

MCA's exiting Azoff succeeded by Teller

Shock waves rolled through the U.S. West Coast music community with the sudden announcement that Irving Azoff had resigned as a Vice President of MCA Inc. and Chairman of its Music Entertainment Group. There had been speculation that Azoff "was looking" for a solo venture, but the announcement of his exiting made by Sid Sheinberg, President and Chief Operating Officer of MCA Inc., had its obvious impact. He will be succeeded as Chairman of the MCA Music Entertainment Group by Al Teller, who joined the company in 1988 as Vice President of MCA Inc. and President and Chief Operating Officer of MCA Records. He had previously served as President of CBS Records.

Azoff, who joined MCA in 1983 to head up its record and music operations, will continue to act as MCA's representative for the Los Angeles Coliseum negotiations. He will also continue to act as a consultant to MCA for its Facilities Merchandising operation, which specializes in on-site distribution of non-consumable merchandise at sports and concert facilities throughout the

Tragedy on way home for Carlton Show Band

Sean McManus, founder and leader of Canada's popular Carlton Show Band, passed away suddenly, Sept. 9. The cause of death was a massive heart attack. Mr. McManus would have been 53 in December.

The Carlton Show Band has been one of the most active and best loved touring acts in Canada for the past 25 years, a popularity that spilled over into the U.S. as well. Much of this popularity grew out of their CTV series, the Pig 'N Whistle, a highly-rated variety show that became a weekly habit for millions of Canadian viewers over an eleven year period. To celebrate their success in the business the band recently released a Silver Anniversary cassette.

The band was enroute home to Toronto through Michigan after performing at the Thunder Bay Fair when Mr. McManus suffered the fatal seizure. Funeral services were held in Bobcaygeon, Ontario, on September 14.

FACTOR evaluations to be held in Saskatoon

FACTOR will hold evaluations of funding applications in Saskatoon during the Saskatchewan Recording Industry Association's Music Industry Weekend. A deadline of Oct. 15/89 has been put in place for applications to the FACTOR Loan and New Talent Demo Award Programs for Saskatchewan musicians, labels, managers and others involved in the music industry.

Music and broadcast industry professionals will evaluate applications from Saskatchewan and other regions of Canada on November 17, 18 and 19. Blaine Wilkins of Saskatoon's Studio West will be assisting in the arranging of evaluation sessions. Studio West, a sponsoring studio of FACTOR's New Talent Demo Award Program, will have a supply of FACTOR Loan and New Talent Demo Award applications available.

Hallmark Cards Canada to sponsor Penner tour

Hallmark Cards Canada has announced the sponsorship of the upcoming Fred Penner In Concert national tour. Penner was this year's winner of a Juno as Best Children's Performer. His five album releases which were distributed internationally, have sold close to half a million units. As well, his CBC-TV Network show, Fred Penner's Place has become a regular morning habit for an estimated 500,000 viewers.

This national tour is in support of Read Canada, a Frontier College project, described as "one of the most innovative programmes in Canada, promoting literacy among Canadian children." Mrs. Mila Mulroney is Honorary Patron of the project.

Tanya Boyd-Saffran, Director of Planning, Research & Communications for Hallmark Canada, points out that "This project's main goal is to get kids hooked on books today . . . creating a more literate Canada for the future."




Broadcaster/writer Payne to head censor board

Robert Payne, former CKEY broadcaster, currently writing for the Toronto Sun, has been named Chairman of the Ontario Film Review Board. He succeeds former Hamilton politician Anne Jones.

Payne first made his mark in broadcasting when he joined CKEY as a part-time newscaster in 1969. He took the job on a full-time basis in 1972, remaining with the Toronto station until last year, when both he and station management agreed to disagree. He has, however, continued his involvement with broadcasting, and is well suited for his new challenge where he is expected to continue what is described as the "liberalization" of film censorship, which was introduced when Premier David Peterson's Liberal government came into power.

COVER STORY - by Chris Murray**Hit The Ground Runnin' kicks off in Canada**

New Autograph signing Hit The Ground Runnin' is currently engaged on a national radio tour to promote their debut single, Over & Over, and upcoming album, Sudden Impact, slated for a September 15 release. After their appearance at the legendary Monterey Pop Festival, October 1, the band will return for a series of live showcases and concerts to afford Canadians the chance to witness the live show that has made them favourites in their home town of Philadelphia.

The roots of the band extend back to 1983, when bassist Paul Piccari and drummer Jim Katone formed Sanctuary (later Escape), a Top 50 cover band. "We used to play the hotels and casinos back in the United States," informs Piccari, "and we were doing very well . . . very good money."

In 1984 Piccari, Katone and two others who have since moved on, left Escape to form Free Delivery and pursue originals. "Once we started to get that really big following," recalls Piccari, "we were throwing in originals and the crowd really loved our original material.

