TELL NO LIES STABILIZES SPOONS SUCCESS

Tell No Lies, the latest EP by The Spoons on the Ready label distributed by WEA, was produced in New York by Chic guitarist Nile Rodgers, who also produced **Talk Back**, the band's album release of last year. The title track of their new album has moved into the Top 50 of the RPM 100 after only 6 weeks on release, an indication of the established popularity of the group.

It was in early 1982 when 4 young Burlington musicians, known collectively as The Spoons, came to prominence nationally with the release of **Nova Heart** - a 12" single on the Ready label. Produced by John Punter (Japan, Roxy Music), the record moved rapidly into the Top 10, and created a stir on the music scene with its dreamlike synth sequences and urgent, compelling vocal lines.

In fact, the story of The Spoons goes back to 1979, with the band's original line-up consisting of Gordon Deppe on guitar and vocals, Sandy Horne on bass and vocals, drummer/percussionist Derrick Ross, and keyboardist Brett Wickens. The latter was eventually replaced by Rob Preuss. In 1980, the band financed and produced their first single - **After The Institution/My Job**.

It was in 1981 however, when **Stick Figure Neighbourhood**, the band's debut album for Ready, topped the National Campus Radio News Chart, which marked the replacement of Wickens with Preuss. The **Nova Heart** EP followed in 1982, earning The Spoons a slot on the Police Picnic '82, held in Toronto. In September of that year, Ready inked a worldwide distribution deal with A&M Records, and October saw the release of the **Arias & Symphonies** LP, which was produced by Punter. The

LP yielded 2 singles - the title track and **Smiling In Winter** - and became the band's first Canadian gold record.

A support slot on a Culture Club tour of the U.S. kicked off 1983, and in April, The Spoons garnered 3 awards at The U-Know Awards, and were nominated in the Most Promising Group category at The Juno Awards.

Talk Back, the band's second gold LP in Canada, was released in late 1983. The association with producer Rodgers came as the result of a show he caught at The Palladium in New York City.

Tell No Lies - charting strongly nationwide - is further evidence of the fruitful collaboration with the renowned producer of David Bowie and **Gang Of Four**; funk rhythms, catchy hooks, and a more pronounced bottom end.

A video was recently completed for the single, with production handled by Pretty Pictures of Toronto.

"We liked the videos Rob (director Rob Fresco) had done", said Sandy Horne, in a recent interview with RPM. "The techniques he used and the overall effect really appealed to us," added guitarist/writer Deppe, continuing with, "It's a fun video with about 40 extras . . . a comedy that brings out the personalities of the band."

The Spoons have also involved themselves with film: Deppe and Horne contributed to the recently previewed Ron Mann film, **Listen To The City**. Horne takes a cameo part and sings in the movie, and



Deppe scored the soundtrack. The film will be released in the U.S. in January 1985.

Tour dates for The Spoons were being finalized at press time, with a swing through the Maritimes pencilled in - a leg to include college dates. A tour of Western Canada is slated for October.



Expectations running high for Juno Awards show

Toronto lawyer Peter Steinmetz is the current president of CARAS - the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences - as well as head of Toronto law firm Steinmetz and Associates.

In his role as CARAS president, Steinmetz is currently in the midst of preparations for the 1984 Juno Awards, which will be held in Toronto in the Automotive Building at Exhibition Place on Dec. 5. The event will be televised by the CBC. Responding to criticism from both inside and outside the industry, a committee set up by CARAS had determined that certain changes in the event's format would be necessary, one of which involved contracting out the show's production to an independent firm.

In the course of a recent conversation with RPM, Steinmetz commented on the choice of Toronto-based Concert Productions International (CPI) for the job.

"This would be a large and complex undertaking," Steinmetz points out. "CPI had the wealth of contacts in the music

industry - specifically with regard to talent, as well as the production experience gained in doing the First Choice Rocks series; in other words, a background in the TV production of music artists. We had several other informal bids, but perhaps the fee for our consideration of their proposal made the difference. In any event, CPI is certainly aware of their responsibilities."

