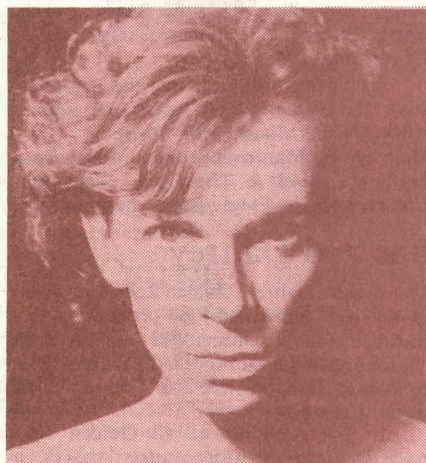

Adams launch is most extensive in A&M history

A&M is preparing the "most extensive campaign in our history," says the label's Senior Vice President and General Manager Joe Summers. He's referring to the launch of the new Bryan Adams album and single. Orders for the album, CD and cassette exceed 200,000, while orders for the single, between the 7" and cassette-single are now over 50,000, (Mar. 11).

The single, *Heat Of The Night*, was released to radio Mar. 10, and initial response has been "stunning" says Summers.

CRIA statistics reveal CDs bouying marketplace

The Compact Disc configuration has had such a positive impact at retail that the year-end statistics for 1986 actually indicate increased sales over the previous year by 11 percent, whereas total product shipments (which include CDs) slipped by a percentage point.

According to recently released CRIA statistics, last year's sales totals topped \$326 million, half of which was supplied by the cassette configuration (\$174 million). Vinyl discs (albums), accounted for \$91 million and the CD over \$48 million. The remainder was split between 7" and 12" singles, totalling nearly \$13 million.

Interestingly enough, both single and album shipments decreased by 15 and 13 percent respectively, while the cassette figure increased by 3 percent. Shipments of 12" product decreased in 1986 from the previous year's total of slightly under 26 million units to 22.4 million.

However, cassettes continue to show healthy sales increases. In 1986, the \$174 million figure represents an increase of 11 percent over 1985 (\$157 million) with net shipments also increasing from 41 million units to 42 million.

Golden Reel awards to Collins and Daltrey

Ampex Golden Reel Awards were presented this year to Roger Daltrey and Phil Collins. The Daltrey award was for his album *Under A Raging Moon*, which was recorded and mastered exclusively on Ampex Grand Master (R) 456 Audio Tape. The presentation was made at Odyssey Recording Studios in London, by Tony Shields, Ampex sales rep.

The label is also coming with a cassette-single, which will retail at the same price as the single. The cassette-single is housed in its own unique special casing and packaging, (a plastic wrap-around lock case) called *plastipak*.

There will also be a merchandising piece which includes a 7" single and the cassette single available to retail Mar. 17. A counter merchandizer that will hold 25 singles and 9 cassette-singles will also be available. "This is the first time a cassette-single has been merchandized," Summers points out.

The *Into The Fire* LP, CD and cassette will be released to radio Mar. 25 and simultaneously to retail Mar. 30. The CDs are being manufactured by Montreal's *Americ Disc*.

To accommodate these configurations, a free-standing merchandising unit has been assembled, and will be shipped to 1500 retailers. The unit will allow for the display of 25 LPs, 25 CDs, and 50 cassettes, or a combination of the configurations. Four-colour

Polydor is first to introduce mid-price CDs

Polydor has introduced their mid-price CD line, "the first label, domestically, to introduce mid-price CDs in Canada," says the label's Vice President of Promotion and Media Relations, Bob Ansell. "We're coming with 27 titles off the front end and the sales force is out selling right now. Reaction to the line is fantastic." Commercial shipping date for the line is Mar. 27.

Included in the titles are the Bee Gees' *Best Of Volume 1*, 10 CC's *Original Sound-track*, Nana Mouskouri's *Passport*, Great Melodies by Mantovani, and product from Level 42, Kool & The Gang, The Jam, Cream, and The Everly Bros, among others.

