Cinram and CBS sign manufacturing deal

CBS Records Canada has announced the signing of a long-term compact disc and vinyl record pressing agreement with Cinram for the manufacturing of all CBS Canada's CD and vinyl record pressing requirements for Canada. CBS had previously imported all of its CDs from the U.S. and Japan but manufactured their vinyl records at its own record pressing facility in Toronto.

Although the Canadian operation will continue to manufacture its own cassettes at its Toronto facility, it will be necessary to restructure the manufacturing operations. This move will result in the reduction of staff by approximately 95 people, many of whom will be offered employment by Cinram, who will obviously need the extra, already trained, staff to handle the additional CBS volume.

Jack Robertson, Senior Vice President, Operations, for CBS Records Canada, revealed the company has developed job search and employee assistance programs, utilizing outside consultants and government

agencies, both federal and provincial, in an effort to find other employment for the affected employees. As well, the company is providing a compensation package, which, says Robertson, "exceeds provincial employment standards requirements."

The decision was obviously a difficult one to make, and as the organization's president Bernie DiMatteo notes, "We know the impact our decision will have on each member of our staff. We sincerely appreciate the commitment, effort and contributions

Eno's new Opal label to feature Lanois album

Among other artists featured on Brian Eno's latest musical endeavour, Opal Records, are Daniel Lanois and John Paul Jones.

The first product released includes albums from Hugo Largo, Harold Budd, Roger Eno and Music For Films 3, a compilation project which will feature some of Lanois' music and is expected the first week of September.

This past week the label was launched in Los Angeles, with Eno putting on a display (an audio-visual "installation" titled *Latest Flames*) to coincide with the new albums, distributed by Warner Bros. worldwide.

Apparently there are also plans to introduce Russian musicians and their work to world markets, as Opal has just completed co-producing a program with the USSR state-run television station, Gosteleradio, highlighting some of their "unknown" musicians. In fact, Music For Films features Lydia Theremin and Mikhail Mahlin. The former's grandfather invented the Theremin-Vox in 1920, an instrument described as producing "a sound nearer that of a choir of angels than any modern technology can attempt."

FACTOR pulls plug on Quebec/B.C. Demo loans

FACTOR's Board of Directors announced (Aug 16), they can no longer accept New Talent Demo Award applications from British Columbia and Quebec. The funds for the current year are reportedly "fully subscribed". Funds for these programs are allocated on a per capita basis for the various regions of Canada.

FACTOR's Heather Sym also advises that funds for the International Tour Support Program are exhausted as well, therefore no further applications are being accepted at this time. FACTOR administers the tour program on behalf of the Department of Communications, which provides funding for foreign touring activities by Canadian artists.

The above follows FACTOR's July 27/88 announcement that "funds for individual FACTOR loans have run out" (RPM, Aug 6/88).

Apparently the Department of Communications has not yet made a decision regarding FACTOR's proposal for an increase in its annual contribution through the Sound Recording Development Program.

Industry insiders predict up to \$1.00 price hike

Stephen Ostick, who writes the Pop Beat for the Winnipeg Free Press, has tapped industry retail and manufacturer contacts, along with the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency for a revealing piece in his Aug 12th column. "Music lovers can expect to pay about \$1 more for LPs, cassette tapes and compact discs, as early as October," reports Ostick.

Cyril Devereux of the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA) told Ostick the agency has agreed to a new royalty rate record companies will pay to songwriters, effective Oct. 1, to which record companies and retailers will "certainly" add an increase and "pass it on" to the public.

Ostick quoted Jason Sniderman, of Roblan Distributors, the distribution arm of the 115-store Sam The Record Man chain, as saying, "Thank God they're finally paying a decent rate for songs, but unfortunately we'll eventually pass it on."

As Ostick pointed out, the CMRRA has confirmed the new rate of 5.25 cents per song has been agreed upon by music publishers and record companies. "For a 10-song LP, tape or CD," says Ostick, "that would mean an increase in the songwriter's share to 52 cents from 20. Retail and record company increases tacked on account for the total jump of about \$1.00."

Garry Newman, Vice President Sales for WEA Music Canada, was quoted as saying, "We'll add anywhere from 13 to 33 cents. We haven't made the decision yet about whether to increase prices Oct. 1 or wait until the new year."

Dirty Dancing breaks Diamond in Canada

The Dirty Dancing soundtrack has been registered by BMG Music Canada as having attained diamond status (signifying sales of over one million units). U.S. sales have topped the seven million mark, while more than four million copies have been sold internationally, outside of North America, registering 12 million copies sold worldwide.

