## Sam Chase takes over as publisher of *Gig* Thor and The Imps

An almost legendary discbiz figure, Sam Chase, has become Publisher of *Gig*, a national monthly edited for young adults with an editorial emphasis on popular music and records.

Chase, a veteran publisher and communications consultant and one of the few in music journalism who told the true story about America's acceptance of the Beatles' invasion dropped out of the business shortly after introducing, as Editor and Publisher, the weekly trade magazine, *Music Business*, which was later merged with *Record World*. His credits include that of Editor and Publisher of *Record Beat*, the first national popular music newspaper.

Much of Chase's knowledge of the music business however, came through his 15 year association with *Billboard Magazine* where he served as Editorial Director, Associate Publisher and Editor-In-Chief. He was instrumental in introducing many important features to trade reporting which remain today and which have made this medium a necessary part of the recording industry and figured in its development into the giant it is today.

For the past eight years, Chase has

headed up his own consulting organization serving publishers and national advertisers on promotional utilization of media, with emphasis on print and broadcasting. Among his clients are *Newsweek*, *Harper's*, *Atlas*, *American Airlines*, *Metropolitan Life* and *American Home Products*. He has also been active in broadcasting, serving as Vice-President in charge of station operations and programming for New York's *WLIB*. Two program series which he created and produced at *WLIB* won Peabody Awards over a three-year period.

*Gig*, Chase's new venture, is just one year old and has undergone some facelifting ala Chase. These include a new look to the front cover, to better display each issue's editorial feature; improved presentation of such editorial features as the record popularity charts and reviews; increased information about music, musicians and musical instruments; and expanded coverage of areas symbiotic with music and records.

Jean-Charles Costa remains as Editor of *Gig* and Jim Harvey Cowen has been appointed Director of Sales for the New York-based monthly.

## tape Eastern date

John Mikl Thor and The Imps, billed as North America's "most unique rock show group", have made moves into the record business. The group's manager, Bruce Wilson reports to RPM that a recording session of four original songs took place at Toronto's Eastern Sound. Says Wilson, "Each of the four songs has its own identity while maintaining the basic style of Thor and The

Imps." All four songs were written by John Mikl and lead guitarist Frank Soda.

Included on the session was Stacy Heydon, a young Canadian who has just completed a worldwide tour as lead guitarist for David Bowie. Engineering chores were handled by Peter Mann who assisted in the Elton John sessions at Eastern earlier this year.

Thor's songs now in the can are *Do The Muscle-Flex*, *Land Lover*, *I Gotta Eat* and *Everybody Needs A Hero*.

Wilson is currently negotiating for a single release.

On May 18 of this year the Carnegie Hall Society staged a "Concert Celebration observing the 85th Anniversary of the Opening of Carnegie Hall." The list of soloists reportedly read like a "who's who of the greatest musicians of our time."

## Convocation Hall concert for Attic recording acts

Three of Attic's top recording acts, Ken Tobias, Shirley Eikhard and Ron Nigrini have been set for a Nov 19 spotlight at the University of Toronto's Convocation Hall. The concert is sponsored by the label and the Student Activities Council of the U of T, and is open to non-students.

Headliner of the show, Ken Tobias will be appearing with his five man group. He has just returned from his third tour of western Canada. He is currently on release with a single, *Oh Lynda* which was culled from his new album, *Siren Spell*.

Shirley Eikhard, who will shortly release her single, *Let Me Down Easy*, from her new album under the same title, will bow her new backup group at this concert.

Ron Nigrini, no stranger to the RPM charts, will be backed by John Stockfish on bass and Aden Mason on guitar.

The concert will be taped by CHUM-FM for airing at a later date.

## RCA Mutual St. studio getting big renovation

RCA is completely renovating and technologically updating its Mutual Street Toronto studios, the oldest multi-track recording facility in Canada.


The studio has been closed while workers, engineers, architects and RCA staff work to install almost \$100,000 worth of new recording equipment and complete almost \$200,000 worth of renovations within the building, RCA studio manager Ed Traynor told RPM.

When completed, the studio will offer a new 24-track facility with new consul and electronic out-board gear. "We're building a whole new control room" Traynor explained.

Los Angeles designer Jack Edwards has redesigned the new facilities and its acoustics. Traynor said the sound heard in the control room during a recording session will be as exactly similar to the sound recorded on tape as is possible with today's electronic equipment.

Edwards has designed other RCA and Canadian studios in the past.

Traynor expects the studio to be open early in December.

## A&M enjoys long chart life

Many may have noticed that several A&M LPs have been on the RPM chart an unusually long time. Frampton Comes Alive has occupied the upper levels of the chart for 40 weeks, and last week returned to the number two spot. Supertramp's Crisis? What Crisis? although sometimes slipping off the bottom, has been moving on the chart since its release one year ago this month. Crime Of The Century, though for the same reason listed as only 17 weeks, has actually been on the chart for more than two years. Last week all three LPs were bulleted.

It certainly is unusual, but not suspicious. It's just another part of A&M's unique sales patterns. National sales manager Joe Summers and national promotion manager Doug Chappell have confirmed that these LPs really are consistent sellers.

Chappell accounted for last week's move of Frampton back up to the number two berth by explaining that "just the copies shipped in the past week were enough to qualify for gold status." As it is, the LP is platinum almost four times over, which is amazing for a double album. It's sold 5 million in the U.S.

