Purple Rain heralds arrival of a new star

The era of the sexually androgynous pop star has locked in with a vengeance — performers whose features are chiselled, made-up, or just plain childlike. WEA recording artist Prince fits in nicely; full sensual lips in an almost conventionally pretty face, surrounded by a mound of curls. There's something more though — talent, a #1 record with Purple Rain, an acting debut, and a Top 5 song with When Doves Cry.

At this writing, Prince's sixth LP, a film soundtrack called Purple Rain, sits comfortably at #1, as pop commentators try to get a handle on the thin young man responsible for some of the most exciting and melodically aggressive music that this decade has so far experienced.

Prince, nee Prince Rogers Nelson, was born and raised in Minneapolis, Minn., the son of a jazz band leader and a mother who sang in family bands. At 12, Prince was heading up his own band, Champagne, performing original material as well as Top 40.

After five years, the band decided to call it quits, with Prince determined to "... be serious about a music career." At this time, Prince had a friend who was a lyricist, as well as an engineer at a recording studio. Prince arranged to write music for his friend's lyrics in exchange for studio time. He cut the demo on his own, subsequently going to New York in an attempt to raise some interest in the project. He returned with two solid offers from major record labels, but didn't take either, citing the companies' insistence on bringing in producers to work with him.

Prince did another demo, consisting of three songs, which he took to Warner Brothers. The result was a contract said to be the most lucrative ever offered by the company to an unknown act. The debut release, For You, while not a commercial success,

nonetheless demonstrated the diversity of style of which he was so capable: a capella vocal tracks alongside Hendrix-style guitar riffs. Prince played synthesizer, guitar, percussion, and drums, and sang all the vocals. Soft And Wet was released as a single.

Following the LP's release, Prince, intent on putting a touring band together, hired a Champagne alumnus, Andre Samone to play bass. The lineup eventually included Dez Dickerson on guitar, Gail Chapman on keyboards, Matt Fink on keyboards, and another old friend, Bobby Lee, on drums.

Prince's self-titled second LP was completed, with Prince again handling literally everything, however on this occasion an engineer was brought in. The Prince LP, as well as his next two records — Dirty Mind and Controversy — surpassed gold status in the U.S. In late 1982, Prince released 1999; the LP, a 2-record set, was generally regarded as indicating commercial acceptance of Prince's distinctive and alluring mix of black dance music and traditional rock & roll. Songs such as Delirious, Little Red Corvette, and the title track, demonstrated compelling street savvy combined with an acute understanding of pop dynamics. Purple Rain has placed Prince firmly in the upper echelons of the pop establishment.

Once again, Prince plays a plethora of instruments, subtly grafting licks which have an



undeniable basis in rock onto vigorous pop and funk tableaux.

The first single, When Doves Cry, has fluttered around the higher reaches of the Top 10, reaching #1 in early August. The follow-up, Let's Go Crazy, has already jumped into the Top 30 on the RPM 100, and shows signs of duplicating the success of Doves. In Canada, the LP has gone double platinum.

The LP is the soundtrack to a film of the same name, which stars Prince as a young musician in a romantic entanglement with actress/singer Apollonia Kotero, lead singer of Apollonia 6, formerly Vanity 6. Vanity 6, as well as The Time, were bands Prince created from the vibrant and evidently talented pool of young musical talent in Minneapolis.

Whether as a result of his effective filmic presence, or his grasp of what the fickle pop music market will bear, Prince is certainly here to stay — you've been warned, the revolution has just begun.



Prince/ZZ Top bring WEA into busy fall

Toronto: "I can't believe how well Prince is selling," says Garry Newman, VP of Sales for WEA Music in Canada. "It's definitely #1, and it's closing in on triple platinum status — after only seven weeks in release we've done almost 300,000 units." Newman says that August-to-date figures alone show WEA moving 80,000 cassettes and 70,000 LPs.

