Allan Katz vacates his position of promotion chief for Polydor, to take over management of Nana Mouskouri. Mr. Katz has been associated with Polydor for the past six and a half years.

The Mouskouri/Katz pact came about through the latter forming a

management firm with well-known Montreal impresario Sam Gesser. Both will work very closely with Mouskouri on her upcoming tours which will include Australia and Europe.

Described as more "rock oriented" than previous Lightfoot releases (of which there are more than 20), he is accompanied by guitarist Terry Clements, steelman Pee Wee Charles and drummer Barry Keane.

On the heels of sweeping nine Tony Awards, Broadway hit Chorus Line comes to Toronto's Royal Alexandra Theatre for the premiere of the show's international company. The Broadway run, in its 40th week, is still playing to more than 100 per cent sold-out houses.

At the same time, Columbia has released the show's cast LP.

Chorus Line's international com-

pany will play Toronto for six weeks (following previews April 29-May 2) and will then move to England, Australia and Japan. There are two Canadians in the 28-member cast of actors, singers and dancers: Jeff Hyslop and Mark Dovey, both of Vancouver.

Rackjobber answers disc brass charges

Answering complaints by some major-label record brass of apathy among rack jobbers to Canadian product (RPM April 17) racker Taylor Campbell, from one of Canada's largest rack jobbers, Pindoff Record Sales, spoke to RPM and threw the ball back into the labels' court.

Rack jobbers supply current disc product to retail outlets, mostly in department stores and supermarkets. It's estimated that 60-80 percent of the records sold in Canada are handled by rack jobbers.

Campbell confessed, "As far as Canadian talent is concerned, up to a year ago we were not the biggest supporters because sales just weren't there, and we have to put stock in our stores that's going to turn."

But, Campbell continued with an example, "Two weeks ago we made arrangements with Stan Kulin to run a five-week promotion on their (U.A.'s) Canadian product."

Campbell claims the labels he deals with don't push Canadian product more than any other product. "In fact, if they do any pushing at all, it's for the real winners like Led Zeppelin and Paul McCartney."

"The record companies don't seem to be pushing Cancon like they used to, it doesn't seem to be the thing anymore."

Campbell said, if label brass want to complain or establish new ways of working they should talk to him about it:

"I haven't had one person come in here, except Stan Kulin, and sit down and say, 'We've got some titles here, here's what we'd like to do, what can you do?' We're open."

Campbell stressed the differences

"Our songs are becoming more musical than commercial," said BTO's Randy Bachman during an interview in Minneapolis.

But, he insisted, "... in the end music becomes a matter of economics. We won't play anything that's too far out. For instance, on our new album Head On, I play some jazz. ... but it's commercial bubblegum jazz. Unless you starve, you can't be an artist without being a businessman. I wanted to be heard, so I looked for a common denominator."

Reportedly, Bachman's million-seller songwriting approach freely borrows hooks and chord progressions from Chuck Berry, Eric Clapton, Chet Atkins, Robin Trower and Leo Kotke.

"I'll take a lick from here and there, smooth them together and put them against our background. I stole

Polydor stages Garfield to promote debut album

Polydor (Canada) showcased Mercury's latest Canadian find, Garfield, in a unique setting at Toronto's St. Lawrence Centre, Tuesday April 20.

Affording the industry a high-energy preview of the seven piece progressive-rock group, via a concert atmosphere, the evening was hosted by Polydor president Tim Harrold, who introduced the group to the audience, highly spiced by the record retail crowd. The promotion was arranged by Polydor's Lori Bruner and Max Swerling.

The concert was highlighted by composer Garfield French's deeply emotional vocal play that could only be accomplished with what must be the finest and tightest instrumental backup available.


Garfield's album, Strange Streets, produced by Elliot F. Mazer will be given a national promo push by Polydor. Photo coverage of the label promotion to follow next week.

John Lowrey, D. McBride are forming a new band

John Lowrey, wrongly identified in last week's RPM piece on Deja Vu as Joah McKane (which is his middle name) is in the process of forming a new group along with Danny McBride. It's hoped that Danny's brother Bob will be recruited as the lead vocalist, which is contingent on his move to head vocalist for Blood Sweat & Tears.

Lowrey was with the Bob McBride group just after the latter's split with Lighthouse.

