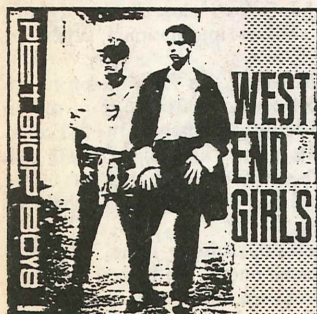

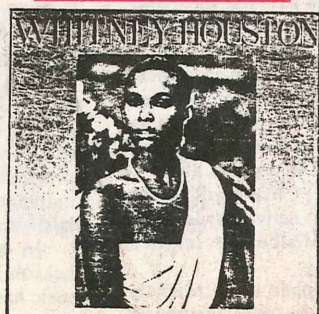

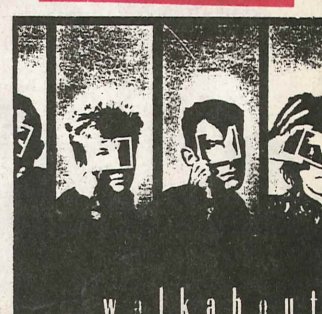

## Madame's is setting for important showcasing

Joe Guerrieri, one of Canada's newest and most aggressive entrepreneurs, hosted an important showcasing of artists and songwriters at Madame's, his Toronto (Mississauga) club (May 5). The special "extravaganza" evening was part of a series Guerrieri presents in his club on a monthly basis. However, with this artist/songwriter's showcase the goals are far more reaching.

Guerrieri has formed his own Unity label, and he has been working with Trevor Shelton and B.J. Cook in an effort to create a vehicle for new artists and songwriters, which led to this promotional launch at his packed club.

"I don't play a guitar or sing," says Guerrieri, "but I know business, and we're going to be active in the music industry. We're good at organizing people and events, and that's what I think is missing in the music business."

For the launch, Guerrieri brought in a 24-track mobile unit from Comfort Sound, and recorded 24 performances on 2" tape. The performances were filmed by 3 Betacon cameras. What Guerrieri has is enough for a live album plus material for a TV special or individual videos. The door is also open for the release of singles by the individual artists who showcased the 24 songs, 13 of which were original.

## Manta Sound enters digital recording field

"We now have the only completely digital studio in Canada," boasts Andy Hermant, President of Manta Sound Studio. Manta has just installed 2 new Mitsubishi 32-track digital recorders, and upgraded the remixing facilities with the purchase of 2 Mitsubishi X-86 2-track recorders. "The addition of these machines," continues Hermant, "means that all 3 of our studios are now capable of full 32-track recording."

The advantages of switching from 24-track analog to digital equipment, "can be found in the quality of the finished product," explains Hermant. There is no sonic deterioration from the constant playback when overdubbing or bouncing."

He continues with, "and no print-through from adjacent layers of tape - as was previously experienced with the analog machines."

Having eliminated the problems of tape noise and cross-talk between channels, as well

Michael Fonfara produced the session and also gave Cook an assist. Fonfara, who is currently with The Lincolns, was originally with Rhinoceros during the early '70s and has produced 3 of Lou Reed's albums.

"This was a great evening," said Guerrieri. "They were very interested people - and all of a very professional nature, which certainly confirmed my beliefs that what we were doing would be a tremendous asset to the Canadian music industry."

Marketing plans and release of product is now under discussion with an announcement to follow shortly.

## Platinum Blonde slated for heavy summer dates

Following the release of their 4th single, Hungry Eyes, from the quintuple platinum selling LP, Alien Shores, Platinum Blonde have been firmed to play 5 Western dates this July.

Being billed as the Summer of '86

as increasing the number of tracks by 8, "clearly brings the Canadian recording industry in line with international studio technology," Hermant maintains. "We now have the same capabilities as those studios found in either New York, Los Angeles or London."

Recently installed at Manta's control Room No. 1 is a Diskmix 2, which compliments the existing console's ability to log and edit mixes, and now controls all automated mixing data at a much faster rate.

"The Diskmix 2 allows updates throughout sections of music, without having to run the entire mix from the start or through to the end.