Rob Iscove, reporting to CPI, will function as creative producer for the event.

CARAS has also established a dinner committee for the Junos. The Academy's intent, according to Steinmetz, is to maintain and continue the highest possible standards with regard to the dinner served at the awards.

"There were criticisms of the 'dinner theatre' format in previous shows," continues Steinmetz, "because the show went from 7 pm to 9 pm, a sitdown dinner was held after the show at approximately 9:30 pm; this tended to leave people unsatisfied and unsettled. Even serving hors d'oeuvres at 6 pm was insufficient."

Steinmetz estimates that up to 1,700 people will be served dinner.

The Exhibition Place locale has no serving kitchens equipped to deal with this sort of event, so food will be catered in from another location, and kept warm in on-sight warming kitchens.

"The location was chosen for its TV value," Steinmetz emphasizes. "In previous years, a dinner venue was chosen that could accommodate a stage show. Obviously, the program's emphasis has shifted."

The conversation ended with a comment from Steinmetz on his personal perception of the Academy's mandate, as a member of the music industry. "We have an obligation to bring to the public outstanding performers in all ranges of music," says Steinmetz. "The Academy has to be open and responsive to both negative and positive criticism from the grass roots of the industry."

Prices for the dinner and Juno Awards have now been made available and are as follows: for CARAS members - \$125 (reds), \$100 (yellows), and \$75 (blues); for non-members - \$160 (reds), \$135 (yellows), and \$85 (blues).

Hodgson promo tour to support solo LP

Toronto: A&M recording artist, and former Supertramp member, Roger Hodgson, will do a promo tour of Canada from Sep. 24 through the 28th in support of his new solo LP, *In The Eye Of The Storm*.

Hodgson will visit Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Toronto, and Montreal in the course of the tour.

In The Eye Of The Storm, written, arranged, produced, and performed almost entirely by Hodgson, is slated for a Sept. 27 release. *Had A Dream* will be taken as the first single.

Hodgson's former band, Supertramp, is still the only group or artist to have 2 million-selling LPs in Canada - *Crime Of The Century* and *Breakfast In America*.

Rick Hallson oversees format success at CKEY

Rick Hallson is currently PD at Toronto AM station CKEY 590. He was retained early in 1984 to oversee the station's change to a more contemporary programming format. An aggressive ad campaign in the highly competitive Toronto radio market alerting listeners to the new format follows 9 months of music research, talent development, and promotion strategy.

"All the components which we feel are key are now in place," Hallson explains. "We didn't make a big deal out of it, we just knew there was a major job to do. CKEY had been losing audience numbers for about a decade, while the demographic centre was hovering around 45. We've lowered that to 35, because above 49 there simply isn't any growth potential." He

International interest in MCA's Hanover Fist

Hanover Fist, a local Toronto hard rock quintet, the first Canadian act signed through MCA Records Canada for a worldwide deal, are experiencing impressive initial reaction to their 12" single release, *Metal Of The Night*. The single, is one of the key tracks on the MCA motion picture soundtrack, *The Wildlife*. A video of this track is expected shortly.


The 12" sampler, mailed to major AOR programmers and the press, contains an extended version of *Metal Of The Night* on one side with an edited track on the flip. The band's first album, likely self-titled, will be released in the new year. The session was produced by Stacy Heydon.

Metal Of The Night is the only Cancon track on the *Wildlife* soundtrack, a Universal film which is a follow-up to *Fast Times At Ridgemont High*. The film opened across Canada Sept. 28.

Also on the soundtrack are tracks by Bananarama (*Wild Life*), Andy Summers (*Human Shout*), Eddie Van Halen (*Donut City*), Go-Go's members Louise Goffin and Charlotte Caffey (*No Trespassing*), and Charlie Sexton (*It's Not Easy*). The latter features Rolling Stones' members Keith Richards and Ron Wood. The soundtrack was scored by Van Halen.

continues with, "With this format, we won't be mistaken for CFTR or CHUM, and we won't be mistaken for CFRB or CHFI."

