



Response to Purple Rain 'phenomenal' - Johnston

Toronto: In the seven years he has been with WEA Music Canada, the label's Product Manager Bill Johnston can't recall an initial response as strong as the Prince & The Revolution's Purple Rain album.

"Phenomenal is the word, primarily from retail," says Johnston. "Let me summarize it this way. In the first week we tripled our initial order and achieved gold in one week. In the seven years I've been here we can't recall a record that has had that great a re-order pattern in the first week. It was hot right out of the box."

The album contains the music from Purple Rain, the forthcoming motion picture which also stars Prince and is due to open in Canada July 27. Prince has already had an impact with programmers with the release of his single, When Doves Cry,

now an established hit on the RPM singles chart.

The album was produced by Prince & The Revolution who also wrote all the material.

Prince's previous album release which contained his hit, Little Red Corvette, established him in the market, but Johnston tags the Purple Rain release as the one that will make Prince a superstar and expects the album to go double platinum. His last album scored gold in Canada.

"I've seen the movie," continues Johnston, "and it's very powerful. It's a tremendous vehicle with a good performance by Prince. Many are comparing him to Michael Jackson, except that Prince appeals to an older audience. He's also very revolutionary in terms of his music."

"It's a remarkable phenomenon to be so hot so quick. Promoters have been working to bring him here for years. There are now talks of a tour this fall. There's going to be a great demand for him because of the movie."

Heavy Virgin push for new Oldfield release

Toronto: Virgin Records Canada are currently planning a full marketing campaign to support the recently-released Mike Oldfield album, Discovery. Produced by Oldfield and drummer Simon Phillips, the album also highlights vocals by Barry Palmer and Maggie Reilly. The latter worked on past Oldfield projects including his Crisis album.

Britisher Oldfield was the first signing to the Virgin label and is still perhaps best known for his critically-acclaimed Tubular Bells album. Discovery marks his ninth LP for Virgin.

To France, which features the vocals of Reilly, has been issued as a 7" single along with a 12" single which contains In The Pool, and Bones, both of which are instrumentals.

Oldfield, reportedly one of the top-selling singles artists in Europe, is expected to announce a Canadian tour which will take place before Christmas.

United AVSR introduces Talaria projector system

Toronto: United AVSR, the Canadian distributors of the G.E. Talaria video projector, have become the leaders in sales and rental of visual communications equipment.

The Mississauga-based firm was front and centre in popularity (June 28) with a special screening of Culture Club's A Kiss Across The Ocean, using the \$160,000 Talaria video projector and 20-ft screen, introduced in a club atmosphere for the first time in Canada.

The Talaria projector systems have been designed for numerous applications, in areas such as education, business, aerospace, and television production. The projectors provide perfect definition through the use of a single optical path that projects all colour information simultaneously in one light beam. This allows display of picture sizes from 2 to 25 feet wide, and will accept video signals conforming to most television system standards.

CBS Records Canada chalks up record half

Toronto: Last year CBS Records Canada experienced its most successful year in the company's history and now Don Oates, Vice President, Sales & Marketing, has confirmed the company has just chalked up its most successful first half ever.

"Last year was our best and this year is above and beyond that," said Oates. "And we hope to continue with albums like the new Springsteen and the Jacksons, plus our upcoming albums."

Oates couldn't reveal the percentage increase over 1983 due to company rules, but did note that it was a significant increase. Says Oates, "The secret of the company's success is good product, strong sales and marketing, and good support from the manufacturing and distribution departments." He went on to point out that "We also have a broad umbrella of product from artists like Cyndi Lauper to Willie Nelson and Julio Iglesias. It's a wide range. We feel we can carry on the success with forthcoming albums from Neil Diamond, Willie Nelson, and Quiet Riot."

Oates says many critics were giving most of the credit to Michael Jackson, but he pointed out that the company has had several hit albums including the Footloose Soundtrack, now well over triple platinum, and Cindy Lauper's She's So Unusual, now over double platinum. In addition, Platinum Blonde has gone platinum, Springsteen is already over platinum and Billy Joel is about to go over the triple platinum mark.