Columbia to market Aquitaine classics



A record distribution pact has been firmed between Columbia Records of Canada and Eleanor Sniderman's Aquitaine label. Five major projects are in the can and are now being readied for release. These include Beethoven's 32 piano Sonatas (a 14-record set) with a suggested list of \$100. (a pre-release price of \$75); cellist Gisela Depkat, accompanied by Raffi; 16-year old violinist Victor Schultz; tenor Alan Woodrow, formerly of the Festival Singers; and Kuerti performing Liszt's B Flat Minor Sonata and Glazounov's B Minor Sonata. The Aquitaine/Columbia deal is considered a first for an independent Canadian classical record producer. Release of product will take place over the next four months. Aquitaine's Sniderman and Columbia president Terry Lynd firm distrib deal.

April Wine knocks 'em out in the West

Aquarius "supergroup" April Wine, the first Canadian group to attain platinum status on an album release (*The Whole World's Going Crazy*) have captured the west. It's reported they are the first Canadian group to have "sold out" notices posted for the Kinsmen Field House (7250 capacity) and added an additional performance (23) for the Edmonton showplace.

Gertrude Harvey, of Mike's Ticket Wicket in Edmonton, reports ticket sales of 800 a day and predicted two sellouts with a gross of \$85,000.

The Aquarius group, earlier in their western tour, scored advance sellouts in Regina (6500), Saskatoon (5000) and in Calgary with 6000 passing

Two new Chappell books, by Tom T. Hall, Tobias

Chappell Music, one of the largest music publishers in North America, recently published two books, including its first hardcover publication, Tom T. Hall's *How I Write Songs*.

Chappell's California office announced the publication of Henry Tobias' *Twelve Musical Plays*. The 12 "playlets" are taken from Grimms' Fairy Tales and each contains five original songs. Tobias is a songwriter, playwrite and educator among other things, and is a well-known MC and author of *The Borscht Belt*.

Hall's book is based on his experiences in his 10 years in the music writing business. Chappell calls the book "a practical and non-technical guide to songwriting."

Besides a string of hits sung by himself, Hall wrote hit songs for others including Jeannie C. Riley's *Harper Valley PTA*, Johnny Rodriguez's *You Always Come Back* and Jerry Lee Lewis' *I Still Can Hear The Music In The Restroom*.

The group's single, *The Whole World's Going Crazy*, is currently riding the RPM 100 at No. 56 while their album, under the same title, is enjoying a No. 6 berth on the album chart.

Quality's Opus 5: promo hard at work

Quality Records recently hosted a press reception at Montreal's Le Goblet, to fanfare their current Quebecois acquisition, Opus 5.

Opus 5 are: Olivier Duplessis (clavinet, vocals), Luc Gauthier (guitars, vocals), Serge Nolet (flute, vocals), Christian Leon Racine (bass, vocals) and Jean-Pierre Racicot (percussion, vocals).

They were signed by Quality's Quebec branch manager Nicolle Dufor to Quality's Celebration label.

The press affair attracted over 150 guests, including rackers, college talent buyers, CBC personnel, Lesley Sole and Peggy Colston from Montreal progressive outlet CHOM-FM, Sandy Rochester from CHOM sister CKGM and CKVL's Jacques LaTendre. Representing Quality were A&R director Bob Morten, Quebec branch manager Clement Dufresne, Dufor and Cancon promo manager Nick Panaseiko.

"Opus 5 definitely made a favourable impression," said Morten. "... the group walked away with ten additional college dates as a result of the reception."


Quality's Quebec office reports a back-order of 3,000 units, favourable reviews for the band over CBC Radio, and the possibility of a CHOM-FM feature.

Quality expects an English-language release from Opus 5 within one month.

U.A. releases solo debut of former War-ior Oskar

United Artists have released a debut solo by Lee Oskar, the talent responsible for the harp of War.

Born in Copenhagen Denmark, 1948, Oscar Levinson's parents settled



in Toronto, where Levinson would play occasional gigs ala Bob Dylan (harmonica/guitar) while a summercamp waiter at Pickering Ontario's Camp Yungvelt.

At 17, Lee Oskar moved to New York and San Francisco. He sang and played harp for Project Hope, eventually meeting manager Jerry Goldstein, who was looking for someone to play a harmonica riff on a "bubblegum" single ready for production. Oskar played, received ten dollars and made a lasting friend of Goldstein. Shortly after, Oskar met Eric Burdon, who accompanied him and Goldstein to the club Rag Doll, where they heard the Night Shift, backing ex-football star Deacon Jones. After Deacon's set, the subsequent jam became War, managed by Goldstein.

