





Fuji Audio and Enigma sign marketing deal

The Magnetic Products Division of Fuji Photo Film U.S.A., marketers of Fuji brand audio cassettes, and independent record label, Enigma Entertainment, have entered into a joint marketing and promotional program. This first known coupling of a major record label and a tape manufacturer is described as one that is "designed to promote emerging Enigma artists, while offering Fuji a creative platform to market its audio products."

The agreement calls for Enigma artists to be featured in several upcoming Fuji-sponsored U.S. and Canada concerts. As well, Fuji will sponsor a 13-week new music television series featuring Enigma artists. Special promotional Fuji audio cassettes will offer on-pack, compact disc samplers of new music from a variety of Enigma artists.

The multi-faceted long-term agreement between the two companies also calls for Fuji and Enigma to work together to have Enigma pre-recorded cassettes on Fuji audio tape.

Joshua C. Simons, President of Rockbill/EMCI's Marketing Group (New

York), is credited with engineering this marketing partnership.

Enigma is based in Culver City, California and operates a number of labels including Enigma, Restless, Intima and the recently launched Enigma Retro, in addition to several associated labels including Metal Blade, Mute, GWR and Blast First. Enigma is distributed in Canada by Capitol Records.

Rivers Air Force spiked with addition of Fedoruk

As the press release states, "Now it's Tom, Dick and Larry," who will be anchoring CFTR's popular morning show, the Rivers Air Force. Sharon Taylor, Program Director of the Toronto station, reports, "CFTR and Tom Rivers welcome Larry Fedoruk as co-host of the Canada's No. 1 Contemporary Hit Radio morning show." He joins Rivers and controversial newsman/Toronto Sun columnist Dick Smyth weekday mornings from 5:30 to 9:30 am.

Fedoruk is no stranger to CFTR, having been with the station for almost ten years as writer, Creative Director and host of his own Saturday morning radio show. He also writes a monthly humour column for the Markham Business Journal, as well as freelance writing for radio and television.

Originally from Saskatchewan, Fedoruk worked morning radio in Winnipeg and Brampton before joining CFTR. As well, he spent five years as a stand-up comic on the Yuk Yuk's circuit, worked on CBC-TV's Switchback as writer, sketch player and announcer. He can also be seen on television on behalf of First Choice preview weekends.

Fedoruk reveals that one of the highlights of his career was "Selling seven jokes to Phyllis Diller for three dollars each . . . and I have a photocopy of the cheque to prove it."

Anthem Records/SRO Management announced that Canadian supergroup Rush has ceased their association with Polygram by signing a deal giving worldwide distribution rights to Atlantic Records. Canadian distribution will remain in the hands of Capitol Records, while Japan will continue to be serviced by the Epic/Sony organization.

Anthem Records is of course maintaining full label control, but felt that Atlantic could bring about some positive changes. According to Anthem President Ray Daniels, "We were impressed by Atlantic's track record, and we were anxious to have our records part of the Warner-Elektra-Atlantic system, which is second to none."

Rush is currently involved in the recording of their still untitled upcoming LP featuring Rupert Hine at the production helm. Tracks are being recorded in both Toronto and Montreal, with mixing to be completed in London, England.

Jingle Bells or is it Balls? "So you had to start talking Christmas . . . " says Ed Preston, and he laid a pretty good one on me about Tembo Christmas releases including a holiday package from Carroll Baker with the cute title *Christmas Carroll*, which will mark the recording debut of Carroll's 16-year old daughter Candi. Has it been that long? I remember Candi in diapers. So, after telling me about Roger Whittaker's new Christmas releases, Ed closes his letter with "A&M Records here will also have a new *Liona Boyd Christmas album*." (EC: *How'd he know that . . . ?*)

When you talk Stompin' Tom . . . smile! I am really impressed with the enthusiasm that's going down at Capitol over the projects in store for Stompin' Tom . . . and the glitter in the eyes at the very mention of this Canadian folk hero. He has what looks like a burgeoning cult following with the campus crowd, but a confused lot at radio. So, the way to go with Stompin' Tom is with TV packaging, where the record buyers in the Innisfails, the Marshy Hopes and Fort Resolutions and the thousands of other little towns across Canada can have the opportunity to catch up with this legend. (EC: *Like my MP says . . . Right On!*)

