You can't upstage a talent - Don't even try!

Dating back to the early days of the legitimate stage, the great actresses of their day feared being "upstaged" and the strange paranoia has been brought up to date by rock groups at concerts.

The public knows little about the trite

and childish antics of many groups headlining rock shows, in their treatment of the lesser known act that opens the show.

There is a constant fear that the new group may upstage some of the abilities of the name groups and this in itself leaves the latter vulnerable to criticism.

Being the opening act has many hazards to begin with. The audience is impatient to see the headliners. They are late filing in and usually as the opening act goes on. They chatter and create bedlam - making life

miserable for the opening group.

Add to this the demands by many of the headliners that the lighting and sound provided for the opening act be substandard to that of the headliner, which casts a shadow of unprofessionalism on the headliner and even more serious is their lack of confidence as performers.

Reviewers might take a look at the treatment afforded the opening group, to judge the quality of the headliner. The media could do much to end this childishness that adds nothing to the entertainment aspect of a concert.

If the opening act can put on a better show, so be it. If the "creative" people of this industry really analyzed their positions in the business they would live with the theory that acts really don't compete. Each talent is a thing onto itself. There is only one of a kind in artists and groups. If there were two, the second would most certainly be an imitation.

On the other side of the coin, there are

name groups and artists who afford every opportunity to the opening act, knowing that they were once openers and remember how important it was to their careers. The state of the art demands that the industry grow by the influx of new and talented people and at any given time there were many acts making money in the industry and records aren't like anything else. That makes it necessary for the industry to adapt a very professional approach. It will sell records and that's the name of the game.

A good manager could also pave the way for better treatment of his group, by demanding and overseeing sound checks. Promoters should make every attempt to make the show an overall entertainment success by working with the lesser known acts, their managers and even harnessing the services of sound experts. It's tough enough to be the opening act, but to be "sound guinea pigs" as well, is demoralizing to the group and unprofessional for the promoter.

Quality and Right On pact distribution deal

Quality Records has signed a distribution deal with Right On! Records, a New York-based company specializing in disco product. The company was formed last fall,

and is headed by Bill Downs, President, and Dave Gilmartin, Director of A&R.

During the past year, Right On has charted singles by Sam Nesbit, Chris Bartley and the A.C. Soulful Company. Recent signings have included disco acts Dolly Gilmore, The Blade Family, Rozza Wine, and the original Adlibs, known for the Boy From New York City.

Through Quality in Canada and Buddah in the U.S., Quality's first servicing of the Right On label will be a special 12-inch disco pressing of Because of You, by the A.C. Soulful Company.

Yamaha bow Italian, Tokyo-cut disc here

Yamaha Audio has gone into the record production business with the limited Canadian distribution of an Italian-language MOR single. The song is Parigi A Volte Cosa Fa, performed by Italian songstress Gilda Guiliani.

The song was used in a series of TV commercials for Yamaha, which sponsored the World Popular Song Festival in Tokyo. As the song festival winner, Yamaha had decided to use a clip of Guiliani singing the song for promotion.

Riley & Compton bow "Image" operation

Another image-making company has opened in Toronto. Owned and operated by Colleen Riley and Jo Anne Compton, the firm's efforts "will be aimed at dealing with 'images' of companies or people who need public awareness."

The Promotion House/The Image Builders began operations May 10, and have already secured the account of Terry Christenson, formerly of Christenson, and managed by Mel Shaw Productions.

The two partners have both headed companies of their own in the management and promotion field for various musical and other interests.

Canadian & U.S. release for Guess Who single

RCA Canada and U.S. are apparently very high on the single release of Silver Bird from the Guess Who's album, The Way They Were. The single was produced in 1971 by Jack Richardson and was the last session cut by the group with Randy Bachman.

The Silver Bird single is a co-writing by Bachman and Burton Cummings and was released simultaneously in both countries.

In response to an apparent heavy demand, Yamaha Audio obtained "a few hundred" copies of the full recorded version of the song, produced in Tokyo on the Italian Seven Seas label, which they distributed to Canadian radio stations. The song was picked in RPM June 12. Pending a legitimate Canadian distribution deal, RPM is advised that copies of the song are available from Yamaha Audio shops or from John McGuinness of the Yamaha Audio branch in Winnipeg, 1330 Portage Ave, (204) 786-8901.

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New-look Stampeders off and running

The Stampeders were first on the RPM cover in 1965.

That year they played for free, outside of the Calgary Stampede Corral. This year, 20 charted singles and eight LPs later, they return to the Corral, a headlining, major rock attraction.

Only the now-defunct Guess Who have charted more hits in Canada than the Stamps.

Ten years ago this July, the then six-man group and manager Mel Shaw moved to Toronto in an old oil magnate's Cadillac and U-Haul trailer. The Stampeders, a trio since 1968 until recently, mixed the lean years with the good (mostly good), and now, after selling more than a million singles in Canada, their new seven-man group is going back out West in three trucks with a six-man road crew.

Shaw says it now costs \$5,000 a week, plus travel expenses, to keep the Stamps on the road.

Quality Records, who have been distributing Stampeders product (recorded on Shaw's Music World Creations label) since 1970, has declared June "Stampeders Month." They're conducting one of the most expensive Canadian campaigns ever for a Canadian group, reminiscent of their

recent, successful Kiss campaign, which put five Kiss LPs in the RPM Top 100.

Most of the Stamps product is still active. All the big singles are distributed as part of Quality's Golden Treasure Series and none of their eight albums have been deleted.