The Dirty Dancing album topped the RPM 100 on Feb. 27th of this year, maintaining this position for fourteen weeks until May 28 and is still a Top 10 chart item after 47 weeks.


The soundtrack which holds Top 10 chart positions in many other territories of the world, spawned four singles, including the Oscar and Grammy award-winning *Time Of My Life*, performed by Bill Medley and Jennifer Warnes. Medley was in Toronto recently where he received RCA gold for *Time Of My Life* from BMG Music Canada's President and General Manager Don Kollar.

Dirty Dancing will be presented as a half-hour series this fall by Vestron Television Productions, in association with Steve Tisch and Mitchell Cannold with Kenny Ortega, who have adapted the film for television (Ortega choreographed the original

feature film). The series, to be seen on the CTV Television Network, will star Patrick Cassidy as Johnny, Constance Marie as Penny, Melora Hardin as Baby, and McLean Stevenson as Max Kellerman.

Slumping sales figures something to CRIA about

If the mid-1988 statistics from CRIA are any indication, then there are some disturbing patterns that will definitely be of interest to the industry. Units of LPs sold, compared to the first half of 1987, plummeted 41 percent (to 3,868,000), which is not confusing when one considers that the average list price these days is about \$12.00. The downward swing in 7" singles sales continues, with a nasty 15

percent drop in both revenue and units sold. Even cassettes, which account for more units sold than all other formats combined, sold 6 percent fewer units.

The only positive news is the dramatic increase in the popularity of the compact disc which at 3,726,000 units sold, showed a 41 percent increase and should exceed LP units sold by the end of the year.

The bottom line in this business consists of those numbers which are preceded by a dollar sign, and with increased sales of higher-priced CDs, and generally higher prices, revenue has increased by \$2,104,000, despite the fact that approximately three million fewer units have been sold.

Over the next six months, industry attention will no doubt be focussed on the public's reaction to the across-the-board price hike,

U.S. & Canadian release for Breit Bros

The Breit Bros, who were born and raised in McKerrow, Ontario (near Sudbury), will see their self-titled debut album distributed in both Canada and the U.S. by BMG Music. The deal was struck through their producer Tom Treumuth. The first single, *Going Down*, has already been serviced to radio in both countries.

The Breit Bros have appeared with several Cancon acts during their short career, including Corey Hart, Lisa Dalbello, Long John Baldry, Rational Youth, Boys Brigade and Sherry Keane, and most recently supplied back-up for Toronto's Q107 Homegrown winner Mark James Fortin.

Brothers Gary (keyboards, vocals) and Kevin (guitar) Breit co-produced the album with Treumuth in Toronto. Mixing took place in New York and England.

Lebo gets nod from Canadian retailers

Within one year of expanding its Canadian operation, Lebo, the accessories manufacturer, has acquired over 35 of the country's top retail accounts. These include Sam The Record Man, Sunrise Records & Tapes, The Hudson's Bay Company, Simpson's, HMV (formerly Mr. Sound) and Canadian Tire Corp.

Rod Boudreault, Vice President Lebo Canadian Sales, credits the firm's popularity to the quality of the product. "Canadian retailers demand the best, so Lebo has found a perfect niche in this market," says Boudreault.

To further accommodate the rapid growth in Canada, Roberta Witschger, Lebo Administrative Vice President, reports the hiring of David LeBlanc as Administrative Manager for customer services. A systems and service oriented manager, LeBlanc's responsibilities will include integrating all company business systems between Canada and the parent company's Bloomfield, New Jersey head office.

"My goal is to offer a strong commitment to quality customer service and satisfaction," notes LeBlanc, continuing with "I want Lebo to be known as the quality name

Guitarist Roy Buchanan dead at 48

Roy Buchanan, one of the most respected guitarists in the world [of recording/performing] is dead at the age of 48. He reportedly hanged himself in a Fairfax, Virginia jail cell (Aug 14) where he had been placed after having been charged with being drunk in a public place.

Buchanan had quite a memorable connection with the Toronto community of musicians, having toured with and played on recording sessions with Ronnie Hawkins during the early sixties, which led to him joining Robbie Robertson, Rick Danko and Garth Hudson, a band that eventually became The Band.

Buchanan, who was signed to the Alligator label, kept close contact with his friends in Toronto, and quite often returned to play dates.