Besides Daltrey, Golden Reel Award plaques were presented to producer Alan Shacklock, and engineers Will Gosling, Mark Wallis and Roger Dobson. *Odyssey* and *RAK Studios* in London were also presented with award plaques.

In the tradition of all Golden Reel Awards, Ampex Corporation makes a presentation of \$1,000 to a non-profit charity of the performer's choice. Daltrey selected the *Broadoak United Football and Boys Club* in Sussex, England, as his charity.

Collins received his award for the *No Jacket Required* album, which was also mastered entirely on Ampex Grand Master (R) 456 Audio Tape. The presentation took place at the *Twickenham Film Studios* in Middlesex, England by Shields, who presented plaques to Collins, co-producer/engineer Hugh Padgham, and the *Townhouse* and *Old Croft Audio Studios* in London.

The charity picked by Collins for the \$1,000 cheque was *The Children In Need Fund* in the U.K.

Since the start of the Golden Reel Award program, Ampex has donated more than \$500,000 to charities around the world.

header cards, "teaser" mobiles and other p.o.p items will give A&M two weeks of pre-in-store promotion, that will be enhanced by an in-store play cassette, featuring the complete *Into The Fire* LP on one side and 10 selected cuts from various LPs on the other.

Trade listening sessions are now being set up for several cities across the country. On Sunday Mar. 22 an A&M rep will turn over an *Into The Fire* CD to selected programmers, and immediately after airing, the CD will be secured by the rep, so as not to allow any one station or market to have an unfair advantage over others.

"This whole campaign has become mind-boggling," concludes Summers, "and it's designed to maintain Bryan's superstar status . . . which isn't hard to do, considering the incredible product he's supplied us."

Review now underway on Caplan-Sauvageau report

The Standing Committee on Communications and Culture is finally reviewing the Caplan-Sauvageau report on Broadcasting. The review will take place in two stages: the first will look at those recommendations relating to a new Broadcast Act, and in the second phase, the Committee will examine the other recommendations.

Flora MacDonald, the Minister of Communications, has committed herself to a new Broadcast Act, and requires the Committee to report by Apr. 15th.

Current's Young gears up "street" label launch

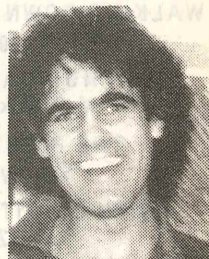
Gerry Young, President of Current Records, says that over the next few months, he expects to release product from the newly formed *Current Street* label. He anticipates albums from *Mystery Romance*, and *Breeding Ground*.

"Because the cost of recording an album these days is so steep," he explains, "there's only a certain type of band being signed to the major labels. Therefore, bands that normally wouldn't get a shot . . . well, I'm giving them a shot."

Young's "boutique" label will basically sign bands, record them within their own expectations and limitations, then obtain distribution, and with "major promotion dollars," he adds, "get them the exposure they need."

Because the costs of recording ("the big name producer" and the studio) are so high, "and that doesn't include the videos either," Young feels that even if his *Street* band's went gold, they would profit, thereby proving to the distributor that a \$250,000 investment is warranted.

"We want to break the bands in this country first," he continues, "then if the album goes gold, and you've made your money back, then with the next record you go for the international market."

New members elected to CARAS Board

Bon Jovi's Slippery LP heading for 600,000 sales

The Bon Jovi album, *Slippery When Wet*, which has been No. 1 on the RPM 100 album survey for the past 4 weeks, is now heading for the 600,000 sales mark. This is quite an impressive sales figure, considering they are only into their second single off the album. The LP was released Sept. 5/86. Their current single, *Livin' On A Prayer*, topped the RPM 100 singles chart this past week as well.

Bon Jovi's 2 previous albums, *7800 Fahrenheit*, and *Bon Jovi*, *Bon Jovi*, have also experienced metal status, with both going gold.

Changes and signings to enhance Current's image

Last year Current Records released albums from The Parachute Club, M+M, and Double Dare, all of which label president Gerry Young believed would achieve some degree of international success. However, only Parachute Club look to stand a chance of breaking in foreign territories.

