

CRIA announces Pavilion Theatre performances

The Canadian Recording Industry Association has announced the complete lineup for the Pavilion Theatre concerts inside the CRIA Pavilion at the Canadian National Exhibition August 17 to September 5.

Performances are scheduled by Malcolm, Polydor's Goddo and WEA group Wireless August 17, David Wiffen, Dixie Flyers and A&M's Cano (18), a multicultural program with CHIN Radio hosting (19), Skyline's Wenzday, Capitol's Bill Amesbury and GRT's Ian Thomas (20), Axe group Great Rufus Road Machine, Quality's Bruce Murray and Polydor's Gary & Dave (21), CFGM Radio's Opry North (22), a night of classical music (23), Major Hoople Boarding House, GRT's The Hunt and Anthem's Foot In Cold Water (24), Manohar artist Brent Titcomb, Nick group Stringband and True North's Ronney Abramson (25), a Canadian Talent Library evening sponsored by CKFM (26), GRT's John Ellison, Polydor's Stratavarius and Quality's Sweet Blindness (27), RCA acts

Family Brown, Carlton Showband and Carroll Baker (28), U.A.'s Keath Barrie and Capitol's Suzanne Stevens (29), Posterty artist Doug McArthur, Woodshed artist David Essig and London group Lougarou (30), Springwater's Graham Townsend and Capitol artists Colleen Peterson and Ray Griff (31), Dennis Lepage with Woodshed artists Willie P. Bennett and the Original Sloth Band (September 1), a jazz evening featuring Moe Koffman (2), WEA's Christopher Ward, A&M's Charity Brown and CBS group Bond (3), Royalty artists Fjellgard and R. Harlan Smith with RCA's Ronnie Prophet (4), and Polydor's Rose with U.A. group Lavender Hill Mob and Rising's Lisa Hartt Band (5).

In addition, there will be a special August 16 preview in the theatre for news media and exhibitors with entertainment featuring Keath Barrie.

Shows run approximately from 6:30 to 10:30 p.m. Dates and acts are subject to change.

RPM Magazine tops all trades in Canada

Attic Records promo mailing "Under The Eaves" reported recently on their trade magazine survey which was conducted by them across Canada. The survey found that "more people receive RPM than any other trade (magazine)". A U.S. trade magazine stood second in the survey.

In the report, Attic states "What really surprised us is how few receive some of the publications and how many stations had never even heard of some of them."

RPM has been publishing for 13 years

and our own survey revealed that with few exceptions every radio station in Canada receives RPM each week. RPM also maintains a controlled circulation outside of Canada of approximately 500 hitmaking radio station music directors. This foreign distribution has been maintained by RPM for the last six years in an effort to promote Canadian recordings outside of Canada.

Another survey of record dealers conducted by SRO indicated that RPM was at the top of the list.

Direction signs Montreal's Workman

John J. Williams of Direction Records has announced the signing of Billy Workman as the first in a series of new signings. Workman, former lead guitarist/vocalist with Michel Pagliaro, is a native of Mississippi who has been living in Montreal for a number of years. His sister Nanette Workman is already an established act in Quebec.

In its first few months of existence, the Montreal-based label has experienced success with a number of singles, particularly in the Toronto and Montreal disco scene, with reports of unit sales over 10,000 each

for product by Gloria Spring, Jackie Robinson, Bumblebee Unlimited, Amanda Lear and Kebekelektrik. A number of albums have also been released, including the first English language product by Quebec notable Yvon Deschamps.

Other Direction signings include New York cabaret and concert band Gotham, Toronto singer and bandleader Grant Smith, and Atlanta R&B act Crystal Brandy. Product from all three acts is slated for release within the next two months.

Canadian Recording Studio Directory in preparation

RPM's annual Canadian Recording Studio Directory will appear in the July 30th edition.

This directory of recording studios across Canada includes information on personnel, studios size, equipment, hours and rates and is a valuable reference to record companies and producers.

In the fall of the year, this information is updated and used in the RPM Canadian Music Industry Directory.

Forms are currently in the mail to studios across Canada asking them to update their information for this important issue.

New studios or studios that might not have replied to last year's forms are asked to phone or write to RPM and request that information be sent to them.


The deadline for this issue has been set for July 8th with copies available on July 18th which will be dated July 23rd.

Meanwhile, Martel takes over Guilbert's place as Eastern Promotion Manager. His territory will include Quebec, Ottawa and Kingston.



I just answered a telephone that was invented (we are told) in the U.S. I'm surrounded by things that are foreign. So far the only thing I've spotted in my office that is Canadian is my copy of *The Canadian Establishment* by Peter C. Newman. Why should we believe in anything that's wholly Canadian?

But then you look at the record business and suddenly you realize that Attic is Canadian. Most of the records that RPM has been writing about for 13 years are Canadian and more and more compositions that are being recorded in Canada are Canadian and we see something that 13 years ago didn't exist.

When RPM began, we were told that the combined circulation of both U.S. music trade magazines was 1000 copies. We were told that the Canadian record industry amounted to about 2000 potential subscribers and when we got that many, we had everybody.

Thirteen years later we can boast about a circulation of just under 5000 (and we really can't hit that 5000 figure).

So the industry has grown and the

Canadian industry struggles to even get bigger.

Someone once said that records and movies are the best vehicles to promote Canadianism. Records are still the most convenient form of nationalism and isn't it surprising that Secretary of State and the other departments of government take very little interest in Canadian recordings?

