





## Sufferin' Catfish debut with The Budget Song

While the federal government's Minister of Finance, Michael Wilson, continues to feel the heat over the leak of his budget and the budget itself, Sufferin' Catfish, a Windsor duo keep the pot boiling with their A-Frame debut, The Budget Song. The record is described as "zeroeing in on the funny bone immediately with some offbeat commentary that all Canadians can relate to."

Sufferin' Catfish is Hans 'Rusty' Winker of Warwick, Ontario and Windsor's Somerset Novak. The two have apparently been writing since meeting last July while fishing near North Bay.

As the story goes, Winker came to the rescue of Novak who, for hours, had been calling for help after his motorboat had run out of gasoline. Subsequently they both learned of each other's musical interests.

The comedic pair were somewhat removed from the recording industry before their debut; Winker doubled as an apprentice

FACTOR has expanded its list of distributors to include Denon Canada for classical and jazz product only and DiscReps for jazz product only.

Denon has a well-founded history in the production and marketing of software and hardware for the recording industry. Denon was established in 1910 and began selling software to the industry in 1951 and was one of the leaders in the manufacturing and distribution of CDs and CD players. Specializing mainly in classical product (RPM - Apr. 29/89), Denon has bases in Japan, New Jersey, Georgia, Ontario and West Germany with distribution reaching into many countries including Austria, Denmark, the U.K., France, Hong Kong, Italy, the Netherlands and Spain.

DiscReps distributes and promotes jazz product exclusively. The company matches projects with appropriate labels, ensuring that existing labels are actively releasing new product. This practice provides artists with inclusion in a label's catalogue and a commercial outlet for their product. DiscReps currently handles sixteen labels and represents releases to eight countries with sales reps in seven Canadian cities.

After opening to warm reviews at Emerson's Bar & Grill in Toronto (Feb. 21/89), Marvin, Dream Of A Lifetime, closed May 6th after a ten week run. Producers Donald K. Donald and David Doze had made several adjustments during the musical's run, however, although brilliantly staged with Dutch Robinson as Marvin Gaye, it was obvious there was not enough impact on Toronto audiences to continue.

The show returns to Montreal, where it was the smash hit of the Montreal Jazz Festival in 1988.

## Heavy BMG promotion on Dion's return

BMG Music Canada have set in motion a national promotion campaign to support the return of Dion (DiMucci) from his drug hell to what could be a second kick at the can. BMG has just shipped Dion's debut for Arista titled Yo Frankie. Heavy emphasis is being put on Written On The Subway Wall, a track expected to break him in the U.S.

Dion's hook for getting back into the record business is his honesty in facing up to his drug habit. In his autobiography, The Wanderer; Dion's story, which he wrote with Davin Seay, Dion paints a very painful picture of drugs and his addiction. "The day I snorted that first white line," he wrote, "and walked like a king through the tenement streets was the day I cut myself off from ever facing what was wrong with me, Dion the man behind all those masks." There wasn't too much in the drug field that Dion didn't sample and he admits to becoming a "junkie" at an early age. The book should be must reading for those wanting to get into the recording business.

Also shipped to the media is a 9:46 minute video titled My Dinner With Dion. As well, BMG are making moves to bring the veteran hitmaker into Canada for promotional dates.

## Browne & Hiatt firmed for Mariposa '89

The 1989 Mariposa Festival, which bills itself as "Canada's leading summer outdoor music event", has announced this year's lineup for the festival. The event, which is being held on June 23-25 at Molson Park in Barrie, is the 29th and the roster of performers will showcase a wide range of musical styles.

Taking part in the festival will be Jackson Browne (his first visit to Mariposa since the early 70's), Melissa Etheridge, John Hiatt, David Lindley, Jane Siberry, The Razorbacks and many others. Other than representatives from Canada and the U.S., the festival will present artists from other countries such as South Africa's Malumbo, Britain's punk dub poet Attila the Stockbroker and Australia's Weddings Parties Anything.

Mariposa president Lynne Hurry is approaching this year's event with enthusiasm and optimism: "We're moving towards our 30th festival. We hope that the 29th annual event will be our most successful yet, and a worthy milestone on our way to the start of our third decade."

