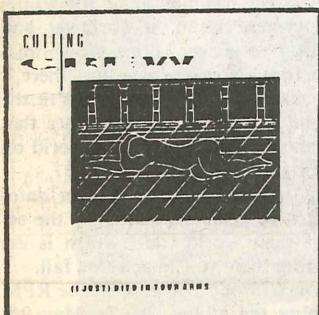

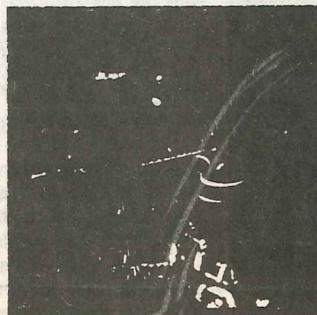

Retail recovering after traditional slow down

Al Fletcher, Director Central Region Sales for CBS, has found retail "somewhat soft", but puts it down to the fact that "April and May are traditionally slow. Right now, it seems to be picking up across the board. Remember, not all stores are experiencing soft sales."

Fletcher has also noticed that there are some stores beginning to pick up in sales because universities and other schools are into their exam period. "So . . . just about this time, students are getting up to 30 days off, or a week to study and that affects cassette sales. It's obvious there are a lot more young people in the stores." He also suggests that now the income tax deadline is over "there will be an adjustment in thinking with regard to outdoor sports, jogging, boating and other mobile activities that go hand in hand with cassette buying."

Fletcher also finds varied interests in configurations offered. "CDs are still growing substantially," he stresses. "A lot of stores report customers asking for product that is 5 or 10 years old, which means they probably have the album or cassette, and are now looking for the CD, years later. It's obvious, record buyers are changing their entire library. We knew that would happen, and a

Attic's Mair clarifies Aaron's recording pact

"For the sake of clarity," says Al Mair, President of Attic Records, "Lee Aaron is signed to Attic for the world. We have a contract with 10 Records, a Virgin associated company, giving them rights for various territories."

Aaron is currently in Europe, touring in support of her latest self-titled album, which last week continued its upward trend on the RPM 100 into the Top 40. Only Human, taken as the first single from the album, has also shown impressive moves up singles charts across the country.

plus is the fact that a CD buyer is a multiple purchaser."

As far as trends go, Fletcher finds that "heavy rock" is selling. "Just take a look at the charts, and you can see a greater concentration on heavy rock, and that's a reaction to what's been happening to radio over the last year or so. Now, radio is going from the gold syndrome to heavy rock. But don't forget, dance music is a big sales item as well."

Country music is also having a resurgence at retail. "The new country acts, are bringing a lot of attention to country again . . . and that's helping the catalogue. It seems to be creating buyer interest once again in old country product. I'm seeing a lot more interest in accounts with regard to country, and working country than I have in a long time. I noticed that months ago in Winnipeg, but now it seems to be kicking into Eastern Canada."

Stores are divided on "hit" and "catalogue" product. Fletcher finds that "a lot of stores are concentrating on Top Con (Top Concentration) right now, but those stores who have seen an interest in country and crossover product, are stocking catalogue. It depends on the market demand."

Merchandising is of prime importance at present. "We've talked sales, configurations and trends, but merchandising seems to be a major factor out there," continues Fletcher. "CDs are taking over a large market share,

Canada leads world as U2

Having now surpassed the quadruple platinum sales level in Canada, and eclipsing Robert Palmer's Riptide within a month, U2's album The Joshua Tree is now Island Records' largest seller to date. Those figures are based on the tremendous acceptance of the first single, With Or Without You, at CHR radio, "and only now are we beginning to break new ground," says the label's Vice President, Bill Meehan.

"We're at 400,000 units without really getting into that new market we're chasing and the next single's going to do it. So," he adds, "you ain't seen nothing yet!" The next single, Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For, is tentatively slated for release May 25 but because of slower chart action stateside Island is hoping for early June.

"We're trying to do it in concert with the U.S.," explains Meehan. "The plan is to get With Or Without You to No. 1 in the States and see how long it stays there, then we'll introduce the new single."