## Pepsi-Cola reunites with Michael Jackson

Colin Moore, Director of Marketing for Pepsi-Cola Canada, has announced that Pepsi-Cola will reunite with Michael Jackson in what Moore describes as "the most far-reaching sponsorship and advertising agreement ever made between a corporation and a performing artist." The long-term agreement calls for a worldwide collaboration between Jackson and Pepsi-Cola with Jackson helping to create and appearing in Pepsi advertising in Canada and the U.S. as well as abroad. "In return," says Moore, "Pepsi will put its global resources behind activities Jackson undertakes after his new album is released this fall."

Moore goes on to explain that "Michael Jackson will apparently be releasing music unlike anything he has ever recorded before. In addition, he will be sporting an updated image and a new persona to carry his trend-

## Collins' Jacket LP scores diamond sales in Canada

No Jacket Required by Phil Collins has topped the one million sales mark in Canada. Says WEA's Vice President of Sales, Garry Newman, "It was like magic. No sooner did the album top the million mark, when we ran into a back order situation. We are experiencing sales once again reminiscent of the release of the album, almost 14 months ago. We should make this one 1.2 in a very few weeks."

The Jacket album first entered the RPM 100 with a bullet at No. 52 (Mar. 2/85) and continued to make gains up the chart to the No. 2 position (June 8/86) where it remained for 7 weeks, unable to dethrone the Tears For Fears album, Songs From The Big Chair, which was finally overtaken by Corey Hart's Boy In The Box.

The Collins album remained in the Top 10 for several weeks and as of this week has enjoyed 62 weeks of chart action.

Special Event Tour, the Blondes have been slated to play Saskatoon (July 5), The Calgary Stampede (12), Expo '86 (14&15), Lloydminster Exhibition (17), and Edmonton's Klondike Days (18).

A CBS press memo points out that "South of the border, what started out as isolated flames of excitement is rapidly spreading to a wildfire of press, TV and sold-out concert dates."

## Paylo release for new Cliff Roberts' single

Cliff Roberts, the founding member of Blue Rhythm and Changes, is on release with Computer Machine on the Paylo label. Paylo is distributed by Comstock Records of Shawnee, Kansas.

Roberts, originally from the Barbados, now makes Canada his home. The single was recorded at Round Sound Studios in Weston, Ont. and carries a full MAPL logo.

setting ways into the latter part of the 1980s."

Moore points out that "Today's announcement (May 6/86) marks the beginning of the second alliance between Pepsi and Jackson, and follows close behind Pepsi's launch of another international superstar, Tina Turner."

The agreement calls for Jackson to appear in Pepsi commercials in 1987 - one in Spanish - to be aired in many of the 148 countries in which Pepsi is available. He will also contribute 2 pieces of original music to the campaign and may direct one of the commercials.

In conclusion, Moore notes, "In 1984 Jackson became one of the biggest successes music has ever seen. His ability to set tomorrow's trends, to introduce the unexpected, the bold and the new, makes Michael Jackson one of the world's most exciting entertainers."

## M+M - combining swing and funk

Over a year in the making, the Toronto duo of M+M are on release with their latest album titled *The World Is A Ball*. "Finally we're going to get some reaction to what we've been doing for the past 2 years," is the comment from vocalist Martha Johnson.

Song In My Head, the first single taken, is currently bulleting up the RPM 100 singles chart. Johnson points out that their album "has so many sides to it," and that she (and her songwriting partner Mark Gane) are often frustrated "because so much focus is always put on whatever single is put out and that's all so many people get to hear."

Johnson continues with "People really don't get to hear your music, and there are so few radio stations that play anything but the singles. Again - our music has so many sides to it - and so many influences and deals with so many different subject matters, lyrically, that we always feel it is frustrating and a shame that more people don't get to hear it."

For the first time, the band didn't employ the production expertise of longtime associate Dan Lanois, who produced their previous albums, including *Martha & The Muffins*. David Lord, known primarily for his work with Peter Gabriel, is credited with co-producing this album.

