CIRPA submits proposal to gain Ontario funding

The 150-strong Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA) has tabled a well-written and in-depth look at the music industry in Ontario, a report that was commissioned by the Ministry of Citizenship and Culture (The Honourable Lily Munro - Minister). The report was authored by Earl Rosen, Executive Director of CIRPA and owner of Marquis Records; J. Stephen Stohn, entertainment lawyer in the firm of McCarthy & McCarthy; Donna Murphy, Editor of the Canadian Record Catalogue and researcher with CIRPA; and Paul Castellarin, a research assistant with CIRPA.

The report recommends "initiatives to complement the federal program (a \$5-million a year grant recently authorized by the Department of Communications through their Sound Recording Development Program, awarded annually for the next 5 years), and capitalize on Ontario's unique role in the record industry." The report also recommends that "Ontario should emphasize programs which increase the strength of the marketing and distribution of Canadian records, thus ensuring that audiences have access to Canadian music and that Canadian record companies can strengthen their economic base."

CIRPA is asking the Ontario government for \$2.8 million in annual grants over the next 5 years, which is broken down as follows:

\$1.5 million to promote domestic

Toronto's CHFI rolling with new \$250,000 sound

"It took 6 months and cost \$250,000, but Oh! ... it sound so good," says Judy Burrell, Promotions Manager for Toronto's CHFI FM. Burrell is referring to the station's new state-of-the-art broadcast studio, which went to air at 7 pm (Feb. 9) when on-air personality Lori Grant pressed the button.

The construction of the new studio began last August "after it became apparent that our old studio couldn't maintain CHFI's technical excellence much longer," explains Burrell, continuing with "The decision was made to build a new master control, update the newsroom and, because it got caught in the middle, the lobby has a new look as well."

Architect Glenn Piotroski and acoustic consultant Neil Muncy designed a studio described as "unique in Canada," being the first radio broadcast studio to combine L.E.D.E. (Live End, Dead End) acoustic design with R.P.G. panels, creating "an optimum listening environment."

The studio is equipped with a McCurdy console, 2 Technics turntables, and 2 Studer reel-to-reel machines. Also added were 3 Studer compact disc players. Says Burrell, "CHFI has led the pack in introducing listeners to the concept of CDs, and we've built up a reputation in that area. Currently, over 50 percent of our music is on CD, and that will increase with availability."

Burrell concludes with, "We believe the entire project reinforces CHFI FM98's commitment to provide our listeners with the best sound possible."

marketing efforts of Ontario-based record companies and music publishers (retail campaigns, tour support, consumer and trade advertising campaigns, market research)

\$500,000 for international marketing efforts, trade shows, tour support, and promotional trips of Ontario-based record labels and music publishers;

\$300,000 to FACTOR/CTL for use in the production of specialized records;

\$200,000 to music trade associations for use in research, training seminars, and skills upgrading;

\$300,000 for research studies on the Canadian and worldwide record industry.

The report also asks that a loan program for long-term financing be provided for Ontario record distribution companies.

There is also a recommendation that the Ontario government should press the federal government on several matters including the introduction of copyright legislation that will increase the penalties for record piracy and protect copyrights; and the support of a federal levy on blank tape and home recording equipment, to discourage home taping and to compensate performers and record companies for lost sales attributed to home taping.

It was also recommended that the existing exemption from the 10 percent Ontario sales tax on tickets of concerts featuring Canadian performers should be continued, and that concert promoters, promoting non-Canadian headline acts, should be able to deduct a substantial portion of the fees paid to Canadian opening acts from the Ontario sales tax payable.

All configuration release for Rock And Hyde

Capitol held a listening session at Toronto's Sounds Interchange (Feb. 17), to launch the release of Rock And Hyde's new LP, *Under The Volcano*. This was a rare, if not first time event, with album, cassette and CD configurations available for the session. The CD product was supplied by Praxis Technologies of Toronto, making *Under The Volcano*, an all-Canadian product.

Sounds Interchange was packed with retail, radio, and specialized press people, as well as a large contingent from the label itself. MuchMusic, as always, was on hand to tape the proceedings, another event "not important enough" for CBC and CTV to cover.

Needless to say, the consensus of opinion would indicate that Capitol has another hit act, to join their already impressive Canon roster.