Quality, which in the past has been, especially by international standards, more of a conservative-minded record promoter, has budgeted \$15,000 for radio spot ads and created poster, tee-shirt and in-store displays in a big way.

With twenty hit singles behind them, the Stampeders have legitimately entered the realm of mass merchandised "20 Greatest Hits" record albums, and two television-

already had cuts on 18 K-Tel Canadian sampler albums.

Shaw is mostly concerned about what the big Best-Of sales will do to his group's active back album sales and will weigh offers carefully with Quality, who could make a lot of money from the mass merchandising campaign as well.

Shaw is convinced that the Stampeders have proven a label can make good money off a band of Canadian sales alone, and now is keen on Quality's efforts to invest some of those earnings into establishing the band in the U.S. through the label's new New York office.

Timing of releases and other problems have slowed Quality's U.S. efforts since last fall, but, with a few charted U.S. hits already, Shaw plans for the Stampeders to break big there, this fall.

By then, their next album will be released; one that shows the new, full, sax-backed sound of the hard rock group. He's booked a U.S. tour for September.

A fall-cut live LP is being considered.

Shaw observes that every Canadian act consistently-charted in the U.S. has been on the same label here as there. The Stampeders are on the Quality label in the U.S. (distributed by Private Stock). Shaw feels that the Quality U.S. system is working the kinks out.

A Canadian subsidiary here, Shaw explains, may earn \$50,000 from a Canadian group's hit product. To back a U.S. release the profits can be easily transferred to the parent's books. But for a group on a Canadian independent label, a new deal has to be made with a U.S. distributor, requiring them to put up the \$50,000 to launch a U.S. sales campaign.

Shaw appears more excited about his Stampeders now than ever before. "For

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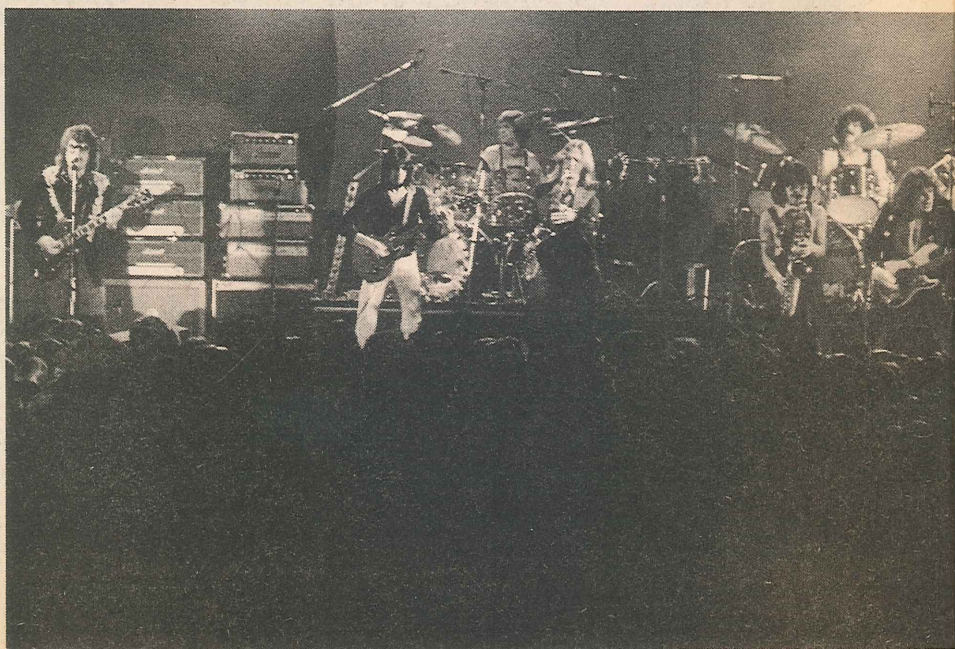

Canada's Colour Glossy King

Al Galbraith, the trade-dubbed "Glossy King" of Canada, has provided a slick picture of Canadian band representation for more than fifteen years.

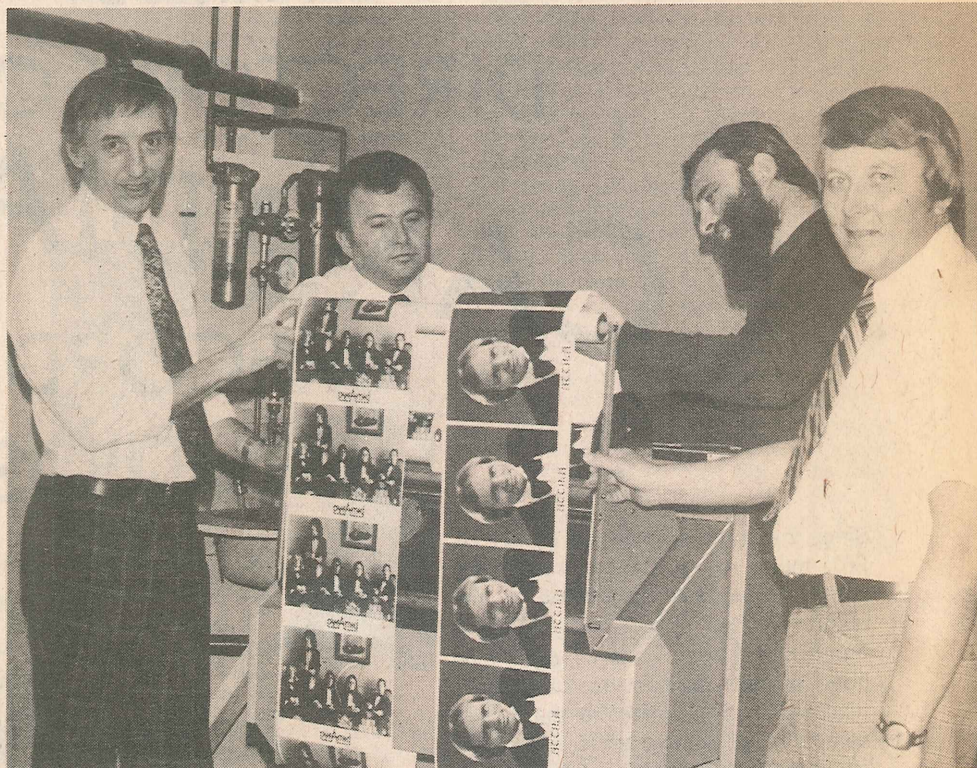
The "paying-through-the-nose" era of assigning studios to reproduce series of identical publicity shots, has been successfully phased out, due to Galbraith's company strides for professional and economical photo reproductions.

