Sheila Conner a victim of cancer

Sheila Conner, a veteran in the broadcast field and a highly respected music programmer, has lost a lengthy battle with cancer. Ms. Conner, who was 47 years of age, passed away at Toronto's Princess Margaret Hospital on February 9th. A memorial service was held in Toronto with burial in Winnipeg.

Ms. Conner began her radio career at CJOB, in her hometown of Winnipeg, and a few years later moved to Toronto joining the library staff at CHUM, where she enjoyed a long and very successful career. She then became Music Director at CKFM, and it was here where she gained the reputation of being a "very tough, but fair music programmer." She prided herself on judging records on their own merit and often voiced displeasure with outside influences. Ms. Conner went on to join the programming staff of Rogers Broadcasting, and her most recent position was that of Music Director for CFRB, which she had to leave because of failing health.

Island titles added to MCA CD reduction series

MCA is currently running with Phase V of its series of Compact Disc price reductions. Added to the mid-line catalogue are 29 titles from Island Records, including U2's *Under A Blood Red Sky*, *Slave To The Rhythm* by Grace Jones, Robert Palmer's *Sneakin Sally*, *Pressure Drop*, *Clues*, *Secrets and Pride*, *Time And Place* by Andrew Cash, Marianne Faithfull's *Strange Weather*, *Rain Dogs*, Frank's *Wild Years and Swordfish* and Jimmy Cliff's *The Harder They Fall*, to name a few. "Response has been excellent at account level," says MCA's Vice President, Sales, Randy Lennox.

All selections are stickered with a CIDM prefix, with no change in the numbering sequence. The series was introduced on a free goods (built in the price) programme, and carries a suggested list price of \$16.98 (price code N). These additions put the overall mid-line series at more than 150 selections.

A&M releases debut LP for Liona Boyd

Liona Boyd, one of the world's leading classical guitarists, has signed to A&M. Her debut for the label, and her 15th album release, is titled *Encore*, comprised of new material which she wrote and co-wrote. Also included are new works by longtime collaborator Richard Fortin.

"We are delighted to welcome Ms. Boyd to the A&M family," said Gerry Lacoursiere, President A&M Records Canada. "She is eclectic, prolific and without equal around the world and *Encore* makes the beginning of a potentially explosive collaboration."

Boyd has won four Junos and has been awarded the Vanier Award and the Order of Canada. She recently won Classical Guitarist of The Year for the fourth consecutive year in *Guitar Player Magazine*.

CRIA certifications for Cancon - down from '87

Figures released by the Canadian Recording Industry (CRIA) show Canadian content certifications for both albums and singles for the year 1988 were down significantly, (48 compared to 59 in 1987.)

There were no quadruple or triple platinum awards during 1988, however, in 1987 there was one for each category. In the double platinum category, there were 2 certifications in 1988 as opposed to 33 the year earlier. The only noticeable increase was in the single platinum category with 18 certifications for 1988 and only 14 for 1987. Gold LP certifications for 1987 registered 35, and for 1988, only 26. In the gold singles category there were 5 certified for 1987 and only 2 for 1988.

Certifications for international releases were also down - 295 for 1988 as compared to 338 in 1987. There were 6 diamond awards in 1987 and only 5 in 1988. In the nine-times platinum category, there were 4 in 1987 and only 3 in 1988, with the same figures for the eight-times platinum category.

In the seven-times platinum category, there were 6 certifications for 1988, an increase over 1987 which registered 4. The six-times platinum category was also up, showing 7 in 1988 and only 6 in 1987. Quintuple certifications registered at 11 for 1988, and only 9 for the previous year, and in the quadruple platinum category, there were 10 for each year. Triple platinum was also down for 1988, registering 15 certifications over 18 for 1987. Double platinum for 1988

showed 19 certifications as opposed to 25 in 1987 and in the single platinum category there were 74 in 1988, an increase over 1987's 62 certifications. Gold certifications for 1988 were down to 126 as opposed to 1987 which had 152.

