

NMS IX set to discuss Canadian marketplace

Currently the largest event of its kind in North America and expected to attract over 7,000 industry participants, this year the ninth annual New Music Seminar (New York, July 16-20), will not only feature keynote speaker Paul McGuiness, the manager of U2, and its usual variety of talent showcases, but several discussion panels have also been organized and, among the many topics slated, the Canadian market will be addressed in detail.

"We've been basically doing this off our own backs," says Intrepid Records' Graham Staris, while explaining the panel's origins. "Over the past couple of years, as the seminar itself has grown, we've been fighting for a higher Canadian profile there. Now we're getting a certain amount of credibility and it's starting to pay off."

Intrepid, an independent record company distributed in Canada by Capitol, plans to highlight and expose many Canadian acts during the convention, primarily through a compilation package available on compact disc, and perhaps with the assistance of the Canadian consular offices in New York.

"They're very eager to get involved," Staris elaborates, "and we're hoping they'll either hold a reception for the Canadian delegates and their clients, or rent a club, so there'll be a playback for the compilation." Once again though, competition for space is intense, as New York Nights: The International Music Festival will offer 13 major showcases, representing over 300 artists, in conjunction with the seminar.

Although the panelists haven't been finalized yet, each area of the Canadian music industry should be represented, he concludes. "The basic idea is to give insight to the international industry of what goes on up here, so there'll be people from all the different aspects; someone from one of the major labels, managers from some of the groups, somebody from radio, somebody from publishing . . ."

Westwood One Canada will have up to 30 radio stations across Canada patched into their new special from David Pritchard, titled The Yorkville Era: Canadian Rock To The World. The special, which airs Victoria Day weekend (May 21-23), was produced at Pritchard's Sonic Workshop, and features new interviews from artists of the Yorkville period. The three-hour special is hosted by Q107 Music Director Andy Frost.

Pritchard, well known for his documentaries on both the Beatles and Rolling Stones, stressed that this production isn't just focusing on Toronto acts that played in Yorkville, but includes many of Canada's top recording names from that period, most of whom played in Yorkville during their careers.

Pritchard also revealed that Terry Black, known for his 1964-5 hits *Unless You Care* and *Only Sixteen*, helped out in the writing and research of the documentary.

"It was a period that developed many of our best known artists," Pritchard told RPM. "It was a very rich period, and we in Canada should be very proud of all these dedicated artists who started it all." The special will bring attention once more on David Clayton Thomas, Neil Young, Joni Mitchell, Steppenwolf, The Guess Who, The Stampeders, The Big Town Boys, Ocean, The Mandala, Levon Helm, A Foot In Coldwater, Richie Knight, Gordon Lightfoot,

"I asked Westwood One, what they thought about a special on the Yorkville era," continues Pritchard, "and they liked the idea."

There has been considerable interest from the U.S. says Pritchard, who believes there would be no problem selling the special there. "Americans are much more open than we are," he emphasizes. "We seem to have quite a disregard about our musical history. The quality of playing in Toronto was much superior to the Americans because it was much more competitive in Canada."

"I didn't talk to one act who displayed any bitterness," Pritchard continues. "Most of them still perform, or are involved somehow with the music business."

Pritchard, who is owner and president of Sonic Workshop, points out there are "some great interviews and stories," in the special, including one about a Toronto band and their song written by a band member. Apparently no one wanted to release the song, and it went on to become a "very big hit". Listeners can also expect to hear some unreleased material and different versions.

The show is available on a market exclusive barter basis.

Neil Young fans bring "hero" back onto charts

Bill Johnston, Warner Bros Product Manager for WEA Music Canada, reports "extremely good" response to the new Neil Young and The Bluenotes LP, *This Note's For You*. The release represents Young's return to the Reprise label.

"This is the best reaction we've had in several years, for Neil," says Johnston. "We anticipate this to be his biggest seller in quite a few years. It all looks thumbs up at this

point."