Thirteen years ago, the concepts of promotion were far from what they are today. Most promotion men also did sales. Trade promotion didn't exist. There wasn't a weekly source of information on the industry. The few groups that recorded could do little more than ask a local station to play their records. There was no weekly trade chart that would indicate the success or failure of a Canadian record. Very simply, there were no hits and even more simply it was embarrassing to put out a Canadian record.

Less than 5% of the records sold in North America were sold in Canada.

There was a need for a Canadian trade weekly and RPM met that need.

U.S., South African release for A&M's Raes

New single *Que Sera Sera* by A&M recording artists Robbie & Cherrill Rae has been slated for an early July U.S. release. Recently out in Canada, the single was added at Toronto's CFTR and CJBK London in its first week. The single is also slated for a South African release on the RPM label (no relation).

Robbie Rae, a native of Wales, began his career managed by Gordon Mills (Tom Jones, Engelbert Humperdinck) and recorded with MAM. He achieved a major U.K. hit with a cover of *The Lord's Prayer*, which reported sales of 200,000. Now based in Toronto with wife Cherrill, a St. Thomas, Ontario native, they are managed by Artists Management Associates, a division of Dixon-

Props.

The duo have toured extensively throughout North America, doing primarily resort work. Booking is being handled through major New York-based agency ICM. Negotiations are currently under way for appearances on the Johnny Carson and Merv Griffin shows on U.S. network television.

Another AMA-managed act, Toronto-based Mighty Pope, has also achieved a U.S. single release with *Heaven On The Seventh Floor*, out June 14 on the Private Stock label. RCA is releasing the single in Canada on the 22nd. RCA is also finishing graphics for his debut album, due for release in Canada in August.

Travelling Youth Disco opens in Toronto

David Horner has recently opened a new large disco offering the youth of the city of Toronto a place to go for an enjoyable, trouble-free evening. Called Opus, it is Canada's largest youth disco, operating from three different sites in the Toronto area on a once-a-week basis. The disco takes place in Scarborough at 991 Kennedy Road every Friday, the Thornhill Community Centre on Sundays and St. Mary's Hall in Mississauga every Wednesday. Times run from 7:30 to 11:30 p.m. and admission is three dollars.

The opening, which took place Friday, June 10, featured CFTR disc jockey Paul

Godfrey, who announced afterwards that he would be sitting in frequently in the future.

The recorded music is played on cassette but Horner will also have a turntable present for co-operative promotions with record companies. Jerry Hochberg of Motown reports he is already interested in such promotions, and that he is impressed with the quality of the set up, particularly with the lighting system and the professional attitude of the management.

Hochberg also notes if the project is successful, Horner intends to move his equipment into the studio for a television special.

Eleventh annual Picnic set for Toronto Island

The eleventh annual International Picnic has been slated for Toronto's Centre Island July 1 through the 3rd. The picnic is recognized by the Guinness Book of World Records as "the world's largest and most successful free get-together". Highlighted at the picnic will be entertainment, food, contests, fun and, for the first time, a wedding.

Among the stages featuring ethnic entertainment are entries from Italy, the West Indies, Native People, Germany, Portugal and French Canada. Contests and awards include the Molson Folklore Award for best adult performing cultural dance, a polka competition, a Miss Bikini pageant, a limbo competition, a best picnic photograph contest and a Schneiders Sweepstakes offering a free trip to Frankfurt.

Bob Morten heads up CIRPA for 1977/78 term

Bob Morten has been elected to head up the Canadian Independent Record Producers' Association (CIRPA) for the 1977 and 1978 term. Doug Hill of Phase One, takes on the Vice-Presidency chores with Jeff Smith of Inter-Production as Secretary/Treasurer.

Other Board Members are Harvey Glatt of Ottawa's Treble Clef, Three Hats' Willi Morrison and Vic Wilson of SRO.

Buffalo station WBEN-FM (Rock 102) is also presenting a rock program featuring Canadian groups: The Ian Thomas Band (GRT), Lisa Hartt Band (Rising), Wireless (WEA) and Paul Clinch and Choya (Realistic). GRT's Ishan People will also be on hand at the West Indian stage.

CBC's French Network station CJBC will be broadcasting events live from the Island (July 1) as part of the salute to National Unity Day.

The International Picnic is being organized by Toronto's Johnny Lombardi, President of CHIN Radio.

Attic's Gallant, Hardy to appear on July 1 show.

Attic Records reports two Attic artists, Patsy Gallant and Hagood Hardy, are slated for appearances on a four-hour CBC television special on July 1, Canada Day. The program is being aired live from a number of sites throughout Canada. Gallant will perform on Parliament Hill in Ottawa, and Hardy will be appearing from the Ontario Place Forum. There will be a number of other performers in the program, including Anne Murray.

According to Attic, CBC is predicting a total viewing audience of six million people.

WEA tops RPM's singles charts in June

For the 18th consecutive month, WEA Music topped the RPM Top 100 Singles chart for total chart listings in the month of June. In the four June issues of RPM, WEA singles appeared on the chart a total of 84 times, for an average of 21 chart singles per week.

CBS Records, which slipped below third place last month for the first time in the 18-month study, rallied to overtake Capitol and GRT for second spot with 59 chart singles. Capitol, which had held second since March, slipped to third with 55, and GRT to fourth with 36.

RCA finished fifth with 26 chart singles, edging out Polydor and A&M, which tied for sixth with 25 chart listings each.

