



## Bain, Norris, Williams in BMG Canada moves

In his first major move since being appointed Vice President of Marketing for BMG Music Canada, Dave Platel has announced three major appointments to take effect immediately.

Tim Williams, who has distinguished himself in the sales field, takes on the mantle of Director National Sales.

Sarah Norris, a new face at BMG, has been appointed Manager National Media Relations. She was previously with Capitol-EMI Canada where she held the position of Marketing Manager.

Ken Bain, who holds the post of Manager, National Promotion, has been named Manager, National Video Promotion/Artist Relations. He will be primarily responsible for developing all aspects of BMG's artists profile at the video level. His artist relations responsibilities will cover a wide variety of duties involving liaison with artists and their managers, promoters, agents, venues, the hospitality industry, and the media. He will continue in his role as Manager, National Promotion, until a replacement is named.

Referring to the Bain appointment, Platel points out that "It's clearly apparent the video medium is deeply entrenched in our industry. With MuchMusic going to basic cable, soon to be reaching 4 million households, coupled with the ongoing success of Video Hits, the Canadian consumer is receiving a steadily growing diet of visual musical messages every moment of the day

and night. Add to this the emergence of MusiquePlus, the ever-popular Good Rockin' Tonite and the countless new entries such as Electric Circus and you get a ton of exposure for our artists."

Platel continues with, "It's our intention at BMG to offer these outlets the very best service around; we owe it to our artists, and to the marketplace that supports them, and we're not going to limit our efforts to the traditional broadcast avenues. The clubs will benefit, the pools will benefit, and we'll also have some surprises up our sleeves . . . where there are screens . . . there are means."

This audience/panel interactive workshop will be headed by Mike Shalett of Street Pulse Group, the marketing research company which services all but one of the major record labels in the U.S. He writes *Vital Signs*, a regular column on marketing and the record buying consumer in Radio and Records.

The remainder of the workshop series will cover alternative avenues of exposure and distribution of record product and an in-depth look at international markets.

### Toni Childs distraught over loss of Swazili scarf

Toni Childs is appealing for help from her Toronto fans for the return of her hand-made multi-hued Swazili scarf, which she lost during her Canadian debut at Toronto's Diamond Club (Sept 18). The A&M recording star literally "let her hair down" in response to a request from the audience, pulling the scarf from her head and letting it fall to the stage, from where it disappeared. She obtained the headpiece while in Africa recording *Union*, her debut album for A&M.

"I've never performed live without that scarf," said Childs, "It has immense sentimental value and I'd dearly appreciate its return." She continues with, "I'm appealing to the young fan who scooped it from the stage to please return it. I promise front row seats to the next show in Toronto as a sign of my sincerity. The headpiece is irreplaceable."


## Pierce to Westwood One as station relations rep



*Two Whoppers and a couple of chocolate shakes to go . . . for starters!*

**Speaking of Whoppers . . .** Nothing official yet, but GP, who dropped out of the industry a few months ago, has surfaced as a Vice President of the Whopper company. (EC: *Which goes to prove there might be life after the record industry . . . !*)

**More empire building . . .** There's a large broadcast property on the block . . . and there's a very large broadcast conglomerate interested . . . again. However, the latter is busy with a "hello" takeover, and their legal front is a little weak and may not be able to stage the necessary theatrics for the CRTC. (EC: *Hello . . . and goodbye!*)

**U2 timing is perfect!** In spite of manufacturing problems, Lee Silversides was able to get his "fill" of cassettes, compact discs, and yes, even black vinyl product of U2's newest album, Rattle And Hum, which is pretty phenomenal considering there were 400,000 units shipped. A nice door opener for Christmas. Now that I have my own Citizen portable stereo compact disc player (EC: *A gift, no doubt . . . !*) the entertainment value of U2 has increased immeasurably . . . but wait, I hear you ain't heard nothing 'til you've heard it on DAT. (EC: *Let's deal with the black vinyl crisis first . . . !*)

