OAC's Contact Ontario gives boost to artists

Toronto: More than 500 performing artists, arts groups and community sponsors recently gathered at the Constellation Hotel for Contact Ontario '83, an annual event sponsored by the Ontario Arts Council (OAC) and now, in its 12th year.

Born in 1971, Contact began as an audition process for young soloists in classical music, but has since changed and expanded. Each year Contact provides a marketplace where performing artists meet potential buyers of touring performances from hundreds of communities in Ontario, as well as other provinces and even outside Canada.

The OAC points out that Contact not only allows artists to showcase their performances for potential sponsors, but encourages the two groups to meet and discuss future touring

in the Contact Room, involving some 120 exhibitors.

"Since its inception, Contact's mandate has been to serve primarily Ontario-based artists and secondly, artists from other provinces of Canada," explained Nan Whilaw, OAC Touring Officer.

"This year, 35 artists, out of a total of more than 200 requests, showcased their performances in 44 different time slots. Twenty-six of these artists, especially young artists, place upon Contact as a valuable marketing tool."

In the music category, artists involved in Contact Ontario this year include Shirley Eikhart, country group Whiskey Jack, Canadian composer John Arpin, the Whitley Brothers Orchestra and many others. The OAC is an Ontario government agency.

McLauchlan named Xmas seal Chairman

Toronto: Six-time Juno Award-winner Murray McLauchlan has been appointed Honorary Christmas Seal Chairman of 1983 for the Canadian Lung Association (CLA).

To commemorate the launch of the association's campaign, at an Ottawa press conference (Nov 2), McLauchlan was presented with the first sheet of 1983 seals Governor-General Ed Schreyer.

Lillian Schreyer, wife of the Governor-General and past Honorary Chairman of the same campaign was also presented with a sheet of Christmas Seals by Erin Campbell, a youth member of one of the CLA's asthma programs.

Funds raised for the CLA through Christmas Seals are used for research to examine ways to prevent and treat lung disease, operating community programs, and smoking cessation programs.

Distributed by CBS Records and released on the True North label, Timberline is the latest album from McLauchlan. Never Did Like That Train was taken as the first single. A video has also been produced of the cut.

ARC prepares tribute to late Buzz Shearman

Toronto: Buzz Shearman, lead singer of Moxy, was killed in a motorcycle accident on June 16th of this year. In view of the tragedy, Ken Stanley has announced that ARC Sound, in collaboration with Valerie Shearman, Buzz's widow, will release a single with the previously unreleased titles, Can't Stop The Music and Take It Or Leave It. The single will be followed by a new album, titled Moxy...A Tribute To Buzz Shearman. Royalties from the sale of the single and album will be paid into a trust fund for Jesse Shearman, who was only 18 months old when Buzz died.

To coincide with the release of the album, a benefit concert is being planned for November 15th at the Toronto nightclub Heaven. The benefit will feature Moxy with the original musicians including Alex Machin as lead singer. Machin was formerly with a Foot In Coldwater. Also appearing will be the original Goddo Band, Champion and other guest performers to be named at a later date.

Controversial single launches BeauRegard

Calgary: BeauRegard Records takes their first step into the recording field with a controversial single by Wayne Faro titled Night Line/Ass In The Wind. Faro wrote both sides and produced the single in Winnipeg.

In revealing why BeauRegard would undertake such a controversial offering to make an initial impression on the market, the label's Judy Dalgliesh told RPM, "Firstly, because of our belief in the artistic merit of the product and artist. Also, BeauRegard has a strong desire to be on the cutting edge insofar as uniqueness and impact on the music scene is concerned." She went on to explain, "We dare to be different, to introduce a breath of harsh realism along with the winds of change. Our errors will be errors of enthusiasm rather than those of complacency."

A newcomer to the field, Dalgliesh made a very serious study of the recording industry before formulating her plans for a release label. Her research included attending the Commercial Music Academy, comprising several days of seminars and think-tanks organized by its founder, Bob Cousins, considered an expert in the field of record production, management and label administration.

Faro was born in Westaskiwin, Alberta and got off to an early start in the music business when he gave his first public performance on Vancouver's CKNW at the age of four. Several years later he made another impression on the West Coast city when his group was the first rock band to perform live on the Jack Cullen radio show. He went on to play the Canadian circuit but one of the highlights of his career was when he became a member of the Toronto production of Hair.