Oskar's harp play has become synonymous with War's "slipping into darkness" funk effect, heard on all of their top-40 hits.

His debut features production by drummer Greg Errico and Jerry Goldstein for California's Far Out Productions.



Casablanca's Kiss weights RPM album chart

Quality Records devoted five weeks in March and April to promoting Casablanca-label product, which they distribute in Canada. The effort, which involved dealer discount incentives, centered on five LPs by Kiss, currently on a Canadian tour and Donna Summer who was in Toronto (April 8-11) to tape a Bobby Vinton show appearance.

Kiss is represented on the RPM 100 Albums chart with five albums: Destroyer (7), Alive (11), Hotter Than Hell (57), Dressed To Kill (70) and Kiss in at 86. Donna Summer is also well represented with her two albums Love To Love You Baby and A Love Trilogy sitting at 20 and 23 respectively.

The Kiss phenomenon is now strong on the west coast where Taylor, Pearson and Carson's Ray Ramsay has been successful with his Destroyer promotion. Radio spots, with dealer tags, have been booked in the B.C. interior, regarded as prime Kiss territory. These include CJIB Vernon, CHIK Prince Rupert, CKTK Kitimat, CKOK Penticton (with spots simulcast on repeater stations CKGF Grand Forks and CKOO Oliver-Osoyoos) CKOV Kelowna and CHNL Kamloops (with simulcast on repeater stations CJNL Merritt, CINL Princeton and CHNL -1 Clearwater). All spots run from April 26 through the 30th.

Ramsay has been receiving heavy exposure on the group's Shout It Out Loud single, (which is currently No. 6 on the RPM 100) particularly on CKPG Prince George and its repeater station CKMK Mackenzie, CKRW Whitehorse and CKDA Victoria.

Says Ramsay: "We have effectively covered the majority of the B.C.



market with the Kiss promo in one phase or another."

Major market stations, CKLG and CFUN have already charted the Shout single along with Alberta's CHED and CKXL. Destroyer albums were used as giveaway promos at CFUN and CKLG.

Quality contributed to the forthcoming Kiss cross-Canada tour staging a Toronto-based Kiss-athon and a Kiss By Numbers contest in London, Ontario, sponsored by CJKB-London with A&A franchise stores, with a Kiss-off at Toronto's A&A downtown location. The winner received photos with Kiss, autographed posters, tickets to the Toronto performance, tour jackets, t-shirts and a Kiss LP library.

During Summer's Toronto promo

swing Quality arranged for a Sam The Chinese Food Man reception, with Quality's Ontario promo manager Dom Posterino securing interviews with AM-giants, CHUM and CFTR-Toronto.

Hammersmith opens Kiss tour

Openers for the Canadian Kiss tour will be the West Coast band, Hammersmith, Mercury recording artists, distributed by Polydor.

Hammersmith's current single, Late Night Lovin' Man, occupied the No. 39 position on the April 24 RPM Top 100 singles chart.

The Kiss/Hammersmith tour dates are Moncton (18), Halifax (19), Montreal (21), Ottawa (23), Kitchener (23), London (24), Toronto (26), Winnipeg (28). The tour is handled by CPI and Donald K. Donald.



Columbia's Lick 'N Stick have a new release. Under My Thumb (C4-4118), produced by Bob Gallo. Lick 'N Stick are Paul Vigna (guitar, lead vocals), Rick "Rocket" Law (bass), Brian "Fingers" Fraser (keyboards) and Rob "Rhubarb" Hancock (drums).

Radio shows, sro's for Mouskouri tour

When Nana Mouskouri finished her sell-out concert tour here with three full houses at Toronto's Massey Hall, she left behind four tracks of each of the two Easter Sunday shows for CBC-FM broadcast next fall.

Mouskouri sold out houses in Montreal, Quebec and Hamilton as well.

The show will be aired during a weekly series of FM two-hour specials, titled Special Occasion, under executive producer Mike McEwan.

The taping was done by free-lance producer Jaques Robert Rivart in CBC's new four-track Massey Hall recording facility. Rivart has been busy with CBC lately, tracking a number of artists for broadcast specials and Radio Canada International disc library. These are records used for broadcast purposes in Canada and internationally.

The fall FM series, recently announced by CBC, will also feature the Canadian Opera Company's performance of *La Boheme*, Rod Coneybear's study of Cole Porter and a four-part, eight-hour series prepared by singer-songwriter Malka Cohen.

