ORIGINAL FM MEMBERS BACK IN LINEUP

The original Toronto-based FM, formed in 1979, consisted of Cameron Hawkins, Martin Deller and Nash The Slash. Their debut album went platinum in Canada (100,000 units sold), and continues to sell to this day. It's now 6 years later and FM is back on the charts with their latest album, *Con-Test*, just released on the Quality label. The album entered the RPM 100 at No. 92 with a bullet (Sept. 7) and their single, *Just Like You*, is an immediate add to radio charts.

Clearing up what might have been some confusion about FM's beginnings, Cameron Hawkins was quick to point out that the original lineup consisted of only Nash The Slash and himself, "then Marty (Deller) joined, then Nash left and Ben (Mink) joined, then Ben left and Nash rejoined - and that's where we're at now - basically a 3 man band, although Ben did guest with us on the session."

was an expansion. We were objective and the music dictated. It wasn't like we had to do something because we played all these things or that we wanted to include these people. We wanted to because we felt the music included them, and the music was the focus."

Hawkins was asked about the differences between the *Black Noise* LP and *Con-Test*. "Black Noise started off as an experiment - from a 3-man experimental band," he explained, "a band that combined electronics with pop music. A lot of people put us into the progressive niche. That was back in the '70s. Now it's 1985 and what was once experimental is now day-to-day accepted. Therefore, I don't think our approach is any different today - with the use of electronics to write good songs."

Deller interjects: "As with *Black Noise*, the music is the main focus and the use of electronics is always a means to that end, never as an end in itself. Therein lies, not a difference, but a continuity, which relates the 2 albums together. Also, there's a very strong connection between the 2 albums and the 3 players being back together again. The chemistry that was evident on the first album is evident on this one."

A video is now in the works as Deller explains: "We're working on a video now. It will tell a story in a song and because the band has always maintained its creative input into all things as we go along - we will in the video as well. Hopefully, it will be ready soon."

Hawkins explains that "the first time

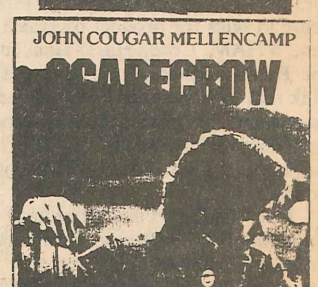

Summer superstar dates gives boost to record sales

Contrary to what some observers were predicting, the recent spate of superstar concert dates has given a boost to both LP and single sales, not only by these name acts but for record sales in general.

"If you had asked me 3 years ago if the concerts at the CNE and Kingswood would have had a bad effect on record sales, my answer then would have been yes," said Al Andrichow, Director of Sales for Capitol-EMI Records Canada. "This year, I believe the concerts helped carry the momentum - as in the case of Tina Turner for example. It gives good reason for more airplay and for front racking - and yes, you can sell a lot more records, as we did with Tina." Andrichow also pointed up that he didn't find ticket prices "posed any problem", continuing with "I saw the Grandstand (CNE) emptying after the Corey Hart concert and I think every teenager had a Corey Hart T-shirt - and his product, albums and singles are still selling exceptionally well. Power Station was another group that did quite well at the CNE and the resultant album sales are further proof of their popularity. Our economy must be in good shape."

Cathy Pitt of A&A's Yonge Street store in Toronto was also of the opinion that concerts by name acts gave a boost to record sales over this past summer. "We saw an increase in sales for product by Bruce Springsteen, WHAM, Corey Hart, Tina Turner and The Pointer Sisters," Pitt pointed out. "I think that with the tourists in town, many for the concerts, they came into the store looking for records by these groups, and they also bought other product while browsing through the store."

Don Oates, Vice President Sales & Marketing for CBS Records Canada, saw an across-the-board increase not only by those acts appearing at the CNE and Kingswood, but on their general hit roster as well. "We registered good sales of both LPs and cassettes for Bruce Springsteen and WHAM prior to their concert dates," he notes, "as well as

for product by several of our Canadian acts. Look what's happening with Platinum Blonde for example." He concludes with "I think the concert dates at both Kingswood and the CNE were another plus factor for the record industry, and with front racking of much of the product by these acts, retailers would most certainly benefit."