Faro's single reflects the "street-smarts" he has acquired over the years with Night Line a blues-touched, hard-edged message of street life. Ass In The Wind is a flat-out rocker, designed specifically for the clubs and those programmers looking for listener response.

TICTOC clock moving with single success

Toronto: The local Dallcorte recording quartet TICTOC are finding their clock ticking much faster due to the success of their debut single Twenty Questions from their premier LP, *Where The Picnic Was*. The track has also been issued as a 12" single.

Produced by the well-known Terry Brown, best noted for his production work with Rush, the LP was recorded earlier in the summer at Studio 306.

The group is currently rehearsing in preparation for a national tour in support of the LP, which includes a date at The Concert Hall in Toronto (Nov. 12).

The Dallcorte label, distributed in Canada by RCA, reports word of the single has also spread into the U.S. where independent promoters are showing major adds coast-to-coast and mass club acceptance to the Twenty Questions dance single, although album nor single have been released in the U.S. yet.

Tevan Kaplan, drummer, vocalist and key songwriter for the quartet who composed Twenty Questions, explained how the quartet came about choosing the name TICTOC.

"Basically we didn't want something that was overwrought. And we didn't want something that was trendy, so we opted for a name that was a sound effect. It's a good name because it cuts across language barriers. There's no deep meaning behind it and there was no consideration of the time element when we picked it, even though time is very important."

Kaplan noted the band is happy with the

Alexandre firms releases in Europe markets

Montreal: Alexandre (Stanke) is emerging as one of the leaders in Quebec's pop/rock field. Fluent in both English and French, Alexandre has enjoyed much success with both languages, particularly his English-language recordings, released on the Celebration label.

The young singer's initial album release, *Let It Out*, drew the following comment in RPM's New Albums (Apr 23/83), "It's difficult to categorize Alexandre, but it's relatively easy to slot him as a professional. His wonderings between rock, dance and pop with jazz overtones adds to the entertaining value of this." The first single taken from the album, *We Broke Up The Band*, was quickly added to contemporary adult playlists resulting in a lengthy stay on the RPM Contemporary Adult chart. His latest single, *I Need Love*, also taken from the album, has shown early indications of following the success of his first single.

Release of Alexandre product in several European countries is currently under negotiation and at time of writing is firmed for Germany by Pop Imports, Italy by Pana and in Portugal by the Gira label. A U.S. pact with a major label is expected over the next few weeks.

Alexandre is also an established name in Quebec's commercial and jingle business, supplying vocals for Juicy Fruit, Cheddar Cheese, Orange Crush, Golden Eagle Gasoline and a commercial in support of non-smokers.

success of their debut single and LP.

"If I got hit by a truck tomorrow, I'd still feel that I accomplished something. It's a good start, but there's still a long way to go."

Kaplan hesitated to categorize the TICTOC sound, but felt the music is "consistently interesting." He explained that it's a sound that has resulted from the influences of all four members.

"We don't like to think of ourselves as following any trends," he said. "The album title comes from a poem by Thomas Hardy, an English poet from the turn of the century. The title seemed to lend itself to the pastoral scene which is also on the album jacket."

Tim Trombley, National Promotion and A&R Director for the Dallcorte label admitted that when he first reviewed the band's demo material, he didn't know where the group was from, but was surprised to learn they were local, describing their sound as "international in style and appeal."

To support the LP and single, RCA and Dallcorte have also launched a TICTOC promotion involving the 1983 Freestyle Dance Championship, which is travelling through the local dance club Scinocco. Winners of the event win an expense-paid trip for two to New York.

Participants will choreograph a dance routine to the hit Twenty Questions with each club presenting their own competition and choosing their respective winners who qualified for the finals which were held (Oct 29) at the Sherway Gardens Shopping Centre in Eaton's Court, Mississauga.





Attic recording comedy brothers MacLean & MacLean recently recorded a commercial spot to promote their latest album, Go To Hell. The commercial was apparently so hot that CFOX turned it down and when C100 aired it, they were forced to take it off the air due to complaints. Says Attic's Lindsay Gillespie, "When this happens we know we have a winner." Attic aired the commercial for Walt Says, but more bleeps were heard than voice.