Certifications in the platinum and gold singles categories reflected the vinyl problem that plagued the industry the latter part of 1988, showing only 1 platinum single, while there were 3 in 1987, and 15 gold singles as opposed to 35 the year before.

Heydon voices unique challenge to industry

It is certainly a strange situation, some might term it shameful actually, but even after Sheriff's *When I'm With You* topped the international charts last week, Canadian labels refused to believe in their own success; as if it were some sort of fluke. Stacy Heydon took Sheriff from the bars and into Grant Avenue studios, and emerged with a genuine hit, albeit several years later, but a worldwide hit nonetheless. However, with this to boast about, he is now heading to New York, where he will entertain several offers to record.

"I'd love to stay in Canada and work with Canadian bands, but it's a Catch-22 situation here," he explains. "When I go to a Canadian label, they say, 'Why should we hire you, when we can get an American producer for the same amount?' And when I go to American labels, they say 'Why should we hire a Canadian when we have a hundred Americans with the same credentials to choose from?' That's a real problem for this industry."

Prior to producing Sheriff, Heydon had recorded Teenage Head, and has performed with David Bowie (both on record and in concert), and yet he says only Deane Cameron and John Alexander were willing to have him produce other projects. History seems to be repeating itself in more than one area with this story though, as only one Canadian label has called in the past week, compared to the six U.S. labels that have expressed an interest in obtaining his services. "Having a number one single can't even guarantee me a job in Canada," he adds.

The obviously talented producer operates his own label, Wind Song Records, which is currently promoting the Windsor (Ontario) based Michael Patrick Band, that has already taken Detroit rock station WLZZ by storm. "It's been a Top 3 record for the past month," says Joe Wood of RDR Promotions. But, again, Canada isn't taking any chances, quips Heydon. "I'd like to see the situation where the Canadian government has to regulate the amount of foreign songs played on the radio," he adds, challenging radio to support more than their Cancon quota.

Canada undoubtedly has some of the very best recording facilities in the world, after all, a Studer is a Studer is a Studer. But when our young bands are given the budgets to record, they invariably choose either New York or Los Angeles and a foreign producer to boot. Heydon asks why. In fact, he would like to see recording budgets trimmed and more bands in the studio, developing that elusive Canadian sound. The Sheriff album was recorded for Reel Records, an independent label, and it seems to have done quite well for the band.

"More than wealth, I would rather have a Canadian scene," concludes Heydon. "But it's really becoming apparent that I won't be able to stay up here much longer. Even with free trade, it just can't get any worse than it is right now. It's all up to the kids, and the talent is out there. They're the ones who write the songs . . . and they're the ones who have the answers."



It was a "yawn" exercise at the best, and I knew very few would get that chance because of their general attitude towards "things Canadian." But then there was that evolving national pride . . . which I stupidly thought was happening. Well, it hasn't. I was talking to the lead singer of a band that recently started to break out across Canada. A nice "uptown" girl. She wasn't interested in a Juno, nor in chart action in Canada. "I'd be much happier winning a Grammy than a Juno," she told me, "and getting on American charts . . . Wow!!" What's that old saying, "It's better to be a big fish in a small pond than a small fish in a big pond, or a rejection like Charlie Tuna." (EC: *Do we stand on guard . . . ?*)

Radio, Radio! Wherefore art thou? (I'm slowly developing that cassette vs CD syndrome . . . sans radio, and I don't like it. CDs and cassettes don't tell me what time it is, but on the other hand, some radio stations don't. I'm finding a lot more excitement in the CDs and cassettes I receive than I do

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listening to the radio. Where's that spark that used to create an exciting competitive edge in radio? Music is, or I thought it was, radio's top priority, if it's after the 18 to 25 year olds. (EC: *Is that like chicken coup?*) And speaking of chickens, he's strutting around like a fox let loose in a henhouse full of cluckers. During the latter part of last year, and


A new mechanical royalty rate is imminent

The onus is on the artist/writer (who, in most instances, negotiates a record deal prior to dealing with a publisher) not to accept the controlled composition clause - no other individual involved in the creative process works under these conditions - slowly but surely the change will come in 1989 for the better of the industry.