In the top 25, WEA rallied for the strongest month ever since the survey began, and finished with 34 listings over the four weeks, for an 8.5 average. Capitol finished very strongly in second with 26, totalling 60 percent of all top 25 singles between the two distributors. Finishing a distant third was Motown, which placed eight of its 14 total listings in the top 25. GRT finished fourth with seven, followed by RCA with six.

Phonodisc's Frontenac releases first single


Phonodisc's new French Canadian label, Frontenac, has released their first single and is expecting smash sales. Rush released is the new Gilles Girard et Super Classels song, *Les Trois Cloches*. Actually, this is a re-working of an old hit by Girard from the late 60's when his group, Les Classels, were the biggest seller on the Quebec record racks.

Brought back to produce the session was Ben Kaye, the man responsible for the incredible success of Girard's original group. *Les Trois Cloches* was recorded at Montreal's Studio Six.

Folksinger Lisa Garber returns to tour Canada

Lisa Garber, a well-known personality in the Canadian folk scene, is returning to Ontario from her new Los Angeles home to do a club and festival tour. The tour begins at Ottawa's Festival For The Folks July 1-3, and is followed by dates at the Talbot Inn in London (4-9), Camp Fortune, north of Ottawa (11-12), the University of Waterloo (17), Carlton University in Ottawa (20-23), the Alexandra Hotel in Ottawa (25-30), the Home County Festival in London (August 4-6), and a benefit at the Distress Rape Centre in London (7). Additional dates may be added.

A native of London, Ontario, Garber is known for her own songs and renditions of songs by Canadian writers Dan Hill, Adam Mitchell, and her brothers, Nathan and Victor Garber. She is booked in Canada by Toronto-based Listening House agency.

Warner Bros. signs Toronto's Marc Jordan


Toronto singer-songwriter Marc Jordan has signed a major recording contract with Warner Bros. Records (U.S.). The deal, firmed in Los Angeles, calls for two albums over an 18-month period, options for future albums, and heavy promotion and tour support commitments from the company.

The contract, considered exceptional for a new artist, was negotiated by Toronto lawyer Peter Steinmetz and Jordan's manager Bernie Schaeffer.

Jordan has already begun work on the first album at Sound Lab Studios in Los Angeles. The album is being produced by Garry Katz of Steely Dan fame, and features a number of notables on the sessions. Musicians include Steely Dan co-founder Donald Fagan, drummer Jeff Baccara from Boz Scaggs' band, guitarist Davey Johnstone, formerly with Elton John, Toronto's William (Smitty) Smith, former leader of Motherlode on keyboards, and bassist Chuck Rainey.

Also in Los Angeles on the session are Jordan's regular band members Tony Laviola on bass and Tim Wynveen on guitar and arranger/pianist John Copek.

Jordan took a mid-session break to return briefly to Toronto to announce the deal at a party at local disco Cooley's. He intends to remain living in Toronto.



CBS' Mahogany Rush
signed by The Agency

Toronto-based booking firm The Agency has signed CBS group Frank Marino & Mahogany Rush for exclusive booking representation in Canada. The Montreal-based trio consists of guitarist/leader Marino bassist Paul Harwood and drummer Jim Ayoub.

The group has been together since 1969, and was originally booked by Ed Smeall, now with The Agency. They recorded their first album in 1971 on the Kot'ai label, and joined CBS several years later. CBS has released the group's fifth album World Anthem, their third with CBS.

The trio is an established act in the U.S., having broken out of the Detroit market several years ago. A concert level band, they do most of their work in the U.S. Their last Canadian appearance was on tour across the country with A&M group Nazareth last fall. They are managed by New York firm Leber/Krebs, who also manage such notables as Aerosmith, Ted Nugent and the Blue Oyster Cult.

Smeall reports a concert tour being firmed for headline dates across Canada throughout August and into September, beginning in the Maritimes. The complete itinerary will be announced when dates are finalized.

CAPITAL CANADA THROWS A PARTY

Capitol Records opens new manufacturing plant

Record industry figures from throughout the world were in attendance at the June 15 official opening of the new Capitol Records-EMI of Canada record manufacturing plant. The festivities took place on the plant site, which is located at Capitol's Canadian headquarters in Malton, an outlying suburb of Toronto.

Presiding over the events was Arnold Gosewich, President and Chief Operating Officer of Capitol of Canada, who introduced the special guests at the occasion. Official guests included Ontario Treasurer Darcy McKeough, representing the provincial government of behalf of Premier William Davis, Sir John Read, Chairman of the Board of EMI, and Bhaskar Menon, President and Chief Executive Officer of Capitol Industries-EMI Inc.


Following brief speeches, the four jointly executed the official opening, unveiling a commemorative plaque.

The manufacturing plant has been in operation since June of

1976, when it began to produce singles. Last October marked the first album product from the plant, and the ceremonies marked the beginning of the plant's operation at full capacity with 24 presses, 17 for albums and seven for singles. At this capacity, with 70 employees plus support staff, the plant can accommodate orders for ten million records per year.

The 40,000 square foot facility contains the record manufacturing plant, tape manufacturing plant which includes tape component production and storage space for albums, tapes and inventory materials.


Other notable people in attendance at the opening included Capitol U.S. artists Glen Campbell and Al Martino, Capitol Canadian artists Bill Amesbury, Domenic Troiano, Gene MacLellan and Alec Glover of Conspiracy, and various additional government figures and managers representing other artists. Also on hand were EMI representatives from England, France and Switzerland.

