





WEA strengthens team with internal moves.

Stan Kulin, President WEA Music Canada, has announced the appointment of three of his top executive personnel to senior positions within the company.

Garry Newman has been appointed Senior Vice President and Managing Director of the U.S. Divisions, while Dave Tollington takes on the new mantle of Senior Vice President and Managing Director of Domestic and International Division. In the financial structure of the company, Claude Sassoon has been appointed Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer.

In making the above announcement, Kulin points out that "These appointments reflect the contributions of all three to our exceptional growth over the past three years," concluding with, "I'm confident our

growth will continue under their leadership."

In a related move, Newman announces the appointment of Kim Cooke to the position of Vice President National Promotion and Special Projects, effective May 1st.

CBS Direct teams with MuchMusic for releases

CBS Direct, a leader in the marketing of TV product, has joined with MuchMusic for the release of two new packages. Both releases, available on a single album, cassette and compact disc, are based on MuchMusic's programs *The Power Hour* and *Soul In The City*.

The game plan, according to CBS Direct is "to combine outstanding repertoire with heavy television advertising on MuchMusic to drive consumers into the stores." MuchMusic reportedly penetrates into 3.4 million households across Canada on basic cable distribution with more distribution planned for this year.

Demographically speaking the campaign will allow for saturation in both the 12 to 17 and 18 to 34 age groups. It's expected that with the combination of the repertoire, plus the aggressive in-store p.o.p., both these packages will be hot items for the spring.

The *Power Hour* album features fourteen heavy metal tracks on a single album, cassette and compact disc. Included are Iron Maiden's *Run To The Hills*, You've Got Another Thing Coming by Judas Priest, Rock You by Helix, Rush's *Tom Sawyer*, Lee Aaron's *Metal Queen* and *Thirty Days In The Hole* by Kick Axe, to name a few.

The *Soul In The City* album comprises fourteen of the top soul artists of today. Included in the package are Billy Newton-Davis with *Perfect Love*, Marvin Gaye's *What's Going On*, Brenda Russell's *Piano In The Dark*, *Roses Are Red* by Mac Band featuring The McCampbell Brothers, and more.

Saturn maintains belief in power of cassette single

"We believe the cassette singles are working," says Saturn's Leonard Kennedy, a major player in the introduction of this configuration to the Canadian market. "Of course, it's the way I approached the situation over the last seven or eight months," he continues.

Saturn has been using its present fixtures (45 bins), but putting the cassette single into a red longbox, with the actual printing on the longbox indicating that it is a cassette single.

"We're doing it ourselves," explains Kennedy, "because it still really doesn't have the identification at store level . . . but it's selling through. We've also brought down our own charts, from Top 50 to Top 30 on vinyl and we're positioning whatever cassette singles that are available, with our present fixtures.

But as Kennedy reveals, "There will be a fixture at the end of May that the record companies will 'flip for', which we will put into all of our locations. This fixture will

Germany's Gronemeyer gets Capitol Canada push

Herbert Gronemeyer, considered one of Germany's "most successful" pop artists, is getting the full promotion treatment by Capitol Records - EMI Canada who hope to break this young talent in North America. He is described as "Central Europe's reigning King of album-oriented rock."

Gronemeyer has three European album releases behind him with a total of 3 million in sales. He just recently released his fourth EMI album, *What's All This*, which is his first for the North American market. The new album contains the title track from Bocham, Gronemeyer's first album, which sold close to two million units and which carried him into domestic rock fame.

As well as the cassette and CD, the media package contains a very impressive video on Gronemeyer entitled *Portrait Of An Artist*.

Mica Paris to Toronto for North American debut

Island Records has chosen Toronto's Club Blue Note (May 2) for the North American debut of 20-year old London R&B/pop songstress Mica (pronounced Meesha) Black. She has already turned heads in her native Britain, and her single, *My One Temptation*, taken from her debut LP, *So Good*, has been given the nod by U.S. trades.

The Toronto showing will allow the media the opportunity to meet a modern-day trend setter. Paris and her vocal approach is somewhat unique for London's entertainment community. Her backing musicians are all unknown with the exception of sax man Courtney Pine, who adds to the overall class sound of the album. Although her Jamaican roots are proudly in place, Black has borrowed from the Motown sound of the late sixties, creating a blend of vocal charm that has already prompted one British critic to label her *So Good* album as "one of the classics of 1989."

I.R.S. restructures with new appointments

I.R.S. Records recently renewed their distribution agreement with MCA Records for North America, a long term deal rumoured to be for five years. The Canadian operation is now located in their own office complex at 99 Sudbury Street in the west end of Toronto. They were previously housed in the MCA building.

Paul Orescan, Label Manager for I.R.S. Records Canada, has beefed up the operation's marketing department with the appointment of Steven Kane, who has been appointed National Marketing Coordinator. He comes to I.R.S. from Kennedy Record Sales, where he served as manager/buyer. Prior to that he was store manager/domestic buyer for R.O.W. Entertainment's flagship store, their Yonge Street location in Toronto, a position he held for two years.

