Will give us a chance to tighten up and get to know each other." The band will then do an extended eastern tour in August.

Sweeney Todd have also returned to the studio, re-recording their latest single, Juicy Loose, to include the new members.

A U.S. distribution contract with London Records is in the process of being negotiated.

Skip Prest advises that the band will probably re-record their first album for American distribution, omitting some of the old songs to insert new material.

Agents' new booking web to ease tour problems

In an effort to facilitate national bookings for acts established regionally and thus increase their own roster of acts, Music Shoppe International president Ron Scribner and VP Ralph Jolivet recently travelled across the west, talking to club owners and concert promoters. They also met with reps from Alberta's Studio City Agency, Saskatchewan's Quicksilver Agency, and Bruce Allen Talent in B.C., all major western booking agencies.


They hope the meetings will enable easier cross-Canada bookings for club and one-nighter artists from all four agencies. Music Shoppe lists Liverpool, Ian Thomas, Choya, Deja Vu, Sweet Blindness, Crack Of Dawn, Teen Angel and the Chevy III, and Funktion, as acts currently planning western tours. Many are already charted at western stations.

Similarly, Western bands such as Wind-slow, Teen Angel and the Rockin' Rebels, Zingo and Bowser Moon (all Bruce Allen acts), and Chilliwack, will be touring Ontario this summer.

Sunshine Hour's Gallant looks East with CBC-TV series

Making CBC-TV's summer Sunshine Hour show has co-host Tom Gallant thinking East again.

Sunshine Hour is the first one-hour variety series ever produced in Halifax. They taped nine shows, under producer-director Jack O'Neil, in 2½ weeks during the spring. Gallant is again visiting eastern centres the week of the show's June 18 premiere.

Gallant, originally from Campbelltown, N.B., enjoyed working with the East Coast resident musicians - Sunshine Hour's music consultant Skip Beckwith, music director

and keyboarder Paul Mason, George Bear, Tim Cahoon, Steve Rimer, Dave Helyer and Les Ault - on the series' 150 songs.


Gallant sings his current single, Let's Make Love, or another of his original compositions in each show and basically holds down the front-man host role. Co-host Gloria Kaye has the flashy role.

Gallant plans to work closely with Beckwith in the near future and will move back East as soon as possible.

Beckwith has secured rights from CBC for the soundtracks of the series shows. He and Gallant want to sweeten them a bit and

release 12 cuts, possibly six of Gallant's songs and six sung by Kaye, as a Sunshine Hour LP. Details will have to be worked out with Kaye's label, RCA.

Gallant feels there are enough good

musicians in the East, with new stepped-up CBC variety production in Halifax and the new recording studio in the area, more local talent can be enticed to come home and be part of a very lively music scene: something like Austin North.

Resigned to the journeyman, straight-man image he's getting in television work; Gallant has given up dreams of Toronto stardom - "I don't think it's necessary if I can't act like an ordinary human being" - and heading back to where he believes there's going to be a music boom, and where people still sing in kitchens - "That's the way it all started anyway."

Gallant is making a half-hour movie with director Bob Hutt in New Brunswick this summer. He'll be playing the lead role in a story he wrote, set in King's Landing, New Brunswick.

Daytime talk-music show set by CTV net for fall

CTV's afternoon talk variety show, The Alan Hamel Show, to debut next fall, will begin taping in Vancouver August 15. The show maintains booking offices in Los Angeles, Vancouver and Toronto.

This is the first major daytime talk-variety afternoon show produced by a Canadian network, and will be produced by Craig Tennis (who has been associated with the Johnny Carson Show for eight years) and directed by Robert Wilson (who has been with CJOH-TV Ottawa, CFTO-TV Toronto, and currently of BCTV in Vancouver).

The show, developed jointly by BCTV and the CTV network, will run each afternoon Monday through Friday, available to the network's 15 affiliates, three supplementary affiliates and more than 170 re-broadcasting stations.