**Speaking of pressing . . .** Randall Cousins, over at Roto Noto in Hamilton, tells me he has struck a fairly reasonable deal with The Pressing Plant in Dallas, Texas. The unit price is not bad and all you have to pay is the duty. Seems to me the duty can be lifted on this item if government is approached properly . . . kinda like early free trade. (EC: *So that's what it's coming to!*)

**Hold your breath . . .** With advanced technology getting in the way of progress, watch out for the latest on the drawing board, a closed-circuit video transmission service for bars and clubs. All your latest and most popular videos . . . without the commercials. (EC: *I go to a bar for quiet, intimate conservation . . . get out of town!*)

**A loose cannon . . .** Here's a job for Kelly the mediator. Talks have bogged down on a very major issue . . . and they aren't going anywhere until a certain loose cannon can be tied down . . . or thrown overboard. The amount of money that's going down the drain during the stall is fairly substantial. (EC: *Kelly the mediator . . . ?*)

**How sweet it was . . .** When a price is set, that's the price. If a different price is offered, that same price has to be offered to everyone. Well . . . check this out. A very large and well-heeled nationally recognized corporate sometimes sponsor of musical events booked a full-page ad in RPM. The price was quoted and agreed to, the rough layout arrived with an attached note that said they could only afford to pay a certain amount, like . . . take it or leave it. I felt good by leaving it. Business ethics are good for the soul, wouldn't you agree. (EC: *Yes, but what about those who take the money and run?*)

**Remember the Ballanger Brothers?** I couldn't forget the Ballanger Brothers, one

of the first to offer video excitement at the club level. They're opening a new club, which they've dubbed Rockit, in downtown Toronto, and they've joined up with local musician James Poulos for this latest creation, which is being launched Oct 20 . . . but don't try to crash this party . . . call Joanne Smale for clearance. (EC: *I remember the whole Ballanger family . . . !*)

**Speaking of remembering . . .** Remember Steven Jobs, the co-founder of Apple Computer Inc., who got shoved out the door in 1985? He's shoving himself back in the computer door again with his new company, Next Inc., and he could revolutionize the desktop publishing business. As well, Jobs is introducing the first erasable compact disc. You'll hear more on Jobs and Next very soon. (EC: *Let's deal with the black vinyl crisis first . . . !*)

**Where are the dailies . . .** What a great story for the snoops from the dailies. Now that all our biscuits, so to speak, are in one basket, the adventure is only just beginning. Customer complaints, you ain't heard nothing yet. How about CD product arriving, blank, or black vinyl product . . . with only one side? And then there's the classic all-thumbs mistake of packaging a major, running up the chart item, with the wrong record. One programmer, who I promised I wouldn't name, actually aired two tracks of this nameless band, introducing them as who they were supposed to be. Phone reaction? Yes, but the listeners liked what they heard. (EC: *I don't believe it . . . !*)

**May olde acquaintances . . .** This past week, CRIA and presidents of the various record companies threw a rather emotional farewell luncheon for outgoing Capitol Records - EMI of Canada president Richard Lyttelton, and I would like to add my own "fond adieu, but hopefully, not farewell," comment. "His Lordship", as he was affectionately known around here, contributed perhaps more to the industry than he realizes. He has a way of handling people and situations that certainly endeared him to Capitol's Canadian operation, not to mention the industry in general . . . a true visionary and a very fine gentleman. I will sorely miss our pleasant meetings where facts were facts and where truths and emotions weren't held back. It wasn't even necessary to preempt one topic with "off the record . . . " It was a pleasure knowing you, Richard . . . !



### EMI's Queensryche look to future LPs for success

As opposed to Def Leppard, who have been emasculated in the studio by Mutt Lange: from rough and raw, indeed powerful, to polished and accessible; Queensryche have not compromised any integrity in order to achieve airplay over the years, yet. Although the two bands are currently on tour together, their respective philosophies concerning what constitutes "good" heavy metal music obviously differ, as both today are found on opposite ends of the commercial spectrum.

With Def Leppard's new album *Hysteria* and Guns 'N' Roses debut *Appetite For Destruction* topping charts across the North American continent, heavy metal has apparently made a comeback as a viable genre for musicians. Even though ask any self-respecting fan for an overall definition of what exactly heavy metal is and the response might include, as examples, anything from Led Zeppelin and Aerosmith to Europe and Cinderella, from Iron Maiden and Judas Priest to Def Leppard and Queensryche.

