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## CANCON BRINGS HEART BACK TO CHARTS

Capitol recording act Heart have taken hold on single and album charts across Canada with their self-titled debut LP for the label. Of particular interest to Canadian programmers was the first single, *What About Love*, written by three well-known Canadian songwriters - Jim Vallance, Sheron Alton and Brian Allen. The single qualifies as 2 parts Cancon (ML).

The Heart session was produced by Ron Nevison, his first for the group, at the Record Plant in Los Angeles and the Plant Studios in Sausalito. *What About Love* is the only Cancon cut, but it was obviously enough to create programmer excitement, resulting in consumer interest in the surfacing of this very popular '70s group. The Washington-born Ann and Nancy Wilson first introduced their band to the Canadian and North American markets in 1975 and in 1976 gained national recognition with their *Dreamboat Annie* LP. The album was produced in Vancouver and released on the Mushroom label. The Wilson sisters, who were considered "landed immigrants" at the time, were living in Vancouver. They won a Juno in 1976 as Group Of The Year.

RPM recently spoke with Heart vocalist Ann Wilson via telephone in Seattle, Washington. She was asked why they picked Capitol as their release label. "Nancy (guitarist and Wilson's sister) and I weren't getting the excitement out of Epic that we thought we were worth." Wilson explains.

"We looked around and the biggest interest was from Capitol. They've been incredibly supportive since."

Wilson was asked if touring was something to be dreaded, or were there positive aspects involved, to which she answered: "There are positive aspects to touring, I think. To me, that's when a band becomes a real thing - on stage. You also get to see a lot of new places. Generally however, you don't get much writing done, except during the sound check. A couple of the new LP's songs were written out of jams in sound checks."

The other members of Heart are Howard Leese (guitar), Mark Andes (bass), and Denny Carmassi (drums). Carmassi and Andes joined Heart in 1982.

"Denny (Carmassi) and Mark (Andes) brought the band to a higher level of music."

## The Cancon music industry is healthy - Wipf

According to Jerry Wipf, General Manager of the Toronto-based Music World chain, "The music industry in Canada, in terms of Canadian product is very healthy." Wipf continues with "The last 4 months have been the most successful months Music World has had in a number of years - and this success is the long term cumulative effect of several things - everything from advertising to merchandising to product content within stores."

Music World recently opened a new store in Vancouver and, as Wipf explains: "We are actively looking for expansion, either through acquisition or through new locations. The chain, as a whole, is running very well, and we have a strong base to work from."

To what then can Wipf attribute this success - in terms of what people are buying. "We've noticed a change in buying habits."

Wipf explains. "Just a few months ago, it was normal to have 2 records each selling 100 copies. Now, you might have 50 records - each selling 4. Today there is a far wider spread of artists that are selling, as compared to the days when Michael Jackson would be 50 percent of the total stores sales."

Wipf was asked about indications of any strong trends this year: "Trends haven't been as noticeable," he answers, "but the heavy metal trend continues to do well. The metal fans are being more discriminating than they were a year ago, but the music itself has become more acceptable. If you compare Lee Aaron's new album to her last one - I think the new one is so much better. Metal has become a bonafide type of music to a point where they can have better musicians and better productions in better studios."

Wipf was asked about the charges of discrimination against Cancon and the suggestion from the Canadian government that a 50 cent surtax might be imposed to aid and develop Canadian talent and companies. "The good Canadian artists don't have any problems," Wipf answers, "and there's no

such thing as discrimination. Look at Bryan Adams, Platinum Blonde and Gowan - and over the years, Rush has done very well. Talent-wise, you have to be competitive, and if you're not - from the point of view of quality of song, of production and of delivery - then no amount of subsidies or assistance will make you competitive."

Wipf hammered home his view with: "We just ran a strong promotion with WEA on Idle Eyes, and they certainly haven't done close to what Honeymoon Suite did, but from the effort put behind them, if they don't make it on this album, it won't be because they didn't have retail or radio behind them. The public is simply saying that they're not interested enough to make them superstars on their first album."

Wipf also pointed out that "Smaller Canadian labels such as Attic and Duke Street, are doing very well. They know their market and don't spread themselves too thin."

