

Supergroup debuts in Canada

Have you ever experienced something and felt as if you had seen it all before? That's called *deja vu*.

Deja Vu is also the name of a new "supergroup" of Canadian musicians, the likes of which, we're told, we've never seen before.

The group was put together in New York by Columbia Artists Management (RPM February 28, April 3) but RPM has learned that *Deja Vu* will break in up here.

Unofficial reports say that CAM, responsible for the careers of Three Dog Night, Grand Funk and Isaac Hayes, invested \$3 million into the group, including the cost of the unpublicised studio sessions to produce the group's debut LP to be released by Capitol in May.

Capitol personnel up here have been briefed on the group but remain tight-lipped about the label's plans and Grant Spence, on the management side, has been unavailable for any specific details.

The group is playing a private showcase performance in Toronto April 15. Nothing has been finalized about Canadian booking responsibilities. *Deja Vu* is booked by American Talent International in the U.S.

Deja Vu personnel are vocalist Paul Gordon, Cal Dodd and Bob Bonnell and musicians Terry Wilkins, Wally

Cameron, John Sheard and Joah McKane.

Bonnell was with a group called Cherry and Dodd, now signed to Rising Records, released his last records with RCA. He signed with the group after leaving the Broadway cast of Cliff Jones' *Rockabye Hamlet* in February.

Spence is working closely with Skip Prokop, who produced the debut LP with Jimmy Ienner. Spence and Prokop also manage Bob McBride whose band included Gordon and Sheard.

Laura Nyro plays Massey with Ellen McIlwaine

Laura Nyro packed Massey Hall (April 7) and put on the concert to show she deserved it. But Canadian Ellen McIlwaine, the unbilled opener, put on the surprise performance of the night.

Her singing (both a capella and with her guitar) and guitar playing (she even tuned it like a sitar and played a tribute to Ravi Shanker) delighted and dazzled the assembled Nyro fans.

Nyro, with a fine eight member backup, played songs her way, but none of them less than well and some of them great.

Shoppe inks Downchild, Thomas

Music Shoppe has signed exclusive booking contracts with GRT's Downchild Blues Band and GRT's Ian Thomas.

Music Shoppe's Ron Scribner said of Downchild, "We feel that by the end of 1976 or early in 1977, Downchild will emerge as a popular act in the United States." Downchild's Ready To Go LP, nominated for a

Juno for its graphics, is their most successful yet. Their new single, One More Chance, will be out soon.

The Ian Thomas Band, garnering acclaim for the Calabash LP, signed a three-year deal with Music Shoppe at Toronto's Gasworks Tavern. The Ian Thomas Band has skedded June 21 as the first date of a Western Canadian tour which will run to July.

\$\$ for U.K. labels for U.S. disc meet

British Record companies will get subsidies to participate in Musexpo '76 in New Orleans next September.

Musexpo spokesman Roddy Shashoua was quoted in Variety reporting that the British Board of Trade will cover about 90% of booth costs and up to 50% of two round trip tickets between Britain and New Orleans.

Shashoua set up Musexpo, which was held in Las Vegas last year, to be the U.S. version of the MIDEM meet at Cannes.

New Cancon, Wings in Capitol spring

Capitol EMI (Canada) has new LPs by Sylvia Tyson and Gene MacLellan as well as singles by Larry Evoy and Peter Foldy ready for release.

The LPs are still untitled and Capitol A&R are selecting singles from a number of recently recorded Evoy and Fauldy cuts as well.

Tickets have gone on sale for Paul McCartney and Wings' Toronto concert on May 9. This is the first confirmed date in their North American tour, which was recently postponed one month. If it is their premiere on this continent, local Capitol promo will have to deal with press from all over Canada and the U.S.

As the Wings fly here, CBC radio and TV tapes of Anne Murray, Suzanne Stevens and Maneige cross their path en route to the BBC. The BBC is sampling various taped performances by these artists with a mind to future broadcast productions.

Harris in L.A. for talks

B.C.'s Kenny Harris of Hoadley House Music (BMI), Pyramid Records and Reel Productions, will be in Los Angeles April 26-30 for talks with record companies about his roster of artists.

Iceland's top singer-composer Gunnar Pordarson, will be a major priority in Harris' speculative dealings.

Toronto tribute for Paul Robeson

Paul Robeson will be honoured April 25, at Toronto's Harbord Collegiate, with a program of acting, dance and music. Among those involved are Charles Jordan, Beverly Glen-Copeland, Vera Cudjoe, Jim Burt, and Arden Bess and the Jewish Folk Choir.

\$30,000 for new Olympic song

The Montreal Olympics Organizing Committee (COJO) opened a contest to select an official Olympic song. The winning song will be debuted at the internationally-broadcasted Olympic closing ceremonies this summer.

