

## MuchMusic heading to basic service this fall

In the wake of recent "marathon discussions," an agreement has been announced by MuchMusic, which allows the music video channel access to every cable customer in the country, as of Sept. 2, and this should come as very good news to the music industry, especially to the record companies, who are spending vast amounts on making videos available.

Rogers Cable, the largest cable company in Canada, (with over 1.4 million subscribers in 29 major cities), has been negotiating with the pay TV network ever since the CRTC

reached its decision last November that provided for the movement of MuchMusic (and other pay TV services) over to cable distribution.

According to Colin Watson, Rogers' president, they were "tough" negotiations, but he's pleased it has ended well. "The way it's turned out," he continues, "each of the speciality channels is now getting the distribution they prefer; and Rogers is living up to the CRTC's expectations that the cable industry should carry on basic all speciality channels that are 'authorized and available'."

While MuchMusic's Moses Znaimer hopes now that other cable operators will follow suit, "I think we've come up with a creative solution to the impasse while still meeting the spirit of the CRTC's recent decisions."

"The Minister of Communications," he concludes, "on behalf of the Government of Canada, has indicated that it considers the musical culture of this country as being of prime importance, so we're hoping that this deal will catch on so there will be no distribution."

## Sweden solves problem of parallel imports

Sweden is one European country that may have significantly reduced the problem of parallel imports, a problem that has been a prime source of irritation with major labels in Canada.

Apparently, Ahlens, Sweden's largest record retailer, which accounts for 5 percent of the country's total pre-recorded music market, has agreed to stop importing records and tapes.

Major record labels in Sweden were continually trying to persuade Ahlens to buy from them directly, to no avail. Even Sweden's IFPI repeatedly sought court rulings in an effort to ease the problem, but they were unsuccessful. Fortunately, a court case in Norway, involving the payment of import licenses, eventually provided Scandinavian mechanical rights society, NCB, the opportunity to open negotiations directly with Ahlens. The retailer reportedly agreed to pay full copyright to NCB for all past and future imports, an arrangement that would have cost Ahlens upwards of \$10 million dollars, had they not announced that they would stop parallel importing altogether.

## Coney Hatch's Curran signed to Alert

Andy Curran, the founding member, bassist and co-writer of Coney Hatch, has been signed to the Alert Records and Management rosters.

Liza Zbitnew, of Alert Music, points out that "some of the most anthemic songs of Coney Hatch's three album career, including Monkey Bars and Stand Up," were written by Curran.

Curran is currently taking a break from touring to work on new material with co-writer Tim Broyd and former Coney Hatch guitarist Steve Shelski. A recording session is in the works for late summer, with labelmate Kim Mitchell tentatively slated as producer.

## BMG Classics signs Ofra Harnoy worldwide

Michael Engelbert of BMG Classics, Canada, has announced that Ofra Harnoy has signed an "exclusive worldwide" contract with BMG Classics. Initial release under the new long-term agreement is Vivaldi Concertos For Cello, with Paul Robinson conducting the Toronto Chamber Orchestra. The album, produced by Jacob Harnoy, at Toronto's St. Timothy Church, utilizing the Sony PCM system, has been released on the RCA Victor Red Seal label.

The young Harnoy was born in Israel in 1965. Soon after moving to Canada, she made her professional debut at age 10 as a soloist with orchestra. She was also the first prize winner of the 1978 Montreal Symphony Competition, and in 1979 of the Canadian Music Competition, going on, in 1982 to win the Concert Artist Guild Award in New York, the youngest recipient in the 35 year history of this competition. She made her solo-orchestral and recital debuts in New York's Carnegie Hall in December of that same year, and was selected by the Musical America magazine as the Young Musician of The Year for 1983.

Harnoy previously released on Fan Fair, a Toronto-based classical/pop label.

The release becomes effective immediately.

## Island's Cash to play London's Mean Fiddler

Andrew Cash, recently signed to the Island label, will play his first out-of-Canada date, when he opens at the Mean Fiddler in London, England (July 4). This date will also give him the opportunity to meet Island's head office personnel and their European licensees.


Cash has just returned to Toronto from a Western Canada promotion tour, which coincided with the release of his Island debut album, *Time And Place*. He guested with Vancouver's 54-40 at the Ontario Place Forum in Toronto (June 16), and will play the Mariposa Folk Festival (25). He will headline the Anti-Free Trade Show at Toronto's R.P.M. Club (30), followed by an afternoon set at the Canada Day Molson Park Festival.