"We were quite close friends with Danny (Lanois)," confides Johnson, "and didn't develop quite the same relationship with David . . . it was a friendly working relation-

## Waves surpassing gold doesn't surprise Rew

"Canada is the country where we are most popular," declares Kimberby Rew, lead guitarist for Attic's *Katrina And The Waves*. A popularity that was spawned 4 albums ago, but didn't surface until the remix of *Walking On Sunshine* was released last year.

Their latest LP, *Waves*, is currently bulleting up the charts, yet Rew admits "this album is not doing as well as the first."

Following a cross-Canada tour in 1984 they were signed to Capitol worldwide, (except Canada), out of which came the *Sunshine* LP as *Katrina's* "first."

As he spoke from England, Rew relates, "We're hoping for a moderate hit here, but we haven't really toured anything like we have in Canada." The band has since been slated for a European tour.

Rew continues with, "Here, in England, you don't really have that huge circuit of bars and clubs that you can work your way around - just playing basic rock 'n' roll - and expect to be accepted by the kids the way you can in Canada.

"In Canada," he explains, "there is always room for a new rock 'n' roll band to come along that can put out that basic energy. In England, it's pretty much a case of being in style and having the right clothes than the right song.

"Obviously," concludes Rew, "We're not like that - we are more of a traditional and basic rock 'n' roll band."

ship, but it really wasn't something that went any deeper than that.

"Sometimes, working with somebody where things aren't always rosy, can work very well," she adds, "because when a conflict does come up - musically - it goes one way or the other, rather than compromise and that can be very healthy for the music."

Johnson agrees that their writing style has changed over the years, and the "funk influences have been explored more on this record." As well, there is a combination of styles. "Those funk influences with swing," she explains, citing 2 tracks: *Watching The Boys Fall Down*, and *Only You*. "There is a swing flavour to those songs, and in some cases there is a mixture, which a friend coined as swunk."

Although the majority of recording was completed in Canada (Morin Heights, Hamilton and Toronto), the band spent 3 months recording at Lord's Crescent Studio in Bath, England.

"Over 3 months recording is quite a bit of time for us. We've never spent that amount of time before, but it's a much more common thing to happen in England. A lot of people will spend a month or 6 weeks just doing a single, so it was something we had to get used to."

The time spent in the U.K. was also used for writing lyrics. "We did finish a lot of the lyrics in Bath, and there was a bit of pressure that way. I really like writing lyrics when they happen all at once. But it doesn't always happen that way. Sometimes it takes quite a bit of slaving over - and I think a lot of that was done in England."

While in England, Johnson says the

songs were "fleshed out" as they went along. "It's become a new standard for us, rather than coming up with many, many different parts and knowing exactly the arrangement that you want - perhaps having it cluttered and then having to weed that stuff out.

"You start out very simply," she explains, "with just the bare bones of the songs, and add to them very carefully. When you know you've got what you need - then you stop."

## MCA launches new label - The Master Series

Designed to show "the diversity of music emanating from Nashville," MCA has announced the creation of their newest label, -The MCA Master Series.

The initial releases include instrumental selections, encompassing jazz, bluegrass, classical, and "several forms of what has become popularly known as new age music."

Jimmy Bowen, President of MCA Nashville, points out that "as Nashville becomes a full music centre, MCA will be there in whatever forms of music may come from this city."

He continues with "Until the formation of the Master Series, there was never a creative outlet designed specifically to document and preserve the more esoteric forms of music found here in Nashville."

He goes on to explain that "a phenomenal collection talent has been assembled on the first 7 albums, and in deference to and in respect of that talent, we have given each artist complete artistic control of their individual albums."

The first releases in the series are titles by Larry Carlton, John Jarvis, Jerry Douglas, Albert Lee, Edgar Meyer, Robert Greenridge, and Mike Utley.

## Numerous artists guest on new Box of Frogs album

CBS is readying the long-awaited new album from *Box Of Frogs*, titled *Strange Land*. The album from this British band is being released on the Epic label and is preceded by a radio only 12" of the rock classic *Heart Full Of Soul*. The commercial single for retail has not yet been decided.

The band is made up of the original 3-man rhythm section of The Yardbirds, one of the most influential and innovative bands in the history of rock music. The nucleus comprises bassist and producer Paul Samwell-Smith, rhythm guitarist Chris Dreja, and drummer (sometimes keyboardist) Jim McCarty. Added was singer John Fiddler.