A song COJO previously picked for the games, by Claude Lacombe and sung by Rene Simard, is now only the "official song of welcome," following criticism by music industry professionals and broadcasters.

The committee will award \$1,000 to each of 10 contest finalists plus another \$20,000 to the winner. Each of the songs selected as finalists, to be announced at the end of June, will be part of musical programs in the various locations the games are held.

Eligible composers must be Canadian, members of a recognized songwriters society and represented by a publisher who is a member of CAPAC or BMI.

The songs, which can be in French or English, and must be new, original compositions, must be submitted on mono, 15 ips tapes with a voice accompanied by three to five musical instruments, suitable for broadcast. COJO will share the studio costs of tape production.

There is no limit on the number of songs a writer or publisher may enter. Twenty-four representatives of Montreal newspapers, television and radio stations and professional music associations will judge the entries. Toronto soul club goes country rock

"We're having a problem getting through to everybody that we're not a soul club anymore," Le Coq D'Or manager Bill Bulucon told RPM.

On March 15, Le Coq D'Or changed their music policy over to soft and country-rock.

Le Coq D'Or is one of the flashiest of Toronto's Yonge Street clubs, notorious in the past for the plumage seen to throng en masse in front of its Yonge St. entrance. Bulucon operated Le Coq D'Or for five years as a soul club, but now through Music Shoppe, is attempting to reach a laid-back audience that other clubs, notably El Mocambo have succeeded in attracting.

Music Shoppe's John Stainton, initially booked three acts each night March 16-20. He billed the entertainment as The Canadian Talent Showcase, featuring eighteen acts, including Ron Nigrini, Colleen Peterson, Dee Higgins, Blackcreek and Coyote.

Bands scheduled for future dates include Larry Razzberry and the Highsteppers (April 19-24), Martin Mull (26), Rough Trade (May 3), Chris Hillman (formerly with the Byrds) (10), John Hammond (17) and Lester Flatt (July 12).

Le Coq D'Or will undergo some minor interior changes, following their country-rock policy with a gradual move into blues and jazz.

THP Ork hits gold

THP Orchestra's Theme From S.W.A.T., recently achieved gold status with sales of more than 75,000 singles. The hit was number one on RPM's Top 100 Singles chart (March 20).

RCA recently released THP's Early Riser LP, featuring standards and three originals: Dawn Patrol, Crazy and title track Early Riser.

Homemade Theatre going to the disco-tech

Disco-tech, the new single by A&M's Juno nominees Homemade Theatre, is described as "a parody of the disco-craze that has taken control of kids across North America, featuring a dedicated police official determined to stamp it out."

The single follows up on the Homemade Theatre's Santa Jaws hit of Christmas 1975.

Music Shoppe's new faces

Ron Scribner, president of Music Shoppe International recently appointed two new staff members. Judy Sneed, formerly with Columbia A&R becomes Scribner's personal assistant, handling secretarial and general office duties.

Diane Grenn, formerly a Michigan agent for three years and with the DRAM Agency for nine months, will be working in Music Shoppe's one night department. Grenn brings Michigan's Salty Dog to the Music Shoppe roster.

Elton wraps it up at Eastern Sound

MCA's Elton John arrived in Toronto March 2, to begin work on a new LP at Toronto's Eastern Sound Studios. Recording began March 8 and finished on the 30th.

Elton's new band consists of James Newton-Howard (keyboards, synthesizers), Roger Pope (drums), former Joe Walsh barnstormer Kenny Passarelli (bass), Ray Cooper (percussion), and Davey Johnstone, Caleb Quaye (guitars). Arista's Brecker Brothers Band flew up from the States, mid-March, adding the flavour of disco-horns.

MCA threw a private party for the band, March 3, at the MCA Victoria Avenue location, screening films and presenting Elton with CRIA gold and platinum for his Rock Of The Westies LP, and gold for his single, Island Girl. MCA vice president Richard Bibby and national promotions' Scott Richards made the presentations.

Elton left Toronto, March 7, for Los Angeles with producer Gus Dudgeon, reportedly looking for a black gospel sound to back up a few tracks.

Tubes at TIC "should be a good test"



A&M's Tubes, who last played Toronto October 18 in Massey Hall, through Martin Onrot Inc., are booked by Onrot to play the Toronto International Centre, April 28.

With a seating capacity of 6,000, compared to Massey Hall's 2,765, the Centre also features free parking facilities for 4,000 and a direct linkup with the Islington and York Mills subway stations.

Previously used primarily for trade shows and dances, the TIC has Toronto concert promoters casting an interested eye on its concert hall potential.

"We intend to set up for 6,000," Onrot said, "and instead of reserved

seating, there will be reserved sections. We feel that this will cut down on rush-seating."

Martin Onrot Inc., were once one of Toronto's largest concert promotion organizations until Maple Leaf Gardens finally refused to rent out their space and set up Concert Productions International.

