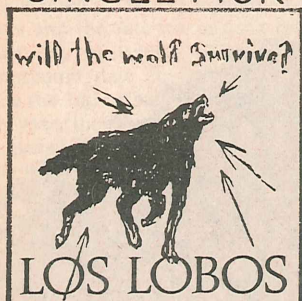

BELINDA METZ — AN ELECTRIC SPLASH

Edmonton-born singer, actress, and dancer Belinda Metz, who established herself several years ago with an album titled *The Minx*, has taken the plunge again and created an "Electric Splash" with her first Attic album.

Produced by Dave Tyson and Bob Bartolucci, the label has issued *What About Me* as the first single from the LP. A video has also been released.

After the release of *The Minx*, Canadian radio must have wondered what ever became of the energetic newcomer on the Canadian scene. By no means had Metz slipped into



seclusion. She toured such territories as Germany, Norway and Switzerland where her album had been released. The LP was also released in Japan on the Epic label.

Metz also continued her work in TV in the areas of commercials, TV specials, movies and other programs. Most recently she appeared in the documentary-drama *Charley Grant's War*.

Her interest in show business started at an early age. At 13 she began dance training.

"I want to do more film work, but I don't want to do t&a," she said. "I want to keep my integrity intact."

RPM asked the 25-year-old vocalist why it was so long between records.

"We had to get out of the other contract. My first company did a lot for me. They were running around trying to get the record off the ground. They did the best they could."

Metz stressed that there is a big difference between the two albums.

"The first album was a learning experience. I was never in a studio before and I was doing other people's material. The first was straight-ahead rock. This time, I'm the writer. It's more myself and I had a good producer. The songs are more dance-oriented and melodic. I'm much happier with this album."

It had first been planned to release the new LP on Metz's own label.

"We were in negotiations for six months with the label before signing. It was frustrating. I was doing tours and films. Meanwhile Attic continued to talk, but it took a long time. We finally signed in June."

The singer pointed out the difficulty in Canadian artists acquiring record deals.

"The majors don't want to look at you until you have your own master," she said. "I wish the people here would believe more in their own artists because there's so much talent. They should be supporting more than just a couple of acts. I see people around me who are so talented and I wonder why they're not signed."

All songs on the album were written by Metz along with Bob Bartolucci who also handled guitar on the session. Dave Tyson contributes the keyboard work. Also on the session are drummer Jorn Andersen, bassist Mitch Starkman and percussionist Memo Acevedo.

One of the big features of this album is the eye-catching and hypnotizing album jacket work by photographer Deborah Samuel and designer Dean Motter.

Plans are in the works for Metz to embark on a major showcase tour of key clubs to begin in late spring or early summer.

"There's no use in playing live if you're just going to be doing small dingy clubs," she added.

Attic Records introduced a full-scale major national campaign to support Metz complete with posters and slicks, as well as display contests with selected accounts in various regions across the country.

"She's a major artist for us already," said Lindsay Gillespie, Attic's Director of Sales & Marketing. "It's the most widely accepted record we've released in some time. We've got every CHR and AOR station on the record."

"Radio has been very very supportive. And we're giving the project 110 percent as far as effort goes. The acceptance at CHR and AOR was immediate. Belinda is currently in the final leg of a promotional tour that's taking her into Winnipeg, Edmonton, Calgary, Vancouver, Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa. We're looking at breaking her in a big way."

Gillespie added that the major cross-country showcase tour is to be tied in with a major fashion retailer as an added bonus.

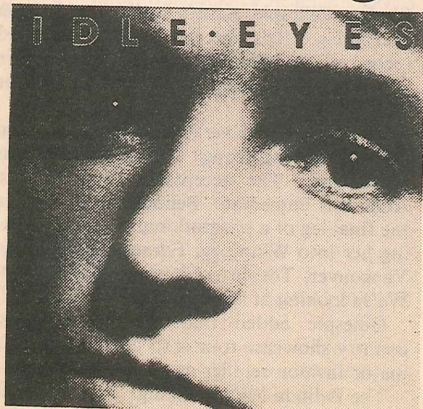

Junos '85 set for Nov. date

The Board of Directors of CARAS, the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, has announced Nov. 4 as the date for the 1985 Juno Awards. The decision was made at the board's meeting held in the first week of March.

