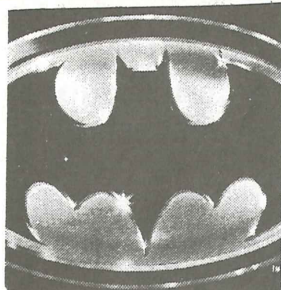

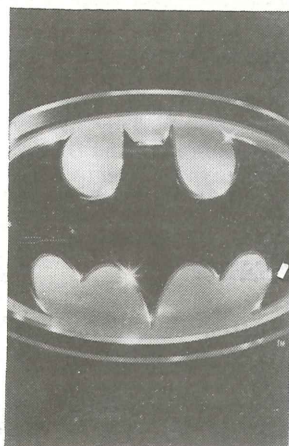

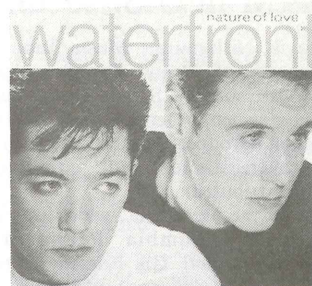

A&M in U.S. to distribute Denon

Lloyd Nishimura, Music/Tape Division Manager of Denon Canada, reports that A&M Records U.S. and Denon have signed an agreement whereby A&M will distribute Denon product in the U.S. In Canada however, Denon will continue to be self-distributed.

In the agreement, which was signed by Nippon Columbia President Kazuo Mochizuki and Gil Friesen, President of A&M Records, and which is effective immediately, Denon will maintain full control of its artist and repertoire decisions, while A&M will administer Denon's promotion and marketing efforts.

The initial A&M/Denon releases will carry an October 3rd street date in the U.S., and include classical recording artists Ellahu Inbal conducting the Frankfurt Radio

Symphony Orchestra, the young French pianist Helene Grimaud, I Solisti Italiani, and Henry Mancini. Also included are jazz recordings by The Count Basie Orchestra, jazz vocal group The Ritz, Uncle Festive and guitarist Pat Kelly. These same titles will be released in Canada, but it has not been determined at press time what the release date will be. It should be pointed out that as of now, all classical releases for Denon will be on compact disc only, with select jazz releases available on compact disc and cassette.

Island retains autonomy in PolyGram takeover

David Fine, President of PolyGram and Chris Blackwell, founder of Island Records, Island Music and Island Visual Arts, jointly announced from London, England (Aug 1/89) that PolyGram will acquire 100 percent of the equity of all three Island companies. However, Island Records will continue to operate as an independent and autonomous group with Blackwell as chief executive. In addition to his position at Island Records, Blackwell will also play what is described as "an important role in shaping PolyGram's long term popular music strategy."

It was estimated that the Dutch Electronics giant had paid US\$330 million for the Island properties.

Insofar as the Canadian operation is concerned, Island product will continue to be distributed by MCA until their contract runs out in December of 1990.

Digital Music equipped with Fairlight Series III

Toronto's newest state-of-the-art recording studio, Digital Music, which was recently opened by well-known studio musician Rob Yale (RPM - July 8/89), is equipped with a Fairlight Series III, not Series II as reported, "the newest possible model," reports Patricia Hope, Studio Manager, "which is the ultimate of C.M.I. (computerized musical instrument) technology . . . impressive and new."

It had been mentioned in the article that Digital Music was equipped with a Fairlight Series II, but as Hope points out, "We did have a Fairlight Series II several years ago when it was the best system available and, although it was a forerunner of the system we now have, the Series II is seriously outmoded by today's standards and is indeed an entirely different machine from the Series III."

Berry exits CMRRA for position in France

Paul Berry, General Manager of Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA), has announced he will be leaving this position the end of September when his contract with the company expires.

Berry, a Toronto lawyer, is noted for his controversial stand with regard to copyright reform. During his ten year's with CMRRA, he was instrumental in securing amendments to the Copyright Act for songwriters and

July CRIA certifications reflects soft market

Retail continues to be unusually soft over the summer months, perhaps best reflected in the dismal showing of platinum and gold certifications. CRIA's industry statistics for July aren't in yet, but industry insiders are predicting a continuing slump, "until the majors get their top acts on the shelves," notes one observer.