"When we have an artist appearing at locations like the CNE or Kingswood, we get to secure more rack space," says Tim Williams, National Sales Manager for RCA, "more front pockets to support the show that's in town. What it does, for certain artists, is that you get a lot more catalogue back up on racks, like on Waylon Jennings, who appeared with Willie Nelson. It enabled us to get his Greatest Hits LP back up on the racks as well as Waylon & Willie - and the sale through has been great."

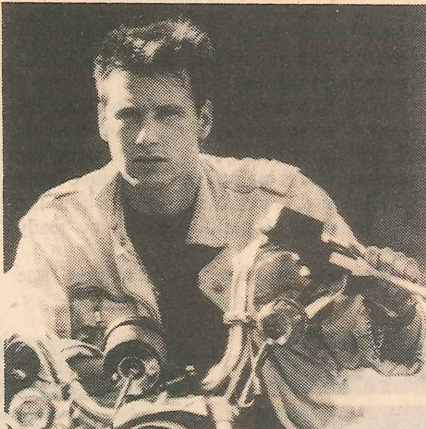
Even those majors that didn't have name acts playing dates over this period have found a maintaining of flow of product and, in some cases, an increase. "Bryan Adams isn't

Hart completes successful tour of Canada

Aquarius recording artist Corey Hart has just completed his 20-city tour of Canadian dates and will launch his debut U.S. tour in Milwaukee on Sept. 22.

Hart virtually sold out each date in Canada, however, his rigid insistence on fair sightlines and no rear-seating prevented Canada's first absolutely-no-deadwood box office result.

Because Hart's concerts create such mass excitement, first-aid stations were kept busy each night treating patrons for heat and

hysteria. These avid fans (177,647 who bought concert tickets) grossed Hart over \$2,750,000. His largest crowd was in Toronto where he played to 22,235 with this concert alone grossing \$381,346.75.

Hart's Never Surrender single topped the RPM singles chart on July 6, and his follow-up, Boy In The Box, is fast climbing the chart and is already in the Top 20 after only 4 weeks of release. Boy In The Box, Hart's LP which includes both these singles, topped the RPM 100 on July 27, a position it has maintained for 6 straight weeks.

appearing at the CNE until later this month," says Joe Summers, Senior Vice President and General Manager of A&M Records Canada, "but his album and single product continues to sell in strong numbers. I expect that by the time Bryan plays Toronto, we will have sold even more of his Reckless LP, which should make this the largest selling album by a Canadian artist (600,000 units sold)." Summers concludes with "Just as a matter of interest, this past month of August was the second largest month in the history of A&M. We're hot, very hot."

"We didn't release too many LPs over August," says Garry Newman, Vice President Sales for WEA Music Canada, "but we haven't noticed any slippage with any of our current releases. Madonna and Phil Collins are big big sellers, along with Motley Crue and Howard Jones. One of our acts that did appear at the CNE, Neil Young, is shaping up fast. His Old Ways LP is one of the fastest moving releases for this month."

Idle Eyes to play dates on Adams Canadian tour

Vancouver-based Idle Eyes have been firmed to join Bryan Adams for his September dates. They will appear with the A&M superstar in Montreal (Sept. 22), followed by Quebec City (23), Ottawa (25 & 26), and an unconfirmed date for the 27th.

Idle Eyes, who have just descended the RPM 100 singles after a successful run with their WEA release, Tokyo Rose, are also set to appear on MuchMusic (Sept. 7), shown in concert which was recently taped at Toronto's Diamond Club. Their album debut has just been released in the U.S. on the Mirage label.

CBS to administer ATV Music copyrights

Negotiations for the sale of ATV Music to the Michael Jackson group, which have been going on for a year and a half, have finally been completed. ATV, which was owned by ACC, the holding company for Murdoch Communications System (Australia), has been purchased by Jackson for an estimated \$47 million.

CBS Songs will take over the administration of ATV Music worldwide with the closing of all offices and clearing of staff. The Toronto operation will be taken over Sept. 6. A name change for the new organization will be announced at a later date. Insofar as the Toronto operation is concerned, Jackson bought the copyrights and computer, but not the staff. However, it has been learned that CBS Songs will be retaining the 3 member royalty staff. Frank Davies, who headed up the Canadian operation for ATV, will remain until October. It's also quite possible that with the size of the ATV catalogue, CBS Songs may re-employ some of ATV's staff.