"We got picked up by NISE Productions to do a record in the United States," he continues, "[so we decided] to pull off the circuit and go full force into the album, which we did, and we changed the name [to Hit The Ground Runnin'] while doing that, so this way there wouldn't be any confusion about Top 40 or cover music.

"The following knew about the transition and they didn't seem to mind at all," he relates. "When we came back we did spot gigs here and there to test out the material and we would do an hour and a half show of completely original stuff and the crowd response blew us away because they were even more enthused than when we were doing covers."

Although recording went smoothly for HGR, it did not go quickly. "We have done two other albums before this . . . but we never pressed them," elaborates Piccari. "We brought some of the [early] material into NISE Productions in Camden and we started

to record that stuff and I said, 'I don't know . . . I think we could do better.'

"So as we were recording that album, we ended up writing a whole other album on the side and we let them hear it and they were blown away by the next album" he declares. "So we said, 'Well, let's just use this.' So as we were doing that, we wrote even more material, so we changed it again. All the old material's fantastic stuff too, but this album is just a very inspirational thing. It's a boy meets girl situation and it fit into a story and we really like the way this album felt. So this is the one we went with."

Although positive HGR could have secured a major deal in Canada, Piccari maintains that he is happier with an independent label in this country. "With a major," he suggests, "you get put on a shelf . . . We feel it's more of a little family thing where we can actually communicate and talk and have some say in what's going on."


While currently shopping stateside for a major deal, the band is doing a good job of developing a high profile, using visual media far more effectively than most new acts. In addition to appearances on Dance Party U.S.A., put on by the U.S.A. Network, for which co-manager Hilary Schacter is Vice President Special Programming, the band is involved with several film and commercial pursuits.

The producers of one film, Surrounded By Fire, apparently approached Hilary and asked him if he thought his band might have something. "So he called us up," recalls Piccari, and said 'Listen, write a tune called Surrounded By Fire.' We wrote the song in a day, recorded it the next two days and sent the tape out. Well this guy flipped out because the song really kicks butt . . . 'This is great', he said, 'it's up there for theme title'." The band is also negotiating for a cameo performance of Over & Over.

As well as two other films, HGR is involved with commercials, having done a jingle for a sleepwear company. "It wasn't exactly the demographic they were after for this particular commercial," confesses Piccari, explaining why the project has been put on hold, suggesting that "If the band starts doing something, they're going to pull that out and use it."

"They had the idea that they wanted us to actually be in a pyjama party, playing at this pyjama party," he goes on, "and chicks running around with these sleepthings, you know, just the tops on . . . so we would actually be in it too."

Having delivered an unabashedly straightforward pop rock album with high production values, the strong support of Autograph with distribution through BMG, and a well connected management team, it will be truly surprising if Hit The Ground Runnin' does not win a place in the hearts of teenyboppers nationwide. With a U.S. deal not yet finalized, Canada has another opportunity to prove it can break foreign acts as effectively as it has been breaking domestic acts over the past few years.

CBC-TV sets date for new Anne Murray Special

Anne Murray's new CBC-TV special, Anne Murray's Greatest Hits, Volume II, goes to television October 1st, at 7 pm. The hour-long special was taped in concert. Murray's guests include K.T. Oslin, Kenny Rogers and Dave Loggins. CBC-TV's last special for Murray, Family Christmas, was the No. 1 show on the English Television Network in 1988 and the highest-rated variety show in over a decade.

A highlight of the new Murray special will be the world television premiere of Murray and Rogers performing their recently released duet, If I Ever Fall In Love Again, which is already charted on the RPM Country 100. The special will also allow producer Sandra Fairé, to show some of the footage she and her production team gathered at the recent opening of the Anne Murray Centre in Springhill, Nova Scotia.

"The last special was a terrific experience for me," said Murray, "so when they asked me to do another one I said . . . what the heck, why not. This time I get to sing with three of my favourite singers, Kenny Rogers, K.T. Oslin and Dave Loggins." Another highlight of the special will be Loggins joining Murray for Nobody Loves Me Like You Do. It was this song,

featuring Loggins, that was taken as a single from Murray's LP, Heart Over Mind, that became No. 1 on the RPM country chart on November 24th, 1984.

What producer Fairé found exciting with the Murray special "is watching Anne in her natural environment . . . an in-concert setting." She continues with, "You can see why people really love her. She's completely relaxed. Her natural humour comes through,

she's real . . . and she sings hit after hit after hit. It's one of the smoothest hours on television you'll ever see."

As Murray's manager Leonard Rambeau points out, "We hadn't been planning to do another special so soon . . . but when I met with variety chief Carol Reynolds, to hear the ratings for our Christmas special, she had a contract prepared for this one. The CBC's moving pretty fast these days."