"It seems the album hasn't reached its peak yet," Chappell told RPM. "It still hasn't reached its maximum market. It's a classic album, like Tapestry (to date,

A&M's biggest all-time seller). Even that LP is still selling. Many Tapestry buyers are repeaters who are replacing worn-out copies. Frampton will be like that. So will Crime Of The Century. The Crisis album, the newer Supertramp LP, is considered by some to be the turkey album, the one that couldn't follow up. It's moving toward double platinum. That's no turkey."

While Frampton is an out-and-out hit right across North America, Supertramp, like Nazareth, is finding more success in Canada than the U.S. Equinox, the last album by Styx before Crystal Ball, is experiencing a surge in Canadian sales as well. It's almost platinum here, but still hasn't gone gold yet in the U.S. (Last week it returned to the RPM chart, joining Crystal Ball, after its normal life expectancy had run out.)

Why does this highly unusual sales situation happen so often with A&M? Joe Summers suggests that it's due to the unique independence of the Canadian national office from its U.S. parents. "We have an effective sales department," Summers told RPM. "We own our own sales branches across Canada, and this allows us to move very quickly on something we think could be hot."

A&M in the U.S. must rely on a network of independent distributors.

## Recording activity for Nancy White

Nancy White, off the record scene for sometime, is ready to enter the race once again. The talented young artist will soon release a single, Hockey Widow.

White has kept busy writing for several CBC shows and can be heard on the CBC's new three-hour public affairs show, Sunday Morning. She has just completed a season with the comedy and music review, Mail Order Brides with Gay Claitman and Suzette Couture, directed by Phil Savath for Homemade Theatre. She has also written songs for Morningside (CBC) and W-5 (CTV) and has appeared on the Alan Hamel Show (CTV).

Toronto's Groaning Board, which boasts a "no smoking regulation" along with a liquor licence, is the next stop for White (Nov 15-20), followed by Yuk Yuk's comedy cabaret at 519 Church St. in Toronto (24). She is accompanied by Jed McKay on piano. He also writes for television and collaborates with Homemade Theatre on scripts.

## National "Sell Out" for McLauchlan tour

It would appear that Murray McLauchlan's concert tour of Canadian centres will break all his previous records and finish up a "national sell out". McLauchlan's manager Bernie Finkelstein telephoned RPM from Regina where he and McLauchlan are taking

a short break between concert dates. "It's been an incredible tour", said Finkelstein, "Murray's acceptance by the press and radio has been exceptional."

One date where Finkelstein, was a bit apprehensive was Nov 12 in Winnipeg. This time however, it was "sold out" with top ducat price at \$6.00, a house of 2203, they grossed \$11,300.

The Arts Centre in Ottawa was also a triumph. Both shows netted \$24,000 and, of course, packed houses were in order for McLauchlan's Toronto dates.

Their swing through the Maritimes and in particular New Brunswick gave McLauchlan and Finkelstein the opportunity to meet Peter Hatfield, Premier of New Brunswick who hosted a party for the touring group. It also gave Finkelstein an edge with the Premier in his efforts to have the province waive their 10% tax for Canadian performers visiting the province.

Two extra dates have been added to the tour which will wind up on the west coast Dec. 7.

McLauchlan's album, Boulevard, has been released in the U.S. on the True North label distributed by Island. His latest single, Sling Back Shoes, released the week of Nov 15, has indicated a pattern of acceptance by programmers that could bring about a national hit within a few short weeks. The flip, Train Song, is considered good fare for country programmers.

## Campus media people meet with GRT promo

GRT press officer Perry Goldberg met November 4 with 45 representatives from Toronto-area campus radio and newspapers to work out a more organized system of presenting record product to the campus markets. GRT is also distributing radio documentaries about GRT artists to campus radio stations.

Goldberg, with a good deal of recent experience with campus radio, says the response was good; and some of the campus people want to set up a joint campus board to receive and distribute record product in a systematic manner.

They decided to meet on a regular basis and set the next meet for December 2.



## Label-TV tracking keep Sundown hopping

Vancouver's Foreman & Young flew into Edmonton to finish their album session at Sundown Recorders and cap a busy month. Also in from the coast was Shakedown who completed their first single for Ray Pettiner's Casino label.

Betsy and The Blueboys looked after the final mixes on their new single as did the Edmonton-based Redwing.

Fustukian, who captured a strong Detroit market through CKLW-FM and his Casino single, Wait For The Wagon, is now working on his first album for the label. Country singer Shannon Two Feathers has

taped several tracks and overdubs for his upcoming album and single which is being produced by Wes Dakus. Country producer R. Harlan Smith returned from his promo junket to the east and began work on Larry Gustafson's new album to be released on the Royalty label.

Gord Beattie has just completed the taping of a Gospel album by the Emmanuel Ministries. Also completing sessions were Luis Dimas, working on his single and D. Cameron putting the finishing touches on an album. ITV Production wrapped up their final mix of Roger Whittaker's Edmonton concert.

## Hometown Band bows product, hits U.S. market

The Hometown Band recently issued its first single, Flying (an album of the same name has just hit the racks). The original title of Fear Of Flying had to be dropped because of copyright hassles with the Erica Jong bestseller.

The public has been aware of the group for some time thanks to the Valdy and the

Hometown Band album. A single from that album, Peter And Lou, has just been released in the U.S. and has received favourable plugs in the trades.

Like Valdy, the Hometown Band record for A&M. Along with Valdy, they won over

the A&M brass at the label's annual summer convention in Los Angeles with a showcase performance.