The Seattle-based band have released three full-length albums (and an EP) to date. Their latest, *Operation: Mindcrime*, an intelligently written concept piece, has drawn incredible reviews from critics and their ranks of followers is increasing with each subsequent date. The album deals with some grand and encompassing themes such as religion, politics and even revolution, which guitarist Chris DeGarmo hopes is not only interesting but also challenging for the listener. Their last album, *Rage For Order*, contained Lisa Del Bellos' *Gonna Get Close To You*, a "one off" cover, says DeGarmo.

"We have a lot of different kinds of records in our collections and Lisa Del Bello is someone who we all really like," he continues. "We spend so much time working on our own material, it's sometimes pleasant to listen to other things. In rehearsals we just

"It's a great tour to be on," DeGarmo enthuses, "what with them having a number one album over the last couple of weeks. They're a real talented band. All of the shows are sold out on this tour alone and if we added them all up, I'm sure we've been exposed to a couple of hundred thousand people. A lot of times we're playing to an audience that isn't as familiar with us, so we just go out there for fifty minutes and try to leave our best impression."

One thing the band has done with great consistency over their varied career is manage to employ a different producer for each effort, and they've certainly learned from

### Cohen moves into major continent tour

Leonard Cohen, currently on release with his Columbia album, *I'm Your Man*, which has already sold in excess of 750,000 copies worldwide, is set for a major tour of Canada and the United States. He toured Europe this past spring playing to SRO houses, followed by four showcase dates in the U.S. in early July, the success of which prompted the more extensive tour.

The tour begins at the Edmonton Jubilee (Oct 23), followed by Calgary's Centre For The Performing Arts (24), Vancouver's Queen Elizabeth Theatre (26), and several large theatres in the U.S. coming back up into Canada for dates at Toronto's Massey Hall (Nov 9-10), Ottawa's Congress Centre (11), and the St. Denis Theatre in Montreal (13-14). Cohen will then play Boston's Opera House (15), and wind down at New York's Beacon Theatre (16).

their mistakes and improved with each outing, says DeGarmo. Their last producer, for *Operation: Mindcrime*, Peter Collins, who has worked with a spate of artists from Nik Kershaw to Rush, will likely produce their next album. They were that impressed with the results and so were their fans.

"Initially," he explains, "we were very interested in James Guthrie because of his work with Pink Floyd. We were looking for that kind of contribution." In 1984 *The Warning* was released, having been produced by Guthrie, and the band toured with Kiss, Quiet Riot, Twisted Sister and Dio. "The switch to Neil Kernon occurred because James was busy and Rage (For Order) turned out great, just the way we wanted it to. But when it came time to do the next album, Neil was busy doing the Dokken album, which had in fact gone way over schedule, and we had to make our record, so our management suggested Peter Collins and we're really glad they did!"

DeGarmo expects the band to tour through until next June and because the last album took over a year to write and three months to record, the next album could be a long time coming. However, when it arrives he expects it will be a big one. "I don't have a crystal ball," he concludes, "but we're very proud of the music that we do together."

"It's been a slower road though, because radio hasn't been playing Queensryche very much. But I don't think it will always be like that. I mean . . . we're doing enough business now that we can't be ignored, because of our record sales. I think in the future they're going to have to play us. Each record we've done, we've reached a newer audience and with this album, we've reach new levels as far as sales go. It may take a couple of albums until we're platinum, but then again, it may happen at the end of this year."

## CRTC approves CAB's Standards Council

The CRTC has approved a proposal by the Canadian Association of Broadcasters (CAB) to establish the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council. The objective of the Council is "to promote voluntary action by its members to achieve the highest possible standard of radio and television broadcasting" (Public Notice CRTC 1988-159).

As the CRTC's Chairman Audre Bureau points out, "In a regulatory environment where greater emphasis is placed on self-regulation, the Commission expects all broadcasters to demonstrate increasing responsibility for their program content," continuing with "The proposed Broadcast Council to ensure high program standards is a welcome manifestation of this responsibility. The Commission is generally pleased with the CAB's revised proposal for a Canadian Broadcast Standards Council and believes that it constitutes the basis for a valuable new approach to the improvement of industry standards."

