





## Breweries gearing for rock dominance at CNE



## Jitters offer reward for return of stolen guitars

Since their signing to Capitol-EMI last July, the Jitters' first anniversary celebration was soured with the theft of six guitars from their van this past month. According to the band's manager, Evan Adelman, flyers have been distributed to all music-related stores and pawn shops in the Hamilton area. Unfortunately, to date, their efforts have gone unrewarded.

"Interestingly enough," explains Adelman, "We were able to cross Canada twice, tour the U.K. (with Heart) et cetera, without incident, and then, we were 'ripped off' in Hamilton the day the band's stage gear returned from Vancouver. We'll certainly never leave a loaded vehicle parked on the street overnight again, tinted windows or not."

The Jitters most recently performed in front of 13,000 people at the Ontario Place Forum on Canada Day and are presently writing material for their follow-up album. Their debut has yielded four singles, including the most recent, Go Ahead 'N' Love Me, which continues to gain momentum at radio. "Incidentally," concludes Adelman, "the Edmonton Oilers used the band's single, Closer Every Day, as their theme song on their drive to the Stanley Cup."

## Adams' European tour sets another record

Bryan Adams capped the second leg of his Into The Fire European tour with yet another record-breaking date, this one in Lisbon, "in front of the largest rock music crowd in the country's history on July 9," reports Adams' publicity contact, Kimberley Blake. There were more than 30,000 Portuguese fans on hand for the Adams date that went on well over the scheduled two hours. The highlight was his duet with Bonnie Tyler, during which they performed Straight From The Heart and No Way To Treat A Lady. Both songs, written by Adams, were previous hits for Tyler.

With the Lisbon date, Adams capped the second leg of his tour, and is currently in session at London's Olympic Studios with producer Steve Lillywhite (U2, Talking Heads, Rolling Stones, Pretenders, Pogues). The Lillywhite-produced A&M album, slated for release early next year, will be completed in Vancouver early August.

## Mortifee to Grand for one night

Ann Mortifee will perform in concert with her band, on the stage of London's Grand Theatre, for one night only, Aug 10.

Mortifee is well known as a recording artist and composer and has written several ballet scores including The Ecstasy of Rita Joe performed by the Royal Winnipeg Ballet; A Yesterday's Day, which she composed for Les Grands Ballets Canadiens; the Grey Goose of Silence for North Carolina Dance Theatre; and Klee Wyck, a ballet for Emily based on the life and work of Canadian artist Emily Carr.

Mortifee is somewhat of a legend in live theatre, having starred in several musicals including Jacques Brel Is Alive And Well And Living In Paris, I'm Getting My Act Together And Taking It On The Road, plus four of her own One Woman shows. Most recently she played the lead in the Cleveland Playhouse premiere of The Arabian Knight for which she wrote the music and lyrics.

Plans are already underway for next year's awards show, scheduled for May 13 at Toronto's Royal York Hotel.

As well, top session people in the business have been hired for the project. These include guitarists Elliot Randall (Steely Dan) and Elliot Easton (The Cars), bassist Will Lee (David Letterman Show), keyboardist Robbie Condor (The Color Of Money) and drummer Allan Schwartzburg (Everyone).


## Mill and Stillie to CBS as account service reps

there was a growing number of industry people angry about the government grants being forced on the industry, I received several interesting calls . . . all from major writers with important dailies. I understand they are now canvassing the industry, which will result in heavy news pieces on government funding. (*EC: How much . . . to who . . . ?*)

**Why bother to deregulate . . . !** While some broadcasters are anxious for deregulation, our Flora drops the bombshell that there could be "hundreds of new (AM) radio stations going to air" over the next couple of years. This expansion of the AM dial has apparently come about through Canada signing an international agreement with the U.S. and other countries in South and Central America. (*EC: I think I'll apply for a broadcast license and maybe Rosie The Clown could submit an application!*)

**What a coup for Baton . . . !** The CBC had one of the best news anchor people in the business, and they let him go. Mike Duffy, the top political "nose for news" in the business, has quit the CBC and joins Baton Broadcasting to anchor his own public affairs show, which will go to air in late fall. (*EC: Will it be called Duffy's Tavern . . . ?*)

**Is there trouble in CD land . . . ?** Well, on top of the problem of only a 10 or 12 percent penetration of the Canadian market for compact disc hardware, comes the rumour that over a period of time, oxidation threatens the surface of the compact disc. I've yet to see anything like this on my compact discs, and I've had them from the beginning. They also tell me there's a problem of skipping with the CD auto units. Now who could be starting these rumours? (*EC: So DAT's who's behind it!*)