Cliff Jones, the manager of both acts, was instrumental in setting that performance up.

"You don't have a chance if the people plugging your record aren't hot on you."

Jones is not a flamboyant manager and keeps a very low profile.

"I don't want to be hyped. My name's on the cover and that's it. I don't want a stable of artists because then you have to start hiring people and lose control."

Right now, Valdy and The Hometown Band are in the midst of a college tour of the U.S. As a combined package, they offer concertgoers a two hour show. Jones feels that the package format allows for more economic stability than if both artists separately played second and third on the bill at major concerts. To Jones, there are other advantages to the format.

"I went through that rock and roll egomaniac trip, the harsh competition of getting up and blowing so and so off the stage. But when you're an opening act, people can start doing things like pulling plugs out. We can go to the colleges now and not have to open for anyone. This takes the pain out of breaking into the States. I can take a tasteful package in and make things easier." -Richard Skelly

## Bissell's magic show picking up bookings

Bruce Bissell, one time record promotion rep and now doing his own magic trip, has become somewhat in demand throughout the Vancouver area.

Bissell introduced his new brand of magic the first part of this year and has since appeared on several local TV shows as well as theatre dates around town. He was the subject of a story in RPM (Oct 23/76) written by Richard Skelly.

Just recently he played the Bayshore Inn and the Hyatt Regency in Vancouver, the latter in cooperation with CKLG which involved Trooper and a disco-type show. He has also appeared on CKVU-TV, Vancouver's newest television station. His biggest boost came from the CBC-TV when he appeared on the popular Hourglass show.

## Cliff Richard releases set for Soviet Union

Cliff Richard, who scored Canadian gold with his single, Devil Woman, is getting ready to groom another large sized audience. His Rocket label has arranged for the release of two of his albums in the Soviet Union. Richard is no stranger in Russia. He has just completed a three-week concert tour where he played 20 concert dates for more than 90,000 Russians.

The albums to be released are The Best Of Cliff Richard and I'm Nearly Famous. The latter contains his Devil Woman single and has enjoyed 20 weeks of action on the RPM 100 Album chart.

The Russia release was negotiated by Tony King, Executive Vice-President of Rocket and the albums are being released under a licensing agreement between EMI Records and the Russian Department of Foreign Trade, Mezhdunarodnaya Kniga.

A new single release is expected to be making gains by the time the popular duo return to Toronto's club circuit.

Audio Magnetics, manufacturer of blank tapes under brand names of Tracs, Tracs Plus and XHE, has shuffled its Canadian staff.



The Hollies completed the first half of their Canadian tour with two shows at Toronto's Convocation Hall. All of the original members except Graham Nash are now back with the group, including Terry Sylvester and lead vocalist Allan Clarke. As

a result, the vocal harmonies sounded as fresh as they did five and ten years ago. They went through a relaxed and well-paced set, similar to the presentation of the new Hollies Live album. Old and new songs were played, and the audience liked every one. After a dozen years at it, they seem to find it hard to present a weak song. Pete Wingfield, of 18 With A Bullet fame, helped out on keyboards and almost stole the show with his antics at some points.

The last time they played anywhere in Canada publicly (aside from the CBS Convention in Toronto in 1974) was at least six years ago. They have been performing during this time, however, mostly in Europe. Before coming to Canada they had finished a successful tour of Germany, according to Terry Sylvester, who talked with RPM recently. Surprisingly, they have no intention of touring the U.S. in the near future.

Following their Canadian tour, they plan to return to London where they'll rest before an Australian-New Zealand tour in the new year.

The new live album, and a new single called Wiggle That Wotsit, have not been released in the U.S. and may not be for a long time. Their last album, Right On, was never released in either Canada or the U.S. Their manager Robin Britten claims they have little interest in the U.S., but have started dealing separately with CBS Canada, which explains the new album.


Britten explained they have separate contracts in every country they release product in. They are handled in various places by EMI, Polydor and Epic. Britten said that it was the decision of the Epic office in the U.S. not to release Right On or the live album.

Their new album, Russian Roulette, will be released (in Canada at least) in January.

Opening the first half of the Hollies tour was Peter Foldy, performing live for the first time in at least a year. Since signing with manager Buz Wilburn in L.A., things have started to happen for the singer of Bondi Junction fame. This tour was a major break, and Roxanne, still on the RPM chart after 12 weeks, marks his first real chart success in three years. Last week Capitol released Julie Anne, a non-original by Martin/Coulter from Britain.

Capitol got behind Foldy on the tour, and several reps including Scoot Irwin, national publicity officer Karen Ball and Mike Docker of the A&R department accompanied Foldy on some of the dates which included Ottawa, Sudbury, Hamilton and Toronto. Foldy told RPM that the second Hamilton date was most successful for him. "I'm really sorry it's all over," Foldy said. "I could go on forever if I had great musicians with me like I did this time."

Extensive radio promotions were launched in Sudbury and Hamilton. Roxanne reached the number two spot on Hamilton's CKOC's chart during the summer, and the station will be featuring Foldy on their chart back page in conjunction with the contest. The contest involves daily phone-ins. (The Sudbury station used a write-in). A final winner is drawn from the daily qualifiers, each of whom receive a copy of Roxanne and an autographed picture. The final winner is entitled to dinner with Foldy.

# Yamaha song festival hits Tokyo stage, TV

Forty-six entries from 30 countries will be performed November 19-21 on stage in Tokyo's Nippon Budokan Hall in the finals of the Yamaha World Popular Song Festival.