Bureau went on to acknowledge the efforts of the CAB's Chairman Jim Sward and President Michael McCabe, congratulating them for "their understanding of the role to be played by the industry in this new regulatory environment, and their dedicated efforts to put in place this Council."

The Council will be responsible for ad-

ministering the CAB's Code of Ethics, the Voluntary Code Regarding Violence in Television Programming, the Codes Regarding Sex-Role Portrayal in Radio and Television Programming, and any other codes that may be referred to it by the CAB, including the Industry Code for Brokerage.

Bureau stressed that "Increased reliance on self-regulation however, does not imply that the Commission is relinquishing its responsibilities," concluding with "Any interested party may, at any time, choose to approach the Commission directly . . . the Commission remains in a position to respond to such an approach."

The Council will consist of a National Executive, comprising 12 members, five regional councils (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario, West and British Columbia) and the radio or television stations that adhere to the Council. The members of the Councils will be named at a later date.

The Regional Councils will advise and assist local members in dealing with the complaints from the public that are not resolved by the local member stations. The individual member stations will comply with the standards, inform their audiences of the existence of the standards and of the public's avenues for recourse.

## Culture in Australia not without its frustrations

Brisbane, Australia: Media-ocracy, one must come out and confess, is one of the least positive aspects of life in the so-called "lucky country." Actually it's more than a bit of a worry.

All areas of mass communications are infected, electronic, print, the whole darned lot. And you can see, hear and feel the results of it all around you in perceived public awareness . . . the street vibe as it were.

Why, it might amaze you to learn that the Australian populace at large recently voted NO in a referendum asking Ozzies if they wanted a guarantee of fair and reasonable democratic voting procedures (i.e. one vote, one value) embodied in the Constitution. Australians also voted a resounding no to a number of other academic proposals which have long since been nailed down in the Canadian Constitution, no matter what its alleged failures.

You could easily get the idea that the concept of change is viewed somewhat suspiciously by the "lucky country" lads and ladies. That's if one was in any way cynical. Perish the thought. But we digress. Media-ocracy is the prime topic, and one could eke out oodles of verbal omelettes over the mass mind control circa 1988 by a handful of Ozzie media proprietors.

Take the widely-renounced ex-Ozzie, Rupert Murdoch, often pictured internationally as Citizen Murdoch, the heir to William Randolph Hearst, Citizen Kane in popular video culture. "No" insists "The Bulletin with Newsweek" (an Antipodean variation on the Washington Post's newsmag flagship), that description is too "facile." The third top story in the lead opera review points out that tickets for the upcoming Bolshoi Opera season will be \$110 per bum. Culture for the common man, eh?

In The Australian, there were two opera reviews; one theatre review of Richard II, a true chestnut; and four "serious" music reviews, plus an apology that "owing to lack of space, several reviews have been held over." Better believe it.

Personally, I find Tracy Chapman, Dire Straits, Supertramp and Roger Waters to be quite serious stuff. But there you go.

In the same tight issue of The Australian, we find an 11 1/2 X 4 1/2 ad for Anna Murdoch's looming Literary Lunch in Sydney (only \$30 per bum this time). Anna, perhaps co-incidentally, is the spouse of said Rupert. As all the biggest corporate barons have constantly maintained, keep it in the family. The Anna ad reveals that she "was forced to retire to the solitude of her holiday house in Aspen, Colorado, to complete her

Butler is referring to the Digital Silver Series of Great Orchestras, a series of four concerts by visiting orchestras from Europe and the U.S. The series is being underwritten by Digital Equipment of Canada as a celebration of their 25th anniversary year.

The visiting orchestras include the State Symphony Orchestra of the U.S.S.R (Oct 18), the Vienna Philharmonic (30), the San Francisco Symphony (Nov 29), and next year, the Gewandhaus Orchestra of Leipzig (Apr 30).