MIJACK, Jackson's publishing house, will apparently not be involved with the new company which holds more than 40,000 copyrights, including some 250 titles from the Beatles, as well as very valuable copyrights recently recorded by Pat Benatar and The Pointer Sisters, not to mention old Little Richard material.

Vancouver vs Montreal for Juno Male Vocalist

With the phenomenal success of both Vancouver's Bryan Adams and Montreal's Corey Hart, the focus of this year's Juno Awards will most certainly be on this pair, both of whom are also experiencing international acclaim. Adams and Hart, both with album and single product on RPM charts, the latter holding down the No. 1 position on the RPM 100 for the past 6 weeks (topping the chart on July 27) are competing against each other in 4 categories. It's interesting to note that Adams' Reckless LP has been on the RPM 100 for 44 weeks, topping this national chart on Feb. 23 of this year. Reckless has sold in excess of 650,000 copies, which makes it one of the largest, if not the largest selling Can-con albums in the history of compiling numbers for the record industry.

Adams and Hart are not without competition however, as dark horse Larry Gowan, who has been nominated in 3 categories with the A&M and Aquarius pair, finishes off one of the most successful years of his career.

Another highlight for this year's Junos will be the presentation of a special Juno Award to the people of Canada, given by CARAS on behalf of the participating creators and performers of Tears Are Not Enough. The award will be presented to Prime Minister Mulroney at the Junos by producer David Foster.

The Variety Club will be holding their Salute To The Junos once again. The date for the luncheon has been set for Friday Nov. 1st. Many of the Juno nominees will be on hand for this event.

New logo created for Juno Awards

A new logo has been created for the annual Juno Awards by Dean Motter and will be implemented immediately by CARAS. The 1985 Juno Awards will take place at the Toronto Harbour Castle Hilton (Nov. 4) a co-production by CARAS and the CBC.

Motter has 2 Junos to his credit: one for the 1984 Nylons' LP and the other for Anvil's Metal On Metal, which he won in 1983.

CIRPA organizes booth for this year's MIDEM

Earl Rosen, Executive Director for the Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA) has announced that CIRPA will once again be organizing a Canadian Booth at this year's MIDEM '85 to be held in Cannes, France from Jan. 27 through the 31st. Rosen expects that this year, the 5th such year for CIRPA's participation, will see an increase in registrations from Canada. "The excellent booth location and carefully planned promotions should make for a very prosperous trip for all concerned," says Rosen.

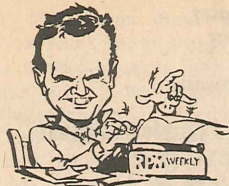

Attic Records' Lee Aaron was on hand to talk about her upcoming shows in Western Canada.

Also attending were Kids Records' Bill Usher and Lyndon Fournier who presented new product from their artists and detail marketing plans for the upcoming year. Virgin's Bob Muir previewed a quantity and quality of upcoming releases. Windham Hill were represented by Larry Hayes who pledged more support this year, in terms of touring artists in Canada. Passport Records previewed new product from Jack Starr, Robin Trower and Brian Eno as well as presenting a debut video from the Fools.

To complete the meetings, A&M President, Gil Friesen presented their latest movie effort Better Off Dead at a special screening in Orangeville.