"We've chosen the Centre mainly because there were no other locations available," Onrot said.

"It's bad when competition no longer exists in a market, when a major hall is off-limits to a major promoter. It certainly doesn't serve the interests of the fans."




speeding ahead

Rush

Every popular trend in contemporary music finds commercially-minded Canadian performers riding the crest to the American market. BTO, for example, is one of the most popular rock-singles band in North America, Anne Murray is well ensconced in the MOR/country field, and Gordon Lightfoot is almost an American folk hero.

It seems the only music market that hasn't made superstars of any Canadian performers is FM-oriented, progressive hard rock. Rush's new album, 2112, should see the band with a good position in the international "heavy-metal heap," so far untouched by a Canadian group.

Right from the band's 1968 high school beginnings, Rush's trademark has been bassist Geddy Lee's powerful vocals soaring over Alex Lifeson's guitar and John Rutsey's drums. Then, they were worthy of the attention of booking agent Ray Danniels. In 1973, with Vic Wilson and under the SRO banner, Danniels took the band out of high schools and into the better Toronto pubs, the Victory Theatre, ABC's In Concert series, and onto wax, with SRO's Moon label presenting the band's first LP, Rush.

Neil Peart replaced drummer Rutsey and Rush continued to expand their following to south of the border where they gained a foothold in Cleveland (thanks to Canadian-music lover Donna Halper at WMMS). Chicago's Phonogram, investigating the noise, offered the proverbial big-break contract deal that resulted in the band's second (and the label's first) Rush album, the recently-gold Fly By Night.

The first LP effort resulted in a 1974 Juno nomination for Most Promising New Group. They won, and Fly By Night was released the same week as the awards presentation.

"The Juno Award has helped us in Canada," comments Geddy Lee. "Winning the award brought our name to the attention of a lot of people who didn't know we existed, people who didn't take us seriously - it gave us a good boost. It came at the perfect time for us."

Strangely, the band's Juno had

little or no effect on their success in the States, because they had already begun to break there. Although they sold out Massey Hall, they still needed exposure in the rest of Canada.

Neil Peart explained that Canadian success "wouldn't make any difference at all in the States, really. They don't care whether we're being played out in Canada, whether anybody in Canada likes us."

Since they aren't a singles band, Rush enjoy a unique advantage. Canadian regulations have no effect on them - there is no distrust from American programmers and rack jobbers - the only real measure of their success is dollars and cents, not airplay.

At the same time, Rush is rapidly destroying the myth that the only way for a Canadian band to make the big time is to rack up a string of hit singles. Rush haven't really had even one.

Their third album, Caress of Steel, was released last October, and is still selling - about 38,000 units, in Canada alone so far. The single culled from the album, Return Of The Prince, while not a particularly strong seller, is still receiving airplay on some Canadian stations.

And now 2112 is selling faster than any of the first three. American sales have been outstanding, and Cashbox called the concept "a valid and melodic tale... the story/song is a definite cohesive listen." There's nothing like a concept album to build



a promotion campaign around, and Polydor (which distributes the Mercury/Phonogram product here) is doing just that, taking out well-designed ads (to compliment the grabbing graphics on the sleeve) in all the major trades. Toronto-region initial shipments are selling out, and some stores are finding the LP difficult to keep in stock.

Rush seem to have a sense for anticipating and understanding their audience. Such a concept album at this time in their career is good timing. The majority of their audience are teens in the 15-17 year old bracket, who are naturally attracted to anti-establishment concepts and philoso-

phies that they can call their own.

The LP is based on the writings of Ayn Rand, of whom all three band members are fans. The idea for the LP grew mainly from the mind of drummer Peart, but eventually the whole band became involved. "I concentrated on lyrics and suggestions," says Peart, "and left the music to the other two." (The credit on the label that attributes the whole album to Peart is erroneous.)

Writing the material took about six months, and the album, recorded at Toronto Sound with Terry Brown, required about a month of studio time to complete. "We're very satisfied," says Lee of the final result. "Some of the things on there are the best we've ever done."

Rush used very little overdubbing or special effects on the LP (unusual for a concept album) because they wanted a sound they could reproduce faithfully on stage. They spend nine out of every twelve months touring.

"There's less overdubbing on this album than on the last. We just like to present it live as well as it is on record," says Peart. Lee adds, "It's the live performance that makes someone go out and buy the album."

2112 was premiered for audiences on the West coast of Canada and the States on the band's most recent tour, and was received well. Rush was encouraged by the West Canadian and American audiences, which they find more unrestrained, spontaneous and excitable - offering a constant feedback, unlike the notoriously laid-back crowds of their native Toronto.