ZZ Top is apparently the #2 seller, just over quintuple platinum (500,000). "We recently hit 540,000, and we're the only country in the world so far to hit quintuple platinum," reports Newman. "This is amazing for a record which was released in April of '83. August-to-date figures show 30,000 cassettes and 25,000 LPs . . . it just won't stop." Newman surmises that the Legs video and single are primarily responsible at this point in time for generating LP and cassette sales. "There'll be another video, but not necessarily a single," he says, "the band is currently in the studio working on their next record, and we'll probably have a first quarter '85 release. On Eliminator my next plateau is 750,000."

Newman talks about two other WEA acts: "The Cars are really taking off with the Drive single . . . Van Halen is just shy of 1/2 a million units; we've done 20,000 combined a month on the 1984 release. There's another video under production currently."

September releases for WEA include a Talking Heads package, to include a limited edition booklet, Donna Summer, Rickie Lee Jones, AC/DC Live, Jim Capaldi, The Honeydrippers, and The Guess Who Live on Ready Records. Country product will include Frizzell & West, T.G. Sheppard, and Eddie Rabbitt. "October looks good as well," says

Capitol Canada scores the first platinum Turner LP

Toronto: Capitol Records — EMI of Canada reports Tina Turner's latest album *Private Dancer* recently surpassed the 100,000 mark making Canada the first country to bring the LP to platinum status.

The first single from the album, *Let's Stay Together*, was modestly received in Canada, but the second, *What's Love Got To Do With It*, quickly catapulted the LP into the status of one of the hottest selling albums in the country. The LP currently stands at #3 on the RPM 100 Album chart.

What's Love Got To Do With It is also about to turn gold. The next single is expected to be the track, *Better Be Good To Me*. A video is to be released. The LP has been released in 40 countries around the world.

Turner's last success was with her husband, then bassist, Ike Turner in 1971 with the song *Proud Mary* which reached gold in the U.S.

While in Toronto, Capitol presented Turner with both gold and platinum for *Private Dancer* at a special reception in the Westin Hotel in the city.

Turner performed the same day at the new Toronto nightclub, The Copa. The singer, who had just completed a Western Canadian tour, also performed in Ottawa and Montreal.

Newman, continuing with, "we'll have product from Eric Carmen, Don Henley, Al Jarreau, Quincy Jones, Shannon, and a 5-LP set from Laurie Anderson."

Newman is set to leave for the WEA convention, to be held in September in Phoenix, Ariz., and is excited about the four day meeting which will include the unveiling of all the company's fall releases.

December date for Juno ceremonies

Toronto: The 1984 Junos will be presented at ceremonies to be held at Exhibition Place in Toronto on December 5. The event will be televised nationally by the CBC

For the first time, the Junos will be awarded in December, and for the first time, the TV show is being produced by an independent company — Concert Productions International (CPI).

Juno presentations were previously made each spring, and were last awarded in April 1983.

True North adds MacLeod to roster

Toronto: Johnny MacLeod has signed with True North Records and will soon commence work on his debut LP, to be entitled *True Lives Of The Young Pioneers*.

MacLeod is managed by Bernie Finkelstein's Finkelstein Management Company in association with Stuart Raven-Hill. Raven-Hill, when asked how the signing came about, said that he and Finkelstein were looking for a new act, and MacLeod displayed the potential for longevity and serious songwriting skills that the management team deemed essential. MacLeod will employ four other musicians in his band, people currently "jobbing" in other bands.

The LP will probably not appear much before January '85, according to Raven-Hill.

Harlequin/Woods and Toronto on co-bill

Sault Ste. Marie: Harlequin and Holly Woods and Toronto will co-bill what is titled "a rock 'n' roll evening" in five Northern Ontario markets. Support will be Sheriff who had a Top 10 single in 1982, *When I'm With You*.

Harlequin's current Epic release, a self-titled effort, has yielded a single, *Take This Heart*, and the band has enjoyed considerable success since its inception in the mid-'70s with hits such as *Innocence*, *Thinking Of You*, *Superstitious Feeling*, *Can't Hold Back*, and *I Did It For Love*.

Holly Woods and Toronto, formerly Toronto, are currently on release with their *Solid Gold* LP, *Assault And Flattery*. As Toronto, the band did very well in the Canadian market with albums such as *Get It On Credit* and *Girls Night Out*.