**Damned hit doesn't miss . . .** and it will run. That's my prediction for the Ed and David Mirvish Damned Yankee production currently premiering at Toronto's Royal Alexandra. The all-Canadian cast, with the exception of David Gaines, an American, do an unbelievable job of recreating the show which originally premiered on Broadway in 1955. The story is as new today as it was back then and although the Canadian cast is excellent, Gaines does stand out as a big theatrical star in the making. The stage presence of this young man and his amazing voice steals the show. The Mirvishes again prove that theatre can be great in Canada when you choose the right people and put up the right amount of capital. Co-producer Marlene Smith, who brought Cats to Canada has again come up with a show which will no doubt be a success across Canada. Be there when it plays your neighborhood legit house! (*EC: Run, not to miss this hit!*) and other baseball cliches!

**PR where it's needed . . . !** With the exception of one brewery (*EC: How about an initial or at least a brand name!*) the PR approach is dismal to say the least. If they're going to get into the entertainment business perhaps they should change their PR approach. It's quite a different kettle of beer (*EC: Kettle of beer?*) when it comes to PRing tavern owners, as opposed to the movers and shakers in the entertainment field. (*EC:*

*Yeah! But they got the big bucks!*) And besides, money can only buy so much time. (*EC: Are you talking about airtime . . . ?*) Can I suggest a good PR firm? (*EC: How about an initial . . . at least!*)

**Someone stepped on his ego?** There's trouble in the land of the dailies. Confirm or deny . . . a major player at one of the giant dailies isn't too happy with his new beat, which goes to prove that music critics are really the "darlings" of the dailies. (*EC: Who's going to deny that? What power these "navel gazers" must have!*) Has there been an ultimatum delivered? Will we scratch one, or will we see the return of a slightly dented, but well fed "musicologist" to the REAL world? (*EC: At least tell us what city . . . !*)

**Quality shows quality and then some.** It was nice to see all the new product that will be coming out of the Quality Special Products camp. At a lush presentation at Toronto's Wharton Renaissance, Bernie Willock and his group showed their wares at a reception like none yet. Not only well put together, but the PR that was generated in that room was something they can be as proud of as they are of their product. Congratulations (*EC: And he's usually not easily impressed!*)

**Imperial Room has tits and ass!** Is this the end of the eighties? The internationally-famous Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel moved right into the eighties with their current night club presentation of High Voltage. It was a Las Vegas-type show that brought this club into the major league, and no one could be offended by the tasteful nudity that took place. You can take your mother or your maiden aunt. They'll love it, and the high-stepping energized show brings a new meaning to the Imperial Room. Let's have more of this!

**Get out of town . . . ?** Was a certain record company told to get out of town and get where the action is? (*EC: We all know who "a certain record company" is . . . !*)

**The making of a hit . . . !** Every once in awhile I walk into RPM's chart department to see what's happening and to take a look at the results of all our research. Just thought I'd tell you about a few of the records our research is predicting big things for: Rag Doll (Aerosmith), All Fired Up (Pat Benatar), Monkey (George Michael), People Have The Power (Patti Smith), and My Secret Place (Joni Mitchell). (*EC: Mark his words . . . !*)

The first person who'll admit that mistakes were made and a valuable lesson was learned, in fact, following her impressive showing at the 1986 Juno Awards, is the one who actually had the most to lose, Liberty Silver. Simply put, nothing was gained and it was coincidental that her debut album was recorded at all. Only Bryan Adams won more Junos that fateful year and although praise for Silver's talents came from afar, her label had only pressed one thousand copies of her winning single.

Hence, after demand had waned sufficiently, over the next two years, and a great deal of soul searching, Silver severed her ties with her previous label and returned to the clubs, shortly thereafter to be "discovered" by Joel Wertman, who promptly signed her to his Eureka label.

"He was just as frustrated about me as I was," explains Silver, "and it's hard to find somebody like that . . . who will actually say something and then go out and do it. From

what I'm doing now to what I was doing back then, I've taken a 365 degree turn and my life has changed totally. I've learned more about the proper side of the business, rather than just going out and trying to make it work."

In essence, Silver's is a tragic story: the star system was really working, but the star wasn't. Having been tied into deals above and beyond her control, fate slipped out of her hands and she was determined that it would never happen again. Canada certainly can't boast of many female stars of international repute, even though this past year the likes of Madonna, Tiffany, Debbie Gibson and lately Tracy Chapman have graced the top of the charts.

Silver, who has been singing professionally for more than a decade, could be on her way, as her latest single, Let It Begin Tonight, from her Private Property album has gained a foothold at radio recently. From jingles to festivals, from Tears Are Not Enough to the many other charitable organizations which have benefitted from her multi-octave range, Silver's track record is considerable and impressive; seemingly her debut is long overdue.