On another front, the Warner/Chappell commitment to domestic acts, since the merger, is in full stride. We have just hired Geoff Kulawick as Professional Manager. He will be coordinating material internationally for David Roberts, Stan Meissner, Colin Linden, Myles Hunter, John Whynot and Henry Small. We'll be looking to purchase Canadian catalogues as well as making meaningful co-publishing deals and supporting our creative roster with co-writing situations in America.

I look forward to 1989 with cautious optimism. A&A is projected to open between 25 and 30 new locations including a number of new SuperStores. I am forecasting increases for A&A in our per store unit volume. However, I remain very concerned about the general health of the industry.

As the CRIA year-end wholesale numbers clearly indicate, the industry overall, was down 2 percent in unit volume. It is all well and good that dollar volume is up 10 percent. I know this was caused by inflation and compact disc increases. However, as I said last year, and the year before, units equal customers, customer growth equals good health.

The industry needs to re-examine a number of our current business practices. Why have compact disc prices remained artificially inflated, especially in relationship to the U.S. market? Why are LPs being prematurely killed off by regressive wholesale policies and pricing? Why is there no longer an affordable "first purchase" configuration for the young teen consumer? Why is the retailer facing disincentives in his attempts to carry full catalogue?

Competition should not be limited to a struggle for market-share in a stagnant market place. I challenge the industry to recognize the realities of our market place. We must anticipate and provide for our consumer's needs and expectations. At this moment, I do not see the industry doing the job.

Cowboy Junkies living a rock 'n' roll fantasy

For some bands, it's a long time coming and for others, it never comes at all, but when it does, it's always such a surprise. Fame is never expected, yet welcome because hopefully, hand in hand, comes fortune. So, when the American publicity machine kicks into high gear, fame can only be around the corner. Well, for the Cowboy Junkies, currently the focus of an intense RCA/BMG publicity campaign, it is taking quite some getting used to. Fame, that is.

When the bidding wars were underway last year, the Toronto band had three demands essentially: that they would remain the Cowboy Junkies, that their second album (The Trinity Session) would be released as their first of the seven album deal, and, with regards to their next record, that the label had to display some faith in the band's live recording method. These were met and the band went from obscurity to outstanding in a matter of months. An ordinary Canadian band had cracked the commercial veneer of the American entertainment industry, rather quickly and quietly too.

For Margo Timmins, and her brothers, the expectations were much less than any degree of fame. In fact, Timmins, the lead singer, never really aspired to sing, but was simply content to dream about the rock 'n' roll fantasy. "As I grew up with what everybody else grew up with . . . rock 'n' roll," begins the native Montrealer, "I used to sleep on the sidewalks to get tickets to see Springsteen and Dylan. As a kid, I was too young to understand the blues and I hated country. It wasn't part of my culture; rock 'n' roll was."

Timmins now loves country, but the talented vocalist also used to love the Sex Pistols as well. Times change and so do people. "In those days," she elaborates, "I was much more aggressive, much more,

angry . . . I guess. Or I wanted to be angry. Everybody else was angry, so I thought I'd be angry too. Although I had nothing to be angry about, I was a white suburban kid. I had no problems, but it seemed to be fun at the time."

Regardless, The Trinity Session is causing quite a stir down south. It's a critical fave and Timmins is certain the adulation will not last. As a matter of interest, she adds, the "backlash" has already begun. Fortunately, the band does not write or record for the critics, but for themselves. No amount of fame can be adequate reward for an unsatisfying album, from the band's point of view anyway.

"Some people say it's a country album," Timmins explains. "and I agree with that. Some people say it's a blues album, and I'll agree with that too. We didn't set out to make a certain kind of music. We wrote music that appeals to us . . . that makes sense to us. There's so many different types of music in all of us, it's a really weird set up and I'd love to figure it out. But somehow, all the different pieces work. I don't know how they work, but they do."