Wipf concluded with "Our industry has about as much government subsidies and intervention that an industry needs. It's time to let the talent stand up and speak for itself."

### Changing roles for the CRTC

The CRTC has announced that they have adopted a newer approach to the administration of the broadcasting and telecommunication industries, attempting to keep up with what has been described as "the tremendous number of changes occurring within the industry every year."

According to CRTC Chairman, Andrea Bureau, "The Commission is moving away from detailed regulation . . . we are moving towards a supervisory approach." He adds however, that "the approach certainly does not rule out regulation to achieve the objectives of the Broadcasting Act."

In the CRTC's Annual Report, tabled in Parliament this past month, it was stated that there is now a "renewed vitality" to radio. It is believed this was brought about (after the recessionary period of 1982 and 1983) by several key changes that had occurred within the industry. Noted among these changes were: The portability of radio receivers; the quality of sound; the introduction of such new technologies as AM stereo; and new services, such as subsidiary communications multiplex operations (SCMO) and higher quality programming.

With respect to this new role as the broadcasting industry's supervisor, the framework that the CRTC will follow will include: more in depth analysis and evaluation of the industry to ensure that the objectives of the Broadcasting Act are still being met. This will be coupled with an increase of their monitoring efforts and lastly, recognizing that the industry must assume responsibility for socio-cultural concerns and the use of new facilities. The CRTC believes this streamlining will provide for what Bureau refers to as "a healthy and stable system." He concludes with: "This supervisory role will allow for flexibility in making timely changes to policy and in meeting expectations to respond to changes in the environment."

## Molson's & CPI Target 'Untapped Rock Market'

Molson's Breweries and Concert Productions International (CPI) have joined forces to reach what Molson's promo director Jody Bishop refers to as "untapped rock 'n' roll market". The brewery will supply the money and CPI the concert know-how. The game plan has Molson's sponsoring all entertainment events which will take place at Toronto's CNE, Ottawa's Central Ex, and a series of concerts in Western Canada beginning this fall.

The first of the CNE Grandstand shows begins Aug. 14 with Tina Turner and Glen Frey, followed by Corey Hart (15), Neil Young with Kris Kristofferson (17), REO Speedwagon with Cheap Trick (18), Willie Nelson and Waylon Jennings with Jessi Colter and George Strait (19), Placido Domingo (20), Kenny Rogers with Lee Greenwood and Sawyer Brown (21), Power Station with Paul Young and Nik Kershaw (23), George Thorogood and The Delaware Destroyers and Johnny Winter (24), Bruce Springsteen (26-27), WHAM with The Pointer Sisters (28), and DIO with Helix for a heavy metal extravaganza (31).

The above acts, with the exception of WHAM, Willie Nelson and Waylon Jennings, Placido Domingo, REO Speedwagon, Neil Young, and Bruce Springsteen will appear at the Ottawa Ex during August.

The Molson's announcement sounded the opening of what should prove to be an interesting battle for the "suds" market. Labatt's announced last week that they will sponsor a series of concerts that will take named Cancon acts across the country to play centres that aren't normally included on tour itineraries. The initial thrust by Labatt's is a 36-date tour by Platinum Blonde to which the brewery is contributing \$500,000.

The Molson's/CPI coupling will last 3 years and the money involvement is in the 7 figure range. CPI's Michael Cohl also pointed up the importance of getting to many of the centres that aren't usually included on tours by major acts. "Several Canadian cities don't even exist," Cohl told the gathering of media people at the press reception, "as far as rock tours go. This sponsorship will allow us to expand the Canadian music marketplace and create new areas of revenue and what is most important is that we at CPI can participate in the process of building a bigger, better and bolder star system in this country, for all musicians, and all their fans, from coast to coast."

To add more visibility to the brewery involvement, Molson's have come up with an eye-catching Molson Music logo which will be displayed prominently at all concerts and utilized on press releases and promotional items.

## Paying more attention to AOR stations - Saint

Toronto radio - AOR, CHR and A/C have been in a state of flux for some time, and the music programmers in this 18-station market are becoming even more concerned by moves from their competitors. Program and Music Directors are now patched into the world - looking for trends - and more street (retail) smarts, which gives them more confidence in their gut feeling toward a release.

