Labatt's launches CNE Rock Stop

The media was provided a preview of one of the most extensive, and perhaps expensive undertakings by a brewery (Aug 12) to promote Cancon rock 'n' roll - and the history of rock 'n' roll in general, at Toronto's Exhibition Place (Aug 12). Organizers of the event were meticulous in their preparation: with gallons of beer, soft drinks, a very short speech, T-shirts, and an exceptionally well laid-out buffet - a rare occasion for the CNE.

The purpose of the gathering was the launch of Labatt's Blue Rock Stop, which will feature 20 nights of Cancon Rock 'N' Roll as well as their Rock 'N' Roll Tunnel.

Onstage at the Rock Stop will be the

Duke Street and MCA pact distribution deal

Duke Street Records, currently boasting a roster that includes Jane Siberry, Chalk Circle, Eye Eye, Manteca, and Scott Merritt, have announced the signing of a new distribution deal with MCA Records (Canada).

Leaving the WEA "family", with whom Duke Street has been associated for the past 3 years, was a decision based solely "from a business premise," maintains Adrian Heaps, Vice President of the Toronto-based independent label.

"It was time for a change - time for a good business move, and only time will tell," he adds. "We felt that to reach the next plateau - from a creative, as well as a business standpoint - it was time for a change.

"It's a fresh infusion of energy," Heaps continues. "I think it's very easy to stagnate in this industry - to become institutionalized, and that's a real fear I have. Now, all of a sudden, we're dealing with a new company, new people, and new strategies."

He concludes with "It was time for people at this company to get a kick in the ass anyway."

Ross Reynolds, Executive Vice President and General Manager of MCA Records, notes, "I'm very excited to have the opportunity to work with a company that has already broken ground with several artists, and is well on the road to becoming the leading independent label in Canada."

Paul James Band (Aug 12 through 14), followed by GP & The Mauraders and Johnnie Lovesin & The Grand Slam Band (15), FM (16), The Downchild Blues Band (17), Ron LaSalle & The Silver Bullet Band (18 & 19), Minglewood (20 & 21), Crowbar & King Biscuit Boy (22), Q107 Home Grown Winners, Red Letter, Jitters, and Simon Chase (23), Sherry Keane (24), 1964 (25 & 26), Blushing Brides (27 & 28), Kids Wanna Rock (29 & 30), and the CFGM Country Day with The Good Brothers, Prairie Oyster, and Blue Rodeo (31).

The Time Tunnel, described as "an unforgettable journey through Rock 'N' Roll history," is a photo, video, memorabilia trip through the rock music form, from its birth in the early '50s to today's high-tech, synthesized sounds.

Bill Vronsky, Promotions Manager for Labatt's Ontario Breweries, explains: "Labatt's has acquired over 70 items valued at over \$70,000 from the Museum of Rock Art in Hollywood - everything from very rare Elvis Presley photos and the RCA dog used in Cyndi Lauper's *Girls Just Wanna Have Fun* video to the most expensive item on display - Buddy Holly's last 3 photos, valued at \$25,000."

There are also 4 different video pods continually showing footage from each decade, giving priority to the name acts of that particular era. The Canadian connection of Chilliwauck and Rush are cleverly worked into the videos showing their moves onto the chart and into international prominence.

As well, Rock 'N' Roll Trivia contests will be held in the tent during the afternoons.

Westwood One Canada sponsors EL&P tour

The Westwood One Radio Networks have announced they will be "the sole sponsors of the upcoming concert tour by Emerson, Lake & Powell."

The tour kicked off in El Paso, Texas (Aug 15) and will continue through October with more than 65 concerts dates including Toronto (Sept 3), Montreal (5), Quebec City (6), Ottawa (9), and a date in Vancouver (T.B.A.).

Tour dates will be backed by a series of promotional services including an hour-long ELP music and interview special, broadcast in each city on the tour schedule, approximately one week prior to the concert.

