

There has been some concern by retailers over the lack of "creative" when it comes to packaging of cassettes and CDs. The vinyl album is a billboard in itself, allowing record buyers the opportunity to browse and pick items quickly providing them with valuable information. The much smaller packaging of cassettes and CDs doesn't provide this service.

Gerry Prochaska, Vice President and Managing Director of Shorewood Packaging Canada, was asked about this situation, and he suggests, "The industry in Canada is groping," referring, of course, to the "confusion" with regard to packaging, particularly in the CD field.

"The 6x12 box for the CD, which has almost become a standard in the U.S. where all the majors have adopted it . . . is not anywhere near that close here in Canada,

Amnesty retail campaign organized by Hemingway

Modelled after the very successful (the release of several "prisoners of conscience") Amnesty International awareness campaign undertaken by Tower Records, a stateside retail giant, initiated last year in the wake of the Conspiracy of Hope Tour, Sam The Record Man's Gail Hemingway hopes their 50-store campaign will achieve "even better" results.

Basically, Amnesty International has enlisted the support of retail outlets across the country for a campaign, now underway, in which they will "adopt" a prisoner. The various stores will distribute pre-printed petitions addressed to government officials for customers to merely sign and deposit in the unique point-of-purchase displays, to be picked up weekly by Amnesty officials.

The display features a photo of the prisoner, information about the case and a brochure on Amnesty International for the concerned individual to take home. Unfortunately, there wasn't enough funding available to secure a display (including stands) for each store in the chain, which is why only 50 are able to participate, Hemingway informs.

Primary funding was obtained by soliciting the various record companies: A&M, CBS, I.R.S., Island, Jabula, MCA, Polydor, True North, Virgin and WEA, as the campaign also involves a header card titled Artists For Amnesty, such artists are U2, Bruce Cockburn and Simple Minds are prominently displayed.

"The kids who are buying these records," says Hemingway, "they do care about the prisoners around the world and it's a good way for them to become involved. I've spoken to a lot of young people who say they'd like to know more about Amnesty, but don't know if they can spend the time being part of a group, but they are still wanting to help in some way. So, if they sign their names, that helps."

"My stores are wonderful," she enthuses. "I'm just so thrilled by the response . . . and this is only the beginning. We'll keep it going as long as we can make it work. And I plan to make it work!"

because they (the majors) consider it an 'excessive' cost."

Most labels, major and small independents in Canada are going with the blister box, which they believe stands up better. Instead of concentrating on developing a package that would draw attention to CDs and cassettes, Prochaska complains they have made the inside packaging more and more elaborate.

"The one-panel card has grown to the point where every release has from four to seven panels," says Prochaska. "It's not the ideal situation, because to read these panels you need 20/20 vision. It seems the big development is to cram more and more into the jewel box and the outside packaging remains the same."

Prochaska points out that record buyers like browsing for records, and the vinyl album jacket provided enough eye-catching information to attract sales. "The jacket was the best self-promotion there was for an album, and all of a sudden, record buyers have only a 2x4 cassette card, and they can't find what they're looking for . . . and that's where the 6x12 box would be invaluable."

Continuing, Prochaska points out, "I want to be careful here, because I'm the guy who's selling the board. But, I've always worn the consumer's hat too . . . and I say, a long box, as long as it's in a format where it will be destroyed by the consumer . . . in the long run . . . will leave a bad taste in their mouths. They'll say, 'here I got all the information, and a nice picture and I have to throw it out.' If there was a package big enough to put on the shelf and keep it, then it might be better for display purposes, but nobody has come up with anything yet."

It was at MIDEM, two years ago, when Prochaska introduced a cardboard insert that

would hold a CD, and fit inside a record jacket, "where they basically, could have used jacket film," says Prochaska, "but that was shot down because they said it wasn't different enough to attract people, and yet when they came out with other formats, they said the problem was that 'it's so different, nobody will recognize it'."

In conclusion, Prochaska re-emphasizes, "The industry, in terms of packaging, is groping, and a lot of people are trying different things, but nobody really knows where it's going to end up."

Attic primed to distribute Cypress catalogue

That ever-elusive "baby boomer" demographic certainly carries a tremendous weight at retail. Their purchasing power often sends an album soaring past the diamond plateau, however it remains a market largely untapped. They consistently bank on quality and rarely venture out on a limb, choosing instead to wait at least until multi-platinum sales have been achieved, as if by instinct, and then the "must have" theory swings into effect.

Following the watershed punk movement, its successor new wave, "baby boomers" subsequently lost interest in buying music, perhaps it was no longer considered an art form to those who had matured through the turbulent sixties. Hence, artists struggled in the wake of these new fads and fashion trends, gradually losing priority on the record company totem pole; eventually losing their recording contracts. Jennifer Warnes was among them.

Then technology changes things somewhat. With the advent of the Compact Disc, the "baby boomers" returned to the stores (and the music industry is reaping the short-term windfall) in the process though



radio have both risen to the occasion, catering to their tastes, both undergoing major facelifts in recent years to attract and accommodate those "new" customers.

