



Murray's new single a jarring commentary

Toronto: Says Balmur's President Leonard Ramebeau, "Anne Murray's new single is going to be the next big one for us. Not just another record launch — an event." Murray's Black/Bourke/Rocco penning of *A Little Good News*, has a kick that will no doubt be felt at every city editor's desk across the civilized world, but will find favour in the U.S. White House, where President Reagan has been criticising the news media for their "bad news" reporting.

Murray's punch rolls out with the lines:

"There's a local paper
rolled up in a rubber band.
One more sad story's
one more than I can stand.
Just once how I'd like to see
the headlines say,
Not much to print today,
Can't find nothing bad to say."

The single was taken from the album of the same title set for release this month.

Having taken six weeks off to holiday in her native Nova Scotia, Anne Murray is currently playing major U.S. fair dates. These included the Ohio and Indiana State Fairs, the Front Row Theatre in Cleveland, and coming up, Pine Knob Theatre in Detroit (Sept 1-3), Kansas City's Starlight Theatre (7), the Nebraska State Fair (8), the Carlton West in Green Bay (9), Lafayette's Purdue University (10) and the Kansas State Fair in Hutchinson, Kansas (11). The only Canadian date for the rest of 1983 will be two nights at Hamilton Place (Sept 21-22), celebrating that theatre's 10th Anniversary.

The Country Music Association (CMA) is celebrating its 25th Anniversary in October and Anne Murray will be the first non-American to ever host the Awards show in its 17 year history. She will co-host the CBS-TV televised October show with Willie Nelson. As well, in October she will headline her annual Harrah's engagement in Lake Tahoe,

Island scores Cancon with Martha single

Toronto: Martha (Lady) one of the Martha's from *Martha And The Muffins*, is capturing a piece of the contemporary adult market with her Island solo, *Light Years From Now*. The release is the first results from the Martha/Brett Wickens songwriting partnership. They co-wrote both the plug side and the flip, *Dramas Of The Human Heart*, of this Steve Nye production.

Martha is featured on the single as vocalist and on synthesizers. Wickens is featured on synthesizer, piano and harpsichord. Other musicians are New Order's Peter Hook, bass; Jamie Lane, percussion and Paul Hirsch, pan pipes. The strings were arranged by Simon Jeffes.

Producer Nye's credits include Roxy Music, Bryan Ferry, Japan and The Walk, most recent single release by The Cure.

Original bands used in Labatt's Blue ads

Toronto: If the songs you've heard on radio in the Labatt's Blue beer commercials sound familiar it's because the original artists recorded them.

Toronto can be heard singing Blue's lyrics to the melody of their hit single *Your Daddy Don't Know*. The Tenants cover their own *Sheriff*, while Trooper sing a version *The Boys In The Bright White Sports Car*. As well, the Powder Blues hit *Thirsty Ears* fits right in with a beer commercial.

Other artists who have recorded commercials for the company include the Good Brothers, Lisa Dal Bello, the Nylons and even Peggy Lee.

"It was worked out with the groups to record these songs so that they would be immediately recognized," said Kevin Brady, of J. Walter Thompson, one of the advertising agencies for Labatt's Blue. "The songs are also closer to the band and in a more true form."

Brady explained that these acts were picked because they're Canadian, pointing out however, that they're not forced to use Canadian artists and compositions.

"The groups appeal to a youth-oriented audience and each has a different sound and trend. The commercials will be running for about a year and then we'll be assessing the position of the campaign. We have done some research and the reaction seems positive."

"I feel the bands were pleased and it was super to work with them. We had a lot of fun and it's good experience for the bands."

Brady pointed out that the consumers are getting older and seem to hold onto rock songs longer. He explained that the reason beer companies are becoming more involved in sponsoring and presenting rock concerts and festivals is because five to ten years ago, there was more liquor legislation when it came to sponsoring these types of events.

"Now things are more competitive and we need more ways to reach our audience," he said.

