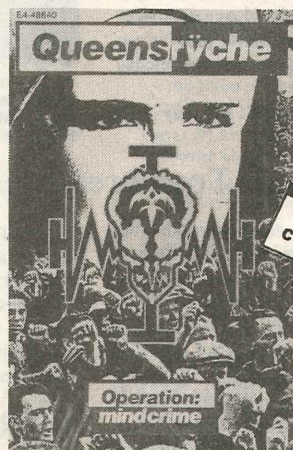

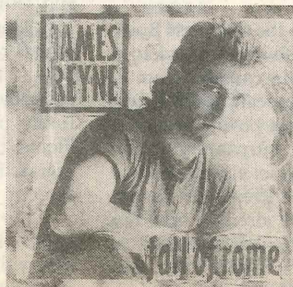

Junos to recognize Blues/Roots music

The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) has announced the establishment of a new Juno Award category for Blues/Roots music.

As Neill Dixon, who handles press and publicity for CARAS, points out "Canadian Roots and Blues has become a unique hybrid;

Rock and Roll sales sets record for Grand

Doug Bennett, the "Chief Slug" of Doug And The Slugs, was no doubt instrumental in advance ticket sales for Rock And Roll, setting records for London, Ontario's Grand Theatre. Bennett stars in the John Gray play, taking on the role of Parker, the lead singer of a rock and roll band.

Elaine Calder, the Grand's Administrative Director reports that advance ticket sales for Rock and Roll have "already made the 1987/88 season one of the most popular in the theatre's seventeen-year history as a professional company."

Almost 110,000 tickets have been sold for the 1987/88 season so far, 18,500 of them for Rock and Roll, which opened Apr. 22. Calder also points out that "an additional week of performances were scheduled for the Rock and Roll production, so that, despite the extraordinary strong advance sales, excellent seats are still available." The production continues through May 21st.

Rock and Roll represents Larry Lillo's final production as The Grand's Artistic Director. Joining him for the opening night performance were his many friends from across the country, including playwright John Gray, whose Billy Bishop Goes To War and Rock and Roll served to open and close Lillo's highly successful two-season tenure.

Ticketron gets exclusive for Royal Alexandra

Ticketron, regarded as "the market leader" in computerized ticketing, has been awarded the exclusive ticketing rights for Toronto's Royal Alexandra Theatre.

In order to handle the volume of business, Ticketron has moved to new premises, adjacent to the Royal Alex. New state-of-the art equipment is being installed and additional staff is being hired to handle the anticipated volume of business. Extra outlets are also being opened to better serve the Toronto and Golden Horseshoe areas.

Ticketron also announced the signing of a contract with Roy Thomson/Massey Hall to sell tickets on an allotment basis, and exclusive agreements with Ontario Place Film Festival, Tennis Canada, Molson Indy, Royal Ontario Museum, Canada's Wonderland and Kingswood Music Theatre. Ironically, many of these contracts have been won back from other ticket agencies in the past year.

"Toronto is an exciting centre for major league sports and first-class entertainment," says Michael Carrigg, Area Manager for Ticketron in Ontario, "and we're proud to be associated with Ed and David Mirvish and the Royal Alexandra Theatre."

Honeymoon Suite off on 30-city European tour

Honeymoon Suite begin a 30-city European tour, starting May 21st in Hamburg, Germany, winding down at London, England's Wembley Arena on July 7th. A good portion of the tour will be concentrated in Germany, where the group had much success on their 1986 tour when they visited eight countries in eight weeks. This trip, the WEA band will be special guests to Status Quo, a British rock institution for more than 20 years. All dates involve 7,000 and 9,000 seat arenas.

The band's third LP, *Racing After Midnight*, produced by Ted Templeman and Jeff Hendrickson, was released worldwide Apr. 26, and their current single, *Love Changes Everything*, has made impressive moves up the RPM 100 singles chart since its release eight weeks ago.

A Canadian tour is planned for July with U.S. dates to follow in August.

Turner's Farewell Tour breaks every record

After 31 years on the road, Capitol recording artist Tina Turner has said farewell to live performances. She completed her last date of her Break Every Rule tour in Osaka, Japan on Mar. 27.