One of the more interesting battles for the ratings with the last few books was between CFTR and CHUM - with the former finally gaining and maintaining a lead over the long-running top of the rock popularity poll which was CHUM.

CFTR's Music Director Bob Saint was asked how his station's music policy differs from that of CHUM. "I don't know how much of a competitor CHUM is, to tell you the truth," he answers. "We're paying more attention to the so-called AOR stations. I'm more concerned about a mixture of CHUM-FM, Q107, CKFM and CFNY. Between them I find a lot more tunes breaking out then I find even from CHUM-AM these days."

Has this concern evolved because of the softened sound now prevalent at some of these AOR stations? "CHUM-FM is virtually almost a Top 40 type mix," says Saint. "Taking the FM regulations as close to CHR as you legally can. They are a little yuppie-oriented gold wise naturally, where as we are more of a hot hit entity. But on the current list it's amazing - the so-called AOR station having a crossover of what use to be 40 to 50 percent, now I'd say 70 to 80 percent of the tunes are the same on the current list as a

CHR station. Can you call them AOR anymore? That's the new competition. That's where the listeners are turning to. The ratings are proving it in the last couple of books; CKFM and CHFI have always had good mid-day quarters. They do quite well during that time period - and when I compare and do a scan on them, I find a lot of the music is the same - so you shake your head sometimes, because you don't know. The only advantage we have, of course, is rotation, being able to avoid the songs we feel might flush out maybe half way up the charts. And avoiding the heat is fun, because we're no longer faced with the follow the trade adds situation. We're trying to give Toronto the cream of the crop.

"Canada, I'd say in the last 4 or 5 years, has developed its own identity. European and British product breaks out of Canada now before it goes Stateside. It must be frustrating for some American companies in that they can't get a song that's a Top 15 on R&R onto a parallel one station in Canada. We sit back and say 'This band hasn't sold here in the last 3 records, why should we go with it?'. We have a limited enough playlist as it is - so we have to make judgement calls all the time, and it's doing your homework which makes your judgement calls right."

CFTR maintains a committee which allows for the use of "gut feelings" in making add decisions. "That gut feeling has a lot to do with what we do," says Saint. "I know the market, having grown up and lived in Toronto most of my life. Sandy Sanderson, our Program Director is also Toronto born and raised, and Henry Van Derhoogen, our Assistant Music Director, was also Toronto raised. Between the 3 of us, we all have pop ears as a mainstream. Sandy likes things right up the middle. I lean more toward rock and the European releases, and Henry leans a little more towards imports - not that he likes them better, it's

just that he can hear a song that might cross-over earlier than some of us in the music department are capable of. And the committee seems to work. Usually 2 out of 3 will make a judgement call, strictly on ears. We do our homework as well. We know what's selling, what's being requested and if another station is playing something we're not on, we usually find out about it."

The retail market is very important to CFTR as Saint points out: "We follow the retail market very closely," he reveals. "I'd say we probably do more homework on the retail market than anyone else in town." How about visiting the stores? "I don't call on the stores as much as I would like to," answers Saint. "From time to time I'll drop into the stores. I like to see what's being racked. Sometimes you don't pick up on sales items - or why a particular product is moving so fast. I'll find a company has blown the price out by 2 or 3 dollars, so all of a sudden it falls into place. I then understand why it's selling so fast - it's at a very cheap price." He continues with: "Usually we have most of them covered. I'm more interested in seeing what kind of people are buying records. You can only do that by talking to the people who are selling the records across the counter."

In answer to what's the most important age group as far as the buying is concerned, Saint suggests "It varies by the record. You'll find a Cyndi Lauper has amazing appeal from teens through adults and yuppies and so on, whereas a Prince or Madonna appeals more to the teens. Then you get something like a Bob Dylan single (Tight Connection To My Heart), which is barely moving, yet the album is moving in amazing numbers. So you have to pay attention to the album sales as well, and if the album is of such magnitude, you have to credit it - acknowledge its sales and power on the market. So we are on the single even though it isn't moving as much as we want."

Cancon has been regarded by most rock and pop programmers as one of concern, but not lately. "One thing that amazes me, and something I'm very proud of is Canadian music," says Saint. "It's finally selling on its own merit. We hit a record week, 2 or 3 weeks ago: For the first time in our history we had 9 Canadian selling records on the chart without any assistance. They were all legitimate sellers. That was an amazing week."