Rivart recently tracked Ella Fitzgerald here and has her approval to press a RCI disc of the performance pending talks with Pablo Records. He's also planning to go to France to produce an Elton John special.

Cathy Young back with Good Company

"I've never managed the responsibility of having my own band before, yet I'm confident that this sound is going to tilt Canada on its ear."

Cathy Young, 1973 Juno Award's Most Promising Female Vocalist, leads the new band Cathy Young and Co., featuring: Young (lead vocals, guitar), Michael Taka (bass), Bruce Griffin (keyboards) and Michael "The Hawk" Hawkins (drums).

Young is known for her backup vocals and vocal hooks for Suzanne Stevens' *Make Me Your Baby* (with Attic's Shirley Eikhard), Peter Foldy's *Hollywood*, and various radio spots including the *Hip Pocket* and *Thrifty's*.

In 1975, Cathy Young sang for Cliff Jones' CBC radio production *Hey Marilyn!* and was featured in interview via host Jim Bauer's *The Entertainer* series.

In February 1976, Young and Shirley Eikhard backed Lynn Jones' *Small Town Talk*, produced by Milan Kymlicka for CTL.

Cathy Young and Co. recently played Smith Falls' *Carousel Inn* (April 5-10), and will play Peterborough (19-24) and St. Catherines (26-30).

A&M president Gerry Lacoursiere and national promo Doug Chappel flew to Calgary for a dinner to mark the release of Cliff Edwards' new LP *Singer of Songs*. Local A&M reps, radio, press and TV people attended.

Later that week, Edwards was interviewed by the Calgary Albertan weekend's Shirlee Gordon, who wrote " . . . he (Edwards) is recuperating from open wounds inflicted during the royal screwing he got, from the industry he loves."

"Can you imagine how humiliating it is," said Edwards in print, "to be told flat out by the CTV Network, that they are only interested in remaking the show (his, previously over the Global Network), because they are only interested in getting established U.S. performers to do shows here, and they get around the Canadian Content thing by surrounding them with Canadian crews and backup performers . . . they told me though, they could arrange an audition for me, for the *Bobby Vinton Show*. Imagine, I'd been established for ten years, and now I'm asked to audition in my own country, for an American singer's show which is being produced in Toronto. That hurts!"

"I feel, however," he said, "after being in this business almost eleven years, that finally things are starting


to be slanted the performer's way. The 30 per cent edict about radio stations having to play that amount of Canadianism is finally starting to pay off and we are being recognized with our American singers on a world market.

"Sure, I've been hurt, angered, humiliated and for a while I had negative thoughts and went into a slump where I didn't feel wanted or recognized in my own country. Well, I'll be damned if I'm going to be licked."

Calgary is to be Edwards' homebase where he'll continue "writing songs like my next single off my new album, *There's A Fire Burning Still*, and I'll perform in clubs, record for A&M and produce records . . ."

Edwards also plans to "... produce package tours . . . three acts in one concert. For instance, a concert would open with a folk singing group, then Cliff Edwards and Susan Jacks, or a group opening followed by Dan Hill and Shirley Eikhard. People would go and see them I'm sure."



Weddings, Wakes And Other Things is four sides of the versatile John Allan Cameron. Sides 1 and 2 present a variety of contemporary and traditional-style vocals, side 3 a medley of traditional instrumental tunes and side 4 is a lively Cameron live concert.

The four sides together create 45 minutes of good listening at home, but most programmers are going to have to zero in on a few cuts on sides 1 and 2. A couple of Allistor MacGillivray songs on side 1, Tie Me Down and Looking Back, are appealing, with the former quite suitable for most country and MOR formats. On side 2, there's quite a bouncy, country version of one of Cameron's old favourites, Anne, and a searching ballad, Birds Of Joy, written by Canadians Stu Cisco and Paul Grady.

The live portion was tracked by Audio Atlantic at the Dalhousie Arts Centre and the rest at Morning Height's Le Studio. It was all mixed at Sounds Interchange, produced by Robbie MacNeill, with engineer Chris Skene and Cameron.

Cameron, who has a great radio on-air presence, will be playing dates out west May 4-12 and in the Maritimes, June 1-12. He's taping next year's CTV John Allan Cameron Show in Montreal during the latter part of June, first half of August and late in September.




The original Canadian talent

The Zodiac I Room of Toronto's Ramada Inn played host to Canada's top club act, Bobby Curtola, for a capacity house one week engagement (Apr 12-17). The room is one of Toronto's best disco locations and often features top name artists.