The Junos will be telecast over the CBC-TV network from the Toronto Hilton Harbour Castle Convention Centre in a theatre setting, with a dinner being held afterwards in the same facility.

Staged in early December in 1984, the show has been moved up one month to give record companies and retailers more lead time to promote Juno product to the Christmas market.

For 1985, the Junos will air at 7 PM in a bid to corral a perceived youth audience in the 12 to 17 age bracket.

Peter Steinmetz, recently re-elected as President of CARAS, tells RPM that last year's Dec. 5 date for the Junos was the latest anybody wanted it. "We canvassed a number of venues and the date was more a function of availability of venue," Steinmetz says. "The optimum date for the record labels would be the 2nd or 3rd week of November. For this year, the possibility of the Harbour Castle opened up for a Nov. 4 date — which isn't that bad. The CBC was delighted . . . the Monday is a better TV night, and we won't lose a portion of the audience to *Dynasty* like we did last year. The teenage audience has control of the family TV in the 7-9 PM period, and that's the important audience for the program."

According to Steinmetz, complaints about last year's locale — the Automotive Building

New Frankie documentary from Island

Island Records have released a 62-min. documentary entitled *Welcome To Frankie Say Bang*. The videocassette, sent to selected retail, radio, and print people, is intended as a video summary of the success attained to date by Island recording act Frankie Goes To Hollywood.

The cassette represents the culmination of a 6-wk. pre-release campaign on *Welcome To The Pleasuredome*, the current single from the band's LP of the same name. The LP is significantly over the platinum (sales of 100,000 units or more) status in Canada, with the label anticipating sales in excess of double platinum. The videocassette includes live footage and TV interviews. Constituting one of the most hyped bands in the history of pop, the members of Frankie Goes To Hollywood rose from the tedium of the unemployed ranks in their native Liverpool to captivate audiences internationally with their sexually and politically explicit lyrics and cheeky manner with the press.

In the U.K., the two-record *Pleasuredome* LP's release last fall followed advance orders in excess of one million units. *Relax* and *Two Tribes*, songs pre-released as singles, were at one point positioned on the charts as No. 2 and No. 1 respectively. Both these went gold (sales of 50,000 or more) in Canada. A 3rd single, *Power Of Love*, was released last November. Island Product is distributed in Canada by MCA Records.

at Exhibition Place — were "legion". "Justifiably so," he maintains, continuing with "there were too many pillars, it was too cold, and there was a problem with washroom availability." As for the event's dinner, although many in the industry alluded to the dubious quality of the meal served at last year's event, Steinmetz reports that only "three or four complaints" were received about the dinner portion of the evening. He indicates that "current thinking" is to stage the event in Harbour Castle's Metropolitan Ballroom, with three or four other rooms to be utilized for the dinner at 9 PM. Regarding his personal objectives for 1985 as President of CARAS, Steinmetz cites three: continuing the effort to be responsive to the academy's membership (and increasing membership), nurturing and stimulating the involvement of the various CARAS committees, and specifically employing the academy's Advisory Committee to a greater extent. On the subject of CFNY-FM's U-Know Awards, originally a good-natured spoof of the Junos, Steinmetz says "We delighted at the U-Know Awards going to TV, and we support them as another opportunity for up and coming talent in this country."

Kruize to new Capitol position

Capitol Records have announced the appointment of Roel Kruize to the newly created position of Vice-President and Managing Director, Record Division.

The appointment was effective Apr. 1 with Kruize reporting to Capitol President J.D. Evans. Kruize has been the Managing Director of EMI Holland since 1982, joining EMI in 1962 and holding positions in marketing, A&R, and label management. In his position he will be responsible for Capitol's A&R, sales, marketing, promotion, and inventory management.