The response has been positive from both fans and the critics, and Johnston believes there's a renaissance or revival of sorts, especially with long-time Canadian names. He points to the examples of Robbie Robertson, whose self-titled LP is now over the platinum mark, as well as Joni Mitchell's new album, and even the release from James Taylor.

Johnston describes Young's new venture as a "bluesy, rootsy combination of rock and blues." The Reprise label itself has described the LP as "a hybrid of crunching power chords, hard bop, stax-fueled horns and high voltage soul."

Produced by Young and Niko Bolas, under the production title of The Volume

Dealers, the album was the highest debuting in the Apr. 30th issue of the RPM 100. *Ten Men Workin'* is being issued as the first single from the album.

Recorded at various studios in California, this is Young's first Reprise LP in six years. He recorded his debut for Reprise, and his first solo album, titled *Everybody Knows This Is Nowhere*, in 1969, and it was issued in 1970. His last LP for the label was *Re-ac-tor*.

Young most recently recorded for Geffen, his last album for this label being *Life*, which was released in June of 1987. A live project, it marked Young's reunion with his old band, *Crazy Horse*.

In addition to the East Los Angeles musicians, who contributed to the new LP were keyboardist Frank Sampedro and saxophonist Ben Keith, both of whom worked with Young since his *Harvest* album.

WEA surprise to Roblan - a new Aussie band

One of the highlights at the recent Roblan/Sam The Record Man national meeting (Apr. 22/88) was an unusual presentation by WEA Music.

As part of their new product presentation, WEA brought along Weddings, Parties, Anything, an Australian band, whose first Canadian release is due late May. The band performed three songs for the gathering and then met with managers and Roblan staff.

The band is currently touring Canada in support of their album, *Roaring Days*.

Quebec artists unite for special fundraiser

Displaying a musical unity quite rare these days at a recent Montreal concert, under the banner *A Show of Concern* (Un Moment du Manifestation) that sold out Le Spectrum and raised \$30,000 for the Montreal Children's Hospital in the process, Alert Music president and organizer Marc Durand says the participating artists' friendship that night is what the music business lacks today.

"We always hear of musicians talking against each other, and I think the Montreal concert proves a lot of things wrong. It sounded good . . . a great performance . . . a good build-up. No technical problems. It just went very smoothly and it was a big thing with television and radio involved, and it was a success."

The fundraiser, which was broadcast live by CHOM and taped by the MusiquePlus and MuchMusic crews, featured many of Alert's own artists, including Bundock, Jean Marc of The Box and Michael Breen, as well as Michel Pagliaro, Martine St. Clair and Michel Lemieux, among others.

"It was the same pattern as the Prince's

Trust," Durand explains. "It was a two-part show. The first part was Bundock playing with guests and the second part was Michel Pagliaro and his guests. Then the big finale, *Closer Together*, with 23 people on stage and everybody loved it; the musicians came off the stage pretty high. It was a very good experience."

Bundock, whose latest single, *Time For Time*, according to Durand, was the most requested song at CHOM this past weekend ("above the new Plant and Sinead O'Connor," he adds), will soon embark on the next leg of their tour which will take the band into several Ontario markets, including Toronto's Diamond (May 30), though the Band has yet to break in any other market.

"It takes time to break a band," Durand concludes, "Overnight successes happen, it certainly did with Men Without Hats, but I don't think it's the best route. You don't know what you're dealing with and you don't appreciate the success . . . it happens too fast and you don't want to work for it after that."

ANDREW CASH: The right time and place

Andrew Cash has long been one of Toronto's favourite acts, but it's taken his hot new album on Island, *TIME AND PLACE*, to put him on the radio across the country . . . just check this week's charts.

La cucaracha or is it cockroach!!



COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Latest Suite album should take band over the top**

Quickly eclipsing their humble "homegrown" beginnings, in five short years, Honeymoon Suite have experienced a musical career which most Canadian bands can only dream about: a committed U.S. label, competent management, support tours, soundtrack work and, of course, hit singles, and now their latest album, produced by studio veteran Ted Templeman.

Apparently Templeman has had more gold and platinum records placed on his office walls than the Suite's lead vocalist Johnnie Dee has had hot dinners. A gold record stateside is something the quintet want, need and desire, yet it's indeed something they realize can't be bought; just like respect, it must be earned.