Currently, the Glossy King has branched

method of reproducing black and white glossy photos for PR and district mail promotion use. Previous glossy photo methods involved reproduction by high-priced studios, averaging costs at two dollars per shot. Galbraith retaliated, researched into the development of a processor (capable of dependable reproduction)

and began to run glossy prints at costs of less than half-dollar apiece.

Within a year, Galbraith's clientele swelled to impressive proportions (CBC, Pacific Western Airlines, Philco-Ford, Canadian General Electric) including thousands of Beatle-influenced musicians, desiring an economical means of circulating the face

into colour reproductions, "still in its infancy," he said.

The company's colour repros image an immaculate representation, retaining all details of original highlight and shadow, "and yet," Galbraith explained, "due to the constant advances being made, we're just beginning to break the surface."

Fall 1965, Al Galbraith and business partner, entered the arena of dry process duplicating, with a collective capital of less than one thousand dollars. In 1960, after his partner left the business to pursue a career in law, Galbraith attempted to gear company activities towards an inexpensive

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value of their act.

April 1974, two foot by three foot black and white photo posters were introduced. The success of the venture, prompted Galbraith's move to larger premises, (April 1975) to 420 Bathurst Street, Toronto. A new logo was unveiled, to coincide with the move: two capital "G's" back-to-back, with one "G" reversed in a "negative white", reflecting the concentration of Galbraith's dominance in photo reproduction. The Bathurst Street locale, doubled their workspace to 10,000 square feet. Another black and white automatic photo processor was installed, allowing efficient production workload and 48 hour service.

Shortly thereafter, Galbraith's "right-hand man" Gayle Gannon, "could see the need for colour photo reproduction, increasing at a very rapid rate." Galbraith concurred by installing automatic colour equipment, continually experimenting with new techniques for improvement of colour quality. The company had depended on photos or transparencies, but a method was devised to produce a copy negative, with laboratory assistance from Kodak Canada.

Sharp caption setting was the next

me," he says, "It's dealing with something brand new, it's not retreading." With four members added to the three Stampeders, the seven-man group is "a whole new show."

Changing from a three to a seven-man rock band, virtually overnight, may seem a little surprising, especially since there were six members when manager Mel Shaw formed the group some ten years ago. A diversity in musical tastes encouraged a trim-down to a trio and another contributing factor, of course, was the fact that it wasn't easy to make a living with a six-man group. Now however, they can afford to think seriously about expanding their sound and personnel.

The four new members are: second drummer Gibby LaCasse, guitarist Gary Scrutton and saxmen David Norris-Elye and Ian Kojima.

The original band members, bass man Ronnie King, drummer Kim Berly and guitarist Rich Dodson, are delighted with the new arrangement. "All of a sudden

there's a new interest," King told RPM. "There's new guys to relate to, on stage, and we're really able to open up, style-wise, now."

On their last tour, the band borrowed a brass section and were tagged as "the Tijuana Brass of rock". Saxophones obviously offer a sound, more in tune with the Stampeders' musical personality.

"The sax guys have had lots of experience with jazz and disco and can add a little funk to the band," continued King. "They're very enthusiastic on stage, they look good and they're really into the show."

The new band also allows for fuller reproduction of a few of their old songs including Sweet City Woman, a Dodson penning that really needs that banjo sound.

Another change in the group image is the amount of writing Ronnie King has been contributing. While much of their previous material (and many of their hits) was penned by Dodson, King has written five of the ten songs on their new album, including their last single, Playin' In The Band, which achieved number one status across

Europe and, after a 14 week run on the RPM 100' is only now beginning to descend as their new single, Sweet Love Bandit, is being shipped.

The Stampeders are well known in Europe where they capped a successful tour two years ago. King was particularly happy to return to his native Holland where he was able to converse with media people in their own tongue.

There's no letting up for the group, by any means. They're hoping that the expanded band will enable them to make further inroads into pop markets everywhere.

"We've been after more American Top 10 hits like Sweet City Woman, ever since that song happened," King told RPM, "as well as the international markets. We've got records out there and it's surprising to discover, every once in a while, charts from here and there showing that we're getting action in Australia or Japan". Their single, Hit The Road Jack, is currently Top 5 in Holland and Belgium.

Their new release, the upbeat Sweet Love Bandit, is calculated to sweep the international summer charts.

