ARTIST OF THE WEEK

New Longfellow single launched by PolyGram

Baron Longfellow is on release with his new PolyGram single, I'm Gonna Need A Miracle Tonight, a project that is being given special attention to by the label's Karen Gordon (PolyGram's Central Region Promotion Manager). An album, Prisoner By



Design, is slated for a late summer release.

The single has a contemporary feel to it; a mellow funk with a distinctive groove which should gain attention at the club level.

Longfellow began writing for the project almost one year ago, and produced the session himself.

Born in Montreal, he went to New York at an early age, releasing a string of internationally successful records under the name of Andy Kim. In 1974 he moved to Los Angeles, intent on determining in which

direction his music was going, and where his career was taking him. In 1980, still based in Los Angeles, Longfellow released Amour, a single aimed at the adult-contemporary market.

Amour created a strong profile for him in Europe, to the extent that a German TV crew flew to Los Angeles to film him on the beach near his home, as well as in the recording studio.

Longfellow recently returned from a tour of South Korea and Hong Kong where he did dates in front of a 35-piece orchestra. In September he is off to Europe, a trip which will include an appearance on a German TV program.

In commenting on the forthcoming album, Longfellow says: "There's a sound to this record unlike anything I've done before; I took my time, I didn't want to come up with any excuses. Whatever emotions I've felt in making the music, are represented on the record."

CRTC/broadcasters talk about Cancon

Ottawa/Hull: Many of Canada's major private TV broadcasters met with the CRCT recently for informal discussions on Canadian content. This inaugural meeting constitutes the beginning of a long-term approach to ensure the production of distinctive Canadian programming.

The initial meeting was to be followed later in July by another session between the CRTC and leading Canadian program producers.

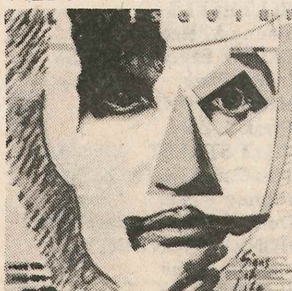

Brave New Music pacts with Melodiya/VAAP

Los Angeles: Dan Friedman, who heads up Brave New Music, a Los Angeles-based music-publishing firm, has announced a licensing/sub-publishing agreement with Melodiya Records of Moscow, and VAAP, the copyright agency of the Soviet Union.

Under this agreement, the company will license labels in the U.S. Canada, and Australia, to release a compilation record of Russian rock groups.

Friedman made the contact with the Soviets at last year's MUSEXPO, which was held in Acapulco, Mexico.

WEA video release for Honeymoon Suite/INXS

Toronto: a priority item in the new WEA Music Video Compilation is the music clip of New Girl Now by Honeymoon Suite. The Niagara Falls-based group are breaking in the U.S. and the video is being given top exposure on MTV (U.S.).

Recording/film action for RCA's Gary O'

Toronto: RCA is anticipating a North American release in August for an album by songwriter Gary O'Connor, who works under the stage name of Gary O'. The LP release stems from a long-term international production agreement between O'Connor's executive producer/manager Stephen Glass (Radioactive Music Corp), and RCA (U.S.) in New York.

The album, Strange Behaviour, was arranged and produced by O'Connor who also performed most of the instrumentation and wrote all the material. The first single to be

taken from the album will be Get It While You Can, which will be supported by a video.

O'Connor's songs have been recorded by several name acts including 38 Special, Kim Carnes, Rod Stewart, Pat Benatar, Eddie Money, and Kansas.

An American film, Zoo Gang, scheduled for a fall release, will feature two of O'Connor's recordings of his own compositions: the proposed single and Jungle Out There.

The future will find O'Connor writing for Julio Iglesias and Barbra Streisand and a Leif Garrett version of his Pretty Boy, performed for the movie Thunder Alley.

Tina Turner LP takes off fueled by latest single

Toronto: Private Dancer, Tina Turner's latest Capitol album, has become one of the hottest items at retail, although on the market for some time.

The sudden surge in popularity can be attributed to the success of her second and latest single from the album, What's Love Got To Do With It. The album quickly rose to No. 10 on the RPM 100 while the single follows suit by bulleting up the singles chart.