"RCA seems to understand where we're coming from. Their plan of action was not to ram the music down people's throats. It was to allow people to discover us as quickly or as slowly as they wanted. RCA is huge, a major corporation with tons of money. They can make any band famous. It's just a matter of them deciding to stick you in every record store or on every radio station, and we really didn't want that. We wanted it to happen naturally."

Now that the wheels are in motion though, and the pace is definitely beginning to quicken with mounting sales, the pressure is also escalating at a frightening speed. However, calmly, Timmins suggests the band

would be just as happy if the entire "rock 'n' roll fantasy" collapsed tomorrow. After all, nothing ventured, nothing gained, and all they wanted in the first place was the ability to tour and play their music to appreciative audiences, whatever the size and whatever the country.

"We could easily be doing what we were doing and being quite content doing it, because we had no expectations of getting signed to the majors," Timmins concludes. "We hoped that maybe an independent would pick us up. That was our goal, sort of, and if Graham (Henderson, an entertainment lawyer) hadn't been at the Rivoli gig last year, and liked our music . . . then we'd still be there today."

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CBC Radio still reflects Canada's musical mosaic

Today, there are not too many music directors who will readily admit to a shortage of music in this country, let alone a shortage of Cancon. Radio stations around the world, for decades, have been ensured an infinite supply of music diverse enough for any tastes by the eclectic record companies, as well as the various independent labels ready and willing to fill any perceived gap or hole left in the market. This, however, is not the case for CBC Radio, now, apparently, a bastion of disparate musical genres in an age of blatant Top 40 and that common ilk.

CBC Radio continues to record musicians whose material otherwise cannot be heard unless seen live, after sifting through all the weekly releases, thus ensuring the broadcaster can maintain its stringent commitment to Cancon and exposing previously buried talent via the airwaves from Newfoundland to British Columbia. The CBC produces recordings at its own studios, recalling an era practically forgotten in commercial radio circles, through a program now operating under the auspices of Variety Recordings.

The name change to Variety Recordings, which for many years actually released its best recordings on compilation LPs (and there is one more to come), better reflects its proper intentions, informs Ian Kennedy, the station's music director who heads up the program from the Music Sources office. Under his direction, more appropriately and yet obviously, the program and CBC Radio is really suited to simply expose talent than

develop it, as was formerly implied, he adds. Hence the change.

"One of the projects that I'm currently working on is another recording with Sneezy Waters and it's not like we're developing his talent," Kennedy explains. "He has talent, but it's not commercial enough that any major label wants to invest in it." Essentially, the shortage problem is one of quality, not of quantity. "We're interested in music that will sound good on radio," he continues, "and we will invest money making sure we can get it."

From the dozens of proposals that are submitted, only "several" are selected by Kennedy and his committee every few months. Although the subsequent recordings

remain the property of the CBC, the artist does receive a copy and, if upon choosing to do so, can forward the tape to a label. "If it gets them a major record contract," says Kennedy, "then we've really done our job. Because a year later, for no cost, we'll get a whole album worth of material from an artist who we were interested in to begin with."


The Music Sources office not only takes undiscovered and unrecorded talent into the studio, but also acts as a clearing house or distribution centre for recorded material, independent or with major label distribution. "We're here to build on that base," Kennedy concludes, "to make sure that all the independent recording artists are aware that when you have product . . . this is where you audition it. From here, we will distribute it to all the CBC stations across the country and direct it to those programmers that are going to be most interested in it."

CAB's Gold Ribbon to CJLS Yarmouth

The Gold Ribbon Award "for excellence in spot news coverage in Canadian radio," went to CJLS Radio in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia. The award was in recognition of the station's "immediate national coverage" of the landing of 174 refugee-claimants on the shores of Charlesville, Nova Scotia in 1987.