Joining the company as office manager is Caroline Chia, who was most recently with Head Office Management. Prior to that she was Promotions Manager at the Entex Club in Mississauga, Ontario. As well, she has four years experience as office manager at T.B.A. (Tsavdaris Barrow Associates) Management.


identify the cassette single, which I think will also be a very good merchandising tool that will add awareness at the consumer level."

The new fixture, which is being provided by a few of the interested labels, holds forty facings for cassette singles, six deep. "All we do," says Kennedy, "is take the cassette single out of the longbox and put it into the fixture which is just the size of the cassette."

He concludes with, "Now that record companies have to make radio stations aware of the availability of cassette singles, the end result will be an informed consumer."

Saturn has always been a major player in the singles business and, now with more than 500 locations which include Zellers, Woolco, Woolworths, Towers and a number of independents, the switch from vinyl to cassette single is paramount in the company's operation, certainly one that Kennedy is aggressively promoting. Most of the cassette singles are priced at \$2.99, while vinyl singles are priced in the marketplace at anywhere from \$2.49 to \$2.79.

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

COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Third solo project for Tim Finn a breakthrough**

After releasing two previous solo albums, *Escapade* and *Big Canoe*, Tim Finn realized the next one had better consist of the right stuff. Well, a new Tim Finn album has recently been released, his first on Capitol Records, and his new label should certainly be aware of the rocket they have in their possession. Produced by Mitchell Froom, who also produced *Crowded House*, and managed by Gary Stammier, who also manages *Crowded House*, Finn is really looking forward to a healthy run up the charts.

Whatever reason the Finn brothers used to finally dissolve their partnership and Split Enz in 1984 is really neither here nor there. Neil Finn, an excellent songwriter and singer for *Crowded House*, proved by sheer determination that the North American market was assailable. So, brother Tim is about to attempt that very same feat, hopefully with the same results, as his songwriting talents are of equal proportions.

"On the *Big Canoe* album," begins Finn, "I tended to try everything I could think of with the songs and I just went overboard with musical ideas. Whereas with this album, I really felt good about it. I had a lot of songs, a real collection, to choose from. So, it felt like I was well armed at least. Keeping the voice central to the whole sound, serving the song more, rather than just

painting colours with sound in some expressionist kind of way, was the main difference in the approach we took."

Working closely with Froom in the studio took a lot of the pressure away from Finn, allowing him to concentrate on the more emotional aspects of creating an album. The approach was certainly minimalist, similar to the *Crowded House* style, but still maintained Finn's own stamp of approval, he says. Therefore, with someone controlling the sessions, not letting the musicians lose sight of the songs, Finn has undoubtedly released his best effort yet. With this, he agrees. "Mitchell is very good with structure," he continues. "He's like an architect, he knows how to build a song and cut away what's not necessary. So, he might find a bridge in one song and say 'Look, that'd work as a verse in this other song.' There were actually quite a few changes from my original demos. While I write the songs, the lyrics and the melodies, he had a lot to do with putting them all together and that's his real skill.

"Recording is such an emotional and volatile time for me. I've never achieved any great degree of objectivity in the studio. It's a huge thing every time, a cathartic event, making a record. I've never been able to approach it any differently. But I've obviously got a lot more confidence now, as a person,

because of everything I've been through, all the ups and downs have made me strong."

Counting the soundtrack work, this album is actually his sixteenth release. Still, though, he admits a need for a sounding board, perhaps unsure of his own material after all these years. Whereas before he had a band, today he works alone, preferring the confidence of one man. In fact, if it succeeds, it does so on its own merits and no one else's, something Finn looks forward to. Yet the reward is obviously the ability to tour and sample the accolades first hand, in person.

"I don't have too many grand expectations," he concludes. "I try to take it as it comes, to a certain extent. I'd be lying if





Immediate adds for Rana's O'Toole debut

It's very rare when Canadian country programmers move decisively on a release, but even rarer for a Cancon release, but that's what has happened with the debut release by Ray O'Toole. Session people on board for the *Out Of Control* recording were drummer Glen Hendrickson, Wayne Bassett on keyboards, bassist George Chapelas and Joanie Bye on background vocals, with O'Toole supplying vocals and guitar work.

Bassett switched to fiddle on *Saturday Night*, along with very impressive accordion accompaniment by Jim Wilson and Kevin McCormack. O'Toole doubles on bass pedals, harmonica and guitars as well as vocals.

"Ray O'Toole is a musician's musician," says Weird Harold, "a talented individual with a finger on most every style of music imaginable."



I said I didn't care, because I do care. I want at least a modicum of success, a degree of success, so that I can get on the road. It oils the wheels . . . it allows the tour to happen. That was the problem with the last one, Big Canoe. Last time it really felt half-cocked. I was quite frustrated, because it didn't lead to any touring and I like playing on stage. It makes me feel like I'm part of the community . . . it connects all the dots."

Being managed by Stammler, who also manages Chalk Circle, has already had its effect felt, as Finn's tour is already underway, in a sense, as promotional showcases criss-cross the continent, including a stop in Toronto this May. Hard work, persistence and determination do pay off, after all.

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
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