Dancer, which features several guest musicians, including guitarist extraordinaire Jeff Beck, was worked by a number of producers, including Rupert Hine, Terry Britten, Carter and Martyn Ware. Included on the album is a cover of the David Bowie classic, 1984.

Turner recently played dates in Western Canada and is scheduled to open Toronto's new club, The Copa (Aug 29), followed by Montreal's Spectrum (30).

Jackson & deBurgh clips among A&M video release

Toronto: Among the video music clips included in A&M's Video Compilation are Chris deBurgh's current hit single High On Emotion, and Joe Jackson's Happy Ending, both enjoying an upward trend on the RPM 100 singles chart. Also featured are four cuts from the Top Secret movie soundtrack, as performed by Nick Rivers (a.k.a. Val Kilmar).

The White Knuckle Ride begins for Duke Jupiter

Toronto: "My father had a music store," Duke Jupiter's Greg Walker recalls. "I was taking piano at age 7, but it really began at 15 when my dad brought a guitar home for me."

RPM spoke with guitarist/vocalist Walker recently prior to the band's support date at Toronto's Kingswood Music Theatre.

How did the band get started back in 1973? "Marshall (guitarist/vocalist Marshall Styler) and I came together at about that time," Walker recalls, "and we were strictly an instrumental outfit back then; we brought in the vocals to improve on the commercial possibilities."

For Duke Jupiter, whose Morocco product is distributed in Canada by Quality Records, it was never easy: always one or two nighters, playing over 200 dates a year. Based in Rochester, N.Y., the band created pockets of loyal fans over the years throughout upper New York State.

Duke Jupiter eventually employed Pete Morticelli as their manager, with Morticelli presenting the band's six-song master to record companies. A deal was inked with Morocco, Motown's "rock" label, resulting in the band's debut release of White Knuckle Ride. A 12" radio sampler was made available, showcasing the first single, Little Lady, in a live format. The flip of the 12" will be the follow-up single, Rescue Me. This is Duke Jupiter's sixth album, with previous releases on Mercury, as well as the CBS affiliate, Coast To Coast.

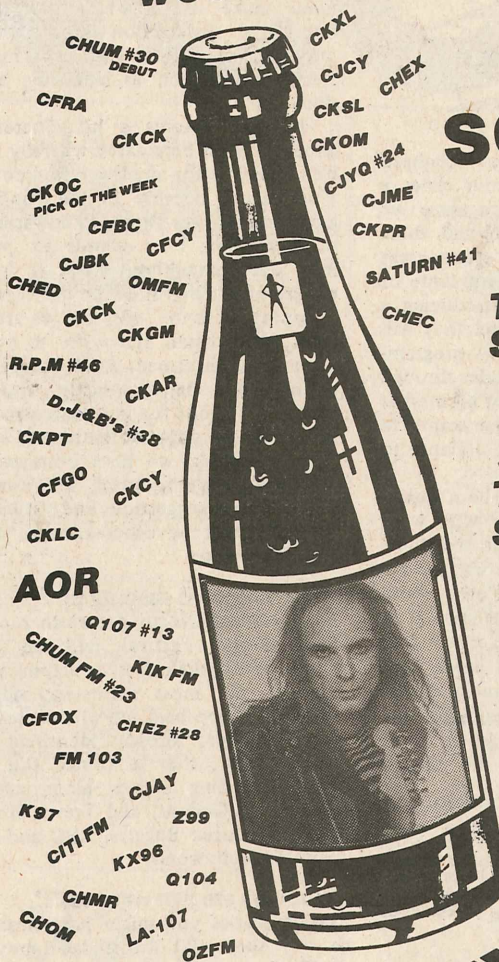
Walker feels very good about the White Knuckle Ride release. "We did some other things over the years," he explains, "but I don't think the companies involved really knew how to handle the material." In 1982 the band had a sizeable hit with I'll Drink To You. Walker comments; "That did well for us, but I don't think the record company knew they had a hit on their hands."

What's the story behind Little Lady? Walker relates how Marshall was picked up by a girl, "apparently she had left her man at the altar. It's a nice little rocker." The single has been a 'best song' pick in the American trade, Album Network, and is receiving extensive Canadian airplay, notably at CHEZ-FM in Ottawa and CHUM-FM in Toronto, and KIK-FM in Calgary.