M+M are apparently contemplating a permanent move to either the U.K. or Los Angeles, and Double Dare are busy writing songs.

"There were some mistakes made," says Young, of the Double Dare effort, "But I'm not going to point any fingers. Certainly though, I Can't Hold On was a world class song, and a world class production arrangement, but that one got lost.

"So, I think there were some mistakes made but," he adds, "I'm willing to take as much of the blame as anybody. Hopefully you learn by your mistakes, and if you don't, you might as well pack it in."

Over the next year, Young is looking for new releases from Alta Moda and Strange Advance, as well as material from new signings.

Vancouver's CFUN scores a broadcast first

On Mar. 16, Vancouver's CFUN will make history by becoming the first Canadian radio station to ever broadcast live from the People's Republic of China. Says CFUN's Neil Gallagher, the broadcast "is all part of CFUN's on-going series of 'Wake Up' contests sponsored by Canadian Pacific Airlines." He goes on to explain, "since we began the contests back in 1983, we have awarded over a million dollars worth of travel and accommodations."

There have been over 500 CFUN listeners who have travelled more than 2 million air miles to exotic places like Waikiki, Lima, Amsterdam, Auckland and Tokyo, "making the 'Wake Up' contest," boasts Gallagher, "the biggest, most valuable radio travel contest in the world."

Latest travellers, 50 of them, took off Mar. 10 for Shanghai, with Fred Latremouille doing the chaperoning. He will begin broadcasting live from Shanghai's Hua Ting Sheraton on Mar. 16 beginning at 5:30 am (Vancouver time).

"My attitude is to always go after the international market, and in that sense, you have to hire a world class producer. If you've got a world class band, then you'd better put them together with a world class producer."

Young points out that "I'm trying to keep it up, even though all the accountants are screaming at me, but I think it's important. Hey . . ." he concludes, "These artists are up against Gabriel and all those people, so it better work. If you have a hit in Canada, it's terrific, but it doesn't pay all the bills," concluding with "But if you can't take the heat, then get out of the kitchen."

Radio receives first taste of new Fleetwood Mac set

After a near five-year wait, pop radio listeners are receiving their first dose of new Fleetwood Mac material. Their new single, *Big Love*, has been shipped to radio.

The album, produced by band member Lindsey Buckingham, is titled *Tango In The Night*, and contains 12 new tracks in all. Buckingham also wrote the new single. A video is expected to support the song.

Released on the Warner Bros label, the new album follows their multi-platinum *Mirage* album. However, between projects, band members released their own solo efforts.

Bill Johnston, Warner Bros Product Manager, expressed surprise himself at how long it had been since the group's last album, but stressed their fans were anxiously waiting for new material from the band.

"This LP is what you would expect them to sound like in the late '80s," he said. "It's undeniably Fleetwood Mac. It's strong, melodic Top 40 music and should do exceedingly well. The production techniques are updated."

The album itself, has been slated for an Apr. 7 release. Other tracks on the album, include, *Seven Wonders*, *Everywhere*, *Caroline*, *Mystified*, *Little Lies*, and *Family Man*.

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Yamaha's 100th birthday to be celebrated at WPSF

The Song Festival will be held at Tokyo's Budokan (Oct. 31). However, this year the Yamaha Music Foundation, sponsor of the WPSF, has introduced changes in the rules for the

Heavy national push for new Body Electric single

Using the combined promotional, publicity and marketing expertise of The Music Brokers, Promotionally Yours . . . Martin/Kierans, and Parallel One, a massive launch is underway for Body Electric's latest single, I Don't Know Why. The Music Brokers are touting the single as "hot right out of the box . . . great for CHR and AOR formats with huge A/C crossover potential."

Parallel One has offices in Vancouver and Toronto and maintain their own distribution set up. Talks are currently underway for a U.S. release, along with a major tie-in in Canada.