With total sales of U2's album approaching 10 million worldwide, topping charts in virtually every territory, its success has not only spurred sales of U2 catalogue product but also the label's roster seems to be enjoying a "spillover" affect. Although it is

but a lot of stores really haven't had the opportunity of merchandising them properly yet, and it's not their fault, CDs are growing so fast. Unfortunately, there are some retailers not willing to invest in fixtures. No one's willing to invest in fixtures because, as an industry, we haven't really standardized anything at all for CDs and cassettes."

With the summer months traditionally good for record sales, and with retail promotions currently underway and in the offing, Fletcher is confident of a "hot summer season, and by hot I mean hot sales."

BMG prepares for new Whitney Houston release

The new Whitney Houston album, simply titled Whitney, will ship (June 1), simultaneously in album, cassette and CD configurations. The Narada Michael Wilson-produced first single, I Just Wanna Dance With Somebody (Who Loves Me), has already made significant chart gains.

Although Love Is A Contact Sport is also the title of a song recorded by Billy Newton-Davis, Houston's version isn't a cover informs SBK Song's Wayne Patton. "I only wish it were", he adds.

Houston's debut album celebrates its 100th week on the RPM Album chart this week, having spawned the hit singles: Saving All My Love For You, You Give Good Love, How Will I Know and Greatest Love Of All. The self-titled LP has surpassed the diamond plateau in Canada.

too early to determine whether The Joshua Tree has opened the doors, Island's success with Amazulu should not be overlooked.

"We're leading the world in U2 but it is refreshing to be able to really brag about the Amazulu story," Meehan agrees.

"We could come close to gold on this record, which isn't being worked anywhere else in the world," he continues. "It's a pure Canadian chase at this point. The States are only now thinking about releasing Montego Bay - after what we did with it." The follow-up has been released, titled Don't You Just Know It, a Huey 'Piano' Smith cover.

Toronto radio station CFTR was one of the first stations in the country to "take a shot" at the first single ("It worked and went to No. 1," advises Meehan.) and now have just recently added the second.

"I know U2 has not gone four-times platinum anywhere else in the world yet, and I know they've never gone four-times platinum before. Now that we are there," Meehan concludes, "we can say: 'We're the first' and the band even acknowledges that Canada is ahead of the rest of the world on this project."

U2 is currently in New York for dates there and are expected to announce the second leg of their world tour, which is expected to bring them to Canada this fall.

With Or Without You topped the RPM charts, joining the album, in the May 9th issue, which, informs Lee Silversides, corresponds with both Island's 25th and Island Canada's 3rd Anniversaries.

Quality Special Products on roll with LP releases

Quality Special Products, currently experiencing success with their recent TV-backed album releases, have just issued more new projects that will also be the focus of national television campaigns.

A number of packages have already surpassed the gold mark, and are approaching the platinum level. Among those over gold (50,000 units) are This Is Music, Heart To Heart, Mini Pops, and Foster And Allen.

A number of projects were so successful they've been carried over from last year. These include Amazing Grace by Judy Col-

lins, Elvis Presley's Classic Love Ballads, the Power Of Love, and Mini Pops Magic.

Packaging such as VSOP, The Ultimate British Collection, Heart To Heart, Country Supergroups '87, This Is Music, Songs For The Family Of God by Pat Boone and Ireland's John Macnally are all currently the focus of national TV campaigns. Only the Foster And Allen albums, Reminiscing and Maggie are being supported regionally, particularly in the Maritimes where they are the most popular.

Even with several recent successful

Molson's & Coors tie up Toronto's waterfront

Molson's Breweries and its distributed Coors label have major control of Toronto's waterfront for entertainment this year. Molson's also have acquired major concert locations across the nation where they will be staging top name entertainment, both Canadian and international, but heavy on Cancon.

Molson's key to the entertainment world is being supplied by Concert Productions International (CPI). The Forum at Ontario Place (Toronto) will stage everything from light classics to rock and country. Canadian content will represent more than 60 percent of the bookings. These will include Murray McLauchlan and Blue Rodeo (May 17), Manteca (18), David Wilcox (19 & 20), Eight Seconds (21), Rock And Hyde with Go Four 3 (26 & 27), John Baldry (29), The Partland Brothers (June 1), Pukka Orchestra (2), Spoons (3 & 4), Messenjah, Sattalites, and Sun Force (June 9), Tom Cochrane & Red Rider with the Terry Crawford Band (10 & 11), Luba (16 through 18), Billy Newton-Davis and Liberty Silver (20), Parachute Club (22 through 24), Chalk Circle (July 8), The Box (22 & 23), Doug And The Slugs (29 & 30), Haywire (Aug. 13), and Dan Hill (Sept. 12).