Radio Canada Int'l celebrates 40th year

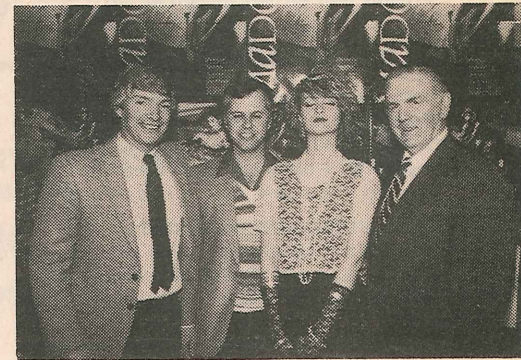
Radio Canada International (RCI), the external shortwave service of the CBC, marks its 40th anniversary in 1985. Many Canadians have come to rely on RCI while travelling or working abroad.

Through the facilities of six transmitters in Sackville, N.B. and relay stations in the U.K. and Portugal, the service now broadcasts in 11 languages to Eastern and Western Europe, the U.S., Mexico, Central and South America, the Caribbean, Africa, and the Middle East. The broadcast languages are English, French, Russian, Ukrainian, Polish, Czech, Slovak, Hungarian, German, Spanish, and Brazilian Portuguese. In addition, RCI feeds weekly programs by satellite for broadcast in the Pacific Rim. These programs consist of a weekly report in Japanese to Tokyo, and more recently, a public affairs half-hour program in English to Hong Kong. RCI also produces music and spoken-word programs for distribution to domestic radio stations around the world. According to surveys and other sources, programming reaches a worldwide audience of over 10 million listeners every week.

We Are The World to radio, retail

Canadian radio has now received 7" and 12" versions of *We Are The World* — recorded last January in Los Angeles by 45 major American recording artists to benefit hunger victims in Africa. At press time, retail was slated to receive both versions Apr. 4. An LP (to include the single, nine other previously unreleased tracks, and a Cancon package, *Tears Are Not Enough*) entitled *U.S.A. For Africa* will be released to radio and retail the week of Apr. 11. Suggested list prices will be \$2.49 (or less) for the 7", \$5.98 (or less) for the 12", and \$9.98 (or less) for LP and cassette.

All profits realized by CBS Records International from the sale of *We Are The World* and the LP *U.S.A. For Africa* (the collective name for the 45 American artists) will be contributed to *U.S.A. For Africa*, a non-profit corporation. *We Are The World* was penned by Michael Jackson and Lionel Richie. *Tears Are Not Enough* was recorded in Toronto by a gathering of Canadian artists calling themselves *Northern Lights*. The song was penned by David Foster, Bryan Adams, and Jim Vallance.



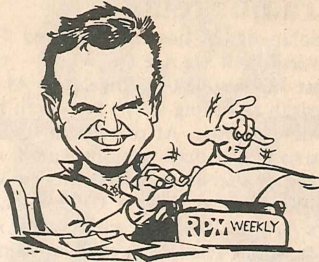

Quality acquires 2 new labels

Quality Records has inked a licensing agreement with Heavy Metal Records in the U.K. Quality will also distribute the F.M. label in Canada — a subsidiary of the Heavy Metal group of companies. In this country, the former will be registered as Heavy Metal Canada, with initial releases including *Wrathchild*, *Pet Hate*, *The Rejects*, *Jim Dandy*, and *Multi-Story*.

Heavy Metal Canada will be introduced via a low-list compilation LP, and will sport its own logo and label design. In related news, Quality has acquired the Kent Records blues label, and will release five titles initially — two from B.B. King, Tina Turner, Big Joe Turner, and Little Richard. The catalogue includes titles by Z.Z. Hill, Johnny Otis, Elmore James, Lightnin' Hopkins, and others. All Kent titles will be available at mid-price list, and will be available in both LP and cassette formats.