The Curtola show brought a new sparkle and professionalism to the room and changed the demographics of the audience that usually frequents this bistro cum-disco. The club started to take on a Las Vegas appearance as Curtola did a show that happened anywhere on the stage and anywhere in the club that the length of the microphone cable permitted. The performance never leaves out the audience for a minute as Curtola sings and dances and makes the audience participate.

It was a new show that had added the lovely new Mrs. Bobby Curtola. Ava Curtola (daughter of Curtola's manager of many years, Maria Martell) is slowly being introduced into the show as a partner in many of the songs and as a background singer for Curtola's solo stints. She adds a great deal to the show. She dances and sings a couple of duets with Bobby but the show still revolved around Curtola who at one point calls himself "the original Canadian talent". His stardom goes back to the early sixties

when he was a hit parade topper in Canada for close to ten years. Internationally he scored a chart entry with "Fortune Teller" his biggest hit.

Included in the show is a medley of all those early hit singles which gets a response from the audience, indicating they haven't forgotten.

The "Let's have a party" theme runs throughout the show which is

principally up-tempo but the big showstopper is Curtola's tribute to Paul Anka and with a mainly record industry audience he got two standing

ovations at the end of his set.

The Las Vegas experience hasn't hurt Curtola and his recent marriage has added to the show. He tours constantly and from coast to coast is a highly sought after act that brings in the audiences.

His newly released RCA single "Hap Hap Happy Song" is already scoring MOR airplay and promises to be another record achievement for "the original Canadian Talent."

Middleton's new single gets programmer praise

Tom Middleton, chugging up and down the charts with his single. One Night Lovers, is ready to chuck this "work record" for what could be an "instant smash". Rolling off the presses and receiving immediate programmer acceptance is, I Need A Harbour For My Soul" a self-penned published through Blackwood Music (BMI).

The session was produced by Bob Gallo at Toronto's Manta Sound.

One Toronto rock programmer, on first listen to the single, commented: "This is the best produced record, Canadian or foreign, ever released. The levels are perfect and the orchestration incredible."

The Harbour single was produced as a crossover item in the studio with excellent reaction from adult and contemporary programmers, on release.

A&M Tubes warm up for Toronto re-run

Martin Onrot Inc., has scheduled A&M's Tubes to play Toronto's International Centre, Wednesday, April 28. The date will mark the second time the band has played Toronto.

Subject of a recent four-page pictorial spread in Playboy, the Tubes (originating in Phoenix, base of operations San Francisco) are: founder, lead guitarist and composer William Edmund Spooner, (whose childhood trauma was that he would grow up to be Alice Cooper); percussionist Prairie Prince, regarded as the "sweaty pedal pusher"; synthesizer whiz Michael Cotton (creator of the Tubes array of

stage props and cinematic visuals); guitarist, composer Roger Steen; keyboarder Vince Welnick; bassist Rick Anderson, (a chronic worrier of the black holes in space); and Fee Waldo Waybill, undoubtedly the centre of the Tubes satire-circus - a multi-schizoid vocal personality, embodying theatrical parodies of Rod Stewart, David Bowie, etc. Re Styles is the other billed Tube. A longlegged, choreo-crazed woman, she wants "to make and star in the first Tampax commercial". At least a dozen acrobats and dancers comprise the remainder of the Tubes media-assault.

The band's second LP, Young And Rich, was airplayed (via testpressing) over CHUM-FM-Toronto, the evening of April 13. Produced by Ken Scott, the album is decidedly jazzier than the band's previous Al Kooper-produced effort. Nevertheless, Young And Rich maintains with the Tubes highly unique signature of musical madness, notably on the "bicentennial anthem," Proud To Be An American.



Randy Bachman solo album released by RCA

Released on RCA's Pure Gold series, is a solo album by Bachman-Turner Overdrive's Randy Bachman. The session was produced by Bachman at RCA's Mid-America Recording Centre in Chicago in March of 1970 when Bachman was a member of the Guess Who.

The set contains all Bachman originals, published through Dunbar and Ranbach Music. Personnel on the album include Wes Dakus, pedal steel; Garry Peterson drums; and Dom Troiano on guitar with Randy on guitars and bass.

Sun's Doug Fisher rates CBC's chief, Al Johnson

CBC chief Al Johnson spoke to members of the Canadian Club, in Toronto, April 12.