June figures, although showing a 63 percent increase in shipments over the previous year, managed only a 5 percent increase for the year to date shipments and a limp 8 percent increase for the year to date dollar value.

There was only one platinum certification for the month of July, that being Virgin's release of Forever Your Girl by Paula Abdul. Gold certification were for Raffi (Everything Grows), Jody Watley (Larger Than Life), Rob Base And DJ E-Z Rock (It Takes Two), Cyndi Lauper (A Night To Remember), and Simple Minds (Street Fighting Years).

FM 102, Toronto's Modern Rock station, is asking listeners to help the station welcome its new morning team to the airwaves by sending in a letter of greetings along with "one uncooked egg" in its shell.

The new morning show hits Toronto's airwaves on Aug. 8th and will be heard weekdays from 5:30 to 9:30 am. Hosting the show will be "Humble" Howard Glassman, former stand-up comic and morning man in Vancouver, Calgary and Montreal, and Fred Patterson, Sports Director and longtime personality on FM 102.

Says FM 102's Director of Promotion, Darren Wasylyk, "All listeners sending raw eggs that arrive to Howard and Fred's attention, unbroken, will qualify to win a vacation for two to The Royal Antigua Resort and Casino in Antigua, along with an invitation to an upcoming special Breakfast Broadcast with the duo." He continues with, "All eggs that arrive broken are immediately disqualified from the draw . . . and all eggs become the property of Howard and Fred and will not be returned."

Wasylyk concludes with, "It would appear that FM 102 could be on the verge of creating one of the highest cholesterol morning shows in the country."

Bush congrats to Murray on opening of Centre

Among the hundreds of congratulatory messages from show business personalities and government dignitaries that Anne Murray received on the eve of the opening of the Anne Murray Centre in Springhill, Nova Scotia (July 28, 1989) was a hand-written note from U.S. President George Bush. It's no secret that Bush regards Murray as one of the world's top recording stars and his favourite, which was revealed just after he was elected President of the United States last year.

After the closing of the local coal mines in 1959, Springhill became just another jog in the Trans Canada Highway, but now there is reason to stop. Unfortunately, there aren't any highway signs banner the fact that Springhill is the home of internationally-acclaimed recording star Anne Murray. Now, however, there is ample reason for the Nova Scotia highway crews and Springhill itself to attract the eyes of tourists with effectively sized and worded signs applauding the fact that Springhill has its own Anne Murray Centre.

July 28th belonged to the Capitol superstar, and a crowd, estimated by police to be close to 10,000, jammed the area in front of the centre. The Blue Knights, Amherst and Springhill police forces, the latter decked out in their handsome light blue dress uniforms, plus the local RCMP detachment in their scarlet tunics, added a touch of "Hollywood" to the eventful afternoon.

A memorable happening during the official opening ceremony was Murray's praise of her manager Leonard Rambeau. "He has been by my side for twenty years, and without him I don't think any of this would be possible," said Murray to her very attentive audience. She then undraped the beautifully-designed Anne Murray Centre logo that commands the centerdrop of the building, and the official ceremonies were over. The swarming media and CBC-TV's Sandra Faire and her fourteen-member crew then had the opportunity to further tour the Centre and have a one-on-one with Murray at a press conference.

The Centre itself is a maze of Murray memorabilia from Snowbird and her first RPM Gold Leaf Awards (now the Juno Awards) to her RPM solid walnut, gold and platinum "outstanding sales" awards, Number One Awards and Big Country Awards. RPM's Stan Klees, who designed all the above awards, was visibly taken by the high-tech audio-visual displays. Having interrupted his European vacation to attend the opening of the Centre, Klees said "I've travelled the world, and I've never seen anything like this . . . you have to see it to believe it . . . a tribute like this in the centre of Springhill . . . incredible!"

After being welcomed to the Centre by Murray, on video, there are priceless clips of her early years in the entertainment business; accepting her Order Of Canada and one of her three Grammy Awards and there are vintage CBC-TV tapings of her Singalong Jubilee performances with husband Langstroth. She is also seen in settings with Miss Piggy, Pat Sajak, Tom Snyder, Hugh

Downs, Mary Hart, Brian Linehan and Jane Pauley. There are cute baby photos of the 44-year old recording star, her first baseball glove and bowling trophy and even the first dress she wore on Singalong Jubilee. "You'll notice the hem is held up by masking tape," she quipped, "That's the way I did things back then."