Reporting directly to Bienstock will be Richard P. Randall (Executive Vice President, Chief Financial Officer/New York-based), Johnny Bienstock (Senior Vice President/New York-based), Irwin Z. Robinson (Senior Vice President/New York-based), Jonathan Simon (Senior Vice President/U.K.-based), and Ton Smits (Senior Vice President Netherlands-based).

Freddy Bienstock also indicated that Robinson, in addition to his responsibilities for the U.S. operation, will be responsible for the territories of Canada, Japan, and Hong Kong; while Simon, in addition to the U.K. operation, will be responsible for the territories of South Africa and Australia.

Simon will retain his position as Managing Director of Chappell-International, while Ton Smits, who remains President of Intersong-International, will additionally be overseeing operating companies in Latin America and Europe.

Acknowledged to be the world's largest music publishing organization, the Chappell and Intersong Music Group was sold by Polygram in 1984 to a group consisting of Anglo-American Music Publishing Holding Corp., Edward B. Marks Music Company, the Williamson Music publishing interests, and Wertheim & Co., the investment banking firm.

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## Hardcastle's 19 - a jolting reminder of Vietnam

The Paul Hardcastle single release of 19 on the Chrysalis label is being referred to as "a jolting reminder of the Vietnam war", but at the time delivers a new dance record that moves this Britisher into the hit arena. The single deals with the Vietnam war and its stirring message is given even more clout with a video. The latter was put together by Bill Coutourie, who utilized clips from a documentary of the Vietnam war. The single has made impressive gains up the RPM 100 singles chart, where it peaked at No. 2 on Aug. 10/85.

Stations contacted by RPM expect no negative feedback, although many had just added the single to their playlists at press time.

In addition the label has made a 12" available, containing 3 tracks: an extended version and "destruction mix" of 19, plus The Sylum. Fly By Night is on the flip of the 7".

A Hardcastle album isn't expected for some time however, the label is making available, a mini-cassette at a suggested list of \$6.98. The cassette will contain the extended and "destruction mix" of 19, plus The Asylum (It's Weird) and Fly By Night.

"It's not really an anti-war song," explains Stephen Tennant, Chrysalis Marketing Manager. "It's a reminder of the way people should have been treated when they come home from a war. The song is more geared towards the older demographic, but it's also a real good dance tune, which has a

powerful video. The editing is phenomenal."

Tennant also pointed out that the action on the single began with those stations that air imports and also at the dance club level.

CFNY-FM Toronto is believed to have been the first radio station on the record in Canada and began airing it during the first week of May. Station Music Director Eddy Valiquette revealed that it was their import Music Director, Ivar Hamilton, who brought the import disc into the station.

"The song was approved, and the phones went crazy," said Valiquette. "We're on all 3 versions. The response has been really good. The most popular version is The Final Story because of the production - it's such a hot dance record. A few have mentioned they found the lyrics depressing, but it's still a little too early to tell the response."

Henry Van Derhoogen, Assistant Music Director for CFTR Toronto, had also reported that at the time of release it was too soon to determine what the response would be by those affected by the war.

"There's a few 'dodgers' who might like it," he said. "Most of the calls are in the upper demographic. The adults were most affected - they would remember the film clips from the war." Van Den Hoogen also believes the single is a good dance record as well as an accurate reminder of what happened. "The video is going to strike some people and really affect them", he continued. "When I first saw the video, before

the 10th anniversary, I thought 'wow, it really shows what it was like', because these are actual clips from back then. Then when I heard the record again, it really reminds you of what you saw."

Despite the heavy lyrical message, Van Den Hoogen doesn't anticipate any negative feedback.

John Martin, Director of Programming for MuchMusic, says, "Everything I've heard has been incredibly positive. I think it's a great video. Usually the negative thinkers will call quickly if they don't like something." MuchMusic has been airing the video for several weeks.

## Labatt's to sponsor Kingswood shows

Labatt's Ontario Breweries and Canada's Wonderland have announced the brewery's sponsorship of the remaining shows at the amusement park's concert facility, the Kingswood Music Theatre.