The dates will be: Sudbury (Sept. 6), North Bay (7), Sault Ste. Marie (8), Timmins (10), and Thunder Bay (11). Tickets for the shows will be general admission and cost \$12.50.

Nelson presented with gold, platinum

Toronto: CBS recording artist Willie Nelson was presented with an assortment of gold and platinum records at a recent press conference held in the Four Seasons Hotel, located in the Yorkville district of Toronto.

The press conference was held in advance of the Summer Sunset Picnic, a CFGM-sponsored event held at the CNE Grandstand, featuring Nelson and his band, Kris Kristofferson, Jessie Coulter, Waylon Jennings, and The Floyd Family.

Clad in a black t-shirt, jeans, a jean jacket, and sneakers, Nelson charmed the industry and media people present with his casual style and disarming smile — in distinct contrast to the room's ornate chandeliers and plush carpeting: he sported a "Thriller" cap, a gift from Michael Jackson received at a recent recording session.

Nelson was asked how he came to meet Julio Iglesias, his singing partner on a recent duet.

"I accidentally heard him on the radio in London one evening," said Nelson. "I thought I'd discovered somebody; within 30 days of hearing him in London, we were recording. He chose the song — *To All The Girls I've Loved Before*."

Nelson credited his 4th of July picnics initiated in the '70s as a factor contributing to his widespread commercial success. The awards presented by CBS included a platinum single for the duet with Iglesias, and double platinum LPs for *Always On My Mind*, *His Very Best*, and *Stardust*, a collection of standards.

RCA intros national push to back Gary O' album

Toronto: RCA Records has launched an extensive national campaign to support the album *Strange Behavior*, the debut RCA solo LP from Toronto singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Gary O'.

The LP, which has a simultaneous U.S./Canadian release, is being backed with extensive radio buys, print advertising, posters and streamers.

A box package of the album containing poster, photo and bio has already been sent to key radio, press and dealers. The single, *Get It While You Can*, has been issued in a picture sleeve.

O'Connor, who goes under the name of Gary O', not only played the guitars, bass and keyboards for the LP, but produced and arranged it as well. O'Connor sings both lead and background vocals on the album, for which he also wrote all the songs.

The singer-songwriter is currently preparing for a tour that will cover the U.S. as well as Canada, and is expected to begin in early October.

A former member of the local bands Cat and Aerial, Gary O' has more recently been spreading his name as a major songwriter by composing the gold singles *Back Where You Belong* and *One Time For Old Times* on the platinum LP from 38 Special, *Tour DeForce*. Other names working with O'Connor include Barbara Streisand, Rod Stewart, Steve Perry and Sammy Hager.

CIRPA/PRO-CANADA co-sponsor fall seminars

Toronto: Seminars sponsored jointly by the Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA), and the Performing Rights Organization of Canada Limited (P.R.O. Canada) will occur across Canada this fall, focusing on how radio stations target their audiences using demographic information — and how record labels, producers, and artists can make use of this information to produce and promote their records for airplay.

The first seminar will take place in Toronto on September 10. The keynote speaker will be John Parikh of Joint Communications Corporation. Seminars will follow in Vancouver (Oct. 9), Edmonton (10), Winnipeg (12), and Halifax (15). The Edmonton seminar is co-sponsored with the Alberta Recording Industry Association (ARIA), and the Halifax one with the Atlantic Canada Music Association (ACMA).

New Sinatra LP attracting both young and old buyers

Toronto: Several retailers have noticed that veteran superstar vocalist Frank Sinatra has recently been attracting younger record buyers as well as many of his older fans.

The growing interest with Sinatra by the younger consumers appeared to take hold with the release of his hit single, New York, New York. Even the Toronto new music station CFNY-FM could be heard airing the song.

Now, WEA has just released Sinatra's latest album, L.A. Is My Lady. The album, which comes in a colour gatefold jacket, was preceded with the release of the title track single. Both are on the WEA-distributed Qwest label. The LP is hot out-of-the-box.

On the LP, Sinatra is backed by Quincy Jones and orchestra. Jones is recently best known for his production work with Michael Jackson. The album also contains a star-studded line-up of guest musicians such as George Benson, Lionel Hampton, Michael Brecker, Frank Foster, Bob James, Steve Gadd and others.