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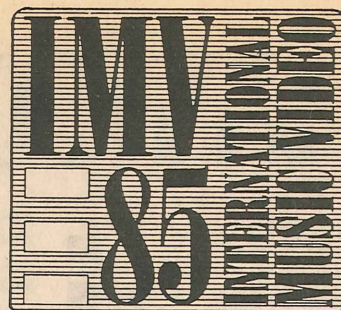
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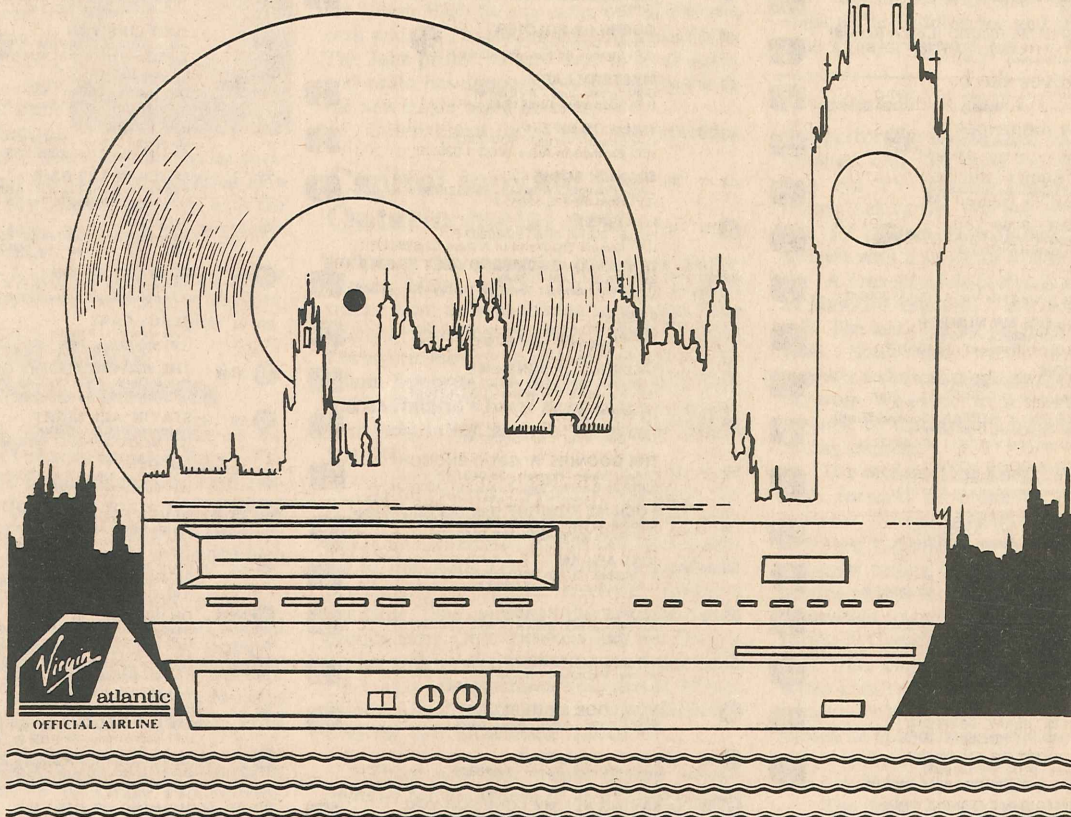

There's good request action across the country and chart numbers are now starting to come in from Vancouver to Halifax - adding up to a solid building situation. My only concern is that some stations are reluctant to put *You Look Marvelous* in regular rotation or to chart because it's perceived as a novelty song. My solution is to go with the flow. If the sales and requests are there - what's the problem?

The video is also doing a great job at TV and in the clubs where there is great support.

**Movie and single set for Patti Jannetta**

Following her recent performance at the Royal York's (Toronto) Imperial Room with Bo Diddley and Ronnie Hawkins, Patti Jannetta entered the studio where she recorded *Make Up Your Mind*, a duet with Diddley. The song will also be used in a forthcoming movie titled *Loverboy*.

As a result of these and other accomplishments, including her tour of Poland where she represented Canada at SOPOT, CFTO has offered Jannetta a TV Special. The special is currently being shot in Jamaica and will be titled *A Family Christmas With Patti Jannetta*.

To coincide with this national exposure, Steve Thomson of Backstage Productions, has scheduled an album session, which he says "will feature Patti as a more energetic A/C performer than did her last self-titled album".

After all, this is a lifestyle record from a man with a very high profile (you know what I mean?).

Closer to home, radio and retail have given Saga tremendous support. The single, *What Do I Know*, has been added at virtually every station from coast to coast. The album is pulling chart numbers at AOR and the video has been added on MuchMusic. All in all we have an excellent situation for the band as they prepare to go on tour.

The Payolas are still as strong as ever with great airplay across the board.

