THE ARROWS - ON TARGET WITH NEW ALBUM

With their latest A&M album, *The Lines Are Open*, outselling the entire life of their debut LP after only 3 weeks of release, local Toronto rockers The Arrows would appear to be homing in on a full-blown entrance into the hit arena. Group leader and main songwriter Dean McTaggart is confident The Arrows are on target.

The 6-piece band is currently in the midst of local dates to support the new album and first single. The latter is titled *Talk Talk*. Two of the dates, fund-raisers for the United Way, have them opening for Platinum Blonde.

Nominated for a Juno Award in the Most Promising Group of The Year category for their first LP, The Arrows are to have their follow-up released in 18 countries. As well, beginning in February, the band will be touring Europe in support of this album.

Along with McTaggart, the band comprises guitarist Douglas Macaskill, saxophonist Earl Seymour, keyboardist Rob Gusevs, drummer Bobby Economou and bassist Glenn Olive.

Like their first LP, the new set was produced by Dave Tyson, who himself won a Juno nomination last year for producing *Stand Back*, the Arrows first album. But Tyson also plays another vital part in The Arrows, and that's as a co-writer of much of their material, along with McTaggart.

Success didn't come easy for the band's main songwriter and lead vocalist who had previously been working as a solo artist. The goal was a long time coming.

"I tried it as a solo artist for a long time," said McTaggart. "I was playing clubs and going nowhere. Finally, I left the business out of sheer frustration, but I knew that someday I would get back into it."

McTaggart was away from performing for 7 years, filling in his time as a truck driver. He continued writing at home however, and finally came the formation of his new group with their first release on El Mocambo, an independent label in late 1981.

The Arrows followed this release with a 4-track EP containing 3 originals, plus a cover of the Animals' hit, *Misunderstood* which attracted good attention.

"It was very difficult getting a record deal," continues McTaggart. "We almost



signed a deal through the EP with an independent label, but it's a good thing we didn't because that label's now gone."

McTaggart stressed that it takes persistence today to obtain a record deal, pointing out that labels now want to be sure the artists and bands are serious.

"A&M Records is really behind us," McTaggart said. "The big difference today is that we have a video."

The video for *Talk Talk* was directed by Rob Quartly of Champagne Productions. Quartly picked up a Juno this year for Gowan's *Criminal Mind* video. He will also be directing the video of the Arrows' next single, *Heart Of The City*, to be released in the new year.

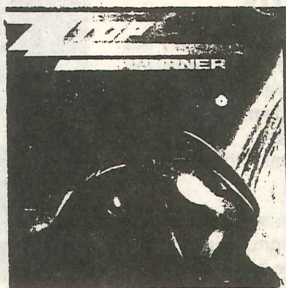

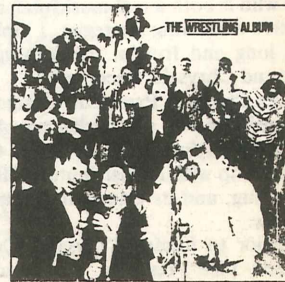

A long way to go to solve CD problems - Robertson

According to the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) President, Brian Robertson, "the CD problem won't be solved until towards the end of next year - when the parts supply in the U.S. increases and the Praxis plant is opened in Canada."

He continues with "The technology has preceded the production capabilities and that's a reality the industry will have to face. Unfortunately it's magnified by the fact that CD players are reduced in price, selling in quite high volumes, and the software is not available."

"The only real solution is a manufacturing plant solution and there's going to be 12 months where the industry's got to watch its public relations, in terms of bridging the gap."

When asked whether he thought CDs were presently overpriced, Robertson replies: "No, not at all. You've got to have some reality to what other countries are charging. Prices in Europe are substantially higher, but from what I've seen in the U.S. the prices are lower."

He concludes "In one respect it's a positive problem because you've got a new format that really has established itself very quickly and you've got demand exceeding production. So, it's a matter of catching up and obviously it's going to be a healthy, new addition to the record industry. It's a problem the industry is going to have to cope with for the next 12 months and hope its image doesn't suffer."

Craig continues to head Chrysalis North America

Jack Craig has renewed his contract as President and Chief Operating Officer of the Chrysalis Group of Companies in North America. He has served in this capacity for the past 2½ years.

In announcing Craig's renewal, Chris Wright, Chairman of the Chrysalis Group, P.L.C. remarked: "In his two-and-half years at the helm of Chrysalis Records in the States, Jack Craig has overseen the evolution of Chrysalis into the strong and profitable independent label that it is today." He continued with, "He (Craig) has charted the company through its most successful, and artistically-viable period ever, with several of our artists realizing multi-million copy sales and worldwide acclaim." He concludes with "Jack is a unique and consummate label chief - one who is both a real music man and an aggressive marketing strategist. I look forward to a long and fruitful relationship between Jack and Chrysalis Records."

As Chrysalis President, Craig has total responsibility for all marketing, A&R, and publishing activities, and oversees Chrysalis' relationship with its distributor, CBS Branch Marketing, and its Canadian licensee, MCA Records.