Triumphant tour of Japan for Capitol's Anne Murray

Eight-time Juno Award winning artist Anne Murray recently arrived back in Canada after what has been regarded as a highly successful concert tour of Japan. Ms. Murray visited six cities for eight concerts that sparked incredible reviews from the Japanese press. Following are a few samples of the comments bestowed on the Capitol artist.

"She wove her female sensitivity, softness and mellowness with her skill as a singer, subtly revealing her emotions - the performance came to a close with everyone wrapped up in the good vibes." (Mainichi Newspaper - June 1, 1977).

"Anne Murray's arrival and performances in Japan were wonderfully refreshing, blowing away the gloom of the rainy season." (Sankei Newspaper - June 1, 1977).

"The Canadian singer Anne Murray's concert warmed the hearts of her audience like a summer breeze coming over from North America." (Yomiuri Newspaper - June 6, 1977).

... Anne Murray's concerts have

been tremendously popular, to the point where the audience wouldn't get up to leave even after the final curtain call." (Evening Fuji Newspaper - June 7, 1977).

"... through her skill and richness of emotion and the concert into which she breathed so much life left a refreshing feeling." (Tokyo Times - 1977).

The complete list of cities and concerts for Ms. Murray included Tokyo (2), Osaka (2), Nagoya, Fukuoka, Kumamoto, and Yokahama. Highlights of the tour included the FM broadcast of one of her Tokyo concerts at the Sun Plaza Auditorium, and a press conference held at the Canadian Embassy in Tokyo. Hosted by Ambassador and Mrs. Bruce Rankin, this meeting with the press is a tremendous honour for a visiting entertainer. Various cultural and music industry representatives attended the gathering and speaking through an interpreter, she dazzled reporters.

Kyodo Productions of Japan, promoters of Ms. Murray's tour, claim that no other international artist has been treated with such a high level of respect in the 25 year

history of the company.

Murray received numerous presents from the estimated 20,000 people who saw her. Of the total number, it has been estimated that around 60% were males between the ages of 16 and 22.

All of her fourteen albums have been released in Japan, including her Greatest Hits LP which was released to coincide with the tour. Also involved was a re-release of her early hit Snowbird which had already made a substantial mark in the Japanese record industry. Since returning, both the Greatest Hits and Snowbird orders have completely sold out of stock.

As Murray's manager Leonard Rambeau notes, the entire reaction to the singer's tour is very reminiscent of her early years as a performer in Canada. Basically, both the audience as well as the media loved her.

Plans are tentatively calling for another Anne Murray tour of Japan in the fall of 1978.

Presently, work is being done in Toronto's Sound Interchange studios for Ms. Murray's next CBC special.



Byron Lee has that sound of all seasons but this album is top fare for the sun months and should rekindle many thoughts among tourists of their stay on the Islands. No political overtones with Lee, just straight entertainment and pleasing lyrics, Byron can take a Beethoven's 5th or a Piano Concerto by Tchaikovsky, add a synthesizer and bring



the old Masters into the realm of today's music. Lee and his Dragonaires have changed their pace somewhat, after a long absence from the record scene. The Island sound (oil drums) are still there but there's been an effort to expand the sound which should capture an even greater audience.

GENE MacLELLAN

If It's Alright With You

Capitol ST-11535-F

There's obviously a good chemistry mix between writer/performer MacLellan and producer John Capek. Produced at Toronto's Captain Audio and Toronto Sound studios, set has already been enjoying heavy national exposure with the adult oriented and country programmers. Contains MacLellan's current RPM Country Playister, Shilo Song and, if you listen carefully, you just might pick up the voice of Gene's very dear friend, Anne Murray, although it was probably her very presence on this cut as well as Put Your Hand In The Hand, that gave Gene that much needed confidence. A shy man, at the best of times, MacLellan gains in stature as he performs on wax with his sincere brand of lyrical communication. Besides Annie, MacLellan has a host of friends all too anxious to lend a hand and they include: Prakas John, bass; Pentti Glan, producer Capek on keyboards, Bob Lucier on steel, Eugene Amaro



on soprano sax and background vocals by Annie, Tommy Ambrose, Steve Kennedy, Ken Marco and Ed Wideman. Don't lock MacLellan into any one format, he's got that gospel, country blues feel that fits all formats.


NORTON BUFFALO

Loving' In The Valley Of The Moon

Buffalo Norton has a sizeable following even before the release of this set, mainly because of his associating with some of the big names in the business: Commander Cody, Elvin Bishop, Boz Scaggs, Steve Miller and more. His Eighteen Wheels is included on Commander Cody's live album

recorded during their farewell tour to Europe and he was an important addition to Steve Miller's Fly Like An Eagle and Book Of Dreams albums. He also opened Miller's west coast tour, which added to his following. Described as "a virtuoso on any type of harmonica", Buffalo tops his harp



playing with a unique brand of vocalizing that should sit well with the adult-oriented programmers as well as those into progressive rock. Stretch it a little, with Hangin' Tree, and country programmers could become interested. Produced by Buffalo with an executive production assist from Steve Miller.

BERT KAEMPFERT

Safari Swings Again

Polydor 2310494-Q

Whatever happened to the big band Kraut sounds of the late sixties and early seventies? Names like James Last and Bert Kaempfert? They're both alive and well at Polydor and Kaempfert surfaces with a somewhat nostalgia kick. Produced by Kaempfert, this set is strictly for the Kaempfert fans - and they number in the thousands so this album could be an important release, particularly for the adult-oriented programmers who have had to lean




more into the contemporary field for their programming material. The Kaempfert touch is still there and the big plus factor, of course, is trumpet player and flugel-hornist Ack van Rooyen. Contains Henry Mancini's Baby Elephant Walk but much of the material is Kaempfert originals.