Several well-known "friends of the band" guest on the session including Jimmy Page (Yardbirds, Led Zeppelin), Steve Hackett (Genesis), Rory Gallagher (Taste), Ian Dury (Blockheads), Graham Parker (Rumour), Roger Chapman (Family, Street-Walker), Max Middleton (Jeff Beck Group), Graham Gouldman (Wax, 10CC, Mindbenders), Dzal Martin, and John Knightsbridge.

All the material, with the exception of one track, was written by McCarty, Dreja, and Samwell-Smith, along with some co-writing by Fiddler.

## FM set to tour West in support of Con-Test

Following the recent MCA distribution agreement with FM, the Toronto band has announced tour dates for several Western cities.

As well as performances in Winnipeg (May 10), Brandon (12), Regina (13), Prince Albert (14), Saskatoon (15), Edmonton (16&17), and Calgary (19&22), the band will be scheduling press and publicity appearances.

FM is touring in support of their last album, *Con-Test*, and their latest single, *Why Don't You Take It*.

## GTR new on Arista an RCA priority project

Legendary U.K. guitarists, Steve Howe and Steve Hackett have joined to form GTR. They were signed to the Arista label this year by label president Clive Davis.

Howe (Yes and Asia) and Hackett (Genesis) were in Toronto recently, promoting their self-titled debut at the Copa. A video, titled *The Making Of GTR* was also premiered.

When *The Heart Rules* is the first single taken from the album, and is available to radio only on 12". The album was produced by Geoff Downes (Asia) at the Townhouse Studios in London.

The other members of the band are vocalist Max Bacon, bassist Phil Spalding (Mike Oldfield), and drummer Jonathan Mover (Marillion).

Early comparisons include the Jeff Beck/Jimmy Page edition of the Yardbirds and the Derek & The Dominoes union of Eric Clapton and Duane Allman.

## Q107 readies 8th annual Homegrown LP release

The winning entries for Q107's (Toronto) 8th annual Homegrown contest have been announced. However, the overall winner will not be known until next month when the final judging is conducted over 3 nights at The Copa.

Gary Slaight, Vice President and General Manager of Q107 reports that production of the Homegrown album has begun and will be available shortly.

Already guaranteed a track on the album are Everest, The Hush, Shattered Heart, Tabula Rasa, Bleeker Street, The Jitters, Redletter, Thief, China Blue, Simon Chase, Vienna and Diamond.

The winner will have a single distributed by MCA, produced at The Metalworks, as well as a video, \$12,000 worth of stage equipment and \$1,000 cash.

The Copa performances by the 3 winning bands will also be taped for airing on Q107. "All we can do is give them a shot," says Slaight, "Then it's up to the bands."

## New Hoskin single released by Creative

Following the release of her first 2 singles, *Come To Me Tonight*, and *Loving Memory*, New York singer Debbie Graham Hoskin is on release with *Cool Summer Nights*.

Now living in Belleville, Ont. Hoskin had Ken Post write her latest single and recording was completed at Toronto's Manta Sound with production chores shared by Ron Dann and Steve Graham. The single qualifies as 3-parts Cancon (MPL).

Graham, who is the label president notes, "We used a lot of Cancon talent on this record. Debbie's a true believer in Canadian music. That's why she moved here."

Session players include Barry Keane, Kim Brandt, Ray Parker, and Rick Whitelaw. Background vocals were supplied by Debbie Fleming and John Gillard.

## Idle Eyes at Expo with Loverboy Adams et al

Idle Eyes, the band that won a Most Promising Juno last year, much of this recognition through the release of *Tokyo Rose*, were part of the gala opening for Expo '86 in Vancouver (May 3). They shared the show, which will be broadcast on CBC-TV (May 19), with several big names in the recording business including Bryan Adams, Loverboy, Kenny Rogers, and Sheena Easton.