Tom Williams to retire from Attic Records

Toronto: Tom Williams, Vice-President of Attic Records, announced that on September 30, 1983, he will be retiring from the company, from a position he has held since the label was formed by he and President Alexander Mair in 1974.

"It is with some regret that I leave a company that I have spent 10 years helping build,







Now, Underground Records (Tony Baylis) is releasing that original single by Priscilla, which was written by Warwick Webster of Orillia, Ontario. The single was cut in the studios of CFPL in London. The follow-up single to *Raincoat* was *Me & My Bester Feller*, which also reached the Top 10 in the U.S.

I didn't know that!!

Did you know that of the recording acts on a major U.S. trade chart, 60% are non-U.S. acts, and of that the U.K. leads, followed by Australia and just take a look at who's third . . . Canada!!!

Kenny Harris goes south!!

Kenny Harris has given up on the record business, his Starbird label at any rate. He has been appointed Promotion Manager for the Bermuda Broadcasting Company. Kenny was previously Production Manager at Bermuda's ZBM Radio and Television and had worked at CKNW/CFMI in Vancouver prior to that. He's apparently still going to be looking after the acts that were signed to Starbird.

Baker selling groceries??

Carroll Baker, currently creating a stir in the country and contemporary adult markets with her *Tembo* single, *Right Or Wrong*, has entered the commercial field. She has just completed the audio portion of English/French radio and TV commercials for Save Easy Grocery Chain, to be shown in the Maritimes. The commercials were recorded in Nashville.

U.S. coup for Quality!!!

Quality's New York office has finally paid off with a single release that could pay the hydro for the next couple of years. John Driscoll, Quality's A&R Director, was in New York and heard a medley of *Do It Again/Billie Jean*, a mix of Michael Jackson's *Billie Jean* and Steely Dan's *Do It Again*. The single was an Italian import by Clubhouse. Driscoll tried to get rights to the single, but found that Atlantic already had it sewed up. Driscoll called Jack Tann in Detroit, an expert on funk and over a weekend they had recorded a single and released it as a 7" and 12" by a group they tagged *Slingshot* and "voila" Driscoll had a hit, racking up sales of over 100,000 copies in the U.S. A Canadian release is now beginning to get under way.

Joint active in U.S.

Joint Communications has been active in the U.S. for sometime and were responsible for developing NBC's new Friday Night Video show, which premiered a couple of weeks ago. This show gives many Americans, and Canadians in the border areas, an opportunity to see what rock videos are all about. MTV doesn't cover the continent completely, as yet. Apparently the NBC show has pulled in good ratings, and doubled their shares for any previous shows.

Cancon tops Videofile!!

Safety Dance, the video by Men Without Hats, tops Videofile's RockAmerica chart

for the month of August. This is the only Cancon listing on the chart. They are followed by Culture Club's *I'll Tumble 4 Ya*, Eurythmics' *Sweet Dreams*, Human League's *Fascination*, and *Billie Jean* by Michael Jackson. On Videofile's Mainstream Chart, Michael Jackson's *Beat It* tops the list, followed by *Every Breath You Take* by Police, *Donna Summer's She Works Hard*, Robert Palmer's *In My System*, and Greg Kihn Band's *Jeopardy*. Videofile is based in New York and they've got a very good handle on video popularity.


HOME GAME (A Novel)


Paul Quarrington is a Toronto musician. He's also a sportswriter, a playwright, a songwriter and, obviously, from this release a writer of exceptional "story-book stuff," to use his vernacular, which is as far from the music scene as imaginable. Why discuss a book that isn't about music in a music trade