Doug Fisher, columnist for the Toronto Sun, reacted by writing, "...Johnson is the most convinced protagonist for the CBC, that the Corporation has had to lead it in the post-war years."

Predecessor Laurent Picard (1972-75), "was primarily dedicated to streamlining the CBC's bureaucracy, not explaining, defending or extending its mission."

George Davidson (1968-72) was "a polished Ottawa mandarin, dropped on top of the CBC by Lester Pearson, to muffle its dissonance and take it out of public controversy."

Alphonse Ouimet (1958-67) was "the engineer builder of lines and plant, otherwise an inept exponent of CBC's national role."

David Dunton (1945-58) was "the chief during the last glory years of national radio and he took the CBC into television with much confidence."

In Fisher's opinion, Johnson's main concern is with programming and not administration, techniques, or "bureaucracy".

"At least he's not a token president," Fisher wrote. "He's not there to drift quietly through his seven year appointment."

CTV net debuts Rolf Harris Show


CTV variety has debuted a 16-week series of the Rolf Harris Show, featuring the Australian singer-comedian and a special guest each week.

Produced in the studio's of Vancouver affiliate BCTV, the show enhances the folksie, small-town humour of Harris's performance. It is scheduled independently by each CTV affiliate.

CTV sales' Philip "Pip" Wedge told RPM that the network is looking to capitalize on Harris's international popularity through syndication, especially in Commonwealth countries. Part of the production deal requires approval by Harris's management for foreign deals since the show will compete with other syndicated Harris shows originating from the BBC. Wedge points out that the production is "self liquidating" in Canada, meaning all costs are recovered through Canadian broadcast.

Harris, who is signed to EMI-England, has six active LPs in the Capitol Canada catalogue including his first, Tie Me Kangaroo Down (featuring his 1963 world-wide hit) and two recorded in Canada: Live At The Cave (Vancouver) and Jake The Peg In Vancouver Town. In April Harris sold out three B.C. dates, Ottawa's National Arts Centre and Toronto's Hotel Toronto.

Upcoming Harris Show guests include: Shari Lewis, Tom Connors,

Ian Tyson, Rod Hull, Bob McGrath, Diane Staples, Guido Basso and Tanya Tucker. Vancouverite Geri Dewson is Harris's straightwoman each week.

Capitol is ready to release a new Harris LP, Turn On Rolf Harris, recorded live last year at Massey Hall by CBC radio crews. The concert was aired on CBC.

CBC: 1-Night Stand

CBC-TV debuted an 11-week pop music series, One Night Stand, Saturday night, April 17, with WEA's Christopher Ward Band. The pre-prime time (7:00 pm) slot and a relaxed format of talk and performance makes the show, producer John Martin says: "such as to show the viewing public their (the performers') real personalities."

The series, alternately hosted by Mel Profit and Rob Parker, will feature Joe Mendelsohn, Shawne Jackson with the Domenic Troiano Band, Dan Hill and Dianne Heatherington with more artists to be announced.

Chilliwack on Swede TV

Casino Records' Chilliwack were filmed by Swedish National Television, March 19, during their Vancouver Commodore Ballroom engagement. The special is intended for broadcast this summer in several European markets, where response to the band's Rockerbox LP has been enthusiastic.

New to country promo

GRT gets ready with Freddy

With their newly-acquired ABC line of records, GRT promo people moved into country music for the first time when Freddy Fender came to Toronto in mid-April.

Fender, one of the most popular U.S. country artists here (three Canadian gold records in 1975), sang to a gathering of industry and media people and guests at Toronto's Ramada Inn and did the rounds of the radio stations April 13, 14, despite a bad case of the flu.

GRT's Liz Braun, who recently joined the label to work on ABC promo when GRT bought the Canadian rights from ABC in March, told RPM that more than 350 people saw Fender at the show and reception. Fender performed with local musicians.

GRT's ABC people will be busy with Fender for a while. His new LP, *Rock n' Country*, promises to be one of his most popular, and he's playing 30 dates in Canada this summer.

Probably the most successful cross-over artist ever, Fender is quite sympathetic to the Canadian artists who,

because of the size of the country market here, have learned to place hits on a variety of charts.

Fender sings in two languages, Spanish and English, has hits on all U.S. charts (though he's really a unique artist in a style somewhere between R&B and country), appeals to young and old (demographics of his record sales show strongest sales in the 8-14 and post 24-year-old age markets) and his music spans decades (he wrote his big 1975 hit *Wasted Days And Wasted Nights* in 1959).