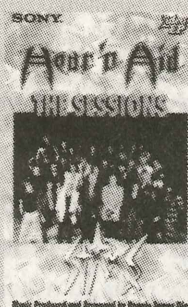

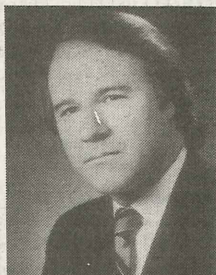

Platinum Blonde are superstars in Canada, and they make hit records. Glass Tiger are not yet superstars, but they certainly know how to make a first impression. Both point out the most serious problem affecting the Canadian music industry in the creation and maintenance of a Canadian star system.

No. 1 in Canada means you may have paid the bills. It's time that a collective effort

3) Why not use the Juno event to gain international attention? I'll bet many large and medium market U.S. stations would run Trip To The Junos contests, if they knew their winners and jocks could get to see and perhaps meet Bryan, Corey, Anne . . . et al and, of course, at the same time be introduced to the Canadian superstars they haven't heard from yet.

### Fringe raises profile with several new releases

The Toronto-based independent label, Fringe Product, have launched what they've described as their "most ambitious release schedule ever," with the issuing of 6 new albums, 4 of which are Cancon.

A Victoria quartet, Dayglow Abortions, makes a bid for the market with their self-produced new LP, Feed U.S.A. Fetus. The album was recorded at Legacy Studios. The band, who recently acquired a bus from a bible college, will be touring across Canada.

A Texas group, Dirty Rotten Imbeciles, referred to as D.R.I., make their presence known in Canada with their second LP, titled Dealing With It. Dan Yeane, who also did work on ZZ Top's Eliminator LP, looked after engineering of the session. This package

The Inn On The Park's Park Ballroom was packed with the creme de la creme of Canada's country music industry, including artists, musicians, managers, producers, and major record executives and small independent label owners, as well as on-air personalities and music directors from country radio stations. They had gathered in this plush setting (May 4) to honour "the best in Canadian country music."

Not only did the night run like "clock work", it was in fact "a prestigious event for the Canadian country music industry people to get together and relax", as Big Country Awards co-founder Stan Klees explained. There was no entertainment, which seemed to please many in the audience. They were there to pay tribute to the winners, and not listen to a showcasing of artists. It was because of Klees that this evening was a memorable and prestigious event, and not just another variety awards show.

Dining in the company of such notable performers as Carroll Baker, Gilles Godard, Murray McLauchlan, The Stoker Bros, Audie Henry, Jules, Anne Lord, The Mercey Brothers, Robbie MacNeil, Kevin Simpson and The Haggertys, to name just a few, made the evening one of the better events in country music.

The audience was peppered with those people from behind the scene: marketing, sales and promotion - record company executives, RCA's Don Kollar and Tim Williams, Don Oates, Dave Platel and Charlie Camilleri from CBS, True North's Bernie Finkelstein, WEA's Stan Kulin, MCA's Ross Reynolds and Graham Powers, as well as Chris Hughes (Albert Hall), Steve Thomson of Backstage Productions, who introduced his new country artist, Lilian, Jack Feeney, the new director of ACME, and David Peever, who heads up his own talent agency. The list of record industry people just went on and on, far too many to name here. However, it was nice to see the representatives from radio stations: Ernie Steeves and Cliff Dumas from CHAM Radio in Hamilton, CFGM's Gary O'Brien and Vic Follitt from CKGL-FM in Kitchener.

RPM publisher Walt Grealis opened the evening with "We have gathered in this room tonight, the cream of Canadian country music. Look around and you'll come face to face with someone you've seen on television or heard on the radio."

Grealis took his audience back in time to the early beginning of Big Country, the early winners and the cities the show played to as Big Country went on the road. "We are dedicated to creating a star system in Canadian country music and the best way we can do that is by continuing to recognize Canadian country artists and their achievements on a year-to-year basis."