Thirty-eight of the 46 finalists are entries from countries outside of Japan -

selected by festivals and tape judging in contests in their own countries, sponsored by local branch plants of the huge Yamaha conglomerate. There are no entries from Canada.

A spokesman for Yamaha Canada ex-

plained that organizing a festival is a major undertaking and Yamaha's promotion department here hasn't had the involvement with the creative side of the music industry or the input from Canadian publishers to get one started here -- though they would

like to.

In Japan, the world-wide festival has the support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Tokyo Metropolitan Government, Japan Air Lines, Yamaha Motor Corporation and more than 30 other Japanese corporations.

All entries in the festival must be composed solely for festival competition and never before recorded.

Highlighting the festivities in Tokyo are Splinter, a group produced by ex-Beatle George Harrison; French star Gerard Lenorman; Catherine Ferry, second-place winner at the recent Eurovision Song Contest; Italian star Gianni Morandi; Mary Christy, third-place winner at Eurovision; and Guruh Sukarno Putra, son of the late Indonesian president.

Yamaha will award grand prizes to a Japanese and a foreign entry in each of four categories: Grand Prix (\$5,000, U.S.), Most Outstanding Performance (\$2,000), Outstanding Composition (\$1,000), and Outstanding Performance (\$500).

The panel of 22 judges is headed by Yamaha Music Foundation president Genichi Kawakami. The festival will be broadcast live on Japanese radio and television.

Winners will tour five major Japanese cities following the festival.

With all the publicity involved, over six million records have been sold in Japan of songs introduced at the past six festivals.

## Cooper focal point of Eaton's promo

WEA Canada is collaborating with Eaton's Canada in a promotional contest involving Alice Cooper. To draw some of the youth market to their record departments, Eaton's has arranged a special draw which will see the first prize winner being flown by Air Canada to Los Angeles sometime in the new year for dinner with "exciting rock star" Alice Cooper at his new restaurant. The contest is being held at Eaton's stores all over southern Ontario, and is being accompanied by a promo push on CFTR Toronto and a price reduction on Alice Cooper product at Eaton's stores, WEA national promotion manager Larry Green told RPM.

## Rocket's Richards, Dee get big sales awards

MCA (Canada) has certified Rocket label Don't Go Breaking My Heart, by Kiki Dee, platinum in Canada, with 150,000 sales; and Cliff Richard's Devil Woman as gold, with its more than 75,000 sales here.

It's Kiki Dee's first platinum single ever, and Richard's first gold record in Canada.

Rocket brass in Los Angeles have announced a new marketing campaign for Richard's I'm Nearly Famous LP. The album cover has been redesigned and posters, tee shirts and buttons will be used to supplement print, radio and TV advertising and in-store display efforts.

Cry, the Cooper single, and said that it had been released in September and was a late starter. He said the new LP, Alice Cooper Goes To Hell, has been a consistent seller.

There is a new Alice Cooper documentary available produced by Warner Brothers in Los Angeles. The two-hour special, based on interviews with the artist, has been firmed for airing on Montreal's CHOM-FM. Others interested can contact Larry Green.

## New single, debut LP due from Jackson Hawke

CBS is releasing a new single by Jackson Hawke, entitled She's The One. This is the second single for the group, although You Can't Dance received a double life with airplay of the flip, Into The Mystic.

Terry McGee, press officer for CBS, told RPM that a debut LP from the group would also be released in the next few weeks, and that a heavy promotion campaign would be launched to accompany the Bob Gallo production. The LP is entitled Forever.

## U.A.'s Keath Barrie gets U.S. LP release

United Artists has released Keath Barrie's new album, Reach Out, in the U.S. This marks the first time the singer has had a U.S. release.

## Baby for Curtola hubby for Marie

Bobby Curtola recently gave birth to his initial album release for RCA, Stickin' With Beautiful Things, and will soon be the proud father of his first born. Curtola's wife Ava, who is part of his show, is pregnant and expecting in June. Ava is the daughter of Curtola's manager Marie Martell.

Martell, who has been associated with the Curtola career from the beginning, dating back to the late 50s, recently announced her engagement to Toni Soderberg, an electrical engineer who makes his home in Stockholm, Sweden. Martell, who has taken a six month leave of absence from her business, is currently in Sweden. No date has been set for the marriage but it is rumoured to be a June wedding - on the high seas.

## Pol's Strawbs postpone Canadian dates till Dec

Lori Bruner, Polydor National Promotion Manager, has announced that the Canadian dates of the Strawbs tour have been postponed until December. The band, who have just recorded their first Polydor LP after several on A&M, was scheduled to play Hamilton, Guelph, Toronto, and Montreal at the end of October.



There are also the novelty songs, like Laurel And Hardy and Country Joe And The Groupie. Opening the album are several quieter tunes, like Melanie, which feature Millar's voice in a solo setting.





# Now it's Moe "The Jungle Man" Koffman

Moe Koffman's new GRT LP, Jungle Man, is not a jazz album, Koffman says, although Canada's top flute and reed player still sees himself as a jazz musician.

"The songs on the album are like my jazz pieces, but we did something different to make it more palatable to record buyers and radio stations."

Koffman enjoyed his biggest hit 20 years ago when his simple flute tune, Swinging Shepherd Blues (a jazz-inspired MOR number) was on pop charts around the

world. But throughout his career Koffman's biggest-selling records have been his light-jazz arrangements of themes from classical music.

