Female artists in Canada more on ball - Cameron

Toronto: Noting the number of Canadian female artists on the Capitol Records Roster Dean Cameron, Vice President of Talent Acquisition & Artist Development for the company, says that female artists appear to have more on the ball.

"I'm always trying to keep the roster balanced," he said. "But we seem to have a lot of female artists. Some of the more interesting artists over the past while have been female. There are still a couple of things on our shopping list."

Cameron reported that the company received approximately the same number of tapes last year as they did in 1982.

"The ratio of newer music is coming along. About 99 percent of the tapes we receive are pretty useless. There's a lot of unsolicited stuff, but the quality is getting better. I think there's a more profound awareness of the business. They're being exposed to more domestic material."

Cameron says there are still a lot of rock bands out west that bear a listen to, while more new music has been emerging from the Ottawa and Toronto areas.

"We still get a lot of country and most of the tapes are from the west. Perhaps there's a bit more money and awareness of the business out there. Most of the music out west is pop. Loverboy is an old fashioned rock band, but they can't hold a candle to Rush. Some of the classier acts are from the central and eastern regions."

Cameron felt a lot more names are going to be emerging from the Atlantic provinces, noting that many artists may find themselves moving to the Toronto area.

"We at Capitol definitely have the most Canadian acts and a great deal of our income comes from those acts," he stressed. "A lot of Canadian record companies are taking chances on something new. I would dare somebody to step forward and challenge us."

Cameron also sees the return of the hit single as a major contributor to the industry.

Explains Cameron, "Even U2 has a hit single. The hit single today is even more

Shirley Eikhard kicks off new year with Rumours

Toronto: Local singer-songwriter Shirley Eikhard has begun 1984 with Rumours, not the kind that are spread by word of mouth, but the name of her new single released on her own Eika record label.

Produced by Randy Kumano, the song is composed by both Kumano and Eikhard. The guitar work on the single was contributed by Dave Grey of The Parachute Club.

In addition, WEA Music of Canada recently released the single Drivin' Wheel by Emmylou Harris. With a quick check on the B-Side programmers will discover that the disc contains the Shirley Eikhard composition Good News, recorded by Harris.

Rumours follows Eikhard's previous single, Clever Girl, released last year. A new album is expected from the Toronto singer-songwriter this year.

Cameron says an act will sometimes be signed on the basis of seeing the group live before hearing the tape. He said it happens more often in Toronto.

"It's just the proximity of the record industry. Toronto still has the biggest club scene, the biggest radio stations, the biggest club market and the most agencies."

CFNY-FM makes gains in Toronto market

Toronto: As predicted, CFNY-FM has become a formidable broadcast force in Toronto radio since moving to the CN Tower, the latter part of last year.

On-air personalities Pete N' Geets, recently voted Top Morning Personalities by Toronto Sun readers, was an indication of things to come. Now, the Birch Report (week of Feb. 20), brings CFNY-FM into further prominence, showing them ahead of Q107 and even with CHUM-FM.

A major factor in the popularity of CFNY has been their close communication with listeners, and listening to what their listeners had to say. One of the more popular promotions for the station has been their annual U-Know Awards that have blossomed into a full-scale sit down dinner and awards show.

Last year, the Concert Hall Ballroom of the Royal York Hotel was packed to capacity (1,500) by listeners who had paid a \$45. tab to watch international and Canadian artists they had voted for, accept their U-Know award.

This year's show will be once again held at the Royal York Hotel and tickets are going fast for the April 2nd. date.

Camp LP supported with club dates

Toronto: Cherie Camp, newly signed to the WEA label, gives a boost to her initial album release with several club dates in the Ontario market. Her self-titled album was produced by Gene Martynec. Track has been taken as a single.

Camp and her band have been performing primarily in the Toronto area but will be expanding into other centres. They are currently at Albert's Hall at Toronto's Brunswick House (Feb. 20 to 25), followed by Ottawa's San Antonio Rose (Feb. 29 to Mar. 3), back to Toronto and the Cabana Room (16) and the Rivoli (30).