A three-day early bird pass for the event will be available for \$49.50 until June 1, after which a weekend ticket will cost \$69.00. For more ticket and event info, contact the Mariposa office at (416)769-FOLK.

## Attic releases second in series of Focus Trax CDs

Attic Records is taking full advantage of the allowable time on compact discs with the release of their second Focus Trax compilation CD. The Attic CD includes not only the current singles, but key tracks for A/C and AOR stations as well as interviews with the artists.

Attic's Lindsay Gillespie points out that "In some cases, the Focus Trax replaces the vinyl singles; in others we also service vinyl, because our research indicates that not all secondary and tertiary markets have CD broadcast capability."


The new Attic compilation includes David Knopfler's Heat Come Down, Roman Grey's Give Me Your Love and I Want To Mean Something To You by Jessie Winchester, plus an interview with Winchester. The compilation also includes an interview with Southside Johnny along with his single, Slow Dance; Richard Jon Smith's Michael Row The Boat Ashore; and Peter Noone's I'm Into Something Good.

The first Focus Trax was shipped in February as a test. "I believe we were the first to do this in Canada," says Gillespie. Subsequent releases will be shipped monthly.

## Elvis' Toronto date sells \$200,000 in three days

Ronald Andrews of Concert Productions International (CPI) believes the company has locked into a runaway hit with *Elvis: A Musical Celebration*. This is the first real investment CPI has made as a producer of a musical, from story board to stage, and initial response has been "overwhelming", says Andrews. In the first three days of the tickets going on sale at Toronto's O'Keefe, more than \$200,000 in ticket sales have been rung up for the week's engagement (May 29 through June 3).

The show opened last July 1st in the Hilton Las Vegas, in the same room where Presley used to play. Toronto will be the third Canadian city to stage the show. It previously played Vancouver and Ottawa. After the Toronto date, the show moves to New York.

Interestingly enough, this musical documentary on the life and times of Presley comes from the same creative team responsible for *Beatlemania*. There are 33 actors and musicians in the show, handling a repertoire of 49 of Presley's songs, all intertwined with six miles of film and video.

## Universal release for Dirt Band's Circle Vol. II

It was in 1971 when The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band "and friends" hit the market with *Will The Circle Be Unbroken*. The album, which made platinum in Canada, was described as a "milestone recording of traditional American music." Now, with their first release on Universal/MCA Records, the Dirt Band have a new generation of performers for the Circle.

*Will The Circle Be Unbroken Vol. II* features performances by some of the biggest names in the country/rock field. One of the first singles released, *You Ain't Going Nowhere* by Roger McGuinn and Chris Hillman, has already charted across the country.

Also featured on the new album are Levon Helm (When I Get My Rewards), John Denver (And So It Goes), Bruce Hornsby (The Valley Road), Randy Scruggs on guitar (Amazing Grace), Emmylou Harris (Mary Danced With Soldiers), Ricky Skaggs (Little Mountain Church House), John Prine (Grandpa Was A Carpenter) and Johnny Cash (Life's Railway To Heaven), plus the Dirt Band, of course, on several tracks.

Of particular interest is the title track, performed by Cash, Roy Acuff, Skaggs, Helm, Harris and the Dirt Band.

After last year's winning campaign CBS hopes that this year's campaign will prove even more successful.

## David Gibson featured on Pontiac's Mall Tour

A & M Records recording artist David Gibson is currently making promotional appearances in shopping malls across Canada as part of Pontiac's Rising Stars Tour, a presentation of Mall Promotions Network. The tour, which began on April 13th and runs through July 22nd, will make stops in Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, Winnipeg, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver.

Pontiac will be displaying several of their automobiles during the tour, and co-sponsor Silkience will host a hair styling contest in each city. Throughout the presentation at each mall, there will be continuous videos, displays and demonstrations.

Mall Promotions Network has presented other tours such as the Childrens' World Tour and the New You National Tours. This is the first tour launched by a Canadian company featuring a young artist. Shopping Centre Network in the U.S. presented a similar tour for, then unknown artist, Tiffany.

## Chater to board of FACTOR

Brian Chater, Executive Director of CIRPA, has been appointed to the Board of Directors of FACTOR. He was appointed by CIRPA to hold one of the seats designated to the music industry on FACTOR's board. This marks a return to the FACTOR Board for Chater since his term as a Director from 1982 through 1985.