The Forum opens its 17th season May 14 with Michael Damien. Other name acts include Billy Vera & The Beaters (May 23 & 24), Jennifer Warnes (June 14), Emmylou

Harris (July 12), and James Brown (July 19).

There will also be a nostalgia series, which will include The Great American Cruise featuring Rony & The Daytonas, The Outsiders and Gary Lewis, Jan & Dean, Gary U.S. Bonds, the Spencer Davis Group, Chubby Checker, Fabian and Bobby Rydell, as well as Randy Bachman and Burton Cummings, Herman Hermits, The Turtles, Byrds and more.

The Coors Light Summerfest at Harbourfront will present 4 weekends of theme activities. This will include everything from arm wrestling and bodybuilding contests to beach party promotions and concerts by local and nationally-recognized rock and country bands.

Canada Day will be the kick-off weekend, followed by the Great Caribbean Jump-up (July 3 through 5) with Lilian Allen and Calypso King Jayson.

Cancon Country gets a break this year with the Great New Country Weekend (July 10 through 12). Featured will be Blue Rodeo and Prairie Oyster.

July 17 through 19 will feature Down East Traditions with Figgy Duff, Matt Minglewood and The Celtic Gales.

Summerfest caps their weekends with a Soul And Blues party, July 24 through 26, with Colin James, Albert King and Johnny Littlejohn and more.

packages, Quality has just issued a few more titles which will also be supported by TV buys including Class Of The '80s, the 2-record set, Magic Serenade by Acker Bilk, and Conway & Loretta, featuring Loretta Lynn and Conway Twitty. Mini Pops will also be another major project. Two of their biggest pushes at press time involve This Is Music, and Heart To Heart.

Quality, which has both a mail order and retail division, will quite often first check the potential of a package by making it available through mail order. All LPs can also be obtained at retail.

Bernie Willock, General Manager for Quality Special Products, reports that business is much better with both volume and profit up over last year.

"The single artist projects are what we're working on to increase our business," Willock points out. "The Engelbert Humperdinck album (With Love) is the direction we're going . . . projects that appeal to a TV audience."

Willock also pointed out that the Humperdinck release carries both new and old material. Torero (She Brings Him Spanish Roses), was taken from the album as the first single.

Quality will be releasing a number of projects like the Humperdinck package, which like most single artist LPs generally appeal to the 30 and older age group. The label's single artist and various artists compilation ratio is roughly about 50/50 at present.

Willock was asked if their packages were more popular in certain regions or markets, to which he answered, "I think we're selling them right across the board. Stores from coast-to-coast have them, but there's no one chain doing better. We're finding some albums are more successful than others, which is normal."

Willock added that in addition to the TV advertising campaigns, the company has been supporting their albums with radio advertising, special advertising promotions and trips such as one that was offered to Nashville for one of their LP packages.

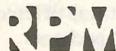

The tracking card problem!!

GBM Records Incorporated has been trying to survive a business that is known by all to be very tough and competitive. We spend a lot of money releasing GBM product to our Canadian radio stations. Included with each release is a tracking card which is used for follow-up after it is returned. The return postage is paid by GBM Records.

What I would like to know is that if we take the time, and spend the money to include this card, why don't the radio station programmers return them? If the return postage was not paid, I would understand it not coming back, but when it is, and for the time it would take, I can't think of any reasonable excuse not to return the card.

We are not in this business for fun. It's very important to our marketing of the product to know where the record is being played. Our time and money is as important to our survival as their's is to them. Whether it's good or bad, programmers we need to know. Are you, or are you not playing this release? If the card does not come back, are we to assume that you are not adding this one? Somebody please let me know!

Hey . . . it's rock 'n' roll again!!