As well as playing several tracks from the Rock And Hyde album, including their current single, *Dirty Water*, a rough cut of the *Dirty Water* video was shown.

The single apparently caught several programmers off guard, many of whom were quick to recognize its potential with immediate chart adds.

Springsteen set "not over yet" - says CBS' Oates

Checking the industry on sell-through of popular product from the December sales bonanza, it was

revealed that contrary to rumour, the Bruce Springsteen 5-record set, was still selling well. "It's a perception situation we're dealing with," explains Don Oates, Vice President Sales & Marketing for CBS. "We asked some dealers how the box set was selling and a few answered, 'it's not doing very well'. We discovered that several were selling 5 or more each week. Well, if you sell 5 a week and convert that to being a 5-record set with 4 times the price, that's like moving a minimum of 20 to 25 records of something else. When this was explained to the dealers, they agreed and suddenly realized the set wasn't doing so badly after all."

Oates continues with "Springsteen is far from over, and *Fire*, the new single is being actively added at radio stations across the country."

On another subject, Oates was asked about the state of returns, being as this is the period for this type activity. "As far as returns are concerned, we're seeing an increase," Oates answers, "but not an increase over last year at this point in time. This is just a heavy return period - just like in the fall, when we see increased sales from the summer, which you expect because the fall is the heaviest sales period."

Oates went on to point out that "The accounts we've spoken to and processed returns for, aren't indicating any heavier return than last year. In fact, the control system in place in the organization, will allow for reduced returns year after year." He concludes with "No specific album stands out, for sure, and the overall return is well within line for this time of year."

SCI to address problems facing new recording acts

Gary Moffet, former member of April Wine, has teamed with respected producer Gary Szawlowski to head SCI Productions. Apart from producing albums for various labels acts last year, the company offers a comprehensive and "economical" recording package for new Canadian talent faced with the problem of limited funding.

"We've been able to present very economical budgets," Moffet begins, "where they can actually come to Montreal and get the job done cheaper than it would be in their own hometown." SCI has invested in midi systems, digital drum computers and digital processing equipment, which makes their low-rate studios competitive.

"It makes those studios into, in our estimation, competitive with the kind of thing that's going on in radio today," continues Moffet. "We're able to deliver those kinds of quality to artists who have limited funding."

Georgia Satellites biggest hit for WEA on coast

Georgia Satellites is WEA's biggest seller on the West Coast, reports Branch Manager Randy Stark. "It's all over radio," he boasts. "CKLG jumped on it very early, and it just ran up the chart."

Another big seller is Los Lobos, but radio support isn't credited with the success of this album. "Retail is hot with Los Lobos," Stark points out, "and that's mainly through word-of-mouth. Release ads had a lot to do its popularity as well, and the sell-through has been exceptional."

Stark and his promotion/sales team are now gearing up for dates by several acts over the next couple of months. Included are The Pretenders, who are playing Vancouver Mar. 5, and Wang Chung, who are in on the 8th. Album product is top priority at the WEA branch for these two acts, "and they're both doing quite well," he says.

As far as "down-the-road product," Stark is looking for big things to happen with the k.d. lang release. "This one should be a monster," says Stark. "We're already experiencing good response on pre-orders, so it should be a powerhouse crossover album."

Also high on Stark's prediction list is Simply Red's new album. "A lot of people have been waiting a long time for this one," says Stark . . . and an album that will really be a blockbuster is the Trio LP from Dolly Parton, Linda Ronstadt and Emmylou Harris . . . and I mean blockbuster."

For the independent bands, SCI offers cost efficient production, as well as counselling, before delivering a record-ready master. "We have seen a hundred thousand different ways that money was spent improperly," Moffet explains, "or that money was spent excessively . . . or where money was wasted. You learn by all those things and how you can cut down, and how you can be more efficient. I'd say if there was one word that would sum it up, it would probably be homework."

Moffet and Szawlowski cut down the number of hours spent in the studio by completing pre-production at home, on their computer-based systems. "It's not really a novel idea," answers Moffet. "I would say however, that it is the trend in the future. The technology of the new equipment tends to be going in that direction, where you can do a lot of the work at home."

"We provide them with a way of being heard and heard in the best possible light. And, as far as we're concerned, this is the best possible direction for our company because we will actually be developing our artists for the future, rather than trying to find new artists, who are already established."