In most cases, record companies did not move as quickly and a void, a gap, in the marketplace was thus left open for any marketing genius to fill. New Age didn't quite do it, although sales are indeed very respectful in this area. An anecdote to bands with teenage appeal was needed. "Rock and roll with an intelligent slant to it," answers Cypress Records founder Craig Sussman, who released the Warnes' album (now well over platinum) last year to a rather unsuspecting but appreciative "baby boomer" audience.

Only recently though has a deal with Attic Records in Canada been reached for the forthcoming and entire Cypress catalogue; the Wendy Waldman album their newest priority, Jennifer Warnes their last.

With regards to the Warnes' success story, Sussman says: "It's hard for even me to believe it, but we planned to make this kind of record, and we were hoping that this

was the kind of reaction we were going to get. It's one thing to plan it, but it's another to actually see it through," he adds. "Because you can't foretell the future, and it's a real volatile business and you just never know, until it happens."

Sussman left his post at CBS, in the Business Affairs department, two years ago to form the label which now enjoys a roster of ten artists, who will make "meaningful soft rock" records. For instance, he advises, watch for a new Gary Wright album next year. "It's the one that we're really, really looking forward to. The album is like a 'who's who' of industry players."

In order to attain an acceptable level of recorded quality, time is the most important factor, and his acts are allowed as much as necessary.

"A lot of companies are doing that now," informs Sussman, "because you only get one shot at it, and you might as well feel confident that this is the best possible record that you can make and this is what you want to give the public. You only have one shot, so you may as well make it the best possible. And that's just something we have to do," he concludes, "and hopefully Attic will benefit from that."

Upcoming releases include albums from Tower Of Power, Jesse Colin Young and the Waldman (co-writer of Don Johnson's Heartbeat) package titled Letters Home.

ROGER HODGSON - Pop/Rock
Hai Hai - A&M SP-9503-W


Obviously with this package released, it was indeed Hodgson who provided that commercial side to Supertramp during their multi-platinum and diamond selling days, and those may soon be upon the label again. You Make Me Love You, the first (of many) singles, is a smash hit and has begun already its climb up the charts. Other tracks favoured include My Magazine, Desert Love and House On The Corner. Definitely an attractive album for retail, especially with Christmas only a few months away, with instant awareness and a solid set of material backing up the marketing effort. Produced by Hodgson and Jack Joseph Puig at several studios.

AMIN BHATIA - instrum'tal
The Interstellar Suite
Cinema - CLT-46669-F

Quite an interesting piece of work from this Calgary-based artist, who denies the "new age" tag vehemently, choosing instead the early ELP or Moody Blues category... perhaps art rock? A conceptual album with many sound effects to arouse the interest of many demographics; from those into classical music to those "Star Wars" likes.

GEORGE OLLIVER - R&B
Dream Girl - Slott - CSTS-3104

Canadian R&B legend should move back into prominence with this excellent self-produced package of the blue-eyed type of soul and R&B that made him so famous in the '60s. Key are I Idolize You, High Heel Sneakers, and a couple of his own originals, Can't Believe It's Real, and the title Track. Background vocals supplied by B.J. Cook, Collins Philpotts, Debbie Fleming, Sherri Jeacock, Peter McGraw, Nick Cuccinato, Billy Ledster, John Rutledge and Dave Blaymire, whose professionalism enhance Oliver's crusty vocals. The Slott label is located in Whitby, Ont.



TIMOTHY B. SCHMIT - Pop
Timothy B - MCA-42049-J

Schmit, formerly of both the Eagles and Poco, has released a very mello effort but nevertheless in the very vein of those two former groups, as each song is very reminiscent and his voice quite identifiable. Key tracks include Boys Night Out, Into The Night and A Better Day Is Coming. Produced by Dick Rudolph at a variety of studios. Down Here People Dance Forever features the backing vocals of Seidah Garrett, who most recently appeared with Michael Jackson on his last single.

GRAPES OF WRATH - Roots/Rock
Treehouse - Capitol - CLT-48018-F

Produced by Tom Cochrane (who also provides backing vocals on How Long and Piece Of Mind), this package of great entertainment has tremendous potential to break this trio wide open, building on their strong campus and alternative reputation. Recorded this past year at Vancouver's Mushroom Studios, watch for a strong initial reaction at retail, but realistically program fare is limited. Peace Of Mind taken as the first single.

JOHN SCHNEIDER - Country
Greatest Hits - MCA - MCA-42033-J
Schneider fans are already picking up this one, which contains his past hits, What's A Memory Like You (Doing In A Love Like This), Too Good To Stop Now, Now Or Never, and I've Been Around Enough To Know. Jimmy Bowen produced with Schneider.



NEW REGIME - Rock/Pop
The Race - RCA - KKL1-0586-N

The band's follow-up to a rather dismal debut contains several punchy and distinctly perspicuous songs, such as Catch Fire and Wild Eyes. Steve Webster has done a marvelous job with the band and their sound. Love And Satisfaction is making an impressive initial run up the chart, but look for the follow-up to give this album its shot at retail.