Hamel has hosted 13 specials and series for CBC as well as shows on all three U.S. networks.

The family hour

Court could cool Canadian TV U.S. welcome

Independent TV producers and writers in the U.S. are seeking to break down the restriction of prime-time TV's "family hour" -- really two hours (7-9:00 pm), when stations are required, by FCC and NAB codes, to air programmes suitable for family viewing -- and the outcome will have an effect on Canadian TV productions, especially variety shows.

The family hour came about through a series of National Association of Broadcasters (U.S.) and the U.S. Federal Communications Commission policies, beginning when the FCC ruled that network programming of owned and operated and affiliate stations could not begin until 8:00 pm.

Local stations had to find their own programming for the 7:00 to 8:00 pm slot, creating a large market for syndicated, non-network programming, a market receptive to Canadian productions.

The FCC (backed by the U.S. congress) later ruled that the 8:00-9:00 pm slot had to be filled by programs suitable for families, and the NAB followed with its own code, marking the 7:00-8:00 slot likewise.

The first family hour is filled with non-network game shows, situation comedies, re-runs, and variety. The network family hour is dominated by comedy and variety

programming.

Canadian variety shows aired at 9:00 pm or later, or before 8:00 pm, as a rule don't compete with U.S. network variety. Some Canadian variety, CTV's Bobby Vinton or David Steinberg shows or CBC's Wolfman Jack show, find markets for syndication for the first family hour. Some adult Canadian TV productions, such as CTV's Police Surgeon (co-produced with a U.S. firm) were killed when the NAB code made them unsuitable for U.S. syndication in the non-network time slot. (See RPM, May 29).

Recently, Los Angeles Federal Court proceedings were suspended after five weeks of testimony by plaintiffs Tandem Productions (which produces *All In The Family*, a show banished from the family hour) and the Writers Guild of America, and defendants CBS, NBC, ABC, NAB and the FCC.

The basic line of argument against the family hour policies is that, yes, violence on the screen should be forbidden, but profanity and sexual content restrictions were too harsh. Tandem added that *All In The Family* was booted to the post-9:00 slot because of its candid treatment of controversial issues.

The outcome of the trial, of course, won't make or break Canadian TV pro-

duction, or even syndication to the U.S., but it will colour it.

CTV's Philip Wedge, responsible for the net's buying and selling shows, told RPM that any regulations here or in the U.S. will effect possible markets, as well as what is available to buy from the U.S.

CBC and CTV will not change their plans to boost television variety and music, but the softening of the U.S. family hour regs may cause less demand there for Canadian-produced variety and, if not changing star-heavy programming plans, at least cut down on possible income the two nets and Canadian independent producers could bring home.

TV people expect family-hour regulations of some sort in Canada soon. The Ontario commission on violence in the media is certain to make recommendations along these lines in its final report. The CRTC has already held seminars on the subject and may announce hearings or outlines of policies in the near future.

In any case, the U.S. experience has shown that family hour policies bear good fruit for television music and variety shows.

New NB concert arena opens with August date

The Fredericton Campus of the University of New Brunswick is unveiling the concert capacity of its new 6500 seat arena with an August 7 concert headlining Roy Clark and Lynn Anderson, promoted by CSL.

The new centre, which seats 4,000 for sports events and 6500 for stage concerts, offers parking for 2000 cars and a bus shuttle service between downtown Fredericton and the arena, formally called the Aitken University Centre.

Centre director Donald Sedgewick is hopeful the centre will become a regular stop for big-name touring acts to supplement its University and athletic functions.

The arena was opened last month with ceremonies for the class of '76, followed by a benefit performance by UNB grad Anne Murray.

The arena's facilities include power, ample for rock concerts (a full-house reverberation time of two seconds), Rinkex ice covering, and a media-press centre.



Slic Brothers

Designers to the Canadian music industry

"Del Monte peaches will spend more money on colour separation than Canadian record companies will spend on packaging," explained Peter Francey, co-owner of Toronto's Slic Bros. graphic designers, currently making overtures to advertising

agencies for illustration and product design work, "Because we have to seek other areas, besides the music industry, for a matter of survival.

