Ottawa: The Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) has announced the finalists for private broadcasting's most prestigious station awards, the annual Gold Ribbon.

Sponsored by CAB, the Gold Ribbon was established in 1982 and designed to recognize private radio and television stations for their outstanding achievements in the areas of news, Canadian talent development, public affairs, community service, engineering and distinguished service.

Winners of the 1982-83 season, selected from dozens of entries, will be announced Oct. 25, at the Gold Ribbon dinner during the CAB/CBA Communications Expo '83 Conference and Trade Show in Toronto.

CAB's Gerry Acton points out that "The Gold Ribbon is not just a piece of pretty material, but is broadcasting's newest and most cherished award for excellence, and the ribbon design symbolizes audio tape and video tape, two of the industry's most essential tools."

In the area of news, the finalists were CFCF-TV Montreal, CHAN-TV Vancouver, and CFRN-TV Edmonton. Chosen in the



There's enough in the way of displays and in-store plays as well as video presentations through MTV, to keep the customers happy - and there's a lot of product going out the door. John Walmer, manager of the Discus store in the Pacific Mall, runs an exciting operation as well. Effective displays and in-store play make the customer want to come in and browse and there were a lot of them doing that. There's one major store close to the downtown core that leaves much to be desired. The store doesn't look friendly and once inside, it's obvious there's a don't give a damn attitude.

CMA Awards - a fashion show???

Energized team effort keeps PolyGram on top

Peter Erdmann joined Polydor when he finished high school and now at 50, is in charge of one of the most successful operations in the PolyGram fold. Although the bottom didn't begin to fall out of the record industry until early 1980, it was obvious that as early as 1976, financial problems were beginning to develop. Mr. Erdmann transferred to Polydor Canada as Senior Vice President Finance in 1976 and became President of PolyGram in March of 1981, succeeding Tim Harrold.

Asked about some of the problems that had been plaguing the Canadian operation in the mid-seventies, Erdmann was quick to point out that "The financial problems you are referring to were based on the fact that Polydor at the time had only access to the international Polydor catalogue. Phonogram's catalogue was, at that time, still represented by London Records. Therefore, our financial problem, if you want to refer to it, was a problem of size, and we had to look for additional material, which later came to us via the acquisition of the Casablanca catalogue and by going very strongly into the disco repertoire." He went on to explain that "Eventually, Phonogram transferred to us in January of 1979 and our group acquired the London/Decca catalogue in July of 1980."

North America was a market Erdmann had watched with much interest. However, when the opportunity came about for him to take over the Canadian operation he was somewhat overwhelmed.

"I had to familiarize myself with the North American market, so I was, in that respect, a newcomer," he explains. "I had spent most of my time in the financial end of the business, so being looked on as a firefighter, I knew how to put out a fire. So, what I had to do was to put revenue and costs into proper perspective."

Prior to his Canadian appointment Erdmann had spent ten years with Polydor U.K. where his work was more finance-oriented. He did however, familiarize himself with the complete operation including production and label operations. It was this knowledge that paid off with him bringing the Virgin line to Canada, and which brought PolyGram into the forefront of contemporary, or new music.

"The Virgin line didn't mean much to us in the first three years, but we established a base and when Virgin opened up with more accessible material, we did very well with the label."

The Canadian operation was also the beneficiary of a very strong Phonogram U.K., from which came Dire Straits and Soft Cell, among others.


"I think if you analyze the situation, you will find that PolyGram was the first to get into New Music in a big way," he continued. "The very first break was XTC and then we had much success with the Canadian group, Martha and The Muffins, which was also a Virgin signing. However, the real big breakthrough with New Music was with Human League in 1982 and they have been followed by Culture Club, which was a national No. 1 single for three weeks on the RPM chart."

PolyGram's success is obviously due their heavy concentration on European product,

which might lead one to assume that the Canadian operation is run along lines similar to their European counterparts. "No," replied Erdmann, "I would say our operation is a well-balanced one. Our management and key personnel is 50-50 European background or North American background, plus they have had their ears tuned to New Music coming from England.