Born in Winnipeg, Hallson began a 20-year career in radio working as a mailboy for the CBC. He did stints in production and on-air at Winnipeg's CKY, Toronto's CHUM, CKGM in Montreal, and CFRW and Q94 in Winnipeg. These were followed by PD positions at North Bay's CKAT and Toronto's CJCL.

"According to the summer BBM, our base audience at CKEY is about 400,000," continues Hallson, "A high percentage of what was lost has been replaced. With the current format, you're never more than one song from the song you want to hear."



Virgin Records Canada is gearing for what could be their best quarter. Heading the list of releases is the long-awaited new album from Boy George titled Waking Up With A House On Fire. Already shipped and garnering immediate programmer adds is the first single taken from the album, The War Song, a somewhat controversial outing that speaks against the current arms race.

The Culture Club album was produced by Steve Levine at Red Bus Studios in London. Levine had also worked on the band's previous albums. She will be recording a solo LP for Virgin for a January release.

A full marketing campaign is also in place by Virgin to back the new release, supported by a video of The War Song. As well, the band will play Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens (Nov. 15 & 16).

Also shipped by Virgin is a 5-track 12" from Heaven 17, titled Sunset Now. The session was produced by band member Greg Walsh and the British Electric Foundation which is a firm the group is part of. The new disc marks the first major release in over a year from the band which is comprised of former members of Human League. The release is being supported by a 2-track AOR 12" as well as point-of-purchase material. Tour dates are expected for the new year.

The UB40 single, If It Happens Again I'm Leaving, taken from their upcoming album, Geffery Morgan, is beginning to shape. The release was preceded by a 12" containing extended versions of the plug side and the flip, Nkomo Agogo. The LP was produced by Howard Gray, Ray Pablo Falconer and UB40 in the band's home town of Birmingham. A mid-October release is expected for the LP.

Purple Rain follows When Doves Cry and Let's Go Crazy. The former remains the fastest selling single in the history of Warner Bros Records. Purple Rain is scheduled for a late September release.

A Warner Home Video videocassette of the Purple Rain film will be available in mid-November and retail for \$39.95 in both Beta and VHS formats. The release of the cassette represents one of the fastest appearances of a feature film on video - a scant 3½ months after the film's release date.

Powerful new release set for Parachute Club

The Feet Of The Moon will be the title of the new Parachute Club album. Produced by Michael Beinhorn, a member of Material and who was also the co-producer of Herbie Hancock's single, Rock It, the album is being readied for an Oct. 12th release. Beinhorn also produced the Nona Hendryx single, The Art Of Defense.

The title track of the Parachute Club LP has been taken as a single and will be issued in a picture sleeve.

Recorded at Toronto's Sounds Inter-

change, the new album is described as "harder hitting and funkier than the band's previous release." One observer who had a sneak listen to the single is quoted as saying: "That's one of the first Cancon singles I've heard that has the maturity and confidence that goes with a world class hit."

The group has been touring the university circuit recently and will soon begin work on a video for the single with band member, guitarist Lorraine Segato behind the video concept.

Meanwhile, the group is scheduled to appear at Canada's Wonderland (Oct. 13) in the International Amphitheatre.

Hawkins to RYH with Jannetta & Bo Diddley

The Hawk (Ronnie Hawkins), is set to return to the Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel from Nov. 19 through the 24th.

Hawkins will be joined for the engagement by Patti Jannetta, fresh from the Sopot Festival in Poland where she represented Canada, and legendary Bo Diddley, affectionately referred to as "the father of rock 'n' roll".

Bringing Hawkins brand of rock 'n' roll into the staid old Imperial Room a few years ago wasn't an easy decision for promoter/booking impresario Gino Empry, but the gamble paid off and Hawkins subsequently played to capacity houses whenever he plays the giant room.