Duke Jupiter was firmed for four support slots with Huey Lewis (including the Kingswood date), as well as a two-week run through Texas with guitar hero Stevie Ray Vaughan. The live version of the single on the sampler was culled from a live date in Geneva, N.Y., part of a Westwood One broadcast in the U.S. The other dates with Lewis were scheduled to be Ottawa, Grand Rapids and Charlevoix in Michigan.

Greg Walker has the last word: "We do a 40-minute set as the opener, and the response has been good," he says. "We just try to keep progressing as a band; you have to stick to your guns."

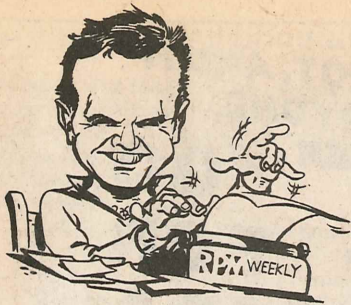

A move to rescue Cancon!!!

Over the past 20 years, we have changed RPM as many as three and four times a year. It has been a long time since we changed our cover and format and these changes are really overdue. It is after a great deal of research and talking with some of you out there, that we are introducing a number of new features. We feel they will be of great benefit to the busy programmer who doesn't want to wade through pages of tracking to find a hit for his market or the Music Director who just wants to look at the national picture at a glance to program for his region.

This weekly is designed to be a quick-read to those in the industry who want fast and accurate information in the shortest period of time. Most important, we are gearing ourselves to do something about the desperate situation of Cancon. If it doesn't improve, it will effect every programmer in Canada. We don't agree with the bureaucratic attitude that more regulations to create more airplay will assist the industry. We are trying to make it easier for all programmers to fulfill the present

Cancon regulations, and our charts are designed to make this possible. Today's industry demands that a great deal more be spent to launch a single or an album. It is no longer realistic to just throw a record out into the market to see if it gets air play. The staggering cost of music videos alone make this a whole new ballgame. Subsidized production hasn't been the answer. The only answer is a more professional approach to launching new product.

No one ignores a hit. Therefore the situation must be created whereby it would be impossible for a radio station not to play your record because of the popularity it gains as it moves through the various areas of promotion. Few records are promoted into stardom without help. It is a very precise effort that must be put forth. Time is important in the '80s, and we are here to chart, plot, detail and write to you, who want to be informed. RPM should be easy to read and digest quickly. Our people should lay it out for you to see and understand without pages of figures and statistics. Not everything we have done will meet with everyone's approval, so we open our doors to your suggestions and criticisms.

There will be other changes over the next few weeks.

Saint-Tropez is shaping up!!

John Nathan, North American rep for the Saint Tropez Festival, tells me that this year's event, their first, is shaping up to be one of the most important video conferences to be held anywhere. Besides the jury members already identified in this week's RPM, they've firmed Bill Wyman of the Rolling Stones, along with Peter Gabriel of Genesis, and Trevor Horn. The latter produced Buggles, ABC and Frankie Goes To Hollywood.

RCA and Bertelsmann merge int'l operations

Toronto: A preliminary agreement has been reached between the RCA Corporation and Bertelsmann AG to merge their worldwide record, music publishing and music video businesses.

Located in West Germany, Bertelsmann AG is the manufacturing, distribution and administrative arm of RCA operations. Bertelsmann also owns the Ariola label.

The final agreement in the deal is still subject to a number of conditions including the approval by the Boards of Directors of both RCA and Bertelsmann.

Under the proposed venture, the record operations of each company is to "exercise creative control over their operations, while being supported by joint services in the manufacturing, distribution and administrative areas."

Arista, a U.S. label, jointly owned by RCA and Bertelsmann, which is still to operate independent of RCA is expected to be distributed by RCA Canada beginning in the new year.

Publishing on the plug side is through Southern Music/Covered Wagon. The flip, You Think You're So Special, was penned by Hoople's David Lodge and is published through Southern Music.

Eastcoast Rider is based out of Barrie, Ontario, and is fronted by vocalist/guitarist Wendall Donovan and multi-instrumentalist Paul Crompton, both originally from the Maritimes. Other band members are Andy Thoburn (keyboards/vocals), Omer Langois (guitar/vocals), and Tony Fantauzzi (percussion).