Jarrett showcased at Vancouver

On June 14, international jazz pianist Keith Jarrett performed a special presentation of his newest work at Vancouver's Queen Elizabeth Theatre, according to Polydor's Sali Murphy. The composition, entitled Arbour Zena, consists of three pieces, Runes, Solara March, and Mirrors. The ECM recording of the work is slated for June release.

Murphy told RPM that Jarrett, as on the album, was accompanied on stage by saxophonist Jan Garbarek and bassist Charlie Haden. Also featured for the presentation was a 30-piece string orchestra, comprised of members of the Seattle

Symphony and Vancouver's North Western String Quartet.

Keith Jarrett was one of the first improvisational jazz pianists to reach mass audiences, with albums such as the Solo Concerts and Koln Concerts. Selections from his last album, Lumines Sence, also recorded Garbarek, were also performed.

In reporting the special concert, Murphy cited Jarrett's "brilliant abilities as a performer and his unique talents as a composer," and remarked that "the Vancouver concert provided a rare opportunity to see this remarkable musician."

Charlottetown '76 stages 2 musicals

The Charlottetown Festival '76 features two original musicals to accompany its standard production of Anne of Green Gables. Gordon Pinsent's Rowdyman, with music by Cliff Jones and director Alan Lund and arranger John Fenwick's staging of By George, a musical review of the late George Gershwin.

Pinsent will play the starring role in his Rowdyman, as he did on the screen. The show opens the Festival June 28.

By George, intended to be a musical salute to the U.S. Bicentennial, features Charlottetown vet singers Rudy Webb, Cleone Duncan, Brian McKay and newcomers Mary Lou Collins and Sharry Flett.

Singing in Rowdyman will be Frank Moore, Deborah Templeton, George Merner, Collins and Duncan. Fenwick arranged the Cliff Jones compositions for this show as well as arranging Gershwin's classics into song and dance routines for By George.

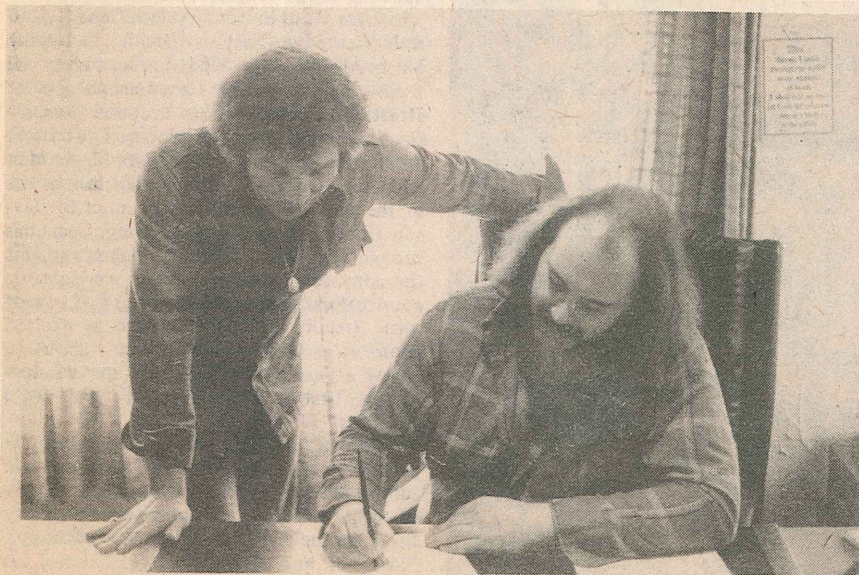

Galbraith breakthrough, perfected by the team of George Rehak and George Reichart. The company now offers various type styles from \$1 per word to \$3 per unit (up to four lines per unit), also pricing 8 by 10 colour reprints at 99 cents each, in lots of 100 (supplied from a negative).

September 1975, Galbraith initiated production of full-colour photo posters, beneficial to the industry for promoting artists at press receptions, concerts and functions that require an accurate "larger-than-life-true-to-life" representation. Three sizes, 20" by 24", 24" by 30", and 24" by 36", vary in price from \$15 to a high of \$23.

"Colour is currently taking a very large percentage of our business," Galbraith said.

The Galbraith Glossy King may soon be destined for the rank of Canada's Colour Glossy King.

CAN BASE - The house that Al built

Al Reusch is unique in Vancouver recording history because he had a recording studio built from the ground up. Competitors have bought existing buildings and then converted them into studios, which just 'ain't the same'. New ownership came in 1971 allowing Reusch to step down.

One of the survivors of that original group is Michael Flicker, still around and kicking some five years later. He recalls that one of the first decisions was to renovate the existing equipment. He was deployed to his native Los Angeles to shop around. Among other things, he was able to invest in

a tube board which had churned out endless hits for 'Studio A' of United Recorders. United were far more interested in transistor boards. This is a course that Flicker could have followed. Such boards are less expensive and more easily maintained. Tube boards are impractical. Still, steps were taken by Flicker to offset this. A computerized air conditioner prevents overheating of the tubes. They are cooled and maintained at a constant temperature.

Is it worth the bother? "There are two of its kind in the world. Al Green's producer owns the other one in Macon Georgia".

The tube board does have an advantage for rock and roll music. The reasons for this were given in Audio Engineer magazine, 'Tube Versus Solid State-Is There A Difference?'