paper? Well, Mr. Quarrington is as much a part of the music community as Loverboy, Carole Pope, Bruce Cockburn, Anne Murray, Bryan Adams and more only, here he reveals another talent that perhaps many of his musical counterparts wish they had. Mr. Quarrington is "between hits," not that he ever had one. He did however, perform in a group with the unforgettable name of Manure. Then he joined The Joe Hall Band where he supplied vocals, bass and harmonium, all of which were part of a couple of albums, *On The Avenue* and *Rancho Banano*, both of which probably can be picked up in flea markets for about 99 cents. He teamed with Martin Worthy and had what his publicist describes as "a hit single" with *Baby And The Blues*. He is currently performing with a group known as The Suits. Is Mr. Quarrington a better novelist than a musician? Perhaps his musical talents have yet to bloom, but his professional approach to writing goes without saying. Mr. Quarrington has conjured up many weird characters, who have some very interesting speaking parts in a strange setting. Perhaps his travels as a musician supplied him this insight. Here you have a marooned circus sideshow troupe and a former baseball star, in a small Michigan village, hung up on fundamental religion, something similar to the bible-belt of the South. Mr. Quarrington's characters make for good company on a long trip. His bid for the literary brass bring - on a scale of 10, could be somewhere around six - which isn't bad!!!



C-Weed Band - alive and well and living in Winnipeg

Contrary to rumours of the opposite, the C-Weed Band are alive and well and living in Winnipeg. As one observer put it: "They're still living up to their reputation of being the hardest working group of musicians in Canada (bar none)."

They are enjoying one of the best summers in their career, packing crowds into clubs,

dance halls and at concerts and, says one of their closest friends, "still spending money like crazy. What recession? How do you spell 'inflation' in Ojibway?"

Winnipeg's favourite native sons, C-Weed comprises Clint Dutiaume, an amazing fiddle player, Wally Ranville on bass, drummer Don Ranville and C-Weed himself, who does the smooth rhythm guitar work. Their contemporary country-rock tunes are augmented with clean country standards, often enhanced on their tours by the addition of Craig Fotheringham (keyboards and lead guitar), who is also their studio producer, and

Manitoba's Instrumentalist of the Year, Jim Flett, a former member of the group, and steelman Clyde Roulette. The mix for their tours is looked after by one of the better sound men in the business, Fred (The Gun) Hayes, with the lighting by Don (D.H.) Henderson.

Touring has been the staff of life for C-Weed, they certainly haven't set any prairie fires with record releases. They did release two albums, a few years ago, both of which they've milked pretty dry. However, the future is looking good. They've just completed the final mixes of their new album, titled *Going The Distance*. Their close friend describes the album as "consistent, clean and it kicks shit around and is laid back just enough to also appease the traditionalists." Most of the album is original C-Weed, but they've also borrowed *The End Is Not In Sight* from Those Amazing Rhythm Aces and *Clovis, N.M.* described as "a Bocephus classic." One of the standout tracks is titled *Draggin' The Bow* where they let Clint Dutiaume loose with his fiddle. Another noteworthy track is *The Ballad Of The C-Weed Band*, penned by Billy Green of Winnipeg. Other titles include *My Favourite*

Moroder produces France Joli!!

The latest album from Montrealer France Joli, who recently signed to Epic, credits Giorgi Moroder as exec producer. Moroder is known for his work with Donna Summer and Flashdance's Irene Cara. Titled *Attitude*, the album includes a cover version of the Holland/Dozier/Holland penning of *Standing In The Shadows Of Love*, which was a '60s hit for the Supremes. Background vocals are by Gladys Knight's vocal group, The Pips. Joli is perhaps best remembered for her past hit, *Come To Me*.

New McLauchlan album set

Timberland, the next album from Murray McLauchlan, originally expected for a late August release, is now set for mid-September. Produced by McLauchlan at Kensington Sound in Toronto, session people included former Rough Trade members drummer Bucky Berger and Terry Wilkins. A tour is expected shortly. McLauchlan has been kept busy playing several festivals over the summer months.

Two singles from Axe

The Toronto-based Axe label has released singles by Hooples and Fergus Hambleton. Hooples, formerly Major Hooples' Boarding House, are off with *Trudy*, written by group member David Lodge. The flip from the Kitchener group is the Richard Howell penning of *Easy*. Both the plug side, *Movin' Around*, and the flip, *Ride Alone*, on the Hambleton single are his own originals. Both Axe releases were produced by Greg Hambleton, who heads up the Axe label.