The tour spanned 25 countries and 145 cities on five continents. Her Osaka concert, her 220th of the 13-month tour, included a surprise appearance by Mick Jagger, who coaxed her into an impromptu duet of Honky Tonk Woman. During the duration of the tour, more than 3.5 million fans saw her worldwide, and in Europe alone, she performed over 100 shows and was seen by more than 1.7 million fans, making it the most successful tour ever undertaken by an artist in that part of the world.

As well, Turner made the Guinness Book of World Records when she performed to a crowd of 182,000 at the Maracana Stadium in Rio de Janeiro, her first appearance in South America. It was the biggest paying audience for a single artist ever, surpassing Frank Sinatra's record which was set eight years ago at the same location. The event was filmed and a one hour TV Special aired on both the First Choice and SuperChannel networks. A home video of the concert, *Tina Turner: Rio '88* is now available.

Tina Live In Europe, released by Capitol Records-EMI Canada on Mar. 23, commemorates the tour and covers every aspect

Brown memorial album released by Inflatable

The Vancouver-based Inflatable Records & Tapes has released a memorial album in tribute to the late Doug J. Brown, considered by many as one of Vancouver's most talented songwriters. There are fourteen tracks on the set that Brown recorded with three different bands: The White Lies, Light In August and Red Harvest.

Born in Vancouver in 1962, Brown succumbed from injuries suffered when he fell from a cliff near Whistler on Sept. 27, 1987.

During his short lifetime, Brown wrote and performed a wide variety of music, and, together with his partner, Peter Cocking, he composed more than fifty songs, and recorded more than two dozen. The best of these recordings comprise the memorial album, Doug J. Brown: 1962-1987.

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Power's Fachin finally breaking across Canada

Originally released in September of 1986, Eria Fachin's single, *Savin' Myself*, is finally beginning to attract attention in Canada. Although having already spent over six months atop the British dance music charts, and coupled with its recent awards, the record is now considered a "classic" at the club level, informs Vince DiGeorgio of Power Records.

Savin' Myself, written by the late David Lodge (who unfortunately died two days prior to its release), was voted Best Hi-NRG 12" single of 1987, proving itself to be more popular than the Pet Shop Boys' *It's A Sin* and The Communards' *Never Can Say Goodbye* in the clubs, at the U.S. National Dance Awards, held this past April 26 in Boston. Then, one week later, at the Canadian Dance Music Awards in Montreal, Fachin was voted Most Promising New Canadian Dance Music Vocalist, which ultimately set the stage for the push at radio.

"We're the first label to ever release a record independently with no radio play in Canada and have our record already on the

pop charts in the States. That's never happened before," proclaims DiGeorgio. "Radio doesn't want to hear a record in this country, unless it's on the air in the States."

Thus, following Fachin's record-setting months on the U.K. charts, *Savin' Myself* was released stateside on Critique Records, and that label, later this month, scheduled the album *My Name Is Eria Fachin* for release as well, after taking the single recently through the pop charts with as much success as their British counterparts.

"When you're number one in England for 28 weeks," he adds, "it says something. It's really done a phenomenal job on its own and I'm really happy about the fact that we've been able to get it on Canadian radio. It's a real kick to hear the record on CFTR. It means you're up there with the big boys and I'm sure glad I didn't conform and do a rock record. We did what we do best . . . and it works. But it's been a real, real battle; you've really got to give a story out there to get a record licensed in the States, and to have the radio stations really give a listen to it.

"You have no idea what a thrill it is for me," DiGeorgio concludes, "because I'm a little vigilant. I like to always think of beating the system, but now I just hope the system can work for us and I think it is. To be denied is one thing, but to sit around and mope

about it is something else and I refused to do that because I did it for a long time. You've just got to make things work for you . . . I mean not every station out there is AM 106 in Calgary."

Ain't No Planes is the follow-up to *Run With Us*, "which made a big move on A/C and CHR national charts," says Gonda, "and the success of *Run With Us* created a buzz that became a roar with the release of Lisa's album, *Evergreen Nights*."

Lougheed is currently in the midst of a national television campaign, which will be followed by a mall tour for the month of June. Gonda also reveals that a major multinational label will shortly release Lougheed's album in the U.K. and Europe.

The Music Brokers are handling the promotion and tracking of the Lougheed release, currently charting on RPM's A/C chart.

B.C.'s Eckart Seeber scores a world's first

West Coast composer/performer Eckart Seeber has written and produced the world's first Robot-Ballet, as a commissioned work for the opening of the new EBCO Aerospace Centre in Delta, B.C.