Erdmann explained "In the beginning when Polydor didn't have star names, they started off almost exclusively with MOR product — I'm now going back to the mid-sixties. Polydor, at the time almost existed totally on James Last. Roberto Delgado, Horst Wende, Crazy Otto and the Fischer Choir." Polydor's catalogue has always had a very substantial classical element — their top of the line, of course, being the Deutsche Grammophon label. Now, Polydor boasts impressive sales figures for product in almost all music forms.

PolyGram officially launched the Compact Disc in Canada the latter part of July and Erdmann is particularly impressed with the response. The Compact Disc was developed by the PolyGram group of companies, in association with Philips and Sony. There were 150 pre-packs sent out to 150 stores for the launch. The titles represented a mix of pop and classical selections. These included Def Leppard's Pyromania, The Hurting by Tears For Fears, Love Over Gold by Dire Straits, as well as works by Zamfir, James Last, Nana Mouskouri, and Soundtracks, including Flashdance and Saturday Night Fever. Classical offerings include 13 releases by Herbert von Karajan, five recordings by Charles Dutoit and the Montreal Symphony Orchestra, plus a number of opera highlights including performances by Luciano Pavarotti.

Erdmann has had a few too many financial disappointments when it comes to the

domestic market. He explains, "We have not always had success with Canadian product. We had Blue Northern which was not a financial success. We had the Pumps from Winnipeg, which was not a financial success — we were proud of the project but it was not a financial success. There was also Francois Dompierre, with whom we invested large sums of money, and it hasn't paid off. It has paid off in the case of Diane Tell — and Frank Mills was a great success and so was Martha And The Muffins."

Although the financial end has been bleak for their Canadian signings, Erdmann is committed to contributing whatever is financially possible to searching out, recording and breaking Canadian talent. "We will always maintain an open door policy, when it comes to Canadian talent," says Erdmann. "We recently signed Prototype and Dan Hill and we are looking for other signings."

"I have a feeling," explains Erdmann, "that the guaranteed airplay (CRTC content ruling) takes away the competitive edge that we need. If Canadian recording artists realized they are competing, not just within Canada with themselves, but on an international level, perhaps we might determine a new direction for the domestic industry. To go into the studios costs just the same whether your market is Canada or the world. The problem is that in not many cases will Canadian product be accepted outside Canada, so you always have to try to recoup your investment in Canada. You can't rely on your friends outside Canada going along with the project." In explaining what he believes is the international opposition to Canadian product, Erdmann notes, "I use the analogy, if you sing in French, you better come from France, not Belgium. I can't explain it, because people are people and although I don't see why there would be any reason for differentiation between American and Canadian product, you have to realize that America is such a competitive environment. If you cut a record in America, people automatically assume that you are already that much better than those in smaller markets."

The unilingual situation in Quebec has created a few problems for PolyGram, mostly in the packaging area, but very little with employees, many of whom have been with the operation since they opened their Canadian headquarters, tape duplicating operation and central warehousing almost nine years ago, some even before then. This, in itself, would answer the age old question of why doesn't PolyGram move into the central area of Canada (Toronto) where their major counterparts are headquartered. "I must say I enjoy being closer to markets where you have both cultures," explains Erdmann. "Although if you are in Toronto, you might as well be in Detroit, there's not much difference. You think North American and tend to forget about the multicultural aspect of the market."

Erdmann's thinking can't be all that wrong. The year 1982 was disastrous for most Canadian record companies — the industry was down 23%, but PolyGram registered an increase of 15% over that period. "If we had not signed Arista and Attic during that period, we would have still come out slightly ahead of 1981," concludes Erdmann.

Powder Blues: red hot and true blue with new album

Powder Blues leader, guitarist and vocalist Tom Lavin has given his band a shot of rhythm and blues on their latest and new RCA album, *Red Hot/True Blue*.

Produced by Lavin at his Blue Wave studios in B.C., the album is a two-record set and features such titles as Chuck Berry's *Roll Over Beethoven*, B.B. King's *You Know*

What I Mean, the Paul Butterfield composition *Born In Chicago* and several other R&B numbers, as well as Lavin originals including *Pushy*, which has been released as the first single.

Described as "recorded live off the floor in the studios," *Red Hot/True Blue* is the band's first album to receive major attention since *Thirsty Ears*. But Lavin is hoping for another *Uncut*, the band's first album which surpassed the double platinum mark in Canada during 1981. The same year the band was named Best New Group of the Year at the Junos. Their previous album, titled *Party Line*, was modestly received.