"It's just knowing how to spend your money properly," he concludes. "There's a

lot of talent out there not knowing what to do, or how to approach a record company. We try to help by giving them advice on how to make contacts and how to get their product into the right hands."

Good sell-through for Capitol on West Coast

"The first few weeks of this year have been very good for us," says Capitol's Western Region Branch Manager, Brad Morrissey. "The sell-through has been better than we had expected, and we are currently hot with Robbie Nevil and Glass Tiger."

As Morrissey points out, the big news for the label in Vancouver is the release of the Beatles on CD. "There has been excellent response at retail on this release," says Morrissey.

He does point out however, there have been a few complaints that retail is soft on the West Coast, "but we certainly haven't experienced any downward shift," he continues. "The overall picture looks good here. Radio is very responsive. It's come around quite nicely."

As far as future product is concerned. "No predictions," says Morrissey, "It's all going to sell. We have a lot of hot product on the market, and more on the way."

MCA adapts to challenge facing emerging talent

"There aren't a lot of retailers out there who sell records to develop an artist," maintains Stephen Tennant, MCA's Director of Marketing. "They want a story, and that's our job." The task of breaking new artists, and their art, doesn't fall on the shoulders of radio or retail, it's the solid responsibility of each record label.

"Some stations have gone gold or tightened up their formats however, there are some in radio who still give acts a shot," he continues. "I think retail inventories are very much like radio programmes today . . . there's very limited space. And retail is just as tight as radio."

Bands that are victims of this type of situation include Karl Wallinger's World Party, and the U.K.'s Housemartins. Steve Earle and Alice Cooper have provided "surprises" for Tennant, both now approaching the gold

plateau, with neither having the support of commercial radio.

After establishing a base at AOR since its release late last year, MCA have recently shipped the single, Ship Of Fools, from the World Party album Private Revolution. "It's starting to get AOR numbers based on sales, based on airplay," says Tennant. "They're finally realizing it's a great song, and they're making it fit and it's performing. It's getting great phone calls right across North America."

"That's ammunition for retailers to realize this could be a seller for them, and that's really what they're concerned about when it comes right down to it. How many records are they going to sell?"

The story is quite different for the Hull-based Housemartins, who have had no commercial airplay either. However, "with basically just college airplay, word-of-mouth and retail support," the album has sold in excess of 11,000 copies already," Tennant explains.

The band's first domestically-released single, Happy Hour (U.K. No. 3), is now being serviced to radio and the clubs. "It's a project - unlike World Party - that has no airplay and it's selling. It's just a real good record. A clean pop record that's platinum in the U.K." he adds.

Steve Earle's Guitar Town, released last March, has started to cross over from country to the CHR charts. For what Tennant terms a "hip retail record. It's taken a year, but 50,000 records is a lot of money."

Finally, "with absolutely no airplay," Alice Cooper's Constrictor album is selling so well, Tennant hopes to present gold to the veteran rocker before his Toronto Maple Leaf Gardens' date, which has been switched from a concert bowl to a full Gardens show.

Disque Americ opened many doors at MIDEM

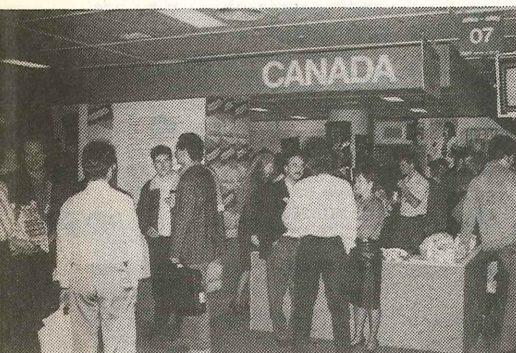
With their compact disc manufacturing facilities located in Drummondville, Quebec, Disque Americ's first trip to MIDEM was "extremely beneficial," says Andy Nagy, Vice President of Marketing.

"Moreso . . . from the standpoint that our product was analyzed," continues Nagy, "and from that quality standpoint, we got a very good rating from our foreign competitors."

Disque Americ will now be supplying quotes to various independent labels as a result of their participation at MIDEM because of the U.S. control of manufacturing plants by the majors.

"Many of the majors have their own CD manufacturing facilities and, in other cases, they are still dominating the few CD plants that are available in America," Nagy continues, "therefore, the independents certainly appear to be looking for additional sources outside the U.S."