Prior to joining Chrysalis, Craig was Division Vice President, USA and Canada for RCA Records, and previous to that served as Managing Director, RCA Records Division, RCA Limited (UK)

CD's are over priced at retail - Ierullo

Vito Ierullo, President of Records On Wheels, feels there are only 2 problems facing the industry today, with respect to Compact Discs: The supply of the product and the price of the product.

"They're already overpriced," states Ierullo. "Those who want better sound quality are actually paying for better sound quality, but I don't think those people will be willing to pay more than 16, 17 or 18 bucks - that's high enough...it's actually too much."

"It's not really a question of raising the prices to create less demand. If you raise the price, I think a lot of people will turn around and go across the border. I just don't think the market will bear \$25."

"What they're trying to do is convert a lot of people into buying CD players and if the marketplace, all of a sudden, shows a situation where CD's cost a fortune then they're not going to convert a lot of people. People will just keep buying LP's or cassettes. To be a mass sale item - well, you're not going to get that situation if they're over \$25."

Ierullo answers the question of supply, with a question: "What's the worse problem...getting a 50 percent fill from Warner Brothers or a 20 percent fill from CBS? I mean I'd rather have a 50 percent fill from Warner Brothers but it's certainly not what I'd call 'good enough'. We're doing over 100,000 CD's a month - now that's not a lot - it's only about 5 percent of our business."

However he also notes that "it makes a

lot of sense to open up a CD shop today. Right now it could be possible for a guy to open a CD store, carrying strictly CD's, and making it successful. Because I have a couple of stores right now that are selling more CD's money-wise not unit-wise, than either albums or cassettes."

Cancon artists lend talent to aid food banks

In an effort to raise the public consciousness and awareness of the plight of Canada's hungry that number in the thousands, Loverboy's keyboardist Doug Johnson organized a recording session by 14 other Cancon artists out of which has come the release of a single, Action Speaks Louder Than Words. Johnson was concerned about the deteriorating situation of Canada's food banks and their inability to cope with the growing lineups of people who were down on their luck, many of whom have young families to care for.

Action Speaks Louder Than Words, written and produced by Johnson at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound, is intended to not only give a financial assist to the food banks, but to bring this terrible situation that exists on our doorsteps to the attention of elected officials at all levels of government.

The 14 artists who took part in the session are: Paul Dean, Matt Frenette, Derry Grehan, Doug Johnson, Marc LaFrance, Murray McLauchlan, Carole Pope, Mike Reno, Ted Campbell, Johnny Dee, Lovena Fox, Paul Hyde, Darby Mills and Nancy Nash.

All proceeds from the record are being donated to the food banks of Canada. For those interested in further information about food banks in their area call: 1-800-663-5981.

The single is now available on the WEA label.

Bob Roper, A&R Manager for WEA Music of Canada, notes, "We're going to throw whatever weight we can behind this record, and if we raise \$1,000 - then that's \$1,000 more for the food banks than we had yesterday." He concludes with "WEA felt it was a tremendous cause and if we can do anything to bring attention to this problem and anything to alleviate it then we will."

Charges laid in record store thefts

An investigation by Toronto Police has resulted in the laying of theft and possession of stolen property charges against 3 employees of A&A's downtown Yonge Street store. It was estimated that more than \$100,000 worth of stock was stolen over a period of a few years.

According to reports, most of the stolen property which included album, cassette and CD product was found at the home of one of the accused, a man who had worked at the store for the past 8 years.

Only for the rich, you say . . . ??