Camp, who studied piano and taught herself guitar, was inspired by the music of the '30s and '40s and also had a penchant for acting, which led her to study drama at Queen's University in Kingston. Graduating in 1977 she became a member of Available Space, performing three-part harmony and blues. The group released a CBC produced album in 1980 but after a tour of the country, decided to pack it in.

Speaking of her new album and producer, Gene Martynec, Camp told RPM, "Gene's value is that he brings out the artist. He lets you record the way you hear it, which was

Andrusco release gets jump on British single

Toronto: Canadian programmer reaction to the Billy Andrusco album, *Billy*, has been decidedly positive, particularly for the *Thorn Birds* Theme, a track that many programmers carted. However, in view of these positives, plus recommendations from the field, RCA rush released the *Thorn Birds* track as the first single from the album. Both the single and album are released on the Montreal-based *Globe* label, which is distributed by RCA.

A British recording of the theme has been having much success in the U.K. and it's expected that Andrusco's *Cancon* release will short circuit the British single's chances in Canada.

The Andrusco album was produced in Montreal by veteran producer Bob Hahn.

ideal for us because we were anxious to record our own arrangements.

"I have this feeling that male artists are allowed to take more chances. Females have less chance if the music is left field. There's certainly sexual stereotyping in video, predominantly a male point of view."

Camp believes there's a lot of rock music that is inherently sexist, stressing that an artist should be aware of this.

"I do miss theatre and hope to do more acting," she continues. "With music you can combine the mediums. I chose music because I enjoy writing. It's an easier art form and there are problems in theatre."

Camp pointed out that she had never pursued a record deal until last year and felt it was a combination of luck and timing that she signed with WEA.

"I think the Canadian music scene is changing. Toronto is artistically healthy and there are a lot of interesting bands. There's been a trend toward independent record production and I think it's good that people are taking that step. It's pretty hard to sell records here."

Ottawa: Dave MacDonald, who made his entry into the recording business through releases on the Diana label, has gone on to find recognition on the Broadway stage and in America's film industry. Says Ralph Mongeau, President of the Diana label, "There are so many things happening with Dave that it's hard to believe. Starting from the Sparks Street Mall to Broadway and into movies and entirely on his own with a little help from a few people including RPM."

MacDonald made an impression on Broadway audiences when he played a major roll in Rock 'N Roll - The First 5000 Years. When the musical closed he was signed to appear in American Passion, which opened at the Joyce Theatre in New York last June. He had however, impressed Paramount Pictures people to such an extent that they helped obtain his release from the show so he could play a part in

C.S. Angels continue North American bid

Toronto: C.S. Angels, a British rock quartet may have been forced to make a name change for the North American market, but the band isn't being deterred from establishing themselves in Canada.

Released on the Jive label, which is distributed in Canada by Quality, their current album, Land, was produced by Mike Howlett, who has worked with several name British acts including A Flock Of Seagulls and O.M.D.

The band comprises guitarist Stephen Fellows, keyboardist Andy Peake, drummer Mike Glaisher and bassist Kevin Bacon.

The group ran into problems while on a small tour of North America when their name, which was Comsat Angels at the time, caught the attention of Communications Satellite Inc., a Texas-based high-tech firm known on the stock exchange as Comsat.

The company was granted an injunction barring the group from using the name. With several weeks left for their tour the band was forced to return to England, but continue to use their original title at home, but not here.

"We were kind of angry about changing our name at first," Fellows told RPM. "But after a while, you get used to it. It's not as important as playing North America. This company claimed a copyright on the name. We originally found the name in a book by J.G. Ballard. It was about a bizarre U.S. football team."


There is apparently no regrets by the group in not keeping their original name.

"It seems that many groups starting out change their name from week to week. Our earlier band had been going for about a year and the material was awful. So we decided to split up and got back together later to try something new, change our name and do something unique."

