Watch for changes . . . ! A major has made several changes to its marketing division, ala Europe. Nothing official yet, but we'll have the real news next week. (EC: *Ala Europe?*)

How time flies . . . ! I remember twenty years ago this month when I took in the throwing-the-switch ceremonies to bring CKGM-FM on the air . . . Montreal's first underground radio. Some referred to it as Tribal Radio. Now, here's something that many of you won't know. One of the first on-air personalities was a jock with an English accent no less. Yessir, Doug Pringle, your friendly consultant, brought Montreal front and centre to that "forbidden" sound of The Rolling Stones, Traffic, Blind Faith and more. Another personality who helped bring underground to the bi-bi town (they honoured both English and French at that time) was Earl Jive. The station changed its call letters to CHOM the next year. So, there you go, a lesson in Canadian radio history. Happy birthday CHOM. (EC: *I remember it well . . . !*)

The new Luba LP, All Or Nothing, features Paul Shaffer (David Letterman Show) playing keyboards on As Good As It Gets. Another special guest is Mike Campbell of Tom Petty and The Heartbreakers, who produced and played guitar on Wild Hearts. Campbell's most recent production credits include work on the Traveling Wilburys and the last Roy Orbison album.

The balance of the album, containing eleven Luba originals, was produced by Joe Chiccarelli and Jimmy Vivino. 

"I was somewhat apprehensive when I joined BMG," Bendeth recalls, "because I

CBS to distribute Anthem in Canada

Ray Danniels, President of Anthem Records, has announced the signing of a distribution agreement with CBS Music Products. The deal included all artists signed to Anthem, including Rush, Gowan, Spoons, Clean Slate and Mendelson Joe.

As of October 1st., CBS Canada is also distributing Anthem's back catalogue. This includes fourteen previous Rush albums, all of which went platinum, double or triple platinum in Canada, and five Max Webster albums. Also included in Anthem's back catalogue are titles by Ian Thomas and Moe Koffman.

An ironic twist in the signing is that all future Gowan recordings will now be released on the Anthem label. He previously released on Columbia. A new Gowan album is now in the works expected for release early in the new year.

As Danniels points out, "We're very excited about our new relationship with CBS in Canada. CBS has done a fine job in this country with Gowan, and it makes sense, with two very strong records coming up in the next few months - from Rush and from Gowan - to move Anthem to CBS."

In conclusion, Danniels stresses, "We have enjoyed our ten-year relationship with Capitol, but I think a change will give everyone involved a new surge of energy. We will certainly miss our friends at Capitol, but we are looking forward to a long and productive relationship with a company that has long had one of the best distribution systems in Canada."

knew they didn't have an enormous track record in the domestic area. Coming from CBS, where we had so much success with the domestic roster (Platinum Blonde, Gowan, Loverboy), I was so used to being on that big team of winners. So, as much as I was a little leery about BMG, I was more confident in the fact that I knew this was a good record company . . . there were things I had seen them do and I knew, once we had the acts, we could do it."

Bendeth was given a free hand to bring the A&R department around. "I was basically told to do what I thought was right . . . I had the freedom. I was very lucky that Don (Kollar) gave me that opportunity."

Bendeth goes on to reveal that when he first joined the company, his initial plan of attack was "to go in exactly the opposite direction that everyone else was going, which meant to not try and sign any corporate rock. I had seen certain reactions to Canadian acts in America when I was with CBS and, as much as I believed that Larry Gowan and Platinum Blonde deserved to have more action after their Canadian success, I was a little upset at how the Americans treated, not only CBS acts, but, to a certain degree, Tom Cochrane and others."

Bendeth qualifies, however, "There are a couple of signings that can be perceived as corporate acts . . . but the one thing that stands true is that all our artists write their own songs. So, it's not like we're trying to build up a facade. Based on that merit alone, they are all creative people."

One of the first signings that Bendeth became involved in were The Cowboy Junkies. "Because of the nature of the beast, I thought we needed help on a band like this and I got New York involved right away. They were a special act . . . and I guess that's what I call 'running in the opposite direction.' This wasn't an act that everybody would instantly recognize . . . so at that point, Jim Powers from New York, moved in with me and we basically tackled it together."

Bendeth goes on to explain, "With the signing of The Cowboy Junkies, it was my way of making a statement that we weren't going to be signing acts that other labels

already had. I just believed it would surface no matter what we did. As long as there was great songwriting involved . . . and a great attitude, we would make it based on that alone. As well, I was concentrating on direct artist signings. That way we could work together in building a family of artists."