Seeber was hired by the large EBCO Group to create ballet music for their newest robotic manufacturing machinery. It was explained that the music was "to reflect the impressive appearance and technological refinement of the gigantic robots," which was to provide the appropriate musical basis for a computer-choreographed dance work.

The result was a fully synthesized studio production that blended musical "high tech" with classical currents, using state-of-the-art digital sampling technology. Computer experts at the Aerospace Centre programmed the fully computer-driven robots to perform a presentation of movements and "dance-routines" in synchronisation with the music.

Seeber's Robot-Ballet was premiered before a large audience of industry and government representatives at the Aerospace Centre's Open House last April 21st, and again on the 23rd at a subsequent Open House event, which was open to the general public.

Seeber is as well known in the contemporary classical field as he is in new-age and jazz/rock music. His recordings featuring his talents on piano and organ are available on two new digital albums: *Water Colors* and *Symphonic Organ*, both of which are available through Victoria's Con Fuoco Records.

Island's Cash now ready to take on the world

For so many years L'Etranger toured across Canada, financing each new release and trip themselves by hawking their precious independent records to fans along the road; and those who caught the band live were watching one of this country's premiere songwriter's honing his skills with each subsequent journey. It's certainly a big country out there, but somebody has to do it.

Though signed to Island Records and his debut, titled *Time And Place*, is slated for release stateside this June, not much has really changed for Cash, who has just recently returned from a tour of East Coast clubs yet again, or so it seems.

"When you're an independent," he begins, "the frustration was always the inability to record regularly and, when doing an album, the inability to record more than a handful. For us, we never had enough money to do more than an EP. So, creatively and artistically, that was the biggest frustration, but it has also been the main foreseeable difference immediately."

Cash actually co-produced the sessions with John Switzer (Jane Siberry) and even though they disagreed often, he suggests this was all part of the creative process, there however wasn't any "friction" being under the musical microscope constantly but it still wasn't what was expected.

"When we were recording," Cash explains, "I realized this had to be really good, and so as we along . . . it wasn't like making an EP. I was prepared for more scrutiny than I'd had in the past, but I never seemed to have a problem singing in the studio before, the vocals took much longer than I thought they would take, the concentration level has to be higher and that's the thing: it was just a lot more work."

With or without Island, Cash would be content to write his songs and perform them on his own, which is why whether he's playing

to a crowd in Halifax or Los Angeles, he's going to do it anyway, one way or another. Yet with the label, where old problems were erased, new ones were added, says Cash.

"The problems that I had, just in terms of creative frustration before getting the deal," he elaborates, "are over. But there are other new frustrations now that I didn't have before. So, in a way . . . having the deal, opened up a whole new can of worms. Life goes on though with or without a record deal. If the whole thing fell apart tomorrow, I'd still be doing what I'm doing . . . it'd just mean I'd have to get a part-time job."

That attitude stems from a long and traditional line of the Canadian singer and songwriter (as a matter of fact in his more recent live sets cover versions of songs by The Band and Buffalo Springfield are played), the comparisons nonetheless are obvious, but it is precisely the straight-forward honesty which has eluded so many of today's bands and created such a tenuous position for the music industry.

Time and Place contains songs Cash has been playing the past year in acoustic settings, usually very intimate locations, as he

tried to get away from the bars and clubs and having to sing over the beer drinking patrons. He liked to joke with the crowd, explain in greater detail his songs and how he wrote them, or why; perhaps more importantly, he was learning to communicate with the audience.

"When music, or anything, gets to one extreme," he continues, "then there's naturally a reaction against that extreme and I think that's what you see now. People are fed up with the huge gaited snare, the big reverb, the huge, strident sounds; basically these songs come a dime a dozen. The sonic quality of the music today is spectacular but many of the songs are mediocre."

"So," Cash concludes, "it was a feeling on my part that I wanted to develop my songs and then portray them in a more sensitive and human way, because that's just where my head and my heart were at."

Penta signs and readies

The Vancouver-based Penta label has announced the signing of their first artist Raymond May. His debut album is expected to be released shortly.

May was born in Sri Lanka and after emigrating to Canada, went on to England where he became involved in the London club scene. He returned to Vancouver in 1983, where he picked up on that city's club activity, and where he eventually entered the homegrown Spotlight '85 contest, where his talent potential became obvious.