Quality is currently mapping a hefty promotional campaign for the group's album, which is expected to be bolstered by a tour of Canada.

a movie titled Joy Of Sex. Hollywood's doors were wide open for the young singer and he later found himself playing a part in a Columbia picture with a group called Invisible Pedestrians, in which he is featured on lead vocals. There is apparently some connection with EMI on this production.

his foot in the door of recording and while in New York, taped a recording session. Jeanne Napoli, who is a featured columnist with Entertainment New York magazine, co-produced the session for MacDonald with Lincoln Clapp. Napoli also co-wrote the plug side, Scene Stealer, with keyboardist Allen Scott. Bill Jones on sax and Russell Velazquez on background vocals, had a part in the making of the record which was recently released on the Diana label.

There is no Canon on the single. However, the record, if judged on its merits as exceptionally well-produced and featuring a superb vocal talent, there should be no hesitation in getting adult contemporary airplay. Diana Records is based in Ottawa.

Toronto's Greatest Hits released by Solid Gold

Toronto: Solid Gold has released the best of package, Toronto's Greatest Hits, and LP which highlights the two previously unreleased tracks, Andrea and Me Generation.

Also included are Your Daddy Don't Know, Looking For Trouble, Enough Is Enough, Start Telling The Truth, and Even The Score. The songs, with the exception of the two just released, come from the group's four previous albums, Lookin' For Trouble, Head On, Get It On Credit and Girls Night Out.

Pringle LP produced at Muscle Shoals studio

Toronto: Aiming for a slight R&B edge to his sound, A&M recording artist Peter Pringle recorded his new album, Fantasies, at Muscle Shoals Studios in Alabama. The album was produced by Barry Beckett.

Fantasies In Your Eyes has been taken as the first single. The album features such legendary session players as bassist David Hood and keyboardist Steve Nathan. The album features a drum computer programmed by Roger Hawkins.

"Outside of demos, this is the first time I've ever recorded with a drum machine," said Pringle. "so this album has a much more contemporary sound. It's fascinating working with drum machines. Where a live drummer will normally speed up or pull back, a drum machine will remain steady, although it feels like it's pulling back."

Pringle, who has captured audiences in both English and French Canada, was looking forward to his Muscle Shoals session. "I really wanted to record with Barry on this album," he noted. "Barry had access to Muscle Shoals and all their musicians. I wanted to incorporate an R&B flavour without giving up what I do. There's a feeling about R&B that I like."

It's expected that Pringle will be touring across Canada in the spring, something the bilingual vocalist has yet to do. In fact, it was only recently when he began to tour.

"It was a big mistake not to tour," he admitted. "It was just easier to do recordings and TV appearances. I thought touring was a hassle. I just wanted to be a recording artist. By not touring I wouldn't have to get my hands dirty."

"But then two things happened. If you don't support your album, you lose sales. And if you don't tour you lose touch with your audience. There was never a demand from the record company that I tour. It was something I decided to do."

Both Pringle and Beckett collaborated on nine songs for the album from an assortment of writers including Barry Mann, Cynthia Weil, Bill LaBounty, and Rob Frazier. His new writing partner, Kevin Hunter, is also the Halifax-born singer's manager.

"I've never been big on just recording my own stuff. If something strikes me, I'll record it. It's the kiss of death if you just record your own material and I've known a lot of people who have died doing it."

His music form has never been a problem to him with his past releases spanning both the MOR and rock formats.

"Basically I'm an MOR contemporary singer, but it's never been a problem. It's been great. People used to say to me at one time, 'why don't you become a disco star?' If I was, I probably wouldn't have a record deal today because many of them don't. It had been suggested to me on many occasions that this is where the market is, but it was something not lasting. If you can't be true to yourself musically, then there's something wrong."

Pringle will be in Paris during March to record a French-language album with Eddy Marnay and Rene Angelil producing.

Thomas Dolby - the secret is in the background

Being raised by a father who was an archaeologist and having an unusual interest in electronics and meteorology as well as being a ham radio enthusiast might be construed as major factors in the explosive popularity of Thomas Dolby's music. This young Capitol recording artist and computer rock music genius has not only blinded his listeners with science but with sound as well.