Chater has recently become involved in consulting and research for the music industry, concentrating much time and effort on the copyright legislation. Besides Chater, the FACTOR Board comprises Ann Graham (President), Jason Sniderman (Secretary), Roy Hennessy (Treasurer), Alexander Mair, Stephen Prendergast, Duff Roman, Peter Parrish, Steve Harris, Bill Kearns and Don Shafer.

## Maritime nod given to FACTOR-assisted artists

At the recent Maritime Music Awards, held in Halifax (Apr. 10), two FACTOR-supported artists received awards. They were Haywire, who won Recording Band of The Year, and Matt Minglewood, who took top honours for Video of The Year. FACTOR contributed to the production of Haywire's debut LP, *Don't Just Stand There* and for their video, *Dance Desire*. They also provided funding for Minglewood's *Runaway* video and for his LP, *The Promise*, which was nominated for Best Album.



## Were we wrong . . . ?

Re: March 30th item on Page 4. I thought it might be of interest to you if I corrected some misconceptions about the well being of The Irish Rovers.

1) The Unicorn on Eglinton Avenue was not their first Unicorn Pub. The first was opened in Calgary a year and a half earlier.

2) The Unicorn on Eglinton is not the only successful operation. As it happens, it is the smallest. We have two others that are larger and even more successful - in Calgary and Vancouver.

3) The Unicorn at 110 Bloor West in Toronto was in fact unsuccessful and, because of pressure from outside investor partners, a separate company operating that location was volunteered into receivership.

4) We operated The Unicorn in Aurora (not Richmond Hill) and paid all the bills for two years before concluding that it was too small an operation for us to manage by remote control from Vancouver. Tom Williams was looking for a new and different challenge at that time and he bought the pub from us. Tom has since enjoyed (with an awful lot of hard work) building up a very successful business for himself.

I'm sure you will agree that it's quite an accomplishment for The Irish Rovers to have parlayed their two hits into a successful twenty-five year career on stage, television and records, as well as into a thriving pub and restaurant business and, as they, this year, celebrate their Silver Anniversary (the same five Rovers and same manager, which in itself is no small feat), they have the comfort of knowing that all of this will provide for them very handsomely for as long as they are around and require being provided for.

## Silencers' O'Neill broadsides British scribes

With their second album, *A Blues For Buddha*, getting good press, and an upcoming European tour with Simple Minds, this will definitely be a rewarding year for Scotland's The Silencers. A fall North American tour will give audiences another chance to experience their "folk music for the '90s" live, which songwriter Jimme O'Neill assures is what the band is all about.

O'Neill has strong ideas about the contemporary music scene and where the Silencers fit into the framework. "Music seems to be splitting into two camps," he says, "the real musician camp with something to say, and the bland pop pulp with nothing to say, but a high profile." The commentary continues: "I think the music scene is a bit boring and traditional in the days of video and synthesizer pop records, but we find that playing live is so much a part of the whole deal that unless you can do that and unless you can carry it off, everything else doesn't really matter. We're very committed to that because we find that's the best way to put our sort of message and our ideas across."

So strong is the belief in the importance of the live aspect in music that much of the album was recorded live in the studio. "There's no other way you can do it to get that kind of feeling in," stresses O'Neill. "We actually did try various ways of doing these songs and we came back to these versions.

"The basics were put down as demos

and we liked the feeling. We didn't want to change the feel, so we just worked on those. And I think that was the big difference between that and the first album. The first album was a great collection of songs, but it was more locked out. For this album, we wanted to be much more spontaneous and just let things happen." The proof of the pudding is in the tasting, and the band has delivered an album of which they are rightfully proud.

"While they have found success at home and in Europe, they have yet to crack the influential English market. In a nation which creates one overnight success after another, the Silencers, with their eyes firmly fixed on the long haul, don't seem to fit the mold. In particular, O'Neill notes that the outlook of U.K. rock journalists does not jibe with that of the band.

"They're not really interested in music," he insists, "They're more interested in what sort of trousers and haircuts you've got so they can define you and put you into a box. That's what they're interested in there. We are totally about music and totally about the ideas in the songs. That's all we're interested in. We're totally about playing live."