"In these days of fluctuating dollars and interest rates, you can only hope for increased growth and you find yourself surprised when you get it. We didn't think

Their initial single release, New Girl Now, is enjoying upward movement on the RPM singles chart. The single was taken from their self-titled album.

Ontario dates for the group have seen them play the Astro Lab Theatre in Ottawa, which is to be followed by Sarnia's Campbell Street Station (July 23-25), Spanky's in Brampton (26), the Iroquois Park Arena in Whitby (27), Sudbury's Bell Park Amphitheatre (28), the Thetford Arena (Aug 3), the Memorial Gardens in St. Catharines (10), the Molson Bandshell in Toronto (18-19), and the West Ferris Centre in North Bay (25).

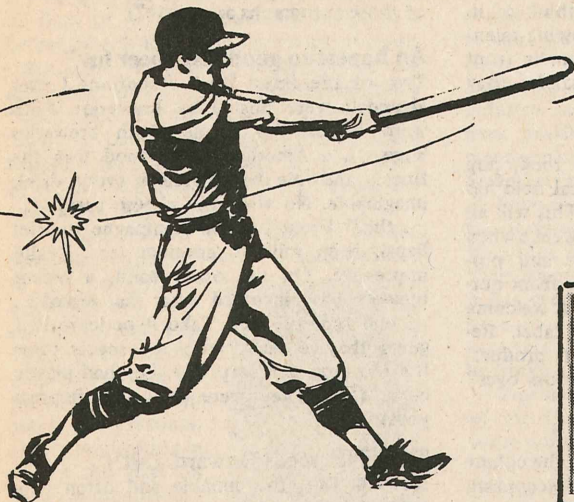

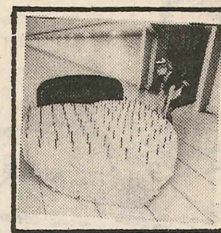

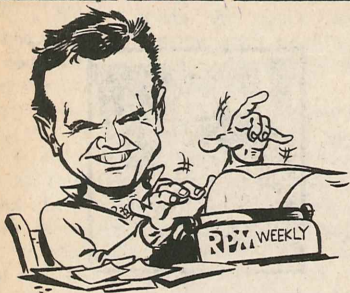

Labatt's Blue & CPI pact concert series

Toronto: The Labatt Brewing Company has announced the signing of a one year promotional agreement with Concert Productions International (CPI). The Toronto part of the agreement includes all grandstand events during this year's Canadian National Exhibition, and 20 other major acts between July and December at various locations.

The brewery has positioned its flagship national brand, Labatt's Blue, against its music involvements, and the theme will be "Labatt's Blue Live." The logo will appear on newspaper advertisements, posters, and various promotional items on site.

The concert series kicks off with the three Bruce Springsteen concerts at Exhibition Stadium (July 23, 24 and 26). Labatt's will also sponsor seven concerts at Ottawa's Central Canada Exhibition in August. Details about out-of-province concerts will be made available at a later date. Six of the concerts will be telecast over a network of syndicated stations later in 1984.

The CNE Grandstand dates, firmed at time of writing are: Frank Zappa and UB40 (Aug 15), Julio Iglesias (16), Scorpions and Quiet Riot (17), Beach Boys (20), Yes (23), Thompson Twins (24), Willie Nelson (27), Rod Stewart (30), and Frank Sinatra (Sept 2).

Just released is an exceptional **Mike Oldfield** album, *Discovery*, and couple that with **Elton John's** *Breaking Hearts* and, given effective front racking, retailers could sell through several times. The singles market isn't showing signs of cooling off either. **Mike Oldfield** should capture across-the-board action with his *To France* single. The charm here, of course, is vocalist **Maggie Reilly**. You can also tag "hit" to **Jermaine Jackson's** single, *Dynamite*, for obvious reasons, and to **Billy Squier's** *Rock Me Tonight*.

