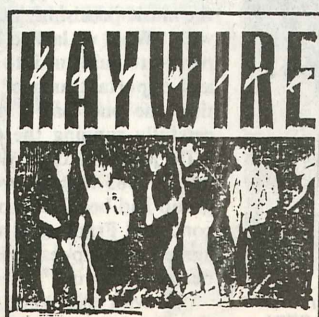

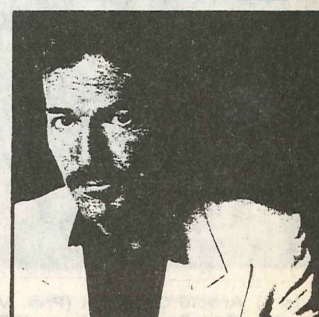

He continues with "Almost everybody in sales, or sales service, for the Music Industry Division has had a tour of duty with a major record company."

This is basically a new career undertaking for Struth, who had been with Quality Records for 30 years. Says Prochaska, "George, after the winding down of the Quality operation, was looking for a new challenge and immediately there was a meeting of minds." He concludes with "It is interesting to note that George Struth first entered the labour force in the printing industry, and in a way, life for him has come full circle."

Ron Besse, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of Canada Publishing Corporation (CPC) has announced the formation of Thompson Music Publishing (TMP) and the appointment of Frank Davies as Executive Vice President and General Manager of the new division.

"Since acquiring Gordon V. Thompson Music in 1984, we have given high priority to expanding the base of our operations into

Compact discs register phenomenal sales jump

CRIA industry statistics for the month of May show an increase of almost 3 times over the same period last year for compact discs. In May of 1985 there were 76,005 units sold as opposed to 211,000 for the same period this year. National year-to-date figures show 282,644 units sold up to May of 1985, while for the same period this year, there were 1,161,000 units reported sold, with a dollar value of \$16,604,000.

Availability of product has been of prime concern for most of the major labels however, there has been a decided easing of this problem in view of the new CD manufacturing facilities now in operation.

Garry Newman, Vice President Sales for WEA Music Canada, reports "Our fill has improved slightly, but if I could get as many Peter Gabriels and Genesis units as I need, we would be much better off." Newman continues with "There's a steady incline in sales,

up about 30 percent. Business is getting better, because my fill is getting better."

Don Kollar, Vice President and General Manager RCA/Ariola, is experiencing the same type of CD growth as the industry. "While supply has improved, particularly with the name acts," he points out, "there continues to be some difficulty in supplying some titles, which is frustrating." Kollar does expect to see however, "a dramatic improvement in the CD supply over the next few months." On stream in Canada now is the Praxis CD plant, which opened the latter part of June, and which already has secured orders for 2 years down the road. CinRam, of course, are expected to be operational with their CD plant early in 1987, prompting one observer to suggest: "With the proper, state-of-the-art CD manufacturing facilities that should be available in Canada, I don't see why certain titles of name acts can't all be produced in Canada for the world."

Copa sets date for history of Cancon rock 'n' roll

The Copa, in downtown Toronto, have set July 30 for an audio/visual presentation of The History of Canadian Rock 'N' Roll. The club's Evan Adelman is billing the date as "An evening of classic Cancon (1966 to 1986)".

Included in the program will be flashback spotlights on Lighthouse, Edward Bear, A Foot In Coldwater, The Guess Who, Crowbar, The Stampeders, April Wine, Stepwolf, Myles & Lenny, Fludd, Mandala, Gary & Dave, Wednesday, Bachman Turner Overdrive, and many more. There will also be rare film footage featuring many of what Adelman describes as "Canada's musical legends."

"We are experiencing an increase in our CD sales for 3 very simple reasons," says Don Oates, Vice President Sales & Marketing for CBS Records Canada. "First and foremost, we're getting full supply from our U.S. plant, and we never had that last year. We were getting absolutely no fill last year. The second reason is that this is the first year when all our accounts are buying compact discs. For instance, last year at this time, Handleman was not in the compact disc business - and they now stock CDs for their accounts like Towers, Zellers, K-Mart etc. So, there would be an incremental increase there. The third reason is that because we do have stock, we can now get into the marketing of compact discs for the very first time."