Leonard Bernstein, conductor of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra, will perform in Toronto for the first time in 20 years. The seventy year old Bernstein will perform on Oct 30, his only performance in Canada (and only three other concerts this year in the U.S.). Interestingly enough, the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra is run as a democracy in which all positions are held by members who are voted by the orchestra, not appointed, to their responsibility. The Concert Master, is Professor Werner Resel.

On the evening of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra performance, Edward Pickering, President of Roy Thomson Hall, will be saluted from the stage. He is retiring from his position this year.

Having been a part of Canada's national sheet, the *Globe And Mail's* first attempts to decipher the rock sub-culture, I can readily understand how difficult it is for editorial executives to come to grips with something so alien as popular culture. Hopefully Canada's mid-sixties era of editorial awareness will soon dawn down under. But I'm not holding my breath.

The video medium, in which I've hardly ever had any faith, is also dreadfully dismal down here. Firstly we have only three commercial TV channels, plus one ABC channel and another outlet, something akin to BBC 2, a minority-interest multi-cultural trip they call it. There's no cable TV, no Pay TV. Ah no, the mates have convinced Bob and the boys that any further encroachment on their privileged monopoly would prevent the production of local drama or "serious" programming. This market couldn't possibly support any more competition. That would be too much like free enterprise.

Nobody's losing too much in the TV world, you will readily appreciate. I couldn't begin to bore you with the every evening's TV fare of insanity, insanity and awesome insult to even a borderline intellect. These programmers start from the bottom and dig deeper. Nothing from nothing leaves nothing, as Billy Preston pointed out. He was absolutely right.

Broadcasting is another variation on the same tired theme that the less competition, the more healthy communication will remain, particularly for the existing information lords. We'll deal specifically with that topic in another column, probably the next one.

After spending two months in a liberated society such as Canada, clearly the media's blinker vision down under can be almost unnerving.

Yes mates, it is a bona fide "bit-of-a-worry," and then some.

### Debbie Johnson firmed for Miss Canada Pageant

KEITH RICHARDS - Rock

Talk Is Cheap - Virgin - VL-2554-W  
More by coincidence than by design has Richards recorded a hit, and hot, album. At a time when the industry remains a cool distance from the synthesizer, along comes the solo album from the greatest rock 'n' roll band's guitarist but more importantly with some of the roughest sounding vocals around. Shades of Stones certainly and yet it's everything expectations demand from Richards' solo effort; only he could get away with it. Marlboro smokin', Jack Daniels Drinkin', a commercial we didn't need. He's jammed with a lot of his friends and come up with quality product: Take It So Hard, Make No Mistake and Wrap It Up, to name a few.

GLENN FREY - Pop/Rock

Soul Searching - MCA - 6239-J  
Well, Frey, the former Eagle, is about to surprise a few people and not only within the industry. As the first single, True Love, virtually screams up the charts, look for several others to ride its coattails. Produced by Frey and Elliot Scheiner. Songs such as the title track, Some Kind Of Blue and Two Hearts are key. Interesting notations accompany the track listings on the inner sleeve. A great follow-up and a job well done by quite an astounding array of musicians.

IDLE EYES - Pop

Standing At The Edge - Black Rose - BR001-E  
It doesn't get any more pop than this. While the first single, the title track, met with only moderate success, Blue Train, the follow-up, simpler and less hook-oriented, is definitely worth a listen for any CHR, AOR or A/C programmer. There is no reason that this accessible sound should not be playlisted.

THE FEELIES - Pop

Only Life - A&M - DASP-5214-W  
A strong effort by this New Jersey band, Only Life shows the cohesion that one would expect from a band that has been together for about a decade. At times, lead singer Glenn Mercer sounds more like Lou Reed than Lou Reed ever did himself. The lead guitar sound never changes from a tubular whine, which becomes fairly annoying by the end of the record. However, as a whole, the release is solid and should be pushed hard at the campus level.

DEAR MR. PRESIDENT - Pop

Dear Mr. President - Atlantic - 78-18801-P  
Juvenile lyrics, unpleasant vocals, synth and distortion guitar do not add up to a palatable package. It is hard to find anything to like about this band and its debut album, and it will take more than a little luck to break it at any level. The final track, Who Killed Santa Claus?, is useful as a working definition of self-indulgence. The strongest song, Love And Violence, sounds suspiciously like Life In Tokyo. Produced by Mick Jones.