Entry qualifications will now insist that all entrants must be professional singers with recording contracts as of June, 1987. Singers not meeting this qualification however, are not being entirely ruled out. Most Yamaha branches around the world are planning to hold an International Popular Music Festival, with these festivals intended for amateur musicians. Further details will be made available over the next few weeks.

There has also been an important change in song qualifications for the Tokyo festival. The WPSF will be accepting songs that are published or released before the announcement of the results of the final entry selection.

Awards increase for annual MusicFest contest

The 15th annual MusicFest Finals, set for this May 13 through 17 in Ottawa, will offer over \$55,000 in awards including: Five scholarships worth \$5,000 each, given by Berklee College of Music; and six scholarships of \$3,500 each, put up by General Motors of Canada. There is also the Yamaha Canada Music Rising Star Award, and the Music Industries Association of Canada Scholarship being offered.

The MusicFest competition, which encompasses the Canadian Stage Band Festival, the Canadian Concert Band Festival, and the Canadian Vocal Festival, is expected to attract more than 8,000 musicians from every region in the country.

Ten post-secondary institutions participated in the festival staged at Expo '86, and at least twice that number are expected to be competing at the finals this year.

Executive Director Jim Howard points out that the festival "offers a unique opportunity for post-secondary educational institutions to offer scholarships to outstanding young performers, enabling these students to further their studies in university and college departments."

"I've seen the organization grow and change," says MusicFest President Allen Michalek, "and I firmly believe that today, we are poised to contribute more to Canadian cultural life than ever before."

Industry Arts Awards to be held April 4th.

The Annual Music Industry Arts Awards Night, will be held at the Regency Ballroom in the Lamplighter Inn, London, Ont. Saturday, Apr. 4th beginning with cocktails at 6 pm.

The Music Industry Arts course is part of the Fanshawe College curriculum.

Jan Wetstein, Coordinator for the awards night, reports that this year's event "is particularly exciting to us, because MuchMusic's Christopher Ward has agreed to be our Master of Ceremonies." Wetstein also reports that "our students are turning out high quality product that we are looking forward to sharing with our industry guests." In view of the high quality productions, the industry guest list for this year's awards has been lengthened.

Jacob's Ladder moves to No. 1 on MuchMusic 30

COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Julian Cope returns with a "polished" solo effort**

Evolving out of the English music scene that brought forth such bands as Echo & The Bunnymen, Level 42 and Tears For Fears, Julian Cope says he has now taken a step beyond his previous work. He claims Saint Julian is "a lot more together than the other albums."

Although the subject of commercialism is touchy with musicians these days, Cope adds he was proud to deliver a "commercial" album to his new label, Island Records. "A lot of people will probably say that Island was hassling me to do a more commercial album, but they weren't," he explains. "I was hassling me."

He likens the album to a new leather outfit or a new pair of boots. "I wanted an album that shone," Cope explains. "I wanted it to glow. There's something good about a boot that's got mud all over it, but there's also something great about a boot that's been lovingly polished."

In the past, his critical vulnerability has been caused by his decision not to "polish" those previous efforts. Whether or not Cope's next album remains in that polished vein, even he is unsure.

"Now that I've written Saint Julian," he continues, "It's easy to write another because I've got all the ground covered, but I don't want to do it like that. I won't learn anything that way."

"It's like I've written Saint Julian, now I've got to go off, step back, and say 'OKay, I've got to write precisely the way I'm feeling.' Sure it's less comfortable that way, but I don't think art should be comfortable."

The songs he writes are angry, not sentimental, born of frustration and curiosity. Over the years however, the proper "projection" of his art has always eluded him.

"It's like you write a song in a euphoria," he explains. "Say over the period of an hour, then you've got to project that song to people, and I actually had a period of stopping that projection." During this time,

Cope pushed his mind to an edge that physically he admits was just "too much" to handle.

"It got very scary for a while," Cope relates, of his drug-filled days with the Mercury label. "I had really gone too far and when you get so far down that everything you do is perceived as being strange . . . it's really bad news."