Recording of the May album began at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound in December of 1987, with Paul Hyde (Rock & Hyde) doing the producing and Bruce Fairbairn (Bon Jovi, Loverboy, Aerosmith) as Executive Producer.

A single will precede the album, which will be released in both Canada and the U.S.

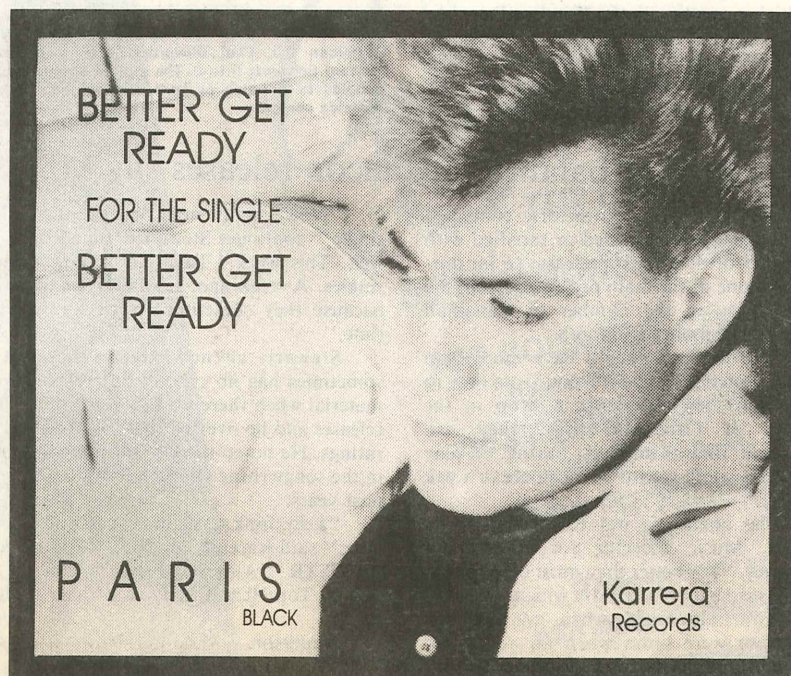

"The quality is not too bad," Barry Stewart, Music Director for CHUM-FM points out. "It's better than most other years. There's also a lot of diversity which is good."

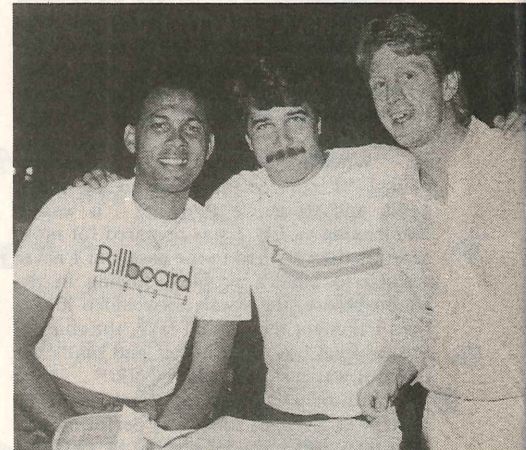
Stewart also recalls when, not too long ago, there were times when an act would release only one single, and nothing after.

PRINCE - Pop
Lovesexy
Paisley Park - 92-57201-P

Although "This is not music... this is a trip" is not included on the album (it's taken from the flip side of the single, Alphabet St.), the words come as an apt description of the latest montage from Prince. He takes the listener to another corner of Paisley Park; where jazz is the hip vibe, and "real" drums carry the beat. Sheila E lends her vocal, as well as percussive talents; Eric Leeds and Atlanta Bliss horn it up, and Levi Seacer Jr. plays bass faster than a speeding drumulator. The latter shines on Dance On, an intriguing track with a chorus reminiscent of the Batman theme. Lovesexy and Eye No are also key, as well as the usual ballads, and even if you're not a fan of Prince's music, give it a listen. Neither anything previous nor anything in the future may hold your interest, this one could surprise you.

OLIVER JAMES TRIO - Jazz
Cookin' At Sweet Basil
Justin Time Records - JUST-25-1

Captured live at New York's Sweet Basil, jazz pianist Oliver Jones combines both standards and his own compositions on this record, as well as exploring the blues and even a bossa nova number flawlessly. Stateside, Jones is enjoying the recognition and due respect usually afforded, in these circles, for Oscar Peterson. However,

radio stations might want to key in on several tracks, either Snuggles or The Sweetness Of You, both originals and both a blast of fresh air. Actually, without the use of synthesizers or computers, the album stands alone today.