Speaking of TV packaging . . . ! Watch for The Hawk . . . Ronnie Hawkins, to catch fire with a well-planned TV package assault by the king of TV package assaults . . . Ed LaBuick. It took a lot of years to finally convince the Hawk that his real fans are . . . out in the country! (EC: *I haven't got over the Innisfails, Marshy Hopes and Fort Resolutions yet . . . !*)

Seen around town . . . ! I'm going to have to stop going to those classy eating joints around Toronto . . . I see too much. I couldn't believe the two very important record people (EC: *Is that VIRPs . . . ?*) I saw huddled in the corner of a very expensive restaurant. The wine was flowing pretty good for the one guy . . . but the other one was into the hard stuff. There's something going down, so watch this column closely. I've already received a very warm telephone tip. And, across town, a couple of nights later, I came across two broadcast/owners, who I thought were enemies . . . but from the smiles and the gesturing . . . money had solved all their past problems. So, watch for some hot news from the broadcast circuit. (EC: *There's not much left to buy, and very little money to buy it with . . . !*)

From Jagger to Nureyev . . . ! What a great business we are in. There I was, Wednesday afternoon, at a listening session for the new Rolling Stones album . . . and that evening, sitting in choice seats at the O'Keefe Centre, watching Rudolf Nureyev in *The King And I*. Quite a contrast. I had never met The Russian, before, but I had met Mick Jagger when I first brought the Stones to Toronto back in 1963. Well, the album is not what I had expected . . . it's much better, and there is so much rock sublimity about it, I can see this one being the big one as we head toward the end of the year. Jagger is exceptional, not to mention, of course, Keith Richards and Bill Wyman. Wyman isn't on a couple of tracks . . . he was apparently off getting

married, and they continued without him. As for the Russian . . . yes I met him at an after show party. *The King And I* is a new role for him and he was a little nervous. This was only his fifth show, but he warmed up beautifully. I asked him how he felt about the audience, and he told me, "The first night was bad . . . too many free tickets . . . and when you give tickets away, the audience is cold." Right on. (EC: *Yeah . . . Right on!*)

From the mouths of musicians! What a gem! Chris Murray interviewed The Grapes Of Wrath for this week's cover and, naturally, they touched on *Cancon* . . . that dreaded word among broadcasters. They were discussing radio, and Kevin Kane, the vocalist of the band, makes the comment that radio stations in Canada, "take Canadian artists a little for granted . . . [as if they] can't believe there's actually good music in Canada." The band's drummer, Chris Hooper adds, "There's that whole thing about people going, 'Well, it's Canadian music, it's just Canadian.' It's like 'Hello, it's only me'." (EC: *You should carve that one in stone . . . !*)

Bill Bannon agrees . . . ! I was mentioning, a couple of columns ago, about how important it is as Canadians to get out across the country and meet the real Canadians. Well, Bill Bannon, has just come back from holidays, and that's exactly what he, his wife and two kids, Elizabeth and Michael did. They motored east to the Maritimes, and he can't stop singing the praises of Cape Breton. They stopped into Rita McNeil's Tea Shop in Square Pond, where he said they've never tasted scones as delicious as what Rita's sister made. (EC: *Holidays? Who gets holidays in this business . . . ?*)

Takin' it easy . . . ! CBS is using real marketing smarts with the release of the new Rolling Stones album . . . a case of demand! No blanket type of shipping for this one, just a modest platinum . . . that's 100,000, plus! Better the stores should run out a couple of times, which makes for a much greater demand. (EC: *I demanded and didn't get!*)

The pain of dying vinyl . . . ! It's going to take some time to get used to "no vinyl", and some of the people involved in this "operation kill" are up front with their bitchiness and arrogance. There has to be an adjustment period and a little diplomacy would go a long way. (EC: *Diplomacy . . . ?*)



Grapes Of Wrath shine on Now And Again

Popular Canadian folk-rockers The Grapes Of Wrath recently saw the release of their third album, *Now And Again*, arguably one of the best domestic releases of 1989 so far. With their strongest record yet, a national tour, and a U.S. tour in the works, all the pieces are in place for a major breakthrough for this young band.

"It's a listening record," declares drummer Chris Hooper. "That's what we've always wanted to do... a record that you put on, sit around and listen to. It's not a record you put on at a party and dance to. You've got to pay attention to it or it goes right by you."

While their previous release, *Treehouse*, was produced by Tom Cochrane, this time out producer Anton Fier was selected. "The reason we chose him was because of *Blast Of Silence*, the Golden Palominos record," reports vocalist/guitarist Kevin Kane. "It had this incredible cohesiveness. It sounded like a Fleetwood Mac record... sort of. Everything belonged. Everything made sense. It was so musical, and that's what we wanted to get."