Running simultaneous to his live dates will be the shooting of *Smile Me Down*, the second video from *Time And Place*. Robin Millar will direct. The single was recently remixed by Kenny Macdonald at Park Lane Studios in Glasgow, Scotland.

The album has now shipped in the U.S., and will be released in England in July and throughout Europe in August.

Cash is managed by William Tenn Management, with offices in Toronto.



## Leonard Cohen firmed for Carnegie Hall date

Columbia recording artist Leonard Cohen will cap his current European tour with four U.S. concert dates in July. The tour has been an excellent promotion vehicle for his new album, *I'm Your Man*, which has already sold more than 500,000 copies outside the U.S.. He began his European tour Apr. 5 in Frankfurt, and just recently performed at the charity Prince's Trust concerts in London, and is scheduled to play two nights at the Lykabettus Amphitheatre in Athens, the Leugardalsholl in Reykjavik, Iceland, the Varvet Festival in Stockholm and the Roskilde Festival in Copenhagen.

In the U.S. he will be playing The Ritz in New York (July 5), New York's Carnegie Hall (6), the Orpheum Theatre in San Francisco (8), and the Wiltern Theatre in Los Angeles (11).

## Tickle fine tunes yet another CBS artist's LP

Veteran producer David Tickle is certainly becoming quite familiar with the Canadian music scene, especially the offices of CBS these days. He has already worked on such formidable productions by Platinum Blonde, Gowan and now Barney Bentall And The Legendary Hearts, a rock 'n' roll band hailing from Vancouver and formerly known as either Brandon Wolf or The Revengers, depending on how far back into the band's history one wishes to travel.

Hence, time is relative, says Bentall, when asked about the length of time it took to record their self-titled debut. Apparently, he and his bands have been playing the club scene for "a long time" while then in retrospect, it didn't really take "a long time" to record since his signing to both Epic Records and Bernie Finkelstein Management last February. He admits however that it did take "quite a while" to record, "but you just don't rush these things."

So, in one day, they took the step that moved them from merely "surviving in the twilight zone" of the music industry into the hands of a manager with international repute and a recording contract with a "major" label, and this is all relative to Bentall as well. Even having Tickle produce (and he is known for his work with Peter Gabriel, Split Enz and Rod Stewart also), didn't create the excitement expected for this relatively unknown group of musicians.

"There were other choices," Bentall explains, acknowledging Tickle's wizardry as sound engineer. "But David responded in the best way. It's not like there were people lined up at the door . . . I mean, it's a new thing, and we had to find somebody who really liked what they heard and who wanted to approach it in a way that we could live with, and David was right along those lines."

"He walked a fine line and didn't change

a lot, but what he did change . . . in my opinion, were the right things. He simplified some things and altered some arrangements, but not a lot. We've played together a long time, and so we have a good feel among us, but he took us those few steps further, just to where we were really listening to each other; he focussed us as a band."

From an independent point of view, this record is nothing more than a collection of their hits, Bentall remarks. Yet, from their vast catalogue of material, Tickle helped to choose those songs most likely to render a respectable debut release for the band; this assistance is the artistic compromise, now having been drafted into the big leagues.

"In a sense," he continues, "this record is a greatest hits album, actually greatest non-hits . . . it's just a collection of the best of our songs to date." However, they're not the songs most popular in the clubs, because selecting songs in this fashion would be "dangerous," he adds.

"For so long we have to be judges of what we do, and that's a hard job, and then there's the crossover point where, all of a sudden, many people judge what you do and have input. Now, I think we're fortunate with Bernie and the way CBS has been to us. We think along the same lines in most respects, and they're also very sympathetic to how we feel it should be."

"We're on to a very different thing now. It's something you've worked for all your life, but there's no way you can visualize what happens from here on in . . . it's like they're two separate worlds, even though you're still playing music." For instance, a U.S. deal looks "positive" and the response has been "great", so far. "We haven't had a bad word on it . . . knock on wood. But that's why I'm really glad to have Bernie involved. He's very well connected down there."

More importantly however, Bentall believes the band will still remain, if all else fails, though it won't be from any lack of effort on the part of CBS. If the record fails, it will have been because "people don't want to listen to it," and he means the buying public.

"We've always believed in this band thing, but there's no right way to do anything. We've stuck with this combination for a long time," he concludes, "and it has gradually started to become something only acquired through time: that value of players playing together and having the whole greater than the sum of the parts."

## Henry Small touring with Who's Entwhistle

Henry Small, well known in the Canadian music industry, having toured in groups such as Scrubbalo Caine, Prism and Small Wonder, will be touring North America this summer as the lead vocalist in The John Entwhistle Band.