MELISSA ETHERIDGE - Pop/Rock
Self-titled - Island - ISL-1143-J

It's no small wonder this album is, reportedly, Chris Blackwell's pet project these days, it's one worthy of recognition certainly. Etheridge is a guitar player (12-string), who writes songs with a great degree of poignancy, and her observations spill forth beautifully on the lead track and first single, Similar Features, which is currently making strong in-roads at radio across the country. Picking out specific key tracks, like Precious Pain and The Late September Dogs, was tough but easily illuminates how powerful this record actually is.

VOI VOD - HM/Rock
Dimension Hatross
Maze/A&M - MML-1042-W

Hailing from Montreal, this metal act continues to release consistently tasty and as innovative as albums can get in the genre. Retail outlets who respect the buying power of this crowd should be quick to check this piece of vinyl out, not to mention the heavier leaning AOR stations that'll want to satisfy their particular listeners thirst for real hard rock 'n' roll.

GODLEY & CREME - Pop/Rock
Goodbye Blue Sky
Polydor - 835 3481-Q

As musicians, this duo aren't as innovative as they like to think. Although they might want to believe the harmonica doesn't exist in popular music anymore, they only need to examine the street a little more. There they'll find bands that can't afford the computerized sound generation equipment Godley & Creme have been used to for so many years. Therefore, if this record had been released by an unknown group today, the world would be listening. But it's just too condescending, coming from an act that's been around for as long as they have.

PREFAB SPROUT - Rock
From Langley Park To Memphis
Epic - BFE-44208-H

With a little help from Pete Townshend, and Stevie Wonder, this album's a competent follow-up to Two Wheels Good (which contained When Love Breaks Down) and there are actually many interesting singles' choices here. Try either Enchanted or The Venus Of The Soup Kitchen for a real mix in your sound. Again, Thomas Dolby assists in the production with the band.



BRIAN SETZER - Rock
Live Nude Guitars
EMI-Manhattan - EI-46963-F

Ex-Stray Cat Setzer is still one of the industry's most influential guitarists, but coupled with another (Eurythmic Dave Stewart) at the helm, the effect is nerve tingling. Yet only some of the tracks were co-written and produced by Stewart, but when the smoke from those clears, Larson Paine, Setzer or Chris Thomas attain the same results with an equalled flair. Obviously, there's been a storm brewing in Setzer for quite some time and the impression left on this record is long overdue. When the dust settles, this album's going to be around for many months, as all tracks are key. One in particular, Temper Sure Is Risin', features Moonlighting and Motown recording artist Bruce Willis on harmonica.

LUCILLE STARR - Country
Back To You
Quality - RSP-159

This is the one country programmers and fans have been waiting for. Contains her current charter, The First Time I've Ever Been In Love, but better still, there's The French Song, Starr's big hit of the early sixties, which brought her into the international arena. That vocal charm is still there, which producer Tony Migliore has enhanced with some of the best pickers in the business. Cyril Rawson is a major composer of music here, so along with Starr as artist, several of the tracks qualify as Cancon (MA). Not restricted to Country formats, there's lots of great A/C material here as well.

DAN REED NETWORK
Pop/Rock
Self-titled
Mercury - 422-834309-1-Q

When someone claims such varied musical tastes as Dan Reed, by citing musical influences from the Doobie Brothers to Van Halen to Cameo, the potential result could be quite powerful. Reed's debut crosses the spectrum of rock 'n' roll (Baby Don't Fade), afrobeat (Ritual) and funk (World Has A Heart Too); all of which his band handles with a skill and finesse seldom found in today's world of sterile and, all too often, pre-programmed music. Producer Bruce Fairbairn's talent (Aerosmith, Bon Jovi) blazes on tracks like Tamin' The Wild Night and Rock You All Night Long, both key, and the latter was actually co-written with The System. The album, recorded at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound, will appeal to programmers with a taste for strong, creative rock.