The Flat Earth is the most recent album from Dolby, given a giant boost by his runaway hit, Hyperactive, the latter being the subject of two videos - a 7" and 12" version of the track.

Says Peter Gourley, Label Manager for Capitol-EMI of Canada, "This is one of the best videos I've ever seen." POP material is being brought in from the U.S. along with a very special fold-out bio from England.

Gourley reports that Dolby, presently on tour, is expected to play five or six dates in Canada beginning the first week in April.

Videos in the works include I Scare Myself and Dissidents, expected to be singles. As well as producing himself, Thomas Morgan Dolby Robertson (his real name) also writes and directs the production of his videos.

Dolby is considered one of the most important artists dealing with sound, to emerge in new music today. His Golden Age Of Wireless album as well as his mini-LP, Blinded By Science captured an im-

mediate audience and both have surpassed the gold mark in Canada. Gourley pointed out that Science was also the first gold mini-album in the world - a first for the company as well as Canada.

Dolby also garnered attention with the single Europa and the Pirate Twins as well as with the ominous track, One Of Our Submariens, an AOR favourite.

Dolby was born in Cairo, Egypt in 1958 to British parents. Since his father was an archaeologist, Dolby was forced to attend various boarding schools.

Self taught on piano and guitar Dolby became involved in the music business operating a sound system for several name British groups as they toured the U.K. and Europe. He went on to design synthesizers and acquired an interest in computer music, teaming with Bruce Wooley & The Camera Club as well as with the Lene Lovich Band. He wrote New Toy, a single released by the latter. He was also featured on synthesizers on Foreigner's 4 album, which included the hit single, Waiting For A Girl Like You.

By 1980 Dolby had abandoned touring to concentrate on solo work, releasing a single, titled Urges, on an independent label which attracted considerable interest in him for both production and session work.

Forming his own Venice In Peril label in 1981, which was licensed worldwide to EMI, his first album, which featured various guest musicians, spawned the hit Europa And The Pirate Twins.

Dolby created quite a stir with his debut one-man stageshows in Madrid and Barcelona in which he incorporated computer-generated music and video-montage techniques. He also made an impression at home as he toured the U.K. in support of his album, The Golden Age Of Wireless, which was released in North America on the Harvest label. Europa And The Pirate Twins was the first U.S. single.

Featuring the voice of well-known British scientist Dr. Magnus Pyke, Dolby released She Blinded Me With Science in the U.K. in the fall of 1982 with the mini-album following in the spring of 1983.

The Golden Age Of Wireless was re-released and includes the addition of She Blinded Me With Science. This album has since gone gold in Canada and the U.S.

Flat Earth is showing indications of becoming a top seller, much of due to the immediate hit status of Hyperactive, now No. 27 with a bullet on the RPM singles chart after only three weeks.

Dolby's current five-month world tour is one of the most extensive undertaken by a recording artist and includes Canada, the U.S. Australia, Japan, Germany, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Belgium, Finland, Holland, France as well as the U.K.

CBS first to utilize Cr02 for cassettes

Toronto: CBS Records Canada has become the first in the country to introduce chromium dioxide (Cr02) on all their regular pre-recorded cassette tapes, all of which are being made available at no extra cost.

Don Oates, Vice-President, Sales & Marketing for CBS, explained that the current availability of bulk chromium dioxide tape will limit their introduction to new releases only. However, it's expected that full production will be underway by early April.

In making the announcement Oates pointed out that "it has been a little disputed fact that the audio quality of a pre-recorded cassette has not met the standards of the LP configuration, but not any longer.

"Chromium dioxide tape makes a difference you can hear," concludes Oates, "and the latest computerized recording techniques bring you a faithful reproduction of the original master."

The new cassettes will carry the artist name and album title highlighted in red ink on white background; Cr02 and chromium dioxide identification on label graphics; full tune listing on front graphic for proper merchandising in single-window long boxes; black screw-type cassette cartridge with gold printing; playback directions for the consumer on both the outside and inside panels of the cassette graphic; and complete tune-stacking, timing, writer and production credits on the inside panel, the latter of which will be on all new releases and top-sellers only.