BON JOVI - Pop/Rock  
New Jersey  
Mercury - 836 3451-Q

Musically, the much awaited follow-up to Slippery When Wet is actually similar to their earlier release, which is greatly reinforced by the lyrical messages. From old friends to old homes, Bon Jovi now sounds more and more like Bruce Springsteen (someone they've always admired anyway), with respect to the images conjured up of their home state but also in delivery. Born To Be My Baby has "smash" written all over it, while other key tracks include Living In Sin and Stick To Your Guns, with its mono introduction similar to John Mellencamp's a while back. Recorded again by Bruce Fairbairn, while engineering and mixing were completed by Bob Rock at Little Mountain Studios in Vancouver.



JON ASTLEY - Pop  
The Compleat Angler  
Atlantic - 78-18821-P

The first cut, But Is It Commercial, asks a question that Astley obviously can answer himself with production credits for the first two Corey Hart albums to his name. His sardonic jab at the popular music industry unfortunately suggests that Astley considers his own output non-commercial, an opinion that demands dispute after listening to his newest release. Key at present is Put This Love To The Test, which showcases Astley's cool, measured vocals. A must for alternative and campus radio.



ONE TO ONE - Pop/Rock  
1-2-1 - Bonaire/WEA - BON-12121-P

Radio-wise the band got off to a good start last time with the singles There Was A Time and Angel In Your Pocket. This time around the pattern hasn't changed much, as Hold Me Now continues its steady climb. The album is certainly a much stronger effort though, as the duo have matured along the way evident on such songs as

Heading For Zero and Victorious. It's a good record that should help the band culture quite a following and develop into an act worthy of recognition outside of Canada as well. Recorded at the band's own Distortion Studios in Ottawa this past winter.



BILLY BRAGG - Pop  
Workers Playtime  
Go! Discs - 836 430-1-Q

Bragg delivers his most radio accessible package to date without sacrificing any of the musical and lyrical freshness. Although, as in Talking To The Taxman About Poetry, back-musicians are employed, the strength and style of the songwriting are unwavering and, with the exception of Rotting On Demand, which is reminiscent of Big Boy Now, the tracks seem more closely akin to his earliest releases than to his most recent studio effort. Aptly titled, Workers Playtime concentrates on the intensely personal themes which often have been overshadowed by the heavy critical emphasis placed on his socialist leanings. While all cuts are key, the obvious radio picks are Waiting For The Great Leap Forwards, which evolves into a rousing singalong, and The Price I Pay, with its lovely harmonious hook.

JEFFREY HATCHER - Rock  
& THE BIG BEAT - Cross Our Hearts  
Upside/Columbia - FC-80132-H

Winnipeg was home to more than a few notable bands, and add to that list, Jeffrey Hatcher & The Big Beat. There's a cold yet warm prairie beat here that should bring this rock quartet into prominence, even though it is through the back door: a U.S. release first. The band comprises Jeffrey's brothers Paul and Don and keyboardist Gord Girvan. A closely-knit band displaying the confidence of vocal and instrumental veterans, and an energy that goes in keeping with a bushy-tailed aggressiveness of a new band.

EDDY GRANT - Pop  
File Under Rock  
Capitol - C1-90343-F

Veteran recording artist Eddy Grant's new release mixes rock, soul, pop and reggae into a product which is not very suitable for Canadian radio as it exists today. Unfortunately, the combination of styles often results in a whole less than the sum of its parts. There is no track on the album destined for hit status, although Harmless Piece Of Fun, Gimme Hope Jo'Anna and Chuck (Is The King), a tribute to Chuck Berry, are strong.

VARIOUS ARTISTS - Country  
More Hot Country Requests, Vol. II  
Epic - FE-44280-H

Nothing like having all the hits in one package and that's what we have here. Includes Ricky Van Shelton's Somebody Lied, Exile's She's Too Good To Be True, T.G. Sheppard's Half Past Forever (Till I'm Blue In The Heart), Second To No One by Rosanne Cash, and John Conlee's The Carpenter.