Fender knows French from his days in Louisiana and he was genuinely interested in the French influences on much of the country music up here. He was especially delighted to hear about the response Ian and Sylvia get when they sing their bilingual version of *Crazy Arms* (which they recorded in 1967).

Fender, who operates out of Houston, doesn't consider himself to be part of Texas' new country swing

More details later. Meanwhile, his *Bad Romancer* single has been picking up solid airplay.





just released Randy Anderson's debut single, Let Us Share. The Programmers

Moffat's computers help jocks spin the hits

by Boyd Tattrie

One of the most interesting, and important, points raised during the Communication 13 radio panel discussion concerned the use of computers in broadcasting. CKLW's Herb McCord called computerization in general an "inevitability," adding that computers "eliminate mistakes" and were definitely going to be the thing of the future."

Moffat Communications vice president Keith James agreed. His company's own computer system has been in use for some time. The Computer Assisted Programming System is in full operation at CHED Edmonton, at CKLG Vancouver, and CKXL Calgary. The setup at CKXL serves as a model to the industry for the potentials of computers in broadcasting.

Greg Haraldson, Program Director at CKXL, explains the thought process every disc jockey used to go through when planning his show without computer assistance:

"Here at CKXL, 19 'A' records are to be played every three hours, and about 25 'B' records are each to be played an equal number of times in a 24-hour day. It's important that all records receive their precise intended exposure... unfortunately a number of factors do create problems. Day part restrictions is one that takes a lot of time to control, certain records are

not to be played in specific hours due to demographic appeal. The music director has to listen to his radio station to insure that those records are not getting on when they're not supposed to. Another factor requiring time to control, is day to day rota-

computer is programmed to take these into account. When the jock does choose his song, he only has to push the proper buttons preparing the song for play, eliminating all record handling by the jock. Ideally, this allows the jock the most time possible to

tion; a record is not to be played in the same hour two successive days. To police this situation probably would require listening to your station 24 hours a day, every day. In addition, we are required to play 30% Canadian recordings each hour to give us a minimum of 30% over the 18-hour period of 6 in the morning to 12 midnight. Of course we can't omit jocks playing favorites, a problem in every radio station.

"In short, getting the right record on the air at the proper time requires a lot of listening by the music director, and a lot of aware thinking by the jock. Unfortunately even jocks with the best of intentions are prone to human error, resulting in improper music rotation."

The computer system used by the Moffat chain eliminates most of the "negative decisions," presenting to the jock on the readout screen only songs which the jock may play. The jock can choose any song from the list displayed, without worry about time and quota restrictions, because the

develop his on-air creativity.

"The deejay won't even need a pencil," explains Keith James in reference to the system at CHED Edmonton. "The system tells him what he's supposed to do next, including commercials. It doesn't do it for him, it merely helps him do his radio show better."

Another advantage of the computer assisted system is the information available instantly to program directors, who need to know exactly when a song was played, and how often. At the end of each day, the computer produces a music list showing what songs were played in each hour, and in which hours each song was played.

"The list is total proof of performance that our music is being rotated properly," says Greg Haraldson. "The most important thing to me is the time this system saves me, time away from being program director. In the past it took literally two to three hours each time I wanted to check the jock playlist. With this list I can check



our rotation in a matter of minutes. The system itself consists of a large memory bank, containing all programming information, linked to a 12 hour digital clock, which enables the computer to record the time of day and the day of the month. Connected to the computer is a teletype printout, providing all printed information, such as the daily music lists.

In addition, there are two CRT data terminals, each with a television readout screen and a standard type-

writer keyboard.

One terminal is in the control room, where the jock can select and play the songs contained in the memory, and the other is used by the music director who can change and enter music information.

There is also the Instacart, the machine that actually holds the carts played by the system.

The Computer Assisted Programming System was developed by Keith James and CKXL engineer Gordon Kyle. After CHED-Edmonton engineers Clint Nicol and Tom Davies had developed a system that eliminated the jock's handling of records. The jock dialed his request and the system put his song on the air by remote control.

After about a year of development, the complete Computer Assisted Programming System, updating the CHED system, was installed at CKXL Calgary, where it has been completely debugged through nine months of 24-hour-a-day use on the air. Eventually every station in the Moffat chain will be on the system. At present, only CHAB Moose Jaw and CKY Winnipeg are not.