O'Neill continues with his attack on British journalists, "They're sometimes very young . . . they failed university and they are very political. They don't have any musical background . . . so they hear a Silencers song and think, 'This is another U2 type of band'." He continues: "They're not really

interested in lyrics. It always amazes me that when journalists talk to you in Britain, they're not really interested in the content of what you're writing about. I think it's a peculiarly English thing to do."


Although the Silencers have yet to attain mass recognition, all the pieces seem well in place for a change. A hard-working band with a hot album and the dedication and artistic integrity the Silencers display should make RCA's task a lot lighter and should ensure success in the near future and not-so-near future.

## T.M.P. and Hardy sign multi-year agreement



**MADONNA**

With Like A Prayer holding in the top 5 of most charts in North America, the commercial appeal of this LP speaks loudly, though not in the same tone as earlier product. Express Yourself and Cherish should be huge hits, with at least one of the slower tunes breaking out strongly. Of note, Prince appears on and co-writes Love Song. Little or none of Madonna's talent shows through here. Completely Prince-esque, this mediocre track sticks out like a sore thumb. The remainder of the songs are much more subdued and introspective than on earlier works. Her maturity is by far the most obvious and pleasing distinction. Clearly having outgrown the pop mini-genre that she created, Madonna has managed to capture her audience and convince them to grow along with her. There is little sign of this artist becoming too comfortable to aspire. Madonna continues to break personal ground, still maintaining fantastic commercial success. - RG

**CARMEN WESTFALL** - Country  
Talk Around Town

A very refreshing sound from Canada's country field. Country, country rock, pop and blues, there are no boundaries for this remarkable talent, nominated for a Big Country Award in the Most Promising category. Westfall's vocal confidence is a manipulation of purr and bite with the projection of a seasoned player. Key are Luke Gibson's You're An Angel (When You Wanna Be), Ian Fletcher Kemp's Jessie's Song (Hold On), and I Don't Need Your Memory, which Westfall wrote with producer Jerry Knight. Lots of great fiddle, banjo, steel and keyboards. - WG



This first solo release by Holly Roddam certainly meets the standards of world class production. The purity of the vocals are further enhanced by the professional backing, both instrumentally and vocally, that adds a cushion of sound allowing for a penetrating yet pleasing vocal projection. Great keyboard work by Bill McCauley, and a very impressive sax performance by Kenny Mackay on Jesus My Lord. Produced by Pat Riley, who is no slouch on bass, at Solar Audio & Recording Studios in Halifax. Also key are The Candle, The Fire, and A New Song. - WG

**DEE DEE KING** - Pop/Rock  
Standing In The Spotlight

A truly confusing and disappointing release by Dee Dee King (aka Dee Dee Ramone). Seemingly enamored of rap, King offers up his own uninspired rhymes mixed with lame pop and watered-down punk. Commotion In The Ocean stands out from the rest of the album, reminiscent of a cross between the B-52's and Trio's Da Da Da. It is surprising that, when so many innovative, hard-working indie bands are around, a contract is awarded to a project such as this. - CM

**TOM TOM CLUB** - Pop  
Boom Boom Chi Boom Boom

Denser and less accessible than earlier work, previously used melodic hooks have been replaced by airy synth washes. Strong tracks include Subocean and Little Eva, while the Lou Reed-penned Femme Fatale is of particular interest, featuring Reed, David Byrne and Jerry Harrison. The group's reputation should provide initial success while further action will depend on the support the project receives from the clubs. - CM



**ANNETTE DUCHARME** - Pop  
Blue Girl

Squeaky clean production makes this introspective singer/songwriter package a safe bet for airplay, as witnessed by strong support for No Such Thing, the initial single release. However, translating radio success into retail action will take concentrated effort considering the large number of female voices currently singing out for consumer dollars. Regardless, Blue Girl is a solid first effort of definite interest to both CHR and A/C programmers. - CM

**MILLI VANILLI** - Pop/Rap  
Girl You Know It's True

The well founded success of their single, the title track, has opened the door for any follow up to be added across the board. A very good display of studio talent and a clean, uncluttered production from these extremely marketable pretty boys. Girl You Know... is definitely the brightest light. None of the other tracks should be as big, for as long. - RG

