



Scott Richards to represent Rocshire in Canada

Toronto: Scott Richards has been appointed national representative in Canada, for the Anaheim, California-based Rocshire label. The appointment becomes effective immediately.

Rocshire is owned by Rocky and Shirley Davis and is regarded as a solid-funded company. The Davis's are both involved in the day-to-day operation of the firm. The Rocshire complex comprises a state-of-the-art recording studio and executive marketing offices. Their national promotion team also works out of the complex. North American distribution is handled by MCA.

Initial release is a country/rock single, *Everybody Loves My Rock And Roll*, by Geoff Edmunds, a resident of Victoria, B.C. for the past 15 years. A brother of noted rock guitarist Dave Edmunds, Geoff is a Canadian citizen. The Edmunds are originally from Wales.

Tobias a finalist in '83 CLIO Awards

Toronto: Canadian singer-songwriter Ken Tobias has received an award certificate as a finalist for the 1983 CLIO Awards.

The certificate honours his "creative contribution" to Bill, Tourism New Brunswick's radio commercial. The award is presented to all finalists and winners in both international and U.S. competitions.

The CLIOs recognize the creative contributions and achievement of excellence in advertising. Tobias was specifically honoured for his music production, composing, and lyrics which were performed for Camp Associates Advertising the firm representing Tourism New Brunswick.

With a total of 15,308 entries from over 37 countries, the 1983 CLIO Awards judging panel comprised more than 1,000 advertising creators from around the globe.

The CLIO is the fourth award that has been won by the creators of the Tourism New Brunswick commercials of which Tobias has been a major contributor.

The Edmunds single, produced in Anaheim, was written by Geoff and is 3-part Cancon (MAL), and is making steady gains in western Canada. Richards will be touring with Edmunds through Ontario and Manitoba, beginning in Ottawa (Nov 6) and

The executive makeup of Rocshire includes Gary Davis, no relation to the owners, as President, Bud Samuels, Director of Sales & Marketing; and Bill Meehan, former A&M Branch Manager in Toronto and just prior to his Rocshire appointment as Assistant to the National Sales Director, was Branch Manager of RCA's L.A. Branch.

It's interesting to note that Gary Davis was the President of ABC just before the WEA takeover and ran the day-to-day operation of ABC with Bud Samuels.

Go To Hell tour for MacLean & MacLean

Toronto: Gary and Blair MacLean, better known as MacLean & MacLean, are about to embark on a major Western Canadian tour in support of their latest Attic album, *Go To Hell*.

Produced by the Canadian duo, the album was recorded in Winnipeg, Toronto and Vancouver with all songs written by the pair. MacLean & MacLean are known for fusing satire, humour and rock for *Hector*, *Playmate*, and *Leave It To Elvis (According To The Book)*. The LP has been stickered warning that it "contains language which may be offensive to some." Tour dates are Lethbridge (Nov 1), Medicine Hat (2), Calgary (3), Red Deer (4), Fort MacMurray (7), Hinton (8-9), Prince George (10), Comox (12), Duncan (14), Kitimat (16), Prince Rupert (18), Trail (21), Lake Louise (23), Grand Prairie (26), Lloydminster (28), Edmonton (29), Prince Albert (30), Saskatoon (Dec 1), Regina (3), and Toronto (9-10).

Grant back to Canada for mini-tour

Toronto: Portrait recording artist Eddy Grant is returning to Canada for a short tour in support of his new single, *I Don't Wanna Dance*, taken from his *Killer On The Rampage* album.

Both the album and first single from the album, titled *Electric Avenue*, have gone over the platinum level in Canada.





Toronto: Kim Mitchell, Toronto, Teenage Heads, and Santers are just a few of Canada's rock stars taking part in Sounds United '83 sponsored by the United Way of Greater Toronto to wrap up the organization's 1983 campaign.

Last year's event was the first time in Canada's entertainment history that the unions, performers and entertainment centres all agreed to support the United Way by contributing their services.

The kick-off show will be presented at Maple Leaf Gardens (Nov 8), beginning at 5:30 pm. Several of the city's top rock-radio personalities will emcee.