In other news from Westwood One, Kim Mitchell kicked off his 1986 North American tour with a visit to Westwood One's Toronto studio, where he did an exclusive interview to be heard in major cities across Canada and the U.S.

Triumph, who will shortly release their new MCA album, were in the Toronto studios (Aug 18), for Line One, a live interview and phone-in show. The following week (25), Tom Cochrane & Red Rider will guest Line One again from the Toronto studio.

The Triumph Line One date was directly linked to the Westwood One L.A. studio, and hosts Sky Daniels (L.A.), and Carol Miller (N.Y.). A similar arrangement has been made for the Cochrane/Red Rider broadcast.

PolyGram heavy with metal presentations

Nana Mouskouri, The Moody Blues, and The Cult were recently honoured by PolyGram head office executives, who presented the trio

of superstars with gold and platinum awards.

Nana Mouskouri, in Quebec on the final night of her recent series of Eastern Canadian dates, was presented with a gold award for *Song For Liberty*, and platinum for *Je Chante Avec Toi Liberté*. A new album from Mouskouri is expected in the fall. She will also be doing a short, 9-date tour of the Northeastern U.S. from Sept. 5 through 14. These dates will include Radio City Music Hall in New York City, and the Kennedy Centre in Washington D.C.

The Moody Blues were caught backstage at Montreal's Forum, where they were presented with gold awards for their album, *The Other Side Of Life*. Your Wildest Dreams, the first single taken from the album has experienced much success in Canada, enjoying 17 weeks on the RPM 100 singles chart. The follow-up, the title track from the album, has just been shipped to radio and is expected to hasten the album's trip towards platinum.

The Cult's *Love* album, released in Canada by PolyGram on the Vertigo/Beggars Banquet label, was certified as both gold and platinum by the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA). Although the band wasn't in Canada, Martin Mills, Managing Director of Beggars Banquet in the U.K. paid a recent visit to PolyGram's Montreal offices, and was surprised by the metal presentation. This was the first time Mills had ever received awards personally made out to him. The *Love* album broke into the Top 5 of the RPM 100 (Mar. 29/86) and, to date, has enjoyed 34 weeks of action on the chart.

CHUM airs year-long report on concerts

Criticising what he feels is an "apparent lack of concern for the concert-goer", CHUM-AM producer Paul Cross revealed the results of his investigation into "the questionable activities of the multi-million dollar Toronto concert industry."

His criticisms include: promoters breaking their own rules in order to sell "huge" lots of the best seats to a "growing" number of ticket scalpers and investigations into ticket "rip-offs" have avoided issues that concert-goers complain about most.

Cross' findings were broadcast on both CHUM-AM and FM during his program, Two

For The Show. Although Cross admits that some of the problems have been eradicated, the issue of scalping has not, and this, he believes, stems from the executive levels of the 3 companies involved (CPI, the CNE and BASS).

According to David Garrick, a Director of the CNE, who headed an investigation into the ticket problem following last year's Bruce Springsteen fiasco, "at least 15 percent" of the tickets available are held back from the public, which, for a sold-out full stadium show, represents over 10,000 tickets.

"The record company gets a whole bunch of tickets," says Garrick, "the promoter gets tickets - they all have to be looked after, and

then you get a lot of people coming to visit the Exhibition like the President of the Calgary Stampede. You have to look after those people, because when people from Toronto go to the Stampede, they are also looked after. They (the tickets) are not abused. They try to use them for good cross-promotion."

In an effort to solve the scalping of tickets, Garrick reveals the number made available to both CPI and the CNE has been reduced "dramatically," 500 and 800 for each show respectively. As well, a mail order system has been implemented for large shows.

Interestingly enough, Ontario's Attorney General Ian Scott doesn't show too much concern for an "anti-scalping" law, when on the same program he suggests that policing the "ticket speculations act" would be "inappropriately expensive for the kind of evil we're dealing with here."