MCA adapting to changes in marketing strategies

It's obvious the record industry is in a state of flux, or perhaps confusion would be a better description, with the advent of music video clips, the growing popularity of cassettes over album product and the escalating ticket prices for concerts. In spite of what might be considered negatives, the record industry isn't in jeopardy. In fact, some labels are experiencing the best years and quarters in their history.

"People have to realize that the marketplace has changed; record companies need to be competitor-oriented, not consumer-oriented. You can't just 'throw' product out, and expect that the consumer will automatically buy; you have to get the edge on your competition."

The speaker is Graham Powers, following seven years with CBS in Canada, currently Vice President of Marketing at MCA Records (Canada). The writer recently spoke with Powers, and the conversation centred on how he views MCA's part in the Canadian music industry.

According to Powers, MCA had been, for the most part, a 'branch' operation of the U.S., operating with limited autonomy. "The only thing keeping us going really was Olivia Newton-John and the country acts," Powers goes on to explain. "Then, about 18 months ago, the company brought in the kind of personnel who could attract

the new acts, and work well with them.

"In Canada, Ross Reynolds hired field people, something which wasn't happening before. The same thing occurred in the U.S., where Irving Azoff was brought in. Since the cutbacks in the early '70s, the industry has matured. Middle level people have gravitated to the upper levels of management, so that there is more of a 'street' attitude toward the business."

Powers firmly believes that this attitude has resulted in the success of acts such as Billy Idol, Nik Kershaw, and Tracey Ullman. "The business is probably as steady now as it has ever been," claims Powers, "and you have to devote your energies to breaking new acts; Billy Idol broke in Canada before he broke in the U.S."

Powers was asked about the autonomy of the Canadian operation. "Fortunately, we're not riddled with politics," he explains. "The U.S. trusts us to put the necessary amount of energy into the act; we know our market very well, and they know that we're not unrealistic."

In reply to the question of is there a 'Canadian' sound, as opposed to an American sound, Powers answers: "I think it's

MCA readies new album from Fixx and Joan Jett

Toronto: MCA is gearing up for the highly-anticipated album from Fixx as well as their first release from singer/guitarist Joan Jett. The latter was formerly with CBS.

Aug. 1st has been set for the release of the Fixx single, Our We Ourselves. The album, *Phantoms*, has been scheduled to follow Aug. 15. The group will kick off their Canadian tour on Sept. 27.

Many programmers have already picked up on the Fixx track, *Deeper And Deeper*, which is included on the *Streets Of Fire* soundtrack, also on MCA.

The Jett album, *Glorious Results Of A Mis-Spent Youth* is expected shortly.

New Juice LP from RCA Best Of issued by Capitol

Toronto: RCA, which recently signed Juice Newton, have released their first album by the highly-acclaimed vocalist titled *Can't Wait All Night*, produced by Richard Landis. A *Little Love* has been taken as the first single. A video of this track is also available.

Taking advantage of the timing, Capitol, Newton's former release label, has issued a *Greatest Hits* package. Included are *Angel Of The Morning*, *Love's Been A Little Hard On Me*, and *The Sweetest Thing (I've Ever Known)*.

The RCA release is actually the third LP from the label who had Newton before she went to Capitol.

There is a Cancon feature to the new Newton album as well. The title track, which will be the follow-up single, was co-written by Vancouver's Bryan Adams and Jim Vallance.

generally a question of image. In many cases American acts don't have a face; they're strictly a sound. In the U.S., American acts are more prevalent than foreign acts, whereas in Canada, foreign acts have traditionally received good airplay. Look at Culture Club, Duran Duran, or Spandau Ballet; *Loveboy* has a distinct image which goes along with the music."