A few weeks ago I mentioned that a major chain would soon be returning to rock 'n' roll. (EC: *What took them so long . . . ?*) Well, get ready, it may be sooner than I had predicted. With radio in major centres having so much sameness, it now closely resembles a magazine format. I find myself continually turning the dial . . . listening for something interesting, and occasionally, but not often enough, I'll find something. COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Poison's debut album already a million seller**

Currently touring and promoting their debut album, *Look What The Cat Dragged In*, are the members of Poison. They know what it takes, and they have what it takes to sell a million records. They're not about to debate whether the music or the image is more important, rather that it all stems from an attitude - good or bad - and theirs is good.

Since signing to the Capitol/Enigma label in late 1985, the band has sold over 1.6 million albums in the U.S. alone, following the May release last year, and only now are those numbers beginning to spill over into foreign territories. The album is gold in Canada and has moved into the RPM Top 20.

"Touring," answers both Bret Michaels and Ricki Rockett, when asked why in America and no where else. "We come from an era of music where showmanship and musicianship were valued together," elaborates Michaels, the lead singer.

"I think a lot of the showmanship over the years has gotten lost," he says. "Because of people trying to prove their musicianship. We're being the perfect mixture between the musicianship and the showmanship, which is what makes people, who don't understand the musical technique, enjoy our show."

Of course, they stress how their songs come "from the heart", and how the "kids can relate" to their music. However, Rockett also espouses the McDonald's theory of rock 'n' roll, "but there's an art to it," the drummer adds. "It's great, and it's fast, and it's easily accessible. With rock 'n' roll it's always been 3 chords fun and 3 chords music.

"You know . . . provoke a little sex, provoke a little rebellion. It's good time music and that's what we excel at, and I think that's why our record's doing so well . . . because there hasn't been a band like that for sometime."

"Yes," agrees Michaels, "we told the

record companies, 'This is what we want to do . . . just give us one year to prove ourselves. Let us go out and do our own thing. If you don't like us . . . then get rid of the band.' It worked, and it feels real good.

"People have always asked us: 'Is Poison more image or more music?' Well, I don't think it's more of either. It's a combination of both these ingredients. It's like being a speaker on a podium . . . you can talk, all day long, but it won't matter if there isn't anyone listening to you."

Both Michaels and Rockett stress that their particular avenue for generating that exposure has been an intense touring schedule and an equally intense live show, complete with flash bombs. "We just want to bring the fun back into it," says Rockett, "something to watch while sitting in the audience. And if you're not seeing something going on, more than music, you might as well go home and listen to the stereo."

Both Michaels and Rockett can probably

Is AM Drive living up to its potential . . . ??

Ottawa broadcast consultant George Pollard takes a look at AM Drive and its importance in today's ratings race.

The success of any radio station hinges on AM Drive. It's the peak rating period that provides a motherlode of listeners available for re-cycling into other dayparts.

What makes AM Drive successful? Music, news and sports, or personalities, traffic and road reports. How about weather up-dates? The answer, of course, is all of these and more.

Some inputs are given. Local news and sports, for example. So are frequent weather, traffic and time checks. Many stations can increase cume by increasing these ingredients.

Music has a role. AM Drive is usually busy. There isn't time for a lot of music. So, music should, and usually does, come across as feature material.

Personalities are critical to AM Drive success. Not just the jocks, but the news, sports and weather people as well. Success in AM Drive, not just us-versus-them success, but success in terms of a daypart viability and successful re-cycling, depends on personalities.

You don't have to look hard for examples. Market dominance in AM Drive by CFRA (Ottawa), CJAD (Montreal), CFRB (Toronto), WBZ (Boston), WTIC

(Hartford), and WOR (New York), for example, is renown. Their key personalities are legends. Ken "The General" Grant at CFRA; CJAD's George Balcon; and Wally Crouter at CFRB. Carl de Suze and his heir, Dave Maynard, have dominated Boston radio for 50 years as has Rick Steele in Hartford. John Gambling and his father before him, have led AM Drive in New York City for 60 years.

Success is complex. Management has to commit to the long haul. Long-term stability is the goal. Quickie fixes may be the consultant's *elixir vitae*, but station success is built

on long-term growth and stability. An investment in talent, consistent with long-term goals, must be made and allowed to mature.

On-air people have to mesh. Jocks, news, sports and weather people must work together. They have to appear close, friendly and sincerely concerned about each other and the listener.