Dunseith leaves CBS

Bert Dunseith, a long-time employee of CBS Records Canada and who for the last 3½ years has been Vice President Special Products and Direct Marketing, has left the company, effective Aug 11. Personal reasons were cited for his leaving. Len Friedman will assume Mr. Dunseith's duties, reporting

directly to Jack Robertson, Senior Vice President, Operations.

Arpin on sick call!!

John Arpin is watching the progress of his first Tembo release, *Do It Standing Up*, flat on his back in Mount Sinai Hospital in



Toronto. John is recuperating from back surgery and is expected to be out of action until the first week in September. Says John, "It's a good thing my single wasn't called *Do It Sitting Down*."

Briley heating up in U.S.

Martin Briley, a well-known sideman, is gaining recognition as a solo recording artist with his debut Attic album, *One Night With A Stranger*. The album, and the single, *Salt In My Tears*, are beginning to take hold in the U.S. where his Salt video is currently in heavy rotation on MTV. Briley, besides playing on name sessions (Ian Hunter, Cliff Richard and most recently Bonnie Tyler) has had his material recorded by Barry Manilow, Pat Benatar and Karla DeVito. At one time he was a member of the house band on Britain's *Top Of The Pops*. Says Briley, "I'm just getting a touring group together and don't be surprised if we pop up in Canada later this year."

Song, *The Magic In The Music*, *Pick-Up Truck Cowboy*, and *Bringing Home The Good Times*, all of which sounds like a chronicle of the C-Weed Band's experiences of fifteen years of being on the road.

Also completed are the bed tracks of an instrumental album featuring Clint's fiddle, backed by the rest of the C-Weed crew. And, making up for lost time, C-Weed have yet another album in the works with some of the bed tracks already done. This project however, will be taking another direction, recording in a Toronto studio where C-Weed is looking forward to working with a few of the professional session people they've been hearing about.

Now for the shopping and contacting that is so much a part of the business. Label deals that went sour over the years have made C-Weed very cautious, so they are taking each step very carefully, and one at a time. Says C-Weed: "The C-Weed Band have long hesitated to enter the already overcrowded market of independents but how the hell else do we contend with the ever increasing demand for our records?" He continues with "We've got the audited figures of our sales to date. We know exactly where we stand in relation to other Canadian award winning artists. We know exactly where our market is. As far as we have been able to determine in all our years of being in business, money is money, art is art, no matter where in the nation it is derived from. We also know that music lovers everywhere will pay for a product that is decent and available. They'll get their money's worth from us, and that's a promise."

A major plus for C-Weed is the fulltime attention that will be given the group by manager Brian Ranville, who has "resigned from Her Majesties' Service, after twelve years in the Indian business in government." Brian is handling all promotion and publicity for the group, while C-Weed will continue to look after all bookings and road management. The group's business management has been turned over to the Winnipeg management firm of The Indian Business Development Group (DBDG) of which Bill Shead and Marion Iornquill-Meadmore are principals.

Toronto goes platinum with Girls Night Out

Toronto: Girls Night Out, the Toronto group's most recent album release, has gone platinum after only four weeks of release. Platinum status is nothing new for this Solid Gold Group, whose previous three albums also topped the magic 100,000 units sold mark. Says Brian Allen, lead guitarist and principal songwriter for Toronto: "I'm very pleased that the public has been so supportive of the new album. We worked hard to create a strong product, and are encouraged that old and new fans are responding so well."

The title track, taken as the first single from the album has also made impressive gains with programmers. All I Need has been released as the follow-up single.

An extensive tour of Canada for September and October, is now being pencilled in. A firm date for the beginning of the tour has been set as Saint John, New Brunswick for Sept. 1.