Capitol Records, one of the first to lend

financial support to the Anne Murray Centre, sponsored the opening ceremonies brunch. Representing the company was Jim Foglesong, President of Capitol's Nashville Division, Lynn Shults, Vice President of A&R, Nashville, and from the Canadian operation, Ron Scott, Director of Marketing, A&R Director Tim Trombley, Eastern Region Branch Manager Val D'Amico and East Coast sales and promotion representative Barry Kent.

Saddlestone launches new gospel country label

Saddlestone Publishing, with offices in New Westminster, B.C. is a relatively new company on the Canadian country music scene, primarily releasing country and gospel product on the Saddlestone label.

Through its pressing and distribution operation, the company distributes on a worldwide basis, for artists under contract, as well as others. Under contract to the label at present are Patty Mayo, Matt Audette and Dorrie Alexander.

The Mayo release, *The Bible Is The Legacy*, a gospel entry, was written by Candice James, who also produced the session at Vancouver's Mushroom Studios. Session people included Brian Nicholl (acoustic guitar, pedal steel, dobro), Frankie Rodgers (fiddle), Eddie Leclair (lead guitar), Lynda Hunt (bass), Don Powrie (drums), and Randy Mueller (piano). James also wrote the flip, *Rodeo Cowboy*. Both sides are four-parts Cancon (MAPL).

James also wrote and produced Audette's single, *I'm Missin' You*, which was also recorded at Mushroom. Sitting in on the session were Don Powrey (drums), John Lacey (pedal steel), Nolan Murray (fiddle), Ross McCrady (lead guitar), Linda Hunt (harmony vocals), and Audette on lead vocals, rhythm and bass guitars. The flip, *The Last Break*, also written and produced by James was recorded at Dell Studio in Surrey, B.C. with Brian Nicholl on pedal steel and Audette doubling on lead, rhythm and bass guitars. Both sides carry an MPL logo.

Clever, clever A&M . . . ! "Big Al" Reid of A&M dropped an interesting promo package off last week promoting a listening session for Katrina And The Waves. The package included a beach key chain, a lifeguard whistle and a pound of sand. Guess what. The sand was everywhere . . . in the whistle, on the floor and in my pocket. What a reminder of Katrina And The Waves and their new LP, *Break Of Hearts*, and I hear it was a great beach party. Precedent setting CHOO ups Canadian content

CHOO Radio - 1390AM in Ajax, Ontario (just east of Toronto) has taken the unusual step of increasing its Canadian content music rotation to 35 percent daily.

This is a significant step taken by the station in view of the fact that the CRTC requirement is only 30 percent Canadian content for AM broadcasters. However, as the station's Music Director Mike Leaver, points out, "We feel that the high quality of Canadian production on the market today warrants our playlist reflecting that trend," adding, "Good talent is good talent, Canadian or otherwise . . . and good Canadian talent deserves fair airplay."

Nominated in 1988 as one of Canada's top country music radio stations, CHOO that same year was awarded the coveted Gold Ribbon Award for Community Service from the Canadian Association of Broadcasters.

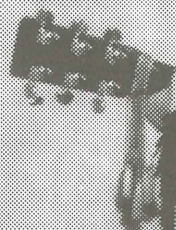

Great Western Orchestra debuts with CBS release

Picture an evening with the Great Western Orchestra. Strings? Brass? Percussion? Forget it. If that's what you would expect at a GWO concert, then you would be in for quite a shock when only three (count 'em, three) musicians walk on stage. Ladies and gentlemen, meet the Great Western Orchestra!

The little trio with the big name is comprised of Cindy Church (vocals, bass), David Wilkie (vocals, mandolin) and Nathan Tinkham (vocals, guitars). Based in Turner Valley, Alberta, the trio has been together as a unit for three years, but have long established themselves as musicians in their own right, primarily as members of Ian Tyson's backing band. Their first single, *Your Image Of Me*, was released in 1988 on their own Centerfire Records label, and it enjoyed a warm reception at country radio. This single is included on their new, self-titled LP (which is being distributed by CBS), and the new single is entitled *Train Of Life*, which should just be arriving at radio.