Eye Eye goes out on a limb to break the charts

After 12 years of frustration, Eye Eye lead-singer Bill Wood says, "Now, it's nice to wake up in the morning and go: 'yes, I've got a record out and, yes, it's getting played. What have I got to do today?' As opposed to waiting for the phone to ring, hoping that someday something will happen. . ."

Wood and Eye Eye, currently touring the East Coast with Glass Tiger, are supporting their debut album, *Just In Time To Be Late*, and their new single *X-Ray Eyes*, the follow-up to *Out On Limb*.

X-Ray Eyes was actually written by Taylor Rhodes and Buzz Cason, not John Oates as previously reported, and it is this single Duke Street Records is hoping will bring the album in to national prominence.

Prior to the release of their debut, Eye Eye had won Homegrown contests, CBC's Rock Wars competition and they finished 3rd in last year's Rock Express/MuchMusic Talent Search. They decided to go this route instead of toiling in the bar circuit because, as leads guitarist Andy Ryan explains, "The idea was to get a deal first and then go out and play."

"Because we had all done the bar thing for long enough. The contests were an easier way of getting our name around through the industry. You get to a lot more people through the media then you do off the stage at a hotel." Ryan continues with "Not that we don't want to do any of that, but we'd all been doing it for so long and didn't really get what we wanted out of it that way."

"We just decided to try it another way:

to get day jobs and survive that way. Because if you're out playing 6 nights a week - it's hard when you wake up to get motivated - to pick up your guitar and write a tune. But when you're working somewhere else to keep yourself alive then it's a treat for you to come back and work on writing."

Wood comments: "It's a matter of channeling your energies and there's only so much energy you can have. If you're trying to write tunes and play 6 nights a week and trying to get a record deal and keep everything organized; well it never worked. We just concentrated on doing this record, now it's done we'll play everywhere for anyone that will have us."

Ryan and Wood fully appreciate what ex-Rush producer Terry Brown achieved for the band in the studio. "There's an overall sound to the record and a lot of variety," suggests Ryan. "There are some rocky tunes and some slower, dramatic songs, but they all sound like they come from the same band. So, we're really happy that finally someone understood what we were looking for."

As the years (and bands) passed by, Ryan maintains that the band "learned to put a lid on their expectations," and Wood agrees, adding that the band's attitude has changed as well.

"Back when we were the Oh Nos, and a lot younger, it was really great just to be on the road constantly: party every night, rape and pillage as you went, but now, it's more of a career thing: you have to take care of business first."

Getting serious about their music hasn't effected the band's songwriting however. As Ryan points out, "Now, it's not a thing of having to write a commercial tune because we write what we write and hopefully it ends up being commercial."

Interestingly enough, today's radio formats was the reason for the release of *Out On A Limb*, they admit. "Sure, it was released because it was inoffensive," asserts Ryan. "If you want to get played - and no one's heard of you before - you have to give them something they can latch onto really easily."

"As far as the intensity of the song, it lies in the middle of our spectrum. Now we can go to either side, *X-Ray Eyes* is a little more abrasive sounding and a little more 'up'," he concludes.

Out of the slump!!

It was 2 years ago when the record business was in a major slump, and it was 2 years ago when MuchMusic went on the air and brought music videos to the attention of the record buying public - and that ended the slump. As I write this, RPM is preparing a special tribute to MuchMusic in celebration of their second year. For more information, give me a call.

If it wasn't for the breweries!!

Well, much has been said and written about the role played by breweries in the entertainment business (EC: **You've written and said much!!**) but you've got to admit, Labatt's and Molson's have opened a lot of doors for what was shaping up to be a dormant industry. Of course, the bottom line is promotion, and both Labatt's and Molson's are in the business of promotion, and what better way to do it than by supporting Canadian recording acts - and entertainment in general. Both breweries are front and centre at this year's Canadian National Exhibition. Molson's are bringing in the big names to this year's Grandstand show, with a good mixture of Cancon. Labatt's has a "spectacular" Big Top setting where they are showcasing Can-

con acts only. There is also a Rock 'N' Roll Time Tunnel, featuring rock music and acts from the '50s through to the present. There must have been a lot of sleepless nights and frustrating encounters for Dan Plouffe, who heads up Firstcom Marketing, in putting together this exceptional display.