When Q-107 went to air seven years ago, its originators Dave Charles and John Parikh hoped to satisfy Toronto listeners caught somewhere between rock-oriented CHUM-FM and the softer CKFM. Enter station manager Gary Slaight, one year later, and the station's mellow-rock days were over.

"When I took over," says Slaight, "I just figured that CHUM-FM wasn't providing a true rock and roll type of situation in Toronto, so we went right after that market, anywhere from taking the slogan, 'Toronto's best rock' to getting rid of a lot of music that you could hear on CKFM."

Since that time six years ago, Slaight has proven that Toronto listeners appreciate the broadened choice on the FM dial. Last spring, Q-107 triumphed over its rival CHUM-FM. While the latest book wasn't quite as overwhelming, Q-107 has certainly reaffirmed its position as a secure force in Toronto.

Q-107's desire to achieve high standards and ratings has meant the use from the beginning of a radio consultant, something Slaight understates isn't a necessity, just a "matter of making your station the best possible. All that (consultants) really do is add to your perspective of things. It's someone to bounce ideas off, and perhaps to come in with the odd good idea."

He adds, "We get a little isolated here in Toronto, and to have somebody who lives in a different market come into town every three months and sit back and objectively listen to what's going on and then say, 'okay, here's the way I see things right now,' as opposed to myself, who's here all the time and . . . just sort of taking some things for granted."

BPA award to CBC


At the Broadcasters Promotion Association (BPA) Awards ceremonies recently held in New Orleans, CBC Ontario Region Publicity Services of Toronto was awarded an International Gold Medallion in the category of Special Projects — Radio (Small Market) for the campaign to promote CBQ's Radiothon '82. This marks the second International Gold Medallion won by the department in three years. The Gold Medallion is the highest award given in each category by the BPA and entries come from all over the continent. The campaign involved an 11-hour CBQ live broadcast designed to raise money for the Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestra. The team responsible for the win includes Graphic Artist Ken Zealley, Public Relations Officer George Snell, Promo Producer Susan Grant, Supervisor of Publicity Services John Muldoon, and Bill Prentice, Radio Publicity Coordinator at the time. The promotion incorporated newspaper ads, flyers, posters, buttons, and a series of radio promos with all printed material centred around a fictional character named Hermie Hoser.

One thing Slaight does not take for granted is their competition — a battle that has broadened from a head-on duo between the "Mighty Q" and CHUM-FM to include AM strongholds CFTR and CHUM as well as Buffalo stations such as Rock 102. In some

ways, this has meant that an FM station like Q-107 has to rely more heavily on Top 40 hits, a longtime staple of AM radio. "You've got to play the popular songs. The difference (between Q-107 and an AM station) is that we'll play maybe two or three tracks from an album whereas an AM station will concentrate on one track," explains Slaight.

The competition has also meant that Q-107 must take on a much greater role in marketing — with station calendars, posters and sponsorship, for example. This September's "Rockworld", a three-day

Memorial Arena. Sister station CFMS-FM meanwhile, has been continuing its support of the arts by sponsoring four concerts in the J.J. Johannessen Victoria International Festival which ran until August 25. The festival combines some of the world's finest talents performing solos, ensembles, opera and orchestra to make it one of the musical events of the summer in Victoria. The station's roving reporter Len Rowcliffe provided the station's listeners with info on the festival talent and performances with features of two of the artists each week during the event.

Off The Record Specials on CKSL

Nancy Matheson, Promotions Manager for London radio CKSL, reports the premiere of Off The Record Specials. Featuring 60 minutes of rock's hottest acts, the program which is aired Sundays at 10 pm, is hosted by Marty Turner who has been referred to as the "first lady of rock and roll." Turner's programs are heard on more than 250 radio stations in Canada, the U.S., Australia, New Zealand and worldwide through American Forces Radio. Turner, who is with KMET-FM Los Angeles, features such giants as The Who, Bob Seger, The Rolling Stones, Crosby, Stills & Nash, and others.