There are twelve cuts in all on the LP, including a couple of tracks that may throw some country fans for a loop. *There Ain't No Cowgirls Down In New Orleans* harks back to early '30s jazz, as does Cindy Church's interpretation of *When You Wish Upon A Star*. Also worth a listen is Tchaikovsky's (yes, Tchaikovsky) *Waltz Of The Flowers*, a beautiful instrumental that closes the LP. Certainly a surprise on a country LP, but a

pleasant one nonetheless. The LP is full of simple arrangements that are easy on the ears, and the overall sound is a far cry from the style of many of today's country/pop artists, who seem to dominate country radio at the present.

This is a do-everything effort for the trio. They have no manager, no agent, and they produced the LP themselves, which was recorded in Calgary at Living Room Studios. When it comes to performing live, the group incorporates not only country and bluegrass, but also jazz and classical into their repertoire. "We think country people are not just one sided where they just want to hear

Cockburn to record live at Ontario Place concert

Bruce Cockburn will wind down his *Big Circumstance* tour with two dates at Toronto's Ontario Place (Aug. 14 & 15), the 61st and 62nd concerts of the tour. Both final concerts will be recorded for a live album, to be released next year. This will be Cockburn's first live LP since *Circles In The Stream* which was released in 1977.

Immediately following his Ontario Place dates, Cockburn and his band will begin a nine country European tour.

Cockburn's latest release, *Shipwrecked At The Stable Door*, which was taken from the *Big Circumstance* LP, is now moving up both the RPM 100 Singles and A/C charts.

Marigold hits AOR with Eddie M release

Marigold recently launched its first AOR project with new signing Eddie M. The band's debut album, *Incognito*, is available through Electric Distribution.

The lead single, a cover of *Mississippi Queen*, a hit for Mountain in 1970, has received healthy airplay and is soon to be accompanied by a FACTOR-supported video which has already been shot. The decision to release the album's only cover as the initial single reflects the band's previous activity, under the name *Foreign Exchange*, as a tribute to Hendrix, Cream and Mountain.



After having previously released independently, Eddie M is relieved to now have the "time to concentrate on the music." He asserts. "Everything here seems to be falling into place. People are promoting it who should be working in promotion. People are producing who are just producers. We're just being the band, writing the music, instead of trying to be a record company, a promotion company and so on."

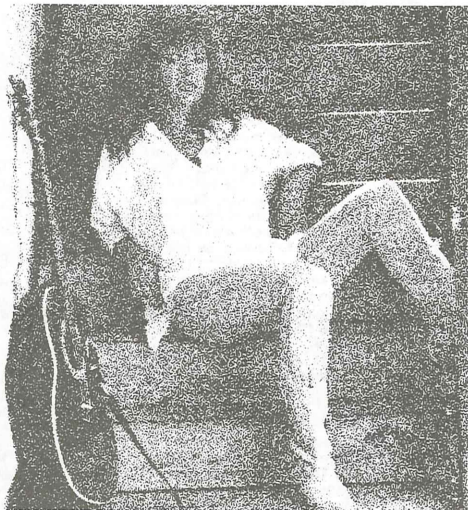
As Marigold is pleased at the success of their debut foray into AOR, the band is similarly impressed with the label's efforts, preferring a small company to "a label where you might be forgotten because you're the nine-hundredth act on the roster," he states. "There's been a lot of concentration and, as a result, we can get the attention of the radio stations and get some results."

Currently, Marigold is negotiating with several U.S. labels for an artist or product deal in addition to a U.S. management agreement. The search is on for "somebody who has a track record," says Eddie, "rather than trying to re-invent the wheel."

"When you've been at it so long," he continues, "you discover re-inventing the wheel takes a long time. We've tried it a few times already. So now we're taking a more professional view and letting the people who do what they do best do it."