While the band had clear ideas concerning what kind of album to make, minimal time went into pre-production. "We only spent two weeks. We should have spent six," informs Kane. "Nobody was pushing us. We were just pushing ourselves," he continues. "It turned out better than it should have, considering, but I don't think we're going to push our luck that much next time."

Now And Again marks the introduction of keyboardist Vincent Jones as a full member. Utilizing keyboards on *Treehouse*, the group saw new possibilities and welcomes the versatility Jones brings to their sound. "There's not that much in *Treehouse*," remarks Hooper, "but we wanted to start writing songs with keyboards."

"It really takes a role in the new record, the new songs and live," asserts Kane. "The keyboards are right up front on the new songs rather than just being pads."

The group, currently arranging an American tour, looks forward to returning south of the border, yet stresses the benefits of beginning in Canada. "You get seen easier

[in Canada] than you would in the states. It helps you start getting somewhere," advises Hooper. "In the states you start, you break and then you're huge, or it's nothing. It seems that way. You can play the colleges forever down there."

"At the same time, when we toured the states, we were down there for two weeks and we only scratched the surface," adds Kane. "I really wish that we had more access to America, that it wouldn't be a big deal to play the states, that it would be just like touring Canada. We could just go down there and tour. We wouldn't have to do the work permit thing."

On the topic of increasing American access, the band shares high hopes tempered with realistic doubt. "This one's shaping up a lot better," suggests Kane. "Last time we weren't especially pleased."

"I think they [Capitol U.S.] are more interested this time," hints Hooper. "I think they like what they hear better and know that there's more commitment in every way."

While their dealings with Capitol in the states have not been entirely satisfying, they are very positive about Capitol Canada, who they feel have afforded the group a lot of freedom. "We've got a lot more artistic control because we went the independent route first," maintains Kane. "We're

MCAG targets MP's with series of newsletters

The Music Copyright Action Group (MCAG) has blanketed federal Members of Parliament with the first of a series of newsletters pointing out the concerns of the music industry regarding Phase Two of Copyright Revision. It is hoped these newsletters will better inform the lawmakers of the value of copyright and the rights of creators to receive their rightful protection.

The first newsletter outlines the objectives of the MCAG, which are:

1) Completion of the revision of the Canadian Copyright Act - the so called Phase II process.

2) The establishment of effective protection for creators under law according to international standards of copyright.

3) The establishment of fair and equitable payment for any use of creators' works.

4) The establishment in law of simple effective sanctions against unauthorized use of creators' works and the putting in place of simple and effective methods in order that judgement on any authorized use can be quickly rendered and that the payment outlined in the judgement be quickly and effectively obtained by the creator.

5) The establishment of Canada as an integral part of the international copyright community and as signatory to the latest versions of the international copyright conventions.

The newsletter also offers a concise overview of copyright, pointing out that copyright is a "right of property," suggesting "the sole difference with other forms of property is that this is intellectual property as opposed to actual physical property."

It is also pointed out that "As with any

allowed a lot more slack with Capitol. We do our own videos. We do our own record covers."

In commenting on the powerful U.S. college radio system, the band delivers mixed reviews. "Some colleges you go in and the guys are these bad mood dickheads," complains Kane. "They have their four pet bands and then all they do is sit around and make fun of other bands and you go in there and they're assholes to you."

"On the other side of it," he qualifies, "there are radio stations that are so great that you can't believe it... what they're playing and their whole openness. And that's what makes it really worthwhile."

"You encounter the bad mood more in Canada in a way, because here, in Canada," explains Kane, "they tend to take Canadian artists a little for granted... [as if they] can't believe there's actually good music in Canada."

Hooper concurs: "There's that whole thing about people going, 'Well, it's Canadian music, it's just Canadian.' It's like, 'Hello, it's only me'."

With a truly outstanding album in hand, as musically mature as it is energetically youthful, The Grapes Of Wrath are hovering on the brink of becoming a major act. If they receive the healthy push stateside that they deserve, they may quickly find themselves among the ranks of those fresh new Canadian acts rapidly expanding Yankee, and perhaps domestic, awareness past the realms of Loverboy.

form of property, owners are entitled to control its use and to receive payment for any use of their property they may authorize."