CHEX expands playlist

In an effort to get more new product on the air and to do it sooner, CHEX Peterborough Program Director Gordon Gibb reports that

lifestyle fair at Toronto's Queen Elizabeth Building, is another example of the station's activity outside of the studio.

Slaight explains FM's broadened role: "When FM was just starting, it wasn't expected to be a moneymaker . . . With the popularity and growth of FM, and the slight demise of AM over the last few years, it's important for owners of radio stations to make money from their FM stations as well as their AM stations." For Q-107, this means "you have to spend money to compete, you have to be visible, and you have to market your product correctly to have people at least trying it."

A good portion of Q-107's success, says Slaight, can be attributed to the station's tie-in with the local music scene. This is most noticeable in the station's successful Homegrown competition, a search for local talent that culminates in the release of an album every year. Q-107's Samantha Taylor notes that after five Homegrown contests, "as the years have progressed, a lot of different bands have come out of it." Taylor says the group Santers is a good example of a Homegrown success. The group, she notes, "is not only doing very well here in Canada, but has received rave reviews in England." Boys Brigade is another Homegrown triumph; the band recently released their initial album on the Anthem label. Taylor expects this year's Homegrown album will also yield it's share of "artists that are really talented."

Slaight says Q-107's announcers are another factor in the station's success. "I think our announcers have more personality than our competition's," he says. As well, Slaight adds, "We are perhaps a little looser, a little more free-form than CHUM-FM, and I think we'll try new things . . . We're not stuck in traditional formats."

Slaight doesn't claim all his ideas are original, just new to Toronto. "A lot of times we'll hear about something in the States and modify it . . . The idea is to offer new things to the listening audience in Toronto — if they haven't heard it before, then it's new to them."

The search for new ideas to try on Toronto listeners blends with the consistency of the station. "People know we're consistent," says Slaight. "They know that when they turn our station on they're going to hear a certain sound and a certain type of radio."

they have expanded their playlist, but have also condensed their Hitlist from 30 to 25 songs. Gibb noted that they anticipated more new product for summer and expanded the playlist just in time. He explained that although there's a reduction in chart positions, it allows a slightly higher rotation for the chart as a whole, increasing airplay for songs that are, or on their way to becoming hits. Gibb pointed out that the chances of charting a song have diminished by five, but if charted, a song will be played more often. Lastly, Gibb reported that CHEX has added a Top Five album list, which will be expanded on at a later date.

Produced by David Bendeth, a guitarist and recording artist of note, Wrabit make their strongest bid for the AOR and CHR market to date. *West Side Kid* is a high-energy, densely-textured package of rock that could be the door-opener they've been looking for. *Say Lady Say*, penned by guitarist John Albani, has been taken as a single and it's fairly representative of the rest of the album. This track gives lead vocalist Lou Nadeau lots of meaty lyric

content for his clean, punchy projection. Nadeau, solo wrote *Young Girl*, a choice track and teamed with Albani for *Best Of Love*, also a lead track which features excellent horn work by Earl Seymour and Vern Dodge, soloing on tenor saxes. Albani is the upfront vocalist on his own penning of *Lin*, a track that shouldn't be overlooked. Remaining members of Wrabit are bassist Chris Brockway, drummer Gary Craig, Lou Pomicanti, keyboards and John Rutledge, background vocals. Lyrics included.



HEART

Passionworks - Epic QE-38800-H

Produced by Keith Olsen, the sisters Wilson, Ann and Nancy, bounce back with this very strong offering that should attract the AOR programmer. *Johnny Moon* and *Together Now*, co-written by the Wilsons and Sue Ennis, both have a softer edge that would make good programming for CHR stations. *How Can I Refuse* has been taken as a single and this portrays Ann Wilson's biting projection, a reminder of their initial thrust into the market. Besides the Wilsons, Heart comprises Howard Leese, guitars and synthesizers; drummer Denny Carmassi; and bassist Mark Andes and, of course, Nancy on guitars and synthesizers.