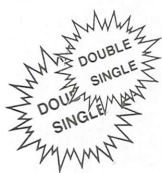

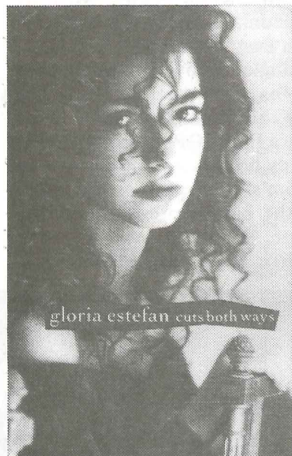

ALICE COOPER - Rock

You just gotta love middle age rockers who refuse to grow up. Yes, he's back, this time with a new label, but the attitude is still the same. Once a major force in shock rock, Cooper's last few LP's failed to reach the levels of success of his earlier works, but this could be the one to turn things around. This is strong rock and roll that AOR's are sure to latch onto. The first single is called Poison, and it's textbook Alice, thanks to help from co-author Desmond Child, who shares writing credits on all but one of the tracks, and is also the LP's producer. Other contributors include Joan Jett and Jon Bon Jovi. The only downside to this release is the packaging. A slap on the wrist goes to the record company for not providing any credits, liner notes, etc. -DS



GLORIA ESTEFAN - Pop
Cuts Both Ways - Epic - OE-45217-H

What was once Gloria Estefan fronting The Miami Sound Machine has become just Gloria Estefan. Well, The Machine are still there of course, but now the emphasis is on Estefan, who, since Conga was unleashed a couple of years ago, has become one of the hottest singer/songwriters on the pop scene. Her (their?) third LP is another mix of Latin rhythms and ballads that has multi-platinum written all over it. First single, Don't Wanna Lose You, is well on its way to heavy rotation on A/C and CHR, and since it's a ballad, the easy money would be on a dance number for the follow-up. Best bet would be Get On Your Feet. With a title like that, how can she miss. -DS

CRAZYHEAD - Rock
Desert Orchid - EMI - E1-91035-F

Concentrating on heavy, melodic rock, some of the Crazyhead's songs come off as run of the mill material. However, the first four tracks are deserving of a listen, primarily by AOR. In particular, Rags is noteworthy for effectively introducing Motown influences to the band's raunchy guitar-oriented sound. -CM

ROCKMELONS - Pop/Dance
Tales Of The City - Atlantic - 78-19491-P

Listening to this LP is like having a soft drink that's gone flat; there's some taste, but something is missing. The Rockmelons manage to work up a good groove on some of the tracks, but there's no punch, no bottom holding everything up. The only cut that's worth a shot at airplay is What's It Gonna Be, a late night ballad that some A/C's may want to try. -DS

PSEUDO ECHO - Pop
Race - RCA - 8303-1-R-N

How these guys managed to get a number one hit two years ago with a cover of Funkytown, one of the worst songs of the last decade, is anybody's

guess. They have a new album now and this time they've left the disco beat behind for a more contemporary rock sound. Fooled Again, the first single, is pretty run of the mill stuff, and if it manages to get playlisted, don't expect more than a limited run. Most people are probably still trying to get the bad taste of Funkytown out of their mouths. -DS

T'PAU - Pop
Rage - Virgin - VL-3051-W

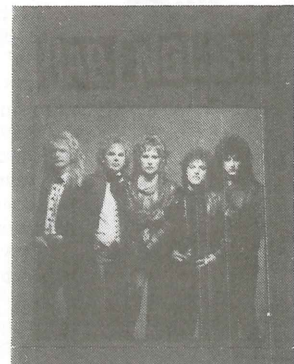
The remarkably bland input of the band does nothing more than provide a background for Carol Decker's elastic vocals. She once again impresses with her energetic and very personal style. Having penned all but one track, Decker has created an album that could very well be a solo work. A more spectacular support team could have made her a spectacular album. As it stands Decker is trapped inside this 'good' record. -RG

DEACON BLUE - Pop

The group may have copped the name from a Steely Dan track, but that's where the similarity ends. This is the second outing from this British sextet, and it's basically another unexciting mixture of pop and white soul that doesn't offer anything particularly memorable. But there's one track that certainly doesn't belong with the rest, and it may appeal to country programmers with a sense of adventure. Queen Of The New Year, with its Texas twang guitar and fiddle, may just win a few friends in contemporary country circles. -DS

THE BLACK SORROWS - Pop/Rock
Hold On To Me - Epic - FE-45158-H

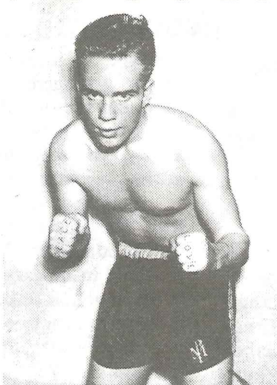

The Black Sorrows hail from Australia, and they have put together a strong debut that fuses the best elements of the above mentioned styles into a tightly produced set of songs that definitely deserves a listen. Fire Down Below may remind some people of Robbie Robertson's Showdown At Big Sky, which could work in the group's favour considering how big that album was. Daughters Of Glory, Chained To The Wheel and Raise That Lantern are also worth checking out. -DS