There were a few eyebrows raised when BMG moved its corporate offices downtown to the MuchMusic/CITY-TV building. As it turned out, the move proved very beneficial to Bendeth's department. "To a lot of artists," explains Bendeth, "It gave them the freedom to come and see us. A lot of them would get burned out bussing to Markham, particularly in the winter. Even at CBS, I can remember people saying it was a bit of a pain. This building . . . it's turned into almost like a Brill Building (Broadway music centre in New York City). In addition, the studio (24-track recording facility) has really helped. I think having a central location showed everybody how committed we are to being a record company in the sense that we weren't just a distribution outlet. We have a real commitment to artists and their art form." Bendeth concludes with, "People are taking BMG very seriously now . . . we are definitely in competition with other companies for acts."

New EMI CD plant for Continental Europe

Jim Fifield, EMI Music Worldwide President and Chief Executive Officer, has announced a new EMI compact disc manufacturing plant for Continental Europe. Estimated to cost US\$16 million, the new plant will incorporate state-of-the-art monoline technology, and is the fourth such EMI CD plant.

To be located at Uden in Holland, where the company has long been established as a manufacturer, first of vinyl discs and latterly of cassettes, the building of the new factory was apparently prompted by what Fifield describes as "the need to serve the burgeoning European CD market . . . and is part of EMI's planned restructuring of manufacturing and distribution on the Continent." CD production equipment is now on order and installation will begin early next year with manufacturing expected to

Fifield points out that EMI "has opted for the latest monoline technology, developed in Europe, which will enable the entire process from injection moulding to label printing to be accomplished on one machine." Fifield goes on to explain that "The monoline systems have the further benefit of requiring less stringent clean room conditions, while delivering discs ready to package within minutes."

Initial capacity at the new plant will be 15m-18m units with future expansion capacity of 24m-30m units.

Fifield concludes with, "We are responding to the rapid growth of the CD market in Europe, where our forecasts clearly indicate that EMI will require additional production capacity to meet demand for our product."

The new plant will primarily serve the needs of Continental Europe while EMI's existing CD Services facility at Swindon, England which has a 20m capacity, expected to increase to 26m in the next four years, will look after the U.K.

EMI also has a CD plant in Jacksonville, Illinois (capacity 20m units) and a joint venture Toshiba-EMI plant in Gotemba, Japan (capacity 35m units).

Cinram develops new CD manufacturing system

The Moduline CD Max 600, a Cinram/Optical Disc Equipment designed compact disc manufacturing system has short circuited the lab coat philosophy that was previously attached to this configuration. As Cinram's Isidore Philosophe explains, it took two and a half years to develop the system, a revolutionary and much more practical method of manufacturing compact discs.

"It was totally designed from scratch in Canada," says Philosophe. "We created Optical Disc Equipment (ODE) to manufacture the equipment . . . to meet our future needs and to allow us to continue to be competitive."

The CD Max 600 is described as "a fully integrated moduline manufacturing cell incorporating an advanced metallizer, high quality spin-coater and laser inspection system in one compact, robotic system."

It is further described as "the product of advanced robotics technology and vacuum coating expertise combined with years of experience in the manufacture of compact discs . . . the result being a small but powerful system that operates either in a batch processing environment, or in-line with existing moulding, printing and packaging machines."

In short, the CD Max 600 requires no clean room, produces a high quality finished compact disc and, besides being cost efficient, is easy to operate and saves space.

Cinram is now operating the new system in their Scarborough (Toronto) plant and the feedback from potential buyers around the world has been "positive" says Philosophe.

A&A & Pepsi closet a free rock 'n' roll picnic



Harris Institute sets out to strengthen industry

This past week saw the opening of a unique institution designed to strengthen the Canadian music industry by better preparing those interested in a music-oriented career for the challenges to be met in the marketplace. The Harris Institute For The Arts will offer students a year-long intensive program and the opportunity to graduate with a diploma in either Producing/Engineering or Recording Arts Management.

Founder John Harris, a veteran of twenty-six years in the industry, strongly believes that the time has come to provide proper training for those entering the

business. "Basically the music industry has grown, in the last twenty-five years, from a cottage industry to the largest of all the arts and entertainment industries and it is large enough now that it pretty much demands formal training," Harris maintains. "So what I'm attempting to do is offer comprehensive programs in various aspects of the music industry: the creative areas, the technical areas and the business administration areas."