The band, which is heavily upbeat country, recently returned from a tour of Europe and several Scandinavian countries, and is slated to record during a mid-summer tour of Canada. Western Canadian and U.S. dates are being pencilled in for the fall.

Cystic Fibrosis Foundation gets boost from Hardy

Toronto: Composer/pianist Hagood Hardy has been firmed for a national speaking tour in his capacity as Honorary Chairman of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation for 1984.

The ten dates will be integrated with a concert tour slated to kick off Sept 15 and run through to Nov 4. A wrap-up Christmas show will occur in Halifax to end the tour. This will be Hardy's first major Canadian tour in almost a decade, and will take him through 40 dates from Halifax to Vancouver. Proceeds of the tour will go to the Foundation, and sponsors will include patrons such as CP Air, CN Hotels, and Burns & Fry.

Chasing A Dream, composed by Hardy, is the signature theme for the Cystic Fibrosis campaign this year, and 25 cents from the sale of each album will go toward the fight against CF. The Bay is the cam-

paign store in each market, and a radio outlet will be designated the Chasing A Dream station.

In the U.S. the campaign's chairman is comedienne Joan Rivers, who is expected to meet Hardy at an Ottawa date sometime in August.

In related news, Hardy will act as a spokesman for Heintzman pianos as part of a two-year contract. The campaign, entitled "Hagood Plays Heintzman" will involve advertisements, as well as personal appearances on behalf of Heintzman.

Hagood Hardy has been involved in the Canadian music scene for more than 30 years, and has more than 50 film scores, as well as nine albums to his credit, the most successful of the latter being The Homecoming. Hardy now releases on the Duke Street label.

Flock Of Seagulls' 12" imported for retail trade

Toronto: Quality Records has imported British copies of the Jive 12" single, The More You Live, The More You Love, by A Flock Of Seagulls. The imports are destined for retail, "to help prevent loss of sales due to local importers who could sell the disc before its domestic release," says Quality's National Publicity and Video rep for Quality, Sheila Kay. Like last year's Flock album, the new disc is not a worldwide simultaneous release. It's normal for companies to import a number of records for radio, but rare to do the same for the retail market.

"We've imported substantial quantities to sell," continued Kay, "During the last Flock of Seagulls release we lost lots of sales through imports, so this is a compromise for us."

Both the 7" domestic single and the album, The Story Of A Young Heart, are to be released by Quality on the Jive label on July 26.

Kay noted that the import was released earlier in July and about four weeks prior to the domestic release.

A radio-only 12" from the U.S. was

sent to key radio stations by Quality, but they have no plans to press a commercial 12" for retail. However, they will be releasing a non-commercial 12" dance club mix of the single.

The British import contains the extended version of The More You Live, as well as the 7" re-mix, plus the track, Lost Control.

A major tour of Canada is in the works for September or October.

Attic's Villains showcase at Toronto's Harbourfront

Toronto: Attic recording group The Villains will take part in CFNY-FM's summer Dance Party Under The Stars, to be presented July 31 at Toronto's Harbourfront.

The showcase will mark the band's first appearance in several years, and will be an opportunity for them to present material from their Attic album, Go Crazy. The show will be broadcast as part of CFNY's ongoing Carlsberg Thursday Night Live series.

WEA Canada & Alligator pact distribution deal

Toronto: The Chicago-based Alligator label has been signed by WEA Music of Canada. The latter will be distributing the entire Alligator catalogue on both import and domestic manufacturing basis. All titles, regardless as to status, will carry a suggested list of \$10.49. A number of titles will be available on cassette. As a further result of the agreement, some titles will be available on Canadian-manufactured cassette for the first time in the U.S.

In commenting on the agreement, WEA Canada President and CEO Stan Kulin noted: "We are very pleased to be working with the Alligator Records fine catalogue and particularly the Johnny Winter album."

Said Bruce Iglauer, Alligator's President, "I am very excited about our relationship with a company of such stature as WEA Canada. I'm looking forward to exploring the great potential for mutual involvement."

U.S. label interest in Duke Street's Siberry

Toronto: Representatives of as many as four major U.S. labels are expected for the Rivoli Club showcasing of singer/songwriter Jane Siberry (July 26 and 27). Siberry has created quite a stir in the Canadian music community with her debut Duke Street album release, No Borders Here.