The Gold Ribbon Awards are presented annually by the CAB and is the latest award earned by CJLS in recent years. The station previously won three national and seven regional news awards from the Radio Television News Directors Association and the Atlantic Journalism Awards Program, for spot news and documentaries.

"We are extremely proud of our Atlantic Journalists," boasts a proud CJLS General Manager, Grant P. Wyman. "We have some of the best in the country, and all of us in the media should take every opportunity to express that view to our readers and audiences . . . those served by our journalists' efforts."



Coveted CAB Gold Ribbon Award

PAUL DEAN - Rock
Hard Core - Columbia - FC-44462-H
Hard Core, produced by Brian McLeod and Dean himself, continues in establishing him as a player of considerable prowess. The musical and songwriting collaborations on this album read like a veritable Who's Who of 1980's rock. Draw The Line was written by Bryan Adams and Jim Vallance, while Sword And Stone was written by Paul Stanley and Bruce Kulick of KISS with ace songsmith Desmond Child. Loverboy's Mike Reno collaborates with his bandmate, as well as Jon Bon Jovi and Ritchie Sambora on Under The Gun. Finally, members of Streetheart chip in with a remake of Action. As one might expect, all this talent brought together for one project results in a final product that rock programmers should find impossible to resist.

DREAMS SO REAL - Pop/Rock
Rough Night In Jericho
Arista - AL-9555-N

They hail from Athens, Georgia, the hometown of R.E.M., and it would appear that this band has perfected their own personal style while sharpening their chops on older songs like R.E.M.'s The One I Love. This is not to suggest a soundalike band; on the contrary, Dreams So Real display recognizable, but uniquely original, vocal harmonies on tracks like California, while showcasing a remarkably clean guitar tone throughout. The lyrics to Melanie and Bearing Witness was poetically with an endearing whimsical romanticism. AOR has previously picked up on the title track, and could easily go a few cuts deeper on this pleasantly surprising LP.



BRIGHTON ROCK - Rock
Take A Deep Breath
WEA - 25-59691-P

Once again, Jack Richardson delivers a slick production. Overall, Brighton Rock's diverse approach to song structures combined with Gerald McGhee's vocal phrasing combine to create a unique sound. One key cut is Unleash The Rage, an anthem suitably written to serve as an opening song in live performances. One More Try is the obvious single selection, and features teen supermodel Monika Schnarre in the video. A new Canadian band has entered the ring. They have youth and talent on their side, and with the release of this LP, there is nowhere to go but onward and upward.

IVAN NEVILLE - Pop
If My Ancestors Could See Me Now
Polydor - 834 896-1-Q

With the first single, Not Just Another Girl, having made a minor dent at radio, this album could go either way from here. Neville's vocals, rougher than, but strongly suggestive of Huey Lewis, and the guitar work of Danny Kortchmar are the real story for this project. The likely candidates for a follow-up release, both mellower than the majority of tracks included. Overall, a fairly strong commercial effort that breaks no new ground or, in other words, run-of-the-mill.

THE DEAD MILKMEN - Rock
Beelzebubba - Enigma - D1-73351-F

Chances are, if these boys read a shining review of this album, they would have a good laugh over having fooled at least one critic. From the same songwriting school as Dead Kennedys, The Ramones and The Forgotten Rebels, their material lacks the energy and wit that afforded those acts their success. The humour is at its best on Bad Parts, Punk Rock Girl and Everybody's Got Nice Stuff By Me, being too blatant on the rest of the effort. With better production and a heavy muzzle on their self-indulgence, the band could conceivably release a successful novelty song. Features some enjoyable organ playing by guest musician Bucky Fellini.

YAZZ - Pop
Wanted
Elektra - 96-08421-P

Jazz, funk, soul and R&B influences are fused together to form the basis of the Yazz sound. Her background includes experience as a nightclub disc jockey in London, England. This acquainted her with several production teams including Coldcut, Youth, and the Beatmasters, all of who are employed on this album. A few cuts like Fine Time or Systematic People may catch on at CHR, but much more success will certainly be found in the dance clubs, where this release should warrant heavy rotation. Recorded at Fon Studios in Sheffield and Livingston Studios in London.