Small had moved to Los Angeles a few years ago where he became involved as a session vocalist and songwriter. He worked on projects with Toto, Eddie Money, Timothy Schmidt (Eagles) and Olivia Newton-John. He now lives in Kamloops, B.C., after having spent the last ten months in England, recording with Entwhistle and Zach Starkey (Ringo's son).

After his tour with the Who bassist, which begins in Long Island, New York (June 24), Small will play Canada during the month of August, after which he will be putting together his own solo album. "For the last eight years," says Small, "I've been recording for everyone else. I think finally it's time for me to record for myself."

## Gray's Rock And Roll set for Toronto run


John Gray's Rock And Roll will be presented by London's Grand Theatre, as its first Toronto venture. The play, to be staged at the Bluma Appel Theatre in the St. Lawrence Centre, has been firmed for a limited run, from Sept. 9 to Oct. 1.

Directed by Larry Lilo, the Canadian rock musical will feature the original London company: Doug Bennett, Maurice Godin, Louise Pitre, Randy Kempf, David Kirby, and Alec Willows. Set and costumes are designed by Pam Johnson, with lighting by Marsha Sibthorpe. Musical Director is Doug Balfour, with Valerie Moore as choreographer and Peter Brennan as off-stage guitarist.

Rock And Roll played to 87 percent houses over its five-week London run, the hit of The Grand's season.

The cast will reassemble for a two-week rehearsal period in London, then move to Toronto for the run. Bennett, lead singer of Doug And The Slugs, will take a breather from his current Canadian tour to recreate his portrayal of Parker, the "fat kid who sings".

Godin returns as the ghost of rock and roll, Screamin' John. Also featured are Pitre as Shirly, Kempf as Chink, Kirby as Brent, and Willows, who originated the role, as Manny.



# Goodbye Charlie . . . !!

Goodbye Charlie . . . ? Forget it, he's just entering a new phase of his life, so hopefully, he'll be getting underfoot for quite a few years to come. Charlie has trained his twins (Rick and Ron) well, so, in fact, he's leaving a living legacy behind and, ironically, both are with his old alma mater, CBS Records Canada. Rarely has there been anyone in the record industry to measure up to the dedication and devotion to the business like Charlie Camilleri.

Charlie Camilleri is retiring from CBS Records Canada . . . and that's a fact. The truth however, is that retiring is further from his mind. "Hey . . . I've got a lot of things to do . . . play a little more golf, and there's hundreds of things to do at the Variety Club . . . and then there's the Blue Jays, I can't miss one of their home games . . . and the Argos. Retirement . . . hell I've still got a 100 percent of me to give . . . so why quit now.!!"

That's Charlie . . . low profiling it right to the end. His old friends wonder how he ever became so well known. He was always doing something for someone or some organization, but was never around to take bows.

Born in Toronto's west end, Charlie got his football knocks through Parkdale Collegiate and St. Michael's. However, he had to put his education on hold . . . Charlie went to war . . . the big war . . . WWII, joining the Canadian Navy in 1940. HMCS York in Toronto was his first tour of duty, and when it was discovered he was better at football than sailoring, he became an important player on the Navy team, and along with being trained as a wireless telegrapher, he played a full fall season of football.

The war finally caught up to him, and he boarded HMCS Gatineau for a run up and down the English Channel, chasing German U-Boats.

After the war, Charlie, with a little help from old Navy coach Teddy Morris, who was then coach of the Toronto Argonauts, joined the Toronto club and played the 1946-47 and '48 seasons, winning a Grey Cup in 1946. Check out his ring.

After a short stint as a civil servant and through circuitous means, Charlie became one of the early employees of Columbia Records Canada.

"During the time of Bob Pampe (President of Columbia Records Canada), in the late '50s," recalls longtime friend and labelmate, Jack Robertson, "when Charlie and I were both bachelors, he was selling Columbia Records for our independent distributor. In 1958, as head of the new branch distribution, I worked directly with Charlie, and we did a great deal of field work together. He was great with radio, artists touring and company PR, and became the first National Promotion Manager in our head office. He was a bit of a pioneer. We've both been from San Juan to San Francisco, from Los Angeles to London and from Miami to Vegas, but our many Nashville trips, which established Charlie as the



primary country promo man, were the ones I remember most. Hard work, but great fun, especially when Harry Dunnette and Gordy Tapp were there."