Contemporary adult nod for Laser's new single

Trenton, Ont.: Laser, local pop/rock quartet, have shown a strong pattern of programmer acceptance for their latest single release, Holding You. John Collins, the group's keyboardist, reports that in view of the positive action on this new single, "There will be a U.S. release, as well, to a test market of over 400 stations."

The new single was produced by the group with some involvement from Eric Baragar, Tim Campbell and Dick Haw. The flip, Crazy People, was produced by Baragar. Both sides were written by Collins and recorded at Skyhawk studios in Belleville.

Holding You is the group's follow-up to Through, which attracted the interest of a large number of contemporary adult programmers last year. Laser are currently in studio working on their next single, which they hope will be followed by an album.

Laser comprises Kevin Kuhn, bass; Gerry Kuhn, drums and electric keyboards; Rob Lynch on vocals; and John Collins, piano.

The new crop sounds good!!

Dial twisting in Toronto and Vancouver, I found it interesting and very entertaining to discover bright and enthusiastic young news reporters taking on the job of interviewing VIPs of the entertainment field. Their approach isn't as smooth but they dig out a lot more interesting information than do many of the seasoned interviewers. HIT AND RUN

The Jimi Hendrix Story

Jerry Hopkins

\$12.50 — 336 pages

Many will agree with author Jerry Hopkins when he notes, "Quite simply, Jimi Hendrix was one of the most significant musical contributors, not just of our time but of all time." Hit And Run is must reading for music buffs of the early sixties, a very critical time in the growth of rock music. It was in 1968 when Hendrix was quoted as saying "It's funny the way most people love the dead. Once you are dead, you are made for life." As Hopkins points out in this book "Eighteen months after he made this offhand statement Jimi was dead of a barbiturate and alcohol overdose at age twenty-seven."

Hopkins has obviously spent many frustrating hours in researching the rather short life of Jimi Hendrix (1942-1970). "There are things he (Hendrix) did on the guitar," writes Hopkins, "no one yet can explain or duplicate, not even given the electronic assistance that's been developed since his death." Hopkins follows Hendrix through many of his experiences, describing in detail several of the horror stories that went with being a rock star. Of particular interest was the Toronto drug bust of Hendrix in 1968, which may have been a "set-up." Well-known Canadian limousine driver, the late Louis Goldblatt is quoted extensively with regard to the case by a Rolling Stone reporter. The outcome of the trial of course was a return of "not guilty" by a jury, obviously impressed by Hendrix.

Hit And Run also contains a Discography on Hendrix by Ken Matesich and Dave Armstrong, and is divided into six sections: Pre-experience, Experience, Bootleg, Selected 45s, Jimi Hendrix as Guest Artist, and Jimi Hendrix as Producer.

Heavy club action for Palais release

Toronto: Palais Records, a new label, is currently experiencing dance club action with their initial release, a 12" EP, titled *Real Men* by Yvonne Moore. The label is distributed in Canada by the Toronto-based Rhythms who are also looking after exporting Palais product.

European tour dates for Capitol's Helix

Toronto: London, Ontario hard rockers Helix are currently on a two-month tour of Europe including British dates, as the opening band for Kiss after recently completing a performance in their hometown and Toronto where they shot their latest video.

The video, the band's second, is their *Don't Get Mad Get Even* track taken from their album, *No Rest For the Wicked* released on the Capitol label.

Helix recently received important coverage in the overseas music publications Kerrang and Sounds. Stops on the tour will include London, Glasgow, Newcastle, Paris, Munich, Vienna, Brussels, Stockholm, and Copenhagen.

A few years ago Kiss, who were very popular in Europe, had another Capitol group Iron Maiden opening for them. As a result of that tour, Iron Maiden who were unknown at the time, broke in Europe and finally in North America, and are now one of the most popular of heavy metal British bands. Capitol hopes the tour will have the same effect on Helix.

The session was produced at Nova Sound Studio in Markham, Ontario by Rory Slater and John Ebata, both of whom co-wrote the material with Moore. The studio and label are owned by Slater, Ebata and Steve Ducas.