TOMBOY - Pop/Rock
Back To The Beat
Columbia - BFC-90768-H

With an Annie Lennox quality about her vocals, lead singer Torhild Sivertsen really belts out some fine tuneage on this debut (the most successful artist in the history of CBS Norway) for Canada. The first single, People Get Moving, could spice up summertime charts and there's a great follow-up in Danger Of Love, both of which were Top 10 singles in their home territory. Musically infectious, dynamic and yet crisp, a new talent worthy of serious attention at radio levels.

BLUE MERCEDES - Pop
Rich & Famous - MCA - MCA-42143-J

I Want To Be You Property and See Want Must Have are doing quite well in the clubs, while the former has attracted the attention of several programmers as well. The duo, with a vocal comparison to ABC, could sell with the summer months approaching, as all tracks are rather energetic, spirited and very well produced by Phil Harding and Ian Curnow for PWL; Pete Waterman, known for his Dead Or Alive work.

SCARLETT & BLACK - Pop
Self-titled - Virgin - VL-2518-W

With all the complaints about radio being too bland and dull these days, after a record like this gets released, the chicken and egg situation glares. If boring records weren't released, then boring radio wouldn't exist. However, as we know, You Don't Know, the first single was well received and has opened the door for yet another new act to break through and sell in globs.

FACTOR should take a closer look at Country

For over 30 years I have made my living in Country Music in Canada, and I believe I should express some of my personal feelings to the general industry regarding FACTOR, particularly the "criteria for loans" to the Country music artist.

I do feel somewhat reluctant to pass judgement on the workings of FACTOR, since I really don't have the perfect plan for an alternative, but I do believe there must be a better way. I also believe the people who administer FACTOR do a great job given the "criteria" they must work from. I happen to feel that certain conditions should be addressed and given special consideration when it comes to Country Music and other minority music forms.

Therefore, if anything I say in this article is the spark that starts the fire to change the policy and system, then I feel I will have done my part to keep Country Music alive and growing.

I may have the wrong idea about what FACTOR's mandate is. I thought FACTOR was first instituted to create a quality, pro-

fessional Canadian record product for play on Canadian radio stations, and hopefully around the world. Now I understand its first mandate was to "produce records that sell". Let's get realistic!! Country Music singles, during my 30 years in the business, have never recouped their costs, and I'm sure they won't in the next 30 years. (I'm speaking of Country Music... please don't misinterpret, contemporary rock groups, such as Blue Rodeo as what you may think successful Country Music is.) Many Canadian Country artists release singles, then put their singles together to compile an album product and then try to recoup costs on that, and in most cases, that falls short. Financial success is rare!!

So why record Country Music? Why give our FACTOR monies when there is very little chance of giving a return? On strictly a "business decision", how can anyone disagree with the FACTOR board or FACTOR juries? If the mandate of FACTOR is to gain financially, then tell the Country artist up front what their chances are of getting a loan and don't give our industry

"tokenism".

There is a bigger picture here than just financial gain, and I think it should be addressed by FACTOR. The Canadian Country

Music Industry is NOT the Canadian Rock Industry and they (Country) should not be subjected to the same rules and the same criteria as the rock industry to obtain loans and grants. Of course, there are those who will disagree with my position, but they probably didn't spend a lifetime in Country Music in this country and don't know the facts and hard realities of its financial returns or more realistic... losses!

Country Music is part of our culture, part of our heritage... and millions of Canadians love Country Music... yet most of what they hear is American. Country artists in Canada NEED the help of FACTOR to compete with the quality of American product. We do have talent in this country, who in their own field of music can compete, but being realistic, can't compete on the same level as the rock industry when it comes to financial returns and gains.

I have a few questions... have they ever crossed your mind?

Are the people who sit on the "evaluation committees" really qualified to spot raw talent and hear what quality production and personal management will develop?

Are they able to judge the applications without a conflict of interest?

Do the members of the Board of Directors have conflicts of interest?

What's the program format of the radio stations they work for?

Which record company are they affiliated with?

What percentage of the year's total funding is allotted to Country Music projects?

Would and could the funding be better distributed by the Canadian Country Music Association?

As far as "conflict of interest" goes, I don't believe there is any way to do away with that problem... it's here to stay in such a small industry. The only alternative to me would be to have salaried employees who work for FACTOR full time, with specific evaluators for specific types of music, and

that's not reality!

It is also my opinion that FACTOR monies are wasted on doing New Talent Demos. In the rock industry they well may be very important and crucial to obtaining a record contract but definitely not in Country Music.