Oates went on to point out that CBS created a CD merchandising display unit that was available to sit on the counter or in the wire frames and "A" frames in the stores. They also created p.o.p material. "So obviously CBS was more prominent at retail," continues Oates, "with resultant sales on across-the-board product - classical, pop, rock, and country - and I can see further increases down the road."

Fraser leaves DJs to join MCA Alberta marketing

Margo Fraser has been appointed Marketing rep for MCA's Alberta Branch. Prior to joining MCA, Fraser was an integral member of the Calgary-based DJ's Music Service where she had become a much-respected source of information for both radio and retail in Western Canada. Fraser had also gained a wide knowledge of promotion experience when she was Quality promo rep before joining DJ's.

Also joining MCA's Alberta Branch is Ed Harris, former Senior Buyer for Sound Insight, a position he has held for the past 4 years. He joins MCA in the position of marketing/sales representative. He will also be responsible for contacts with country radio.

copyright music publishing," explains Besse. "Frank Davies brings to our new venture a proven track record of success in not only acquiring successful Canadian copyright, but the successful marketing of copyright publishing throughout the world."

Arnold Gosewich, President and Chief Operating Officer of Macmillan of Canada (also a division of CPC), will oversee the development of Thomson Music Publishing.

Gosewich explains: "After the acquisition of Gordon V. Thompson Music, a game plan was developed with Ron Besse to take CPC into the 'copyright ownership' end of the music publishing business." He continues with "What we lacked however, was the right person to guide us into this highly specialized and important area of the industry. At that time the one man I had in mind was successfully running the Canadian arm of the ATV Music Group. When ATV announced late in 1985 that the worldwide assets of the group had been sold to Michael Jackson, we contacted Frank, and we're glad that he has agreed to help establish and run this new business with us."

Davies will work alongside John Bird, the President of Gordon V. Thompson Music, in furthering the music publishing interests of CPC.

Record sales are down - a \$5M decline -

According to Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) President, Brian Robertson, 1986 single and LP sales are down 9 percent, while cassette sales decreases have amounted to 2 percent. However, combined, these figures represent a total loss of over \$5 million for the record industry.

"Overall," explains Robertson, "at the present time, it looks as though we're down about 7 or 8 percent over last year." He attributes the decline to "a distinct lack of superstar product."

Robertson does maintain however, that "there is a degree of optimism within the industry that the second half of the year is going to be a lot stronger at retail. I don't think we're in a position yet, of writing off the whole year."

CBS Vice President Sales & Marketing, Don Oates, paints a different picture.

"We're actually considerably up over last year," he reports, noting the past months have been extremely favourable to their new acts such as Jennifer Rush and The Outfield. "But at the same time," he continues, "we've had a full 6 months of compact disc sales - whereas last year, we didn't have supply - and you're dealing with quite large unit numbers."

Oates says he expects business to increase "substantially" in the last half of the year and cites forthcoming releases such as Cyndi Lauper, Michael Jackson, Eddie Money, and Quiet Riot. Also a contributing factor for a healthier 3rd quarter will be the newly released WHAM album - not to mention the Gowan album, expected shortly, and the recently signed Perfect World, both Canon. "We know we have stronger, viable product coming in the next 6 months, than we had in the last, but we're still over budget," he concludes.

Honeymoon Suite's LP goes double platinum

Honeymoon Suite's WEA album, The Big Prize, has reached double platinum status in Canada (200,000 units sold). They are currently making good chart movement with What Does It Take, the second single taken from the album. A video clip of this single has just been shipped.

The Niagara Falls, Ont.-based band are presently touring the U.S. with 38 Special, and will be playing several Canadian dates as well: Kamloops (Aug. 18), Kelowna (19), Victoria (20), Vancouver's Expo (21), and Toronto (Sept. 7).

Interesting enough Bryan Adams and Phil Collins tied for second place in the Favourite Male Artist category with 20 percent of the vote. Tina Turner took second place honours with 20 percent in the

Favourite Female Artist category, followed by Anne Murray with 12 percent.

Mr. Mister (23 percent), and Tears For Fears (16 percent) are the second and third Favourite New Artists - and the Beatles came second to Dire Straits in the Favourite Group category with 21 percent, followed closely by ZZ Top with 20 percent.

