THOR - MULTI-MEDIA ENTERTAINER

Attic recording artist Thor (John Mikl) is working hard on every aspect of the entertainment business, trying to maintain his cult following. After two years of being caught in the middle of a major label dispute Thor plans to make a strong comeback. Along with his latest album *Beware The Fury Of The Ice Viking*, he is now starring in a Roger Corman motion picture. There is no doubt that this outrageous individual will do whatever is necessary to re-establish himself in mainstream North America.

Keep The Dogs Away was released on the RCA label in 1978, and was 2 years in the making. Although it was Thor's debut release RCA was confident that it would have been a big seller, as a result they worked out a huge marketing and promotional campaign to push the LP. A video (one of the first rock videos) and a tour were also set up in order to boost album sales. None of these gimmicks seemed to have the impact on album sales and the LP received mixed media and radio reaction. RPM spoke to Thor questioning why an album with the backing of a major label, and unparalleled promotion, sold in such low numbers? "I was before my time. Now my thing is contemporary" replies Thor.

With little chart success Thor, concentrated mainly on touring and keeping his cult following satisfied. Since the release of *Keep The Dogs Away* he had only one LP, *Unchained*, released in the U.S. The album topped some of the U.K. Heavy Metal charts, and the single, *Thunder In The Tundra*, also charted well in the U.K.

Having such a bizarre stage show, it seemed Thor was receiving mixed reviews and it appeared that most writers took him as some sort of a joke. When asked if he believes the media coverage was fair, Thor explained "I've had some phenomenal reviews, but there's always one or two writers who wants to see what ticks you off. Even if all your reviews say that it was a sensational show, there's going to be one that says it was no good. Who knows, the guy could have had a fight with his wife that night."

After being caught in the middle of a law suit that went on for over 2 years Thor described the situation as "it was something out of my control, that really put a kink in my career, but I never gave up. I'm too competitive. It's harder to come back the second time - most people wouldn't even have tried." As a result of his determination Thor



satisfied himself touring, making 10 trips from London to New York in the past year. Realizing he doesn't break any house records he believes "In the U.S. right now I could fill a 2000 to 5000 seater, it's not 25,000 but it's a good crowd". He continues with "I just want to give the people their money's worth. If they do go to my concert I make sure to have



2.5 million compact discs in marketplace for 1985

The demand for compact discs continues to outpace production. Looking at the initial launch of compact discs, the first year to indicate any form of growth was 1983 which registered 90,000 units available in Canada. This figure jumped dramatically to 260,000 units in 1984, and it's expected there will be 2.5 million units in the Canadian marketplace by the end of this year.

PolyGram's Bob Ansell, who has just returned from a 2½ week trip across Canada, describes the compact disc market as "exploding". A major seller for PolyGram is Dire Straits with more than 11,500 CD units of their release being gobbled up by consumers. PolyGram is also a major player in the sales of CD classics (Deutsche Grammophon). Ansell guesstimates that PolyGram has almost 70 percent of the CD software market - with 1300 titles available.

PolyGram is somewhat in the driver's seat when it comes to the manufacturing end of CD units through their plant in Hanover, Germany, now operating at capacity with 3 full shifts per day. The plant is expected to reach a capacity of 45 million CD units for 1986.

New plants however, are opening - an EMI plant in England, plus another U.K. plant on the drawing boards, a plant in France and one in Canada. There are presently a dozen CD plants in operation around the world, which includes the CBS/Sony Terra

MCA & Pepsi challenge Triumph for United Way

MCA's release for Triumph's new Stages album has been scheduled for Oct. 1st., with a unique, to say the least twist. Triumph's bassist Mike Levine is confident he can personally service the album to 8 AOR stations from coast to coast - on the same day. He will start off his marathon servicing at Q104 in Halifax, followed by Montreal's CHOM-FM, Toronto's Q107, CITI-FM in Winnipeg, CHED's Edmonton, Calgary's CKIK and CJAY-FM, and hopefully wind it all up at CFOX Vancouver.