His Live At George's LP (released last year) was mostly MOR, but that's not the direction he's taking with the new LP, he says.

"We used contemporary funky rhythms with a rock rhythm section, and wrote most of the tunes especially for this LP," Koffman said in an interview after he finished taping one of his daily appearances with the band on CBC's noon-hour Bob McLean Show. "But it's not just that we want to gain a new audience -- at the same time I like the music."

"I used to play most of my music in simple 4/4 rhythms with some Bossa Nova beats," he explained, "but a lot of radio stations won't play that jazz sound. We added the new touch and are getting airplay."

The differences among commercial jazz, rock, and MOR music today, are, Koffman maintains, mostly with the rhythms used.

Koffman's quintet is booked most of the time and is especially accepted on the campus circuit. Ironically, with his move to a newer sound, he finds the younger audiences are more interested in his adaptations of classical music. Perhaps his versatility has bridged the gap between what his live audiences like and what radio stations will play.

Koffman, one of the most financially successful Canadian musicians, earns the greater part of his living through work other than his own recordings.

He's one of the most engaged session men in Toronto, and he plays regularly on TV shows like Bob McLean's daily show,

Front Page Challenge and in many of the current CBC Superspecials.

With the recent growth of movie and TV production in Toronto there are new work opportunities for many local music writers and performers -- and Koffman has cashed in there as well.

"As far as musicians are concerned, Toronto is where New York was 10 years ago," he said, "10 or 15 years ago there were only a few dozen good musicians here, now there are hundreds." But he recognizes there is a small set of musicians who get the lion's share of the work and play regularly in bands which are often various combinations of the same performers.

"It's not a clique, it's just that the best players are very busy."

Members of his quintet can be found in other trios and quartets in Toronto's jazz clubs and their names appear regularly among the credits on dozens of Toronto-produced records. But his quintet is their first call.

He can't offer them 100 per cent employment, so he has to book well in advance to account for other engagements they each must play. Koffman takes care of his own booking and business matters.

Despite his other musical commitments Koffman is quite serious about his recording career: "Records are very important. You need an LP a year to keep your name alive. Radio play reaches millions of people."

GRT is releasing It's All Right, a Jim Capaldi tune, as the first single from the LP. All of the other LP cuts were written by Koffman, Bob Mann or Doug Riley. Koffman says they tracked It's All Right with an AM-oriented single in mind.

**"One Day At A Time"** by Anthony Fawcett (Grove Press) by Ritchie Yorke

For years a stream of superstar rock musicians have been wailing about the planetary predicament, the lack of freedom in the free enterprise system and the hazards of the nuclear horror stockpile. You will have no doubt noticed that there has not been a shortage of rock spokesmen testifying to the insidious dilemma of the war children and clamoring for change. Hardly an issue of any rock publication drops off the press without some kind of anti-establishment rap by a prominent rock star.

The tragedy is that so few of the biggies have taken advantage of their positions to flog the message through shrewd investment and intellect. Over the past decade, even the casual observer of rock can hardly fail to have noticed the mountains of rap and ravines of action. Talk remains cheap and action is rare indeed. If you're going to mouth off against the establishment then you should at least put your money where your mouth is. Pity that so few have.

John Lennon, unquestionably, has been one of a very select few who had the guts to haul himself out of the poppy-starred pits of self-indulgence to make an honest effort to turn the world around. Never mind that he didn't succeed: the fact that he actually tried gives him ten out of ten. In the conscience-starved mentality of big-time rock, Lennon is a living legend -- an artist who had the balls to take the bull by the horns. And that's not even considering his pioneering musical prowess.

John Lennon is a unique and sensitive artist with notable compassion -- a view which is solidly substantiated in the just-published biography by Anthony Fawcett, "John Lennon: One Day At A Time" (Grove Press). I have no qualms whatsoever in recommending Fawcett's book to every student and aficionado of rock. It is an absorbing account of a man who is probably the most fascinating character in the entire history of rock music.

This book concentrates on the period 1968-70 when the author was employed as special assistant to John and Yoko. It provides an insider's insight and perspective on Lennon's day to day life, his aspirations both as an artist and as a human being. The book takes us behind the scenes where the real action was during this traumatic stage in the Beatles' career.

In some ways, this book is a highly relevant requiem to the idealism and deflated dreams of the Sixties. It provides the first detailed documentation of John and Yoko's unique anti-war media campaign -- from its beginnings in the "Acorn Event" at Coventry Cathedral in 1968 through the ill-fated Toronto Peace Festival of 1970. Through it all, one thing remains abundantly clear -- John and Yoko were genuinely dedicated to the cause of peace and devoted all of their time and energy to promoting

the concept wherever possible.

"One Day At A Time" (the title comes from the Lennon song on the *Mind Games* album) gets the reader right inside the most serious attempt thus far to utilize rock music as an instrument of social change. It shows where John and Yoko were coming from and where they hoped to go with their *War Is Over If You Want It* campaign. It is, in effect, a daily diary of the highly significant Lennon-led peace movement.

The book also offers the most revealing report yet published of the final days of the Beatles, involving Allen Klein, Abbey Road, Phil Spector, *Let It Be* and the lifestyle at Apple Corps. While earlier authors have either reprinted third-hand rumors or tried to guess at what went down, Fawcett was right there as it happened and tells the tale with a reporter's nose for detail and direction.