Janik's Castaway single flips to South cover



CKGB/CFTI launch for OPP's Good Bears Patrol

Through the persuasive capabilities of Telemedia News Centre (CKGB/CFTI Radio) in Timmins and with the cooperation of District 15 of the Ontario Provincial Police, Good Bears on Patrol has been an important addition to police work in Ontario's North this summer.

Telemedia News Director Bob McIntyre points out, "There are times in a child's life when he or she really needs a friend, someone to hold onto . . . that's the philosophy behind Good Bears on Patrol." He goes on to explain, "Earlier this year we heard of the bear project being launched in Southern Ontario, by Good Bears of the World and the Telephone Pioneers of America. We checked to see if it would take in the North, and found out it wouldn't . . . so we decided to get involved, and were given permission to supply teddy bears to OPP District 15, most

Good Bears of the World is an international organization with Canadian headquarters in Elora, Ontario, supplying teddy bears to children in hospitals as well as for Good Bears on Patrol.

The local project was officially launched July 1st, during CKGB's annual Day in the Park festivities at Hollinger Park in Timmins. During the ceremony, OPP Public Information Officer, Sergeant Bob Lamb, pointed out the uniqueness of Telemedia News supplying the bears, rather than the Telephone Pioneers, which is also an international organization. "As a police officer," said Lamb, "it's gratifying to know we have this kind of support from the media, as well as the citizens of the community."

As McIntyre explains, "Whenever a police officer becomes involved with a situation that effects a child, an accident, a lost child or a domestic dispute, for example, the officer will give the teddy bear to the child. The bears are about a foot high, just the right size for any child to be able to hold onto. They are a special model, made by Binkley Bears of Hamilton, specifically for Good Bears of the World. Each bear is adorned with a ribbon which carries the OPP logo, and for the District 15 project, Air Canada has provided plastic baggage tags that are attached to the bear's ankle with a card noting the contribution of Telemedia.

"There's a bear and a spare for every OPP cruiser, boat and aircraft in the district," says McIntyre. "As they are given to children, they'll be replaced with funding from the Telemedia Children's Trust Fund," which was also launched at the station's Day in the Park. In summing up his pride in the program, McIntyre said, "We like to think of it as a little comfort from your friends at the Telemedia News Centre in Timmins."



I Can Dream About It is geared for the A/C crowd, but for a real workout, try Rock Myself To Sleep, a track that was recorded by April Wine a few years back. - DS

Jason McCoy is a rare in country music. Besides being a teenager, he has the confidence and delivery of a veteran. He has already scored points with country programmers, resulting in his debut single, Slow This World Down, being charted and playlisted. The single moves up the RPM 100 this week to No. 82. Produced in Nashville by Ray Griff with a heavy who's who of country's session people on board, McCoy's vocal smoothness and lyric interpretation sets him up as a bright, new, bushy-tailed talent to watch. 
STEPHANIE MILLS - Pop

Jefferson Airplane - Epic - OE-45271-H


This year will go down in rock history as the year of rejuvenation, and the Airplane are the latest bunch to take a

Grace Slick, Paul Kantner, Marty Balin, Jack Casady and Jorma Kaukonen have reunited to produce an album that does indeed, and you've heard this many times this year, sound young and fresh. Sounding more like mid-seventies Jefferson Starship than late sixties Airplane, there are several tracks, like Madeleine Street and Ice Age, that should fair well not only on AOR but A/C as well. Summer Of Love is a real corny trip down memory lane, and Upfront Blues is a bluegrass influenced instrumental that sounds out of place from the rest of the LP's more contemporary tunes. With all the other reunions that have taken place this year, this LP was released at just the right time - any later and it might have been regarded as a joke. - DS




FAITH NO MORE - Rock


D'ATRA HICKS - Pop

We've seen Whitney, Paula and Karyn hit the top of the charts, so there's no reason why this vocalist shouldn't find success on CHR and A/C as well as in the clubs. Among the various producers on this album are Narada Michael Walden and Elliott Wolff, who have produced Whitney and Paula respectively, so the similar style on this album to those artists is no coincidence. Sweet Talk is the first single, and it's prime Top 40 material. The CD contains a bonus 12" version of the song, and as for the rest of the album, any of the other dance numbers or ballads would fair well as singles. - DS



ELTON JOHN - Pop
Sleeping With The Past

This is an album ear-marked for A/C. Mid-tempo throughout, Elton seems to have left behind the wild piano riffs that could be heard on earlier works for a much more relaxed sound. The music flows evenly from start to finish, without ever jolting the listener. Fans of songs like I'm Still Standing or I Don't Wanna Go On With You Like That may be put off by Elton's gentler touch on this one, but those who enjoy his more easy going side will be pleased. The title cut or I Never Knew Her Name are top choices for future singles. - DS