The Pepsi Cola people, who sponsored Triumph's successful 16 city Canadian tour earlier this year, say Levine can't do it. MCA also has its doubts - and the 2 giants are willing to challenge Levine by pledging an undisclosed amount of money that he can't possibly accomplish this trans-Canada feat. It's been hinted that both MCA and Pepsi will donate a dollar a mile each for the challenge.

This amount could work out to several thousands of dollars, considering the promotional albums being donated by MCA and Pepsi giveaways as incentives to listeners.

The Stages Marathon will have the added interest through a phone link-up whereby Levine can call the next radio station he is to visit, supplying a progress report.

This promotion is a rare tie-in by the recording industry for a charitable event, and it's hoped the Mayors in the respective cities will support the fund-raiser, which would encourage participation from the community. The Prime Minister's office has already indicated support for the cause.

Haute, Indiana plant which services only the U.S. CBS Canada is serviced by the CBS/Sony plant in Japan.

The CD software manufacturing process could change drastically however, with the discovery of a new process in Holland, which has been tagged "The Gutenberg Process". This process is like a printing press - a process similar to a printing sequence as opposed to the injection procedure that they are doing now. The release is 2 to 3 seconds per disc as opposed to the 10 or 12 seconds per disc common with the current CD operation.

The availability of hardware is still a problem, although Sony, a major supplier expects to have 80,000 pieces of hardware in the Canadian marketplace by the end of December. They are expecting to sell 15,000 pieces of their mobile CD unit by the end of the year.

Yoshi Wada, Merchandising Manager, Sony Music Canada, says that "Deliveries are still very tight. No matter what comes in - goes out almost immediately." Wada also pointed out that there has been an increase in demand for Sony's new model, much of this demand, of course, is due to the lower price for this model.

Sony will be mounting a national campaign - a joint promotion with PolyGram, with all their stores. They will be offering PolyGram CD product with the sale of Sony CD units.

It's also interesting to note that major players in the record retail field are now beginning to stock CD units. Coming on board shortly will be 23 Eaton stores - the first time they have stocked CDs.

Larry Smith, Manager Home Audio for Yamaha Canada, reports "excellent" consumer acceptance to their 2 CD units (CD 3 and CDX2) with the latter selling briskly because of the price structure. Says Smith "I think, from a manufacturers point of view, that we've almost developed commodity pricing.

Labatt's Live adds Mitchell to itinerary

Following his recent Juno nomination, Labatt's brewery have announced the signing of Kim Mitchell (formerly lead vocalist of Max Webster) to their current concert series. Mitchell's tour wraps up in Oshawa, Ontario on October the 5th, marking the most successful year for Mitchell to date.

Prior to touring with Bryan Adams, Mitchell toured for two months with Autograph and Steppenwolf. He also played to his largest crowd at his headlining date at the Kingswood Music Theatre in Toronto (14,500), not comparable to the exposure he received on his tour with Adams, where he played to an average of 25,000 for the greater part of 1985.

The Sarnia, Ontario native has slated the release of his second solo LP for next February, simultaneously in Canada and the U.S.. His debut solo album *akimbo alogo*, released on Alert records in July 1984, has reached platinum status and continues to sell well, especially in the U.S. with the release of his *Go For Soda* single which was used as a promo for the anti-drinking and driving crusade.

ing on the hardware now, and yet the software people are somewhat slow to react."

Smith has found that "CD hardware has not been that well accepted in some of the rural cities in Canada - only because of the support function of the software end of it." He concludes with "In the major cities however, like Montreal, Toronto, Edmonton and Vancouver, CD hardware has been well received because of the support of both industries."

The latest figures from CRIA indicates the phenomenal growth of CD units, showing June of 1984 with sales of 84,402 units with a value of \$1,145,862 and the year to date figure (June 1985) with 367,046 units - a value of \$5,061,888.