Today, Can Base studio rents for \$90 per hour (recording) and \$75 per hour (mixing). As well as the board, there is an Ampex MM1000 sixteen track with a two track Scully for mixdown. An enormous amount of outboard equipment has been built, including six Richmond sound design equalizers with twenty selectable frequencies. Nevertheless, "It's not how much gear you've got but rather how good your monitoring system is. There are certain industry standards that have to be met." In the trade, these are Mastering Lab System and Westlake Audio which both base on the JBL monitor. Thus, an artist can walk into any studio with his tapes and compare them with no difference in the quality of sound.

Also of special interest is the Fairchild 602 Conan treble limiter. This device helps to limit the amount of sibilance in a vocal track. Flicker explained that when you hear an 's' or 'sh' on vocals, you are listening to sibilance. He doesn't think it deters record buyers and sees it as more of a fetish for technicians. "The worst distorted record I've ever been involved with has been 'Seasons In The Sun'."

Until the formation of Mushroom Records in 1974, Can Base was most recognized as home base for their number one client, Terry Jacks. He still records there, but Mushroom is now involved with creating their own hits. The new company has opted for independent distribution in Canada and as of February 15, in the United States as well. Eight promotion men have been hired in major American areas and join Glen Gore Smith (Western Canada) and Bob Vanderlip (Eastern Canada) in hyping Mushroom product. What brought about all these moves was the Canadian success of Heart. The company has dropped over six figures on the group, producing Dreamboat Annie and the two hits therein, Magic Man and Crazy On You. Although Mushroom has in the past simmered with product by Jayson Hoover, Songbird and Spring, Heart has brought the most reaction. Flicker explains the approach to America: "We were getting good offers from the States but not one of them (record companies) were as excited about it as we were. We weren't about to throw a year of our time out the window to the first major that said, 'yeah we'll sign them'."

With Heart, Flicker moved from engineer to status as a fully fledged producer. He admires Richard Podolor who is also reported to have been an early influence on Terry Jacks (in the days before the Poppy Family). Flicker is not of the Randy Bachman 'no frills' production school, but he respects what BTO has accomplished. This must include Down To The Line which was recorded at Can Base. Heart is a rock band. Flicker is a self-described "builder", not afraid to