Hawkins is currently on release with his Trilogy single, Hit Record, with Ode To A Truck Drivin' Man on the flip - both Hawkins' originals. The single was produced by Steve Thomson.

Julian Lennon release scheduled for October

Julian Lennon, son of the late John Lennon, recently signed to the Atlantic label, will be on release with his initial album, titled Valotte, by mid-October. The album was produced by Phil Ramone at Muscle Shoals Studios in Alabama, as well as in New York. The young Lennon also handles various instruments on the session including bass, keyboards, and drums.

A video is likely from the LP, which is expected to be backed by a major promotional push. There is no information at press time as to the first single nor concert dates.

Other musicians on the session were the Muscle Shoals Rhythm Section, David Hood, Berry Beckett, and Roger Hawkins.

Lennon co-wrote the material for the album, along with guitarists Justin Clayton and Carlton Morales.

Canadian tour dates for Alert's Mitchell

Alert recording artist Kim Mitchell has been firmed for several Canadian dates for October and November. His debut Alert LP, akimbo alogo, has gone over 50,000 units in sales, which gives the album gold status.

Dates firmed include: Hamilton Place (Oct. 5), Civic Centre, Oshawa (6), Miss Deanna's Ballroom, Peterborough (10), Stratford Coliseum (19), Alumni Hall, London (21), and the National Arts Centre in Ottawa (15).

Dates for Toronto, Montreal, Halifax, and St. John's will be announced as they are firmed by the label.

The Kim Mitchell Band will also play small concert halls in Western Canada from late October to early November.

Alert has shipped a 12" sampler of All We Are (Is All That Love Brings) to AOR radio. This version of the song has been sped up slightly and re-equalized. A 3rd. version is being prepared for CHR radio.



**GARY O'** - Pop**Strange Behaviour** - RCA AFL1-5304-N

Gary O' is pure '80s: bubbling synth figures, electronic drums, and catchy insights into social relationships and romantic life in general. Gary O' has been successful in writing for other artists, so it's interesting to see what he tries to do for himself. Although the arrangements are effective and the production high quality, no track really stands out; perhaps the writer here is destined to perennially outshine the performer. Produced and arranged by Gary O' (which stands for O'Connor). Engineered by Brian Bell at Toronto's ESP Studios. Gary O' played all instruments with the exception of the drums, which were looked after by Gary McCracken. Cancon.

**XMAL DEUTSCHLAND** - Pop**Tocsin** - PolyVertigo - VOM-1-3339-Q

Formed in Hamburg in 1980, Germany's Xmal Deutschland came to critics' attention as the result of a support slot with Cocteau Twins in London in 1982. Fronted by vocalist Anja Huwe, the band sports a dreamy, occasionally intense sound - one which owes something to bands such as Ireland's U2 and England's Flock Of Seagulls. Mick Glossop's production has taken relatively simple melodic ideas and given them an attractive and assimilable framework. All lyrics and music by Xmal Deutschland. Glossop also engineered the production at London's Livingston Studios.

**THE FRONT** - Pop**Underworld** - Duke Street - AMD-1002-W

The core of The Front - session vets Tim Thorne and Paul Henderson, vocalist Joel Feeney, and producer/engineer Hayward Parrott - has produced a smooth, if contrived, set of studio pop drawing on diverse influences acquired working with

many currently successful artists. Those recruited for the sessions included drummer Paul Hannah, guitarist Domenic Troiano, and keyboardist Ray Parker. Key Is Your Street, with its attractive rhythmic base and overt '60s vocal affectations. A&M's success at radio bodes well for this product, and a tour would be welcomed if the principals involved can find the time. Produced at Manta Sound by Thorne and Parrott. Cancon.