The Caplan-Sauvageau Report . . .!!

A sneak look at the Caplan-Sauvageau Report reveals what seems to carry forward the government's pursuit of de-regulation without displaying any appreciation of why the regs were instituted in the first place, and how successful they have been. If anything, it's naive, in spades. I get the impression the authors (sic) believe the industry wants to de-regulate, so they're trying to lay a foundation for it. (That's called "pluralistic ignorance" - everyone does something because they think everyone else wants it done, even though they personally don't, which sounds like government, wouldn't you agree?) If one thing came through loud and clear at the Radio Reform hearings, it was that de-regulation is not what the industry wants. It will kill it - dead in its tracks. There'll be a dozen chains owning an average 50/60 stations each. Programming will homogenize. Twenty stations across the country will originate out of Toronto, Montreal, or Vancouver. There won't be any regional, let alone local, presence. U.S. satellite programming services will be everywhere: there'll be 600 plus jukeboxes. Cancon will go - after ownership controls - and we'll be back where we were on February 23, 1964.

The rumour may become fact!!

Every once in awhile, they (EC: **Who are "they"?**) talk about a very flamboyant, but not very well liked character coming back into the industry. Well, that rumour is going around again - so we can just wait and see!!

Now . . . that was a deal!!

CKIK-FM Calgary, the CHEZ-FM group station, was sold recently to Selkirk. That was a brilliantly negotiated deal, put together by Chuck Azzarello - one of the leading lights in the broadcast business.

The geese that killed the golden egg!

Further to what I wrote above, it's a good thing there are breweries to help support the tons of talent that will be available this summer and fall - in Toronto, and across Canada. Now, the concertgoers still have to come up with the bucks to see all these shows. How can they resist? But do they have the bucks left to spend in the record stores? I guess it's like too much of a good thing!! (EC: **Overkilling the goose!**) What do we do for an encore?

Who are those people . . . ??

Because someone asked recently, we dug up one of the rare photos of the RPM staff reunion, which was held in 1975. To those of you who were around in 1964

when it all began - some of the faces may be familiar. To those of you, who are recent arrivals to the industry and think it

Well, the promotion and sales better start quick . . . before the concert promoters get all the bread (EC: **See above!!**) Hot Cancon singles include Zappacosta's When I Fall In Love Again, Heaven In Your Eyes by Loverboy, She Trusted Me by Agent. Luba's Innocent (With An Explanation), Glass Tiger's Someday, Eye Eye's Ex-Ray Eyes, Who's Gonna Love You Tonight by David Foster and Triumph's Somebody's Out There, an extraordinary bunch of talent to lead us into the fall season. Foreign acts that will chalk up lots of chart action with their new singles are Mick Jagger (Ruthless People), Paul Simon (You Can Call Me Al), Billy Joel (A Matter Of Trust), Fabulous Thunderbirds (Wrap It Up), Alice Cooper (He's Back - The Man Behind The Mask). Now, if you stock these releases, you'll have your foot in the door and then you can get ready for the next bunch.

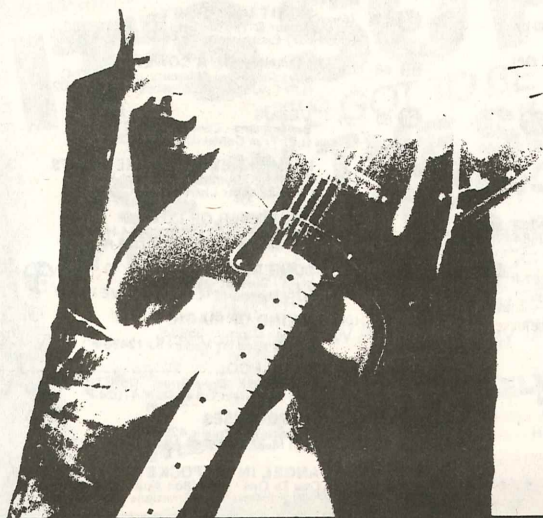

The media has had many people gazing at the night-time skies in the last few days, staring at the novelty of many shooting stars. You will have to excuse us here at RCA/Ariola if we have been somewhat unimpressed; the problem you see, is that we have been working with our own shooting stars.