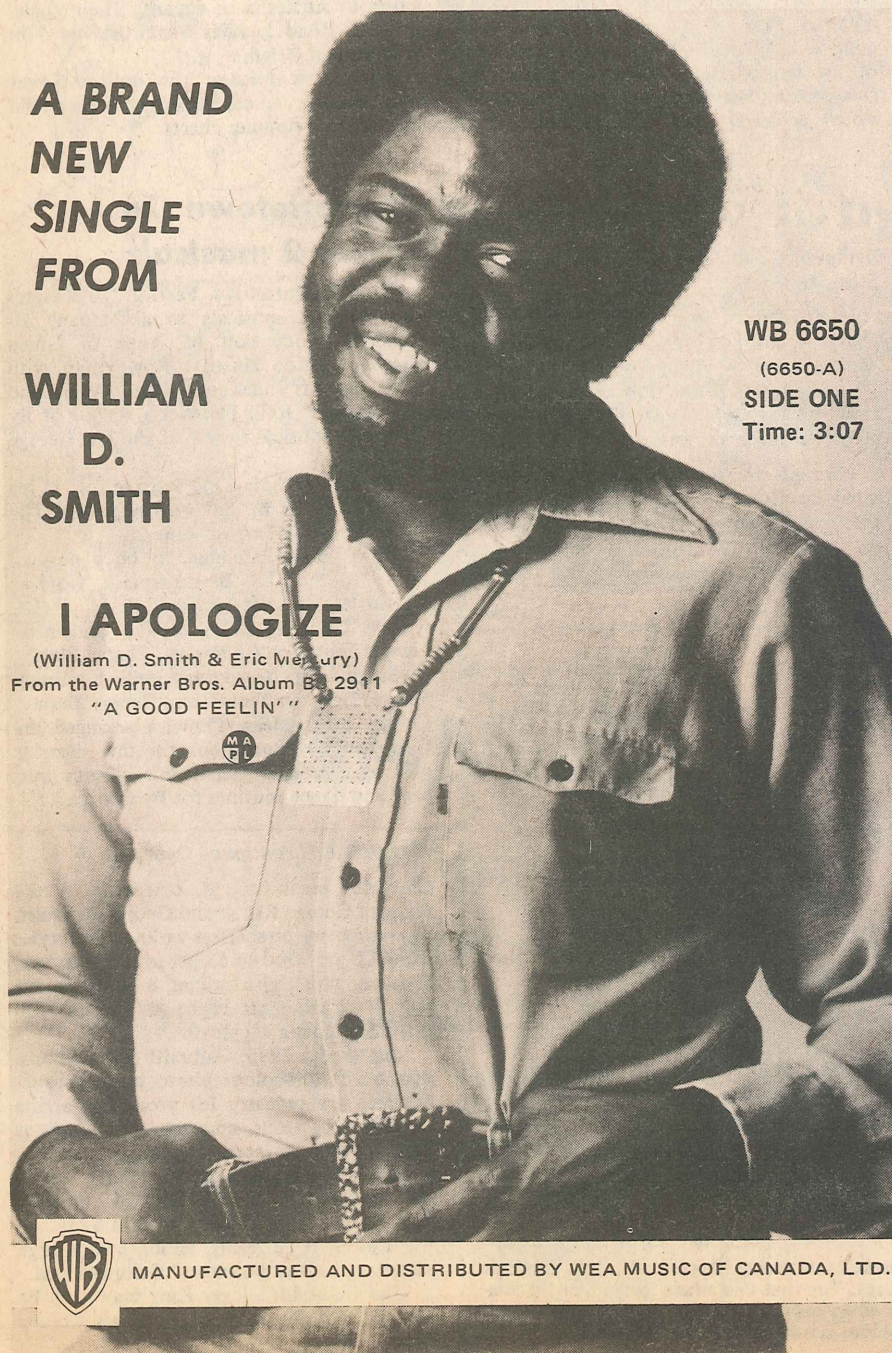

SPRINGFIELD

The vibes have been strong around the Springfield Sound Studios, Canada's newest sound recording facility just a few miles from London, Ontario. Brian Ferriman, president of the complex, reports much interest in the studio's 16-track Studer-MCI operation. In for a look, resulting in a week of laying tracks was Choya, who have just had a good run up the RPM 100 with their single, Linda Write Me A Letter. Condor's Lonnie Salazar dropped by with Blake Emmons to do up a couple of sides for Burton and Honeyman. Condor's Bob Spooner spent a bit of time producing a couple of sides for Eastwind's Johnny Burke. Dave Bradstreet completed taping Renaissance, which recently won him a BMI Award. Thunderbird's Southern Ontario farm boy, Roger Quick is now well into his next album, using members of Eastwind as backup. Album dates have been firmed for the Parish Family, Busker, and the Jennifer Sterling Quartet, with single sessions pencilled in for Homespun, North, Boojum and Merl Morgan. Commercial work is making up the daily work load as well with London's The Jingle People booking time.

EDMONTON

The "sun months" are shaping up to be just as busy as the "snow months" for Sundown Recorders. June started off with sessions for Hammersmith, engineered by Jim Gaines with Dan Lowe doing the production for Polydor. Gaines also completed a single for Steve Miller. Ray Pettinger looked east and found Sundown and arranged for a Casino session for Foreman and Young. Gaye Delorme's production of Peter Matheson's new single had the final mix looked after by Duane Scott. Wes Dakus working on an album session for Mavis McCauley and R. Harlan Smith is tidying up his album sessions for Jimmy Arthur Orde and Larry Gustafson. A single for each will be released on the Royalty label. Also completing sessions were accordion impresario Edward Walden, his first solo album, and Norman Mitchell. Commercial activity has been centred around Dennis Ferby's Canadian Concepts.

Disco and Country set for CBC's Soundsgood

Producer Jim McKenna has scheduled and booked guests for the second of two hour-long Canadian music shows in CBC's Soundsgood series. He's taping a country show June 29 (CBC Toronto's studio 7) with Carroll Baker, Tim Daniels, Prairie Oyster and 12-year-old Mary Lou Del Gatto, from Oshawa, who sings country music in Italian.

On July 2 they're taping a disco hour with Columbia's Crack of Dawn, rhythmic dance group Soul Express and, possibly, headliner LaBelle.

There are tickets available for the live sessions from CBC audience relations, 925-3311, ex. 4835.

Instant RPM 100 berth for new Beach Boys disc

No sooner had WEA (Warner/Reprise) released the new Beach Boys' single, Rock and Roll Music, prior play by Canadian radio stations had guaranteed the single a berth on the RPM 100.

Among the first Canadian stations to realize the potential, according to RPM's Hitmakers of June 12, were CKLG Vancouver's Gary Russell and H. Hart Kirch of CJME Regina. The single, for the week of June 26, has jumped into the No. 84 position.

Written by Chuck Berry who is credited with co-writing the group's Surfin' U.S.A., Rock and Roll Music will be included on the Beach Boys' new album, produced by the group's leader, Brian Wilson. There will

be 15 songs on the album, entitled, Fifteen Big Ones, which will coincide with the group's 15th anniversary. Included on the set will be A Casual Look, popularized by the Six Teens, Come Go With Me, a past hit from the Del-Vikings, Fats Domino's Blueberry Hill and several new songs written by brothers Brian, Carl and Dennis and other group members Mike Love and Alan Jardine. One cut features vocal arrangements by Daryl Dragon - the Captain of Captain & Tennille.

A tour of major U.S. centres is now being firmed with a couple of Canadian dates to be included. Dates firmed are Edmonton's Klondike Days July 21st and Toronto's CNE Sept. 4.

\$ for charity from Gilbert's Capitol disc

It was reported in RPM (June 19, 1976) that the Capitol single release, No Charge, by CHUM talk show personality, John Gilbert, had enjoyed sales success because of "a very respectable berth on CHUM's chart." Warren Cosford, production manager at CHUM, pointed out to RPM that the Gilbert record had never been charted nor playlisted at CHUM or any of the chain's stations.

Cosford also revealed that the Gilbert version of the famous Howard composition, was actually produced at RCA's Toronto studios in November of last year. The single was held back for release until April 1st of this year for its debut airing on the Gilbert show. The initial airing and further plays also added to the listener draw to Gilbert's morning show during the build up to the spring BBM. The record was aired regularly on the Gilbert show and occasionally on Terry Steele's afternoon shift.

Record sales, at press time, have sur-

passed the 55,000 units sold mark, the bulk of sales being in the Toronto area. Profits realized go to the CHUM Charitable Foundation, a unique organization that supplies much comfort to the less fortunate; one example being the all expense paid trip of a young Toronto resident to see Disney World - a dying wish.

The other version of No Charge, also a two part Cancon production, was released on the RCA label by J.J. Barrie. The single showed early indications of radio and sales action, particularly with MOR programmers, but became a chart casualty (May 8) after only two weeks on the RPM MOR Playlist. The Barrie single however, was released in the U.K. and went on to become a top five item, chalking up sales of more than half a million units.