Valentine in-studio with new songs

Singer Cindy Valentine is currently in-studio assembling songs for an LP's worth of material to be recorded in Montreal. In an interview with RPM held in Toronto, Valentine spoke about her future plans and work to date with manager/producer Tony Green. "There's a different excitement level in Montreal," she responds, when asked why the sessions are being done there. "It's a case of energy, I guess. Tony's based there, and we've always worked well together. I'm happy, because the album opened things up." Green is internationally renowned for his work with acts like France Joli. The album Valentine refers to is Rock And Roll Heart Attack, released by CBS Records in February of last year. Despite the release of three singles (Big Kiss, Make It Through The Night, and Victim) and a promotional video featuring Michael Damian, the LP sold poorly, and the label was apparently unable to secure other territories for its release. The LP received little support at radio. Following her departure from CBS, Valentine straightened a few legal things out, and got to work on new material. "I don't want to just throw a band together and go out," she asserts, asked about plans to tour. "I'd like to put together an 'American-style' show."

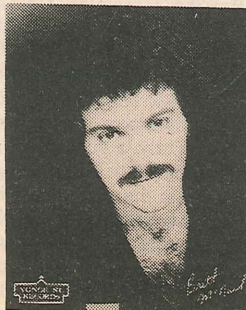

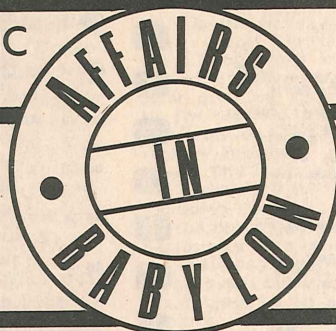

Doors featured in MCA Video

MCA Home Video releases for the month of April include The Doors' Dance On Fire, a 65-min. video collection of live and televised performances as well as "behind the scenes" footage from the career of the legendary Los Angeles band. The Doors have been inspiration to a generation of musicians, including such popular acts as The Stranglers, R.E.M., and Echo and the Bunnymen. The video includes Break On Through, People Are Strange, Light My Fire, Wild Child, L.A. Woman, The Unknown Soldier, Roadhouse Blues, Texas Radio And The Big Beat/Love Me Two Times, Touch Me, Horse Latitudes/Moonlight Drive, The End, Crystal Ship, Adagio, and Riders On The Storm. The Doors were Jim Morrison (vocals), Robby Krieger (guitar), Ray Manzarek (keyboards), and John Densmore (drums). Morrison died in Paris in 1971.

Attic LP highlights Bicentennial

Selected highlights from Ontario's 1984 bicentennial military pageant are now available on Attic Records' A Royal Salute To Her Majesty The Queen. Held in honour of Ontario's 200th anniversary and the Queen's Royal Visit, the pageant featured over 50 military bands, regiments, troops, and reserves. This is the first LP of military music to receive permission to use a photo of the Queen and Prince Philip on the front cover. Attic's LP was recorded on 24-track at Exhibition Stadium in Toronto in Sept. 1984, produced by Mark Domenico.

Tears No. 1 at MuchMusic

Tears Are Not Enough, the song recorded by over 50 Canadian recording artists collectively known as Northern Lights, has entered the MuchMusic video channel's Top 30 survey at No. 1. Proceeds from the song, written by David Foster, Bryan Adams, and Jim Vallance, will go toward aiding famine victims in Africa.

Sweet Blindness at Bluenote

The Sweet Blindness Reunion featuring Bob-Dupont and Curtis Lee will continue at the Club Bluenote in Toronto until Apr. 13.

Quality to release Young single

Quality Records is set to release Rock Me Down, a single from Los Angeles-based singer Mona Lisa Young. The flip is Let's Start Again. Both sides were co-written and co-produced by Canadians Peter Foldy and Joel Wertman, and qualify as two parts Cancon (ML). A veteran session singer, Young has worked with artists such as Air Supply, Tina Turner, Neil Diamond, Joe Cocker, Jermaine Jackson, and Barbra Streisand. Knife, her 1983 LP release on Motown, was never released in Canada. Foldy and Wertman are principals in Buddy-Buddy Productions, a

Los Angeles-based production firm. The duo plan to record an LP this spring with Young, based on response to Rock Me Down.

RIAA nod for Duran Duran

The Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) has recognized Capitol recording act Duran Duran's achievements in the realm of video. All of the band's home videocassettes have been certified either gold or platinum. The Sony Video 45 Dancing On The Valentine and the 1984 tour documentary Sing Blue Silver have sold in excess of 20,000 copies with the Duran Duran Video LP selling in excess of 60,000 copies.