**JANIE FRICKE** - Country**The First Word In Memory** - Columbia - FC-39338-H


Since performing at the CBS convention in Los Angeles in 1978, Janie Fricke has amassed several major industry honours, and toured with country heavies such as Kenny Rogers, Ronnie Milsap, Merle Haggard, and Alabama. The current Fricke single, a moving ballad entitled Your Heart's Not In It - has established itself as a hit on the RPM Country 60 after only a few weeks on release. Ten strong tracks here. Also key are The First Word In Memory and First Time Out Of The Rain. Produced by Bob Montgomery, who has been instrumental in Fricke's recording career. Front racking should turn a few heads.

**DONNA SUMMER** - Pop**Cats Without Claws** - Geffen - XGHS-24040-P

One of the original disco queens in the '70s, Donna Summer finds herself in an '80s dance market up against the very artists she so heavily influenced. Religion may have tempered the image somewhat, but the voice Giorgio Moroder found so attractive in Munich is still there. Key are I'm Free - a dance club entry - and the title track. Summer wrote or co-wrote everything here except Forgive Me And There Goes My Baby. The latter has made impressive gains up the RPM 100 singles chart. Produced by Michael Omartian. Jacket provides no studio info. The rasta/leder look combined with WEA's promo ability should click at retail.

THE ANIMALS - Pop**Rip It To Shreds** - I.R.S. - SP-70043-W

Although Animals reunions tend to be on again off again affairs, the band got it together for a show last year at London's Wembley Arena on a bill with The Police. Augmented by Steve Grant (guitar) and Zoot Money (keyboards) the band rolls through their hits from the '60s with vocalist Eric Burdon frequently struggling to replicate the demanding notes of the original versions. Originally the Alan Price Combo, The Animals came out of New-



castle, England at the height of the British invasion. The band's members have never really been comfortable in this context, with Alan Price noted in his own right as a successful writer/cabaret performer, Chas Chandler producing and managing other acts, and Burdon singing with R&B outfits on both sides of the pond. The result of one night is acceptable, but the future of this band would appear to remain anything but certain.

Deutsche Grammophon debuts Walkman Classics

New from Deutsche Grammophon is a series titled Walkman Classics, available on Cr02 cassettes. There are 20 titles with the initial release encompassing artists such as Albion, Vivaldi, Bach and Tchaikovsky.

The combination of quality programs, recording, and packaging, along with popular prices is intended to help introduce many of the world's renowned composers to the general public.

Balsam and Lee have been nominated for a Dora Award. The TV award ceremonies will take place in Toronto on Oct. 22. They were nominated for writing the music for Jacob Two Two Meets The Hooded Fang, a children's production which was stage at the Young People's Theatre in Toronto earlier this year. The show will be re-opening in December.

White Wolf ready tour to boost RCA release

Local Toronto rock quintet White Wolfe are currently readying a tour in support of their debut RCA LP, Standing Alone. The band was recently signed through RCA Canada for a worldwide deal.

The group was founded 8 years ago under the name of Farmer. The aggressive young group took their masters to MIDEM this year where they hoped to land a record deal. There was apparently much interest in the band with many enquires from 6 labels before signing with RCA. A heavy U.S. and European commitment has apparently been arranged for the project.

The Ontario-based group pulled up stakes to move to Edmonton in 1981 where they worked under the name of Warrior. They moved back to Ontario and settled in Toronto where they became White Wolfe. Their album was co-produced by Jack Richardson and Danny Lowe at Calgary's Thunder Sound Studios.

White Wolfe comprises lead singer/keyboardist Don Wilk, guitarist/vocalist Rick Nelson, guitarist/vocalist Cam MacLeod, drummer/vocalist Loris Bolzon, and bassist Les Schwartz.

Peever and CFGM are working closely to make this a fashionable Toronto and area country showplace. Opry North anchored their show at the club (Sept. 30) for a special edition, starring Prairie Oyster, Chris Whately & Caitlin Hanford, Larry Mattson and The Stoker Brothers. The Opry North band supplied all the backup.

McLauchlan tribute to Sakimoto

The latest single release by Murray McLauchlan is titled Sayonara Maverick, a tribute to Ron Sakimoto, a successful Western concert promoter of Japanese descent. The song is about Ron's parents who suffered the humiliation of being uprooted from their B.C. home during the 2nd world war and who's top priority was to impress their young son that he should not have any bitterness toward Canada.