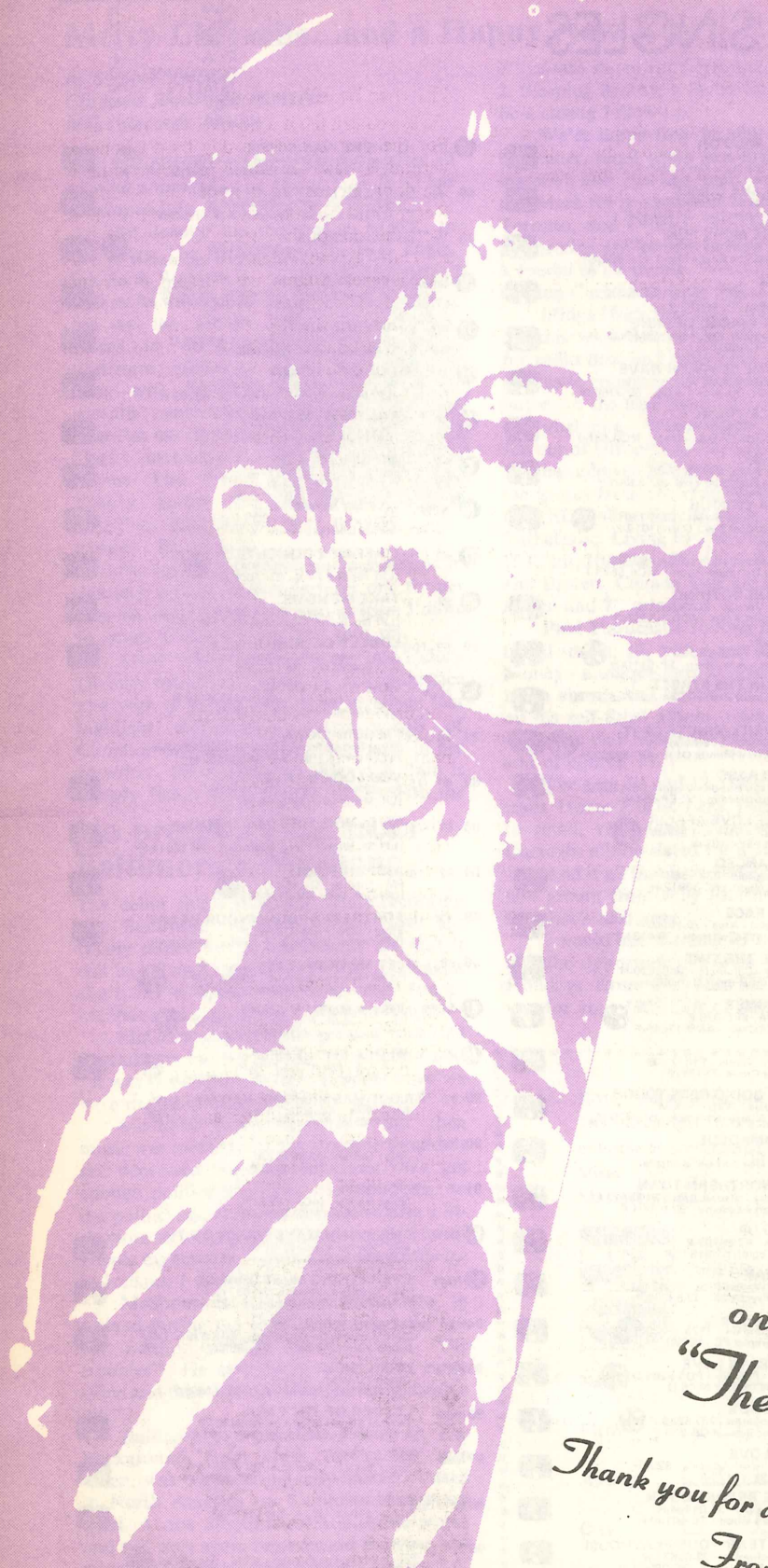

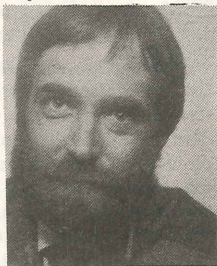

No protest songs from Baltimore's McShane

The debut single from EMI-Italy recording act, Baltimore, entitled Tarzan Boy, has finally settled in and indications are that it will be a Top 5 item on the RPM 100 singles chart. RPM spoke with lead singer Jimmy McShane this past week from New York.

McShane expressed surprise at how well Tarzan Boy has been doing considering that "it was done, more or less, for fun. Now we have the album and the video released."

McShane continues with "But then music was meant to be fun - people shouldn't get depressed listening to music. We get enough politics every day - leave all that to the politicians. Our next project will be a little more serious though, and although a lot of people expect me to write about the problems in Ireland, I won't."

McShane is obviously Irish, was in Ireland during the bloodiest rioting and left for London at age 14 to escape "the troubles". He says he does go back quite often and that "things have quietened down a bit."

Baltimore's debut LP, Living In The Background, from which Tarzan Boy was taken, was produced in Italy and is released in North America on Capitol's Manhattan label. A new album is already in the works and will once again be produced in Milan and mixed in Germany. McShane has written 2 of the tracks for the new set.

Although no tour dates have been firm-ed, McShane says "I hope to visit Canada soon - I've never been before."

7" release slated for CHR and retail on Jan. 2. Sleeping Beauty, a favourite at MCA, will be a strong follow-up.

We're supporting the album release with consumer, retail co-op and radio ads, p.o.p. material, and, just last week, we flew in Chris and Mark for promotional visits to Montreal, Toronto, and Ottawa. On Dec. 8 they'll be performing at The Ritz in New York City for a special MTV taping. Word has it they'll be touring Canada in early '86.

Midge Ure's first solo album was rushed out this week despite the heavy competition for radio time and retail rack space. The enthusiastic response by programmers and key buyers to the lead track, If I Was, has been overwhelming. While there is a familiar flavour of Ultravox in The Gift, the solo venture has allowed Midge to stretch and he runs the gamut from the experimental instrumentals (EDO, The Chieftain) to a cover of the Tull classic, Living In The Past, to the No. 1 U.K. hit, If I Was. The video p.o.p. materials and Eastern Canada tour are supporting the album and 7" releases.