Labatt's involvement began July 26 with the Beach Boys. The Kingswood concerts are part of the Labatt's Blue Live series.

"We've had a very viable promotional agreement with Canada's Wonderland since the park opened in 1981. It makes good marketing sense for us to extend our sponsorship to include the Kingswood concerts. Kingswood is a first-class operation. All the groups that play there are impressed with the sound, the staging, and the backstage facilities" states Michael B. Egan, Director of Marketing for Labatt's.

Blue Rodeo principals Jim Cuddy (guitar, vocals) and Greg Keelor (guitar, vocals) are seeking a "solid populist base" for their 8 month old quintet, unsigned at this writing.

"We've always admired bands with both success on the radio, and street credibility," says Cuddy, following the first of 3 sets at Toronto's Horseshoe. The bands first "official" gig is being committed to tape by Comfort Sound's 24 track mobile unit.

"R.E.M. really opened the doors for a lot of bands," adds Cuddy. Blue Rodeo's other members are ex-Sharks Cleave Anderson (drums), and Basil Donovan (bass), as well as Robert Wiseman (keyboards). All except Wiseman (Winnipeg) are from Toronto.

"This is definitely a 'career-oriented' project for us," Keelor affirms. "We've done a number of things here (Toronto) and in New York, but this has a 'long term' feel to it!"

The Horseshoe date revealed a band strongly planted in the Dylan/Jackson Browne singer/songwriter vein. There is certainly a lot of presence - not to mention instrumental competence - here, with Blue Rodeo occasionally adding a Tom Petty gloss to the tunes.

Keelor and Cuddy, who have worked together for ten years, cite Elvis Costello as a major influence on their writing styles.

"Good songwriting, I think, is what makes the difference between bands," Cuddy reflects. "Often it boils down to simply a 'singer/songwriter' type of presentation. I think there's more of a trend toward that attitude these days."





## KABA introduces new cassette duping system

Kenneth A. Bacon Associates (KABA) of Novato, California recently introduced their Four Track Realtime Duplication System. According to KABA's Sue Rhine, the system can reduce the cost of "producing true audiophile quality cassettes to levels competitive with large high speed bin-loop systems."

The four track capability apparently allows the simultaneous duplication of both sides of a cassette, or either side only, simply by changing the track selector switch on the master. The master deck controls tape speed (1 7/8 or 3 3/4), high or low bias, equalization, start, stop and automatic or manual rewind functions for the entire system.

The electronics are on plug-in cards and head alignment/replacement can be performed from the front of the unit without removing the transport, which is also modular. Play and record electronics not used by Realtime Duplicators when using conventional consumer decks have been eliminated, which apparently reduces costs and improves reliability."

It's interesting to note that when used in the 3 3/4 i.p.s. mode, each deck in the system can produce as many audiophile quality cassettes per hour as 8 conventional top-of-the-line consumer decks.

## Legendary Wilf Carter sets hectic tour dates

Country legend (and native Nova Scotian) Wilf Carter dropped by the RPM offices recently to talk about his RCA compilation, 50 Golden Years, and reminisce about a recording career that goes back to 1933.

Carter has been touring recently with upcoming Ontario dates in Orillia, Whitby, Parry Sound, Sault Ste. Marie, and Sudbury. Over 5 decades of making music have given him the opportunity of working with many of the most prominent people in country music.

Marty Robbins? "A great fellow to work with," Carter fondly remembers. "I was one of the last people to tour with him." Carter also remembers a young Chet Atkins teaching guitar in the late '30s, Jim Reeves ("one of the greatest"), and Orval Prophet ("a good friend of mine").

What does Carter think of the current country music scene? "There's a great difference in it now," he says. "People ask me to change my style . . . how would I change? Back then you had people like Jimmie Rodgers, Carson Robinson, and Bob Wills (early exponent of country swing)."

Accompanying Carter on his concert dates are Kitty Wells, Johnny Wright, and his son Bobby Wright. Joe Alyward and Yellerton Express are supplying the instrumental background.

Of course the Yardbirds later lead to the formation of Led Zeppelin. The Yardbirds albums were originally released in Canada by Capitol but were deleted in 1968 and have since become expensive collector's items.

## Island signs Shriekback