"There was a lot of awareness about this album even before it was released," said Bill Johnston of WEA Music. "The song L.A. Is My Lady is a logical follow-up to New York, New York being that it's the next big U.S. city. There was also the tie-in with the Olympics being held in Los Angeles, although the song is not about the Olympics."

Johnston noted Sinatra is once again working with Quincy Jones who has currently been in the limelight thanks to his recent work with Michael Jackson. He also pointed to the superstar line-up of talent appearing on the LP.

"There definitely seems to be, and I'm not sure if you could call it a revival, but an appeal by a younger audience. It appears to be his fastest-selling album in quite a few years."

Now available is a video of the single L.A. Is My Lady. In it, guest appearances are made by such names as Dean Martin, Eddie Van Halen, David Lee Roth, and several other well-known actors and artists.

Sinatra is scheduled to appear at the CNE Grandstand in Toronto for Sept. 2.

The October seminars will feature videotaped highlights of the Toronto seminar, and panels made up of local experts.

The Toronto seminar will take place in the Ramada Inn located at Don Valley Pkwy. and Highway 401.

Wilcox album set for early September release

Toronto: The new album from local guitar virtuoso David Wilcox entitled Bad Reputation has been slated for an early September release with the first single expected mid to late August.

Like his previous LPs, Bad Reputation is produced by Sadia, but was re-mixed by Rodney Mills in Georgia. The album was recorded at the Metal Works.

The album is to be preceded by an AOR sampler to carry the tracks The Grind and Brian Fever. There will be both a 12" and 7". The LP contains 11 compositions in all, all of which are penned by the singer-guitarist. An extensive tour is expected to support the new album.

Vancouver's Mayor honors vocalist Rod Stewart

Vancouver: City Mayor Michael Harcourt recently paid tribute to British WEA recording star Rod Stewart by proclaiming July 10 as Rod Stewart Day.

Mayor Harcourt acknowledged that not only has Stewart brought enjoyment to millions of music lovers throughout the world, but has "tangibly demonstrated his support of soccer."

The mayor presented Stewart with both the Keys to the City of Vancouver, plus an honorary membership to the city's White Caps Soccer Club.

As part of the celebration, covered by both local and national TV, the singer was also presented with a gold record from WEA for his current album Camouflage signifying sales of 50,000 copies. Infatuation is the current hit single from the LP. WEA has just released the new single, Some Guys Have All The Luck.


Stewart, who WEA reports attracted SRO crowds at the city's Vancouver Coliseum, is currently in the midst of a 70-date North American tour.



Lucky to have Cancon says Villains member

Toronto: David Neal, guitarist, vocalist and main songwriter for the Attic group The Villains admits that it is definitely hard for Canadian recording acts to achieve recognition when the charts are filled with foreign acts.

However, the Vancouver-based artist points out that it's always been hard.

The Villains are currently touring in support of their album on Attic, *Go Crazy*. The title track is the current single and a video of the track is also available.

"In Canada we're very lucky to have Cancon," said Neal. "It lets Canadians hear what's out there. Some musicians are coming through like Bruce Cockburn. In Vancouver there's some great young bands. But there's so many cover and tribute groups in Canada."

Born in East Ham, England in August of 1979, the Villains came to Vancouver in late 1980. The band, who fuse ska and reggae with R&B and new music, played clubs across the country. Why the re-location of their base to Vancouver?

"It was a break, something different for the members of the band," said Neal. "We had toured extensively throughout Europe. Without a record deal there, the clubs don't pay well. Here they pay you for what you play."

The Villains are hoping to re-enter the studio again during the Christmas season. Neal noted the group learned a lot from their current LP, but felt it's perhaps a bit too diverse. The next one he plans will be written

Electric Dreams nears gold fueled by C.C. tracks

Toronto: Virgin Records of Canada reports that in just three weeks of release, the soundtrack from the motion picture *Electric Dreams* is nearing the gold mark in Canada.