Ducas reports the title track as picking up impressive club action and sales in New York and in Europe and that Toronto clubs, name-

ly Faces (George Grant) and 5444 (Loretto Manni) have been programming the *Let Me Soothe You* track, which he describes as "the slow and sensuous cut."

Moore has been doing her bit with live appearances and personal visits to clubs. TV spots are now being scheduled along with a new issue of the record featuring a special club mix of *Real Men*. A video is now in the works and is expected to be released mid-November.

Fringe Product off with several new releases

Toronto: The local Fringe Product label, distributed by The Record Peddler, are readying a shipment of new releases.

Date changes for Kamahl's Canadian tour

Toronto: Attic Records tour changes for Australian singer Kamahl due to conflicts with live dates in Australia. The changes have resulted in the postponement of his Western Canadian dates.

Kamahl is still scheduled to play Kitchener's Centre In The Square (Nov 16), Ottawa's National Arts Centre (18), and Toronto's Massey Hall (25 & 26). His Western dates are to be rescheduled.

The Attic recording artist is presently supporting his latest album, *This Love We Share* produced by Hayward Parrott. The track *You Are That Woman* is the first single release from the LP.

Two of the releases will be from two Toronto bands the first of which is Sin, a seven-track mini-album from the local trash band Youth Youth Youth. Tracks include *Fire In The Raw*, *Greed*, and *Philosophy*.

The other Toronto release will be a 12" single titled *Reunion* from the local cold wave/new age rock band Breeding Ground, with *Slaughter* on the flip.

Lastly, Fringe are releasing the Original Video Soundtrack from UK/DK of the film *UK/DK, A Film About Punks & Skinheads*. A various artist compilation album with 14 tracks, artists include many of Britain's hottest punk and new rock bands.

Names of the LP include *The Adicts*, *The Business*, *Disorder*, *Vice Squad*, *the Damned*, *The Exploited* and many others. The hour-long video, which is also available from The Record Peddler, contains live interviews with the band members as well as live performances.

Hall & Oates compilation captures seven years of Rock 'N' Roll Soul

It was impossible to ignore the soulful heart-wrenching vocals of Daryl Hall and John Oates when the duo first made their mark in 1972 with their debut album, Whole Oates.

It was blue-eyed soul, the likes of which had not been heard since the breakup of the

Righteous Brothers, with whom the pair was also first compared. They even recorded You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling on their 1980 smash LP, Voices.

Anyone who had fallen in love or even lost one, could immediately relate to the music and vocal harmonies of Hall and Oates. It was music from the heart, and as such received airplay on Top 40, rock, adult, R&B and even album-oriented rock stations on FM.

The duo began churning out such classics as She's Gone and Sarah Smile. After taking on a more pop-oriented direction and combining it with their soul-influenced roots, Hall and Oates continued with several smash singles including Rich Girl, Private Eyes, Kiss On My List, You Make My Dreams, Man-eater, and I Can't Go For That. With their winning formula, the pair have gone on to become the most successful duo in the history of recorded music.

Now, for the first time, RCA Records has released a compilation highlighting the duo's most popular songs.

Titled Rock 'N' Soul Part 1 and shipped platinum in Canada by RCA, the compilation LP also features two new tracks, the first of which is the new single, Say It Isn't So. The song, already showing signs of becoming yet another smash single for the duo, was the highest and most popular debuting song on charts across the country. The other new title is the song Adult Education.

The album, being supported by an extensive national campaign by RCA, also includes a 1984 poster highlighting the albums the duo have released over the years.

Hall and Oates were both raised in the Philadelphia area, the soul capitol of the U.S. Attracted to music at an early age, the pair listened to soul and street corner do-wop. In the mid '60s, the duo began recording for local labels.

The two first met at a teen dance and escaped a gang, who were in pursuit, by the same elevator. The pair moved to New York

and currently base themselves in Greenwich Village.

Hall & Oates released their first album Whole Oates in 1972. The LP, containing She's Gone, won them instant attention in the U.S. and Canada.

In 1975 the duo signed with RCA Records and continued with their hit success. In 1980 Hall and Oates took an important step by producing the next album themselves titled Voices.