MuchMusic to air Video Music Awards '88

MuchMusic will air the Sixth Annual MTV Video Music Awards, which is being presented live from the Universal Amphitheatre (Sept 7). Budgeted at over \$1 million, the telecast will feature performances by Cher, Rod Stewart, INXS, Elton John, Guns 'n' Roses, and Jody Watley.

Award presenters for the Dick Clark co-production includes Cyndi Lauper, Arsenio Hall, Belinda Carlisle, Teri Garr and Sam Kinnison. They will present seventeen awards during the telecast which is using the theme, *Live From The Edge*.

CBS to release Folkways superstar compilation


Expected to hit the shelves at retail next week is *Folkways: A Vision Shared*, an album featuring such artists as Bob Dylan, John Mellencamp, Bruce Springsteen, Willie Nelson and U2 paying tribute to the songs of Woody Guthrie and Huddie Ledbetter (Leadbelly). All the above were originally recorded on the Folkways label.

The Birch Tree Group of Princeton, New Jersey bought the label last year from the estate of its founder Moses Asch, and proceeds from the album will provide for the payment of the balance of the acquisition costs, and for the Smithsonian Institute's acquisition of the Woody Guthrie Archives from the Woody Guthrie Foundation.

Currently the Smithsonian curates the multi-media Folkways Archives, which includes an extensive collection of unreleased recordings, books, original glass discs and other related items. The Folkways catalogue (2,200 albums) ranges from folk, blues, country and jazz to ethnic music of America and more than "700 native peoples around the world." As well, there are instrumental and language instruction records, literary readings, children's songs and spoken word recordings, among others.

The Showtime network (U.S.) will air a one-hour special that documents the recording and most of the artists involved (Sept. 17). According to CBS, the special has not yet been syndicated for Canadian television, as negotiations are still underway. An expanded version of the documentary, produced by CBS Music Video Enterprises (CMV), will be commercially released in October.

of movement, not just in the major centres but right across the country their presence is felt in small towns and hay mounds. I thought I was drinking the REAL thing, but I'm slowly being influenced to change my lifestyle and be a fat, corporate sponsored, rock star (EC: *You're about forty years too late!*) I even heard from the backroom boys in Ottawa, that a brewery has offered to sponsor the next election. (EC: *And to think they became all powerful without a Concan ruling . . . !*)

Better than the real thing! All those country people who will be pouring into Toronto for the CCMA Awards should start to plan now to make a trip to An Evening at La Cage, which is a dinner club featuring female impersonators. You just can't miss Dolly Parton and Crystal Gayle and besides, you'll have one of the best evenings of entertainment you've had in a long time. Book early to get seats up front. I can guarantee you'll have a great night. (EC: *The best show in town!*)

Political madness . . . What a hornet's nest the Tory's have stirred up with their "steamrolling" of the new broadcast act. At least when the late Judy LaMarsh first introduced changes to her broadcast act, she allowed enough time for responses from the broadcast and recording industries. Not so this time, and even the CRTC's on the hook, and when government starts interfering in the operation of the traditionally "hands off" government agency . . . you can be sure, there will be trouble. (EC: *There's trouble brewing, right here . . . on the Hill!!*)

There can't be too many! Let's get behind every award show that helps create a star system. Do you believe we have to compete in award shows? (EC: *How counter-productive that is . . . !*)

How things change . . . It's really hard to believe just how much Canadian content there is at this year's Canadian National Exhibition. There was a time when Ben Nobleman would do his yearly criticism of the CNE for not having enough Canadian content. This year's show is just packed with Canadian artists, and we have the Canadian recording industry to thank for building a star system that makes going to the CNE a pleasure. When you think of it, the past 25 years have generated a great interest in Canada and I often think back to the music director who took a Canadian record out of my hand, tossed it into a wastepaper basket and said, "We don't play that Canadian shit!" It was shortly after that when I started RPM and it isn't referred to as "shit" anymore. (EC: *One of the easiest things to sell to Canadians is nationalism . . . !*)

Environmentalists are watching . . . I hear that every time WEA's good Captain Gilligan sets sail with his Minnow, he's being closely monitored by the Ministry of the Environment, not to mention the Ministry of Tourism. If one of the guests happens to be the Warriors' all star pitcher, they immediately close all Toronto beaches. It's easy to spot the Minnow, and its barfing passenger, streaming a mile-long scum chased by a million screaming gulls. (EC: *They're WEA critics . . . !*)