The soundtrack is highlighted by the addition of two new Culture Club tracks — *Love Is Love* and *The Dream*. A radio-only issue of *Love Is Love* has been released as a 7" but the single is not expected to be released commercially.

The first single from the soundtrack is the cut *Video* by Jeff Lynne of ELO who also wrote the cut *Let It Run* for the LP. All songs on the album were written especially for the motion picture.

Virgin revealed the film is to be released in Canada early in September backed by a full marketing campaign from MGM.

The next single is expected to be the cut, *Together In Electric Dreams* by Philip Oakey and Giorgio Moroder. The LP also contains the first solo Canadian release for Hellen Terry, *Now You're Mine*. The song has been released as a single in Britain and could be a future single for Canada.

Virgin is currently supporting the soundtrack with both print and consumer advertising, as well as posters and flats.

Latest Spoons cassette contains bonus tracks

Toronto: Two extra tracks can be found on the latest cassette from the local new music group The Spoons from their latest EP *Tell No Lies on Ready Records*.

In addition to a 7" release of *Tell No Lies* being added to stations across Canada, the 12" vinyl EP has been issued containing an extended version of *Tell No Lies* on one side, plus *Romantic Traffic* and *White Lies* on Side Two.

In addition to these tracks, the cassette contains extended versions of their previous hit *Nova Heart* and *Symmetry*, neither of which have ever appeared on cassette before. The cut *Tell No Lies* has been re-mixed. The EP is produced by the noted Nile Rodgers.

While the label confirms that a fall tour of Canada is currently in the works for the band, they report the next major release from the group is expected to be a soundtrack LP titled *Listen To The City*.

The music on the soundtrack is written by the Spoons with production by Spoons member Gordon Deppe. Spoons bassist Sandy Horne is to star in the motion picture.

RPM credited with high response rate in survey

Professor George Pollard, with the assistance of journalism student Denise McConney, has released an interim report on research he has conducted among Canadian journalists. Data was gathered utilizing a 78-page questionnaire mailed to a random sample of Canadian journalists working in radio, TV, and on print dailies. The sample was drawn from a list of approximately 9,000 journalists published in *The Matthews List* — a tri-annual census of Canadian media employees — and consideration was given to the distribution of journalists by region, market size, and gender.

Of 302 questionnaires mailed in early May of this year, approximately 61% (184) were returned, and approximately 58% (174) were usable. Pollard notes that between the time RPM ran a story on the project, and the end of July, 27 questionnaires (virtually 15% of the total received) were returned.

Notes Pollard: "To be taken seriously, a mail survey such as the one I did, must get a 50% response rate. That I had before the RPM piece . . . a mail survey must move beyond the 50% response rate to have a chance at being effective. A 55% rate is quite good. Sixty-one percent as I received with RPM's help is virtually unheard of, and is considered amazing. As a result, the findings take on added importance and credibility." The survey notes a number of interesting points: the typical Canadian journalist is a 34-year-old male with just over 14 years of education, who has had four news jobs over an 11-year career. He currently earns just over \$26,000 per annum in a small-market radio job he has held for approximately six years. Half of all Canadian journalists have more than 14 years of education, and females comprised over 21% of all Canadian journalists in the study.

New Palais release for Yvonne Moore

Toronto: Texas-born singer Yvonne Moore was slated for an August release with her *Hit And Run Lover* EP. This will be her second Palais Records release; *Let Me Soothe You/Real Man* was her debut, and it has gone on to sell over 2,000 copies, generating interest in Moore stateside, as well as in Europe.

The EP precedes an LP release slated for the fall and includes guitar work by studio and performance veteran Domenic Troiano. The flip is *Silhouettes*, and the sides were produced by Rory Slater. The record is supported by a video premiered in July at Toronto's Club Bluenote.

Moore was a featured performer at the 1984 Canadian Black Music Awards, where she was nominated for two awards — Top Female Vocalist and Top Song Of The Year. At the 1984 Canadian Dance Music Awards held in Montreal, Moore was designated Most Promising Female Vocalist.

The EP was recorded at Nova Sound Recording Studios, located in Markham, Ont., just north of Toronto.