A new tour follows the release of the 2112. Tentative arrangements are for Montreal and larger Southern Ontario centres including Toronto, Oshawa, Peterborough, Chatham and Welland to see Rush in June. July's Western dates will likely include Winnipeg, Brandon, Regina, Saskatoon, Edmonton, Lethbridge and Vancouver. Exact dates will be confirmed later.

Undoubtedly, one of the most dominant aspects of the band's collective personality is a genuine belief in what they are doing. They feel there's still a place for progressive hard rock, despite the exploitation by some performers in the genre.

"There's a lot of directions it (hard rock) can go in," says Peart, and there's a lot of people putting it in good directions, but I think there's so much confusion to an average music lover... how does he know what's authentic and what isn't, what's made for the love of it and what's made for the money?"

As to their own future, the band is hesitant to guess. More concepts? New musical directions?

"We've got a big future ahead of us," says Lee. "Who knows?" At their present rate of success, that could be anyone's guess.


During the ABC product shortage, RCA gave Eric Robertson's musical talents to Willi Morrison and Ian Guenther of Three Hats Productions, who quickly produced a Cancon carbon copy of ABC's huge American hit, Theme From S.W.A.T. The band was dubbed the THP Orchestra.

The followup album, Early Riser, features disco-backed instrumental MOR/crossover material. It's by the same Three Hats Production team (giving us the THP acronym) and the same band, led by Eric Robertson on keyboards and horn-heavy arrangements. The familiar combination of Barry Keane and Paul Zaza lead a solid rhythm section, and Brian Russell heads the guitarist lineup. It's recorded and mixed at Phase One Studios.

Shadow Of Your Smile (AP, somewhat lengthy at 4:54) and Sleep Walk (AP at 3:25) are the best MOR fare. Cuts with strongest crossover potential (aside from S.W.A.T.) are Willi Morrison's own Dawn Patrol (MAPL, 4:20) and instrumental version of eternal standard More, (AP at 4:22). All cuts are at least two points Cancon.

Cover concept, by Toronto image-designers ImaGinician (that's co-owner Gurteen in the bathtub) is the focal point of strong instore display and media promo push. This thoroughly-planned package should get good sales in both MOR and contemporary markets.





Real country promo, sweet for the jocks

Daisy recording artist, Jerry Robitaille, the male side of Jerry & Jo'Anne, has a unique promotion that gets his foot in the door of radio stations. His lawyer, Frank Bernard, is associated with a sugar bush camp which is owned by Francois Quirion and Robitaille manages each year to lend a hand in tapping the Maples, out of which comes the Robitaille syrup promotion.

"It's like the record business," Jerry told RPM, "you put a helluva lot into it and you get very little return but a lot of satisfaction." It takes 50 gallons of sap to produce one gallon of syrup and the Quirion operation is capable of boiling 250 gallons of sap each hour.

Jerry & Jo'Anne are currently making good chart inroads with their latest single, *Drop Some Silver In The Jukebox*, which is included on their new album, *Jerry & Jo'Anne Sing The Country Hits You Love*.

Breaking into the Canadian country scene has been an uphill battle for the Robitailles who steadfastly produce for the English Canadian market,

ACTRA picks awards finalists

The fifth annual ACTRA Awards Dinner will be held April 21 at Toronto's Inn On The Park, televised nationally, 9 to 11 PM EST, by the CBC. Pierre Berton will be host.

Nominations for the Awards originate from ACTRA branches across the country. Each branch is entitled to a number of nominations proportionate to its membership: Toronto, seven nominations in each category, Montreal and Vancouver, two each, and the other seven branches, one in each category.

There are 17 national judging panels. Television programs are transmitted across Canada, to the judges, by ANIK satellite, through the co-operation of CBC. Radio judges are

sent cassette tapes.

Judges on each panel vote twice. The first vote selects three finalists in each category, the second picks the winner.

Best Performance in a Continuing Role in a Television Program will be a new award this year. The award for Best Variety Performance included both radio and TV in previous years. This year, there will be two awards.

Because so few feature films were made in Canada last year, and because of "lack of government action in support of feature film production," there will be no award for best performance in a feature film. ACTRA will present an award next year to cover both 1975 and 1976.



Robeson died recently at the age of 83.

Tim Leary, director of the program, said: "Given the richness of Robeson himself and the richness of talent which has come forward to take part, we can only hope to do justice to the life and work of Robeson who was one of the premiere artists America has produced."

The Paul Robeson Commemorative Committee is chaired by Harvey Murphy, a retired trade unionist. Murphy's association with Robeson, goes back to the mid-1940's, when the Mine-Mill and Smelter Union led attempts to remove the travel ban imposed on Robeson by the American State Department. During the 1950's, the communist "red scare" McCarthy era, Murphy helped stage the Peace Arch Concerts, where thousands of Canadians heard Robeson while he stood in the Peace Garden at Blaine, Washington, literally singing across the border.