And our shooting stars come in a variety of kinds. Most obvious to many within the industry has been the star performance of 2 of our biggest established artists - Daryl Hall and the Eurythmics. features the new 2 person version of the Thompson Twins; and then there is GTR, who released a second single from their almost gold debut album, the haunting power ballad, The Hunter. All stars, all shooting straight to the top.

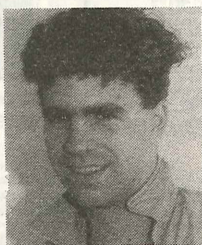
This year at RCA/Ariola we have also seen that rarest of delights for the astronomer, the birth of a star - not just one either, in fact, there have been several.

The Blow Monkeys, whose debut single Digging Your Scene is still climbing the charts at key stations across the country, has been one of the very special projects for us this year. Likewise, Bruce Hornsby and The Range. Although this record is just beginning to break through at radio and retail, it has been a favourite of key industry people across the country since its release. The overwhelming integrity and musicality of this album, The Way It Is, and of the single, Every Little Kiss, has truly made a star of Bruce Hornsby and The Range.

Although we can now safely say, a star is born, Whitney Houston is still shooting higher and higher. Thanks to everyone in this country, we have helped push Whitney past 700,000 units - and we are on our way to making her debut album the biggest debut in Canadian pop history. With her 3 Canadian dates later this month and a new album due by 1987, we can all be proud of her success.

Finally, 2 more stars on the horizon: soon you will have a chance to hear the new mix Someone Else's Shoes, M*U's follow-up single to Song In My Head, taken from the album, The World Is A Ball. It was remixed by Mark Gane and Martha Johnson, and the song is a hit - just watch their star rise.

Three Hearts is Hall's first solo LP in 9 years

While a new Arista album from Hall & Oates is not expected until next year, RCA will have the advantage of an album from one of the pair. Daryl Hall's first solo album in 9 years, Three Hearts In The Happy Ending Machine, is now being prepared for shipping.

Produced by Hall, David Stewart (Eurythmics), and Tom T. Bone Wolk (Hall & Oates bassist), the album was preceded by the single, Dreamtime, which picked up immediate adds across the country. The single is backed by a video directed by Matt Forrest, who has also done work for Grace Jones and Art Of Noise.

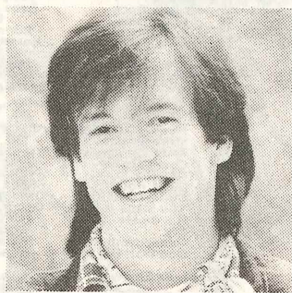
Hall's first solo album, Sacred Songs, described as "a more eclectic project", was issued in 1977 - and was not a commercial success.

CINARS '86 registration now open for artists

The International Performing Arts Conference (CINARS) has opened registration for its upcoming performing arts conference. The conference will take place in Montreal from Dec. 9 through 12 and will feature performances in dance, variety, serious music, and theatre for presentation to prospective buyers.

Alain Pare, CINARS General Manager, reports that "In 1984, out of the 275 groups that applied to perform in our showcase, we could only accommodate 40. This year, we're anticipating an even stronger response and the competition is going to be quite stiff." He continues with "The high level of interest is

understandable, since we're offering artists an opportunity to meet buyers from more than 20 countries."

It has also been reported that in the months following the first CINARS event in 1984, a number of groups and artists who had taken part in the showcases were contacted. It was found that in that first 6 month period, the spin-offs on the international level reached an estimated \$1,600,000 with a total of some \$3,200,000 projected over the 2 to 3 year period. The increase in the number of productions on a national scale has been estimated at 20 percent.