CRTC issues licence to CJMF-FM

Ottawa: In a decision released August 16, the CRTC has issued a licence for a new rock-oriented FM radio station to CJMF-FM Ltee. The licence applies to the Quebec City region.

The decision follows a public hearing in Quebec City on July 4 at which seven applications were considered. A call for applications had been issued following the non-renewal of CJMF-FM's former licence which expired on March 31 of this year due to insufficient compliance with its conditions of licence.

At the hearing, CJMF officials said that they have taken "... very serious steps to eliminate any possibility of repeating past errors with respect to fulfilling our commitments to the Commission."

In its application and at the hearing, the restructured CJMF-FM demonstrated that it represents the best proposal for the success of a progressive rock station in Quebec City," said CRTC Chairman Andre Bureau, adding that "although FM stations offer Quebec City listeners a broad range of musical formats, the number of applications submitted, the public reaction, and the statistical data considered at the hearing demonstrate that an obvious gap exists. There is currently no FM station authorized to broadcast in a progressive rock form in Quebec City, even though the population under the age of 35 accounts for approximately half of this market."

The CRTC granted the licence until September 30, 1985, in order to consider the renewal of CJMF-FM at the same time as that of the other stations in the area, and in the context of the recently proposed changes in the FM policy and the FM radio regulations. The station's performance will also be examined at that time.

Jamie James furthers solo image with *Vanity* EP

Former King Bee Jamie James has been doing the rounds spreading the word about his five-song solo EP, *The Big One*. Released on the *Vanity* label — distributed in Canada by Quality Records — the EP's five tracks are *Night Rockin'*, *Way Out Of This World*, *If I Want To*, *We Got Love*, and *Pieces*.

We Got Love has been taken as the first single, and a video will be available in September. The record was produced by Robert Margouleff — notable for producing Stevie Wonder and Devo — and recorded at the Indigo Ranch studio in Malibu, California.

While still in his late teens, James headed for England, where he worked in a shop selling leather boots, and managed to get work as a session player with early '70s acts such as Tony Ashton. He remembers feeling "... a certain sense of validation ... a sense of

Herb Alpert Toronto date to support *Bullish* LP

Herb Alpert, on release currently with his new A&M LP, *Bullish*, will do one date, August 27, at Kingswood Music Theatre, Canada's Wonderland.

Alpert has 18 albums to his credit, with sales in excess of 70 million. The veteran trumpeter's current lineup consists of: Nick Ceroli (drums), Bob Edmondson (trumpet), Bob Findlay (trumpet), Jimmy Imperial (guitar), Ken Kaplan (trumpet), Sal Macaluso (keyboards), John Patitucci (bass), John Pisano (guitar), Julius Wechter (marimba/percussion), Lani Hall (vocals). This is the latest version of the band which has always been known as Herb Alpert's Tijuana Brass.

Alpert co-produced and co-wrote the *Bullish* LP with John Barnes, keyboard player and arranger, best known for his work with The Jacksons.

Returning to North America, James went through a number of musical incarnations before forming The King Bees in 1979. "Tom (president Tom Gamache) has been really supportive."

Island LP by N.Y. band features Canadian songs

Toronto: Island Records have just issued the album *Living In Fiction*, a Cancon project from the New York-based group Fast Forward that highlights songs written by Canadian artists.

The band is fronted by ex-Stories lead singer Ian Lloyd, a group that scored a major smash in 1973 with the song *Brother Louie*. Only a few years ago, Lloyd had a moderate hit with the Bryan Adams song, *Straight From The Heart*.

The album was produced by Bruce Fairbairn, but recorded in the U.S. However, the LP contains seven Canadian-written compositions in all. Island describes the group sound as straight-ahead rock.

Altogether, four tracks are written by the duo of Adams and Vallance, one by Gary O'Connor, and two by the band Toronto, which were also recorded by the local group.







PROGRAMMER PROFILE

Music and me - an overview of country music

The human voice has long been regarded as the most expressive of all instruments. It is capable of portraying the strongest of passions. With one single note it can strike what I call the 'responsive chord' within you and I. Ten times out of ten if that chord is struck, there is still that feeling within your heart; if you have to ask me what that feeling is, you ain't listenin' to yours.