Considering that Anthony Fawcett has not written professionally since the mid-60s (when he was an art critic for several

prestigious publications), he has enshrined his unique experiences in this book with remarkable verve and dimension. Never mind that he was sometimes slightly overwhelmed by the powerful Lennon presence -- he lays his points down with conviction and studious clarity.

The quality paperback format of the book has allowed for an excellent pictorial history of John and Yoko. Among the Lennon picture-takers in the book are David Gahr, Bob Gruen, Annie Leibovitz, David Nutter, Ethan Russell and Annette Yorke. Fawcett has also dug deep into his personal archives for a stunning array of Lennon drawings and assorted memorabilia.

Certainly this is the most articulate book so far on a man who is without question among the most misunderstood figures of rock history. It is a highly worthwhile account of an artist who sincerely tried to change an insane world, instead of just talking about it. As such, it is an important addition to the literary account of rock's evolution, musical and otherwise.

## Symphonic Slam to make Dec debut in Toronto

A&M and Symphonic Slam's management have announced the group will perform live for the first time at a special public showcasing December 17 at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre in Toronto.

The group has not yet performed in their present three-man format and have spent most of their time recording or rehearsing. They are trying to avoid the usual barroom club circuit due to the nature of their act. Between Timo Laine's polyphonic guitar synthesizer and related gadgets, David Stone's nine keyboards and Jan Uvena's drum set, they carry four tons of instruments and equipment -- and that doesn't include the light and P.A. systems.

Drummer Uvena is a newcomer from L.A., and has only been with the group a few weeks. He replaces John Lowry, who performed on the LP.

Their first album, *Symphonic Slam*, has been on the RPM chart for eight weeks. It is a sound best suited for FM airplay, but A&M is considering releasing a single, possibly *I Won't Cry*. The album has been or is

Off-The-Wall's Chris Mercer told RPM he and partner Kim Kelly will book a few more Monday-night shows in December and then look to regular Monday night concerts at the theatre, owned by Famous Players.

# Curtola - 10 years later

It's been over ten years since we heard songs like Indian Giver, Hitchhiker, Destination Love, Fortune Teller, Gypsy Heart, Aladdin, Little Girl Blue and many more. The man who made these songs into giant hits for a total of 32 top ten records before the Beatles is, of course, Canada's Bobby Curtola. Way back then he was billed as Mr. Personality, Canada's answer to Elvis and more. Bobby was the first Canadian artist to become a star in his own country. The response to his recordings was so great they were released with equal success throughout the world. Curtola was the first Canadian pop artist to break into the national jingle field, (Remember the Coca Cola jingle) and the first to record a million selling LP. Well, as I said, that was over 10 years ago. What has happened to Bobby Curtola since those days as a teen idol? I asked him that question when he was appearing at the Stardust Cabaret in Victoria with his band and his lovely wife Anna Maria. The first thing Curtola did when the Beatles started taking over the music business was to go into nightclub work and up till now Curtola has played Las Vegas about 6 months of the year and toured throughout the U.S. and Canada the rest of the time. He proudly insists on being billed as Canada's Bobby Curtola because he says he made it here "and you should never forget where you started from."

The first shock I got when I met Curtola after ten years was that he remembered me and things we had done. It was as if those ten years had never happened. I was the fan and he was the star with the friendly manner and warm appeal he always had. He is obviously a little older, a lot wiser and more professional a performer than he was but

he loves life, the music business and he is sweet to be real, I say he is sweet because he still has that bubbling enthusiasm for the music business and life he always had. Bobby Curtola, when he talks about the music business still gets excited. He told me that at times he still can't believe what has happened to him. He is humble, yet has the confidence to know what he can do as a performer. He talks about his wife of one year with the same excitement and happiness as he does the music business. Anna Maria travels with Curtola and is gradually being worked into the show and when the two of them sing Charlie Rich's Behind Closed Doors, it is like they are giving you a tiny glimpse into their fairytale life. They are happy as anyone can tell and they are not afraid to show it to anybody. Someone once said to me that Bobby Curtola was too

doing what he really loves to do entertain, and he loves his wife. You would be sweet too with his attitude. He is like a kid with a new toy, not jaded in any way but as he told me "someone told him once that to make it you had to be real," and when you see him on stage or off he is exactly the same, a hell of a nice guy.

Curtola's career has come full circle from recording to nightclub work back to recording again. He has two singles out now with RCA Victor Records Oh Marie and Stickin with the Beautiful People and a new album. He is writing many of the songs he is recording now, developing a new side of Bobby Curtola and of course touring Canada saying hello to his old friends and fans who are turning out in sellout numbers wherever he goes.

## GRT singles for Thomas, Mac & Mac & Downchild

GRT is set to release an LP by controversial off-colour comics MacLean and MacLean before Christmas. The LP was produced by Jack Richardson and includes a featured performance by Burton Cummings, who's with CBS' Portrait label.

The label is also releasing another single from Ian Thomas' Calabash LP -- Right Before Your Eyes -- set for simultaneous U.S. release on the Chrysalis label. Downchild have remixed the Caladonea cut from their year-old GRT LP to add current lead singer Hawk Walsh, who replaced Tony Flame last year after Flame sang the vocal on the LP.

## Reverberi: there's gold in the classics

Looking for a few old tunes to bring back one more time?

How about Chopin's Improvviso Fantasia (1834) or Beethoven's Pathetique (1798).