"In comparison to what's happening in graphic design with companies such as Coca-Cola, 7-Up etc., the entertainment industry should have the best graphics around," he said. "I just can't see any excuse for bad jacket designs.

"Maybe, this industry lacks imagination, due to a 'Canadian conservatism'."

Peter Francey and partner Clark Spencer formed Magic Management in 1970, representing non-recording acts, from their London, Ontario offices.

As the co-op relocated in Toronto, Francey and Spencer discovered a "lack of

professional promotion" in the local music industry, concluding hardsell management techniques, beggared in comparison to an "effective promotion that will sell a group."

Attempting to branch company activities into logo design, posters and press kits, Francey contacted his cousin John Martin, Ontario College Of Art graduate, residing in Vancouver. Martin was called to Toronto and assigned to design promotional material for Chris Kearney, Truck and the Good Brothers.

"People began to call us, continually asking where we had our logos done," Francey said, which led to the formation of Slic Brothers ("merely a catchy name") in 1973.

GRT Records Canada became Slic Bros. initial clients:


George Elms, manager of the Greaseball Boogie band, assigned Slic to design a circa 1950's "Wild One" roughneck image for the band's debut LP cover, plus a "Hell's Angel" type skull logo; the company designed flautist Moe Koffman's Master Session LP cover; GRT's American-designed logo was revamped with buff tone colours, "imaging a winged musical note"; Slic also handled design for GRT's trade advertising and the internal GRT "hypesheet", Outbreak.

Although "it took quite a while to convince the record companies of the necessity of proper graphic representation," Francey said, Slic approached the heavyweights, receiving their co-operation for album graphics and promo material, including Stampeders From The Fire LP cover (Quality), promo kits for Keith Hampshire (A&M) and LP cover design for Gary and Dave, Thundermug and Jay Telfer (Axe).

January 1975, with hundreds of displays

and mailing pieces to their credit, Francey dropped his Magic Management, plunging headlong into "graphic design, illustration and image making" with Slic.

Currently, over 100 projects for GRT and 200 for Columbia have been docketed, as well as recent album cover design for Cliff Edwards (A&M), Susan Jacks, Chilliwack (Casino), Sweet Blindness (Quality),



Slic Brothers' Peter Francey.


and Moe Koffman Live, Brutus (GRT).

"But," Francey insists, "I've never heard of a budget exceeding \$3,000 in Canada for graphic packaging. Album graphics have just not been exploited here, in the way that England (Roger Deen for WEA's Yes covers) and the U.S. (Milton Glazer for Columbia's Dylan covers) have done it."

"The big problem is that, what little money there is, is not being wisely spent."

Francey and Slic Bros. staff (artists, John Martin, John Hanna, Jennette Hanna, David Wyman, photographer Gerrard Gentil, and project co-ordinator Clark Spencer) have parlayed their collective talents into three Juno nominations (1975) for best LP graphics, and a "service publication that acknowledges Toronto as the entertainment capital of Canada," Night Out Magazine.

"At this point we're finally making a living," Francey said, and slow but sure, the image of Canada's LP graphics is starting to breathe with a life of its own.

Bluegrass - a way of life for Carlisle Festival



An estimated twenty thousand people spent a sunny weekend camping in Carlisle, Ontario to attend the fourth annual Bluegrass Canada Festival, June 4, 5, 6.

Festival producer Don Bird remembers the first one in 1973 that attracted only 2,000 people.

"Back then we had to explain to the people what bluegrass music was," said Bird.

The festival is held every year on the

first weekend in June on a 100-acre private campground in Carlisle, 10 miles north of Hamilton.

Carl Storey, a 30-year veteran bluegrass musician from North Carolina and a featured performer at Carlisle called the Canadian festival "the biggest and best in the world."