John Carter, representing Capitol's A&R department in the U.S., is expected to attend as well as reps from Geffen, Arista, and MCA. Larry Hamby, a senior Vice President at Epic is expected to attend a later date.

In addition to Bruce Cockburn support dates previously announced (RPM - June 16), plus a couple of openers for Joe Jackson, Siberry has been firmed for London's 400-seat Bumpers Club (Aug 1), as well as an outdoor festival in Hamilton (Aug 5).

A recent development at radio is the CFRA Ottawa airing of Mimi On The Beach, a popular track from the album.

A marketing campaign is being formulated to increase market penetration in North America by these acts.

Attic has a good chunk of the metal market in Canada having released product previously by Judas Priest, Lee Aaron, Riot, Anvil, Tank and Killer Dwarfs.

The production team of Terry and Tobias is a recent alliance initiated primarily for the production of music videos. The Honeymoon Suite video is the second production for the duo. Their initial collaboration was the Dena Golden/Steven Shapiro single, Someone To Hold.

Tony Tobias was one of the first pro-

ducers to work in music videos in Canada. He produced two Patsy Gallant videos (New York To L.A./Are You Ready For Love) for Attic in the mid-'70s, and was co-producer on videos for Gordon Lightfoot's The Wreck Of The Edmund Fitzgerald and Race Among The Ruins. Tobias has also written several variety series and specials for CBC and CTV Television networks.

Director/film-maker Chris Terry directed and produced That Kind Of Man for The Nylons, a Canadian a capella quartet on Attic. The video won Terry a CFTA Award for music videos. Terry also produced and directed The Killer Dwarfs' Heavy Metal Breakdown, and has ten years experience as a musician and composer.

The Honeymoon Suite video was shot over two days at Glen-Warren Studios in Toronto, and was released by WEA to all international territories releasing the band's album, including the U.S., U.K., Germany and Australia.

Paroles et musique's UZEB signs for major U.S. tour

Montreal: Jazz quartet UZEB who release on the Paroles et musique label, has signed to do a three-week tour of the U.S. West Coast in February of 1985. The popular group will make stops in a number of major markets from Seattle to San Diego. The American tour follows a scheduled fall tour of 46 European dates in West Germany, France, and Switzerland. After the American tour, UZEB will tour Japan and stop off in Hong Kong, after which they return to Japan where they will perform for the Tokyo International Jazz Festival.

You Be Easy, the band's current album, spent two months in the Top 5 of the Montreal weekly Le Monde.

Negotiations for the U.S. tour were made with the assistance of Pamela Johnson, Cultural Affairs Secretary at the Canadian Consulate General in Los Angeles.

UZEB comprises Paul Brochu (drums and percussion); Alain Caron (vocals/bass/synthesizer); Michel Cusson (guitar and synthesized guitar); and Michel Cyr (keyboards and synthesizer).

The group's first album was distributed in Canada by A&M.

Toronto: The Calgary-based Headlines are currently on release with When I Get Through With You, backed with Sunday Morning. The single, produced by Greg Hambleton, was released on the Axe label. Publishing is through Southern Music. Both sides qualify as four-parts Canon.

Headlines' promo material identifies their music as "... crafted, precise, adult rock ...". The band has picked up a sizeable following through their touring of Western Canada and the American mid-west in support of their first single, Avalon, released in early 1984.

The band comprises sisters Shirley and Margaret Langenburg on vocals; John Thiel (guitar/vocals), Dennis Telle (guitar/vocals), Howard Young (bass/vocals), Gary Bowman (drums/percussion), and Thomas Kehler (keyboards/vocals).

Rockit producer on Parachute Club session

Toronto: Michael Beinhorn, producer of Herbie Hancock's Rockit, has been in studio producing the Parachute Club's next album.

As yet untitled, the album is being produced at Sounds Interchange and is scheduled for a simultaneous release in Canada and the U.S. for mid-August.

The release will be supported by a major North America tour by the Current group beginning in September.

The Toronto-based group's first album was recently issued in Europe, Australia and New Zealand. Their promo/concert tour of Europe scored them a date on the highly popular German TV show, Montages Markdt as well as important press, radio and TV dates in England. Their Rise Up single was a pick hit on BBC 1.