The second and third Most Popular Albums of All Time, were Dark Side Of The Moon (13 percent), and Thriller (11 percent).

In the country field, Alabama (21 percent) and Willie Nelson (14 percent) trailed Kenny Rogers as Favourite Country Performers.

Colin Moore, Director of Marketing for Pepsi-Cola Canada, notes: "The Pepsi Music Poll Sweepstakes has given Pepsi-Cola Canada tremendous insight into regional tastes and trends with regard to the Canadian music scene. For example the poll shows that Dire Straits are the Favourite Group in Eastern Canada with 35 percent of the popular vote, while The Beatles were No. 1 in Ontario with 23 percent."

Grand prize winners were announced across Canada this week in draws conducted by more than 60 participating radio stations. Each Grand Prize winner won, among other items, a collection of 100 personally-selected CBS albums.

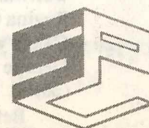

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Haywire firmed openers for Mitchell's tour

Haywire, currently charting with their debut Attic album, Bad Boys, have been firmed to open for all Kim Mitchell's Canadian dates.

The East Coast rockers have just shipped their second single, Standing In Line, the follow-up to Bad Bad Boy, which peaked at No. 21 on the RPM 100 singles chart last week. Mitchell's Patio Lanterns single is still climbing the chart.

The tour begins July 23 in Mitchell's hometown of Sarnia, Ont. and winds down in Hamilton Sept. 5.

Following Sarnia, the bands will play Brantford (24), Ottawa (25), Toronto (26-27), and Peterborough (29).

August sees the tour heading eastward with stops in Sydney (1), Halifax (2), Moncton (3), Saint John (4), and Charlottetown (6). They then swing westward to Belleville (8), Cornwall (9), Sudbury (11), Sault Ste. Marie (12), and Thunder Bay (13).

The latter part of August has the bands departing Ontario and travelling further westward to Winnipeg (15), Saskatoon (16), Regina (17), Lethbridge (18), Edmonton (19), Calgary (20), Grand Prairie (22), Prince George (23), Kamloops (24), and Vancouver (26).

Before winding down with the Hamilton finale, there have been dates firmed for Oshawa (Sept. 3), and Kitchener (4).



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Madonna's True Blue LP ships platinum in Canada

Confidence in the potential of the new Madonna album, *True Blue*, and the popularity of the vocalist was boyed at the WEA Canada camp with the album shipping platinum (100,000 units) a move regarded as "uncommon" today. *Papa Don't Preach*, taken as a single from the album received instant programmer reaction resulting in major moves up the RPM 100 singles chart. The album also contains *Live To Tell*, the single which topped this chart on May 24/86, a position it held for 2 weeks.

"People were waiting for this album" said Bill Johnston, Warner Bros Product Manager. "That's why it's an instant hit at retail. There's at least 3 No.1 singles on the album. When you've already got a No. 1 record, there's an automatic sales base." He continues, "True Blue is going to be one of the hottest albums this year. The strength of the artist and music will speak for itself."

The new album also includes dance-oriented pop material, which is traditional for Madonna. "There's something for everyone on this album," says Johnston. "The title track, which may be released as a single, even has a Shirelles/Ronettes sound, done in the '80s fashion."

The new album was produced by Madonna, Patrick Leonard, and Stephen Bray.

Interestingly, Madonna's last album, *Like A Virgin*, released in November of 1984, is now 8-times platinum in Canada.

Cranwell and Freeman to PolyGram promotion

Bob Ansell, Vice President Promotion & Media Relations for PolyGram, has announced 2 new additions to the company's promotion department.

Steve Cranwell has been appointed to the regional promotion position in Calgary where he will be directly responsible for the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan. He has been with WEA Promotion for the past 2 years, and "with his previous retail experience will be a valuable asset to

PolyGram" says Ansell.

David Freeman joins the national promotion staff, moving from CHRW (University of Western Ontario, London) where he has been Station Manager/Program Director since May of 1982. "David has clearly been a major factor in 'RW's status as one of the country's top alternative outlets," says Ansell, concluding with "Both Steve and David can only intensify PolyGram's continuing ability to do what we do best - break records."