In addition to its own product, MCA distributes product for Chrysalis and Island. "The smaller labels are certainly creating a change for the better," says Powers. "Doug (Chappell) and Lee (Silver-sides) are certainly working with some exciting acts; Frankie Goes To Hollywood is doing quite well for Island, especially in the U.K. *Parade*, the new Spandau Ballet release on Chrysalis, should experience the same kind of success that True saw. We have a young and experienced team, with people like Steve (Chrysalis Marketing Manager Stephen Tennant) and Leslie (MCA National Promotion Manager Leslie Soldat) really doing the job."

Powers points up that the same kind of commitment exists at MCA as was exemplified by A&M in the early days of that company, as well as Clive Davis' work at Arista. "We're committed to the artist as well as to the record," Powers asserts, concluding with, "We can't afford not to be; when you break a record, the rewards are there."

Toronto: VideoFACT, the foundation created by the MuchMusic Network to assist in the production of music videos in Canada, has announced the names of the first applicants to be funded.

They are: Jane Siberry (Waitress) on *Duke Street*; the video to be produced by Dick's Flicks;

UNIT E (Mystified) from Mole Productions; video production company is *Alter Image*;

The Box (Must I Always Remember) on *Alert*;

The Singing Fools (Apocalypse) on the Singing Fools label; video to be directed by John Marshall;

Diane Dufresne (Delinquante) on *Kebec Disc*; video to be produced and directed by Andre Perry;

The Jitters (Take Me As I Am); video to be directed by Scott Eldridge and the band is currently negotiating a record contract;

Kim Mitchell (That's A Man), on *Alert*; video to be directed by Robert Bouvier and produced by Video Impact Productions.

The seven applicants shared a total of \$30,200. The next deadline for submission of applications is Aug 31 of this year.

Island's Frankie tops U.K. charts

Toronto: Island's Frankie Goes To Hollywood continues to dominate the U.K. charts, with the current single, *Two Tribes*, maintaining its No. 1 status for the 4th consecutive week; *Relax*, after 33 weeks on the charts, has climbed into the No. 2 position.

Combined sales of *Relax* and *Two Tribes* have now surpassed the 2 million units sold mark in the U.K., with the latter already accounting for over 700,000 sales. In addition, *Two Tribes* recently went to the top of the unpublished 7-inch chart.

Canadian release of *Two Tribes* is scheduled for July 12. In other Island news, the Bob Marley compilation, *Legend*, remains No. 1 on the U.K. album charts, a position it has occupied since release 8 weeks ago.

Harlequin's story continues with self-titled release

Having established themselves as one of the more successful Canadian bands, Harlequin are now on release with their self-titled album on CBS/Epic. RPM recently spoke with bassist Ralph James in Halifax, where he and bandmates George Belanger (vocals), Gary Golden (keyboards), David Budzak

(drums), and Glen Willows (guitarist/vocalist), were relaxing between several dates in the Halifax area. Harlequin's album sales have achieved gold and platinum status, while their singles, (Survive, Innocence, Thinking Of You, and Superstitious Feeling), have all seen strong chart action. The first question concerned the album's producer, Alfie Agius.

How did the relationship with Agius come about? "I guess it's always the same story when it comes to meeting producers," laughs James. "It happens in the strangest ways; we had acquired a new manager, Ted Thrasher, and Ted was a friend of Alfie's. When Alfie was in Toronto, George (vocalist George Belanger), and Glen (guitarist/vocalist Glen Willows) got together with

him and worked out a few ideas together. It was a little different because Alfie was basically a British session musician, not so much a producer as you usually think of it."

Was the record a conscious change in either image or musical direction for Harlequin? "I think with Harlequin, it's simply a continuing evolution," continues James. "It's hard to be objective about ourselves, after eight years together; I know that it's a leaner sounding record, and many people have been commenting on how good George's voice sounds."

Was the video shoot for Take This Heart the band's first experience with the visual medium? "This was our first 'produced' video," James explains. "We had done a CBC program, a live performance, as well as some other TV stuff, but this was the first thing of its kind we had done. I think that we came off quite honestly, and specifically, George came off well. Video can help 'lock in' the good things the audience might think about the band, and I see it as a great new dimension."