It is suggested however that there is "one radical difference between copyright and other forms of property, intellectual property is intangible; consequently improper and unauthorized uses are quite difficult to control." In the opinion of members of the MCAG, "A strong copyright act can give the necessary protection, assist the development of a country's culture and define its existence as a separate entity in today's technological world."

The first phase of copyright revision completed only last year, was the first in sixty years, and the members of the MCAG have indicated that "Many key issues await phase two of the revision process," stressing that "With continuing advances in technology and ever expanding use of creators' works, often with minimal or no payment due to the deficiencies in the current law, it is imperative that phase two proceed as expeditiously as possible."

Members of the MCAG further stressed that "Creators deserve the right to control use of their property and to receive equitable payment for any use," suggesting that the completion of phase two "should recognize this fact."

The newsletter hammers home the point that "Further delay in implementation will only continue the damage to the rights of creators," concluding with "Swift passage is essential for the good of all creators."

STEVE STEVENS - Rock

As lead guitarist for Billy Idol, Stevens has provided listeners with some of the raunchiest guitar this side of the cosmos. His first outing as a solo performer doesn't hold any surprises. It's hit-you-over-the-head rock and roll that doesn't take any prisoners. Stevens sings lead on only one track and the rest of the time those duties are left to Perry Martini, who managed to do the job, even though he sounds like every other hard rock vocalist. The emphasis, however, should be placed on the guitar work, and it's wild. The title track and Desperate Heart are destined for AOR, but some stations are more likely to playlist Action, a cover of Sweet's 1976 minor hit. Also interesting is the acoustic instrumental Run Across Desert Sands. - DS



SYRE - Pop/Rock
It Ain't Pretty Being Easy
A&M - SP-9156-W


The debut release by popular Ontario band Syre should definitely turn some heads. With a radio-accessible blend of pop and metal, which rarely gets too heavy, these songs will be heard blaring from passing Camaros and customized vans pretty soon. Very commercial production and the general good time attitude communicated by the record should quickly reward the group for the years they've already spent touring. While all tracks are strong, radio should take special note of Flaw It, Summertime, The Way You're Looking Tonight and the ballad, You Never Looked Back. - CM

MICK JONES - Pop/Rock

For a guy who was one of the driving forces behind Foreigner, and who has produced the likes of Van Halen, this is pretty tame stuff. There's nothing to draw the listener in, no hot guitar licks, no driving beat, and Jones doesn't have any range in his voice - it just kind of hangs there. Just Wanna Hold, co-written by Ian Hunter and Mick Jagger, is a mediocre mid-tempo cut, and 4 Wheels Turnin', the only tune with any gusto, sounds like something that was left off the Double Vision album. A very weak effort from a rock veteran who could do better. - DS

SCHOOLY D - Rap
Am I Black Enough For You?
A&M - SP-9156-W

Schooly D is certainly more than black enough for me, and probably most Canadians, who consider Tone Loc and The Fresh Prince to be heavy rappers. Only occasionally interesting, this album is mostly boring, and only stands a chance at the blackest of discos. With more inventive acts like De La Soul and The Beastie Boys currently on release, the record comes off as the work of a secondary talent satisfied to add to the rap overkill of the last year or so. - CM



THEN JERICHO - Pop/Rock
The Big Area
London - 828 122-1-Q

First there was U2, then there was The Alarm, sounding like U2, now it's Then Jerico, sounding like The Alarm. If you like the first two bands, then you'll probably like these guys, too. Their debut of last year managed to see the light of day, if only briefly, on some AOR's, and it's likely that this LP is in for the same short stay on playlists. Big Area is the first single and it'll probably disappear before the guys even decide on a follow-up. Play it after any Alarm track and listeners will be hard pressed to tell the difference. - DS

EDDIE MURPHY - Pop/Dance
So Happy - Columbia - OC-40970-H

Whereas his first musical outing was for the most part a Rick James LP, this time Murphy chose to enlist the help of Narada Michael Walden (Aretha Franklin, Whitney Houston), Nile Rodgers, and Larry Blackmon (Cameo) as writers and producers, and it's resulted in a package that may just surprise folks. Murphy's obviously taking his singing career seriously, from the above mentioned talent to his own writing and production credits on the LP. His voice is a little weak though, and on some cuts it's all too apparent, but Put Your Mouth On Me is already proving to be a winner for him, and that may be a sign that radio is starting to take him seriously as well. - DS





His new LP, his first for the Jive label, features Kiss, as well as a cover of Billy Vera's At This Moment and The Stones' Satisfaction. Jive seems to have a thing with that song since Samantha Fox also covered it, and they've both managed to turn it into a real stomach turner. The rest of the LP isn't much to

write home about either, but Jones' female fans will probably pick it up anyway. - DS