It should be pointed up that the Gilbert version gained a No. 55 berth on the RPM 100, after eight weeks, which is based on sales and popularity at the radio level.

Added is the sound of brass, hinting the kind of favours we can expect from the new expanded ex-Calgarians. As well, bass player Ronnie King has penned half the album, showing a new concentration of efforts in song-writing from him and bringing out a new side to the band.

Playin' In The Band is included on this set and it's a King composition. The horns are also heard on another King song, Sweet Love Bandit, which has been tagged as their next single. Sally Ann is also a good indication of the things to come from the toast of Holland, Ronnie King.

Drummer Kim Berly is represented on the album with his song, Let It Begin, which features added percussion by Gibby LaCasse, who has become the band's second drummer. Berly is currently enjoying a solo release of Blue Eyed Woman, which, unfortunately isn't included on this album.

Rich Dodson, the anchor writer for the group, remains consistent and has provided four items this time round. All Night has the AM single sound that he's become accustomed to writing by now; San Diego is a good rocker; and C'est La Vie deserves a listen as well.

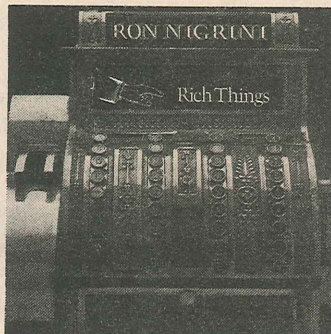

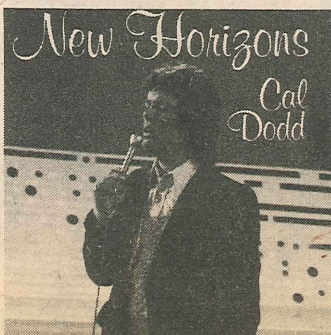

GRT's Liz Braun reports that Bobby Vinton was back in town at the start of this month to promote his single, *Save All Your Kisses For Me*, from an album that should be out by the end of the summer. Accompanied by Liz, Jeff Burns, and manager Bob Morgan, Vinton visited with Sheila Conner at CKFM, Art Collins at CFRB, Jim Paulson at CHFI, and Peter McGarvie at CKEY. Vinton recently finished taping 12 weeks for his show at the CFTO studios.

Phonodisc's Martin Young tells us their Pye-label hit, *Save Your Kisses*, sung by the Brotherhood of Man, has over 50 stations playing it in Canada. The record, which

topped the Eurodisc song contest, has been an international hit, topping the British and French charts and charted in Holland. It's now breaking into the top 50 in the U.S. trades and last week appeared on RPM's 100. Pye has some competition with a recent Bobby Vinton cover of the song and *Quality* is running with a cover by the Nigel Brooks Singers.

London's national promotion manager, Gary Chalmers, dropped by the office with a couple of surprises. Two budget albums (\$3.98) *The World of Susan Jacks* and *The Poppy Family and The World of Terry Jacks* and *The Poppy Family* - two solid gold packages for Canadian programmers. Terry Jacks could have another Seasons with his single release of *In My Father's Footsteps*, already being picked up by every major radio station in Canada. Gary was also high

on the new single release of *Gimme Love*, culled from April Wine's hot *Aquarius* LP.

Birgitta Graham has exited RCA to set up her own publishing and production company. The new company - a joint venture with Prakash John, a well-known Toronto bassist (Mandala and Bush) has worked the last couple of years as a sideman for Lou Reed and Alice Cooper. The new firm will fly the banner, *The Graham-John Music Co.* located at 42 Brahm Avenue in Willowdale.

RCA and Holeinone Records have just signed a manufacturing and distribution agreement. Initial release will be two comedy albums from Don Ast of Edmonton. He records under the name of Nestor Pistor.

Dave Nicol, who received the kiss of death by winning a Juno Award (his label dropped him) is back in the news. This unique Canadian folk talent will be playing Bruegal's (a Toronto folk club) the last two weeks in July. Labels looking for one hell of a talent should contact Nicol through the John Medland Agency, 11 Park Manor Drive in Toronto.

Cape Breton miners our first in China

Canadian music has roots in the mines, mills and factories of Canada at least as deep as in the beer halls, stages and recording studios. Waterloo Music has recorded two LPs by a chorus of Cape Breton Miners, Men of The Deeps, who are now the first Canadian music group to tour Communist China.

The group left Canada with very little fanfare in early June; Chinese authorities denied visas to media and press people who were to travel with the group. They will return through Japan where they may sing on NHK, the Japanese TV network.

Men of the Deeps is a group of working miners, full-time employees of the Cape

Quality has new service for spot, theme music

The Quality publishing group, under Bill Kearns, have produced a set of records of Canadian music suitable for broadcast commercial and theme spots available to radio stations on a subscription basis; it's called Quality BITS (beds, intros, themes, strings). The package includes almost 100 themes, each edited into 60, 30 and 10

second spots.

Each radio station's monthly subscription rates are equal to the cost of its prime-time commercial time rate for one 60-second announcement.

Kearns told RPM that 12 stations have already subscribed to the service after a preliminary mailing, all of them in the West.

The music, created by Ralph Harding of Vancouver's Ralcon Ltd., will be contained on 10 albums, six of which have already been produced.

Quality jumped to produce the package in view of the impending CRTC regulations to up the amount of Canadian-produced music in commercials and other radio spots.