New Liona Boyd works scheduled for release

CBS Records has set an October release date for *The Romantic Guitar* of Liona Boyd, a co-production with Silver Eagle Records. Completed in the spring of this year, the album features re-works of *Gone With The Wind*, *Love Story*, *Chariots Of Fire*, and includes Boyd's first single, *If Only Love*, which will also be accompanied by the classical guitarist's first music video.

CBS is scheduling an early 1986 release of a new Boyd crossover album, tentatively entitled *Persona*. This album is somewhat of a departure for Boyd, in that it involves production work by Michael Kamen, known for his work with Pink Floyd, David Gilmour, Roger Waters, Eurythmics, and David Bowie. It has been hinted that this production will also include guest appearances by Eric Clapton, Annie Lennox, and George Zamfir.

Prior to work on *Persona*, Boyd gave a Royal Command Performance in Edinburgh for England's Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip, in aid of the 1986 Commonwealth Games Appeal Fund. Much of this show will be televised in Canada and other Commonwealth countries in the near future.

Battle looming in U.S. over "explicit lyrics"

The Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) has lost the first round in its battle with the Washington-based Parents Music Resource Centre (PMRC). The latter's thrust comes from Tipper Gore, wife of Senator Albert Gore, who is taking issue with the RIAA over "explicit lyrics" on recorded product.

The PMRC has made many demands of the recording industry, one being the providing of individual ratings of each music track on an album. Brian Robertson, President of CRIA, points up that "There were 25,000 music tracks released in the U.S. last year, so you can imagine how impossible that would be for the industry." The parent group also wanted lyrics printed on the outside of the jacket, "another impossibility," says Robertson, "when it comes to cassette packaging."

The RIAA did however, allow that where they identified lyrics as being 'questionable', they would affix a label on the jacket which would read 'Parental Guidance - Explicit Lyrics'. This was rejected by the parent group and the question is now in limbo.

There has been mounting opposition to the "explicit lyric" question by recording artists, managers and producers, who are calling for a "hands off" policy by both the parent group and the RIAA.

Reaction to the lyric question in Canada

has been restricted to media coverage only. "We reviewed the 'explicit lyric' question with our board," says Robertson, "and while we were sensitive to the topic, which obviously one doesn't lightly dismiss, we were waiting to see what agreement was reached in the U.S."

There is a self-policing element at work within the Canadian recording industry, which has been in place for years. Robertson points out that "This whole thing of identify-

CBS Direct & PolyTel join forces on LP project

CBS Direct and PolyTel have, for the first time, joined forces on a major album project in what may also be the first time that 2 TV advertising record companies have linked up in Canada for a single project. The project, *Here Come The Hits*, is a single album package featuring top pop hits from several of the hottest acts in the business. These include acts not only from CBS and PolyGram-distributed labels, but from other companies as well.

Included on the set are Shout from Tears For Fears, The Pointer Sisters' Neutron Dance, WHAM's Wake Me Up Before You Go Go, One Night In Bangkok by Murray Head, Gino Vannelli's Black Cars, Gowan's A Criminal Mind, and Somebody by Bryan Adams.

"We're looking for this to be the biggest team effort ever," said Steve Pulver, Manager of Direct Marketing for CBS Direct. "We're trying to duplicate the success of a WEA/CBS 2-album package that was released in the U.K."

Pulver pointed out that the British team effort for their package, titled *The Hits Album*, pushed the LP into the No. 1 position on U.K. charts. "We're shooting for a quarter of a million," continues Pulver, "Whether that's a realistic figure remains to be seen. Our album, *Rockin' With The Hits* went platinum."

The album, carrying a suggested list of \$9.98, and which will be available at retail, was manufactured by CBS and is to be distributed by PolyTel. CBS has developed the TV commercial and national radio promotions to back the release.

The actual marketing and promotion of the album is shared between the 2 companies. The campaign runs from Sept. 16 through the end of October. The double album set is being supported by an in-store video, posters, minis, banners, and header cards.