ENYA - Pop
Watermark - WEA - 24-38751-P

This album should certainly launch not only Enya's career but also just might clear out all existing Clannad stock as well. There's no doubt left at all about the vocal prowess of this talent, though most unnoticed in the past, and quite a shame to be left undiscovered by so many for so long. Orinoco Flow has already proven itself on the U.K. charts and is now starting to make similar moves here. The album is more effective overall, than individually, and will be an early top seller this year.

SCRUFFY THE CAT - Pop/Rock
Moons Of Jupiter
Relativity - 61-82371-P

Although some new tracks do stand out and fulfill the band's promise, most don't and hence won't propel this album into many album collections. Punchy production and intelligence evident in their songs, unfortunately, just isn't going to rescue this package, boring overall. With the possible exceptions being I Do, Betty Drops In and Places. Recorded by Jim Dickinson at Ardent Studios in Memphis.

BOOTLEG - Country
Bootleg - Rana - RR-017

A powerful outing from this Vancouver-based band with all the trimmings necessary to make the charts. Already gaining national recognition with The Cowboy Thing To Do, taken as a single. Produced by Ron Irving and Peter Morris with the exception of In My Arms Tonight, which was produced by Irving and Bryan Nelson. Lots of stretching material here and great harmonies. Key are You've Got Me Hurtin and Champagne And Roses.

EMMYLOU HARRIS - Country/Pop
Bluebird - Reprise - 92-57761-P

Perhaps the most important, certainly the best package of entertainment from this classy lady in her long career. She covers every conceivable pop and country angle possible and there's an instrumental cushion here that belies description. Harris produced with Richard Bennett. Key are John Hiatt's penning of Icy Blue Heart, Kate, Anna and Jane McGarrigle's writing of Love is, which, incidentally is Cancon (ML), and No Regrets, written by Tom Rush. Great stuff and effective cover art.

SLICK RICK - Rap
The Great Adventures Of...
Def Jam - FC-40513-H

Hailing originally from England, Slick Rick's rhymes are a lot easier for the average listener to understand than standard rap fare. Nevertheless, the album is not destined for the mainstream acceptance achieved by DJ Jazzy Jeff & The Fresh Prince. The

first single, Teenage Love, a wimpy synthesized rap ballad, has nothing special to recommend it to programmers and will definitely be the only single offering, the other tracks being too hard and too rude for radio, the latter a feature which may lead to greater success at the dance club and, as a result, retail levels.

DALBELLO - Pop/Rock
She - Capitol - C1-48286-F

In grand fashion, Dalbello's latest album was launched in a live concert performance from Toronto's Diamond Club and carried nationally on MuchMusic. In many ways, the new release picks up where her 1984 Whomamfoursays album left off and should win even more critical acclaim and commercial acceptance. The first single, Tango, taken for Canadian release, may be too stylistically eclectic to catch on at CHR. AOR programmers however, may be specially interested in Black On Black which displays a harder edge, or immaculate Eyes featuring David Gilmour on lead guitar. The project was produced and arranged by Dalbello herself, who may prove to be one of the most vital and versatile recording artists that Canada has ever produced.

JANE BUNNETT - Jazz
In Dew Time
Dark Light - DL-9001

A package of jazz exhuberance, rarely heard on disc. Bunnett and her distinguished guests display an unusual brand of regimented jazz with touches of improvisation that adds to the instrumental perfection. The players, Bunnett included, are masters at their craft: Dewey Redman on tenor sax, and he needs no introduction, drummer Claude Ranger, Vincent Chancey on French horn, bassist Scott Alexander, keyboardist's Don Pullen and Brian Dickens, Bunnett's husband Larry Cramer on trumpet and flugelhorn, and of course, Bunnett, an exceptional jazz flautist/saxophonist.