Paul Hardcastle follows up the international smash, 19, with a new single, Just For Money - a unique look at greed with a hook-laden chorus and dance mix. Also included on his self-titled album, released last week, are recent club hits, Rain Forest and King Tut and of course, 19.

The new 7" and 12" from Art Of Noise (sans Trevor Horn), Legs, shipped this week to retail, radio and clubs with their first Chrysalis album slated for a January release.

And if all that isn't enough - there'll be a new album from Billy Idol in late January. But that's next year.

McTaggart believes the Arrows sound has been solidified on the new album with the addition of Economou and Olive. For the first LP, the band utilized session players for bass and drums. With Olive and Economou on board, McTaggart says the overall band performance is better and tighter.

"Somebody tagged our sound as pop/soul," he said. "I think that's as close as you'll get to describing it. So far, the reaction has been great. The reviews of our album have been terrific."

McTaggart doesn't believe the particular brand of rock the band is offering has any less demand today, but he pointed out that some bands have hurt themselves "by lowering their profile with fewer recordings."

The basic tracks for the new LP were done at Sounds Interchange in Toronto with the overdubbing carried out at Grant Avenue Studios in Hamilton. The next time around, McTaggart hopes to do most of the pre-production in his own house where he has a small 8-track studio and board.

"You can't go into a 24-track studio and blow money today," stressed McTaggart. "Tyson and I wrote a lot of songs and I wrote some myself for the album. We kick them around, arrange them and that's the way they end up."

"The goal is to make them feel better. It doesn't matter who likes it - if we don't like it - what does it mean?"

One of the band's last shows of the year will be at The Diamond in Toronto (Dec. 11), to be taped by MuchMusic for The Big Ticket. The band will be winding down the year with a New Year's appearance in London, Ont. More Canadian dates are expected for January.

Columbia & Def Jam sign distribution agreement

Columbia Records and Def Jam Recordings have jointly announced a distribution pact for the U.S. and through CBS Records worldwide. Initial releases will be from L.L. Cool J and Beastie Boys.

Def Jam is headed by Russell Simmons (Rush Artist Management) and producer Rick Rubins. Simmons co-wrote and co-produced Run-DMC's rap hits, and has worked with Kurtis Blow and others.

Beastie Boys' first single, She's On It, will be accompanied by a video filmed in Malta and co-directed by Rubin. The single is also featured on the Krush Groove soundtrack. Also appearing on the LP is L.L. Cool J's I Can't Live Without My Radio.

The Krush Groove movie is based on the story of Def Jam and stars Rubin as himself, with Simmons co-producing.

According to Al Teller, CBS President, "we're looking forward to an exciting collaboration. Russell Simmons, Rick Rubin and their artists are at the cutting edge of contemporary music."

McCartney's Capitol LP scheduled for early spring

Paul McCartney has re-signed to Capitol, a label he left 6 years ago to join CBS. The ex-Beatle is already on release with his first single under the new agreement. The single, Spies Like Us, is the title track from an upcoming movie soundtrack. The soundtrack, which McCartney scored, will be released by WEA.

According to Sarah Norris, Label Manager for Capitol, "We expect McCartney's album around February or March. We were really surprised by the agreement. It was kind of an overnight thing - signed one day - and a single the next."

Shaw production for Toronto's Del Bianco

Del Bianco, Toronto guitarist/singer makes his debut with a Mel Shaw production of Love Fever (We've Got To Get It Back Together). The single is released on Shaw's MWC label.

Session people included Prakash John on bass, saxman Demo Cates, keyboardist Bob Federa, and Claude on percussion.

The Bianco single is described as "R&B with a Latin punch." Says producer Shaw, "There isn't one Canadian act recording that sound today." Love Fever, a Bianco original, qualifies as 4-parts Cancon.

Both Shaw and Bianco have mounted a promotion campaign to bring the new single to the attention of CHR and A/C programmers.

Kretchmar to head up Chrysalis Music

Bruno Kretchmar, who joined Chrysalis earlier this year, has been appointed President of Chrysalis Music worldwide. The appointment follows various reorganizational changes within the Chrysalis group of companies.

In announcing the appointment, Chris Wright, Chairman of Chrysalis Group P.L.C., noted: "The changes which we have undertaken at Chrysalis Music in the past few months are fast reaping the benefits. Our standing in the most recent Gallup figures for the third quarter of the year proves that Chrysalis Music is featuring significantly in all categories as one of the most active publishing companies at the moment." He concludes with "The appointment of Bruno Kretchmar emphasises our intention to develop further, Chrysalis Music as a major force in the publishing world."

Mr. Kretchmar is based at the London Chrysalis office.

CRIA members agree to sticker "explicit lyrics"

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) made moves (Dec. 3) to short-circuit any media meddling over "explicit lyrics" on recorded product. The question of "explicit lyrics" had become a hot issue in the U.S. through fundamentalist religious groups and a gaggle of senator's wives. The RIAA quickly gave in to this group and instructed their members to "sticker" forthwith any recorded product that could be described as having "explicit lyrics".