IM firmed for Toronto date

IM, characterized by lead singer Michael Vini as playing "dance music with a rock edge," have been firmed for a date at Toronto's El Mocambo Apr. 18. Vini confirms that representatives of 3 major labels will attend the showcase. Based in Toronto, IM consist of Steve Agel (lead guitar), Anthony Montano (keyboards, rhythm guitar), and Peter Kouly (drums). Vini, in addition to his vocal chores, plays bass.

Thorogood & Destroyers on tour

EMI America recording artist George Thorogood, who has already played a date in Vancouver, has been scheduled to begin a national tour of Canada. Thorogood and the Destroyers have been supporting their latest Capitol-distributed album, Maverick. The track, I Drink Alone, may be the first single from the LP. A video of this cut is available. Confirmed dates are Ottawa (April 8), Montreal (9), Toronto (23 & 24), Winnipeg May (6), Saskatoon (7), Regina (8), Edmonton (10), and Calgary (11).

Radio only disc from Helix

While the Helix album Walkin' The Razor's Edge approaches the double platinum mark in Canada, Capitol has issued a live, radio-only mini-album from the Kitchener hard rock unit. Handled by British producer

Simon Hanhart, the disc was recorded during one of the two dates at London's legendary Marquee Club during the band's European tour. The band played Germany, Finland and Sweden. Cuts on the disc include Young And Restless, Rock You, Anything You Want, Gimmie Gimmie Good Lovin', Animal House and Heavy Metal Love. Capitol has no plans to let Canada's Helix fans have the disc since the current single from their latest album, (Make Me Do) Anything You Want, a cover version of the Foot In Cold Water classic, continues to gain action across the country. Instead there are plans to release it at another time, possibly as a full album with extra live cuts.

Above And Beyond release

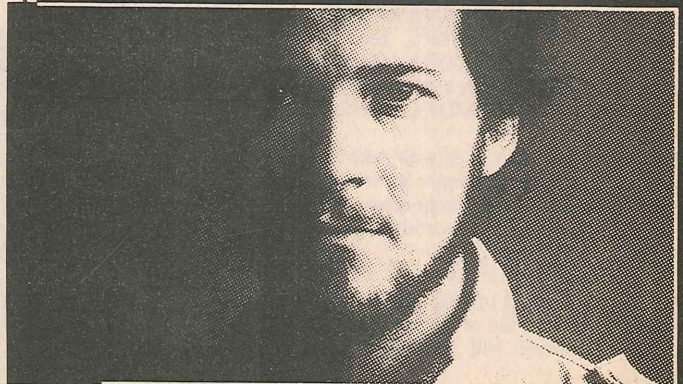

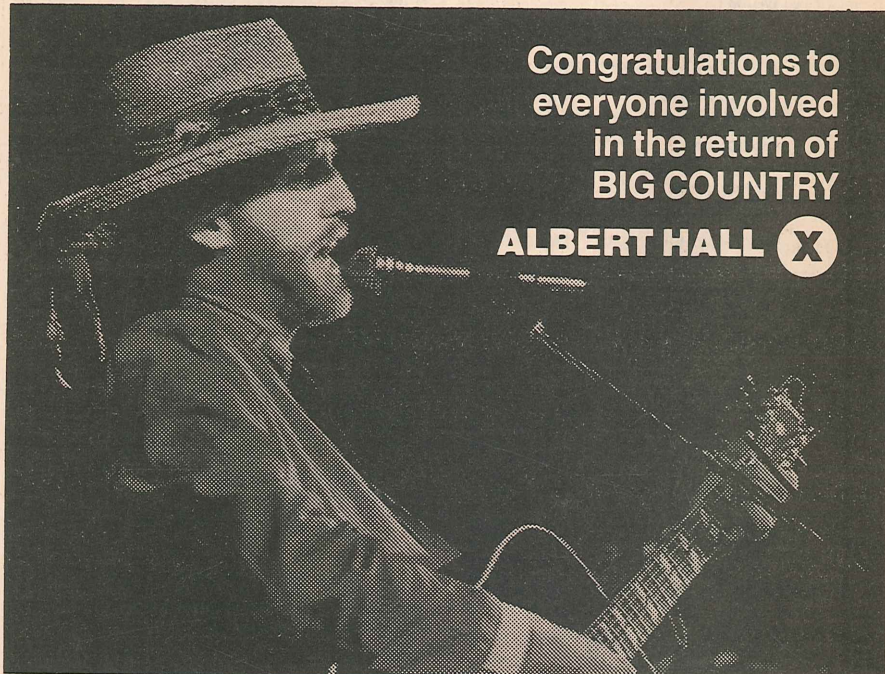
MacNeill bid for action with SummerSalt release