A consultant by any other name! I've quite often wondered, sometimes aloud, what a consultant really does, and then, one night I was tuned into Ed Needham's (CFRB Toronto) talk show and he gave me the answer. Remember now, this is from an on-air personality. Needham says a consultant knows how to make love 50 different ways, but he can't get a girl. (EC: *I thought that's how they got all their information . . . !*)

Speaking of CFRB . . . The other day I saw two motorists bare-knuckling it in downtown Toronto. One apparently cut the other off . . . not very decent. Guess what each had stuck on their car windows? CFRB Drive Decent stickers. (EC: *That's for the other drivers . . . !*)

How's this for a switch . . . There are some American record producers and small labels ready to petition their state governments to pressure the FCC to allow for legislation that would require radio stations in certain areas like the Atlantic Seaboard or the mid-Western states to program local talent. The complaint is that radio stations aren't leaving room for these local artists. Says one independent producer, "How can a consultant three thousand miles away, tell a radio station what's happening in their market? That sounds familiar . . . doesn't it? (EC: *Well, free trade will clear that up, along with our legislation, or are there still people out there who believe in tooth fairies . . . !*)

Refugee status . . . Thanks to the people at CPI I had the opportunity to see the Moscow Circus rehearse before their Toronto date. One of the brown bears was doing its act, when all of a sudden he or she bolted for freedom, but was caught before getting out of the tent. Apparently one of the CNE Directors, the one with the cane, told the bear about applying for refugee status. (EC: *He's always looking for cheap labour . . . the one with the cane . . . !*)

Elvis Presley for 24 hours? There's a radio station in Cincinnati going with a 24-hour straight tribute to Elvis Presley. They're working with 600 of Presley's songs. I wonder how many Gordon Lightfoot or Anne Murray songs there are . . . and what would happen if a Canadian station programmed 24 hours of either Murray or Lightfoot? (EC: *Other programmers would stone the station . . . !*)

COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Wagoneers: the latest act Nashville let get away**

It's a fact: country music can sell, and sell in very large numbers. With a little help from Randy Travis, Dwight Yoakam and, to some extent, k.d. Lang, country has virtually blown down all the restrictive barriers at retail and ably demonstrated its potential, given the same marketing techniques that are usually reserved for pop acts. However, as a source for talented songwriters, the pool remains virtually untapped. Recently, A&M have plucked a very big fish from a very big pond, The Wagoneers.

Lately, country music has been taken off the back burner and again, is being considered quite seriously by the music industry. It took the Hollywood barons and, in particular, *Urban Cowboy* to shake the foundations of the ivory towers in Nashville before a change in philosophy and direction would take place. In that lucrative era immediately following *Urban Cowboy*, country artists were forsaking their integrity for the potential of crossover and for that reason, says Wagoneer Monte Warden, the game was all but lost.

They say Austin, Texas, boasts the largest number of bands per capita. Obviously, competition for label deals is quite intense and the quality of their songwriters separates the men from the boys, so to speak. The Wagoneers' original showcases for the various labels brought the publishers into the picture. It was David Conrad of Almo who brought the band to the attention of A&M, and Nashville was quickly bypassed, though not intentionally, adds Warden.

"It says something about the way things were, and thank God they're getting better, in Nashville," he continues. "We talked to CBS, Warner Bros and Capitol and those folks we talked to were all saying 'You guys got tons of crossover potential,' and we didn't want that. We're a country band, not a pop band. So A&M was the first label to tell

us they'd give us the full country treatment. They wanted to get into country music and we were the ones they wanted to get into country music with."

To that end, the legendary Emory Gordy produced their debut, and now they're out on the road touring and promoting the album, which brought them into Toronto and Graceland, this past week. Admitting his band is "the roll of the dice" for the label, with the bright side culminating with a country division and the dark side is a flop ("and them saying 'Man, 'member when we tried country?'"), Warden is confident his songs will survive the test of time.

"The problem with good country music," he explains, "is just that enough people haven't heard it. But once you get a listener, they're yours for life. But it's hard to get that listener because there's been so much hokeyness in country music throughout the years . . . so many novelty tunes and novelty acts, and of course in the early eighties, there was so much bad country music out there."

"I think right now, the late eighties will be regarded as the same as the early sixties or the late forties, for country music. It's just a revolutionary time and a time when there's a lot of competition between the artists to put out fine records and great records; a golden time for country music."