CRIA President Brian Robertson claims that "The issue of 'warning labels' on sound recordings is not a new one in Canada. Canadian companies have used this form of communication many times in the past on albums that in their view may have contained offensive language or lyrics." He went on to explain that "Our research has shown that the number of records that may fall into this category is very small indeed - less than 1 percent of the total recordings released. We are still however sensitive and concerned with the issue, particularly where young children are concerned."

The new CRIA guidelines, which have been accepted by all CRIA members recommends that "future recordings, where contractually permissible and that in the opinion of the record company contain explicit language or lyrics, will carry the inscription 'Explicit Lyrics - Parental Advisory'."

As well, and at its discretion, a record company may optionally print lyrics on the back cover of the album - or display a lyric sheet under the plastic wrap.

Robertson further explains, "We believe that this industry policy recommendation will responsibly address this sensitive issue." He concludes with "It has also been a priority in these discussions to ensure that the rights and freedoms of creators and recording artists are not infringed or diluted and that they are protected against censorship."

Alfonso appointed PR for Head Office Mgt.

Ralph Alfonso exits Attic Records to join Head Office Management. The appointment is effective December 12, '85. Alfonso will be responsible for organizing a promotion and publicity structure within the company.

Head Office looks after management for Honeymoon Suite and Brighton Rock who release on the Flying Fist label.

The announcement was made by Head Office's Stephen Prendergast who noted "With Ralph on board, I know we've got the right mix of people together that are going to provide a professional support system for both our current and future signings."

Alfonso has been with Attic for 6 years where he was Director of Press and Promotion and where he worked with such artists as Lee Aaron, Katrina And The Waves, George Thorogood, Triumph and others.

Other members of Head Office are Monica Shaver (Office Manager), Jeff Rogers (Creative), Pat Arnott (Live Production) and Mike Balogh (Merchandising).

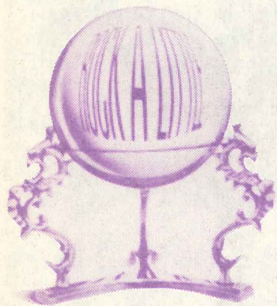
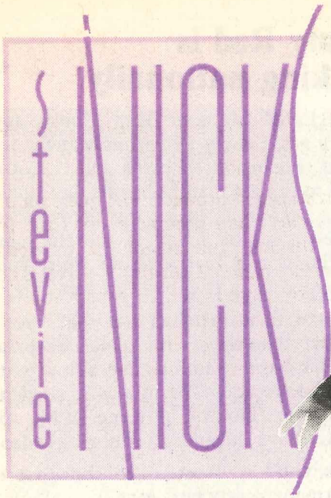

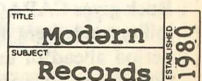

PolyGram breaks ground in commercial video field

PolyGram Canada enters the commercial video field with the release of *Scenes From The Big Chair - The Video Album from Tears For Fears*. The suggested retail price is \$24.95 and marks the first attempt by PolyGram to market a full-length feature video.

For this release, PolyGram developed a unique, shrink wrapped 12" X 12" carton for both Beta and VHS formats. Designed for front-rack exposure at regular full-line record retailers, the packaging graphically extends the visuals of the complete *Tears For Fears Songs From the Big Chair* collection.

Of particular interest to the band's Canadian fans is the fact that much of the video content was shot in Canada - filmed on the highways to Kitchener, Ottawa, Montreal, and Quebec City. As well, all of the exclusive and previously unreleased live footage (including versions of *Shout*, *Broken*, *Memories Fade*, *The Hurting*, *The Working Hour*, and *Everybody Wants To Rule The World*) was taken from *Tears For Fears* May 30/31, 1985 4-night sold out performances at Toronto's Massey Hall.

The package also contains interviews with bandmembers Roland Orzabal and Curt Smith, as well as a behind-the-scenes look at the filming of the band's *Head Over Heels* promo clip at Toronto's Emmanuel College.

The release is being supported by the current *I Believe* video in addition to a special radio-only 12" sampler featuring live versions of *Memories Fade*, *Everybody Wants To Rule The World* and *Head Over Heels*. Further p.o.p. merchandising will be made available.

Tears For Fears are currently in the studio recording material for an upcoming single expected for release in January.

Michael Rock appointed Gen. Mgr. CAPAC

A decision by CAPAC's board of directors has resulted in the appointment of Michael Rock as General Manager of the organization. The appointment becomes effective Jan. 1/86.

In announcing Mr. Rock's appointment, Marc Fortier, President of CAPAC, pointed out that "John V. Mills will continue to serve CAPAC as senior legal counsel with the responsibility of representing CAPAC before the Copyright Appeal Board, together with all matters relating to the revision of the Canadian copyright act, recommended in a recent government report - *A Charter of Rights For Creators*."

Mr. Rock, a chartered accountant joined CAPAC in 1969 and has been assistant manager for 12 years. He becomes the fourth General Manager of CAPAC in its sixty year history.