"It takes a lot to get yourself molded and developed," she admits, suggesting also the experience could never have been bought. "I was ready five years ago, but I got myself into a situation with people who didn't know what they were doing. I was pushed in the wrong direction and I got caught up in that. Not because I wanted to, but because I was there and I had a commitment, and the only thing I could do was try to make the best of a bad situation.

"I could have done this a long time ago, but it's the right time now. I've been through enough things and I know what's right and

what's wrong. Now I can see a clearer path and I can see there's light at the end of the tunnel. Whether it's a 40 or a 100 hundred watt bulb, at least I know what's happening along the way."

Besides, and as her Juno in the R&B category concurs, Silver is not in the same category as some of those aforementioned singers anyway. "It's taken a long time for me," she continues. "But I needed to learn certain things and I don't think without the experience that I have now, I could do it properly and I think that's what really counts.

"A lot of bands are pushed into it too quickly," Silver concludes. "Some singers just go from the street into the studio and they're instant hits, and it takes a lot out of them. But there's a new generation of musician coming up and they're more apt to start earlier, and finish earlier. Young appeals to young, so obviously they are going to sell a lot more records, because young people buy a lot more records. Yet I feel that because of the experience I've had, and dealing with all those kinds of things, I'm more prepared. I'm almost over-prepared, but I'm not frustrated."







## SBK ships new Chipkar single

SBK Songs has mailed their latest Glen Chipkar single, *Breakin' Me*, his follow-up to *Need Another Girl*, which was sent to radio programmers a few months ago, and which ironically, is the flip of the new single. Chipkar's video for *Need Another Girl* was on medium rotation with video shows nationally, and is still getting good exposure in the province of Quebec.

The video for the new single, which was shot in downtown Toronto during the late night hours, has received the nod from several video shows across the country. The single was produced by Chipkar at Metalworks and mixed at Manta Sound by Tim Thorney.

Shipping singles to radio only is a unique method of shopping song material by SBK, resulting in performance royalties for the songwriter and publisher as well as possibly influencing a major label into picking up the artist.

## A first for Brockville CHXL-FM goes to air

A broadcast history-making event will take place July 28th, 1988 at 1:03 pm when CHXL 103.7 FM will sign on, Brockville's first and only FM radio station.

The launch of the station is apparently the culmination of several attempts to establish an FM station for the area. John Radford, previous owner of CFJR, had originally applied for an FM license in 1985, which was denied by the CRTC. He reapplied and was granted an FM license in early 1987, shortly after, selling the station and the new (not yet on the air) FM franchise to St. Lawrence Broadcasting. The latter also owns and operates CKLC and CFLY in Kingston.

As CHXL General Manager Linda Benoit points out, the station "will fill a very great need in this community." It has been suggested that better than 70 percent of the available radio audience in Brockville and surrounding area is tuning to out-of-market radio stations. "Clearly," continues Benoit, "there's a demand for a station to serve Eastern Ontario with a high-quality FM signal which responds to the particular needs of its residents."

As Program Director Gord Watts explains, the station will employ new broadcast technology known as Systemation, a computer-controlled digital audio system which transmits compact disc quality and lessens the amount of time spent by announcers running equipment, "allowing them to do what they do best," says Watts, "communicate with the listener."

"CHXL will be a prototype station," Watts goes on to explain, "and will no doubt be scrutinized carefully by several stations across the country planning to eventually employ the system themselves."

"With the high quality FM signal," Watts concludes, "the new technology and the need for such service in the market, the launch of CHXL is an enormously exciting proposition."

Besides Benoit (formerly of CJSB Ottawa) and Watts (formerly Charlie Watts of CHRO Pembroke), the station comprises News Director Randall Moore (formerly of CJSB Ottawa), Music Director Greg Hinton (formerly of AM63 CFCO Chatham), morning personality Bob Cowan (formerly of Brockville's CFJR), afternoon personality Mark Paine (formerly of BX-93 London), evening personality Jane Douglas (formerly of 54 Lite Rock Ottawa), morning news Tammy Martin (formerly of OJR Renfrew), afternoon news Mike Patterson (formerly of CIXX-FM London), sportscaster Dan Madden (formerly of CJTN Trenton), and Promotions Director Chris Izatt (formerly of CKLC Kingston).


## Famous People's Dupuy into Sounds Interchange



Do you remember Brian Wilson? A lot of people in the music business do, judging by the liner notes. Notable playing credits go to Elliot Easton (The Cars), and Jeff Lynne (ELO) who also co-wrote and co-produced Let It Shine, while Christopher Cross (on Night Time) and Terence Trent D'Arby (on Walkin' The Line) make guest vocal appearances. Five of the eleven tracks were mixed by Hugh Padgham. The performances of these, and a plethora of other artists, unfortunately are insufficient to keep this ship from sinking. The material is disappointingly weak, not even coming close to the results he had with the Beach Boys, although the vocal arrangements are practically identical. Wilson deserves better than to be remembered for this one.