WILLIE NELSON - Country  
What A Wonderful World  
Columbia - FC-44331-H

Those country fans who said they had enough of Nelson dueting with Julio Iglesias will have to wait for Spanish Eyes to have its run. This is the only track on the set that includes Iglesias, thank heaven. Nelson should have much success with this package as he lets that vintage Nelson spirit soar with Moon River, Ole Buttermilk Sky, Twilight Time and, of course, the title track. Front-rack this item.



DURANTE - Pop  
Tandem - TDMLP-88043-E

Montrealer (Sandro) Durante is somewhat of a veteran in the business, although this is his first album that clearly defines his vocal charm. Previously he was part of the Moral Support duo. Durante's talents are also displayed here on piano, guitar, bass, synthesizers and percussion, which he shares with other session musicians. Great song material: Can't Give You Love, All The Way, and Falling, all Durante originals. Produced by Sylvain Jacob at Montreal's Marko Studio. Very impressive horn section.

LONNIE MACK - Country  
Roadhouses & Dance Halls  
Epic - FE-44075-H

You can't get any more traditional than Lonnie Mack, and Too Rock For Country, Too Country For Rock And Roll, the first single from this Mack/Barry Beckett production, should fit nicely into the traditional slot for country programmers. There's a lot of competition however, for this veteran, and the going will be tough, but he will nudge himself up the charts eventually. Mack isn't too far afield, although his sound has more of the fifties to it, but the arrangements and vocals are cleverly presented so as to fit into the eighties, which gives this LP a bit of an edge. Also key are Plain Jane (In A Mustang), Honky Tonk Man, and High Blood Pressure.

WAYLON JENNINGS - Country  
Full Circle - MCA - MCA-42222-J

Jennings maintains his rebel status with this Jennings/Jimmy Bowen production. How Much Is It Worth To Live In L.A., the first single, is already charting, an indication of what's to come. Also key are Yoyos, Bozos, Bimbos And Heroes, It Goes With The Territory, and You Put The Soul In The Song. Says Jennings, "This record is a conglomeration of everything I've ever done," which says everything.

JOHNNY RODRIGUEZ - Country  
Gracias - Capitol C1-90040-F

Rodriguez has been off the chart scene for some time, but this release, his debut for Capitol, should reinstate him very quickly. Much more was expected with his single, I Wanna Wake Up With You, but at least it was a door opener. He should have more success with No Chance To Dance, I Didn't (Every Chance I Had), and Sweet Courtnita, Sweet Home. The Rodriguez vocal treatment is unique, which got him onto the charts in the beginning. Now, he will have to be backed by an aggressive promotion campaign to bring him back into that arena.

Also indicating strong radio support is Barbara Mandrell's I Wish I Could Fall In Love Today up to 31 from 44, and Michael Johnson's That's That up from 45 to 32. Dean Dillon is still a left-fielder with his Capitol debut, I Go To Pieces, which moves into the No. 49 position from No. 58. New to the chart this week and boasting a No. 67 position is Eddie Rabbitt with his latest RCA single, We Must Be Doin Somethin Right. Also new is Shenandoah with Mama Knows at 87; The McCarters, who were such a hit at their recent Graceland showcase, with their single I Give You Music; Sawyer Brown, who is destined for top of the chart action with My Baby's Gone in at No. 91; Patty Loveless at 94 with Blue Side Of Town; and a surprise from Buck Owens, Hot Dog, the title track from his Capitol album. Also looking good for the first week is Highway 101 with All The Reasons Why at 97, Steve Wariner's Hold On (A Little Longer) at 99, and Ottawa's Kevin Head with his Snowy River debut, Good As Gold, first week on at No. 100.

Ronnie Hawkins will shortly launch a tour of Canada and the U.S. playing mostly soft-seat theatres. Steve Thomson, Hawkins' manager, points out that the switch to soft-seat theatres from the bar circuit is a well-thought out strategy that will present Hawkins to a larger audience and one that will recognize yet another side of the rockabilly great.