Commenting on the new appointment, Mr. Fortier stated: "The appointment of Mr. Rock gives CAPAC both continuity and flexibility and frees Mr. Mills for the critical period ahead of us as new copyright legislation moves forward."

No plans to double certification levels

Reacting to statements made recently by Bruce Allen (Bryan Adams Manager), who alleges that CRIA certification levels are to low an should be doubled, CRIA President Brian Robertson suggests "You've got to measure the promotional value of gold and platinum records against the credibility of sales levels."

He continues with, "It was felt that it was important that certification levels be reachable and that's why they've been at the level they are at now."

"Certainly, up until now, the CRIA members have felt that existing levels are adequate, given the amount of records being certified. I mean you don't see a proliferation of platinum albums - particularly with Canadian artists."

Robertson concludes, "Unless there is a major change of view, I don't believe they'll be changed in the near future."

Waxman appointed Attic promo & publicity

Steve Waxman has been appointed to the position of Manager of Promotion and Publicity for Attic Records.

A graduate of New York University, Waxman joined Chrysalis Records as Artist Liaison at the label's head office in New York. He then moved on to Aucoin Management as Production Coordinator, working with their roster of artists that included Billy Idol and Tom Waite.

Returning to Canada in 1984, Waxman took on the job of Director of Promotion and Publicity at the now inactive Ready Records. He then became a promo rep for Honeymoon Suite.

In announcing Waxman's appointment, Attic President Alexander Mair noted: "Steve's broad experience on both sides of the border will be a real plus and we expect his involvement will help increase the success levels of our roster."

Lack of CD stock a problem for WEA

Garry Newman, Vice President Sales for WEA Music Canada, reports that "Sales of CD product is tremendous, but it's really difficult when you backorder 4,000 units and you get one."

He continues with "We shipped 1/4 of what we ordered of the new ZZ Top and our top seller is Phil Collins. He's our largest backorder item. The orders we have in are just unbelievable."

There's no quick solution to the situation. Says Newman, "My whole problem would be solved if I could get stock - and that's not even in the foreseeable future."

The new Praxis plant, expected to open in March of next year, apparently won't alleviate much of the supply problems, and although as Newman states, "We've already signed an agreement with them," he remains skeptical, "until I have something in my hand."

Simply Red is breaking nationally

WEA's Label Manager Kim Cooke says "Elektra act, Simply Red from Manchester, England, are ready to break out." Cooke went on to explain that the band's first single, *Money's Too Tight*, which was pre-released, "received a lot of action in the clubs but CHR didn't take to it and we were really disappointed from that point of view."

Cooke further points out that "As a debut record however, it's a nice surprise. This album has a continuity and a flow to it - a real solid record." The follow-up single to *Money's Too Tight* will be *Come To My Aid* which will have the added boost of a video.

The band is expected to showcase in North America early next year.

Toronto included on Bush promo itinerary

EMI America recording artist Kate Bush (see RPM cover Dec.7/85) included Toronto on her North American promotion visit. Bush was available on November 12, which was a unique opportunity for the media to interview the young artist who is breaking in North America through Canada. Bush isn't keen on flying, preferring to use rail, road or water when playing dates. However, it was impossible to schedule a QE2 trip from England to New York, so she was talked into experimenting with the Concorde. "It was a beautiful trip - almost like not flying" she said. New York was her only other stop on this trip.

During the Toronto reception, Dave Evans, President Capitol Records-EMI Canada presented Bush with platinum for her *Hounds of Love* LP, plus a special award commemorating the sale of half a million records overall in Canada. Both *Hounds Of Love* and her current single, *Running Up That Hill* are now closing on the Top 5 of the RPM 100 albums and singles charts.