**RUN D.M.C.** - Rap  
Tougher Than Leather  
London/Profile - 828 070-1-Q

The new release by rap's premiere trio is, for the most part, a predictable collection of lyrics, scratching and the occasional power chord from a guitar. Reminiscent of their last effort, Tougher Than Leather contains a track about high school situations (Miss Elaine), a cover version of an old hit (Mary, Mary), written by Mike Nesmith of the Monkees, and a tune combining rap with a more established musical style (Ragtime). Polish those thick, gold chains and dust off your high-tops.

**THE RANDYPETERS** - Pop/Rock  
You Thought I Was Foolin'  
Amok - 520

The latest release from the Amok label, this mini-LP is not as raunchy as it pretends to be. The material is split down the middle between energetic,

country influenced rockers and ballads, one of which, Why Should Lovers Die (Intro), even features a synth. Having already charted well at alternative and college radio stations, the Randypeters are actually suitable for mainstream airplay. The intricate harmonies contained on most tracks, especially Lovelost, although enjoyable, seem inconsistent with the band's denim and leather, Jack Daniels image.

**JOHN KILZER** - Rock  
Memory in The Making

Kilzer, and his songwriting style (rock 'n' roll), join a label already teeming with proven artists and yet his debut is no less worthy than any before it; a potent discovery. Strong lyrics are matched with a fury of guitar on this fast paced and entertaining observatory piece of small town life. Although his vocals are quite easy to parallel, his songs are original and certainly powerful enough to warrant early attention. Apparently Kilzer, a former English teacher at Memphis State, will be touring with the Moody Blues shortly, even though he never played guitar prior to graduating, just basketball. Produced by Keith Sykes and John Hampton.



**CLEAN SLATE** - Pop/Rock

The fact that this band could attract Rush guitarist Alex Lifeson to produce its debut effort is enough to warrant a first look. The music contained on the disc is enough to demand a second. The energy of the performances and the accessibility of the songs explain why Clean Slate, formerly Tabula Rasa, won the Q107 Homegrown contest two years ago. Their powerful guitar-oriented sound, complemented by the soulful vocals of lead singer Jon Link, form a combination destined for success. Anthem already has plans in the works for the fall/winter release of a full album consisting entirely of previously unreleased material. The first single, Survivor, is the strongest of the tracks, and is a likely candidate for CHR popularity.

**IGGY POP** - Pop/Rock

Pompous and vain as he might be, Iggy Pop has returned with an album without any assistance from David Bowie, and it shines with a clean virtuosity only he could deliver. This, then, is his album; unfortunately at times it seems as if Billy Idol were actually playing. Bill Laswell has recorded flawlessly an artist once idolized for his flaws and Pop's songs are equally as flawless, simply without character. Perhaps to the discerning fan, this might present a problem, because now Iggy Pop doesn't stand out in the crowd as he once did, quite blatantly too. Bang bang, the soldier has fallen, his instinct failing him at his most crucial moment.

For his diversity of topics, Bergmann deserves much credit, though artistic revelations about what it's supposedly like at the bottom, in the ditch, wear terribly thin when they are, in fact, really nothing special at all. At times, this Vancouverite's tales of woe at home and in love, or failed aspirations all sound too common; yet his similes and metaphors are colourful, to say the least. The songs are certain to attract those in analogous situations, just like the punk movement attracted punks, unfortunately his live performance will garner an audience of that ilk anyway, as John Cale has produced nothing that will reach CHR this time.

**SPIRIT OF THE WEST** - Pop/Rock

It's been a long time since a Canadian record has been released that has sounded so dramatic and so unique. Brilliant lyrical content and wonderful music combine to elevate thoughts about love and politics, simple observations and philosophy. It stands alone as a testament to artistic integrity and poetic justice in today's labyrinth of pretense and ideology. Recorded by the band and Danny Greenspoon at Vancouver's Blue Wave Studios. Political has been taken as a single from the album.



**TEENAGE HEAD**

Long gone are the days of Head Hysteria. Also gone is their distinct logo, and yet although new lead singer Dave Rave can't seem to cut it on stage, this album does actually contain some feisty numbers worthy of the band's repuete. Unfortunately, the assistance of both Malcolm Burn and Daniel Lanois does little to really impress the average listener, yet songs like She Rips My Lips and Full Time Fool should. Ramones-ish in places and very familiar chord structures provide potential, but a lack of promotion and management will hurt.