Those periods in music brought about distinct changes in popular music, specifically rock 'n' roll, and the honesty of the country artist's music was a harbinger of the total refinement of the industry on the whole. And that change is needed perhaps now more than ever, suggests Warden, as the industry is presently riddled with superfluous imagery and pretentious characters.

"We're going to have to change it because right now, it's all faces. Think about it . . . if Buddy Holly were to come out today, he never would've made it, because MTV

would've killed him . . . same thing with the Stones. It's scary to think of all those artists that wouldn't have made it because they didn't have the look or the charisma. So, I think people are going to start leaning towards country, and country is honest again, which is its greatest asset, but it started getting away from that," he concludes. "Now . . . what you see is what you get."

Frozen Ghost gets nod from Samantha Taylor

Samantha Taylor, host of Video Hits (CBC-TV) gives *Frozen Ghost's* Round And Round video the Pick of The Week treatment (Aug 22). Debuting on the chart this week are *I'll Always Love You* by Taylor Dayne at No. 30, Peter Cetera's *One Good Woman* at No. 35, and Roman Grey's *IBU* at No. 39.

Steve Winwood remains at No. 1 this week with *Roll With It*, the second week running, followed closely by Elton John's *I Don't Wanna Go On With You*, at No. 2.

Favorite Nation video shot at Man & His World

Autograph Records began shooting the next video for *Favorite Nation* at what is left of the former American Pavilion at the Man & His World site on Ile Ste. Helene in Montreal. Titled *Without Love*, the performance piece was mounted on the multi-level stages within the biosphere, which offers a futuristic setting of geodesic patterns. The video was shot entirely on this location over a two-day period.

Inframe Productions of Montreal, which produced the band's first video, *Sometimes A Silence*, is again producing with the writer/director team of Chris Malazdrewicz and producer David Pollock.

Favorite Nation, whose lead singer Jeremie Arrobas was one of the founding members of *Men Without Hats*, will be playing Montreal's Club Soda during the month of September.

"In my research, I'm finding records that were big in Toronto, weren't necessarily that big and known in the Detroit market. Remember, we're talking



The station has also introduced a "listen" line for listener response. "I can't believe the telephone calls I'm getting," continues Trombley. "The majority of calls are very positive, and it's a good source of input that Terry [Williams] and I can use in our research."

The station did have a music test prepared by a consultant prior to Trombley's joining the station, but she and her research team do the the leg work, tapping record stores, and various trades, including RPM. Trombley finds the positioning of the classic hits with current music very challenging. "It's surprising on some of the old records we play," she points out, "that listeners call in to find out if they are new. It has a lot to do with positioning and I guess . . . through the years, having started out with Bill Drake, who created Top 40, and seeing how all of that was put together and reasons why things were done a certain way, and having that knowledge . . . I think adds to being able to present the music in a manner that makes it sound like a lot is happening."

She concludes with, "Our current music is as important to us as our sixties and seventies' music . . . they're all a very important part of blending."

CASBY Music Awards set for Oct. 13

Although the event won't be broadcast nationally on radio or television, it was pointed out that "in many ways," the CASBY is "returning to its roots," that of bringing new Canadian acts into prominence, and providing a social gathering for the entertainment industry. CFNY will be broadcasting the entire evening live to its listening audience.

The evening will begin for CFNY

listeners at 7 pm with Skot Turner and Chris Sheppard broadcasting live from the RPM club. The pair will be on throughout the evening, with the CASBY going live to air from the stage at 9 pm.

Confirmed at press time to perform are Blue Rodeo, Shuffle Demons, Spirit Of The West and The Razorbacks. This portion of the evening will run until about 10:30 pm, followed by an in-concert performance by Teenage Head and a party which will run to closing.

Ballots, which will appear in various publications, presents nominees in 16 categories. Each category provides a "fill in" section, allowing voters to supply their "people's choice".

CFNY will be programming Canadian foreground specials on this year's nominees, as part of its expanded plans for the awards show. It's hoped that this will create an early awareness for the program. These specials will be produced by CFNY's Liz Janik and Peter Goodwin and will air on three consecutive Sundays (Sept. 11, 18 and 25).

As well, CHCH-TV in Hamilton will be producing a one-hour nominees special to run early in October. This special will focus particularly on the various video and album art categories, but will also present a general overview of the nominees.

Tickets will not be generally available to the public this year. Instead, a special block of tickets may be won by CFNY listeners through various contests and on-air promotions.