BONFIELD-DICKSON

This isn't a new release but the reissue could bring this talented duo back into prominence. Produced at Zaza Sound by Ron Harrison with an assist by Paul Zaza, Ginny Ridpath's discoveries were just this side of breaking through with their original go-round. They have a pleasant summer sound that should please the adult-oriented programmer, particularly the cut, Ten Thousand One Twenty Days and if you're into album programming don't overlook Gypsy Saviour or Born Dead. If you're interested in getting in on the "unity kick" Bonfield-Dickson supply a cute little ditty, Champs Elysees. Lots of big sound and lush strings with standout performances by Jack Zaza on English horn, alto sax, clarinet, flute, harmonica and oboe. Not included on this set but certainly a boost for Bonfield-Dickson is their new release If You Want



Broadcast Music Inc. announces new payment schedules

Royalty increases for local FM, network television and some radio performances and a new song bonus system are among the highlights of a new payment schedule from U.S. performing rights society Broadcast Music Incorporated. The new schedule, which takes effect July 1, outlines the increased minimum rates to be paid by BMI for popular songs and concerts on radio television feature performances, themes and background music.

Among the new features of the payment plan are a rate of one cent per feature FM performance, and popular song feature performance increases for U.S. television of \$2.25 from 36 cents for prime time and \$1.25 from 24 cents for other times. Prime time includes 7 to 11 p.m. and musical or variety programs between 11 p.m. and one a.m. Other new rates include prime time network television themes, which will receive 22 cents per half-hour show, and 18 cents for non-prime time show, and television background music, which will pay 22 cents per minute prime time and 16 cents per minute non-prime time.

Also effective July 1, BMI will incorporate a song bonus system of payment,

multiplying royalties given out after that date for any song which has received over 25,000 performances since January 1, 1960. Future royalties on songs which have been performed between 25,000 and 99,999 times will be paid at 1½ times the base rate; 100,000 to 499,999 performances at two times the base rate; 500,000 to 999,999 performances at 2½ times the base rate, and one million performances or more at 3.8 times the base rate. This bonus system will apply to every feature broadcast performance of any song in the BMI repertoire on July 1.

Material dating back before January 1, 1960 is also eligible for bonus payments provided its number of performances can be documented prior to December 31, 1977 on a BMI form with supporting statements which can be obtained by writing the Song Bonus Department, Broadcast Music Inc., 40 West 57th Street, New York 10019.

The new payment schedule and bonus plan apply only to performances in the U.S. However, BMI Canada artists whose material is broadcast in the U.S. are eligible under the schedule.

15 acts to be showcased at CT&EC

Fifteen of Canada's top acts will be showcased at the second annual Canadian Entertainment Conference at the Hotel Toronto October 8th, 9th and 10th.

The three day event will include speakers, workshops and entertainment in what will be the event of the year for talent buyers and promoters.

Last year's event attracted 300 registrants from across Canada which included booking agents, personal managers, high-school and campus talent buyers, artists and record company personnel.

Anyone wishing to sponsor a group for showcasing on the five stages that will be available each night should contact RPM for application forms. Only fifteen groups will be eligible for showcasing.

The Toronto Ballroom of the Hotel Toronto will be setup with five stages and the acts will perform one after another with no breaks in what proved to be a very successful format last year.

Prior to the final evening's showcase (Monday) RPM will host a banquet for registrants and throughout the three days there will be hospitality rooms, individual showcase and exhibit rooms and varied social events that will take place between the work sessions.

A three day passport will be available to registrants on August 1st which will entitle registrants to all three days of activities. Day by day registration and single event registration will be available as well.

Strong Montreal response for Pope, Rough Trade

Music Shoppe International reports very strong response to a week engagement at Montreal's Milord by Toronto-based group Carol Pope & Rough Trade. Among those in attendance at the week of May 17 booking were leading Montreal press, record industry and media personalities, including music personality Tony Roman, Attic artist Patsy Gallant and her producer Ian Robertson, Juan Rodriguez of the Montreal Gazette, and representatives of radio stations CHOM-FM and CKUL-FM.

The reaction to the performance includ-

ed favourable local press and airplay for the group's Soundstage/JAMF-produced direct-to-disc album, the first such album produced by those facilities. In addition, Gallant requested Pope to write several songs for her.



John's sixteen years in broadcasting has encompassed all functions of radio operations most notably in radio programming. His previous broadcast history in various markets including Saskatoon, Regina, Windsor and Montreal provides CJBK Radio with a great depth of knowledge and experience.

In announcing the appointment, CJBK President Rick Richardson stated that "John, in my opinion is one of Canada's outstanding programmers and will make a positive addition to London Radio and the CJBK team".

United Artists Records reports Kenny Rogers' U.A. album release, titled after his name, is gold in Canada with sales of over 50,000 units. U.A. reports continued sales are moving the album well on its way towards platinum status.

The album contains Rogers' current major single hit *Lucille*, which is reportedly nearing gold status itself. The single has reached number one in a number of markets across Canada, and is top five in many others. It has also achieved the unique distinction of reaching number one on all three RPM singles charts.

Lucille, which began as a country force, reached number one in the April 16 RPM Country Playlist and remained there the subsequent week. It began to cross over heavily into both Adult Contemporary and Top 40 markets, topping the RPM Adult Oriented Playlist in the June 18 issue and reaching the top position in the Top 100 Singles chart last week.