"The music on Voices is closer to the music we hear in our heads as we compose the songs," said Hall. "Before, the songs would always be filtered through the perceptions of

International artists discovering Gary O'

Toronto: While local singer, songwriter and guitarist Gary O'Connor better known as Gary O' continues work on his next album, expected for a March or April '84 release, several international artists are discovering his songwriting talents.

Tentatively titled Watching You, O'Connor is producing his new album independently. His debut LP on Capitol not only gained

significant airplay, but earned him a Juno nomination.

"As one of our most prominent international writers, Gary is quickly establishing himself as a major force in the recording industry," says Wayne Patton of CBS Songs.

"As prolific a songwriter as he is, we expect the same level of applause for Gary's talent as a producer and recording artist," said Executive Producer Steve Glass.

the producer and the session musicians he hired. So when Voices, which underwent none of that filtering process and which was recorded with our regular band, became such a major success, we were especially thrilled."

Hall and Oates followed up Voices with Private Eyes. Both albums, and the hit singles on them, gained the duo even wider appeal.

Then in late 1982, Hall and Oates released H2O. The album spent 50 weeks on the RPM Top 100 Album chart surpassing the triple platinum mark in Canada.

With the release of Hall and Oates' greatest hits album, and the initial massive acceptance of their new single Say It Isn't So, the duo may be seeing their biggest-selling LP ever.

Quality withdraws TNN application to CRTC

Toronto: Quality Records has just announced it is withdrawing its application to the CRTC to distribute The Nashville Network (TNN) in Canada.

The company reports that the commission has stated it does not intend to hear Quality's application for the Nashville Network at this time.

TNN is a family-oriented country program produced for television and broadcast throughout the U.S. The service features a variety of country-related entertainment including performances by country artists. The Tommy Hunter Show is one of the programs it carries in the U.S.

Quality Records President George Struth states that the support already shown for TNN by Canadian performers and producers, and the real spirit of friendship for Canada shown by the owners of TNN, make it certain that the service will come to Canada in the foreseeable future.

"We've heard from country singers, composers and fans that Nashville would be a popular service in Canada," Struth said. "Canadian cable companies have seen the real market possibilities of this service which is growing at a rate of 750,000 per month in the U.S. now after it had the largest launch subscriber count of any satellite-to-cable service in March of 1983. That's success."

Quality reports that it and the owners of the Nashville Network designed a service, which would provide for Canadian producers and performers, a huge international stage and for real exposure in Canada. The company noted that this model should not be lost because Canada must show the world what talent we have.

The company states that Canadian television licensees will be given the chance in 1984 to choose from up to five foreign services approved by the CRTC to carry on their systems.

Quality added that it is confident that TNN will be one of those services and it calls upon all those who love their "country" to let the commission and the local cable company know how much they want the service.


Nashville opens doors for Tembo's Baker







TERRY JACKS

Pulse - A&M SP-9096-W

One of the hitmakers of the late '60s and early '70s (Which Way You Goin' Billy? and Seasons In The Sun), Terry Jacks makes a strong bid to gain a foothold in the industry once again with this Ocean Sound (Vancouver) production. The session was co-produced by Jacks and Bob Buckley. Jacks' vocals, always cushioned by Susan, his past partner in the Poppy Family, has gained a distinction of its own. He has also utilized the writing talents of others which makes this album much more acceptable as he uses his vocal power and projection to interpret meaningful lyrics on the Buckley/Howie Vickers penning of Rainy Eyes, one of the better cuts on the album, and Too Much Too Soon from the same team. Jacks scores well with his co-writing of The Final Line with Peter Sinclair. Voice Of America, co-written by Alan Hovden and David Jenson, has been taken as a single.

DIONNE WARWICK

How Many Times Can We Say Goodbye

Moving from her 11th hit album, Heartbreaker, which was produced by Barry Gibb, Dionne Warwick, picks Luther Vandross for this production and yet another pattern of success emerges for this extraordinary talent. The perks on this session alone, add immeasurably to the excitement of the album and includes the guitar work of Peter Frampton on Got A Date

BLACK SABBATH

Maple Leaf Gardens - Toronto - Oct 25/83

Given the current popularity of heavy-metal, the assumption might be made that the progenitors of the movement would still make for a contemporary and consequently exciting presentation. The other perspective is that a forerunner who has made few concessions to current trends within the movement runs the risk of conveying an outdated and stale sensibility. Regrettably, this is the case with Sabbath.