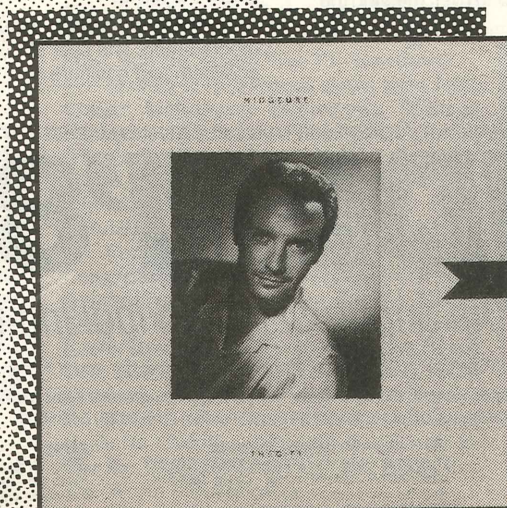

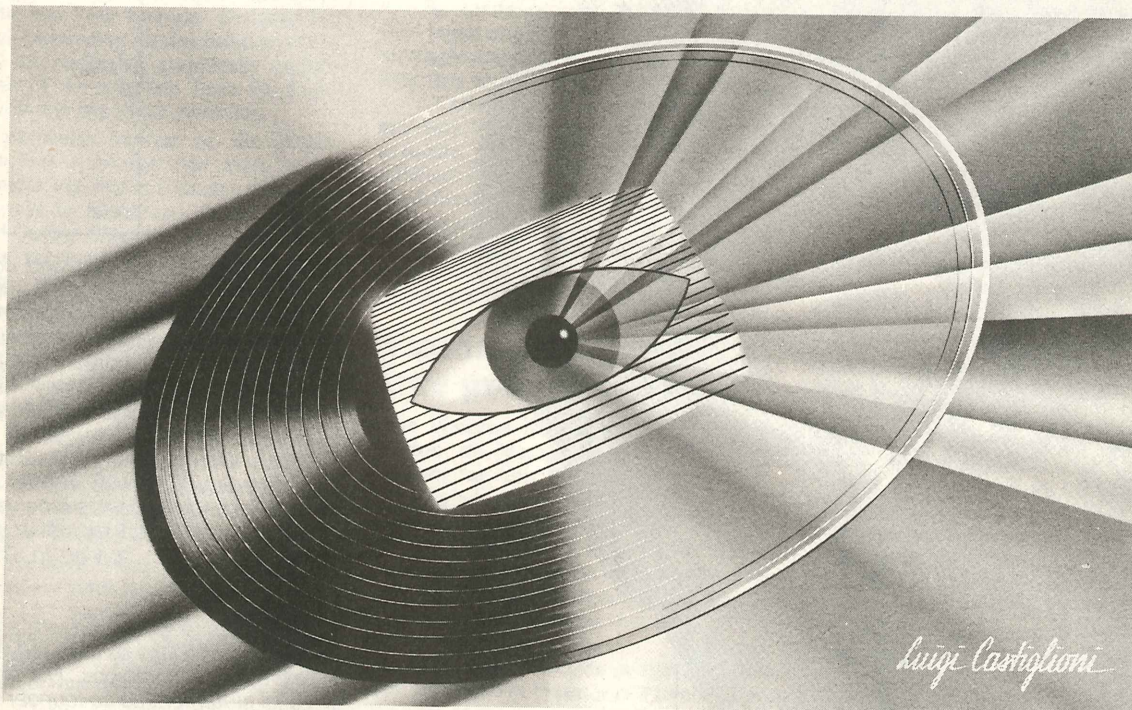

CBC airs Springsteen interview Dec. 21 & 22

Bruce Springsteen's only taped interview, which followed his Born In The USA tour, will be heard on CBC's The Entertainers.

Having completed his 15 month world-wide tour, Springsteen spoke with U.K. journalist Roger Scott after his Hartford, Connecticut show.

The Entertainers' host Stan Carew presents the 90 minute package Saturday December 21, at 10:05 am on CBC Stereo, as well as Sunday December 22, 1:33 pm on CBC radio.

Afterburner tops 400,000 as ZZ Top plays Toronto

ZZ Top, the Texas bluesmen played to capacity houses (32,000) at Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens (December 2nd & 3rd). Exploding on stage, the band was backed by a huge prop of Billy Gibbons' dashboard from his flaming-red 1934 Model-T. This was the first concert the trio had given in two years, and they were obviously a little self-conscious during the opening numbers - one of which was their latest single Sleeping Bag, which is currently number 18 on the RPM 100 singles chart. However, if they were rusty, they were the only ones who would have noticed. An exciting light show, lasers and explosives and an excellent sound, brought this band back into prominence. ZZ Top aren't chicken rockers anymore - they are in their late 30's and their audiences ranged from 12 to over 50's, which is a message in itself about the group.

Since the release of their latest album, Afterburner, their first in 2 years since Eliminator, the WEA crew have been pushing for big sales figures and on the eve of their Toronto date, the album certified 4-times platinum. Backstage, after the show, WEA President Stan Kulin presented the band with triple platinum for Afterburner, a figure attained only 3 weeks after its release, plus 7-time platinum for Eliminator. The latter has since gone 8-times platinum.

It's interesting to note that after only 1 week of release, Afterburner sold over a million copies worldwide.

Michael Rock named General Mgr. - CAPAC

Michael Rock has been appointed General Manager of CAPAC. The decision was made by CAPAC's Board of Directors.

In announcing the appointment, Marc Fortier, President of CAPAC, emphasized that "John V. Mills will continue to serve CAPAC as senior legal counsel with the responsibility of representing CAPAC before the Copyright Appeal Board, together with all matters relating to the revision of the Canadian copyright act, recommended in a recent government report, A Charter Of Rights For Creators."

Mr. Rock, a chartered accountant, joined CAPAC in 1969 and has been Assistant Manager for 12 years. He will become the fourth General Manager of CAPAC in the organization's 60 year history.

Brits use laser technology in developing speakers

Celestion International Ditton Works in Ipswich, Suffolk England, have designed speakers with the aid of laser technology.