The album, Rogers' second with U.A., is also moving rapidly up RPM's album chart, and is currently located at 28 after four weeks on the chart.

MSI international act Woods, Shiver to Toronto

Annie Woods & Shiver, the first group ever signed by Music Shoppe International for exclusive international booking, are slated for a two-week stint in the Toronto area, with weeks at Toronto's Gasworks (July 4-9) and the Black Hawk in Richmond Hill (11-16). The band, which is based in Rochester, New York, consists of singer Annie Woods, a North Carolina native, Rochester area musicians Scott Kreyer on keyboards, Nick Costello on bass, and guitarist Jeff Gilhart. Drummer Rick Rakozky hails from Hamilton, Ontario.

Grandstand stage smaller, more advanced

The new CNE Grandstand, which has been in its fabrication stages since March of 1977, will be more technically advanced, smaller, and more durable. While the old stage had a floor area of 180' X 90', the new one will cover but 120' x 60'. While being only two-thirds the size, the new stage is more suited to use on Astro-Turf, the playing surface within the stadium. Sixty-four pneumatic flotation tires (aircraft type) will carry the 100 ton stage across the turf giving a pressure of less than 3 pounds per square inch, thus damage to the field is virtually non-existent.

The new CNE Grandstand stage is 90% Canadian content.

Music Shoppe and its publicist, Bigland Advertising, will be promoting the dates as the group's Toronto premiere. Shiver will be performing substantially in Canada throughout the summer, in an attempt to establish themselves in Canada as a new market. Music Shoppe is planning a U.S. tour for the fall.

Annie Woods & Shiver are managed by Chuck Leone of Rochester-based Skyhigh Management, whose other two bands, Mother Freedom Band and Terry Whipple & Strider, are also booked in Canada by Music Shoppe. Music Shoppe's Ralph Jolivet is directive agent for all three groups.

O'Keefe Centre continues jazz

O'Keefe Centre in Toronto has completed their jazz series ending June 20-24. The artists appeared from noon until 2 p.m. at the licensed restaurant, The Terrace. Acts for the afternoon concerts included the Carlton Vaughan Quartet, the Jack Lander Quartet, Brian Browne Trio, the Jimmy Amara Quintet, and the Bill Badgely Trio.

This is the 12th consecutive year that these concerts have been made possible with the support of the Toronto Musicians Union Local (149) and grants from the Music Performance Trust Fund of the Recording Industries.

Motown, Keeble Cable

co-op CATV success

Motown Records and Keeble Cable, a CATV company which services western Toronto and outlying areas, recently staged a co-operative special promotion event on Keeble community program Dance Machine. The May 28 edition of the show, which is taped every second Saturday, featured a contest where contestants lip-synced to Thelma Houston's Don't Leave Me This Way.

Motown supplied the prizes, which consisted of Houston's album Any Way You Like It, Marvin Gaye's Live At The London Palladium and the new Commodores' album, titled after their name. Singles Sir Duke by Stevie Wonder and Houston's new single If It's The Last Thing I Do were given to non-writing contestants. Singles were also given to the best dancers on the show.

The contest was planned by the show's producer and host Harold Johnson of Keeble and Motown's Jerry Hochberg, who also served on the judges panel. Johnson and Hochberg both report excellent response and turnout to the contest, which was advertised on previous programs.

The two planned a second contest (June 18), this time for boys, lip-syncing to Marvin Gaye's Let's Get It On. Motown again supplied the prizes, which included Gaye's and the Commodores' albums and Smokey Robinson's Deep In My Soul.

GRT's Peter McCann promoting in Toronto

Peter McCann, recording artist with the GRT-distributed 20th Century label, was in Canada recently on a three-day promotional tour from Toronto to London, Ontario. The Los Angeles-based native of Connecticut was brought into Canada by Peter Pasternack, director of international artist development at 20th Century.

McCann is a noted songwriter, known for his recent hit success with Jennifer Warnes' hit Right Time Of The Night. Other songs have also been done by Wayne Newton, Cinnamon and Stary & McBrien. McCann had a five-piece band, Repairs, for seven years, embarking on a solo career in 1974 on the band's break-up. His first single as a solo artist, Do You Wanna Make Love, is currently listed on RPM's Top 100.

Gage Park hosting Festival of Friends

Hamilton's Gage Park is the site of the second annual Festival of Friends to be held August 12, 13, 14, 1977. Coordinated by Hamilton-Wentworth Creative Arts Inc. and the Knight Coffeehouse, this three day art and music fest will feature performances by various Canadian folk musicians for an audience that the coordinators feel will reach 150,000 over the three day period.

Performers at the Festival will include, Woodshed recording artists Willie P. Bennett, Dave Essig, and The Original Sloth Band, CSR artist Terry Christenson, Attic's Ron Nigrini, RCA's Myrna Lorrie, John Allan Cameron, Rolf Kempf, and Robbie MacNeill.

Irish Rovers firmed for full summer

Potato recording artists, The Irish Rovers, are firmed for concert dates in B.C., Ontario and North Central U.S., until the end of August. Included in the group's itinerary are appearances at the Canadian National Exhibition (Aug. 25), Pacific National Exhibition (Aug. 20), and a 12-day stay with the Vancouver chapter of the CBC in order to tape a special for the network.

The Irish Rovers' most recent release is a compilation of re-recordings of old favourites entitled Children of the Unicorn. The album was released by K-Tel.