Paul Janz's third single and title track of his album *High Strung* came out of the box with adds in Toronto at CHUM and CFTR. The Janz project is very dear to us at A&M and radio has supported it all the way with the new single being no exception.

She cautions however, that "only groups from Ontario, excluding the Ottawa Valley will be eligible." She concludes with "We also hope to have Volumes of *Moose Molten Metal* for the West and the Maritimes over the next little while."

The upcoming album's title is *The Lines Are Open*. The first single will be *Talk Talk* due for release the week of September 17th. The album is produced by David Tyson. Internationally there is an enormous amount of interest in this new release.

Past successes are great but the future is what we're building for and the Arrows will play a major part of that.

FM performed was in front of the television cameras. Our first show was on *Night Music* (the old TV Ontario program hosted by Reiner Schwartz). We put FM together for this TV project. Now, videos are a normal process with a single or album release."

A tour schedule is also in the works, but as Hawkins explains, "We're still in rehearsals. The last time we played Toronto was in 1984. Since then we've decided to put together a show that people are going to freak out over. We expect to be touring in October through to Christmas - hopefully taking us across Canada."

It's obvious that most Canadian groups look forward to breaking into the U.S., however, Hawkins views this as "The U.S. looks on Canada as a test market, and the strongest calling card for us would be a successful record in Canada. Right now, we're committed to taking the record as high as it will go in Canada and then we'll approach the U.S." He continues with "Canada and the States aren't much different, and if the album is successful here, multiply that by 10 - and it should be able to happen in the States. Given this scenario, we're looking at January/February to head down south."

The timing for the return of FM could fit in with what is happening on the upside of the Canadian music industry. Says Deller, "It's like a wave. It's something that started out small, but now it's beginning to reach the shore. We have all these people, like Bryan Adams, Corey Hart, and bands like *Honey-moon Suite* and *Platinum Blonde* - all these different kinds of bands, and such a variety. It's not like the old days when there were just a couple of names at the top of the roster - like Anne Murray. Canadians can't be thought of as the home of the *Snowbirds* anymore. That image has changed. What happened to Australia a couple of years ago is happening to Canada today. People are saying 'yeah, Canada CAN produce international music', and it can't do us any harm at all."

Hawkins and Deller concluded with an analogy between hockey and music: "Just like we were once known for our hockey players - record companies in Europe and the U.S. now look to Canada for their great musicians."

Parr to tour with Turner

John Parr has moved out on an extensive North American tour as special guest on Tina Turner dates. Parr will interrupt this tour for an appearance with Bryan Adams in Toronto (Sept. 21). His Canadian dates with Turner begin in Winnipeg (17), followed by Calgary (24), Edmonton (25), and Vancouver (27). Parr's current single, St. Elmo's Fire has bulleted to No. 5 on the RPM 100 singles

chart. During his concert he will feature music from his self-titled debut album.

Roth to star in Crazy From Heat

David Lee Roth and Pete Angelus (director of Roth's music videos) have signed with CBS Productions to produce their first feature film, Crazy From The Heat, a comedy. Roth will star and co-direct with Angelus. The pair also co-wrote the screenplay with Jerry Perigian. Says Roth: "The movie will be a combination of fine art and pizza delivery." Filming will begin this winter and will be ready for release next summer to coincide with a tour by Roth and the release of an album containing the film's music.

Rubber Rodeo back in studio

Rubber Rodeo are currently recording their second album at Le Studio in Morin Heights, P.Q. Out of this session will come Heartbreak Highway, the follow-up to last summer's Scenic Views. Ken Scott, who has various name groups to his credit (Devo, Supertramp, The Tubes, and David Bowie) will produce. Accompanying Heartbreak Highway will be a mini-movie: a series of song clips telling a story when viewed in sequence and is tentatively slated for completion this coming January.

Flaming Hands debut on Attic

Attic has shipped the self-titled debut LP from The Flaming Hands, an Australian duo signed to the label this past summer. The duo consists of Julie Mostyn (vocals), and Jeff

Sullivan (keyboards). The latter also produced. Break Down And Cry will be the first single which will be accompanied by a video. The LP also guests members of INXS.