Local musician Kir Brownstone recently joined the band as their new bass player.

Videocassette popularity showing increase in U.S.

New York: New research by the Street Pulse Group - an American group of music industry marketing information consultants, indicates that videocassettes are well on their way to catching up with records as consumers' preferred way of buying music.

According to Street Pulse's latest survey, the percentage of record buyers who have VCRs is 37.2% versus 10% for the general public. Also determined were the facts that 27.8% of the VCR-owning record purchasers buy music videos, with 50.5% of the VCR owners renting pre-recorded music video programming.

Says Michael Shalett, President of Street Pulse, "... it's been predicted that by 1988, over a billion dollars worth of music videos will be sold every year. The time is clearly coming when you don't just listen to the latest hit, you watch it."

Maggie Hues to head Numbers PR firm

Toronto: Publicist Maggie Hues, in cooperation with Somersault Records, has established a new promotion company flying the banner of Numbers. Hues entered the promotion field four years ago, after a long and varied career as a musician. She has worked as an independent and in the national press and radio field.

In addition to her role as Managing Director of Numbers, Hues will handle promotional work for DJ&B Record Sales, a singles distributor, as well as for the Somersault label, an affiliate of DJ&B.

Numbers will concern itself with print, radio and TV promo and publicity work, specializing in national radio tracking and local/national press contact work. The latter will include prepping showcase performances, "event" planning, and other promotional activities.

Hues has worked with artists such as Ann Mortifee, Sylvia Tyson, Diane Tell, Johnny Cash, and Alan Thicke. She was also involved with promotion for a recent Grateful Dead/Band benefit concert, as well as the first of CFGM's 1984 Summer Country picnics.

CRTC may approve youth TV channel

Ottawa/Hull: The CBC and National Film Board have offered to help launch a national TV channel for youth, but the Canadian Cable Television Association believes such a service isn't much in demand, or financially feasible. The cable association is urging the CRTC not to licence a youth-oriented service. It claims existing broadcasters and cable community channels provide ample youth programming - up to 90 hours a week in some cities.

The CBC and NFB have added their support to demands from producers and children's organizations for a youth programming cable TV channel. The CRTC is considering several issues related to youth TV programming, deciding whether or not a separate channel is needed and how it could be financed - it may call for licence applications for such a service, or hold public hearings into the issues.

Palais Records, Moore's release label, is seeking a wider audience for the young vocalist with the release of *Hit And Run Lover*, as well as the accompanying video. The latter will feature a troupe of dancers from Les Ballets Jazz in Toronto, as well as six dancers who were chosen from a dance contest held recently at Club 5444 at a Toronto Ramada Inn.

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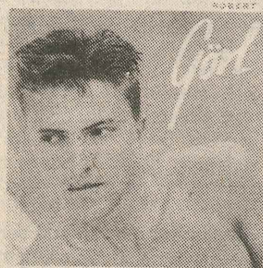

BACHMAN TURNER OVERDRIVE - Rock BTO - Compleat CPL1-1010-M

If any band other than The Guess Who or Chilliwack exemplifies '70s Canadian rock and roll of the prairie/West Coast derivation, it has to be BTO. Randy Bachman and Fred Turner revelled in the "rock musicians as lumberjacks" image, and the band became an international phenomenon - as popular (not to mention as profitable) as maple syrup and cheddar cheese. There is a sense of renewal in these grooves. The familiar booming guitar notes and raspy truckdriver vocals are still present, but clothed in what sounds like a fresh attitude. Drummer Peterson is often a nice change from the bricklayer predecessor. For The Weekend has been taken as the first single. Produced by Bachman Turner Overdrive at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound. Front racking is a must. - KCW



ROBERT GORI - Pop Night Full Of Tension - Elektra 96 03671-P

Gori is notable to date for being one half of the German synth duo DAF. This solo debut is a very catchy set of electro-pop material tinged with sufficient sincerity so as to make many of Gori's contemporaries sound lifeless and uncommitted. Key are Love In Mind, and the starkly beautiful Darling Don't Leave Me, sung with Annie Lennox of Eurythmics. All the material was written by Gori. Recorded at Jacob's Studio, Surrey, England. Produced by Gori and Mike Hedges. Colourful jacket photo should generate strong visual profile for artist at retail. - KCW