Loverboy's Top Gun cut without Johnson

When Loverboy entered the studio earlier this year to record *Heaven In Your Eyes* for the *Top Gun* soundtrack, absent was keyboardist Doug Johnson - due to what has been described as his strong belief regarding the "promotion of the American military."

Johnson has also waived all financial remuneration that would have come to him from airplay and sales of the song. He had also refused to play the song live until recently.

Apparently, after several meetings, Johnson consented to play the song during the band's forthcoming summer tour. "I'm sure there are fans of ours who love the song for its own merits," suggests Johnson, "and it would be unfair of me to deny them the pleasure of hearing it."

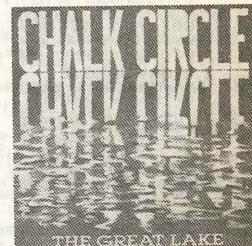

The Cure endure a decade of perseverance

Having finally come into prominence in North America after a decade of perseverance - and a no-compromise attitude - The Cure's latest release (*Standing On A Beach*) is a reflection of their past, detailing their musical history from *Killing An Arab*, to *Close To Me*. However, it is no coincidence that this past year has been their most successful - it was in late 1984 when they were signed to the Elektra label - and founding member Laurence Tolhurst agrees.

"Yes, it's the 4th or 5th label we've been on in North America," he explains, "and for instance, when we came over here last time (1985), there was always somebody from Elektra at every concert. So, there's a bit more concern, something we felt was lacking with the other labels, where it was like 'collect another English group'."

The past year has seen 3 releases from The Cure: *Head On The Door*, *Quadpus*, and *Standing On A Beach*. The latter a compilation, a greatest hits package, and this suggests Tolhurst, was the band's idea. "It was practical," he explains. "We had 13 singles, which is about the maximum you can get on a record, so we thought we'd use it as a summation of the past few years." But not as a means of breaking in North America? "No, we don't really care. But we'd be liars if we said we didn't want success."

With respect to record sales, the drummer-turned-keyboardist offers: "They're not relevant after a certain point because there is always a section of people who will always buy the top albums irrespective of whether they know anything about the band or whether they actually like the music."

Accompanying the *Standing On The Beach* release is a video compilation, titled *Staring At The Sea*. Says Tolhurst: "A lot of people unfortunately, use videos as a sort of marketing ploy rather than what could be done with them - which is the same as making a record - and making a record that's interesting."

"I think it's a grossly undervalued form, and too many take it the wrong way - taking it purely to titillate. I've grown tired of

videos with just 3 ideas: the blond walking down the road with a singer, with lasers coming out his eyes, and people evaporating."

Tolhurst points out that although Elektra has tried to pressure the group to commercialize, "every record company tries that - that's why we've changed so many labels." He adds however, that Elektra is the only company to "understand" the group.

"Albeit, they must think we're a bit like autistic children or something. They know there's something there, but they're not quite sure how to bring it out. Yes, but every company tries to get you to commercialize. I mean, that's what they're there for. They're not charitable institutions... they're banks really."

Hot summer months ahead for Savannah acts

The month of July marks the official launch of Savannah Records' new distribution agreement with RCA/Ariola. So, to heat things up right from the start, we're coming with a blistering release schedule, our busiest ever, including 3 hot new albums and 5 scorching singles. No siestas this summer for the staff (me) here at Savannah! First off the presses comes Gary Fjellgaard's Savannah debut, *No Time To Lose*: a much-anticipated release, and the first LP in over 3 years from British Columbia's highest-profile, most awarded country singer/songwriter. Crafted at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound, with the help of some of the West Coast's top musicians (including Jim Vallance on drums), *No Time To Lose*, Gary's fourth album, is his strongest product yet. Key cuts include the award-winning single, *Riding On The Wind* (Canadian Country Music Association's 1985 Single of the Year; CARAS' 1985 Tribute To West Coast Music Independent Song of the Year), and *Dancing In The Ring*, Gary's chart-climbing current single, now on over 100 stations nationally.