Powder Blues observers were critical of the last album, with some believing the band had lost their sense of raw energy, spontaneity and honesty that was essential to the group.

"*Uncut* was really out of left field," said Lavin. "The record companies turned it down. There was nothing else like it at the time. The record industry forgets just how

many bands are blues-based.

"I thought *Party Line* was the best-sounding record we've made and we approached the project the same way that Steely Dan does. But the album didn't sell because it was marketed like a *Streetheart* or *April Wine* album."

Lavin explained that this time, they wanted to do something that was completely honest noting that this is what the Powder Blues is all about.

"The first year we recorded about 90 percent original tunes, but originally we unearthed a lot of rock, blues and R&B. A lot of people were asking why we never recorded the songs. Because we played them live, people related them to us as Powder Blues songs."

"We set everyone up in the studio and recorded the songs virtually live off the floor, all in first takes. We just kept the machine rolling and recorded about 30 tunes and narrowed them down to 18. The recordings are about 95 percent over-dub free."

The singer-guitarist noted that this time, the reaction has been positive.

"Everyone's gone on it this time. They've recognized that the album has got meat and energy. The new album is also a little less brass-oriented." Lavin added that the recording was geared to catch the same live energy that was prevalent on *Uncut*.

The band is currently touring in support of the double set which is being priced close to that of a single LP. The group is expected to tour until the end of the year. They're expected to return to Europe, where they recently completed a successful tour that in-

cluded performances at the Montreux Jazz Festival in Switzerland and the North Sea Jazz/Blues Festival in Holland.

Originally the Montreux organizers had scheduled the Powder Blues to perform for only one day of the two-week event, but ended up booking them for four appearances over three days. As a result of the response, the band has been invited back.

While at Montreux, one of the band's shows was professionally recorded into a one-hour live TV/video special, as well as radio show and future live LP. The concert was simulcast in Switzerland, France and Italy, and is scheduled to be rebroadcast throughout Western Europe. They hope to release the live album next year.

The band's European tour also spawned a number of European record sales. In addition, blues legend James Cotton has asked Lavin to record and produce his next album at Lavin's Vancouver studios.

September certifications topped by *Flashdance*

Toronto: The Canadian record industry had a much better showing for the month of September resulting in 40 certifications in all compared with only 10 for August.

The September list was headed by a quintuple platinum for the soundtrack from the motion picture *Flashdance*. The LP also captured quadruple platinum status.

Other quadruple LPs were *The Best of Charley Pride* and *Let's Dance* from David Bowie.

Only two LPs were certified triple platinum — *H2o* by Daryl Hall & John Oates and *Pyromania* from Def Leppard.


Def Leppard's *Pyromania* also scored double platinum as did *Always On My Mind* by Willie Nelson and *Tranquility* from Zamfir.

Certified gold were: *Billy Joel/An Innocent Man*; *Donna Summer/She Works Hard For The Money*; *ELO/Secret Messages*; *Eurythmics/Sweet Dreams*; *Headpins/Line Of Fire*; *Iron Maiden/Iron Maiden*; *Kenny Rogers/Eyes That See In The Dark*; *Quiet Riot/Metal Health*; *Stevie Ray Vaughan/Texas Flood*; *Tears For Fears/The Hurting*; *Toronto/Girls Night Out*; *Soundtrack/Staying Alive*, and *Waylon Jennings, Willie Nelson, Jessie Colter & Tompall Glaser/The Outlaws*.

Only two singles attained platinum status for September, *Midnight Blue* by Louise Tucker and *Puttin' On The Ritz* from *Taco*.

Singles certified gold were *Total Eclipse Of The Heart* by *Bonnie Tyler*, *China Girl* from *David Bowie*, *She Works Hard For The Money* by *Donna Summer*, *Sweet Dreams (Are Made Of This)* from *Eurythmics* and *Maniac* by *Michael Sembello*.







His roots are bluegrass, which is about as pure country as you can get. While country sales are, to say the least, dismal in Canada, Skaggs managed to reach



platinum status (100,000 units sold) with his last album release, Highways And Heartaches. He is already nearing the top of the RPM Country 50 with You Got A Lover, not included here and he's got a bunch of singles to look forward from this set. Key tracks are (Honey) Open That Door, Keep A Memory, I'm Head Over Heels In Love, and the title track.