Whether people perceive Cope as being weird or not (after all, the stories he relates are definitely on the wild side), he really doesn't care. "People perceive me a year behind where I'm really at anyway," he maintains. "That really doesn't bother me though, because I really don't think you do art for everybody else to say 'That's great', I

mean I'm doing music that has to last 10 years at least."

Yet, Cope has spent the past two years in his home, writing the new tunes ("staring out my window into the black hole") and bringing his life into perspective.

"It's easy for an artist to say 'Well, you just don't understand my trip.' I don't want to argue that 'You don't understand' thing to people, because that's me bullshitting. Certain things in life are necessary and my phases are necessary to me."

"I get a certain pride out of pissing people off," he concludes. "I do what I want to do and I like to be slightly out of step. There's something about getting into an attitude where you're so snotty, that it's so dismissable. I'm very aware of that, and a lot of the things I write about, people could say 'So?' . . . but that really doesn't bother me either."

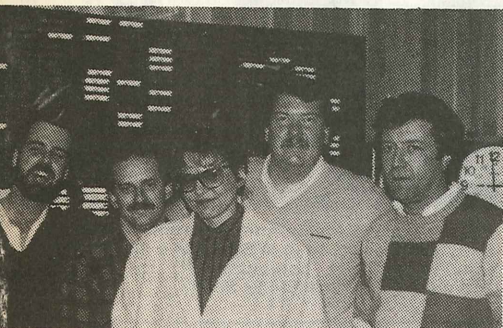


Marie Osmond at A&A's Records & Tapes in Calgary with Capitol's Calgary branch reps Danny Bertsch and Robert Widman (l).

PRO Country sponsors Bud Rampton benefit

Bud Rampton, described as "a true friend of country music", has gone through a "horrendous" traumatic ordeal, the result of his being jailed by Las Vegas police on suspicion of arson earlier this year. Rampton and his lady friend Carol Barclay, were detained on arson charges (Jan. 17) after the investigation of a fire in their room at the Imperial Palace Hotel. They claimed the fire started in their television set, however bail of \$1 million each was set, which meant a lengthy stay in jail. In view of forensic evidence, which they paid for, pair were acquitted by a Las Vegas Justice of The Peace (Feb. 12), after which they returned to their Pickering, Ont. home.

While he was in jail, Rampton's family sold his Club Ashley, far below market value to try and raise bail. He now has no income and is not fit to work. He owes close to \$20,000 for legal fees, hospitalization, forensic experts, airfares, and phone calls.

As a result of the treatment he suffered in Las Vegas, Rampton is still suffering from a bleeding lung, which is nonfunctional. He has also suffered from a concussion, partial loss of hearing, and a hairline skull fracture, internal bleeding, phlebitis in both wrists from handcuffs, and much emotional trauma.

Bud (Rampton) was always first in line to give a hand to country acts, and now they're lining up to help him when he needs it. It's just amazing how this benefit has come together."

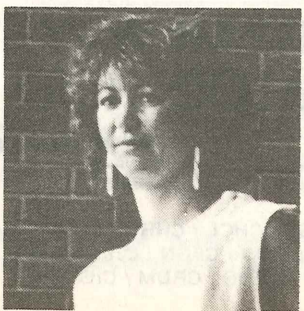

Image of The Esquires guarded well since 1962

It was erroneously reported in the Mar. 7/87 issue of RPM that Ottawa's famous Esquires went on to become The Staccatos which then evolved into the Five Man Electrical Band. This couldn't be further from the truth.

The Esquires were formed in 1962 and became well-known throughout the area. They were managed by Sandy Gardner, who at the time, was the teen columnist for the Ottawa Journal.

The Esquires were the first to win a Juno (then known as the RPM Gold Leaf Awards),

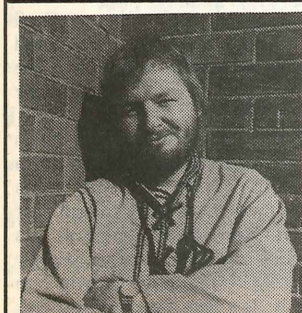