For Nagy, it was actually his 17th appearance at MIDEM and plans are already underway to attend again next year. "Absolutely," says Nagy, "It was so very effective for us. It gave us a tremendous amount of exposure and visibility, and I don't believe there's any other way we could have gotten that much exposure, visibility and attention as we did in that one particular location."

Juno CD distributed by CARAS at MIDEM

An attractive compact disc package, featuring the songs of this past year's Juno winners, was distributed to international attendees at MIDEM '87. Also listed on the insert card were the nominees, which CARAS Executive Director Daisy Falle, "gives a general idea of the scope of our industry."

The CD's were manufactured by Quebec's Americ Disc and are a continuation of Radio Canada's efforts, who, over the past few years, have distributed a compilation of previous Juno winners to their international affiliates.

"We were approached by Americ Disc, who wanted to do this promotion at their MIDEM booth," Falle explains. "as a sample of what they can do and, of course, increase the profile of our winners."

Following collection of the masters and publishing, permission was granted to produce 2,500 of the CD's, 600 of which went to MIDEM.

Philips & Sony heating up CD market with CDV

At the recent MIDEM conference, PolyGram created a great deal of interest with a private showing of their Compact Disc Video, which will be marketed jointly by NV Philips of the Netherlands and Sony Corp of Japan. The lid is being kept on the new technology until next fall.

Singles reportedly carry 6 minutes of video and 20 minutes of music, and are expected to retail in the U.S. for \$7.50

\$350,000 in studio time offered for Rocksearch

One of the richest prizes ever offered in studio time is in the offing for the winner of the first national rock music competition flying the banner of Rocksearch. Bob Moriano, who is organizing the 4-day event, to be held at Montreal's Velodrome (Apr. 8 through 11), reports "exceptional support from radio and the performing rights organizations, as well as local television. Hopefully there will be national television coverage as well."

With Trebas Institute putting up a bank of studio time worth \$350,000, Moriano sees Rocksearch as "the start of a good support system for people like FACTOR and CIRPA for all the different homegrown acts available on a national scale."

A pre-selection board of adjudicators will select 12 rock acts from across Canada, and the last day (11), 3 semi-finalists will compete for the grand prize. A \$25.00 entry fee (money order) which is non-refundable must be submitted with the act's demo, which must comprise only 2 selections, written for or by the act. If there is a video available, this can also be submitted, but it is not necessary.

Moriano is calling a press conference in Montreal on Feb. 26, at which time more information on Rocksearch will be made available.

Publishers not impressed with this year's MIDEM

"I thought it was a lot slower than last year," points out Wayne Patton, Senior Director of SBK Entertainment World Canada, when asked about this year's MIDEM. "I went for the creative meetings with the other Directors of SBK. I did find however, that the Palais certainly had less people than in previous years."

Ron Solleveld, a Director for RCA/Ariola International, says that "certain things were achieved," but mainly it was "an opportunity to get together with our new international team."

RCA/Ariola recently became a part of Germany's Bertelsman Corporation. Solleveld does point out however, "a lot of product" exchanged hands. In particular, he mentions, "It looks very good for (country act) Kelita, and we managed to place a few copyrights for several of our writers."

Although both Patton and Solleveld suggest the annual trip "is useful," they were critical of the increased cost doing business in Cannes. "It's getting ridiculously expensive," adds Solleveld. "The last couple of years, prices have skyrocketed. Can you believe \$75.00 for a cab ride from the airport . . . and \$5.00 for a perrier . . . and \$10.00 for a beer?"

COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Veronique Beliveau puts talent upfront - nationally**

With the release of Veronique Beliveau's new album next month, which has been preceded by the single, *Make A Move On Me*, the bona-fide Quebec superstar will finally have a chance to prove to the rest of Canada what her fellow provincial natives have known for the past ten years.

The singer, or "interpreter" as she prefers, has released four records already (two for RCA and two for A&M), but none in English so far.

"When I signed with A&M," Beliveau explains, "I was hoping to do something in English in the near future. Because, with the fact that I was changing my style of music, I was also in direct competition with what's happening in English all over the world."

"What sells in Quebec for pop-rock is what sells all over the world. It's always better if you sing for the biggest public you can, so I always wanted to do something in English. Now," she continues, "it's happening and I'm very happy. Also, for the past two years there's been a demand for me in English Canada."