Rush release for Triumph in Germany on Bellaphon

Triumph's debut album is being rush released in Germany on the Bellaphon label, according to Attic Records. The contracts have been signed for the distribution and Attic hopes sales will be positive. Most recently, Triumph has been released in Australia on Astor, and in France on Gamma. Currently, the band is working on material for their second project while at the same time doing dates across Canada.

Direction announces two releases

Montreal based Direction Records has announced the release of two albums on the label. Yvon Deschamps, a leading entertainment figure on the Quebec scene has made his first English recording, entitled en anglais, which features some of his most popular monologues in the English language. Deschamps has previously seen release of no fewer than a dozen French albums, most of which are certified gold.

The other release on the label concerns ex-Pagliaro guitarist, Billy Workman. Direction has released a single called Talk About Money which features production by Pagliaro along with George Lagios. It is currently being rush released.

Direction Records are distributed in Canada on the RCA label.

Direction pacts with TK for U.S. disco release

Montreal-based Direction Records has firmied a deal with U.S. company TK International for the U.S. distribution of a current Direction single release by Kebeklektrik. The single, titled Journey Into Love, will be retitled Magic Fly, for U.S. release because of a copyright situation.

The single is Direction's first Canadian disco record ever to make the U.S. trades as an import, receiving action in disco pools in Florida and Long Island, New York. Its Canadian sales are reported at 19,000 units total for 12-inch and seven-inch, with a total of 15,000 more units on order.

Kebeklektrik is a Montreal-based studio band. The single was produced in Montreal by Tony Green and Pat Deserio. Deserio is also Direction's director of promotion for Eastern Canada.

Canadian Spaces succeeds despite many obstacles

Despite the general lack of cooperation by virtually every major record label, save A&M Records of Canada, Canadian Spaces, an exclusively Canadian book and record store, has become a successful trading post for home grown product. Opened in April, 1977, by Barbara Bell and Lucy Kaczmarek, and located on Toronto's Queen Street near Spadina Avenue, this tiny but comfortable store features albums by such artists as, Valdy and The Hometown Band, David Bradstreet, Charity Brown (all of A&M), and Wooden Nickel artists Willie P. Bennett, David Essig, and The Original Sloth Band.

Due to the initial lack of product in the store, Treble Clef Distribution, Round Records, and Rebel Record Company agreed to distribute to Canadian Spaces, thus another small victory for Canadian recording artists was made possible.

GRT mounting Hunt promotion campaign

GRT act The Hunt, whose first single, Billy, has just been released, will see a national advertising and promotion campaign in their name. Included in the campaign effort will be radio time buys, posters, 5 ft. by 5 ft. blow-ups of the cover artwork, T-shirts, stickers, and in-store play and displays. At the same time, the group's management, Franklin House, is working with Donald K. Donald and CPI to set up an extensive summer tour.

GRT National Promotion Co-ordinator, Jeff Burns, reports strong reaction on the FM band in Vancouver, Montreal, and Toronto concerning the bands first album, titled The Hunt.

An announcement in conjunction with American release will be made sometime in the not too distant future.

Quintessence classical line introduced by Pickwick Can

Mr. Peter Munves of Pickwick International co-hosts a reception at the Hotel Toronto June 29 along with Pickwick Canada's General Manager, Brian Sherman. The occasion is to introduce the firm's new classical line, Quintessence.

Mr. Sherman, former Marketing Manager with Pickwick Canada, succeeded John Leetham, to head up the Canadian operation.

Cayuga Speedway site of Folkfest

Cayuga Speedway Park, 24 miles south of Hamilton, Ont. will be the sight of a three-day folkfest called Summerfest. The event will feature top name acts including Dan Hill, John Prine, Loudon Wainwright, Tom Chapin, Juno Award winner Colleen Peterson, and Ian Thomas.

Although the Canada Day long weekend is a Friday to Sunday affair this year, Summerfest begins July 2nd and ends on the 4th. Tickets are \$20.00 advance and \$25.00 at the gate, available at most record stores in Southern Ontario. The festival is being produced by Skarratt Promotions Inc.

Axe reports action on George Kadwell single

Axe Records report good MOR airplay on their current single release, Sue's Song, by organist George Kadwell. The single is off Kadwell's new album release Torn Lovers, his second Axe album.

Kadwell began his career as owner of Kadwell's Music Centre in Kitchener, Ontario, a retail outlet for records and Hammond organs. He played clubs and restaurants as a lounge organist in his spare time throughout Southern Ontario. He was originally signed by Axe with the intent of doing instrumental covers of standards, as was the case with his first Axe album, Feelings.

Kadwell then began writing original material. Axe president Greg Hambleton, produced both albums. The new album includes four Kadwell originals, including the current single, from a total of ten selections.

The album includes Kadwell on piano as well as Hammond organ, Jack Zaza on bass, Marty Morell on drums, with guitar, strings and other instruments. It was arranged by Doug Randle.

Island's Rough Diamond firmed for North America

After finishing a five-stop tour of homeland Great Britain, Island recording group Rough Diamond headed to North America to make their debut on this continent. North American dates began with a New York City concert as opening act for A&M artist Peter Frampton, June 15. A Toronto date is being pencilled in for Massey Hall, with the band opening for Polydor artist Brian Ferry.

Island are concentrating promotional efforts on the band in North America, where they are receiving strong support, particularly in the northwestern, midwestern and northeastern U.S.