Bad English - Epic - OE-45083-H

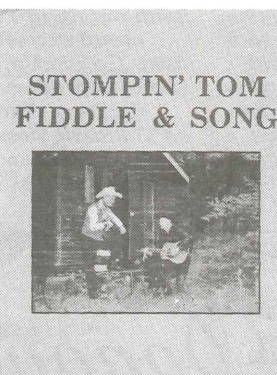
Whenever musicians from already famous bands get together to form a new band, from Cream to The Travelling Wilburys, the label 'supergroup' is almost always applied. The result is an LP full of enough hard driving rock and roll and power chords to please any AOR MD. Forget Me Not, the first single, is by far the album's best cut, but Best Of What I Got or Ready When You Are may get some airtime down the road. Supergroup? Let's see if it sells first. -DS

THE POGUES - Pop

This album, full of the same type of jigs and celtic ballads that have gained The Pogues their large international following, fortunately contains few surprises. All in all, little has changed in the Pogues' sound, which should prompt their fans to display their appreciation at the cash register. -CM



STOMPIN' TOM FIDDLE & SONG - Country

It took a lot of coaxing and probably a bit of nudging by Capitol's Deane Cameron, but he's back, perhaps Canada's only real country/folk legend, Stompin' Tom Connors. In spite of all the years since his heyday, this LP is like a time warp, the voice and, of course, the material, it's the late sixties, early seventies once more. We had a taste of Connors '89 with the release of Canada Day, Up Canada Way as a single, and the timing was perfect for our July 1st holiday, but the big test will be the follow-up single, I Am The Wind, a bit of a stretch for our stompin' friend, who has now mastered the fiddle. Connors' wife Lena joins him on The French Song, another interesting track, not to mention vocal side of Connors. Also key are Wreck Of The Tammy Anne and Lady, k.d.lang, his tribute to... who else. -WG

TEXAS - Pop/Rock
Southside - Vertigo - 838 171-1-Q

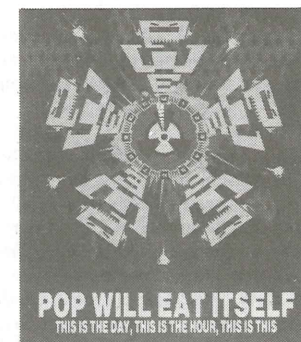
Toss the best elements of Lone Justice and The Pretenders into a mixing bowl and you've got Texas. Don't be fooled by the name though - this quartet hails from Glasgow, a long way from the Lone Star State. Their musical style is an enjoyable mix of rock and country which by now has become a very familiar sound to radio programmers everywhere. Lead vocalist Sharleen Spiteri takes to the mike like a kid to candy, and the first single, I Don't Want A Lover, has already been added by a couple of major AOR's so watch for more adds across the country very soon. Produced by Tim Palmer (Robert Plant, The Mission). -DS

ZIGGY MARLEY & THE MELODY MAKERS - Pop/Reggae
One Bright Day - Virgin - VL-3072-W

After Conscious Party, this new package comes off as unspectacular and lightweight. The initial single, Look Who's Dancing, is among the strongest of the songs, but Justice and Urban Music are the true standouts. Nevertheless, sales should be strong based on a strong following and radio should take easily to such a homogenized brand of big name reggae. -CM

GRADY HARRELL - Pop/Dance
Come Play With Me - RCA - 8341-1-R-N

Talk about something alike. Harrell has Stevie Wonder's vocal style down pat, but the connection doesn't end there. Wonder wrote and performed two tracks on the LP (You And Me, If Ever), and is credited as the album's Executive Producer. There's even a photo of the two on the inside sleeve. Just about anything on here could find a home on A/C, with Fun, Surrender and the two Wonder-penned cuts being the key tracks. -DS