Variety's Al Dubin has known Charlie for more than 40 years. "I remember Charlie during the Mercury Records days," says Dubin. "I know he once sued the City of Toronto . . . for building the sidewalk too close to his ass. He was always too short for his height, but he was always tall in the saddle." Say something nice about Charlie, Al. "That's it, he was always tall in the saddle."

Is there anyone closer to Charlie than CBS Records, the Variety Club, golf, the Blue Jays or Argos? You bet, and her name is Peggy, his wife. "The love of my life, all of my life," says Charlie. "She was always there when I needed a lift, a different outlook, another opinion, and she's why I've always given 100 percent of myself, no matter what I was doing."


How about a word from Peggy: "I think Charlie is really going to miss the record business, and I hope he will still have some type of involvement. He may not be a millionaire, but he has a million dollars' worth of memories. At the moment he's looking forward to the Variety Club, the golf course, and the Blue Jays . . . and the Argos."

"The record business has been very good to Charlie and I . . . and we've been very good to the record business . . . because we have given them the twins . . ."



## CRTC seeking comments on network policies

The CRTC has issued two public notices calling for comments on its proposed radio and television network policies. "Radio and television networks continue to be a significant element in our broadcasting system and the Commission anticipates that they will contribute in the future to improving that system," said Andre Bureau, Chairman of the CRTC. "This is why the Commission seeks to clarify and simplify its policy framework for networks."

It was pointed out that when the radio and television regulations were revised in 1986 and 1987, respectively, the CRTC considered that the regulations were not the appropriate place to set out general policies regarding the operation of networks. It was stressed however, that in both instances, the Commission "has retained in its radio and television regulations, the prohibition against Canadian stations affiliating with foreign networks."

There were two separate notices issued for radio and television by the Commission, recognizing the different roles networks played in each media. In radio, for instance, network programming is used to complement local programming, whereas in television, network programming plays what the Commission describes as "a larger role in the schedules of local stations, particularly during evening viewing hours."

The Commission suggests that their proposed network and syndication policy for radio "provides a more streamlined, efficient and flexible framework to meet the objectives

## Port Coquitlan's Mearns releases on Can-Vas

Port Coquitlan's Rick Mearns, makes an impressive bid for the charts with his debut on the Can-Vas label. The single, She's Not For You, a Mearns original, was produced by Gary Lamb at Sound Connection in Nashville. John D. Loudermilk was the engineer on the session.

It wasn't always country for the 29 year old Mearns. He took an interest in music at the age of 12, "about the same time I was involved in the art of magic," says Mearns, continuing with "It was great . . . if someone didn't like the way I played, I'd vanish them."

Actually his real music career began when he was 17 as a pro drummer playing both live and in the studio. He recorded in the summer of 1980 and toured across Canada with The Volts, an all original rhythm and blues band. They were promoting their LP, Plugged In, which was recorded and mixed at Vancouver's Ocean/Mushroom Studios. The band split shortly after, and Mearns took on the job as house drummer at The Boot, a country-rock club in Williams Lake, B.C. "It was my first taste of country music," says Mearns, "and I've been eating it ever since."

Mearns replaced his drum kit with an electric guitar in 1984, and quickly became one of the most popular hi-tech single acts on the B.C. circuit. He is mounting a major promotion campaign for his new single, and if successful, will move across the country on a promotion tour.

of the Broadcasting Act, and has sought to clarify and make consistent the criteria used to define what constitutes a radio network and to eliminate licensing where no regulatory objective is served."

The Commission apparently believes the primary responsibility of AM and FM licensees is to "provide locally-oriented and original programming suited to the needs, interests and character of the community being served." The CRTC recognizes however, the benefits, stations may derive from the use of network and syndicated programs, and with this in mind, is seeking to ensure that network and syndicated programs distributed and broadcast in Canada "maximize the use and exposure of Canadian artists and technicians."

The Commission proposes that radio network operators, distributing a weekly average of more than seven hours of network programming per year, "Provide a minimum of 66 percent of total programming time per

year of Canadian material." Similary, the CRTC proposes that "at least 66 percent of all acquired programs broadcast by AM and FM stations be Canadian.

The proposed policy for television networks, as with radio, is seeking to refine the definition of a network and simplify the licensing approach. As pointed out by a Commission spokesperson, "According to today's proposal, in situations where the requirement for licensing a program distribution operation as a network is not immediately clear," and the Commission "would consider the potential impact of that operation on the Canadian broadcasting system as a whole," concluding with "The CRTC will expect commitments in respect of Canadian content from program service providers in exchange for their access to the broadcasting system."