Italian arranger-pianist Gian Piero Reverberi cut those tunes with contemporary instruments and rhythms, and stations like Toronto's CKFM and CHUM-FM are playing them and others off Reverberi's two LPs and two singles which United Artist released in Canada this year.

"I don't want to put out just the easy and familiar melodies of the famous composers," Reverberi told RPM in an interview while in Toronto recently, "I'm looking for the themes that now sound the most contemporary."

"The language of their music is much the same as the language of music today; but many young people hear Chopin with-

out the rhythms and bass they are used to, and they get bored and don't have the feeling to appreciate this music."

Reverberi is of the opinion that too often, producers just raid the classics for easy and proven melodies, and too often an entire symphonic theme is compressed into one simple song. He tries to go the other way -- find a strong, perhaps 40-second piano piece he can develop into a five-minute recording with an arrangement for a full orchestra.

United Artists released Reverberi's first LP, Reverberi, in January, and a second, Timer, last summer. Pathetique (Addagio Contabile della Sonata) was edited from a cut on the first LP and released as a single. Second single Improvviso Fantasia came from the second LP.

Both singles and LPs have been doing well in the Montreal area, and on a recent trip through North America Reverberi stayed a few days in Montreal, performing twice on television and giving radio and press interviews in French and in English.

In New York he met Scott Muni, a major DJ who has been introducing Reverberi's music to adult and top-40 audiences there.


Gotta Be A Blues Day is the first solo LP for perhaps Canada's first female country-outlaw recording artist.

Her personal life, according to the liner notes, has seen her survive some hard times -- including prison -- but her music is still unreformed heartaches and booze.

The production is more to the soft side of country-radio music -- lots of strings on most cuts -- and her voice is a bit more restrained than the aggressive approach of most singers of the kind of music she sings and writes.

The LP took two years to produce and get out. One cut, *Lila's Child*, was released as a single in early 1975.

She wrote all but two of the songs -- look for some of her drinking songs (*Pour Me*, *Let Me Sit And Get Stoned*, *All Day Sunday Blues* and the title song) to be being picked by some of the male booze singers on the circuit. Oh yeah, look for her cuts of the same songs showing up on playlists around the country.




Not just an off-the-wall-Loretta-Haggers (of *Mary Hartman* show fame) country spoof, but a serious Brian Ahern production with support from Anne Murray, Dolly Parton and Emmylou Harris. TV show tunes *Vitamin L* and *Baby Boy* are already known, but old-time numbers (like *Settin' The Woods On Fire* and *Get Acquainted Waltz*, -- which she does with Harris) are well chosen and could do well for country programmers.

**KENNY ROGERS**

An all-out and tasteful Nashville production using some of Music City's best studiomen and spiced with pop-style percussion and moog trimmings. Rogers' sometimes-gruff voice does well with some proven standards -- like *Green Green Grass of Home*, and *Son Of Hickory Holler's Tramp*. *Laura* (*What's He Got That I Ain't Got*) is the first single from this, Rogers' second, LP.



## Micmac Audio Creations supplies in-flight music

The November 6, 1976 issue of RPM touched on the acquisition by CKGM Montreal of Air Canada's In-Flight entertainment activity, which only grazed the surface. The company involved with the supplying of In-Flight entertainment to Air Canada is actually Micmac Audio Creations, a subsidiary company owned by Maisonneuve Broadcasting of Montreal. The Corporation also owns radio stations CKGM and CHOM-FM. Jim Sward is the president of Micmac and general manager of CKGM.

The programming for the In-Flight Audio Entertainment is a joint effort between CKGM and CHOM-FM. Craig Cutler, general manager of Micmac, informed RPM that "We feel that in combination, both stations have the substantial amount of energy and necessary expertise to provide the best In-Flight Audio Entertainment available." Cutler also pointed out that "Micmac does, whenever it is to the advantage of our product, use out-of-house talent so that each area of this programming and production is directly suited to an individual's expertise." The facilities of both CKGM and CHOM-FM are used in the production of programmes.

Integral members in the design of Micmac's staff include: CKGM's Tom McLean, Greg Stewart, Sandy Sanderson, Ralph Lockwood, Julie Anna and Rob

## Schwarz & Nighmusic forced to part company

MacLean and MacLean, the folk duo who made local news with their Ontario Liquor Board fight a few months ago, have bounced back into the news. They appeared on Rainer Schwarz' Nighmusic Show (Friday Nov 5/76) which is seen across Ontario on the province's TV network, and apparently did their "usual thing" which, in this case, was described as using "obscenities to disparage Germans and Jews."

Although it was obvious what was transpiring no one threw the switch but producer Richard Johnson apparently had the last word and will continue the series without Schwarz.

That Nov 5 date also saw FM Productions' first video concert on the ill-fated Schwarz show. The background music was FM's redefining of the sound of electric violin, mandolin and bass guitar along with items that chimed and tinkled and then mixed them with synthesizers, sequencers and various signal processors.

FM Productions is a Toronto-based firm.

## CRTC asks broadcasters to assess UHF-TV needs

The CRTC is calling for submissions from the broadcast community on the potential broadcast use of the part of the radio-TV frequencies band now reserved almost entirely for UHF television.

The commission has already received submissions from the concerned public, and now wants broadcasters to project their needs for the CRTC to prepare for a 1979 World Administrative Radio Conference which will review all frequency spectrum allocations.

UHF television has become essential in many urban areas, but there has been some question of the need for as many stations as are reserved for such TV broadcasting.

The frequency band in question is the entire 406-960 MHz band, of which 470-890 MHz has been reserved for UHF TV.