CHRIS WHITELEY & CAITLIN HANFORD - Country HANFORD - CBC/HY-C 1101

A well-crafted release which grows in appeal after several listens. Chris Whiteley is certainly no newcomer to the music business and his touch is evident in five originals penned with partner Hanford. Strong vocal harmonies are an added pleasure in the set. Deborah Samuels' tasteful jacket photo only enhances an already impressive package. All tracks, except Rose Of The Rio Grande (Duke Ellington) are four parts Cancon. That Piece Of Your Heart taken as a single. Produced by Bill Garrett at CBC Studio 4S in Toronto. Distributed through CBC Enterprises. - KCW

THE WATERBOYS - Pop A Pagan Place - Island ISL 1001-J

Nothing short of outstanding. Perhaps destined to be the finest record of 1984. Focal point is singer/songwriter/guitarist Mike Scott . . . a real find. Consists of all

the things which you know to be right about pop music: a sense of majesty, of quests unfulfilled; that peculiar and pleasant sensation of longing and optimism which the truly great stuff induces. Intelligent use of brass and pseudo-orchestral effects. Key are Somebody Might Wave Back, The Big Music, and Rags. Produced by Scott. Recorded in Wales and England. Don't miss this one. - KCW



NETTY GRITTY DIRT BAND - Country/Rock BAND - Plain Dirt Fashion Warner Bros 92 51131-P

First Warner outing for a veteran American band who were more of a folk venture back in 1966. Nearly two decades later, we have a band more inclined to rock and roll now and again, although this may make the record difficult to program. Inclusion of Springsteen's Cadillac Ranch is a good omen. Key are Marshall Crenshaw's Run With Me, and Long Hard Road, the latter taken as the first single. Produced by Marshall Morgan and Paul Worley at Audio Media in Nashville. - KCW

NONA HENDRYX - Funk The Art Of Defense - RCA AFL1 4999-N

Nona looks like the life of the party, with her fencer's garb and rapier poised over her head. The image fits however; this is aggressive and uncompromising music. Once part of Labelle in the early '70s, Hendryx appears to have long given up the "space funk" style which still finds heavy favour in certain quarters. Occasionally almost languid in style, her voice wraps itself around some pointed lyrics, and leaves the listener wanting to head off to see her perform in some intimate and smoky haunt. Key is I Sweat, taken as the first single. Good jacket artwork. - KCW



FASTWAY - Rock All Fired Up - Columbia FC 39373-H

Fast Eddie's answer to those who suspect he packed it in after leaving Motorhead - or after being sacked. Depending on which story you hear. Easy Livin' hit home, but this record shows an honest attempt to move beyond the usual three-piece volume-at-any-cost format. Former Humble Pie drummer Jerry Shirley is competent enough, and Irish yowler Dave King, although frequently too close to Robert Plant in intonation and delivery, leaves a distinct impression on the eardrums. Key are the Zeppelin-flavoured Station, and a 1-take jam, Hurtin' Me. Produced by Eddie Kramer at Marcus Music, England. - KCW

O'BRYAN - Funk Be My Lover - Capitol ST 12332-F

O'Bryan, nee O'Bryan Burnette II, is not just another brocaded crooner of funk it

would seem, and he has certainly maximized his association with Don (Soul Train) Cornelius, penning the set's material with Cornelius and keyboardist Michael Norfleet. Key are the catchy Breakin' Together, and Lady I Love You. Strong jacket photo should attract at retail. Club play will help this release. Produced by O'Bryan, and Norfleet. Lovelite taken as single. - KCW

ART OF NOISE - Pop (Who's Afraid Of?) The Art Of Noise Island ISL 90179-J

Dance club vibes courtesy of the same people who brought us Frankie. An occasionally bizarre mosaic of sound, allegedly aided and abetted by producer Trevor Horn of ABC fame. Beat Box (Diversion One), although not especially original, is a distinctive collage of synth tracks and miscellaneous electronic sounds, all anchored by an echo-laden drum beat. Also key is Moments In Love: electronic, yet pleasantly soulful at the same time. Definitely one for the trendies to sink their teeth into. - KCW

HOLLY WOODS & TORONTO Ontario Place Forum - Toronto - June 26/84

A new lineup, centred around founding members Holly Woods and Scott Kreyer, hits the road hoping to maintain and further the reputation this band has developed as a live act. A notable addition is guitarist Daryl Alvaro, essentially replacing Brian Allen and Sheron Alton. Although Alvaro is more than competent, he would benefit from another guitar on many of the tunes; Woods' vocals could use the assist Alton's voice often provided. These may be petty thoughts however, because this is a new band playing frequently strong new material. A long tour should knock the operation into real shape, allowing Alvaro, drummer Marty Moran, and Mike Gingrich (bass) to properly coalesce.