The addition of ex-Purple vocalist Ian Gillan and ELO veteran Bev Bevan do little to breathe new life into a very dated format. Gillan sounds exactly like a Purple vocalist attempting to sing Sabbath tunes. Bev Bevan, a founding member of the Move in the '60s, delivers little that is very different from predecessors Bill Ward and Vinnie Appice. Meanwhile, the characters responsible for this charade, "Geezer" Butler, and Tony Iommi, seem very content to purvey Sabbath's patented machine-shop roar, with little concession to the '80s. Of course, these considerations have little impact on a fiercely loyal contingent of fans set on an evening of volume and tired satanic/mystic imagery.

JOAN BAEZ

Roy Thomson Hall - Toronto - Oct 23/83

One of the few genuinely interesting and durable performers to emerge from the turbulence and introspection of the '60s, Joan Baez has lost none of the dynamism which characterized her forays into the civil rights movement in the U.S., and other similar projects. Her current project, Humanitas International, would appear to keep her in the vanguard of the international movement for human rights.

Her performance was marred by occasional socio-political jibes which only served to lend an air of stridency to the proceedings. Fortunately, this consideration was leavened by a strong and natural sense of humour, causing her to appear less rigid than the ideology would have us believe.

and I Do It 'Cause I Like It as well as a reunion of Warwick with The Shirelles for an exceptional version of the King/Goffin classic, Will You Love Me Tomorrow, which was a giant for the Shirelles, a few years ago. The song, never recorded by Warwick before, is a favourite at her concerts. Much of the material here was written by producer Vandross, who teamed with Warwick for a duet on the title track, which has been released as a single.

JOE PERRY

- Rock
Once A Rocker Always A Rocker

MCA 5446-J

Former Aerosmith guitarist Joe Perry, burns his musical signature into this debut for MCA (his third album release) and that includes Gibson and Ovation acoustic guitars, Gibson six string bass, various Stratocasters, and what he describes as his "red string Rich Bitch," lap steel slide and a prototype Bill Lawrence electric, which he calls "the balls", and a Leslie Guitar, six string bass solo on the King Of Kings track. The vocals are handled by Cowboy Mach Bell, who co-writes several of the tracks with Perry - key tracks being Adrianna and King Of The Kings. The remaining members of the quartet are drummer Joe Pet and Danny Hargrove on guitars. Also key is the Marc Bolan penning of Bang A Gong. Perry emphasises "there are no synthesizers on this album." The sax inserts are provided by Jim Biggins and Ric Cunningham.

Flanked by a competent and subtle group of musicians, Miss Baez touched on a number of relevant topics, notably the threat of nuclear disaster, and her perspective on American intervention in Central America. One is left with the feeling that as time goes on, there are fewer such people left to remind us of our tunnel-vision and sheer stupidity in a world which we all must share.

THE WHOLIGANS

Tony's East - Toronto - Oct 21/83

One of the numerous "copy" bands to spring up over the last few years, The Wholigans have managed to transcend a genre which can very quickly wear out its welcome. The secret seems to be in their very caring approach to the material, and the passion displayed in its delivery. Lead singer Barry and guitarist Gerrard must be credited with a sense for the theatrical as well as the intrinsic musical elements of the Who's music. Two one-hour sets are set down with minimal comprise to the original material. Bassist Steve and drummer Paul round out the group, and contribute to the impression of a young and very energetic Who.

THE BLUSHING BRIDES

El Mocambo - Toronto - Oct 22/83

Once the pre-eminent imitators of the Stones, the Brides have decided on a course which sees them including much of their own original material in their show. Guitarist Paul indicates that he has pretty well accomplished what he set out to do in 1979 when he formed the original band. Several personnel changes later, we have a very credible outfit, still delivering the old chestnuts, but adding their own distinctive touch to the material. Reception to the band has remained extremely good, notably in the U.S., where they have packed clubs in several major markets. While the presentation has the potential to verge on parody, the feel is more one of reverence for a particular time and place in rock and roll. With several demos about to be completed, there should be some sort of release shortly from this fascinating bunch of upstarts.