Profits to Live-Aid from Bowie/Jagger release

Dave Evans, President of Capitol Records-EMI of Canada, has announced that "Mick Jagger, David Bowie and EMI America Records have joined forces in the ongoing fight to end world hunger, and that the release of this duo's version of the classic Dancing In The Street was August 19th, a date coinciding with the worldwide release of this record." He went on to point out that "Donations from the proceeds of this specially recorded song will be going to the Live-Aid Foundation in support of the music industry's continued commitment to eliminate world hunger."

The collaboration represents the only record being officially released in conjunction with the historic Live-Aid Concert, the most widely watched television event in history. Evans concludes with, "Capitol Records-EMI of Canada gratefully acknowledges the cooperation of CBS Records.

Dancing In The Street is already one of the hottest single releases on the charts and entered the RPM 100 singles survey at No. 71 (issue dated Sept. 7).

Sarah Norris upped to Capitol Marketing

Sarah Norris, most recently National Press & Publicity Manager for Capitol Records-EMI of Canada, has been promoted to Product Manager, National Marketing Division for the company.

Norris, who joined Capitol in 1981 as A&R Coordinator, had been involved with music/disc activities for several years before joining Capitol. These included El Mocambo Records, Charles Dunn & Owens and CHUM.

A new National Press & Publicity Manager has not yet been named.

Gould TV Special to be aired by CBC

A 2-hr. TV Special will be aired (Sept. 8) by CBC, entitled Glen Gould: A Portrait. The special is an intimate look into Gould's life and legacy and is divided into 2 parts. The first covers his early days and his development into a world class pianist, and the second deals with Gould's search for his own identity, culminating with his emergence as a creative force beyond the confines of his keyboard. Both segments were written and narrated by associates who had worked with him during his career - Vincent Tovell narrates the first part with Eric Till narrating the second part.

The special contains interviews with Gould's father, many of his friends and colleagues, combined with radio and television performances that reflect his range of music.

Cancon Country shows increase

Cancon country productions have shown a decided increase over the past 3 months to the point where some country programmers have become frustrated with their inability to chart these productions because of their short playlists. The "Beaver Bin," which some programmers supply their on-air personalities as a "catch all" for Cancon releases, is pushing out the inferior product that has been hanging around for months, and in its stead is what one programmer referred to as "hits out of the box - and many of them by first 'round artists." This same programmer, who for obvious reasons, doesn't want to be identified, continued with: "It's frustrating

as hell when it comes to our music meetings and deciding who should be charted or playlisted. We have to go with the names that draw and satisfy listeners like George Strait, Alabama, Conway Twitty, Merle Haggard and Willie Nelson. But we just can't overlook the potential of some of these Canadian recordings, and we're now in the process of changing our policy with regard to Cancon."

Country in general has become a very hot item, with major labels stepping up their releases of U.S. product, quite often simultaneously with their U.S. releases. With this "swamping" of U.S. product, many programmers have been forced to delay action

on Cancon releases, which is now indicating a waiting period of up to 5 weeks before considering adding a Cancon single to the playlist.

Prime examples are Lou Natalie's *Serenade Your Lady*, A Place In The Shade by Jules, Frank Trainor's *You Sure Didn't Waste Any Time*, Marie Bottrell's *Premeditated Love*, and Matt Minglewood's *Livin' Outside The Law*. In some cases, the wait has been so long, that labels are moving to a release follow-up, assuming their single is "dead".

Jamie Warren ran into a problem with the release of *Too Good To Be True*, considered a "shift away" from his usual sound. However, this Spin artist has persevered and has concentrated his efforts on the A/C market as well - a ploy that is obviously working. A/C reaction to his single was almost immediate, which could bring him in the back door with country programmers, who might possibly recognize the crossover potential of this release.

The Mercey Brothers are also on a holding pattern, both with their MBS release of their own single, *Love Is The Reason* and brother Ray's solo entry of *It's All In The Touch*. Newcomer to the MBS label, Joan Kennedy, who received a hefty boost in promotion through the press, has a strong single with *Calling All Fools*. But again, the field is overcrowded. Other newcomers finding the going difficult include Waco Kid with *Good Old Coke*, on the Kinfolk label; Kevin Simpson as a solo with *Let's Not Be Strangers* and as a duet with Vanessa Jean Moulton on *I Wish*, both released on the Ebony label.