PAUL SHAFFER - Pop
Coast To Coast
Capitol - C1-46288-F

The leader of The World's Most Dangerous Band has released his first album, and so far the reaction to the single When The Radio Is On has been lukewarm at best. As the LP title suggests, this one was recorded across the U.S.A. with various musicians, and as a concept, Shaffer gets an A, but a C-minus for execution. The title cut would have been better choice for first single, which was co-written and co-sung by K.C. (of the Sunshine Band - remember him?), and among other guests are Brian Wilson, Eric Burdon and Koko Taylor. Shaffer is a great live performer, but fans of his late night shitsick may be disappointed by this bland pop effort. - DS

EDDIE AND THE CRUISERS II - Soundtrack
Scotti Brothers - SZ-45297-H

Yes, John Cafferty and The Beaver Brown Band perform all the music again and yes he still sounds too much like Springsteen. Cafferty should just change the band's name to Eddie and The Cruisers since it's a much more recognizable name. The music is blue collar rock and roll, that's highly forgettable, which means that AOR will have plenty to choose from, Pride And Passion (the single), Runnin' Through The Fire and (Keep My Love) Alive being the top picks. - DS

WEBB WILDER - Pop/Rock
Hybrid Vigor
Island - ISL-1249-J

Although the album as a whole is unspectacular, several high points qualify it as a strong first effort. The rocky Cold Front and Louisiana Hannah, along with the bluesy Wild Honey, won't make it past AOR, where they should find some acceptance. Also strong are Hittin' Where It Hurts and Do You Know Something (I Don't Know), which combine a certain alternative charm with a fair portion of catchiness. Interestingly, producer R.S. Field warrants writing credits on eight of the package's ten cuts whereas Wilder himself co-authors only two. - CM

VAIN - Rock
No Respect
Island - ISL-1248-J

These boys can truthfully tell people that they are playing in Vain. Although the record reaches a few highs with Aces, Laws Against Love and Ready, otherwise it never surpasses adequacy. Clean production keeps singer Davy Vain's voice audible and understandable and features some heavy, albeit run-of-the-mill, guitar-work, but uninventive drumming and boring, although well-hidden in the mix, bass lines prevent this effort from inspiring the listener to emotions more elevated than impatience. - CM



JOE COCKER - Pop/Rock
One Night Of Sin
Capitol - C1-92861-F

Posessing one of the most distinctive voices in rock, Cocker has had hits over the last twenty years, and this LP is going to take him right into the next decade. Already scoring a hit with the Bryan Adams co-written When The Night Comes, Cocker should be able to look forward to a healthy stay on AOR/AC/CHR. A master at the cover version, Cocker's choice of material on here is outstanding, including Gladys Knight and The Pips' I've Got To Use My Imagination, the classic Fever, and also worth a listen is the Dan Hartman/Charlie Midnite penned Bad Bad Sign, which will take listeners back to the days of Mad Dogs And Englishmen. Speaking of which, Cocker fans will want to note that keyboardist Chris Stainton plays on most of the tracks. - DS

CLARENCE CLEMONS - Pop
A Night With Mr. C.
Columbia - FC-40917-H

A far cry from his first solo LP, Clarence Clemons and The Red Bank Rockers, Clemons' newest is much more funky, due in part to Narada Michael Walden's production on six of the nine cuts. This LP is heavy on the synthesizers and light on true soul, something that fans of the Big Man might come to expect. The A&R folks at Columbia have apparently decided that Clemons might sell more records if he were promoted as a dance artist, which would explain Walden and the choice of material. Covers of a Quarter To Three and Shotgun leave a lot to be desired, but Dance, Dance, Dance, a duet with Kim Carnes, stands out as the album's best track. - DS

Family Brown and Lang win big at CCMA awards

Hometown favourites The Family Brown were big winners at this year's Canadian Country Music Association awards show, which was held at Ottawa's National Arts Centre (Sept. 9). The popular Ottawa Valley band took three awards, Group, Single (for Town Of Tears), and for Song of the Year which was written by Barry Brown, Randall Prescott and Bruce Campbell.

K.D. Lang was also a big winner, scoring wins as Entertainer and Female Vocalist of the Year, and her Shadowland LP winning the Album of the Year category, for the second consecutive year.

Brian Ferriman's Savannah label was also a major player in this year's awards ceremony with Gary Fjellgaard taking Male Vocalist of the Year award and, with Linda Hunt, the Duo of the Year category.

Although George Fox had been nominated in six categories, the most of any nominee, he managed to scrape through with only one win, in the Rising Star category.

One of the highlights of the evening was Don Grashey's induction into the CCMA's Country Music Hall of Honour. Grashey, a veteran producer and owner of the Thunder Bay, Ontario-based Golden Eagle label, has been involved in country music for more than three decades, and was instrumental in the launching of the careers of several country artists including Loretta Lynn and Carroll Baker.