Other events supporting the campaign include Through The Eyes Of A Child, scheduled for Nov. 13 at the Eaton Centre following the Santa Claus Parade. The comedy, Forbidden Broadway, is slated for the Strand Dinner Theatre (16). As well, TV Ontario's Polka Dot Door is set for Massey Hall (20).

CHUM-AM personality Roger Ashby will be featuring the hits from the '50s and '60s (10) at the Harbour Castle's Jacquis, and a dance will take place at Sparkles on top of the CN Tower.

A birthday bash is being planned for Toronto rockers Triumph (12), at the Knob Hill Tavern in Scarborough with music provided by Santers.

The Second City Revue will be performing their hit, No Man Is A Centre Island at the Old Firehall theatre (20).

Video/Culture '83 set for York Quay Centre

Toronto: The non-profit organization Video Culture Canada, along with local television station CITY-TV, will be presenting a major international news media/video festival in the city from Nov. 1-6 at York Quay Centre and the Premiere Dance Theatre.

Also supporting the festival are Sony, Rogers Cablesystems, and Molson's Brewery (Ontario). Honourary Patrons of the festival include Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau, Ontario Premier William Davis and Toronto Mayor Arthur Eggleton.

Over 35 world-renowned guests are expected to participate in the many events scheduled. Names include former Rolling Stones manager Jo Bergman, Academy Award-winner Shirley Clarke, Judson Rosebush, creator of the computer graphworks for the movie Tron, and video artists John Sanborn, Ko Nakajima and Bill Viola.

Events at the festival will include a five-day eight-topic symposium, two major world premieres of video art installations by Bill Viola and Noel Harding, the world premiere of the video music performance Confused, displays and demonstrations of the latest in video technology.

Saga album captures heavy overseas sales

Toronto: While the new Saga album Heads Or Tales, produced by Rupert Hine, is being met with positive initial reaction in Canada, Maze Records reports that the LP is experiencing strong overseas sales.

The company claims the album has "burst out of the box" with sales figures in Germany alone exceeding 130,000 in the first 48 hours of its release.

Songwriter Foldy moves into Hollywood films

Foldy has continually kept his talent visible in the recording field, releasing several singles over the past few years, the most notable being My Christmas Wish For You, which he released last year on the Nightflite label. So successful was this single, Foldy is resurfacing the record; which could become a perennial favourite for the holiday season, in view of its Cancon properties.

Automatic, a Los Angeles-based rock group, picked up a Foldy composition, Shake It Down, which they included on their last album, co-produced by Canadians Joel and Mark Wertman. In view of the success of this track, Foldy has discovered an interesting pattern of acceptance for his material beginning to come together in L.A.

The band comprises Alex Stangl (guitarist, songwriter), former member of Strobic Axe; Mike Langford (lead vocalist, songwriter); Jim Smith (keyboards, guitars); and drummer Greg Heard.

Presently touring Central Ontario Bamboo played a hometown showcase at Jokers, a popular local night spot.



His other highly successful singles are The Girl Is Mine (with Paul McCartney), Billie Jean, Wanna Be Startin' Somthin', Beat It

Influenced by the stage performances of the Godfather of Soul, James Brown, Jackson wrote the hits Billie Jean, Beat It and Wanna Be Startin' Somthin', which he also co-produced.

While a video of the title track Thriller, guesting Vincent Price is just being released, the LP has reached the sales region of 15 million worldwide. He was recently presented with over 40 record awards, comprising gold and platinum, from 20 countries around the globe.

Other names assisting Jackson on Thriller include Eddie Van Halen, Steve Lukather, Steve Porcaro, Louis Johnson, and Greg Phillinganes.

Meanwhile, Thriller shows no signs of slowing down, enjoying RPM Top 100 Albums chart action, for 45 weeks, most of those weeks in the Top 10. More singles from the LP may be released.

Beginning as the young lead singer of the Jackson 5, in 1969, the brothers gained almost immediate stardom with, I Want You Back, following it up with three more consecutive #1 singles released on the Motown label. The group went on to sell over 100 million records, playing to sold out notices across the country.