When and if a "new country talent" does get a FACTOR New Talent Loan, records, and shops his demo around, what American owned, major label is going to use their money to record a Canadian Country Music artist? How many Canadian independent labels, for that matter, will spend their money to record them? Realistically, not many, if any! I feel that it is fair to say that 95 percent plus of Canadian Country Artists pay for their own masters and lease them to record companies.

I suggest that at least these New Talent Demos could and should have the opportunity to be used to produce a "master" or at least a partially finished master.

As I said earlier in this article, Country Music singles are a promotional tool.

During my career, the only way I have found to recoup the cost of recording singles, is that the radio play they receive raises "performance fees" to a level so that the difference between your performance fees without recording and your performance fees with a recording justify the cost of doing the recording sessions, pressing and promotion of the singles. In the years past I've felt this was possible and that we at least broke even, but now I feel that this too is slowing slipping away with the implementation of the Drinking and Driving Ride Programs across the country. Although no one can knock these programs they are having a devastating effect on the income of the travelling musicians as well as the part-timers. I estimate at least 95 percent of Canadian Country artists pay their sessions and lease to either major or independent labels. If recording wasn't a paying proposition for us before, and the artist subsidized his recording career from performance fees, where will he get the funds to record in the years to come with his income decreasing rather than increasing.

Country radio stations in Canada will still be looking for quality Canadian Country product, but I foresee a number of discouraged artists dropping by the wayside and even-

tually a severe decrease in quality Country product because of the lack of funding. It was my hope and understanding FACTOR was to help fill this void.

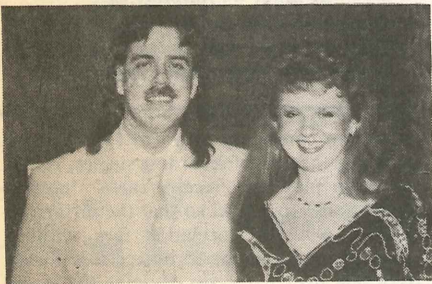
Blue Rodeo win was a win for FACTOR as well

Blue Rodeo's sweep of this year's Big Country Awards was a time for celebration at FACTOR (The Foundation to Assist Canadian Talent on Records). It was FACTOR that provided financial assistance towards the production of the band's award winning album, *Outskirts*, and towards the production of the video, *Day After Day*.

Blue Rodeo, who release on the Risque Disque label, distributed by WEA, won Top Group, Outstanding New Artists, Top Country Composers (Greg Keelor and Jim Cuddy for Try), Top Producer (Terry Brown also for Try), and for Best Country Single (Try).

Cancon a priority with Aquarius label

Before it was released as a single, Myles Goodwyn's version of the Lee Michaels hit, *Do You Know What I Mean*, was not Cancon; yet after re-recording the track at Toronto's Phase One, the song can now be put into rotation at Canadian radio as such. Basically, according to Aquarius Records' Keith Brown, it didn't stand a chance otherwise.

Actually, the reaction to the new version has been so strong that both Brown and Goodwyn are considering re-recording another track on the album, the only other non-Cancon song, and releasing it as a single as well.

"It says a lot for Cancon," continues Brown, "but it's really a fact of life. I mean, a Canadian record goes into a completely separate meeting from other records . . . on a completely different day. They're classified differently . . . they have a different life span and they have a different value to radio."

Historically, examples of the backlash against Canadian artists who record in foreign countries and thus relinquish their Cancon advantage are numerous. For instance, both April Wine and Anne Murray have suffered domestically, on several occasions, for releasing non-Cancon singles. As well, Brown informs, this occurs in the Quebec market and it's commonly termed the "Francon" syndrome.

"If a French artist goes into the English milieu with an English recording . . . then French radio in this province will not play it," he explains. "They will not support it, absolutely, even though they do carry English loads. You would think these artists would be stars in Quebec and therefore the likeliest people to get played. That reflects 'Francon', where they feel abandoned by their artists."

"I feel there's similar mentality at English-language Canadian radio, after more than 20 years of Cancon, where," Brown elaborates, "if a Canadian artist can't be bothered to make it Canadian, then why should they bother playing it? I've heard it and I think it goes right across the country. It's just a fact of life. I don't even have any emotion about it anymore. That's just the way it is."