There will also be 2 weeks of promotion surrounding the Video Hits TV show, plus 6 weeks of promotion on *Switchback*, a popular Maritime TV show. As well there will be 6 weeks of regular radio and TV advertising.

Pulver explained that CBS chose PolyTel to work with because of their strong reputation and solid track record in the area of TV advertising. He pointed out that some of their executives had worked with K-Tel.

Pulver added that future CBS Direct and PolyTel team-ups depend on the success of this project from a consumer and trade perspective.

CRIA is already cooperating with Censor Boards in Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and Manitoba regarding content of music videos. Any music video that has a public performance - that which is shown in clubs - has to be classified. "This has been in place since April of last year," says Robertson. "There haven't been any problems through this process, and very few, if any, videos get a restricted rating."



RECORDS TO RADIO

1985 - Keeping True North on their toes

1985 has been an incredibly progressive and successful year for us. Having signed on 3 new acts, we now have six acts on the True North label - all of whom are extremely busy and keeping us on our toes.

Doug Cameron originally got his start writing and playing for the Cee Dees and Maja Bannerman. From there he came to True North and has had one of the most explosive debuts of any Canadian artist. Doug's first single *Mona With The Children*, taken from the LP of the same name

has firmly established itself on CHR, AC and AOR's as an ongoing hit. He backed up *Mona's* release with a cross Canada radio promo tour, talking to as many stations as possible - and there was a lot to talk about - the topic of the single, the video, the back-up vocalist (Seals & Crofts came out of semi-retirement to help him out) not to mention Doug himself. Both the LP and video will be released in the U.S. on the Gold Mountain label Sept. 23 (the same label to whom we happily credit much of Cockburn's *Stealing Fire* success). *Mona With The Children* is also simultaneously released in mid-October in Australia, Japan, Germany, Finland, Sweden, Norway and Denmark. While the LP is being released overseas, we are unleashing Doug on the States at the same time. He will begin a 17 city tour, then its back home again to Canada to play coast to coast. Much of the awareness of the album and video has come not only from Canada's radio airplay and video shows, but from talk shows, People Magazine and The Journal whose feature is scheduled to air (once again) mid-October. Keep an eye out for it.

Murray McLaughlin's '85 has been one of his most exciting to date. He has had a busy year, winning both a Juno and Big Country Award (and is nominated for a Juno again this year). In addition to his Canada Day special *Murry McLaughlin Floating Over Canada* which is now under negotiation to be syndicated throughout the world. A second special is now being scripted. His new LP release *Midnight Break* has a lot of surprises. The first single *When You Become A Memory* ships to radio Oct. 7, retail Oct. 10. The album is out to radio Oct. 14 and will be in the store the 17th and a cross Canada tour will be kicking off late October.

Another of our Juno nominees, Johnny MacLeod, has had a busy year with the debut of his *Dynamite In The Stove* (this LP is being released in Italy the first week of October on the Dischi label). Johnny is going back into the studio December and January to record what we think will be an outstanding album.

Another of our True North artists, Tony Kosinac, has had a wonderful response to his first single *Whose Love from The Passerby* album. His single enjoyed the status of becoming a Top 20 AC song. His followup is *Listen To The Hukilau* which is really happy and melodic piece - one which is already doing very well.

The Birds Of A Feather have flocked together once again! Rough Trade's newest single is gaining strong and fast ground on both CHR as well as AOR. The album *Birds Of A Feather (The Best Of)* will be shipping to radio the 23rd of September and to the stores on the 26th. It is also being released in England on FM Records distributed by EMI. The cover folks is outstanding - Dimo Safari strikes again. They will be touring later this fall. Carole Pope has had a busy year on her own - she co-hosted the *CASBY Awards*, picked up a Juno for female vocalist and once again is nominated for a Juno this year.