The presenters of the Big Country Awards were as interesting as the winners. They included Gilles Godard, who was nominated in 2 categories this year; Cliff Dumas, on-air personality at CHAM Radio;

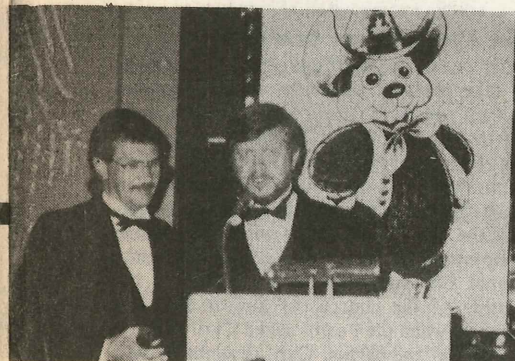

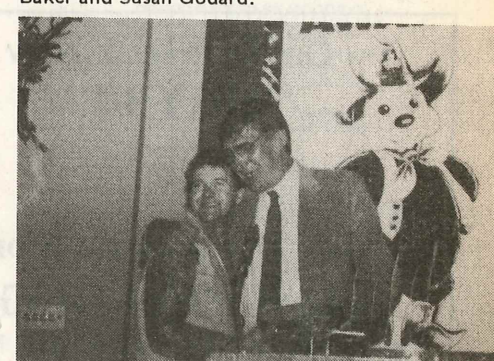

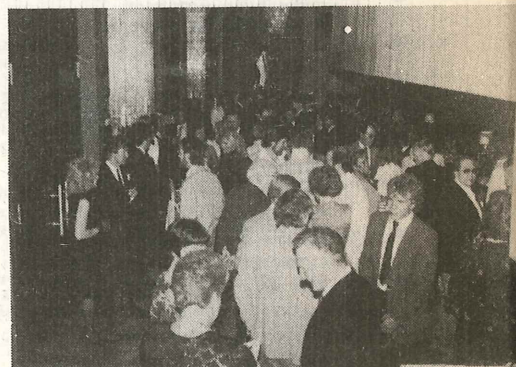

### Fence label reactivated for Hunt A/C release

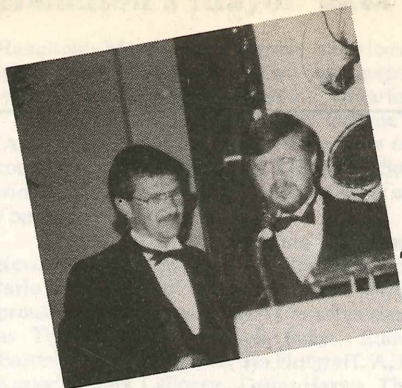

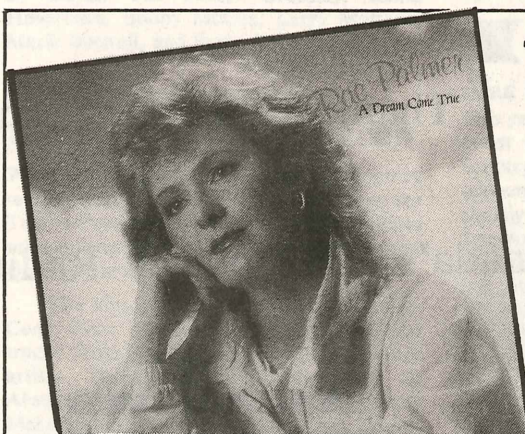
Hunt has been writing music for several years, but has concentrated for the most part on his modelling career.

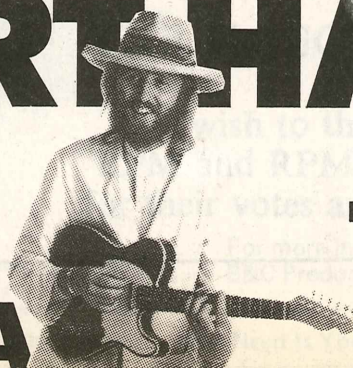

### Colleen Peterson is back

Colleen Peterson returns to the fold with a powerful, pure country outing titled *I Had It All*, released on the Nashville-based Cardinal label. The song was co-written by herself and Cyril Rawson. Although living in Nashville, she still tours Canada. She has also been gaining recognition in U.S. country circles having toured and recorded with Charlie Daniels, Waylon Jennings, and Roger Miller. The single was produced at Nashville's Chelsea Studio by Tony Miglori, Colleen and Cyril.