BRUCE COCKBURN - Pop
Big Circumstance
True North/Epic - TN-70-H

The first single, If A Tree Falls, is meeting with a good degree of radio success and AOR support for the album is being drawn by Shipwrecked At The Stable Door and Where The Death Squad Lives. Cockburn's material continues to reinforce his larger-than-life image as a political poet. These are not just words, they are a personal outpouring of concern over what he has seen first hand, and Canadians are fortunate to have a recording artist who will "lock-in" his career fighting for causes that effect so many, but are recognized by so few. Cockburn stands head and shoulders over his "greedy" counterparts, whose main goals would seem to be stardom and monetary gain at any cost.

DAVID GIBSON - Pop
David Gibson - A&M - SP-9148-W

A promising debut from this young Canadian singer/songwriter, whose self-titled LP should gain considerable acceptance at CHR. The first single, We Close Our Eyes, exemplifies the quality of work that's found elsewhere on the album. Slick production and silky smooth vocals combine to create a glossy sound overall, but one that maintains its freshness and originality. Produced by Domenic Troiano and recorded at Round Sound Studios in Toronto.

TANITA TIKARAM - Pop
Ancient Heart - WEA - 24-38771-P

What is most impressive about this album is the restraint shown by the teenaged artist and the unhurried feel delivered. Vocally reminiscent of a cross between Ricky Lee Jones and Lou Reed, the choice of instrumentation effectively complements the laid back atmosphere established early in the project. Both Good Tradition and Twist In My Sobriety are finding solid radio play for such a young unknown. Unfortunately, the guitar work is consistently masked by a keyboard sound which, along with that of the strings and horns, never seems to change, resulting in monotony.



THE BOOKROOM - Pop
The Bookroom
Unique - UNI-101-E

Many major label executives will be surprised with this release, as most of their own developing acts can't do half as well. Simple and melodic, with excellent harmonies and arrangements, this band should not be left independent for too long. Produced at the band's Redwood studios in Toronto.

T.G.SHEPPARD - Country
Crossroads - Columbia - FC-44421-H

It's not too often that Sheppard isn't chart bound, and he's doing it now with You Still Do, the second single taken from this Bob Montgomery production, the first being Don't Say It With Diamonds. Unlike Sheppard's past couple of albums, the instrumental backing is down to a roar, very simple, which allows a little more concentration on his vocals and lyric content. Also key are While I'm Here and She Didn't Break My Heart.

DON WILLIAMS - Country
Prime Cuts - Capitol - C1-91444-F

America's favourite "country boy" just rolls along with hit after hit, and he's doing it with this album as well. His current chartbuster Old Coyote Town, has made impressive moves up the charts. That's Charles Cochran on piano and Biff Watson on electronic keyboards. Also key is the Dave Loggins penning of We've Got A Good Fire Goin', with Loggins on guitars and harmony vocals. Produced by Williams and Garth Fundis, with the latter also supplying harmony vocals.

CHET ATKINS - Country
Chet Atkins C.G.P.
Columbia - FC-44323-H

He's called "the world's most famous guitarist," and here are ten good reasons why. Atkins co-produced with Darryl Dyke, with the exception of Knuckelbustars, produced by David Hungate. Atkins, a Certified Guitar Player (C.G.P.) has enhanced his guitar work with trumpet, saxophone and flugelhorn and, of course, fiddle, with a little more than necessary synthesizer programming. Great stuff. Key are Chinook Winds, which Atkins co-wrote with Dyke, John Sebastian's Daydream, and Tony Joe White's Light-hearted Lisa. Clever and very simple jacket artwork.

MEL MCDANIEL - Country
Rock-A-Billy Boy
Capitol - C1-91133-F

McDaniel hasn't looked back since his hit of Baby's Got Her Blue Jeans On, and he continues here with this Jerry Kennedy production in that same fashion. Country, with an edge or soft country, McDaniel has a way with lyrics that sets him aside from the rest. Key are Blue Suede Shoes, the title track and the first single, Walk That Way. His 10th LP for Capitol.