Next up, we've got another Savannah debut, this time from The Good Brothers. Delivering The Goods is the first album release in more than 2 and a half years from Canada's top country rock group. The Goods have released 8 albums in Canada during the past 12 years, winning a gold record and a string of 8 Junos in the process. Through their new association with Savannah Records, Delivering The Goods reunites the Brothers with their friends at RCA and continues the tradition established by their previous

Williams, and keyboardist Porl Thompson, have drawn the line between making records and selling records.

"Sure, it would be foolish if we said, 'we'd like it marketed this way', when we don't really know what induces people to buy a record anyway. On the other hand, I don't understand when I'm told 'well, people won't like that, and it won't sell,' I don't see how anybody can tell that at all."

Despite the label changes throughout their volatile career, Tolhurst maintains the group hasn't lost their integrity nor their idealism. "When we first started, we didn't expect a large advance from any label because we figured we'd be paying them back each successive year. Because, for each album or each tour you do, you just end up spending more money - and if you don't recover it, like with huge sales, then you're at the beck and call of everybody who thinks they know how to run you."

"When we started, we just said 'well,

outings: Brian's ballads and Bruce's up-against-the wall rockers combined with Larry's bluegrass influences, all together in one strong, well-produced "Good"-time package suitable for a variety of radio formats. Their first single from the LP, *This Could Be Serious*, hits programmers' desks this week.

Last (but not least) we have the new LP from Terry Carisse slated for late July. None Of The Feeling Is Gone continues the rapid development of Terry's career that began with his last LP, *The Closest Thing To You*. That album helped Terry win 7 Canadian Country Music Awards in 1985 (including Album of the Year and Male Vocalist of the Year), plus a PROCAN Citation for the title track single being most performed Canadian country composition during 1984, and a Big Country Award for Terry and his songwriting partner, Bruce Rawlins, as Canada's Top Country Composers in 1985. But we think Terry's new product is even stronger. None Of The Feeling Is Gone features hotter production values and a smoother crossover-oriented sound with saxophones and keyboards, much to the delight of country and A/C programmers alike: *Love Sweet Love*, the leadoff single released just 2 weeks ago, is Terry's fastest-breaking single ever.

And the heat goes on. We're tallying a torrid radio reaction to Anita Perras' debut single for the label, *Heads You Win (Tails I Lose)*: this solo offering from one half of Canada's 1985 CCMA Duo of the Year (Anita Perras & Tim Taylor) has won widespread recognition as her best individual outing to date. We're ablaze with enthusiasm for our newest signing, Sudbury's Michelle Wright. Her first single, *I Want To Count On You*, ships Friday. All our artists are currently smokin' across Canada in the midst of their summer tours, and we've got new 45s from Matt Minglewood and Terry Sumsion on the front burner for August.

All in all, it's shaping up to be a steamy summer for Savannah.

Island set to release Hine's Thinkman project

Island Records has slated the release of Rupert Hine's new album, *The Formula* for July 29. Accompanying this release is a 12" AOR single containing the first 2 cuts: *Best Adventures*, and the title track.

"It'll be our chase project for the summer," says new Island President Lee Silversides. "We'll build a foundation at AOR first, then we'll use that base as a springboard for CHR - the tunes are relevant to both formats."

Hine's new band, Thinkman, includes members Andy Paris, Leo Hurl, and Joe McArthur. Silversides reveals that Police drummer Stewart Copeland assists on several tracks on the album, and Lisa DalBello provides backing vocals.

Genesis "family" shakes up charts

Having topped Whitney Houston's self-titled album from the No. 1 position last week, a spot she has enjoyed for the past 18 weeks, Peter Gabriel has moved into the coveted Top of The Chart on the RPM 100 (July 12/86).

Gabriel's album, *So*, fueled by the

Sledgehammer single, has been rocketing up album charts across Canada since its release 9 weeks ago.

Following quickly however, are his ex-band mates - Genesis. Their *Invisible Touch* LP, after only 5 weeks of charting, has already moved into the No. 4 position behind the still-strong Houston, Robert Palmer and Gabriel LPs.

Also making quiet, but steady gains on album charts is Mike Rutherford's solo project: *Mike & The Mechanics*. Last week saw the charting of his 3rd single, *Taken In*. His

2nd single, *All I Need Is A Miracle*, has just slipped out of the Top 10.