Among the artists and companies benefitting from CINARS 1984 were: Michel Lemieux of Montreal who has toured in Europe and once in Australia with his Solid Salad show; The Montreal-based Circus which has done a cross-Canada tour and will

CRTC jumps on CJUP over live broadcasting

The CRTC, in an Aug 1/86 telegram, sent to Sam Foldstad, President of City and Country Radio Ltd., has ordered the Langley, B.C. radio station to cease live broadcasting from a Vancouver studio. The telegram pointed out that "origination of programming on a regular basis from a studio in Vancouver is contrary to the CJUP licence."

That licence apparently states that programming would be received "from studios located in Langley, B.C." The Vancouver studio, at 203 East Pender Street in the Chinatown area, was reportedly broadcasting live programming in Cantonese for the Chinese-speaking residents of Vancouver.

The CRTC telegram further stated that "If CJUP wishes to continue to broadcast live from a studio in Vancouver, it must file an application and obtain commission approval to do so. In the meantime, the live broadcast of programming from a Vancouver studio must cease."

The station was given until Aug 15/86 to advise the Commission as to their course of action.

It has been pointed out to RPM that the only broadcaster in B.C., licenced by the CRTC to provide fulltime ethnic service is CJVB/1470 in Vancouver.

Country radio a priority for launch of Trucksave

Trucksave, an annual fuel-economy competition in which professional drivers match their skills against the best on the road, is sponsored jointly by the Ontario government's Ministry of Transportation and Communications and the Ministry of Energy. In view of the popularity of country radio stations with truck drivers, Economy Challenge 1986 hopes to harness the power of country stations in passing on Trucksave information to local truckers in promoting fuel economy.

There are 3 routes this year with the Northern Route a new addition. The Eastern Route takes in a stretch of Highway 401 from Bowmanville, beginning at the 5th Wheel Truck Stop (Exit 431), east to the Husky Truck Stop in Joyceville (Exit 632). Start times are 6 am - 11 am (Sept. 29, 30, Oct. 1), and 6 pm - 11 pm (Oct. 6, 7, 8, 9).

The Western Route stretches west on Highway 401 from Milton's 5th Wheel Truck Stop (Exit 320) to Chatham and the Bloomfield Road Truck Stop (Exit 81). Start times are 6 am - 11 am (Sept. 15, 16, 17, 18), and 6 pm - 11 pm (Sept. 22, 23, 24, 25).

The Northern Route covers Highway 11 from the New Liskeard Husky Truck Stop north to the Cochrane Husky Truck Stop. Start times are 6 am - 11 pm (Sept. 3, 4, 5), and 6 pm - 11 pm (Sept. 8, 9, 10).

There are several categories open, depending on the truck's weight, type and design. Winners are determined by measuring the amount of fuel used to run their vehicle between the 2 designated truck stops, taking into account the truck's exact weight and the distance travelled. Drivers must purchase fuel to top up their trucks at both starting and finishing truck stop checkpoints. An Economy Challenge coordinator will be at each location to collect the data for every run. Participants will receive free T-shirts and caps. Awards will be presented at the Awards Banquet to be held at the Airport Holiday Inn (Oct. 25/86).

Gold Medal & changes at CFNY

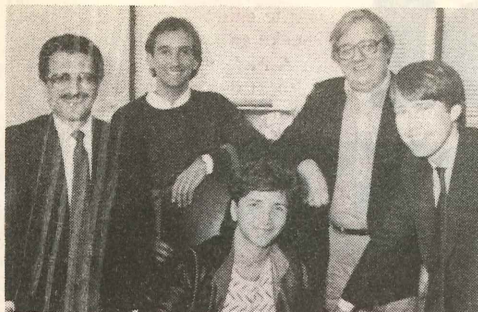

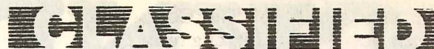