Trevor Rabin was part of the reformed Yes that in 1983 released their most successful album, 90125. Too much of this LP sounds like leftovers from 90125, and Rabin comes off sounding like he's just trying to show off his prowess on everything (except drums). Sorry (Your Heart) kicks off with an intro that sounds like it was lifted from Paul Simon's Graceland, and it's the only mildly interesting cut on here. - DS



FETCHING BONES - Pop
Monster - Capitol - C1-90661-F


Centered around heavy guitar and the less than sweet vocals of Hope Nicholls, this package is definitely not CHR fodder. Lyrically obscure, these songs take a while to digest, but end up a more satisfying meal at the end of the day. For those not in the know, Babyface is one half of one of the busiest writing/production teams in the business, L.A. Reid and Babyface. These two names can be seen on numerous dance records, the hottest right now being Bobby Brown's On Our Own. Anything on this LP could have been recorded by someone else, but this time Babyface has chosen to put his mug on the front cover. Programmers should note that Side 1 is all dance, Side 2 all ballads, with It's No Crime (dance) being the first emphasis track. - DS

KEVIN McDERMOTT - Pop/Rock
ORCHESTRA - Mother Nature's Kitchen - Island - ISL-1240-J

More and more U.K. bands are playing roots rock, once considered a U.S. only genre, and some of these bands, like the Japanese did with electronics, have picked up on the idea and improved on it. This is an album that rocks in all the right places, with lots of hard strumming acoustic guitar, flowing harmonies, and a hint of the Scottish countryside. Healing At The Harbour is an explosive cut that AOR's should definitely consider. - DS




JUSTIN HAYWARD - Pop/Rock

Whereas The Beatles were the most exciting part of the original British invasion, The Moody Blues were, and still are, the most boring. Hayward, who joined the group in 1967, has released an album of material recorded over a seven year period, and it will probably stiff before anyone knows it's out there. The material on here might have a better chance at airplay if it were released as The Moody Blues, and this LP should be labelled 'for serious Moody Blues fans only.' - DS

No, this isn't his version of Jailhouse Rock. The music on here was lifted from a special that Brown did for HBO in the States awhile back. The friends that appear are Robert Palmer, Joe Cocker, Wilson Pickett and Billy Vera. Also included is a duet with Aretha Franklin, Gimme Your Love, but unfortunately, it's not a live cut. It's the same version that's on Franklin's current release. The sound is at times distant and muddy, but there are some good performances, Papa's Got A Brand New Bag and Joe Cocker's rendition of When A Man Loves A Woman, among them. - DS



THE CREEPS - Pop/Rock
Now Dig This
WEA - 24-23534-P

Out of Sweden come The Creeps, a foursome that are the furthest thing from Abba that you could imagine (although they did record at Abba's Polar Studios). This is rock and roll with a later sixties, R&B influence, highlighted by plenty of Hammond organ riffs that would make Booker T. proud. Alternative radio will enjoy this release, and AOR's might want to go with One Good Reason or Don't Go Away. But don't let the band name fool you - there's nothing creepy about these guys. What is creepy is that there's no plans for this to be released on vinyl, so stations without CD players may suffer. - DS

Irwin flies McCoy on his own ATI label

Jason McCoy a seventeen-year old country songwriter/performer from Barrie, Ontario, is now on release with his debut single, Slow This World Down, and album, Greatest Times Of All. McCoy was discovered by country music writer Henry McGuirk at a talent contest last year at Toronto's Birchmount Tavern, resulting in a management deal being negotiated by the pair for McGuirk's Artx Management.

That same year, McCoy was off to Nashville where Ray Griff produced an album of ten McCoy originals, resulting in his release on Scoot Irwin's ATI label.

Irwin, a seasoned promotion veteran, canvassed the top ten country stations in Canada with McCoy's product and the

results were "outstanding" says Irwin, which prompted him to negotiate for a release on his label.

McCoy's talent is much more than singing and songwriting. He has mastered a number of instruments including saxophone, banjo, mandolin, bass guitar and trombone, which adds to his club and concert potential. Like many of his Nashville and Western Canadian counterparts, McCoy's other interest is flying. On his seventeen birthday he was named the youngest pilot in Canada, having completed all the necessary training some months before. He now pilots the family plane to and from business appointments, making him much more accessible for industry happenings.