On-air people have to naturally assume and play-out well-structured and well-defined roles the listener can relate to. Essentially the

roles must convey a sense of the traditional family. Mother, father and children must be evident. And, perhaps, an uncle, aunt, cousin, grandparent or sundry relatives.

Role playing is the make-or-breaking ingredient. Freeman Gosden and Charles Correll - Amos 'n' Andy - stumbled into the family-formula 60 years ago and earned 90 plus shares.

Every radio and television programming success is built on the family-formula (familiarity). The "Mary Tyler Moore" show, for example, offered a well-defined traditional family. 'Mary' as mom, 'Mr. Grant' as pop, 'Murray', 'Ted' and 'Sue Ann' as the kids. The Ricardos kidded while the Mertz's parented on "I Love Lucy".

War precluded a real "M*A*S*H" family. So, the 4077th was a metaphoric family: fatherly colonel, kindly and understanding mother (Mulcahy), impish sons, self-centred sister, naive kid brother, dimwit nephew (Frank), black-sheep cousin and a few stray relatives (Kelly, Igor, Zale).

Programming success often involves a metaphoric family. Metaphoric families are the mainstay of any successful local TV news programme.

The family formula isn't limited to sitcoms. How about the Rolling Stones, E Street Band, and Beatles? Wrassling? Even RPM! What role does EC: play? How about Walt?

Why is familiarity so important? For the same reasons Israel gets so much media attention. Israel and the family are the nectar and

ambrosia of Western culture.

We won't take the world as it is. We need to explain it. We explain via stories (myths, fables and legends). These stories recount experience . . . tell us what's important and what isn't . . . and help us explain if not understand, what's going on. The opening of "Amazing Stories" blatantly acknowledges our need for explanation.

In all cultures, explanations are linked by an umbrella "super story". Super story content defines what is important. The oldest, most familiar, is rooted in Israel. The Bible is its first edition. Importance is summarized in the Ten Commandments. And, the family has a central place.

Living is an editorial exercise. We selectively expose ourselves to some things and not to others. We build a perceptual field that defines what we open our eyes to, what we actually see and what we retain. If we weren't selective, insanity would prevail.

The super story defines our perceptual field. We expose ourselves to what fits the super story. What doesn't fit is often missed. When we see it, we realize it doesn't fit. Over time, non-fitting material may become part of the super story.

News is biased in favour of the dominant super story. Items that don't fit aren't usually used. If they are, you'll find them buried on

The Edmonton-based NEO a4, who opened Gowan's Massey Hall shows this past week, are beginning to pick up significant action on their single Desire. This includes an add at CHUM-FM. The single is now charted on the RPM 100 singles survey.

"Great" response to Chalk Circle video

According to Samantha Taylor, host of CBC-TV's Video Hits, the new Chalk Circle video is "great . . . just great." Titled This Mour-

ing, and taken from the band's forthcoming album, Mending Wall, the video features many special effects and promoted viewers (at the Duke Street special screening), to praise the work as Rob Quartly's best of late. The band has recently been touring arena-sized dates.

Gold Fever Festival to hold talent search

Blaine Wilkins, of Regina's Studio West, reports that as part of the Western Canada Summer Games, a talent search will also be conducted. Fifty ex-urban stations get A&M Janz promotion

Contest criteria will differ from station to station.

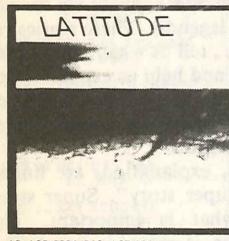

The Marlaine Sisters, Heidi, Carmen and

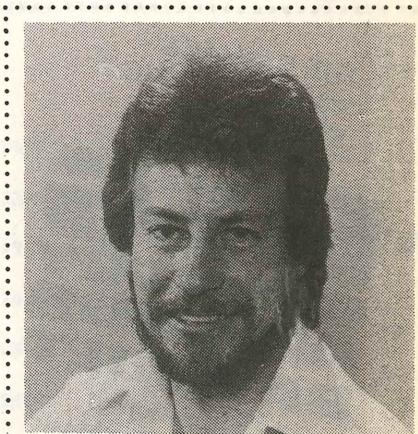