The demand began when Beliveau sang at the 1984 Juno Awards ceremony. From there she was invited to participate in the recording of *Tears Are Not Enough*, the only female Quebec singer to be featured. Last year, at Expo's opening gala, Beliveau performed much to the delight of Prince Charles and Lady Diana, among others.

"The market in Quebec is so limited that you can have a big, big hit and have sold 25,000 albums. Maybe you can go to 80,000 records, but not very often," Beliveau advises. "One song may do that if it's a big general public hit, like a romantic French ballad."

However, the songstress has changed musical direction since the early recordings and although there are ballads on the new album, it's not where she claims she's heading.

"We want to go for young adults," Beliveau suggests, of her new direction. "From 20 to 40 years old, and younger, if

they go for the dance songs. But it's not like Corey Hart heading for the young girls, of course. I think it'll go for young adults because that's the style of music it is."

Her forthcoming album was produced by John Dexter, who wrote *Loverboy's* *Heaven In Your Eyes*, and features songwriters J.C. Crowley, Eddie Schwartz, and Dave Tyson, as well as Dexter. Studios were used in Vancouver, Los Angeles and Toronto. "I was in the studio . . . 12, maybe 14 hours a day," she continues. "We were just working, working, working . . . but the musicians who came to play just loved the songs."

"The ballads are really, really nice. They are kind of rocky," she adds. "They have

RECORDS TO RADIO - by Igor Zaitsev (Moscow)**Russia warming to rock composers and musicians**

Moscow's rock composers and musicians now have their own association called The Rock Club. The inaugural meeting was held in late January.

Just a year or two ago, rock musicians here met with indifference and even hostility, from some of those in charge of cultural affairs, organization of concerts, recording and provision of instruments. The following word from a song by Viktor Tsoi, leader of Leningrad's Cinema rock group, reflects the sentiments of many rockers in that period: "Our hearts long for change, our eyes long for change."

Today, rock groups, formerly known mostly through semi-amateur tape recordings called underground rock in the West, have been given a big break. They have even been appearing regularly on national TV.

Since autumn 1985, The Rock Laboratory (an association of amateur rock musicians), has been functioning in Moscow (the Western press christened it The Rock Club). Amateur rock musicians now have the opportunity to perform in front of large audiences, on radio and TV, and cut LPs. Unlike professionals, who get salaries from concert organizers, they are paid only for each performance. Some of the best amateur groups have decided to turn professional.

The situation of professional rock musicians has also seen a change for the better, but there are still problems. For instance, they are paid less than "serious" musicians, or those in pop or folk.

The Rock Club, which has won the support of the Russian federation's ministry of culture, will handle those matters. Veteran Soviet rock composer and singer, Alexander Gradski, 37, is its elected board chairman. This is not just another rock club like those established earlier in 13 Soviet cities. It has its own rules and programme.

The board members include leaders of the most popular groups, such as Andrei Makarevich (Time Machine) and Alexander Sitkovetski (his group Autograph, which is into progressive rock, took part in Live Aid, and is currently touring Canada), Artem

guitar solos and all that, but they're going to reach a much larger audience."

Beliveau's classical piano training at boarding school, many years ago, no longer counts, when asked whether she could play any musical instrument. "I have knowledge of music, but I don't write," she confides. "I love singing and dancing, that's what I prefer to do."

Having now performed professionally for over 14 years, Beliveau believes the North American market will embrace her music, hopefully. "We decided to go for that market because my sound was more North American than European. As for French artists going over there . . . it's different . . . it's another approach to your career, but that's something I'm also interested in. For the moment," she concludes, "we want to go for the North American market . . . that is our main focus."

Troitski, a music critic, Matvei Anichkin, producer of the hard rock group Cruise (Troitski and Anichkin were initiators of the Account 904 Chernobyl benefit concert), as well as rock-poets and producers, and journalist Dmitri Shavyrin, rock-music commentator for *Moskovski Komsomlets* newspaper.

"Our purpose in organizing the club is to assert rock as a full-fledged trend in music," said Alexander Gradski. "The groups have better opportunities today, but some problems still persist. For instance, rock musicians' salaries are uniform and do not depend on popularity. Advertising needs considerable improvement and there is not a single periodical entirely devoted to rock music."