Given that scenario; that Canadian radio will force Canada's musicians to play by the rules, regardless of the history or stature of the artist in question, then obviously Canadian record companies have to make amends

when facing this dilemma, the choices are few: to enter the studio again or not. In this particular case, the former lead singer and catalyst of April Wine, didn't mind.

"The argument that you can't make money on a Canadian hit might be valid up to a point," Brown remarks, "but think how hard it would be to make money if your Canadian record isn't even a hit in Canada. First things first . . . that's the way I look at it. It's certainly a very, very valuable market. Look at Corey Hart."

Hart's combined Canadian album sales exceed two million and have done so in a very short period of time, compared with April

Wine, who have also sold in excess of several million, but over a much greater length of time, adds Brown. "Once you've sold two million records in Canada, you realize it's not an insignificant market. There's certainly money to be made . . . if you're successful enough."

The first single from the new Corey Hart album, *Young Man Running*, was released this past week. Titled *In Your Soul*, the single is being serviced stateside by EMI-Manhattan. The video, directed by Meiert Avis (U2, Bruce Springsteen) and shot in New Mexico, was also delivered, though later.

"As a record company," Brown concludes, "I look at radio as number one, two and three media all in one. As important as print is, it pales in significance to what radio does for popular music. Radio is the most important promotional aspect of any record marketing campaign. Where else do you have your product featured, showcased and put up on a pedestal? That's what really makes people's opinions about music . . . and I don't think you can treat radio lightly."

strong supporter of Canadian acts, believes that most of the releases are able to compete with the international material. Like other stations, she also finds they sometimes have to play weaker material than they want to.

"AM radio has to play 30 percent (Cancon) and that's a lot," she suggests. "With the repetition factor you don't want to add a weak record because you would play it so much."

She explained that quite often, it's just a case that a record will be mediocre and with all the big-name international releases like Billy Ocean, Rick Astley and George Michael, some records get "beat up".

Both CKFM and CHFI-FM reported that when they're faced with a period where there's a lack of appropriate Cancon, they look to album tracks not released as singles, although in some cases these cuts may be released as singles down the road.

"The balance of the releases sometimes does create a problem and that's when we dip into the album releases," said CKFM's Wayne Webster who rated 1988's Cancon releases this year as "pretty good. Another way of getting around the problem is to play Canadian songs by international artists. Eddie Schwartz's songs have been recorded by several other artists."

Webster stressed the main problem is the inconsistency of Cancon releases. "Sometimes, there's not enough, and then, all of a sudden, there's a lot."

"I think the quality, sound and calibre of the releases so far this year are top notch," said John Jones, Music Director for CHFI-FM. "I'm finding the music I'm hearing tends more towards the adult records than in previous years, but there's not many for CHFI from our sound perspective. There seems to be a bit of a lull right now."

"Billy Ocean's single was too tough for our sound. So what do you do? You don't ignore the album. What you find are other tracks and it still sells the record."

Jones noted you can sometimes find a lull in the number of international releases as well. He doesn't believe Cancon releases are of lesser quality in relation to international releases, but pointed out that Canada doesn't put out as many records as some other countries.

"It's been an exciting year for Cancon already," he said. "We were playing Dan Hill's Carmelia when the album first came out. Glass Tiger has also done well."

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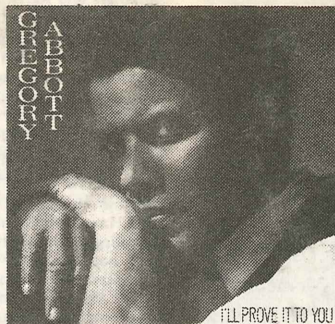

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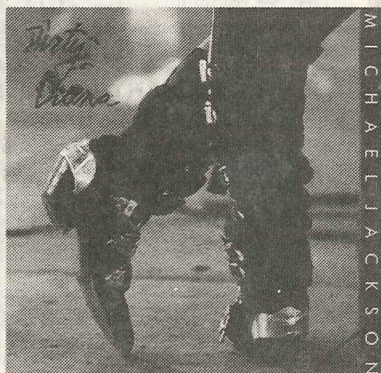

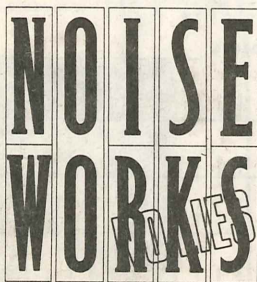