When Anne Murray took her first solo act on the road, Haligonian, MacNeill was her guitarist. He later backed John Allan Cameron and has since worked with many Canadian performers including Bruce Cockburn, Dan Hill, and Valdy, to name just a few. He has also produced albums for Canadian acts, his most notable being Albert Hall's debut in 1982.

Colston-Weir guides CHFI

Peggy Colston-Weir has been with CHFI-FM in Toronto since 1978. Her current position at the station is Program Director and Vice-President of Programming. She is also Vice-President of Programming for Rogers Radio Broadcasting (FM). Colston-Weir is part of a team that has gradually altered FI's once staunchly MOR sound to a more contemporary one. "We took the ingredients for adult radio (listeners from 30 to 40 years of age), and applied 'progressive radio' disciplines and philosophies," she explains. "It's important that announcers have their say — they're talking to people like themselves." Several of the station's on-air personalities once worked in what was originally termed 'progressive' radio. Born in the U.S., Colston-Weir moved with her family to Belgium when she was 14, ultimately attending university there and working in France interviewing artists from the U.S., the U.K., and Europe. In 1972, Colston-Weir was one of over 100 European delegates to the Canadian music industry's Maple Music Junket. "I fell in love with Canada," she remembers. "Montreal seemed the perfect place — half North American and half European." Colston-Weir worked in Montreal radio for several years — notably CHOM-FM — and joined CHFI in 1978 as Program Director.

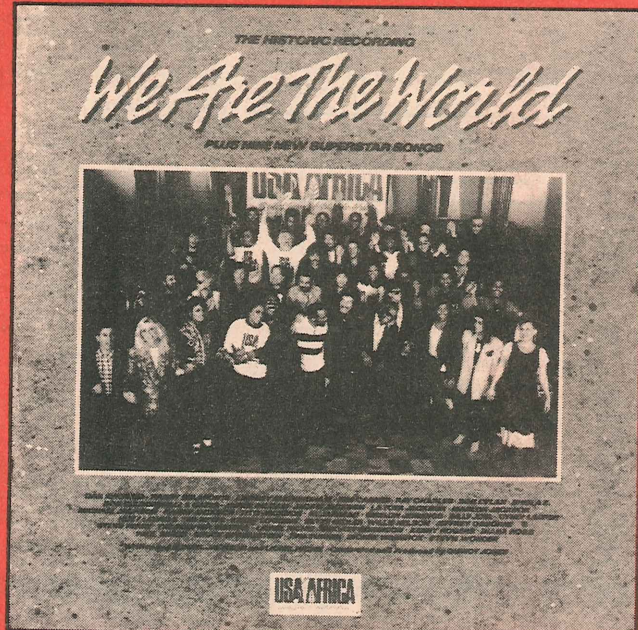

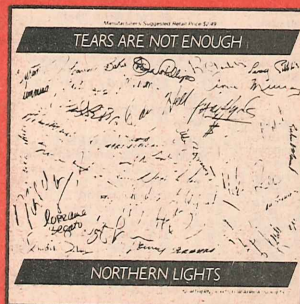

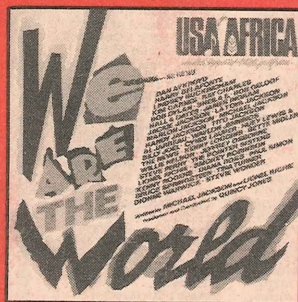