Harris, who mortgaged his house to fund the school, reports excellent support from the industry and students alike has allowed him to get the project off the ground in four short months. "I've had offers of help from all segments," he affirms, continuing with, "part of the financial burden has been offset by the fact that a lot of the students that are going to be going to the school have done a lot of the work. There's been a lot of volunteer help. Most of the construction and the painting, the physical things, have been done by students."

Perhaps the most impressive of his accomplishments has been the enlistment of a tremendous faculty, consisting of top experts in every aspect of the music industry. "I tried to find the best instructors in each area that I could think of and in almost all instances they agreed and they're doing it as a labour of love," informs Harris. "Nobody's being paid what they generally make out there in the marketplace. They're doing it because they think it's important and because they think they can make a contribution."

Not only will learning result from classroom sessions, but also from the internship in which each student must participate during his final trimester which, according to his area of concentration, will allow hands on experience at a record company, booking agency, studio or other suitable operation. "I think I'll have more companies interested than I'll have students," he anticipates.

While Harris asserts that the internship program will likely result in more than a few



permanent placements for graduates, he stresses, "above and beyond that we will be communicating with the industry to let them know who's available, what their training is, etc., and help connect students with the music industry."

Although not the primary motivation to undertake this endeavour at this time, Harris sees the signing of the Free Trade Agreement as a factor making the opening of the Harris Institute particularly timely. "The whole issue of free trade," he declares, "was fought by virtually every professional organization and association prior to the signing of the document for fear it would interfere with our cultural industries. Now, even though cultural industries were exempted in the agreement, I don't think there's any question that, over a period of time, it's going to become more competitive, and one of the purposes of the school is to better equip the Canadian music industry to compete internationally, especially in the United States."

"I think most people in the Canadian music industry would agree that we've got to strengthen the infrastructure of the Canadian industry to better compete internationally," he concludes, "and so we need as many trained and qualified people in all segments, from record promotion to record distribution to artist management right through the entire spectrum."

The Canadian music industry should consider itself blessed to count among its ranks a man with the foresight to recognize a weak link in the chain of operation and the determination needed to attack the problem at its root. The Harris Institute For The Arts deserves all the support we, as the industry, can muster. After all, any energies spent to ensure it becomes a flourishing enterprise are purely an investment in the welfare of the business we rely on for our own livelihoods.





"What were programmers thinking?" is the only question that can be asked about the incredibly undeserved lack of attention received by the lead single, *Some People*. Every cut on the album is highly accessible and radio had better get its ass in gear before it lets this thoroughly enjoyable effort slip through its fingers. Daily's gritty but sweet voice belts out one strong chorus after another and should propel any future releases into the Top 40. From the rougher edged *Bad Water* to '50s swing style *Just Can't Say Goodbye* to ballads like *Heart Don't Lie*, *This World* and the title track, E.G. Daily has written CHR all over this worthwhile project. - CM



BOB DYLAN - Pop
No Mercy - Columbia - OC-45281-H

Without a doubt, this is as strong an album as Dylan has released in years. Of course, the songwriting is unsurprisingly of high quality, while the performances are riveting. Kudos go to producer Daniel Lanois who successfully manages to affix his signature atmospheric tremolo guitar and finely-textured production values while capturing the essence of Dylan's classic periods. Much of the material is restrained and reflective, demanding the listener's full attention. Political World should chug its way onto the radio pretty soon as should *Everything Is Broken*, which harks back to the feel of the tracks Dylan cut with The Band over a decade ago. Every track is a winner and no one who has ever considered himself a Dylan fan will find any bones to pick about *No Mercy*. - CM


SQUEEZE - Pop

Glory Anne signs for fourth season



Savannah stars ready for Holland junket

Brian Ferriman, President of Savannah Records, and one of the leaders in Canadian country music, has announced a series of concerts to be performed by three of his top recording acts. 





approval from A/C programmers for this ballad that was written by Reed and his longtime friend and guitar player Eric Stever. The pair were previously known as Steed, a rock-duo who got their foot in the door with the release of Devil On My Shoulder. Reed and Stever produced the single. With Reed on lead vocals and piano and Stever on acoustic guitar, they had an instrumental assist from bassist Dave Glud, Al Leger on electric guitar, and drummer Dave Johannesson. 