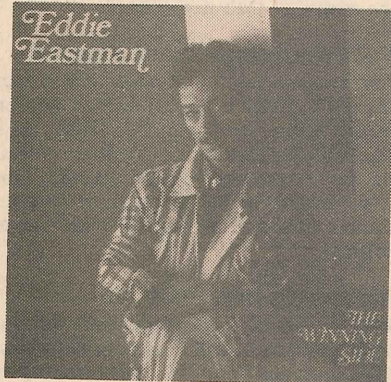
The competitive field has narrowed and many country programmers are now viewing Cancon releases as they do those from the U.S. This thinking has brought Canadian acts into a field of promotion endeavour. Said one country programmer: "It's no longer a case of mailing a single to country stations and following it up by phoning us and asking if we're playlisting it. Canadian country acts will now have to follow their releases with the type of high-powered promotion that puts them a cut above their competitors."

Minglewood completes Me & The Boys video

Me & The Boys, a semi-autobiographical song about Matt Minglewood's childhood days in Cape Breton, will be his first music video release. The video will accompany Minglewood's follow-up single to *Livin' Outside Of The Law*, which is the title track of his LP.

In commenting on the video, Savannah President Brian Ferriman explains that "The story presented, follows the lyrics of the song pretty closely. We tried to create a kind of Summer '42 feeling - showing some of the universal experiences everyone has while growing up."

The video was funded in part by VideoFACT, and is slated for release later this month. Robert Fresco of Pretty Pictures (CASBY award for M'M's *Black Stations*, *White Stations*) directed the video which was shot at various locations around Toronto.

Godard pens Prophet single

Godard is currently moving up the RPM Country 60 with his latest Book Shop single, *We Won't Ever Say Goodbye*, at No. 14 this week.

Carone readies new single

The plug side of this release was written by Fay Walker of Winnipeg. The session was produced by Don Grashey and will be released on the Golden Eagle label. This is George's follow-up to *We Can Only Pretend*, which peaked at No. 12 on the RPM Country 60 this past spring. Session people included Lloyd Green (steel), Fred Newell (guitar) a regular on *Nashville Now*, Henry Strzelecki (bass) affectionately known as "Mr. Hee Haw" from his regular stints on the popular weekly *TVer*, Jimmy D. Capps (rhythm guitar), Tony Migliore (keyboards) an oft-used producer for Cancon acts, and Jerry Kroon (drums).

CJSL tribute to Alabama

Rick Chapman, Program Director at CJSL Estevan, Saskatchewan, reports that the station had great listener response to their tribute to "Supergroup, Alabama - for their

unprecedented 17 number one hits in a row." (Alabama's current single release, *Forty Hour Week* topped the RPM Country 60 last week - Aug. 17). CJSL featured Alabama's hits from 6 am through to 6 pm (Aug. 10), and listeners were asked to jot down song titles and what time they heard any 3 of the group's songs. *Forty Hour Week* LPs were awarded to numerous entrants who qualified.

Fine Line from Carol Johns

New from Carol Johns is her 16th Avenue single, (Walkin' A) *Fine Line*. The kitchenner, Ont. native is currently playing clubs in the West, which included Swift Current, Brandon, Lethbridge, Grande Prairie, and Ft. McMurray. She will be checking out Canadian Country Music Week '85 in Edmonton before returning home.

Stone releases video with single

Shotgun's Rex Stone recently released a country video to accompany his current single *It Hasn't Happened Yet*. The video has been given a regular slot on The Nashville Network (TNN) and a follow-up video has

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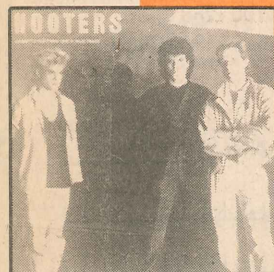
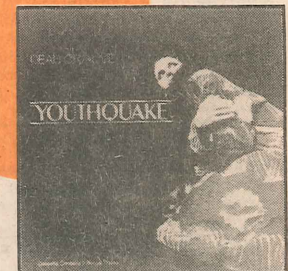
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