## New Quebec FM station needs free-access show

All universities or colleges in Ontario and Quebec that have broadcast programmes with the Association were eligible.

Taking the award for the best half-hour television documentary was Kitchener/Waterloo's Conestoga College. The producer of the documentary was George Dyke a 1976 graduate. Assistance was given the project by Don Willcox of Central Ontario Television and Wayne Currie of the Global Television Network.

The Fanshawe team took top honours for the best half-hour radio documentary.

The awards were presented at the CCBA Convention which was held recently at Ottawa's Skyline Hotel.

## CRTC hearing set for Toronto

The CRTC meets at Toronto's Sheraton Centre December 7 to discuss an application by Channel Seventy nine Ltd. (Toronto independent TV station) to issue and transfer a total of 45 per cent of its common shares and 62.5 per cent of the firm's special shares to Montreal's Multiple Access Ltd., and amendments to CHML's broadcast licence among 30 applications from broadcasters for new, renewed and amended licences.

CHML Hamilton has applied to the CRTC to move its transmitter closer to both the Toronto and Kitchener markets, and to increase its transmission power to 50,000 watts from its present 5,000 watt capacity. CHML broadcasts mostly MOR music dur-


ing the day and country music in Johnny Murphy's 9 p.m. - midnight spot. Toronto country station CFGM doesn't reach a lot of the city market during the evening hours, and country station CKFH often broadcasts hockey and baseball games in the evenings.

The move to acquire an interest in Channel Seventy nine is the first move into the Toronto broadcast market for Multiple Access, which owns Montreal's CFCF radio and TV and Champlain Productions, which in turn runs Rising Records.

The commission will also hear the first part of the deputations concerning the transfer of control of seven B.C. and Ontario cable firms to Rogers Telecommunications Ltd. from Premier Cablevision: Borden Cablevision (Camp Borden - Alliston area) Keeble Cable (Downsview and Mississauga), Oakville Cable and York Cable (Toronto) in Ontario; Canadian Wirevision (Vancouver) Coquitlam Cablevision and Victoria Cablevision in B.C.

The second part of the hearing will be in Vancouver, January 25.

## CBC-TV launches serious-music season

CBC TV Music, the network's higher-brow music division, launched its flagship series, *Musicamera*, last week with Norman Campbell's production of the National Ballet performing *Giselle*, just two-days before The National's 25th anniversary performance.

The Wednesday-night, 9-10:30 p.m. series runs until April, and features a mixed bag of 30, 60 and 90-minute highbrow and popular music presentations, 70 per cent of them produced in Canada.

January 19 the series presents a one-hour survey of music in Canada with a look at artists like Glenn Gould, Beau Dommage, The Canadian Brass, Paul Horn and Murray Schafer.

The 26-show, 16-week series is part of the continuing policy to build audiences for a season of regularly-scheduled serious-music programs, TV music chief John Barnes told RPM. In earlier years, many of the high-brow music and drama specials were one-time programmes pre-empting normal scheduling.

The series includes at least a few productions which should be getting some international attention. Vancouver's Neil Sutherland produced two one-hour programmes set for March telecasts - *They All Play Ragtime* and *Fritz Kreisler* - which should be of interest almost anywhere. *Ragtime*, shot in New Orleans, New York, St. Louis and San Francisco, is a history of the now re-emerging high-pop style. Kreisler is the biography of the late Viennese-American violinist; with participation from Isaac Stern, Yehudi Menuhin and Eugene Ormandy.

The series ends with a one-hour salute to Vincent Youmans, U.S. pop composer of standards like *Tea For Two* and *Through The Years*.

The season includes appearances by the Atlantic and Edmonton Symphony Orchestras; a half-hour special on Boot Records' recording artist Liona Boyd (November 17); Aquitaine Records' Raffi Armenian leading the Stratford Festival Ensemble playing ragtime by Stravinsky (January 19); and a Christmas opera set in Toronto's Cabbagetown.

The series also includes programs produced in Germany and Austria and a Norwegian-produced documentary on the dramatic life of Russian dancer Vaslav Nijinsky.

Barnes explained he shops for foreign-produced specials when the CBC-produced programmes are near completion. Purchasing quality international productions, he added, is part of the TV-music programming policy.

TV music may now be buying a bit more than it is selling abroad, Barnes said, but recent deals with the U.S. Public Broadcasting System and in Europe and Australia gives Barnes an encouraging view of the long-term balance sheet.

In addition to buying and selling in the international marketplace, TV music co-produces some specials with foreign producers. *Bold As Brass* (December 15), which centres on two Canadian brass bands



at a festival in Wales, was co-produced with a London firm. Barnes said it's just cheaper than sending CBC crews over there.

The *Musicamera* series will be broken up by high-brow non-musical programming in the same time slot to fill out a season sandwiched between the end of Wednesday-night baseball in October and the first pitch again in April.



CJBK Radio will soon be moving into new facilities. Construction on the new \$600,000 building began this month. It will be twice the size of their present facilities, which have been getting a little cramped.

### LONDON

A new CBC-FM station in London will broadcast all national and regional programming of the AM network except during the morning and afternoon drive periods, usually slotted for local programming. In lieu of local programming, the station will carry programming from CBC-FM in Toronto to Monday-Friday, 6-9 a.m. and 4-6 p.m.

The step is part of the public network's plan to replace affiliate stations with owned-and-operated CBC stations in many secondary markets.