### 3rd single from Cole Younger LP

Dave Sturgeon, who writes the material for the Cole Younger Band, reports a 3rd single is now being readied from their *Heartbreak City* LP. The single, *Don't Grow Old Alone*, is the follow-up to *Dancin' In The Dark*. 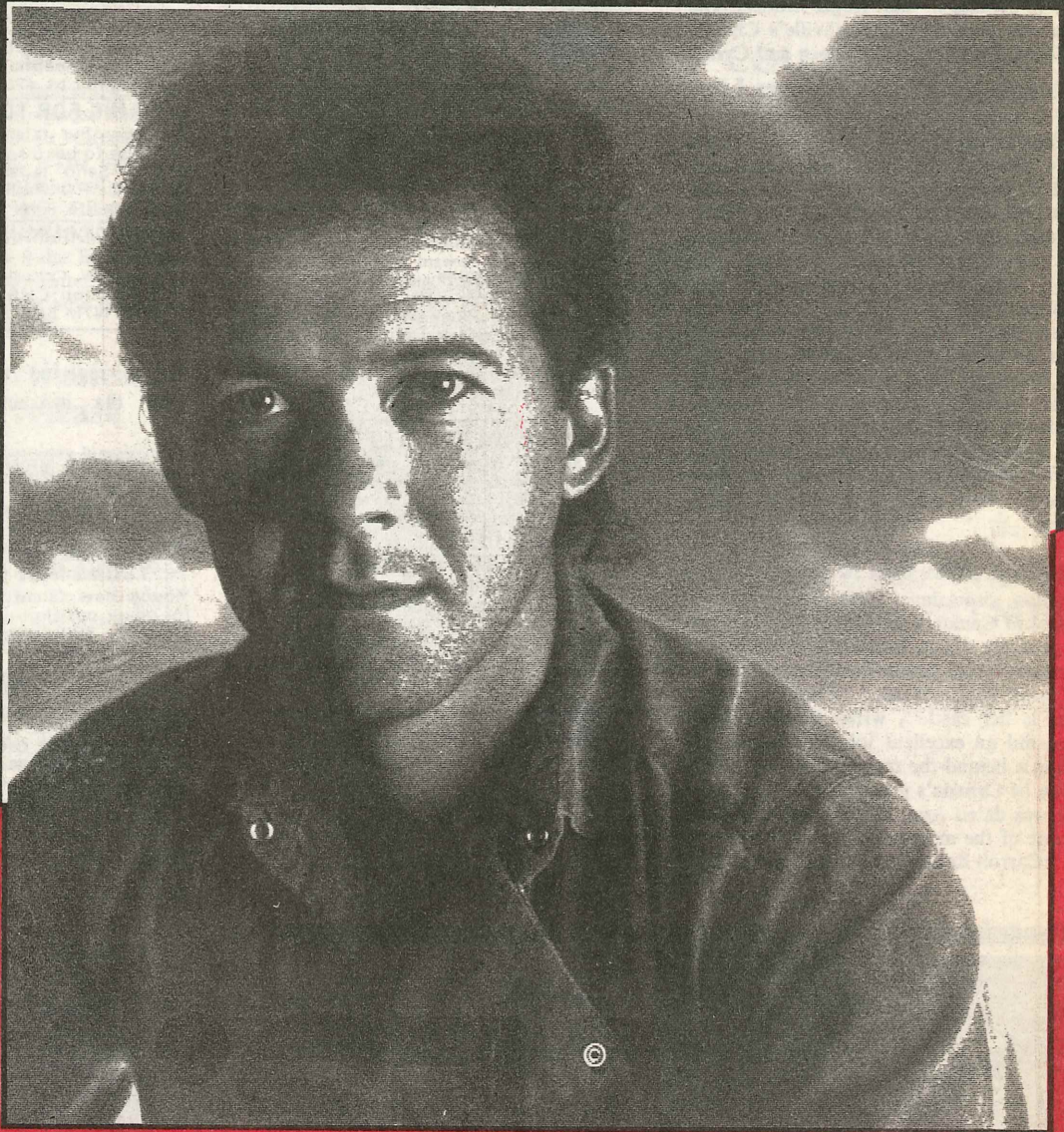