An expert council, including the more competent rock composers and performers will be established at the Club. Their judgement will be weighed heavily next to that of the expert councils already in existence in radio and TV, and the Melodia recording firm and concert organizations.

The establishment of the Rock Club was facilitated by the Moscow Gagarin district Komsomol local, which has also sponsored rock music festivals, such as the Rock-Panorama-86 last May involving many Soviet rock stars, and a rock-poetry festival last November. The local's first secretary, Pyotr Pavlov, believes that every trend in rock music must be promoted and that the time is ripe to put all forms of rock on the stage.

For a start, the Rock Club is going to hold a Rock-Panorama-87 festival from Apr. 23 through 29. It is to be an even bigger event than last year's Panorama. It will present every rock style, from rockabilly to heavy metal. Forty-nine groups have been invited, including Moscow professionals, Aria, Bravo, Quadro, Cruise, Rock Studio, Black Coffee and Computer, and amateurs S-Team, Mu Sounds and Nicolas Copernicus.

This year's Panorama will be the first

Corey Hart kicks off high-profile international tour

After nearly a year of keeping what is described as a "relatively low profile". Corey Hart kicked off his world tour (Feb. 21) at Italy's San Remo Music Festival. He shared the bill with Whitney Houston, Simply Red, Paul Simon, and Duran Duran to name just a few. This show also marked the debut of a new band line-up comprising drummer Jorn Anderson, keyboardist Ray Coburn (formerly of Honeymoon Suite), and returning band

members guitarist Michael Hehir, bassist Russell Boswell, and Andrew Hamilton on horns.

Following several European dates, Hart and the band will be playing a string of sellout dates in Japan, with Australia to follow before his extended tour of the U.S. and finally, Canada during the summer.

Hart's current single, Can't Help Falling In Love, is gold in Canada and new in the U.S. Top 30, and just released in the rest of the world. His next single, Dancing With My Mirror features his first ever dance mix for which a video has also been completed.

In view of Hart's recent heavy exposure on American television, there have been many questions asked regarding a possible film debut. Hart explained that he would rather make an announcement than speculate, but he admitted that he is "very interested" in some recent film offers.



WEA's Montreal Branch, CJAD and A&A Records recently ran a contest in support of Ben E. King's Stand By Me soundtrack and The Best Of Ben E. King. Contest winner Cynthia Philip and her fiancée had a night on the town and met the veteran artist. The soundtrack is now platinum and the single is gold, the latter after 25 years after its initial chart appearance. The single had a four week run at No. 1 on Toronto's CFTR.

Teenage Head planning release of new album

With production of Teenage Head's latest album, their 7th, completed, the band has scheduled the release of Dance With Your Doll for late March. A 12" single, titled Can't Stop Shakin', will precede the 11-track LP.

Featured on the single are 3 other tracks, 2 of which are not included on the album. Lead singer Dave Rave alludes the LP offers "something new for Teenage Head fans, as well as continuing the tradition of offering the best Teenage Head."

The "founding fathers" of the Canadian punk scene have now replaced Blair Martin with Jack Pedler on drums and are expected to embark on a national tour this spring.

Recording took place at Toronto's Kensington Sound studios, where Frantic City, the band's platinum album was recorded. Other tracks on the album include She Rips My Lips, Teenage Doll, and Little Girl Don't You Understand.

Hometown red carpet for Capitol's Glass Tiger

Glass Tiger had the red carpet rolled out for them (Feb. 18) when their hometown of Newmarket, Ontario presented band members Alan Frew, Wayne Parker, Sam Reid, Michael Hansen, and Al Connelly with special awards. The awards were presented to band by Newmarket's Mayor Ray Twinney at the town's annual civic awards dinner.

Glass Tiger follows up these honours by playing a benefit concert for Easter Seals at

the Newmarket Recreation Complex - a 3,500 seater that easily sold out.

The band, which won 4 Juno Awards last year and were nominated for a Grammy Award, have remained on the RPM 100 albums chart with The Thin Red Line for 51 weeks. They are currently represented on the RPM 100 singles chart with You're What I Look For, while the American trades are going with Some Day.