Polydor's Travers back to Canada to record

Polydor recording artist Pat Travers, a 22-year-old Ottawa native who has been living and recording in England since 1975, has returned to Canada to record his third album at Toronto's Eastern Sound.

Travers, a musician for ten years, had his own Ottawa-based rock & roll band, Red Hot. He later played guitar with Ronnie Hawkins, before moving to England and making a recording deal with Polydor. He is now described as "very progressive."

His second album, titled Making Magic, has been receiving U.S. attention, and has just been released in Canada, where it is getting good early AOR response. The album was produced by Travers with Emil Zoghby, and all ten selections are self-penned.

No producer has been announced for the upcoming third album.

Island ships new Exodus LP by Bob Marley

Island Records has shipped a new album by Jamaican reggae artist Bob Marley. Titled Exodus, the album is Marley's sixth effort on the Island label, and was released in Canada June 2.

Island reports exceptional early action on the album, particularly in the AOR scope, where it is being acclaimed as his most acceptable product for the AOR format. It was immediately placed on heavy rotation at Toronto's CHUM-FM and the new CIHQ-FM, and Montreal's CHOM-FM. It has also been featured on the Montreal station.

Island reports very promising early sales figures, particularly in the Toronto area.

Quality's Prokop promos in Montreal & Ottawa

Quality recording artist Skip Prokop is embarking on a promotion tour which will include stops in Montreal and Ottawa. The junket will include meetings with every AM and FM radio station and all the daily papers in the two cities, as well as local Quebec press. Prokop will be promoting his new Quality album, titled All Grown Up. The label is also planning the release of an initial single from the album in the near future. The album is the first solo product ever for the former founder and leader of Lighthouse.

Prokop is also having interest expressed in a number of his songs, many from the Quality album, from such names as Barry Manilow and the Carpenters.

MWC's Stampeders return to the east coast

MWC recording group the Stampeders, in the midst of their major cross-Canada concert tour billed as their Best Ever Tour, are returning to the east coast for a second time to cover cities not included in their first Maritime tour and to return to highlight cities. Hurley named VP St. Clair Productions





In July, a final contest will be held among the weekly winners. The grand prize will be a choice of an expense-paid trip to Nashville or a sum of money.



While the Jays aren't exactly raising hell with the rest of the American League, they continue to draw the fans in droves. This first appear-

ance for the Bronx Bombers has been a virtual sell-out since last April, and attendance predictions were nudging the forty thousand mark as the handsome young native of Georgia, now a Canadian by choice, stepped up to the plate to sing the Star Spangled Banner and O Canada. His debut single Cheater's Kit, on RCA was released only a week prior.

The Family Brown is the subject matter of a new, forty-minute, radio special produced by Paul Kennedy of CHFX-FM in Halifax for the Canadian Association of Broadcasters. Paul included interviews with all of the Family plus no less than fourteen of their best tunes, some of those in medley form. The production is entitled: The Family Brown Words And Music.

Carroll Baker is well into her tour of Canada's west in the company of Ronnie Prophet and Dickey Lee. And if ever there was a Canadian, country, super-star it has to be this lady. The album that established a new bench mark in Canadian country

record sales, her debut set on RCA, that only recently won the great gal singer a gold record for fifty thousand sales, is now well on the way to the platinum plateau. Exact figures are hard to come by officially, but I hear that the set is past the half way mark on its second fifty thousand sales. Then, just to keep things interesting, her former Gaiety, best-seller, only recently re-released on RCA, is a strong contender for a gold record. Based on RCA sales alone, the re-issue could easily hit the fifty thousand mark. While you bounce those figures around in your head, I'd like to go on record with a prediction with respect to Carroll's yet-to-be-released second RCA album. I've heard her do some of the numbers live and if what I have heard is any indication, I wouldn't be at all surprised if the new set, her second since becoming an RCA artist, ships gold in the first go-round. How do you like them apples, neighbour? She has added I Can't Stop Loving You and The Morning After Baby Let Me Down to her stage act. Both tunes, according to reliable sources, are in the still unreleased LP. The way she handles those two classics on stage will make you forget they were ever recorded by any other artist. She's also working on an adaptation of Dick Damron's Waylon's T-Shirt that'll blow even Dick's black sombrero right into the creek.

For my money, what little there is of that commodity, one of the absolute top instrumentalists on the country scene in this part of Canada, if not the whole country, has to be Mickey Andrews. Mickey plays steel and dobro like to make 'em talk. He's the leader of a real good group on the club scene locally by the name of Cabbage Town. I caught their act at El Condor the other evening and they have a super-together sound. Other members of the bunch, evenly divided between two Newfoundland natives and two good ol' boys from Cape Breton, are: John Wells, Don Jarrett and Randy MacDonald. Mickey tells me the group is booked solid for the balance of the year and that comes as no surprise at all. Mickey is the strong, silent type. His instruments do his talking. Vocals are split between the three remaining guys in the group and they all do creditable performances in this department. Mickey records as a solo performer on Periwinkle Records. His last two album releases Velvet Dobro, and Passport To Dobro have been acquired by Stallion Records of Great Britain for release there and in Italy. Meanwhile Cabbage Town has also released their first album as a group.

Just in case this one some how slipped by, I'd like to mention a single that came to my attention last week on the JJS label out of B.C. The group involved is Country Odyssy, offering a pair of very commercial tunes, Loving You Comes Easy f/s Daddy Sang To Me. I hope that whoever is involved does some deejay promo work across the country for this pairing. It sounds like a hit to me, especially Loving You.