POP WILL EAT ITSELF - Alternative
This Is This! - RCA - 9742-1-R-N

An unequalled potpourri of sound, this effort is required listening for any campus or alternative programmer. An incredible mix of rock guitars, rap, scratching, sampling, beat box drums and light melodic and lyrical hooks results in a series of industrial flavoured soundscapes that would have done Ken Kesey proud. Can U Dig It? and Def. Con: One have already seen club success as should the third single, Wise Up! Sucker. Definitive psychedelic music for the nineties. -CM



THROWING MUSES - Pop/Alternative
Hunkpapa - Sire - 92-56551-P

While most of the album is definitely best aimed at campus radio, several tracks come menacingly close to the borders of CHR-accessible territory. In particular, Dizzy, I'm Alive and Angel should be heard by programmers interested in stretching their stations' sound a little. Plush, but quirky, female harmonies and jangly guitars are certainly the order of the day for the band, which has clearly taken a step toward the mainstream with this effort, and suggest that future releases may have been given serious consideration by commercial radio. -CM

Jackson at Roy Thomson Rundgren set for Aug. 14

What do Jody Watley, The Toronto Symphony Orchestra, and Joe Jackson all have in Common? They have all played Toronto's Roy Thomson Hall. Although usually home to the classics, the Hall recently played host to pop/dance sensation Watley, and veteran rocker Todd Rundgren with guests The Pursuit Of Happiness will take the stage on Aug. 14. But on July 30, the night belonged to A&M recording artist Joe Jackson. His style is tough to nail down, his albums have ranged in style from punk/new wave (Look Sharp!, I'm The Man), through to homage to the big bands (Jumpin' Jive), to his latest Blaze Of Glory, a potent mix of rock, jazz, world rhythms and everything in between, with some of his most biting lyrics in years.

Jackson was backed by an outstanding ten piece ensemble, and the capacity house was ready for anything. From the solo piano intro taken from Me & You Against The World mixed into You Can't Get What You Want, through to his latest LP (played in its entirety, in sequence), to the encore which included a rollicking set of numbers from Jumpin' Jive, Jackson made sure everyone in attendance got to sample bits from his decade long recording career. But with such a stately setting as Roy Thomson Hall, no one expected Jackson to rip into I'm The Man, which proved to be one of the evening's highlights, and showed that with such an acoustically outstanding environment as the Hall, you can rock and roll and walk out of there without your ears ringing.

This was a great show, and Roy Thomson Hall was the perfect setting, and with any luck, we may be seeing more pop/rock shows there in the future. If that happens, it could become one of the hot venues for the nineties.

Lock It Or Lose It promo launched by C-FAX

Victoria's C-FAX has joined forces with local police and the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia in an effort to reduce the number of thefts from cars during the summer months. As C-FAX Vice President Terry Spence points out, "In the warmer weather, people are more inclined to leave windows down and doors unlocked, sometimes forgetting to remove valuables from inside the cars . . . resulting in a sharp increase in theft cases."

The station's Lock It Or Lose It campaign features brightly-coloured pamphlets that are left on cars which are found to be unlocked or left with open windows, keys inside, valuables in plain sight, or where there is no locking gas cap. There is also provision for a "thank you" message to drivers whose cars are secure.

"This is the second year we have been involved in this campaign," says Spence, "and it works. It has helped reduce thefts from cars dramatically." The station absorbs some of the costs involved and provides extensive publicity. The campaign is currently underway in the Municipality of Saanich.

C-FAX Official Radio Station of Air Show

The Victoria Airshow Society has named C-FAX the Official Radio Station for the 1989 Victoria International Airshow. The show, expected to attract between 30,000 and 50,000 spectators, will be held at Victoria's International Airport on Aug. 7. C-FAX is providing a heavy schedule of promotional announcements in advance of the airshow and assisting in arranging for major prizes that will be awarded on the day of the show. As well, C-FAX will be on the air "live" from the airport for seven hours during the show, including Barry Bowman's Breakfast Show (5 to 10 am) and Talk It Over with Terry Spence (10 am to noon). The airshow is held every second year and C-FAX has been the Official Radio Station of every show so far.