Bird, an on-air personality at CKGL-FM in Kitchener, confirmed that Carlisle is the largest bluegrass festival on the North American continent and the largest music festival, of any kind, in Canada.

Bird said the idea to hold such a festival in southern Ontario initially came from a U.S. promoter who thought it would go over big up here.

"Bluegrass music is a growing thing. There were 350 bluegrass festivals (in Canada and the U.S.) in 1975," added Bird.


The headline acts at Carlisle included traditional U.S. acts such as the legendary Ralph Stanley, Storey and Jimmy Martin and the Sunshine Mountain Boys. The featured Canadian performers were The Good Brothers, Dixie Flyers and the Humber River Valley Boys.

"The greatest satisfaction to me is turning people on to the music that I have loved for years. Bluegrass is honest music.

There are no gimmicks - the artists have to make it on their music talent alone," said Bird.

Square dancing, workshops and an amateur bluegrass band contest were also held during the weekend. Streets and Hills, from Hamilton won the band contest.

Bird has organized at least two other bluegrass events this summer. They include a two-day bluegrass festival July 16, 17 in Waterford, Ontario and the World Championship five-string Banjo Contest and Festival on August 28, 29, also at Carlisle.



The Programmers

Disc librarians don't just stack 'em

The category of Most Cooperative Radio Record Library Staff at the RPM Music Industry Awards may have gotten a lot of people wondering exactly what it is that goes on in a radio station library.

At CHUM, the station that won the award, Nancy Krant is in charge of keeping tabs on and storing the music that comes in. She meets with the promo reps, and gives her opinion on the material they bring in

Once a week he selects the new adds; sometimes with the help from program director Barry Nesbitt. Winters points out that radio people don't just sit back and wait for reps to come to them. Someone has to go to industry events, receptions and showcases. And in this case again, it's usually Winters.

Sheila Conner is music director at CKFM one of Toronto's MOR stations. Again, she is the one who actually listens to everything

that comes into the station from the record companies, and anything that's played between 6AM and when Carl Banas signs on at 8PM (he chooses his own music) has to be given the nod by Conner. She explained however, that before the record is played, it must be catalogued and filed. CKFM receives more LPs than any other similar type station (except progressive FM) about 15 on the average with about 30 singles each week.

U.S. radio profit wave floods FCC licence department


U.S. trade magazine Broadcasting recently reported great gains in 1975 profits for U.S. radio broadcast firms while TV broadcasting profits fell. In the same issue, the magazine reported a flood of AM and FM licence applications at the U.S. FCC, forcing the commission to invoke a six-month moratorium on licence seekers.

Total U.S. radio broadcast net revenues were \$118,449,000 (gross \$143,450,000) with expenses tagged at \$109,532,000, 13.5 per cent and 7.3 per cent gains over 1974 respectively.

The network radio chains showed a

loss of \$2.5 million, down from the \$6.1 million loss of 1974. Network owned and operated stations, on the other hand, showed a 35.7 per cent increase in profits to \$11.4 million. TV profits, down 5 per cent from 1974, were \$314.2 million.

With the healthy radio market, the FCC reports an increase of 600 per cent in the number of AM and FM licence applications. The commission will not receive applications until January 1, 1977. By then, they hope to have processed through a backlog of more than 250 current AM applications and more than 450 for FM outlets.

at the weekly music meetings. Roger Ashby, J. Robert Wood and Nancy decide, at those meetings, which records will be playlisted.

Ashby told RPM he figures the station receives as many as 100 discs a week, all of which must be listened to, evaluated, and filed away. Most records are kept for a period of time and then given away, Ashby said, but the hits are kept "forever."

Toronto's CKFH was the only country station nominated for the award. Music director Jack Winter told RPM that his station receives a greatly-varying number of discs every week, ranging roughly from 10-15 to four times as many. Perhaps the pace in country music is slightly less hectic than in contemporary, and Winter's finds the time to listen to the new releases when they come in every day, makes sure the library is kept up-to-date, and meets all the promo reps, who each come in about once a week.