WAYLON JENNINGS Hamilton Place - Hamilton - June 18/84

Much like his buddy, Willie Nelson, Jennings has been looked upon as something of a maverick - managing to remain outside the Nashville country establishment. This hasn't prevented him from creating a lot of good songs, and endearing himself to a stubbornly loyal flock of fans who hang on his every word. His guitar playing complements his voice - gritty, distinctive, and filled with the kind of emotions that only 25 years of performing can elicit.

Winnipeg: C-Weed have kept a hectic spring and summer schedule of dates that had them playing fairs and concert dates throughout the U.S. mid-west and Canada's western provinces, the most notable being the Beaver Dam Lake Country Rock Festival. The latter featured two of North America's top country rock acts back to back: C-Weed and Hank Williams Jr. and The Bama Band. The festival was also notable being that it was held on Canada Day and drew a crowd estimated at 20,000 plus. The three-day festival also featured Murray McLauchlan, Earl Thomas Conley, Stevie Ray Vaughan and the Gregg Allman Band.

C-Weed will appear in a one-hour concert special (July 28) on WDAZ-TV. The outdoor concert was taped during the Homecoming '83 celebrations at Eddystone, Manitoba in August of last year. The band performs (Play Me) My Favourite Song, High And Dry, Evangeline, and Bringing Home The Good Times, to name just a few. Eddystone is the ranching and fishing community where the Ranville brothers, who comprise the core of the band, grew up. The TV special was produced by Hawk Records of Winnipeg, with technical production and direction by Stewart Young of S.A.Y. Video in Winnipeg.

A major U.S./Canada deal for C-Weed is expected to be announced shortly, which will see their first U.S. single release.

Cathy, is currently on release with her *Shotgun* single, *Hey Mister Wind*, written and produced by Larry Coad in Nashville.

U.S. action for Bill Hersh

Bill Hersh has broken into the U.S. country market with his latest Comstock single, *Paint Me Blue*. The single gained a bullet at No. 70 on Cash Box. Comstock's Frank Fara has slotted the Hersh single as a "hit" and he's pulling all stops to gain a larger share of the U.S. market and hopes the spillover will effect Canada as well.

There's money in accessories

A very successful booker/manager told me recently that more money can be made through accessories (T-shirts, buttons, hats, photos etc.), than by running a booking agency. Take a look at the Harold MacIntyre store-on-wheels, if you get a chance. Leads me to believe that this crew are on the right path. Ronnie Prophet scores a sizeable bundle each year through the sales of his accessories. It's also a good way to get rid of a lot of records as well.

A banner day for Elaine Jarvis

Canada Day was a big one for Bel Air recording artist Elaine Jarvis who headlined Brampton's (Ontario) salute to Canada. Bob Cousins reports that more than 25,000 people were in the park for the event. Opening for Elaine were Stars of The Jamboree and Generation Band from the Brampton Jamboree. Elaine is currently on release with her *Bel Air* single, *Lovin' On Borrowed Time*.

Palmer now releases on Altair Four

Rae Palmer releases, *Keep On Walking*, her first single for the Altair Four label. The plug side was co-written by Rae and Ted Gerow. The latter produced the single at the Altair Four Studios. Rae had previously released on the Snocan label. Originally from the Thunder Bay area, Rae got her first break at age 13 on the Irwin Prescott TV show.

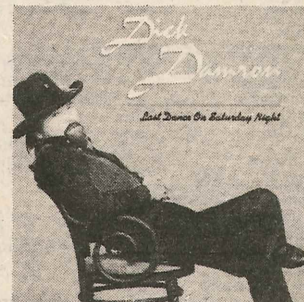