**NITTY GRITTY DIRT BAND** - Country  
Will The Circle Be Unbroken Vol. II  
Universal/MCA - UVL2-12500-J

Country programmers are already featuring several tracks from this classic package of "barnburning" country rock and pop entertainment. It has been 18 years since the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band produced their first Will The Circle Be Unbroken, and with this Dirt Band, Randy Scruggs production, they have once again hit pay dirt. Too many selections to go into, twenty in all, but Levon Helm's When I Get My Rewards, Bruce Hornsby's The Valley Road and Michael Martin Murphey's Lost River should do it, and You Ain't Going Nowhere, a single release by Roger McGuinn and Chris Hillman is already doing it. - WG

**FABULOUS THUNDERBIRDS** - Rock  
Powerful Stuff - Epic - FZ-45094-H

The title track from this set has already been up and down the charts as a single from the Cocktail Soundtrack, and Rock This Place, or any of a number of tracks, could do well at AOR. The reasons though, are not as positive. The tracks are all very similar, and through tiresome repetition of over used Blues/Rock rhythms, any song could appear an audience with a standard, upbeat tune. It could be unfair to criticize what is fundamentally good album, but the lack of uniqueness is frustrating. - RG

**DECADE OF DREAMS** - Rock

Interesting is the best word to describe this band's approach. The vocals seem to mimic those of Lou Reed, a sound that can probably only succeed if you are Lou Reed. Without a serious following of their own, it will be extremely difficult for this act to gain radio support. - CM

**DENNIS BROWN** - Reggae  
Visions - Shanachie - 44002-E

At a time when the reggae scene is dominated by low budget, run of the mill dance hall/beat box affairs, it is refreshing to find an outstanding roots album. Brown's distinctive vocal stylings have won him a tremendous following, and a release of this calibre should reinforce his status as one of the genre's greats. - CM






**VARIOUS ARTISTS** - Country


**TAMMY WYNETTE** - Country

# And the Nominees are....

Q: What are the Big Country Awards?  
A: An annual banquet, held on Sunday evening, at which time the award winners are revealed and awards presented. This evening event is not to be confused with the Variety Club Luncheon saluting the Big Country Awards, which will take place on the Friday prior to the actual Big Country Awards presentation.

Q: How are the nominees picked?

A: Nominations are based on chart action in RPM over the previous year. The ballots are mailed to all RPM subscribers. This gives us a very good mix of voters and makes it impossible for blocks and pockets to control the voting. The winners will be known only when the envelopes are opened onstage at the actual awards banquet.

Q: Will the awards feature musical performances?

A: No. The dinner will be followed by the awards ceremony at which time the presenters will open the envelopes and announce the winners. The whole event is designed to be an industry get together and it is a unique opportunity for the heavyweights in the industry to get to know one another and possibly do a deal. One night set aside for the industry. It's very unique.

Q: How many categories are there?

A: Exactly one dozen (12). The Big Country Awards are very coveted awards and are not given out in large numbers. They carry a great deal of prestige for the industry.

Q: Will there be meetings and conferences tied into this event?

A: No. We believe there is much going on now, and there's no further need for additional conferences.

Q: Isn't \$100 per person a little too expensive for a banquet?

A: Actually it isn't. That price is all inclusive. Once you pay the \$100, you have paid it all. There are no other charges: for parking, drinks, coat checking or dinner wine. Everything is included. The evening will be a very posh affair in a very elegant setting, designed to bring prestige to the Canadian country music industry. It's an event for the industry. Once a year we get together for a very special industry evening. Your payment will be confirmed to you by telephone and FAX and your table arrangements will be handed to you at the door. Cocktails are at 7 pm and dinner is at 8 pm. Dress elegantly but not black tie.

Q: Is it possible to reserve a table?

A: Yes. Tables of 8, 9 or 10 can be reserved ahead, if you get a group together and arrange that they all pay prior to 4 pm May 19. Mail all the payments in the same envelope. We must have all the names in advance.

Q: Will it be possible to pay at the door?

A: Definitely not! For an event of this kind, advance planning makes it impossible to arrange any additional meals. You must be confirmed at least four days prior to the banquet.