While also remaining a member of The Jackson 5, Michael began to establish himself as a solo artist, releasing Got To Be There, Ben, and Rockin' Robin.

It was in 1976 when the group signed with Epic, changing their name to The Jacksons. The same year, they received their own summer variety series on CBS-TV.

By 1978, the group was producing and writing their own recordings with the album Destiny becoming their most successful. It was also in '78 that Michael Jackson made his debut screen appearance in the Wiz.

However, it was in 1979 when he released his landmark solo album, Off The Wall. It was during this LP that the singer became the

first solo recording artist to ever place four singles from the same LP in the Top 10. The LP reached triple platinum in Canada.

With Thriller, Jackson is breaking not only his own established records, but those made by other giants in rock history.

Michael will also be included on his brothers new album and will be touring as family unit as well.

Rothmans/Craven A supports Metz tour

Toronto: Belinda Metz, a local recording artist managed by Starrider Productions, is presently touring the Southern Ontario college/university circuit sponsored by Rothmans/Craven A of Canada.



CFRW, Winnipeg's first AM Stereo radio station, has introduced their CFRW, Supercard. Supercards are available at all 7-Eleven food stores in Winnipeg. Card holders can win prizes ranging from cash to trips to tickets for major sporting and music events.

Ringo docu to CJBK

CJBK is currently in the midst of airing Ringo's Yellow Submarine, a radio exclusive to Southwestern Ontario. The eleven-week series of two-hour specials began Sept. 25, and features Ringo Starr, the famous drummer of the Beatles, hosting the show which features the group's music and never-before-told stories about the group.

Busy summer for CFNO

"The summer was a great success for CFNO," says PD Dave Schwartz. The Station's Rainbow Sticker has brightened up thousands of autos in the station's listening area, catering to 25,000 people throughout Northern Ontario. There were 30 contributing sponsors involved in the promotion. The Marathon, Ontario station also worked in conjunction with several major and small independent labels in album giveaways. Schwartz noted, "I'd like to send a special thank you to the record companies who helped make the CFNO Rainbow Contest a great success and a lot of fun for both the audience and the staff."

CJCH Atlantic Canada's first AM stereo station

Halifax: Canada has yet another AM stereo station as CJCH became Atlantic Canada's first radio station to broadcast in full AM stereo on Oct. 11, at 3:20 a.m.

CJCH selected the Kahn/Hazeltine Independent Sideband Stereo System after completing in-depth testing and research of all available AM Stereo systems.

Said CJCH Chief Engineer Walter Labucki, "The Kahn Stereo System was our final decision, with the knowledge that listeners will now be capable of hearing the very best quality sound, producing excellent frequency response and stereo separation."

Station Promotions Director Greg Edwards reports that CJCH hopes that as other AM stations throughout Atlantic Canada make the move to AM Stereo, "all can work in a cooperative manner to promote and communicate the benefits of AM Stereo to radio listeners."

Because CRTC regulations forbid FM stations from playing the Top 40 style of mainly hit music, CJCH expects the growth of AM Stereo to be rapid.

The Halifax station recently began giving away Sony SRF-A100 AM Stereo Receivers on air as a promotion. This receiver, and another expected on the market soon from Sansui, are described as "capable of delivering a full rich sound to the listeners."

AM stereo another first for London's CFPL

London: September 3 was the official date for CFPL to become the latest AM station to make the switch to AM Stereo broadcasting.

Station General Manager Bill Brady reported that CFPL's entry into AM stereo broadcasting is just part of the progress made by the station which was the first in southwestern Ontario with an FM licence 30 years ago, and the first to broadcast in stereo on that medium. Said Brady, "While many of our listeners automatically think of us as their major source of news and information, we still play a great deal of music during a broadcast day, and now we feel with the advent of AM stereo, that we can provide an extra dimension in sound."