GEOFFREY DOWNES' - New Age
NEW DANCE ORCHESTRA
Geffen - XGHS-24156-P

Produced specifically for the CD market, but nonetheless, released in all configurations anyway, this recording

is a step beyond new age music and bounds beyond Downes' music while with pop group Asia. An artist taking into consideration advances in playback technology deserves recognition but this particular piece of totally innovative music may well be ahead of its time, yet absolutely enjoyable.

LARRY MATTSON - Country
Worth Waiting For - Olov - 5323

Mattson returns to the country fold after several years pondering his return, but he kept his hand in at writing just in case. This is traditional country which Mattson is best known for, and contains two tracks from his old days: Falling For You and Loving You, produced by Ted Gerow. An exceptional track is Ross Allen's penning of Candlelight And Wine, which should be a single. Without You has been taken as the first single. Remainder of tracks produced by Mattson and Al Brisco at Toronto's Kinck Sound.



GLEN BURTNICK - Rock
Heroes & Zeroes - A&M - SP-5166-W

Hopefully this fine piece of work won't be overshadowed in the near future. Burnnick, a really accomplished guitarist, is assisted on this effort by Bruce Hornsby and Journey's Neil Schon, to name a few of the many. The first single, Follow You, hasn't created that much impact, but the album is definitely worth the time to check it out, soon though.



COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Is Pee Wee, America's corporate answer to Raffi**

Traditionally, in America, children's products have been sold through television, especially on Saturday mornings, or a children's record will actually be a program spin-off, such as the *Sesame Street* releases. However, for the past decade, Raffi has sold millions of records stateside without so much as even acknowledging its existence, except for conceding various television interviews when necessary.

Raffi, considered the most popular of all children's entertainers, says he hasn't relied on television as a marketing tool, nor does he plan to in the future, "and when you think about it," he adds, "it's quite un-American what I do down there."

From the release of *Singable Songs For The Very Young*, his debut, Raffi has maintained quality comes first and foremost and since his humble beginnings as a recording artist has subsequently built a retail base, and a live following, any budding rock star would be quite envious of. Yet also from the outset he fought for his albums to sell at full list prices and this was really the first marketing decision he had to make.

"Although at the time I didn't realize I was engaging in that kind of thinking, now in the States, we've kept to that. We haven't bowed to the pressure to have these records marketed at \$5.98 or whatever... we've kept to the same principles which say these are quality recordings. There's no reason to perceive them as lesser or secondary, and certainly in saying so, we're also saying that children deserve top notch recordings like anybody else."

"In this day and age, where television is such a big factor in our lives, I'd almost say that people are hypnotized by television. It runs our society, but there's value in children knowing that someone's real-life, a singer who is real and a person, and not a cartoon

character and someone's music has validity outside of television. We don't have to say this is good, because it's on TV and I'm happy to know that my career can make that kind of statement."

Everything Grows, his latest album, is a combination of many song styles; ranging from country to reggae, from polka to soka, both new and traditional, and Raffi believes it was a lot tougher to record than a "pop" record, "because you're working mostly with the same kind of instrumentation," he says. "I maintain that doing these records, in a sense, is much more difficult."

"Each song still requires a great deal of thought and consideration to make that song, whether it's short or not, be what it's supposed to be. Oddly enough," he continues, "some of the shorter songs became the most difficult to do, and some of the simplest, because they're so naked, become the most difficult." Although he hasn't noted any particular style favoured by his young audience, Raffi suggests folk music, with its emphasis on lyrics, works the best.

"Sometimes, musicians are mistaken in their assumption that because pop music is so prevalent and because kids, younger and younger, get drawn into rock music, either through videos or radio, they mistakenly think that to make music for children you've got to be in the rock style, so they can relate to it. Well, that's not true at all."

Raffi's keen understanding of children has earned him the respect of critics, parents, educators and his fans alike, but conversely and painfully bothersome, is when the children are shown no respect in return. A case in point is Pee Wee's Playhouse. "I don't think there's a lot of play in Pee Wee Herman's Playhouse," he begins.

"There's a lot of thought and money



spent on the show, that's evident. He looks like a grown-up acting like a kid, but not really. He looks like he's playing with children, but he's actually chastising them. The other factor that I find quite upsetting is the tremendously fast pace of the show. It just doesn't let up for a minute and the viewer is constantly bombarded by the various images. I don't think that's what young children need, frankly."

He continues with "I've been saying recently that with minority groups having made great advances in society to show they are worthy of society's respect that it's no longer allowed or fashionable to outwardly laugh at minority groups. It's interesting to consider that children are the last group of people that it is okay in our society to openly laugh at. This happens without people being aware of it, and it's an indication of a kind of lack of respect that there is for children," he concludes.


Available simultaneously on LP, Cass and CD. A commercial dance 12" is set for the second week of November.