The Box hits the ice to shoot new video

The Box were part of a 3-day video shoot, for one of two videos for their upcoming single, Closer Together, which began Feb. 19 at Montreal's Forum. The shoot featured the Montreal Canadiens. The special video is being prepared in support of Leucan (Leukemia Canada), with members of The Box testing their skating and stick handling with the likes of Guy Carbonneau, Bob Gainey and Mats Naslund. The 20-min video will be sold across the country, with all proceeds being donated to Leukemia research. The video is expected to hit the market Mar. 20.

Alert's Lisa Zbitnew reports that the week of Mar. 20 will also see the release of The Box's actual music video, explaining, "This one will be shot in the Dominican Republic, Mar. 6 through 12, with airfare courtesy of a local Montreal travel agency."

Cray and Beck featured on Jagger's next solo LP

Mick Jagger's upcoming album, his second, will feature the guitar talents of Jeff Beck and Robert Cray. Production is currently underway at the Blue Wave Studios, with Dave Stewart at the helm.

Cult guitarist Billy Duffy was also asked

to provide guitar tracks for the session. "It turned out there was more involved in it than I had time to do," says Duffy, "but it was great to play with them. Not everyone gets the chance to play five songs with Mick Jagger and Jeff Beck."

Cray, upon completion of his support tour with Huey Lewis, has been asked to open for Eric Clapton's upcoming tour. Phil Collins, who produced Clapton's last two albums, will be the drummer on the tour.

The above announcement was made by Terry Carson, Ontario Branch Manager, to whom Dunning will report.

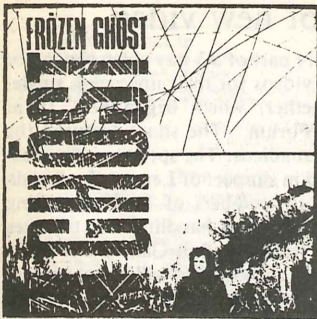
Immediate A/C adds for new Lightfoot single

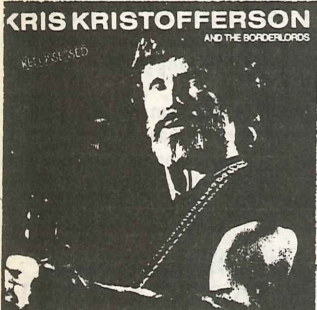
The flip, 'I'll Tag Along, was also produced by Lightfoot, who also wrote both sides.

Also key are They Killed Him, a profoundly simply but powerful message, as is What About Me, and Anthem '84. Should be a blockbuster.

There's more to country than foot-stompin, and hurtin', balladry songs, all of which K.D. Lang and The Reclines are about. However, this weirdly wonderful country bunch have done more than stretch the imagination. For one thing, they've got the WEA crew believing in country - her kind of country - so with that kind of power behind her... watch out. Produced by Dave Edmunds in the U.K. and the session people are something else, most notable

being B.J. Cole, the steelman on Diet Of Strange Places, and the banjo work by Keith Nelson on Turn Me Around, and High Time For A Detour. That's producer Edmunds doing a little guitar work on Tune Into My Wave. Rose Garden, penned by Joe South, a hit more than a few years ago, has been taken as the first single, and a perfect vehicle to ease K.D. into the mainstream of country, not to mention the A/C market. 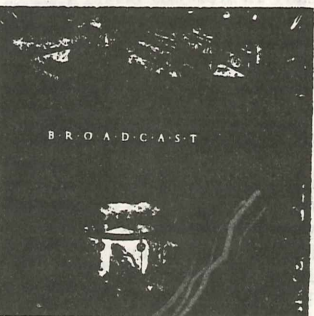

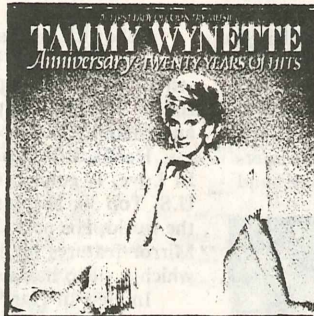

THE ALAN PARSONS PROJECT - Pop/Rock

Since Tales Of Mystery And Imagination, Alan Parsons has released consistently good records. This one however, seems destined to album collectors favourite for some time to come. There are still a lot of Parsons fans out there to start the buzz, especially with the new legions of CD buyers looking for technologically compatible product, who should find this album to be a must-have item. Standing On Higher Ground released as a single, which should provide further buying impetus.