The Benatar musical signature is still magic with the AOR and CHR programmers which created an immediate add to charts and playlists for this Neil Geraldo production. release of the powerpack single, Love Is A Battlefield, one of two new studio tracks. The other is Lipstick Lies, perhaps these two tracks aren't in the league of Hit Me With Your Best Shot, written by Canadian Eddie Schwartz and included here, but Benatar has that ongoing wave of rock fire that promises to keep her on the charts for some time. The rest of the album consists of live tracks, familiar to her fans, recorded during her last year's tour. These include Heartbreaker and Fire And Ice.

ALICE COOPER

Da Da - Warner Bros - 92 39691-P - Rock

Alice Cooper sounds a bit out of sorts with this Bob Ezrin production, recorded in Toronto with the added advantage of having Cancon properties, although not indicated on the label copy. The Fairlight Computer programmed by Ezrin, figures prominently in this production. Not too far removed from what the Alice Cooper cultists expect, but there is a change, which is difficult to pinpoint. Perhaps Alice is slightly more out in front than in the past. He is, after all, fighting an incredible electronic (techno-pop) backing that would automatically raise the vocal defense. It's heady stuff and

it could bring Alice back into the mainstream. Key tracks are the Cooper/Ezrin/Dick Wagner (guitars, bass, vocals) penning of Former Lee Warmer, and from the same pen, Fresh Blood with the latter featuring Prakash John on bass and drummer John Anderson, plus the title track with synth-sist Graham Shaw joining the trio as the fourth writer. Lyrics included.

RATIONAL YOUTH

Capitol-EMI - MLP-15012-F

A very popular electronic-rock group from Montreal, Rational Youth are now closing on national recognition, which they should gain rather quickly with this Pat Deserio production. Now, a four-piece group, Rational Youth are Tracy Howe, lead vocals and synthesizers; Kevin Akira Koomoda, keyboards; Denis Duran, bass; and Angel Calvo, drums and percussion. Founder Howe has much experience in the music business having been the front man for Heaven 17 and a member of Men Without Hats. As Rational Youth they have already scored well in the Quebec/Ontario regions with their 1982 album of Cold War Night Life which spawned an English-language City Of The Night single and a French-language Cite Phosphore deck, both of which did very well in Quebec. Howe projects a powerful vocal property that sits rather to the left, yet comfortably with superb synthesizer programming. As electronic-rock becomes more popular Rational Youth should become a major movement in the international field.

ERIC MARTIN BAND

Sucker For A Pretty Face

It's been sometime since a San Francisco band has caused waves in rock circles and the Eric Martin Band could be the wave-makers. Their brand of rock and roll, described as "straight ahead" is fresh and clean. What they have accomplished with their youthful enthusiasm is a steady, flat-out rock without any of the pidgeon-

holing that many new rock groups are saddled with. Produced by Kevin Elson and Rodney Mills, there are several standout tracks and a couple that should be singles. One is Sucker For A Pretty Face, written by Tony Fanucci and the group's lead vocalist Eric Martin and the other is Just Another Pretty Boy, which happens to be two-parts Cancon (ML), penned by Gary O'Connor of Toronto. The other members of the band are keyboardist David Jacobson, guitarist Mark Ross, John Nyman on guitar and keyboards and bassman Tom Duke, all of whom contribute vocals, and drummer Troy Luccketto.

Bopcats rule O.K. So does rockabilly, judging from the number of fans who showed up Saturday night to dance. With little concession to contemporary sounds, this is music rooted firmly in the '50s. While the lineup has altered somewhat since the band's inception, some things never change; Teddy still exhorts the crowd to dance, and spurs guitarist Jack Dekeyzer on with shouts of "go, man go". Bassist Zeke Rivers lays down a rockin' base and gives a stern eye to those foolish enough not to bop. With Graham Shaw's assistance on their forthcoming EP (he did the same on the Da Da album from Alice Cooper), it may be very near the time when this band has the whole country rocking.

Support was provided by Eric Peterson and his band The Rhythm Buzzards. Relatively new on the scene, they were a strong warm-up with a keen sense for covering R&B standards.