Finally, having reached the diamond sales plateau last month, Phil Collins' solo LP, *No Jacket Required*, continues to display tremendous depth and tenacity - having just slipped from the Top 20 after 71 weeks of chart action, but continues to sell strongly.

Interestingly, according to WEA Vice President Sales, Garry Newman, shipments of these 4 titles constitute over 30 percent of total weekly sales, "and yes," he adds, "they are competing with each other."

"We had asked John (Oates) to produce our album after we got our deal with Duke Street" recalls Ryan, explaining how the band was able to record the Oates song.

"John is a friend of our manager's and although he was too busy with other projects, he did have *X-Ray Eyes*," continues Ryan. "He liked our stuff, and he thought the song might fit with what we were doing. So, he sent it up and we recorded it."

Ryan and Wood were also formerly with the OH NOS before forming Eye Eye. Both bands won the Toronto Q107 Homegrown Contest in 1980 and 1984 respectively. Doug Ruston (bass), and Mark Caporal (drums) comprise the remainder of the group.

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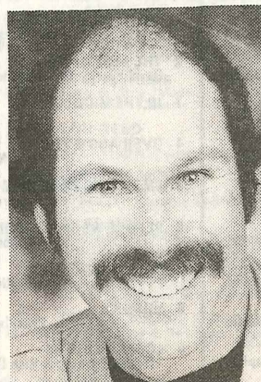

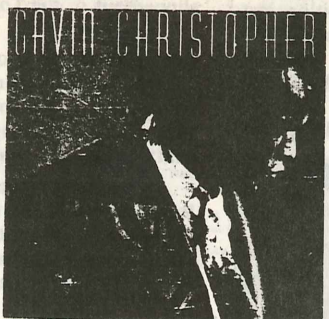

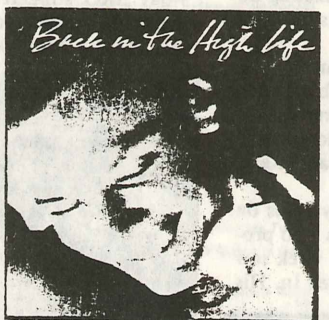

U.S. releases hurting Cancon

Over the last few weeks there has been a noticeable increase in supercountry releases, which has created a bit of a problem for Cancon country releases. Canadian programmers are complaining that to satisfy their listeners, they have to air the established American country superstars. Said one programmer, "We only have so many slots on our chart, and too often lately we can only add 3 or 4 new singles, so we have to go with the winners." These American "winners" include Rockin' With The Rhythm Of The Rain by The Judds, Will The Wolf Survive by Waylon Jennings, Ronnie Milsap's In Love, the Forester Sisters' latest, Lonely Alone, Bottle Of Tears by Gene Watson, and Country State Of Mind by Hank Williams Jr. Ironically, a few of these singles haven't been released in Canada yet, but programmers received their copies through advanced U.S. record services. Unfortunately the tight situation with country charts and playlists is reflected on the

RPM Country 60, where this week it was necessary to drop several Cancon singles. We were however, able to add Gary Fjellgaard's Dancing In The Ring, It's A Fine Line by Gilles Godard, and Albert Hall's Blue Umbrella.

Weird nod to Foreman deck

Hot from the world of Expo comes Deep In The Heart Of Vancouver, a 4-song 12" extended play by Al Foreman. The release got more than a foot in the door when Weird Harold of CKWX gave it the nod. Says Weird, "Deep In The Heart Of Vancouver is loaded with all the very key ingredients I feel are necessary in the make-up of a hit record." The single is released on the Vancouver-based Munchkin label.

The Lords back in studios

Anne and Roger Lord returned to Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound to tape their next single, I'll Never Get Over You. The single will be the follow-up to their current Comstock release, Don't Cry For Me, which gained good country programmer attention and enjoyed several weeks on the RPM Country 60. Both singles were produced by Peter Berring, and co-written by Anne and Roger. They now have 5 tracks in the can and will be working toward the release of an album in the not too distant future.