The Big Prize, suggests Dee, was perhaps too polished, so this time around, the band spent more time in the studio writing their new songs than recording them. Though one aspect clearly different with Racing After Midnight is the greater emphasis placed on the guitar, a change in direction feasibly allowed with the departure of keyboardist Ray Coburn last year.

Rob Preuss, formerly of The Spoons, joined the band shortly after and made significant contributions to the writing, says Dee. "He's a great keyboard player in the sense that he's not like every other keyboard player who always tries to do too much," Dee informs. "Rob knows his position and fits in great. He's like 'less is more' and that attitude is really important to us."

"We're a rock 'n' roll band, and the usual keyboard players always want to put a lot of keyboard parts into the record, but he knew where to back off and he knew where to add in."

Even though both Coburn and Dee are still good friends, it's obvious the band's career is going to take precedence over such

artistic differences the various bandmembers may have. These limits were tested severely during the support tours of their last album, while opening concerts for Heart, ZZ Top, 38 Special, Ted Nugent and Journey across the U.S.

"I think we made a mistake," continues Dee. "The last time around, we spent too much time in America, I mean . . . America is really important, but Canada is home . . . we toured for the whole year, and it was ridiculous: every day and every night. I'm hoping that we won't do all that touring again, but we probably will."

I'm talking from a personal level," he elaborates. "The touring just got too heavy. It was just touring and touring and touring, and touring. It was worth it, but after a while, it gets to you. It drives you nuts. It's your career . . . yes, and you devote one hundred percent to it . . . but you still have to have a little time to yourself."

However, with Templeman producing, and their first single, which Dee adds isn't their best ("I guess the record company's saving the best for last"), continuing to move steadily up North American charts, the band's future certainly looks promising. Yet when hit by a car this past Christmas, the future was put into perspective for Dee, who says he's taking things in stride these days.

"But you have to take everything in stride," he asserts. "Like everybody right now likes our record, but it's only been out for a little while and there's always the chance that it'll stiff. You always have to think that way, because that's the way this business is, it's always up and down . . . I mean, the worst can happen at any time . . . like it happened with me and my leg, but you just hope for the best."

Neither the accident nor the surgery has prevented Dee from promoting the album,

nor will the implanted steel pin stop the band from touring, as they still have a long way to go. Dee admits, in their efforts to reach that next plateau: a gold album stateside, minimum.

"You give it your best shot," concludes Dee, "and you hope this is the record that'll throw you over the top, and if this doesn't, then hopefully, we can make another and maybe that'll do it. That's the attitude I keep, because you just never know what's going to happen tomorrow."

Foundation set up in memory of Andy Gibb

The Andy Gibb Memorial Foundation has been established in memory of the young singer, who passed away last month. In the four weeks since its inception, the Foundation has already raised over \$10,000. All monies raised will be donated to various charities.

Renee Schreiber of the Dade (Miami) Community Foundation of the Andy Gibb Memorial Foundation, points out that the young Gibb was "a strong supporter of many charities and always made himself available to lend a helping hand whether it be playing in a tennis tournament, performing at a benefit concert, or just making a public appearance."

His last public appearance was at the Barry Gibb Love & Hope Tennis Festival last November where he performed during a telethon which was broadcast live on Miami's CBS affiliate, WTVJ, on the eve of the tennis tournament.

The Foundation plans to distribute its money to the Diabetes Research Institute, the American Cancer Society (for which Gibb's own tennis tournament benefitted), the American Heart Association, the National Drug Abuse Council, and the Starlite Starbrite Foundation.

The band have come close to matching the musical honesty and integrity found on their self-titled debut, but coupled with Ted Templeman's smart production and an equally wise move to include a remix of the Lethal Weapon single, this new album (the group's third) will certainly turn more heads, yet again in their favour. Love Changes Everything was released as the first single, and is doing very well, domestically, though it's clearly not the most earth shattering among the remaining tracks. Their two previous releases have both eclipsed double platinum, but the band has only dented the U.S. market . . . this album will do it for them. Following a European tour, a full slate of Canadian dates have been scheduled, prior to their embarking on an American tour this fall.