"The system was meant to assist the jock, and can be relaxed or tightened up as much as necessary . . . One of the main factors is psychological. I feel that our jocks in Calgary are happier on the air than any I've worked with in the past."

Even in more practical terms of measurement, computers seem to be a boon to broadcasting. The most recent BBM figures placed CKXL at the top of the Calgary market. "The summer '75 BBM was the best ever for CKXL, and we're sure computer controlled music was part of the reason."

SRO gives radio men gold

CHUM's Don Shafer, received a gold disc for being the first announcer to air the album. A third award was presented to Nevin Grant and the CKOC staff, the first AM station to programme the album. Both the *Fly By Night* title single and the LP went to the top five in Hamilton. This was the only gold album ever presented to CKOC.

Characters uncertain about CRTC regs

In 1960, Laurie Rotenberg and Larry Goldhar set up the Toronto-based talent agency, The Uglies, patterned after a successful agency in England. Now called The Characters, the agency currently contracts 170 performers, 70 per cent to radio commercial, 20 per cent to TV/film and 10 per cent to theatrical jobs.

"But our bulk of commercial work is for radio and television," Rotenberg told RPM.

"It's almost impossible to watch a commercial break without seeing or

hearing our people."

Nevertheless, Rotenberg insists: "If the borders were opened up a bit, if Americans were let in here, and my people could go there, the total work situation would improve. Right now, it's almost impossible for people to find work."

Rotenberg told RPM that he and many others in the industry are somewhat confused about what the CRTC regulations for Cancon in commercial production actually imply, but he's confident that the regs "should improve the situation up here."

CFTR chart takes hold across Ontario

The recently bowed CFTR survey has shown early indications of acceptability with racks and retailers across southern Ontario. The survey has also attracted new listeners in the Kitchener, Barrie, Oshawa and Peterborough areas.

A survey taken of several youth-oriented clothing stores, hair stylists, restaurants and "hang-outs" revealed a switch to the Toronto-based adult contemporary station.

Chuck Camroux, station manager for CFTR, and responsible for the "music played", has been encouraged by the acceptance of the chart at the

record company level as well as with requests to be placed on the mailing list, from fellow programmers in Canada and in the U.S.

Camroux is now being pressured to make the chart available as a giveaway in record stores, a distinct possibility, but nothing definite has been decided at press time.

There is still a great deal of work in putting together the chart and as Camroux admits: "We are getting a much better balance now and we are improving our method of sampling which will give us a more complete picture of the situation."

The CBC recently sold a number of radio productions to the Australian Broadcasting Corporations new FM network. The ABC-FM network, which signed on the air in January, will broadcast three musical documentaries by Glenn Gould and Tim Wilson's program on Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance.

CBC International relations officer Helga Reed, and other members of her department, are currently negotiating with the ABC over a series of eight, one-hour programs on Movies and Mythologies, a program on the Franklyn School in England, and Gould's The Idea of The North and Bells of Europe.

The ABC has scheduled April and May airdates for Gould's documentaries on Stokowski, Casals and Schoenberg.

between the interests of promo reps and salespeople:

"We never see people from the promotion departments. I guess their job descriptions read 'radio, radio, radio'. But we see some sales representatives. Salesmen are on commission, they're selling winners."

Campbell answered charges, some record brass made through RPM, that rack jobbers ignore regional radio action and local playdates.

"They're 100 per cent right. They're talking about 45s, and it's almost impossible to have a setup internally in most rackjobbing operations for specific markets and specific 45s. I'd be smothered with 45s!"

What about LP product? Campbell told of a recent weekend promo for a Canadian singer, by her label, at Hamilton's East Street Mall.

"We have an account there, so we put in 50 extra copies (of her LP), featured it for the weekend and sold three records."

He told of another label which bought time on Toronto's CFRB radio to promote an LP by a popular Canadian artist. Pindoff received the LP product three weeks after the radio spots aired.

"They're doing their job," Campbell concluded, "but they're really digging their heads deeper in the sand. They've got to learn to make their sales pitch to the same people their promotion is geared at."

or outlaw booms, which he says are really nothing new musically. The lyrics, though, he points out, are contemporary.

Fender performed for more than 20 years before he hooked up with Houston record producer Huey Meaux in 1974. He signed with ABC in 1975 and became an overnight hitmaker.

In addition to Fender, GRT will be into country with ABC artists such as Billy "Crash" Craddock, Roy Clark, Narvel Felts and Don Williams.