Champagne Pictures' Robert Quartly, video's director, was present for the recording of the album's bed tracks, a circumstance, according to James, which

doesn't occur that often. Consequently, the band was prepared for the shoot, and Quartly was familiar with the material under consideration for video support.

Harlequin is slated to begin a national tour sometime in late August, which will bring them from Western Canada, through Ontario, right into the Maritimes. There is also talk of dates in South American markets, although nothing has been confirmed at this point.

James recalls two locales in particular: Puerto Rico and Venezuela. "A lot of South America is opening up," he explains. "Saga has done really well, in fact we opened for them in a baseball stadium in Puerto Rico. In Venezuela, it was our first time, a couple of years ago, and we did two shows in a 7,000 seater. Canadian bands can do very well down there."

James is very happy with the record, and the relationship forged with producer Agius. "It's a thrill to be excited about something again," he continues. "We took a lot of time to make sure that everything was right; a month of pre-production was done with Alfie in Winnipeg, something he wasn't accustomed to . . . Winnipeg, our home . . . in January, isn't the greatest if you've never experienced real winter."

Zappacosta promo push launched by Capitol

Toronto: Capitol has shipped the debut solo album from (Alfie) Zappacosta, the founding member of Surrender, a band that was formed in 1979. The success of the group's No Surrender mini-album led to a new international signing with Capitol as well as a management deal with Lou Blair of Loverboy fame.

The album was produced by Zappacosta with the exception of three tracks which he co-produced with Ed Thacker of Los Angeles. Zappacosta penned most of the material, co-writing Passion with Bob Ezrin.

Capitol describes the album as "melodic pop rock with classical overtones." Plans are underway for a summer tour in support of the album.

Still performing alongside guitarist Zappacosta are former Surrender members, guitarist Steve Jensen and drummer Paul Delaney. The remainder of the band is made up of keyboardist Gerald O'Brian and bassist Mitch Starkman.

Jackson's Victory album leads certification race

The Victory album from the Jacksons has gone platinum in just two weeks. Reaction from the critics has been generally positive. There were a few mixed reviews, but retail-wise the album is doing very well. The next single hasn't been chosen yet.

Springsteen's Born In The USA, is already platinum and a half. He's currently touring east with more dates expected for the west. There's going to be yet another single from the Billy Joel album, An Innocent Man titled Leave A Tender Moment Alone. His album is about to go triple platinum. The Cyndi Lauper album is now over double platinum, while the Footloose Soundtrack is quickly approaching quadruple

platinum. Bruce Cockburn has his fastest-selling album to date with Stealing Fire . . . and look at Platinum Blonde . . . they've gone platinum with Standing In The Dark.

Watch out for the album release from Metropolis which includes songs from Freddie Mercury . . . also albums from Pat Benatar and Loverboy. We're also looking forward to a new single from Bonnie Tyler, titled Here She Comes.

We're just releasing Neil Diamond's new album, Primitive. Three tracks were co-written by Neil with Burt Bacharach and Carol Bayer Sager. There are some upbeat tracks as well as ballads. Brooklyn On A Saturday Night reminds me of Neil's early days. He will be touring the U.S. but there's no word of Canadian dates yet.

Condition Critical, the latest Quiet Riot album, shipped past gold. Mama Weer All Crazee Now, taken as a single, has been picking up good AOR airplay. The band will be playing the CNE Grandstand Aug 17, for the Heavy Metal Hurricane show, along with Kick Axe and The Scorpions. Later in the year the band will tour Canada.

The Harlequin album is off to a great start with airplay locked-in across the country. The band is in the early stages of organizing a major tour for Canada to begin late summer. The group's video, Take This Heart, has been a major add on all video shows.

Other albums on the way are from Jeff Beck, REO Speedwagon, Willie Nelson, Julio Iglesias and Burton Cummings.