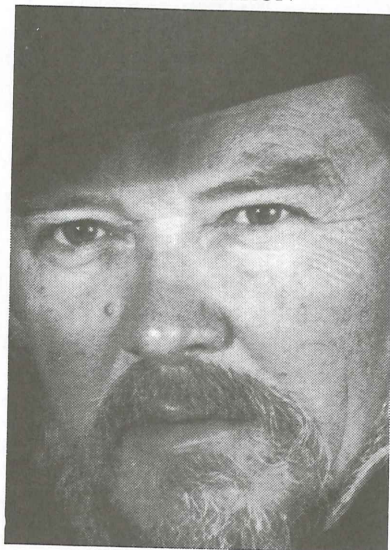

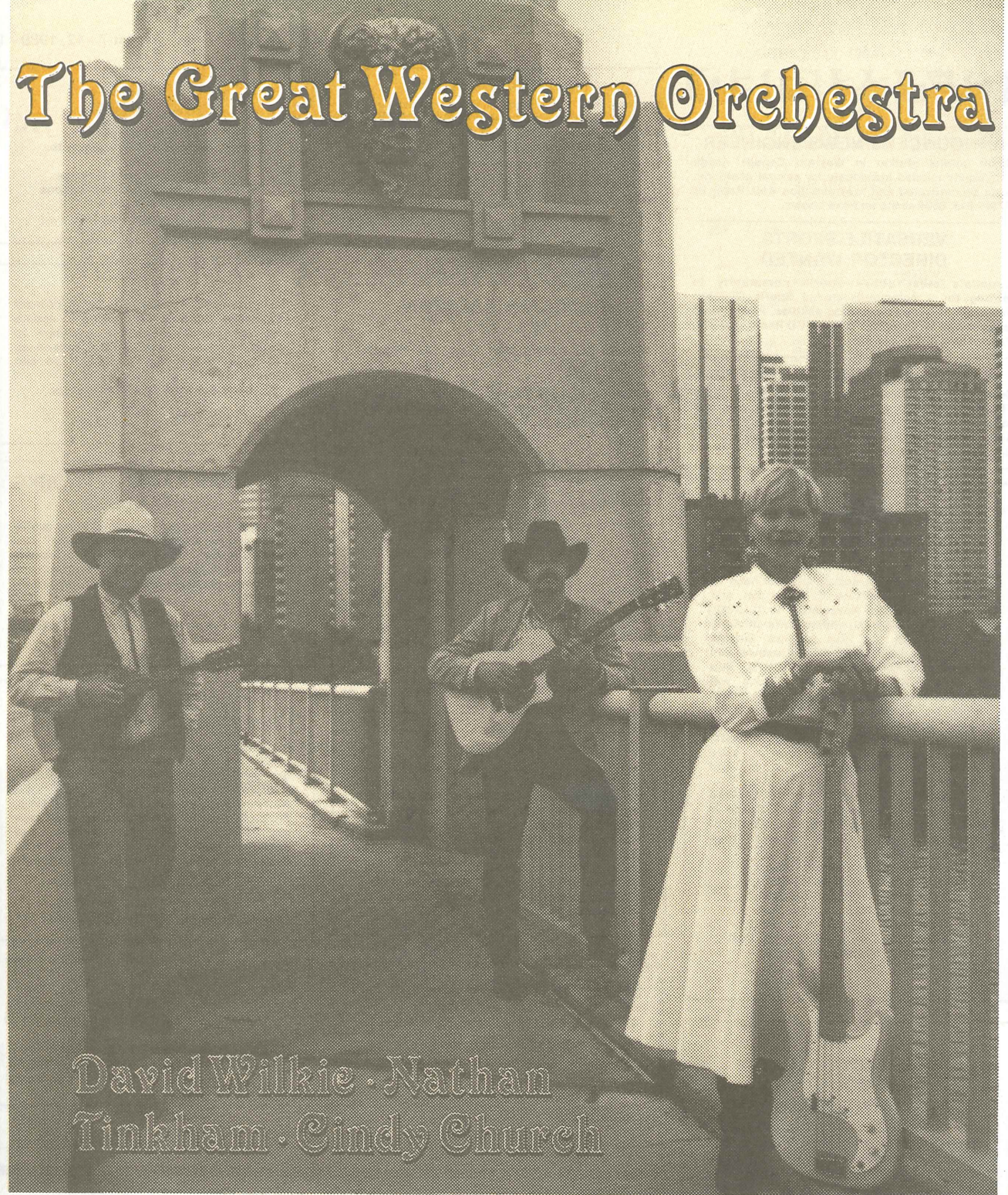