Justin Curtis off with single

New from Calgary and the Boomtown label comes Tell Me Why, a single by Justin Curtis. Both the plug side and the flip, Reality Shakes, were written by Curtis. The single was produced by Eric Westbury at The Sundae Sound Studio. Besides vocals, Curtis plays guitar, along with session people, Ben-

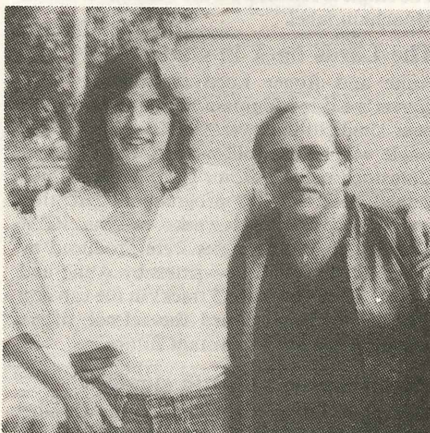

we'll take enough money to live on - and then as we make money we'll just put it back into what we'd like to.' After the initial struggle, we've actually got to the stage now, where we don't owe anybody anything, and we can say we actually control most of what we do and how and when we do it - and not a lot of bands can say that."

He continues with "We don't have accountants breathing down our necks, telling us 'It'd be a good idea if you put out another album otherwise you're not going to be able to pay off this and that.' No, we don't have that problem. I mean, we're not keen businessmen. I don't think we'd get voted 'Businessmen of The Year', but we just have a fairly shrewd idea of what we do."

He concludes with "I think that's not being vastly commercial - I just think that's common sense."

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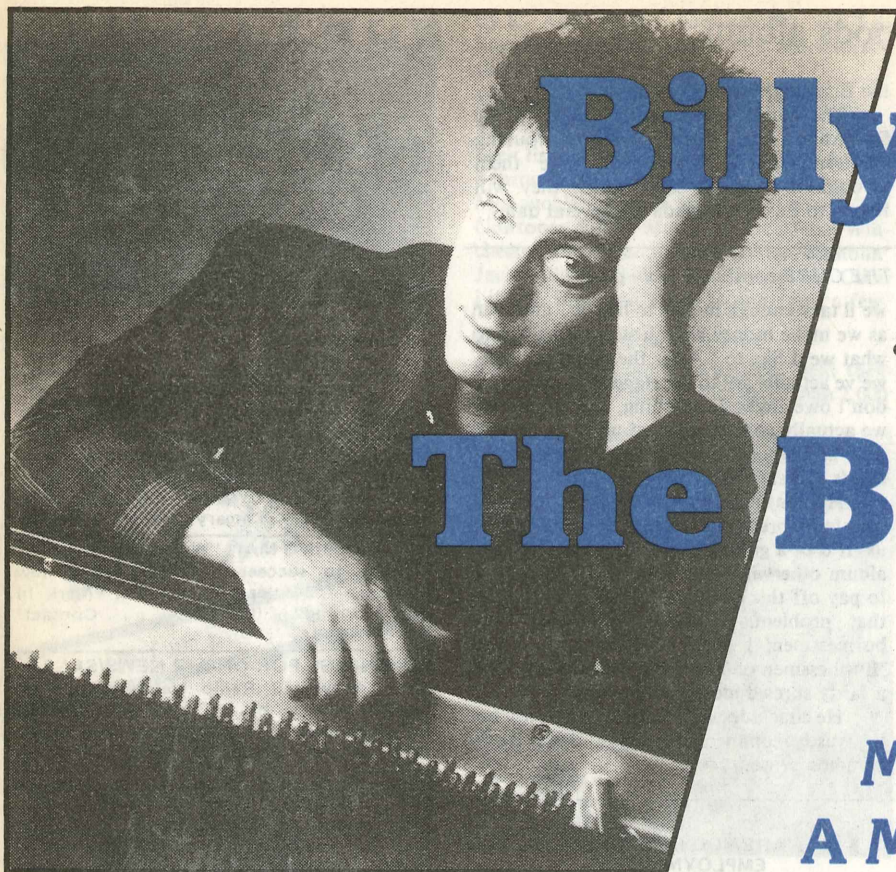
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