Breton Development Corporation, which has granted paid leaves of absence to the singers during their current tour.

Waterloo VP William Brubacher told RPM that there will be more coverage of the trip when the chorus returns to Vancouver, with a scheduled concert and TV interviews there.

embellish songs with horns and synthesizers. The two parties got along very well though and Heart was allowed considerable artistic freedom. "I don't think my job is anything more than that of a translator. I take Heart live and create that same excitement on record. There are things that can be done to hold the listener's attention. Some tunes need more than guitar, bass and drums to create the emotion."

All in all, the studio Al Reusch built has become headquarters for an aggressive record company, scrambling for the top with talent and sheer audacity. (A typical quote: "We exist because people told us we couldn't do it.") At present the financial bosses are ex-MP Hunter Vogl and his sons Walter and Richard, known corporately as Merrill Enterprises. Flicker handles the studio, A&R and publishing. Engineers are Keith Stein and Rolf Henneman. Geraldine Danish manages studio and company traffic. Michael Flicker gets in the last word, "We're our own bosses, and if something goes wrong, it's our fault."

Most recent Terry Jacks' accomplishment at Can-Base is his latest Goldfish single In My Father's Footsteps. Early reports indicate this single as having the same potential as his Seasons In The Sun single which has sold almost 10 million copies.

Hit string gives Lee Roy pull

Lee Roy has finally strung a line of hits long enough to be really serious about a healthy recording career.

His new RCA LP, Lee Roy, (his third on the label) shows this well; it includes four singles the Alberta-born country singer has already charted on the RPM Country Playlist over the past 20 months. With RCA planning to release one, maybe two, more singles from it, the LP may be a very rare five or six-hit deck.

That's heavy hitting, especially considering that three of these good-airplay-style songs were written by Lee Roy: his new Balzac Boogie (featuring some of his own banjo work), Lonely Willow, and Orphan Princess. Also on the LP are his recent hits: Everything I Know About Cheatin', and Mathew.

His new solid base in vinyl has led Lee Roy to concentrate on his recording career.

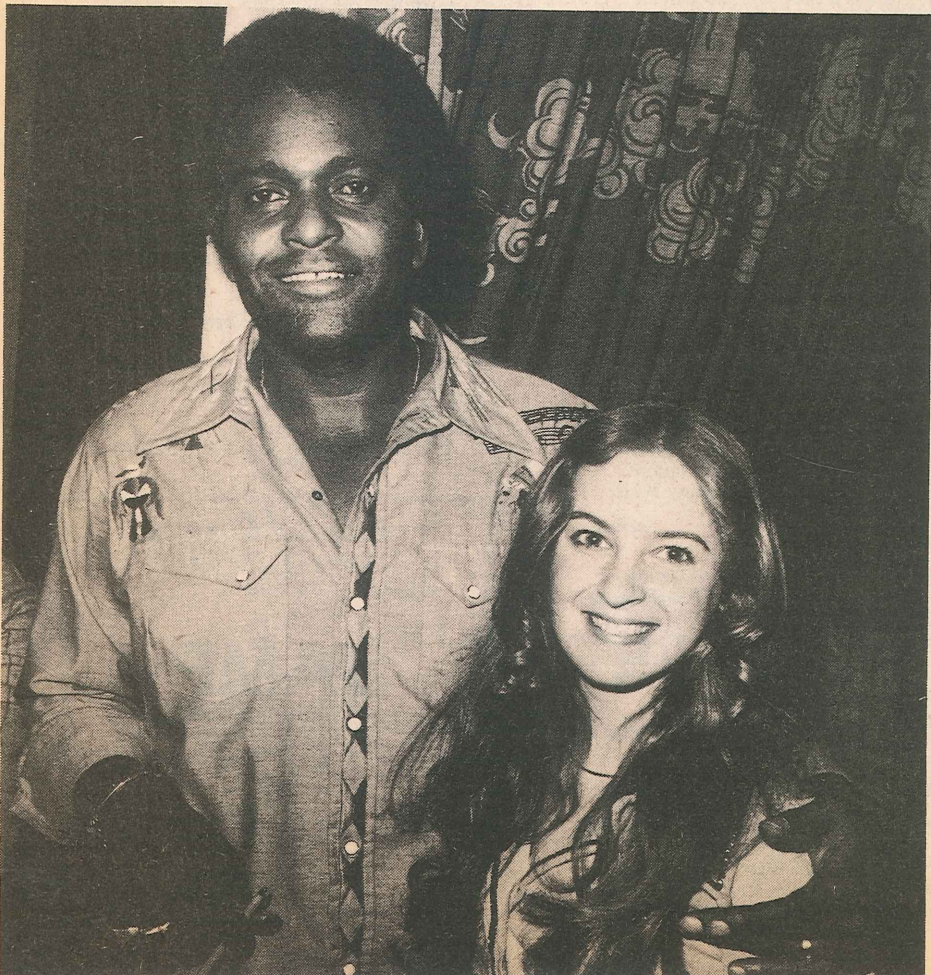
For the past year he's been performing with Broadland artist Donna Ramsay, his wife, as a duet, with and without a backup band. Now, they both feel it's best for them to each play solo to follow their own hits. (Ramsay's Familiar Old Way was a recent RPM pick).

However, they don't rule out working something out between their respective labels to cut a few songs together. They do well, both coming from old-time country music backgrounds and knowing how to sing first second and third harmonies is second nature.

They'll make a last run together, for the time being, with a full band in Lethbridge during Stampede week in July.