Debut albums have that certain youthful exuberance about them and, if there's any justice left in this music industry, this album will be the left field hit of the summer. Naturally, the production talent of Ed Stasium (Talking Heads, Ramones, Jagger) on the remaining tracks definitely helps a lot.

Don't just shrug off these lads from down under as yet another commercial rip-off; there is some serious musical talent to be found here, such as bassist Alan Lancaster. They've put together a fun collection of tunes, some covers, some originals, but nonetheless, simply fun. As one programmer once noted about covers: "at least they've already been tested." Their version of John Kongos' He's Gonna Step On You Again is flawless and a perfect summertime hit. Then there's Hold Your Head Up, Gloria and High Voltage.

The credentials of these two musicians (very well known among Canada's

recording community: Gerald O'Brien and Steve Sexton) is impressive enough, but the majority of their previous work has gone by virtually unnoticed, contributing individually on such albums as Loverboy's Wildside, The Partland Brothers' Electric Honey and Red Rider's Neruda; now their debut arrives via Passport Records, stateside. It is a brooding, almost moody selection of instrumental tracks, each with a differing flavour and ambience of its own, though indeed perfect for modern, contemporary and adult oriented stations today; yet quite not new age in feel.

Eureka/BMG - EK-12000-N


Multi-Juno winner, and extremely talented vocalist (4 1/2 octave range), Liberty Silver's much awaited debut sounds very promising. With the title track, Private Property, released to clubs already enjoying great success and I Do Love You picking up steam at radio; together with an imminent U.S. deal and the opening slot on a certain labelmate's tour forthcoming, the album looks to be a hit. Producer Joel Wertman has put together an impressive list of writers to help propel Silver into the star status justly deserved, including Lemel Humes, known for his work with the Pointer Sisters and Thelma Houston.

Yes frontman goes solo. Some tracks strongly resemble condensed versions of his more popular and best selling songs, which may disappoint some fans, but bring on board others. Altogether though, a very strong package.

The album is certain to surprise, if not shock, many in the industry. Early Traffic perhaps. Check out Not All Fathers, then flip over the record and try either Swelling Valley or Old Man's Mood, whichever first few bars catches the impending mood of the moment. It's not going to be everyone's cup of tea, but those aforementioned songs are going to leave an impression, one way or another.



"WEIRD AL" YANKOVIC - Pop
Even Worse

It was Michael Jackson's Beat It that brought Yankovic front and center with his chart breaker Eat It. Why not return to the original formula? It seems "Weird Al" is on the right track with this one. Several Yankovic originals: Melanie, Good Old Days, Twister, Stuck In A Closet With Vanna White, Velvet Elvis and You Make Me. His parodies are still as clever and side splitting as ever, including I Think I'm A Clone Now (Tiffany's I Think We're Alone Now), (This Song's Just) Six Words Long (George Harrison's Got My Mind Set On You), Alimony (Billy Idol's Money Money), Lasagna (Los Lobos' La Bamba) and Fat (Michael Jackson's Bad). Interesting album cover, although not surprising.

BALAA & THE ANGEL - Rock
Live Free Or Die

Don't overlook the punchy number I Love The Things You Do To Me when entering your music meetings, and the remainder of the album, a hard rocking effort, is equally as good. Driving and yet melodic; sound familiar? Produced by Steve Brown, this trio is going places. It seems The Cult opened up a whole new can of worms. Breathe deeply . . . out with the old and in with the new. This band's hot.

BRUCE HORNSBY - Pop/Rock

In his unequalled status, Hornsby continues to record mellow music for the masses. The Valley Road, the band's first single, is undoubtedly climbing charts rapidly; the potential of this album lies in its radio accessibility through and through, from beginning to end, this album is very easy to listen to, and "easy listening" is where it's at these days, especially with several tracks running in excess of seven minutes. Produced by Hornsby and Neill Dorfman.