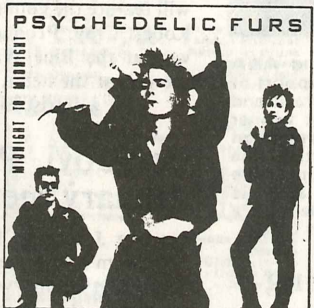


CUTTING CREW - Pop/Rock

PSYCHEDELIC FURS - Pop/Rock
Midnight To Midnight - Columbia - FC-40466-H
An album that strives to match the Pretty In Pink success but unfortunately falls short. Although produced by hard rock veteran Chris Kimsey, this set lacks the punch and abrasiveness found on previous albums. Canadian following apparent with Mirror Moves LP going gold, the only territory worldwide to do so. Title track most promising. Also key are: Shock, and One More Word.

DON DIXON - Pop/Rock
Most Of The Girls... - Enigma - ST-73239-F
A springy album with an abundance of potential, previously only available on import. Could prove to be quite a pleasant surprise for newly opened Toronto office. The infectious lead track, Praying Mantis, doesn't exactly have MOR lyrical content, but taken within the confines of a pop song, looks like it could do very well. Careful instrumentation and clean arrangements will certainly pave the way for the renowned producer to be noticed as a recording artist in his own right. This is the fourth album release for The Judds on RCA, and, like the others, was produced by Brent Maher. Currently moving up the RPM

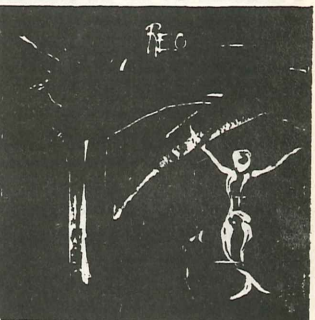

Not entirely in the country vein, but Gordon Lightfoot's latest single, *East Of Midnight*, the title track of his album, will no doubt catch country programmer action.

Country acts in for Fair meet

The annual Ontario Fall Fair Convention was held at Toronto's Royal York Hotel, the

week of Feb. 16. Several top Cancon country acts were seen doing business at the well-attended and important convention. These included Ronnie Prophet and The Mercey Brothers. The latter attend the convention every year and have become popular with the Fall Fair buyers.

A cute Valentine from Stoker Bros

Displaying excellent marketing expertise, The Stoker Brothers, now releasing on the RCA label, took advantage of Valentine's Day (Feb. 14), and shipped their newest single in a cute heartshaped Valentine's card. The title of the single, *Listen To My Heart*, is displayed on the front of the card, and the gatefold opens to display the actual single, along with the lyrics to the song. The lyrics were written by Mickey, D.J. and X. Stoker with production by Mickey and Rick Whitelaw.

More Cancon from RCA

Besides the Stoker Brothers' single (mentioned above), RCA has shipped another impressive package of Cancon country singles. These are Terry Christenson's *Summer Heart*, Terry Cousineau's *Will So Long Do*, and Hotel Mexico by Dick Damron. The latter is Dick's follow-up to 1965, which had a good run up the charts. Christenson is a well-known folk singer from a few years ago, who previously released on his own Harvestholm label. This is a Christenson original, which he produced himself.

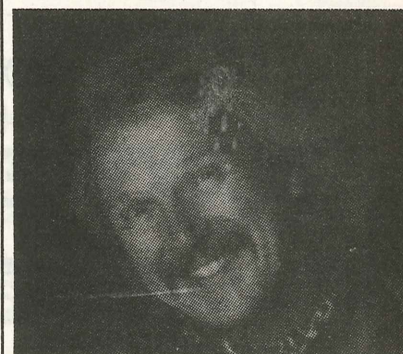

one attended by Lenigrad groups, some of which are known in the West through the Red Wave pirate album issued in the U.S.

Other Soviet republics will also send rockers to the festival, for instance, the Estonian, Gunnar Graps, sometimes referred to as the Soviet Jagger, and the Sympho-Rock-Group in SPE, also from Estonia. Like last year, Melodia will issue follow-up LPs.

A month earlier, in late March 1987, the Rock Laboratory will hold an amateur festival to be attended by 30 groups.

Soviet rockers are now performing for thousands of fans in concert halls and TV studios in the same way they did not so long ago in small clubs on the outskirts of town. With rock groups getting new recognition and support, they are expected to reach new heights, and will soon be touring and competing on the international scene.