Attic celebrates 10 years as major independent

Toronto: Attic Records, one of the most aggressive and successful of independent labels in Canada, is currently celebrating its 10th anniversary. The label was born in June of 1974 by Alexander Mair, who heads up the company as president, and Tom Williams, now retired. Prior to the formation of the label, Mair had worked for Capitol, then Compo, which later became MCA and managed Gordon Lightfoot, helping to establish Early Morning Productions.

"During that period of time, I had always believed that Canadian artists could be as good as their U.S. counterparts," Mair recalls. "I felt there was room for Canadians to be successful here without having to go to the U.S. I had got Tom Williams a job at WEA about that time and he felt the same way as I did. We had talked about having a company and what we would do. Then, one day, I received a call from Tom, telling me he had just quit WEA and that if we were going to form a company, now was the time."

The date was set and on June 7, 1974, the label became a reality with Mair as President and Williams as Vice President. Their first signing was with Fludd, a local Toronto band, and the label's first release was a single by the group titled Brother And Me.

Mair recalls that it wasn't too difficult to get radio to air product during that period. "There were larger playlists and a more positive attitude towards Canadian artists at that time," continues Mair. "Today, things are much tighter. There are

more ratings services. Canadian records still get airplay, but less chart positions."

Although Mair and Williams had hoped the label would be a profitable venture after doing cash flow projections, results were not as expected, not that the company didn't do well. Mair noted they only lost money one year.

Attic's most successful signing was Triumph. The top selling album in the label's roster was Hagood Hardy's *The Homecoming*, and the biggest selling single was *The Rovers' Wasn't That A Party*.

"Things were a little looser before," continues Mair. At one time there was no problem getting a U.S. release. Now it's very difficult. They're much more careful in what they pick up."

Mair believes that one of the biggest barriers today is what he refers to as the "ghettoization" of Canadian records.

"Some programmers will play the 30 percent, but not one percent more," says Mair. "We're in a country dominated by a foreign country, on television and in magazines."

Mair recalls that "The year 1968 was a turning point. It was a great time to be

Canadian. That pride isn't as visible anymore."

Mair noted that unwillingness to play any more Canadian than necessary by some radio stations appeared after the introduction of the 30 percent Cancon regulations.

"They see it as another regulation they have to follow," he explains. "We get comments from radio all the time. They say they don't need any more Canadian records."

Mair has discovered that one of the biggest changes over the years has been the cost of doing business, pointing out that record contracts have gone from 7 to 50 pages, in some cases.

"Legal bills alone can be a minimum of \$2,000. The legal costs for this market are way out of line." He also sees a problem developing because there is no organization or association between rackers, retailers and sub-distributors.

"Right now you can only talk to individuals," he explains. "We should be able to sit down with representatives to discuss common problems and goals."

Mair is obviously proud of the accomplishments made by Attic and is equally proud of his marketing, A&R and promotion team that has made the label a giant among the independents.

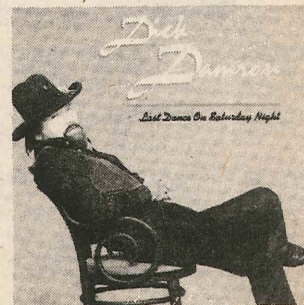

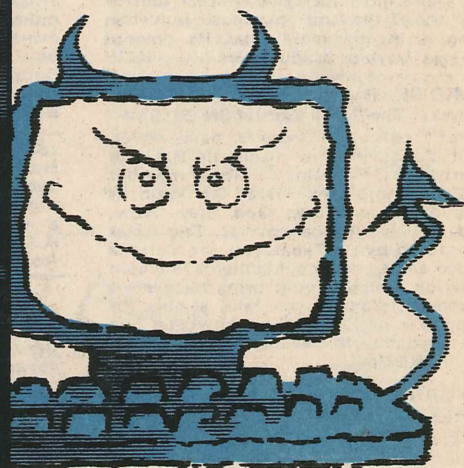