On to Bruce. There is no doubt *Stealing Fire* is Bruce Cockburn's most highly successful album to date. He worked hard to promote this LP, touring solidly in North America and Europe for the past 18 months. *Stealing Fire* has held strong on Billboards chart for 33 consecutive weeks. Nominated for a Juno, Bruce is going back into Manta mid-October to record his new album. Once again, the producing team will be Jen Goldsmith and Kerry Crawford. The LP (untitled as yet) is being simultaneously released worldwide January 15th, and a North American/European tour will follow shortly thereafter.

And at last but not at all least - our OK Blue Jay single (which incidentally was written by Tony Kosinec and Jack Lenz). It has become our beloved Blue Jay's national anthem and long may they both live.

lots of theatrics going on."

Earlier this year Attic Records released Thor's *Beware The Fury Of The Ice Viking* album which is the first LP for him in Canada in 7 years. "The LP is selling quite well in the States and with the video networks playing my video it seems to be selling fair in Canada. Of course it hasn't gone diamond or anything but it's not doing too badly" explains Thor. The album was written as a story, and is the basis of a movie that is in the talking stages now. It is a story about the year 2045, and focuses on a metal war. Let The Blood Run Red is the track used in the video and Thor is content that album sales will continue to do well.

Presently Thor is starring in the Roger Corman motion picture *Recruits*. He portrays a character named Thunderhead who is a Heavy Metal cop. When asked if he is going to concentrate on acting, Thor replies "Now days you have to be a multi-media entertainer. I like acting. It's hard work, but if it can add to my career then it's worth it." The film is set for release next spring, and is being released in the U.S. first, with a major marketing and promotion campaign.

Although it seems that Thor is not musically successful, he does maintain a cult following and judging the amount of touring he has been doing, his main interest is on behalf of his fans. He does sell records, and he does have people attending his concerts. He must be doing something right. If there are those who consider him a joke it seems they're not aware of the hard work and determination he has put into his career as a musician. Thor is hitting the studio this winter to record a new LP. An album is being released in England in November entitled *Live In Detroit*. A tour across the U.S. and plans to shoot his movie are all on the agenda for the next 6 to 8 months. Obviously Thor is another Canadian striving for international recognition.



He wrote the bulk of the material but key is Indoor Fireworks, written by Elvis Costello, and John Hiatt's penning of She Don't Love Nobody. Lowe's band includes Martin Belmont, ex-Rumour member on guitar; Paul Carrack, formerly with Squeeze and Ace, on keyboards; and drummer Bobbi Irwin.

This set has already made giant moves up the RPM 100. The Way You Do The Things You Do/ My Girl taken as the first single. Also key are I Can't Go For That.

REG WATKINS & LORETTA CORMIER - Country

This One's For You

One Raven - LR-715

Two of the most travelled Newfoundlanders in the recording business, Reg Watkins and Loretta Cormier are as smooth as silk as they put their confidences into the grooves. As a duet, they have travelled the Eastern and Western Arctic, the Trans-Canada Highway from beginning to end, "where other's fear to tread" says Watkins. Produced at Orchard Studios, the pair have some of the best pickers available including Mickey Andrews (steel and Dobro), Wendell Ferguson (acoustic and electric guitars), and Watkins on banjo, plus Marty Shaw and Al Cherney on fiddles, Andrew Affleck on bass, drummer Al Cross, and Anthony Panacci on keyboards and accordian. Key are The Basque Whalers Of Red Bay, The Newfie Bullet, both Watkins' originals, and Kris Messel's Bayou Song and Sunrise Travelling Boots.

MARK HAINES & THE ZIPPERS - Country/Variety

A heavy promotion campaign launched by the James McConnell Management firm, is beginning to pay off for this package of country satire. Taken as a single is Messer's Dream, a tribute to the late and great "down home" hero. This side is made up of Big John McNeill and Devil's Dream, arranged by Haines. The flip, Honey Suckle Rose, co-written by Fats Waller and Andy Razaf, is an example of the type of entertainment that Haines and his Zippers are capable of. 