Like Gangbusters - **RCA - AFL1-4847-N**

Yet another British image to consider and the Boxer Boys, visually, create a bit of a time warp, which is quickly forgotten as they roll into their powerhouse jive, described as "a mixture of R&B and soul from the '60s", tastefully cushioned with a little jazz and swing. The description of their sound may be confusing so it might be better to remain with "Boxerbeat", which could quite easily become a new and respected music form. Norris to hold Music Show

Norris Publications of Toronto will present the Canadian Music Show at the Toronto International Centre (Nov 25-27). An annual consumer show, it will feature exhibits of musical instruments, recording and audio equipment, music books, sheet music, radio stations, records, music associations, and other music-related products. With concerts free to those attending highlighting Canadian artists, separate areas have also been set aside for seminars, workshops and demonstrations.

Orphan to open for Toronto

The Winnipeg rock quartet Orphan, who have just released Lonely At Night, their debut album on the Portrait label, have been added as the opening act for Toronto's western dates. Saved By The Bell has been issued as the first single from the Orphan LP. CBS reports very positive initial response to the album. Their swing through the west pulled capacity houses in Brandon, Yorkton, Red Deer, Medicine Hat, Lethbridge, Prince George, Grande Prairie, Edmonton, Calgary, Regina, Saskatoon, Kelowna, Kamloops, Vancouver and wound down in Nanaimo, Oct 23.

Cancon scores in Tennessee!

When Teenage Heads hit the stage at the Electric Cowboy Festival, the crowd went wild. The PR director for the big three-day show, Rondini, a Canadian living in Nashville, says of Teenage Heads, "They performed flawlessly and went over fantastically well. The show took place on a 200 acre farm in Columbia, just south of Nashville. Rondini did well as a country artist a couple of years ago and is now part of Nashville's WSIX AM & FM. The festival, produced by Bob Alexander and Jim Burns, drew upwards of 60,000 rock fans. The lineup included some of the big names in the business including Joan Jett, Joe Walsh and Quarterflash. Unfortunately counterfeitors were at work, printing up thousands of tickets that were sold in convenience stores, service stations and other small locations, resulting in an estimated loss to the promoters of \$300,000.

Nylons make inroads in Holland

The Toronto-based a cappella group The Nylons are making inroads in Holland where their latest album, One Size Fits All is prominent on the national album chart. Their profile was boosted by a recent appearance on the popular TV show, Sonja, as well as interviews with the press and radio. The Nylons' popularity was so great they have been invited to appear on the Dutch Grammy Awards when the group will perform four songs live to several million viewers in the Netherlands. In addition, their songs are to appear on the annual compilation LP that accompanies the awards show. Attic is distributed by Holland's Roadrunner Records. "This is incredible exposure," said Cees Wessels of Roadrunner. "It's quite possible we could sell over 100,000 LPs because of this one television appearance alone." Nylons member Marc Connors noted that the group is considering a tour to coincide with their television appearance.

Capitol reissues Seger single

Capitol Records has reissued the Bob Seger single Old Time Rock & Roll to coincide with the release of the motion picture, Risky Business which features the song. The single has been released in a picture sleeve and contains the track Till It Shines on the flip. Both songs taken from his hit album, Stranger In Town, which he produced.

New Mental As Anything shipped

Solid Gold have just released Mental As Anything's Creatures Of Leisure. The majority of the LP was produced and engineered

by Bruce Brown and Russell Dunlop. Two tracks however, including the single Working For The Man, were produced by Mark Moffatt and Ricky Fataar. Red To Green is on the flip.

Men At Work/Vaughan tour

CBS recording acts Men At Work and blues/rock guitarist Stevie Ray Vaughan, who has worked with David Bowie, have teamed for a Western tour. Vaughan & Double Trouble's album Texas Flood is approaching gold status in Canada. Song Pride and Joy has just been released as the single from the LP. Meanwhile, Men At Work's Cargo album is about to surpass the triple platinum mark. Their new single, Dr. Heckyll and Mr. Jive is now climbing the charts. Pulling capacity houses the groups played Vancouver, Edmonton, Calgary, Regina and Winnipeg.