There have been many moments in musical history when a single vocalist has stirred audiences in auditoriums and held them virtually spellbound. As far as ole Weird is concerned, the purpose of music - like that of any art form - is to produce a moving effect within its audience. If in addition it is capable of entertaining, relaxing, delighting or creating tears . . . all to the good. So long as it never ceases to create a sense of emotional involvement in the listener. Any music - be it punk, pop or country - is capable of generating feeling . . . as long as it satisfies two prime requirements. First, it must be performed very honestly; and, in a direct straightforward manner. Secondly, and of equal importance, the music must be performed with deep and honest feeling. This can be attained if all the vocal or instrumental skills required by the material is brought to the fore by the artist singing or playing what is important to them. The honesty and skill of the performer will be shown in their ability to communicate. If these two qualities are not evident, there is something very, very obvious.


The heart and soul of a person can usu-

ally be found in their music. I base my feeling in this regard on listening to each and every one of the records that I have in my own collection. (approx. 16,000 45's and 7-8,000 LP's). As each year passes, the country form of music seems to attract most all of the adjectives and phrases available for its description. The spectrum of country music is far beyond the boundaries of our nation, and it stretches across the seas. You can catch country music - or it can catch you - in watering holes and homes from Tokyo to Bentley to Saratoga. As each radio station tries and tries to reach more listeners than their closest competitor, today in the eighties more often than not, the means that many of them are using to try to reach their goal is country music. These stations aren't spinning Julio and 'Shotgun' Willie because they want to be country they're spinning the record because it's a good demographic tool for them. Today in '84 most everyone plays Willie; 20 years back, the country cats were already into him! Here at WX1130 as Music Director, I try to stay in tune with what is happening on the country music scale . . . as it relates to our marketplace, and most importantly, as it relates to our listeners. Having the responsibility of trying to 'pick the hits' for this radio station for the past 10 years, I do believe I've got one hell of a good idea as to just what type/style of music our listeners want to hear (or don't want to hear). Country music is direct. It tells a story, and it deals with the emotions that are common inside all of us; and believe me, those emotions do occur in each and every one of us . . . in all walks of life.

People always seem ready for something fresh and also something that maintains contact with the traditional. In the world of music it's Weird's belief that if you do not

have respect for the artists and the real, true genius - the tunesmiths - of the past then you will not be able to fully and honestly appreciate the music of today.

The first thing I listen for is the song. Whether someone has submitted a demo for an act, a dub off a master, a chart record from wherever - no matter - I listen for the song. Then I listen for the performance, the delivery, the over-all interpretation and the way the entire production is tied together. You can't have a hit record without a hit song. Oh sure, there have been, and will continue to be many a hit based largely on/around a 'sound', but, by and large a great record comes from first and foremost a great song. To me those are the most important ingredients for a hit record. Those ingredients will make a hit record. The production end (the producer who gets that great performance out of the artist) will bring it all home . . . in under 3:05!!! A great song, in a great production will give you a great performance. NOW, you have a great record.

Country music is full of folk of all ages; and many of them have a variety of ideas about the music and how it should be developed. As for myself, there is such an abundance of true talent to put ideas into our hearts and minds that I feel confident in their God-given ability to ensure that country music will continue to grow and prosper. The 'crossover' artists have brought country music to the attention of an enormous money-spending audience. And that very audience is liking what they're hearing. Ah sure, some purists will contend that this artist or that has abandoned their country roots. If those same folk heard only half the number of platters that I do, why, they'd realize that there is that abundance of young, talented artists who are well capable of performing in the traditional style. e.g. George Strait, John Anderson.

Country music is alive and it's thriving right along darlin'! The future is most assuredly bright. Funny, some of us have never doubted that all along. As Hiram said,

a moon or two back, "Want to know what makes country music successful? I'll tell you in one word: Sincerity." Amen . . . listen with your heart.

Lawler to follow-up first Bel Air single

Brampton: Tony Lawler, currently on release with Lovin' On Shaky Ground, will release his second Bel Air single in late November or December. The track co-written with Don Peters, will be The Feeling Comes And Goes.