Designed for use with amplifiers of up to 75,100 and 150 watt output, respectively, each of the 3 DL Series speakers provides a sensitivity of 289dB/1 W/60 Hz-20 kHz. The largest model, the DL8, features a metal-domed diaphragm, which is said "to ensure that higher frequencies in particular are reproduced clearly, resulting in a distinctive sound quality."

A laser-scanning process was used "to achieve precise assessment of diaphragm behaviour." Measurements of some 32,000 different points on the component were fed into a computer which produced a 3-dimensional model which allowed vibration patterns to be visualised. The manufacturer claims "the result was simplification of the diaphragm design to give very close fidelity of music reproduction."

Canadian distribution for the speakers is through Rocelco of Concord, Ont.

Celestion has also designed guitar loudspeakers, described as having "outstanding sound reproduction and to remain reliable despite rough handling on tour."

Dire Straits tops metal list for month of November

Dire Straits headed up the CRIA certifications for November scoring 7 times (700,000 units sold) platinum for their Brothers In Arms album.

Corey Hart was the big Cancon winner in the 6 times platinum status for his Boy In The Box album. He was joined by WHAM for Make It Big, and by Tears For Fears for Songs From The Big Chair.

Triple platinum awards went to Platinum Blonde (Alien Shores), Kenny Rogers and Dolly Parton (Once Upon A Christmas), and the Miami Vice TV Soundtrack.

Gaining double platinum were John Cougar Mellencamp (Scarecrow), Dire Straits (Love Over Gold), U2 (The Unforgettable Fire), and the Miami Vice TV Soundtrack.

Making it to platinum status were John Cougar Mellencamp (Scarecrow), Whitney Houston, Alabama, Thompson Twins (Here's To Future Days), Katrina And The Waves, Dead Or Alive (Youthquake), Loverboy (Lovin' Every Minute Of It), Peter Gabriel, and Miami Vice TV Soundtrack.

Certifying for gold albums were John Cougar Mellencamp (Scarecrow), Daryl Hall & John Oates (Live At The Apollo), Kenny Rogers (The Heart Of The Matter), Loverboy (Lovin' Every Minute Of It), Headpins (Head Over Heels), Amy Grant (Unguarded), KISS (Asylum), and Miami Vice TV Soundtrack.

Kool & The Gang gained a platinum single for Cherish, while gold singles went to The Bat Boys (OK Blue Jays) and Ready For The World (Oh Sheila).

U2 were certified for a gold EP for The Unforgettable Fire.

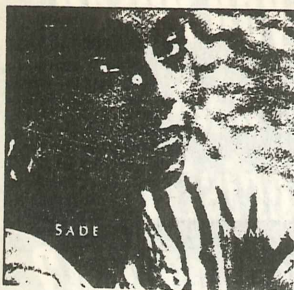

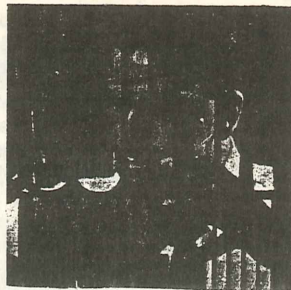

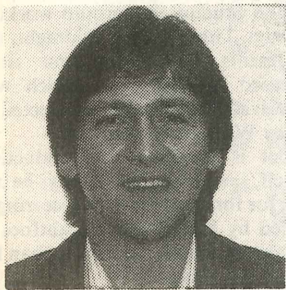

Lightfoot album expected first quarter of '86

Barry Harvey of Early Morning Productions confirms that Gordon Lightfoot has been in Eastern Sound Studios in Toronto working on a new album. Titled East Of Midnight, the album represents Lightfoot's first since Salute, released in 1983, and which was modestly received. The new LP is expected to be shipped by WEA early next year.

Lightfoot is handling the production chores himself, something Harvey says he has been hoping for for some time. Engineering is being handled by Ken Friesen. Lightfoot is also utilizing studio musicians rather than his own band for this session.

"I can't think of anyone better suited to produce Gordon Lightfoot than Lightfoot himself," said Harvey. "It's the first LP that he's had total production control over in some time."

Harvey describes the sound on the new album as "more refined and pop-oriented, yet still maintaining the Lightfoot style."

Contrary to what many may believe, Lightfoot has been playing abroad other than his traditional appearances at Massey Hall. Harvey reports Lightfoot had 90 percent sell-out concerts in the U.S. He also stressed that Lightfoot spends 95 percent of his time performing outside of Canada.

"There seems to be a swing back to intelligent music again," said Harvey. "They're listening to lyrics again - and radio is getting softer."

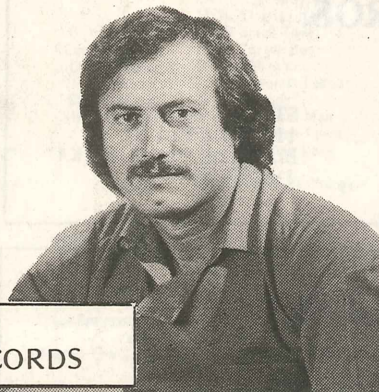