Taylor gains nationally with Tailspin single

BOB MARLEY

Reggae King of the World

Malika Lee Whitney & Dermott Hussey

With the ongoing popularity of the late Bob Marley, particularly since the heavy concentration by Island on his recorded product, the release of this "authorized" biography of the "Reggae King of the World" is timely. Authors Malika Lee Whitney and Dermott Hussey present a



fascinating insight into this legend from his early days in Jamaica's ghetto, his stand against oppression ("I and I no come to fight flesh and blood. But spiritual wickedness in high and low places. So while they fight we down. Stand firm and give Ja thanks and praises") and the building of his greatest attribute - his music which became a force, and in some cases, a way of life, in the Western world. It was interesting to read how he came about writing I Shot The Sheriff which was re-recorded by Eric Clapton and became a huge chart success, and one of the most impressive of his methods of expressing rebellion in music: "Sheriff John Brown always hated me. For what, I don't know. Everytime I plant a seed. He say, Kill it before it grow. Freedom came my way one day. And I started out of town. All of a sudden, I saw Sheriff John Brown Aiming to shoot me down. So I shot, I shot him down." This large-print edition contains more than 200 colour and black and white photos along with original interviews with several of those who touched Marley's life, including his mother and members of the Wailers. Also includes a complete discography. Rita Marley, wife of the late Reggae King, wrote the forward, which opens with: "Jah Live, Bob lives, his music lives - Rastafari lives forever." Those who became close to Bob Marley through his music, can now, through this biography, discover his inner being and his real beliefs that led to the Bob Marley music form become an important part of the music world.

There are three indexes: Title Index, Main Category Index, and Subject Category Index. As well, there is a Sources section which is a complete listing of radio's key execs, supplying Syndicators, Networks, Reps, Trade Associations, and Consultants, all listed in a handy reference source, complete with personnel, addresses, branch offices, and phone numbers. CBC Enterprises would seem to be the most active Canadian participant, although the Source is open to all syndicators and independent producers of radio program services.

ROGER WHITTAKER

Massey Hall - Toronto - Sept. 16/84

Roger Whittaker fans deserve more than a rumpled father figure sporting a soiled jacket. Aside from the costuming, Roger was his usual dynamic personality with an exceptional repertoire that ran the full gamut of what to expect from this "African" (now living in England) recording star. One of the highlights of the evening was a short, much too short, video of his Kenya Safari, appropriately accompanied by equally impressive vocals. Whittaker's wit and thundering vocals worked one side of the stage to the other and, unlike some performers, he played the complete house, main floor, second and third balconies. Instrumental backing for the Whittaker concert is supplied primarily by the best of the crop of Toronto musicians: Earl Marek (lead guitar, mandolin and banjo), Alex Deane, flute, saxophone and English horn, Buff Allen (drums), Stacey Hersh (synthesizer), and Paul Novotny (bass), all of whom obviously work well with Whittaker's arranger Brian Knowles. These musicians will accompany Whittaker on both his Canadian and U.S. tour. The clean-shaven Whittaker whistled and wangled his way through familiar material including works by Canadian writers: River Lady (Greg Adams), Cape Breton And Me (Bob Quinn), Une rose pour Isabelle (Pierre Cour), and Canada Is (co-written by Steve Hyde and Eric Robertson). The latter was given a beautiful visual assist by a video supplied by the National Film Board of Canada. The packed house hung on every word and note, and it was interesting to see that the demographics were 10 to 80 but heavy with the 24 to 49 age group. - WG

CRTC gives break to Windsor FM stations

The *Globe & Mail* (Sept. 26) reports that "The only things they (CJOM-FM and CFXX-FM) cannot challenge are regulations that say FM stations must play at least 20 per cent programs other than music and no more than 10 minutes of commercials each hour."




